1. REASON FOR INVESTIGATION: Investigation is being conducted in compliance with communication from Headquarters 66th CIC Detachment, Subject and file as above, dated 30 Nov 50. The US Immigration and Naturalization Service is considering an investigation of SUBJECT for possible revocation of his citizenship. Helen DUKAS, who may have been SUBJECT's secretary prior to 1933, and who was reportedly brought to the US by SUBJECT, was reported to be in contact with Communists and suspected Soviet agents.

2. SYNOPSIS OF PREVIOUS INVESTIGATION: An FBI memorandum dated 23 Oct 50 mentions a Helen DUKAS, born 17 Oct 1896 at FELIBURG, Germany (French Zone) as having immigrated into the US from Bermuda in 1935. She reportedly was brought to the US by SUBJECT, and was later employed by him as secretary and housekeeper. DUKAS was reported to have corresponded during the early 1940's with Soviet agent Otto PATZ, and to have been acquainted with Mrs Nettie MADVANYI, a refugee German Communist.

3. PRESENT INVESTIGATION: SUBJECT became director of the Kaiser-Wilhelm Institute for Physics in 1914. Coming from ZURICH, he registered at BERLIN-Dahlem, Ehrenbergstr 33. In 1915 he moved to BERLIN-Lichtenrade, Wittelsbacherstr 13. From 1919 until 1933 SUBJECT lived at BERLIN-Schoeneberg, Haberlandstr 5, fourth (German) floor. This street has been renumbered twice in the meantime. Both houses having had the number 5 were destroyed. One former renter of this building, (fau) TETZLAFF, BERLIN W 30, Bambergerstr 26, US Sector, stated that SUBJECT was on good terms with a family named AUERBACH. Lotte SCHIFFER, nee AUERBACH, now resides at 26 Ashford Court, LONDON Nr 2. A former housekeeper of the AUERBACH family, Marie KULIKOWSKI, about 70 years old, knows EINSTEIN quite well and is still receiving food packages from EINSTEIN. KULIKOWSKI is allegedly living either in HOF (M51/0.99) or in the neighborhood of HOF. TETZLAFF stated that SUBJECT did not have an office in or outside of his apartment. The only offices he maintained, according to this source, were in the Kaiser-Wilhelm Institute for Physics and at the University of BERLIN.

4. Available files show only one Helene DUKAS, wine dealer at BERLIN W 8, Wilhelmstr 47 in 1929. This address is now located in the Soviet Sector of BERLIN.

5. UNDEVELOPED LEADS AND FUTURE ACTION:

a. A search is being made for former associates of SUBJECT and for former communist intellectuals who may have moved in SUBJECT's circle of acquaintances.

b. Attempts will be made to initiate discreet inquiries in the Soviet Sector regarding Helene DUKAS.

c. Efforts are being made to obtain more information regarding Lotte SCHIFFER and Marie KULIKOWSKI.

1. Reference is made to letter, your Office, dated 2 October 1952,
Subject as above, file G2, SHS.

2. Previous investigation of SUBJECT, with particular stress on
Helene DUKAS, failed to disclose any specific leads for further inves-
tigation.

3. The results of the investigation are contained in the inclosed
reports which are forwarded for your information.

4. In addition, investigation of Helene DUKAS in FREIBURG merely
disclosed that she was born there and that her parents were named Leopold
DUKAS and Hannelore, born LIEBMAN. They previously resided in FREIBURG,
Rheinstrasse 9. Their present whereabouts and that of Helene DUKAS could
not be ascertained.

5. The one possible lead which might be considered capable of fur-
ther exploitation concerned Marie KULIKOSKA. Since Marie KULIKOSKA is con-
sidered to stand in close contact with SUBJECT, no attempt was made to
interview her because of the possibility of compromise of the investigation
of SUBJECT. If your Office desires, this interview will be conducted.

1. REASON FOR INVESTIGATION: Investigation is being conducted in compliance with request from Headquarters, 66th CIC Detachment, to determine the identity of SUBJECT's pre-1933 secretary, and to determine the validity of allegations to the effect that SUBJECT and his secretary had been connected with a pre-1933 communist underground movement.

2. SYNOPSIS OF PREVIOUS INVESTIGATION:

a. Reference is made to AR, Region X, subject as above, file X-714, dated 13 March 1950. SUBJECT's pre-1933 secretary, a watchmaker's shop known as UHRENELB BERLIN, and a Kartonagenfabrik operated by Walter SCHAURHAUSEN, BERLIN, used as telegram address for Comintern and Soviet apparatus.

b. Reference is made to AR, Region VIII, Subject and file numbers as above, dated 14 February 1951. SUBJECT, prior to 1933, had been on good terms with a family named AUERBACH. Lotte SCHIFFER, nee AUERBACH, now resides at 26 Ashford Court, LONDON NW 2. A former housekeeper of the AUERBACH family, Marie KULKOWSKI, knows SUBJECT quite well, still receives food packages from him, and is alleged to live in or near HOF (M51/099).

3. PRESENT INVESTIGATION: Efforts were made to obtain further information on Lotte SCHIFFER, nee AUERBACH, formerly residing in BERLIN-Schoeneberg, Haberlandstr 5, now residing in LONDON, England.

a. A search of police and official city records produced negative results. (B-2)

b. An investigation of the neighborhood showed that this area was bombed out during World War II. (B-2)

c. Interrogation of former residents of this area disclosed the existence of the former grocer of this area, Max KRUGER, born 5 February 1881, BERLIN W 30, Janaerstr 2. An interview with KRUGER on 24 February 1951 disclosed that he knew Frau Marie AUERBACH, and her daughter Lotte. KRUGER praised the character of these two women but could not give any further information. For more detailed information, KRUGER referred the investigator to a former maid in the neighborhood, Frau Lora TETZLAFF, nee BEISER, born 25 September 1880, residing in BERLIN

During an interview on 25 February Frau TETZLAFF stated in substance as follows: Marie AUERBACH and her daughter Lotte moved into the neighborhood in 1912, Frau AUERBACH being divorced at this time. The maid of the AUERBACH family was Marie KULKOSKA. At this time the family was fairly wealthy but from 1912 to 1933, lost most of their possessions. In 1933 the AUERBACH's moved to Aschaffenburgerstr 9 where Frau AUERBACH opened a rooming house, which she operated until 1939. During this time Lotte AUERBACH married a man SCHIFFER, who resided in the vicinity of Prager Platz. Later Lotte immigrated to England with her husband. In 1933 Frau AUERBACH moved with her maid KULKOSKA to Landshuterstrasse 13, where the maid opened a rooming house. In 1940 Frau AUERBACH moved to Nymphenburgerstr (exact address not known). In 1941 Frau AUERBACH was arrested by the Gestapo and has not been heard of since. Frau TETZLAFF received the address of Lotte SCHIFFER from Frau KULKOSKA in 1945 and wrote her a letter but to date has received no answer. The address of Lotte SCHIFFER in 1945 was: Lotte SCHIFFER, LONDON NW2, Ashford Court 26, LONDON, England. During this interview Frau TETZLAFF claimed that the AUERBACH family were close friends of the Prof Albert KINSTEIN family and KINSTEIN's daughter and Lotte SCHIFFER grew up together until the KINSTEIN family moved to the United States. In German politics of the time, KINSTEIN's, Frau AUERBACH and Lotte SCHIFFER were anti-Nazis because of the persecution of the Jews. Though TETZLAFF did not know to which political parties the two families belonged, she claimed that Frau Marie AUERBACH was not pro-socialist and that both Lotte SCHIFFER and Prof KINSTEIN were left wing socialists and pro-Communist. Whether they were members of the then existing Communist Party was not known. (F-3)

4. A check on Marie KULKOWSKI, age 70, former maid of AUERBACH family, yielded the following results:

a. The correct name of the former AUERBACH maid is Marie KULKOSKA. (F-2)

b. Police and City records check were negative. (B-2)

c. See paragraph 3d above for the residence of KULKOSKA from 1912 to 1941. TETZLAFF stated that she was visited by KULEOSKA in 1945, at which time KULKOSKA claimed she was residing in EOH with her sister, exact address not known. (F-2)

4. An interview with Frau Erika LINKE, born 7 January 1905, Moerdlingerstr 1, was conducted on 28 February 1951. Frau LINKE stated in substance as follows: Maria KULKOSKA moved to 22 Landsbutterstr 13 in 1939, but this address was bombed out in 1944. KULKOSKA then evacuated BERLIN and moved to her sister and nephew in KOLBERG (055/M14). When KOLBERG was occupied by the Soviet Army, KULKOSKA moved to HOP, where she is presently residing. The exact address was not known by Frau LINKE.

5. Both Frau LINKE and Frau TELLAPP claim that KULKOSKA was a member of the Social Democratic party. They also claim that KULKOSKA has been receiving financial support from Prof. EINSTEIN since 1945. (F-2)

5. A check of the watchmaker shop "UHRAN-LB", BERLIN, was conducted, with the following results:

a. A police check, city records check, telephone company check, old address book check and old pre-1933 business directory check were negative. (B-2)

b. A check with the Watchmaker's Association was negative. (B-2)

c. A check of the old records of all watchmaker's supply houses in BERLIN was negative. (B-2)

6. A check was conducted on one Walter SCHAUERHAUSEN, formerly residing in BERLIN, Neue Jacobistrasse, who prior to 1933 operated a "Kartongenfabrik" (paper carton factory).

a. A police check and city records check was negative. (B-2)

b. A check of a pre-1933 business directory disclosed a paper carton factory located in BERLIN S 14 (Soviet Sector), Alte Jakobstr 6, operated by "Gebrueder SCHAUERHAUSER" (SCHAUERHAUSER Bros). The firm, which is presently still operating, is operated by Walter SCHAUERHAUSER and Paul SCHAUERHAUSER. (B-2)

c. Police check of ^{NVS} Walter SCHAUERHAUSER is as follows:

Marie GOETTLING, nee SWICKEY, born 8 December 1909, BERLIN SW 68, Luckauerstr 22, neighbor of SCHAUERHALMLER, during an interview on March 5, 1951, stated in substance as follows: Walter SCHAUERHALMLER was a Communist party member prior to 1933, and re-joined the party in 1945. He is presently an SAD functionary in the FBI BERLIN-Mitte. (F-3)

b. Else SONNEMANN, nee BRANDENBURG, born 16 November 1904, residing in BERLIN SW 68, Luckauerstr 2, neighbor of SCHAUERHALMLER, during an interview on March 5, 1951, stated as follows: Walter SCHAUERHALMLER is an old time communist. In conversations with his present neighbors SCHAUERHALMLER is proud of his communist ideals, praises the policies of the East, the SED and the Soviets. (F-3)

Reurmemo March 24, 1953, advising that captioned investigation was reopened on February 4, 1953, and a pending report was being prepared but would not be submitted until the correlation memorandum is reviewed, at which time a summary report would be submitted within ninety days. The Bureau extended the deadline to ninety days due to the length of the correlation summary.

The Bureau has no objection to this proposed procedure. However, it is pointed out that Bureau files do not contain any information reflecting the reason why Newark reopened the investigation on February 4, 1953. Therefore, if Newark is in possession of pertinent information which should be made available to the Bureau before ninety days, an interim report should be submitted.

Dear Sir:

Readers Digest for May carries a story about Dr. Albert Einstein being a sweet simple harmless old genius who had been duped by radicals into permitting the use of his name as being a supporter.

But this gentle old darling, so innocent and naive, was introduced to me as the brain that was setting up Hollywood in the Thirties for the big Communist push.

I had been story and advertising executive with David "Mark Griffith pictures from 1919 into early thirties. Early all our laboratory men were bolsheviks, our head man having been summoned back to Russia to take charge of films there. b7C

Our still photographer was a Russian named [REDACTED]. One of our second cameramen was [REDACTED] an open communist who went back and forth to Russia.

In early Thirties, I was executive head of story department at RKO studio. Among writers under me was [REDACTED]. b7C

One day [REDACTED] phoned asking me to call on him at Ambassador Hotel, the matter being most urgent.

I found he had a fashionable portrait studio in the lobby. When I asked what was the idea, and how could he afford such rent, he frankly said it was a front. Then he started a three-hour session explaining that the bolsheviks were going to take over here, and it was time for me to join. He had an exaggerated idea of my importance, and also had been impressed by a story in Colliers listing me among top three publicity men in nation [REDACTED] when I was with Griffith. Others were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. b7C

He was trying to sell me on heading propaganda. I thought he was nuts for I was getting \$30,000 a year and going up every six months. After talking too long, he finally said: "Well, I can see that Dr. Einstein has got to take you in hand. He's the one that never fails with the big shots."

I wanted to know which Einstein, and he said THE Dr. Einstein of the theory. I thought he was joking, but he said come along. We went upstairs in the Ambassador and he knocked at a suite door, and Einstein answered. He said he was busy, but would see me next day. I got a glimpse into his rooms and I thought the man I saw there was Charlie Chaplin. b7C

Going downstairs [REDACTED] told me that Einstein was organizing all the big studio figures, Schulberg at Paramount, stars like Freddie March, Walter Huston, Hepburn etc, and all the leading directors and writers. He said: "We've got them in our hand, and the Dr. has never failed on one; give him an ~~REGARDED~~ convincing you." b7C

Of course bolshevism then implied much prestige as Communism does today. I was busy and ignored [REDACTED] He phoned... app'd, and I replied, but several days later he was at the office on [REDACTED] b7C

4 I got through on my day, asking me to take a ride.

6 Then he calmly warned me that if I wanted to get ahead
7 in Hollywood I had better play ball with him, that through Einstein

16 friend; I don't like to see you get hurt and you would be valuable.
17 If you change your mind, phone me."

18 Within three weeks I was staggered to hear the writers
19 had asked that I be discharged, that they couldn't get along with me.

21 Later I had four contracts [REDACTED] cancelled after they had
22 been signed, and I never was able to stay in a Hollywood studio
23 more than a few weeks.

25 Then a few years ago I found out what [REDACTED]
26 was.

27 Of course I know nothing about Einstein now, but he was
28 no gentle old dupe then, and the top outfit in Hollywood was certainly
29 not organized by the Russian photographers and film laboratory men.

31 All this can be verified for [REDACTED] must have had a
32 license at the Ambassador Hotel and Einstein's name must be on the
33 register. b7C

34 I know this has no value now, nor can it be proved,
35 but it is a pernicious thing that magazines should present Einstein
36 as a sweet blundering old darling who is so easily risled by the
37 naughty radicals. Certainly at that time he was one of the
38 most dangerous and powerful figures in what has become the
39 Communist movement, for [REDACTED] was in deadly earnest when he
40 talked with me. b7C

Elsa Einstein had been married and divorced and had two daughters, one of whom later resided with her stepfather, ALBERT EINSTEIN, in Princeton, N.J. Elsa died in 1936.

E. Employment

Dr. S. S. WILKES, Professor of Mathematics, Princeton University, Princeton, N.J., advised that Einstein was presently Professor of Theoretical Physics at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, N.J.

The 1952-53 edition of Who's Who in America reflects Einstein had been previously employed as a professor at the following institutions:

University of Zurich, Switzerland
Deutsche University in Prague
Zurich Technical Academy, Zurich, Switzerland
Preus Akademie d'Wissenschaft

This edition further reflects Einstein was appointed a life member of the Institute for Advanced Study, Princeton, N.J., in 1933; furthermore that he is the discoverer and exponent of the theory of relativity.

The publication, Current Biography, Who's News and Why of November, 1941, reflects Einstein in 1901 started teaching in the Technical School of Winterthur and next as a private tutor in Schaffhausen, Germany. In 1902 he was employed as a Patent Office examiner in Berne, Switzerland. In 1909 he was appointed Professor at the University of Zurich and also as a lecturer at the Berne University. He received an appointment as a Professor of Physics at the German University in Prague from 1911 to 1912. Approximately one and a half years later he returned to Zurich to the Confederate Polytechnic Academy. In 1914 he was offered a professorship by the Prussian Academy of Sciences in Berlin where he remained until forced to leave Germany by the Nazis.

This publication further disclosed that while employed in Berlin, Einstein traveled frequently to give lectures abroad and in 1931 he spent several months at the California Institute of Technology in California. From 1912 to 1928 he was Professor of

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Physics at the University of Leyden and commuted from Berlin, Germany. He had been director of Theoretical Physics at the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute. He left Germany in 1933 at which time he was offered a life professorship at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, N.J., where he has been ever since.

Records of the Clerk's Office, U. S. District Court, Trenton, N.J., reflects EINSTEIN arrived in New York City on 6/3/35 and that as of January, 1936, he has resided at 112 Mercer St., Princeton, N.J..

Dr. S. S. WILHELM, Professor of Mathematics, Princeton University, advised EINSTEIN presently resides at 112 Mercer St., Princeton, N.J..

G. Health

Dr. HAROLD DOBBS, President of Princeton University, Princeton, N.J., had advised that Dr. ALBERT EINSTEIN in recent years has been in ill health, was aging, and consequently his activities were very limited.

H. Relatives

The 1952-53 edition of Who's Who in America reflects EINSTEIN had two sons by his first wife, namely, ALBERT, Jr., and EDWARD. Furthermore, that he had two stepdaughters by his second wife, ELSA EINSTEIN.

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Records of Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington, D. C., disclose HANS ALBERT EINSTEIN filed Declaration of Intention to become a citizen of the U. S. on 12/21/38 at Greenville, S. C. He was residing at 223 Randall St., Greenville, S. C., at the time.

These records contained a disposition dated 8/26/43 from Professor ALBERT EINSTEIN, 112 Mercer St., Princeton, N.J. EINSTEIN stated that HANS ALBERT EINSTEIN was his son whom he had known since his birth at Berne, Switzerland in 1904. Furthermore, that his son resided at Princeton, N.J., from 10/37 to 1/38 and again in 6/38. The son had been absent from the U. S. from 1/38 to 6/38 during which time he visited Switzerland.

Records of [REDACTED] another Government agency, disclosed HANS ALBERT EINSTEIN was born on 5/14/04 at Berne, Switzerland. On 4/12/40 he obtained a passport for proposed travel to Switzerland and to the British Isles on personal business. His permanent address at that time was listed as 1462 Blank St., Pasadena, Calif. 5

Informant advised that EINSTEIN and his wife were greatly concerned over the fact that their son ALBERT EINSTEIN, Jr., was in the Soviet Union and hence all of their actions were influenced as a result of their son's presence in Russia. Mrs. EINSTEIN was particularly concerned and was "scared to death" over the fact that he might possibly be held as a hostage to force some particular action on the part of Professor EINSTEIN. The informant subsequently advised that he was of the opinion that ALBERT EINSTEIN, Jr., was a son of Professor EINSTEIN by a previous marriage and that the current Mrs. EINSTEIN was his second wife.

The Princetonian, a daily newspaper of the students at Princeton University dated 10/13/37, reported that according to the United Press in Hoboken, N.J., Dr. ALBERT EINSTEIN, age 33 arrived in the U. S. on 10/12/37 on the Holland-American Liner Veendam, for a visit with his father Professor ALBERT EINSTEIN at Princeton University. His occupation was listed as construction engineer at Zurich, Switzerland, and that he is one of two sons of ALBERT EINSTEIN, Sr. This article further stated that Dr. EINSTEIN might bring his wife and two children to the U. S. for permanent residence.

II. ACTIVITIES IN GERMANY

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[REDACTED] another Government agency which conducts security and intelligence type investigations, per advised that information was received from a reliable source to the effect that prior to 1933 the Communist International (Comintern) and other Soviet Apparate were very active in gathering intelligence information in the Far East. Many International Communist functionaries were stationed in Shanghai and Canton for the purpose of gathering intelligence information. One means of communication used by these individuals to contact central headquarters in Moscow was through the use of telegrams. Such telegrams which were always coded were never sent directly to Moscow but were sent to agents in other countries such as Egypt and France where they were recopied and forwarded to telegram addresses or "drops" in Berlin. [REDACTED] one of these addresses was the office of ALBERT EINSTEIN in Berlin which proved to be very successful since EINSTEIN received a great quantity of mail, telegrams, and cablegrams from all over the world. (S)u

EINSTEIN's personal secretary, whose identity was not known, in turn gave the telegrams to a Soviet courier, whose duty was to pick up such mail from several telegram "drops". This information was then channeled by one means or another to Moscow. (S)u

This source advised that it was reported that EINSTEIN's Berlin Office employed at least two female secretaries, both of whom were Communist sympathizers. The exact period that EINSTEIN's office was used as an address for coded cables by Soviet intelligence was not known to the informant; however, EINSTEIN's cable address was already in action as of 1929. The reason for the use of EINSTEIN's cable address was due to the quantity of legal cable traffic at that address due to EINSTEIN's established international reputation, which provided a relative innocuous cover for illegal communications. The individual in EINSTEIN's Berlin Office

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through whom arrangements were made for the use of the cable address was EINST LIN's chief secretary at the time. The identity and background of the secretary in question was not known to the informant. Informant advised that this individual was EINST LIN's senior and private secretary at least during the period 1929 to 1931. The secretary was very closely associated with an international apparatus functionary of Soviet Russia. *(X) m*

The informant described the operation of the intelligence activities as follows: *(X) m*

An intelligence message was first transcribed into a prearranged Comintern or Soviet code. This message was then transcribed into a second code prior to the time it was transcribed *sp-4/1/81* in an approved internal cable code similar to that used by EINST LIN. The informant was of the opinion that EINST LIN used the most popular of codes developed in Germany, that of the Rudolph Mosse Publishing and Newspaper Firm. The double coded message was then dispatched to the EINST LIN cable address. According to the informant, at EINST LIN's office it was the duty of the senior secretary who was at that time in the employ of the Soviet Apparatus, to decode all messages and give all messages to EINST LIN for reading. Hence, this individual was in a position to intercept all messages which did not pertain to EINST LIN and transmit them to the appropriate Soviet courier. *(X) m*

This courier or contact man responsible for liaison with EINST LIN's Berlin Office, came directly to that office to pick up incoming cables for the apparatus. *(X) m*

The informant advised that EINST LIN's telegram address was for some time under the supervision and protection of one RICHARD GROS-KOFF, who at that time was in charge of the falsification of passports for the Soviet Apparatus, and subsequently became Chief of the Berlin Criminal Police in the Soviet Sector in Berlin. Informant advised that in the past, GROS-KOFF had issued a fake passport to an alleged Swiss citizen, PAUL HUGG, who was operating as an agent of the Comintern in the Far East and co-worker of the Soviet Apparatus in China. At one time, HUGG had a large amount of intelligence information and due to security reasons was forced to use EINST LIN's address and another cover address to forward this information. HUGG was later arrested by the Chinese police. *(X) m*

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Another individual who acted as courier for EINSTEIN's telegram address was ALFRED KATTNER, Receptionist at the CP Central Committee Building in Berlin prior to 1933, who was contacted by an unlisted telephone when cables were not picked up promptly by the regular courier. Informant was aware of at least two or three occasions when KATTNER made the contact or pick up at EINSTEIN's address. *(X) w*

Arrangements may possibly have been made through EINSTEIN's secretary without his knowledge. Informant pointed out that if EINSTEIN were aware of the use of his address from the beginning, the most logical approach to him in order to gain his approval for such activities would be to convince him that it was in the interests of "human rights." *(X) w*

Informant further advised that at least one incident occurred during the summer of 1930 which indicated EINSTEIN must have had some knowledge of the use of his cable address for purposes other than his own. At that time, EINSTEIN's private secretary had planned to go on a three or four week vacation and had been instructed to notify the Soviet courier in advance of the date of her departure so that arrangements could be made to intercept the Comintern cables before they were given to EINSTEIN. The private secretary left without informing the courier and no attempt was made by the courier to contact EINSTEIN personally. The only remaining alternative was to await the return of the secretary. When she returned from vacation several weeks later, all cables were turned over to her by EINSTEIN and there were no unpleasant repercussions. The use of the cable address by the Soviets continued as in the past. The informant was unaware as to whether EINSTEIN asked for an explanation from the secretary as to the use of his own cable address for activities not relating to his profession. Informant advised he had no further knowledge of facts which would indicate knowledge or lack of such on the part of EINSTEIN relative to the above operations. He stated that EINSTEIN was frequently active in supporting so-called "front groups", especially those relating to human rights or anti-Fascist activities. *(X) w*

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further reflect that the above (c) mentioned source, who was considered to be reliable, stated that it was common knowledge, especially in Berlin, that EINSTEIN sympathized with the Soviet Union to a great extent. EINSTEIN's Berlin staff of typists and secretaries was composed of individuals who were recommended to him (at his request) by individuals who were very close to a Communist cover organization known as The Klub Der Geistesarbeiter (Club of Scientists). This organization served as a source of personnel for various illegal Soviet Apparatus. EINSTEIN was also closely associated with this club and was very friendly with several members who later became Soviet Agents. Also associated with this club as a student in the early 1930's was EMIL KLAUS FUCHS, who was later jailed and convicted in England for giving atomic bomb information to the Soviets. In addition, EINSTEIN was very friendly with several members of the Soviet Embassy in Berlin, some of whom were later executed in Moscow in 1935 and 1937. 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IV. ATTEMPTED COMMUNIST PARTY INFLUENCE

On page 243 of the book entitled "Men Without Faces" by LOUIS FRANCIS BUDENZ, a self-admitted former Communist and former Managing Editor of the Daily Worker, appears the following passage entitled "Capture of the Innocents":

"It is not with any relish that I cite DREISAK's pro-Red record, but it is essential to do so in order to stress the slick ways in which the Communists operate. They are now manipulating ALBERT LINSTEIN in much the same way; though occasionally he shows his independence, his name has frequently appeared on pro-Red lists. The latest is the very recent call for the Western Hemisphere Congress in which LINSTEIN joins LAWSON, RICHARD O. BOYER, who has publicly admitted his Communist membership, and other Reds in denunciation of this country and cheers for the Soviet Union. It is obvious that such internationally known names as DREISAK and LINSTEIN go far toward influencing lesser lights to sign up on pro-Red lists and that they also blunt the awareness of the American people of what is afoot."

The New York Daily Mirror, daily newspaper of New York City, dated 8/17/50, contained statements by LOUIS BUDENZ and quoted him with respect to the Cultural and Scientific Conference held in New York City in March 1949, as follows:

"Heading the list of those who sponsored and attended the Waldorf Astoria "Peace" session were THOMAS MANN and ALBERT LINSTEIN, neither a Communist. MANN is a novelist, long a warm defender of Moscow.

"The relationships with MANN and LINSTEIN were established by what the Communists called 'remote control' while I was still part of the Red leadership. The manner of communication with MANN ran through associates of his daughter, LIKKA; while with LINSTEIN, means of reaching him were set up at Princeton. In both instances, these men were persuaded to their pro-Communist stands by playing on their hatred of Nazism. This I know from what I heard mentioned in Politburo meetings. No more striking illustration could be found of the way well-known men and women of unquestionable integrity are deceived and exploited by the Communists."

HUXLEY were two of the scientists who were instrumental in the development of the Atomic Bomb. Informant was of the opinion that these two individuals were definitely pro-Communist concerning the Atomic Bomb. Furthermore, that another scientist who was of assistance in the development of the bomb, namely, Dr. EINSTEIN, had been led to back those who favored the turning over of the Atom Bomb to Russia by other men who had persuaded him to affix his signature to certain proposals. Informant stated he did not believe EINSTEIN was actually a Communist but that he as becoming old and was very easily led by those younger men in whom he placed great faith.

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V. AFFILIATION WITH COMMUNIST PARTY FRONT ORGANIZATIONS

It is noted that the Daily Worker referred to throughout this report is an East Coast Communist newspaper and further, that The Worker is the Sunday edition of the Daily Worker.

It is further noted that the Peoples Daily World is a West Coast Communist newspaper.

The Morning Freiheit, also referred to in this report, has been cited by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities Report 3/29/44, page 75, as one of the rankest organs of Communist propaganda in this country for almost a quarter of a century.

A. Abraham Lincoln Brigade (AIB)

This organization has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities Report 1943, pages 93, 94 and 157, as a Communist front. It has also been cited by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities Report 3/29/44, page 146, as follows: "The CP was active in recruiting American boys for the so-called Abraham Lincoln Brigade in behalf of loyalist Spain. EARL FOWLER, former National Chairman of the CP, USA, has boasted that 60 per cent of the Brigade was composed of CP members."

It is also noted that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been cited as a subversive and Communist organization by the Attorney General of the U. S. and as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The New York Times, daily newspaper of New York City, dated 2/5/37, contained an article entitled, "EINSTEIN in Sympathy with Madrid Cause." According to this article

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the Spanish Embassy on that date made public a message from EINSTEIN to "a prominent Spanish personality" declaring that he felt ashamed that the Democratic nations had failed to support the Loyalist Government of Spain.

The article stated in part that EINSTEIN remarked, "At this moment I can do nothing less than assure you how intimately united I feel with the Loyal Forces and with their heroic struggle in this great crisis of your country."

According to the Daily Worker of 10/1/38, in an article entitled "\$150,000 Fund to Bring Lincoln Boys Home Is Opened," the national campaign committee of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade included EINSTEIN and other equally prominent national figures.

The Daily Worker dated 3/22/39 contained an article which stated in part that a fund campaign was launched by the Friends of the ALB. According to this article, among the most active supporters of the campaign to rehabilitate and provide medical care and attention for 180 seriously wounded Americans returned from the Spanish War included EINSTEIN and six other individuals.

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The Daily Worker dated 3/11/46, reported that it was announced on 3/10/46 that the IBC and the Igor Association for Jewish Colonization in the Soviet Union had merged into one organization known as the ABC. This announcement was made at a two-day conference of the two groups at Hunter College, N.Y. According to this article, Professor EINSTEIN was named as Honorary President of the new organization.

The Ambidjan Bulletin for January 1948, page 1, contained a copy of a cable dated 1/18/48 which was sent by Ambidjan to the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee in Moscow with expressions of condolence on the death of the head of this

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committee in Russia. According to this bulletin, EINSTEIN, Honorary President of Ambidjan, was one of the signers of this message.

The Ambidjan Bulletin for March and April, 1949 contained an article relative to a New York area conference of the ABC which was held in 11/48 at the Ambassador Hotel in New York City. The article stated that the conference had sent a message of greetings to EINSTEIN, Honorary President of the ABC on the occasion of his 70th birthday.

This organization has been cited by the Attorney General of the U. S. to be subversive and Communist and as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

This organization is also cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities Reports 1947, pages 45, 49 and 113, as among the Communist front organizations for racial agitation which also served as a "money-collecting pedie and "as special political organizing centers for the racial minority they pretend to champion". "Works closely with the International Labor Defense, legal arm of the CP, in defense of foreign-born Communists and sympathizers."

letter dated 10/15/41, bearing the letterhead of the ACPFB, 79 Fifth Ave., N.Y.C., disclosed the name of EINSTEIN as a sponsor of this organization.

The Daily Worker dated 10/21/41 and 2/26/42 set forth a list of sponsors of the ACPFB, N.Y.C. Professor EINSTEIN was listed as one of the sponsors of this organization.

D. American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists and Scientists (ACJWAS)

This organization has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1-47, page 45, as "among the Communist front organizations for racial agitation" which also served as "money-collecting media" and "as special political organizing centers for the racial minority they pretend to champion".

b1,b2,b7D [REDACTED] Development of great significance in American-Jewish life is the reply of the American Jews to an appeal of the Soviet Jews broadcast over Radio Station WNCA on 10/26/41 and endorsed by close to 200 American Jewish leaders under the auspices of the Committee of Jewish Writers and Artists. According to the informant, among the signors of this reply was ALBERT EINSTEIN.

According to the Daily Worker dated 6/28/43, SHOLOM ASCH, President of the ACJWAS aided in the formation of a national reception committee headed by STEW to welcome a distinguished Jewish cultural delegation from the Soviet Union. The delegation from Russia reportedly included the founder of the Moscow Jewish Art Theater and Chairman of the Joint Anti-Fascist Committee of the Soviet Union and a second member described as a poet, who was also a major in the Red Army.

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The Daily Worker dated 1/12/46 contained an article entitled "Form Jewish Committee for Books for USSR". According to this article, EINSTEIN had announced the formation of a Jewish Committee for Books for Russia under the sponsorship of the Jewish Council for Russian Relief and the ACJWAS.

The Daily Worker dated 4/19/48 contained an article relative to the delegation of the ACJWAS, giving JOZEF WINIEWICZ, Polish Ambassador to the U. S., a message from EINSTEIN on the occasion of unveiling the National Monument of Jewish Fighters of the Warsaw Ghetto on that day in Warsaw. The article stated that EINSTEIN was named as Honorary President of the Committee.

According to issues of the Daily Worker dated 1/28/44, 10/31/47, 12/24/47 and 6/12/49, Professor EINSTEIN was Honorary Chairman of the ACJWAS.

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[REDACTED] of a letter bearing the letterhead of the ACJWAS, Inc., which reflected the name of EINSTEIN as Honorary President of this organization.

The People's Daily World dated 1/5/44 contained an article which stated that the ACJWAS was headed by ALBERT EINSTEIN and SHOLEM ASCH.

The Morning Freiheit dated 2/15/46 contained an article which stated that a campaign for books for Soviet Russia was being conducted by the Jewish Book Committee which was composed of the American Jewish Council to aid Russian Rehabilitation, Inc., and the ACJWAS, with Professor EINSTEIN, as Honorary Chairman.

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[REDACTED] that the ACJWAS, Inc., maintained its headquarters at 119 West 57th St., N.Y.C., and that EINSTEIN was listed as Honorary Chairman of this organization.

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[REDACTED] a banquet sponsored by the ACJWAS in honor of ANDREI GRUENKO, Soviet Delegate to the Security Council of the United Nations, was held on 12/30/47 at the Commodore Hotel, N.Y.C. According to [REDACTED] telegrams of greetings were received from Professor EINSTEIN and others.

of a press release issued by the ACJWAS which stated in part that EINSTEIN was head of this organization.

The New York Post, daily newspaper of N.Y.C., dated 11/10/48, contained an article concerning a dinner in honor of Israel's independence held on 11/9/48 at the Hotel Filtmore, N.Y.C. According to the article, the dinner was sponsored by the ACJWAS and sponsors included DR. VLADIMIR CUTRATA, Czechoslovakian Ambassador to the U.S., and JOSEF WINIEWICZ, Polish Ambassador to the U.S. The article also stated that messages and greetings were received from Professor EINSTEIN, Honorary President of the Sponsoring Committee of the dinner, and others.

The Morning Freiheit, page 1, column 5, dated 11/48, contained an article reporting on the Israel Independence Banquet held at the Biltmore Hotel, N.Y.C. on 11/9/48. The article stated that the banquet was organized by the ACJWAS to express their thankfulness and recognition to the Soviet Union for the aid and support they gave to the State of Israel. According to this article, EINSTEIN sent his congratulations to the banquet which was dedicated to the Ambassadors from Poland and Czechoslovakia.

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of the "Jewish Daily Forward", 175 East Broadway, N.Y.C., advised that WILLIAM EDLIN was the editor of "The Day", a Yiddish daily newspaper but that the guiding hand and spiritual voice was BENJAMIN Z. GOLDBERG. It was stated that the ACJWAS in N.Y.C. was GOLDBERG's Communist front organization and that GOLDBERG used such prominent Jewish people as ALBERT EINSTEIN, SHOLEM ASCH, the writer, and others, as cover-up names, when in reality, the organization was completely controlled by the Communists.

Jewish Blackbook of the American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists, and Scientists

It is noted that the Jewish Blackbook Committee of Los Angeles, Calif., has been cited as a Communist front by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1947, page 56, and that a citation concerning the American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists, and Scientists, has been previously set forth.

dated 1/19/45 from the ACJWAS, Inc., signed by ALBERT EINSTEIN, Honorary President. According to the informant, this letter extended an invitation to participate in the inauguration of the Jewish Blackbook project at a dinner at the Hotel Commodore on 2/14/45. The letter further explained that the Jewish Blackbook represented the indictment against the German movement for the crimes against Jewish people.

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the ACJWAS, Inc., sponsored a dinner at the Hotel Commodore, N.Y.C., where the project of publishing the Blackbook was announced and where the financial drive was officially launched. Informant advised that at this dinner, messages were read from Professor EINSTEIN and others; furthermore, that EINSTEIN was Honorary "resident of the ACJWAS.

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The Morning Freiheit dated 8/8/45 contained an article entitled "Jewish Blackbook Submitted for Publication". According to this article, the Jewish Blackbook, which was being prepared by the World Jewish Congress, the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee in Moscow, the IAWD Le Uni of Palestine, and the ACJWAS in the U.S., had been submitted for publication and that EINSTEIN was to write an introduction for this book. The article stated that the Blackbook was to be sent to the leaders of the American Government, to all the Governors of the U.S., to Senators, and so forth.

The Daily Worker dated 3/25/46, contained an advertisement by the ACJWAS of a mass rally presentation of the "Blackbook Jewish Case Against the Nazis," which was to be held in Madison Square Garden on 3/27/46. According to this advertisement, EINSTEIN was Honorary Chairman and one of the principal speakers.

According to the Daily Worker dated 3/27/46, which contained an article relative to the mass rally in Madison Square Garden on 3/27/46, EINSTEIN had stated on the previous

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day that "The Blackbook is one of the most important documents of modern times." b1,b2,b7D

ACJWAS was one of four sponsors of a ceremony on 3/28/46 at Madison Square Garden entitled "Presentation of The Blackbook-- World Jewry's Indictment of the Nazis." Informant advised that EINSTEIN was to be the main speaker for the evening but sent his message by telephone from Princeton, N.J., at which time it was read to the audience.

D-1. American Committee for Spanish Freedom

This organization has been cited by the Attorney General of the U. S. as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

It has also been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, page 115, as follows:

"Communist transmission belt. * * * The key position of this Communist front is held by a member of the CP. * * * ALLEN CHASE (Secretary) was candidate for Congress in New York on the CP ticket." It "has made no attempt to conceal its objective in forcing a break in diplomatic relations between the U.S. and Spain." b1,b2,b7D

JOSEPH SWEAT of the American Committee for Spanish Freedom advised that he informed him that EINSTEIN was assisting this organization; furthermore, that SWEAT conferred with a representative of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in the informant's presence at which time he remarked that the American Committee for Spanish Freedom was preparing a fund-raising letter which was to bear EINSTEIN's signature.

b7C Deputy Sheriff [REDACTED] Westchester County, N.Y., advised he received a letter postmarked 10/15/45, bearing the signature of Dr. ALBERT EINSTEIN, Suite 712-713, 55 West 42nd St., N.Y.C. [REDACTED] advised that according to this letter, EINSTEIN stated that it was the duty of all Americans to see that the campaign of the American Committee

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E. AMERICAN COUNCIL FOR A DEMOCRATIC GREECE (ACDG)

This organization has been cited as a subversive and Communist organization formerly known as the Greek-American Council by the Attorney General of the United States and as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

On 9/15/49 EMILY ROSENBERG, Executive Secretary of the ACDG appeared at the office of Assistant United States Attorney, THOMAS F. MURPHY, USDC, Southern District of New York, at which time, Miss ROSENBERG honored a subpoena duces tecum calling for Miss ROSENBERG to produce the original receipt books and official records of the ACDG.

Included among the documents which were introduced in evidence before the U.S. Grand Jury, United States District Court, Southern District of New York on 9/15/49 by Miss ROSENBERG was

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The Peoples Daily World dated 8/23/48 stated that EINSTEIN sponsored a petition of the ACDG and according to the Daily Worker of 9/2/48, Page 7, EINSTEIN signed a statement of the Council condemning the Greek Government.

The Daily Worker dated 7/4/49 contained an article which stated in part that the ACDG announced that a petition bearing 10,000 signatures requesting the application of the Geneva convention to military and civilian prisoners in Greece had been sent to the National Red Cross. According to this article the name of EINSTEIN was among these signatures.

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that the ACDG issued a form letter dated 9/24/48 which appeared to have served as a cover letter from the ACDG, 152 West 42nd Street, New York City to prospective signers and financial contributors. The letterhead on which this form letter appeared contained a list of the national petitioners wherein the name of EINSTEIN and nine other individuals appeared.

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F. AMERICAN CRUSADE TO END LYNCHING (ACEL)

The fourth report of the Joint Fact Finding Committee of California, 1948, concerning Communist front organizations, page 136, described the ACEL as follows:

"PAUL ROBESON, who has a long record of Communist affiliations, was the moving spirit in what was known as the American Crusade to End Lynching and organized a pilgrimage to Washington, D.C. for 9/23/46. This venture was actively supported by the Communist press."

It is noted in regard to PAUL ROBESON that [REDACTED] b7D

[REDACTED] He knew PAUL ROBESON and his wife ESIADE ROBESON to be devoted members of the Communist Party.

b1 b2 b7D

[REDACTED] disclosed that information was received from a completely reliable source to the effect that in 9/46 the ACEL announced a series of nation-wide activities in support of the pilgrimage to Washington D.C. on 9/23/46. This delegation planned to call on the White House and National figures to demand action by the Administration.

A parade was scheduled to be led by Negro and white veterans who were to march to the Lincoln Memorial, where a national religious ceremony would be held and persons who escaped lynch mobs were to be presented to the audience. Dr. EINSTEIN was scheduled to appear at this demonstration. [REDACTED] disclosed that the informant was unaware as to whether or not EINSTEIN attended as scheduled. (c) b1, b2, b7D

[REDACTED] that information was received from a usually reliable source to the effect that EINSTEIN was among a group of individuals who had issued a call for an "American Crusade to End Lynching" to gather in the Nation's Capitol on 9/22, 23/46. This source further advised that "in view of some of the endorsers, this crusade had all the earmarks of another Communist attempt to instill racial agitation." b1, b2, b7D

[REDACTED] that a circular captioned, "American Crusade to End Lynching" was issued

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by this organization which served as a call to the American people to join the pilgrimage to Washington, D.C. on 9/23/46 for immediate action to end lynching. This circular bore the signatures of individuals who it stated were "morally indignant over this lawless violence (lynchings)." The name of EINSTEIN appeared on this list of signatures.

The Philadelphia Inquirer, a Philadelphia, Pa. daily newspaper, dated 9/23/46, contained an article which stated EINSTEIN wrote a letter to then President HARRY S. TRUMAN assailing lynching. This letter was to be delivered to President TRUMAN by a group of men headed by PAUL ROBESON, Chairman of the ACEL. b1 b2 b7D

that
the "La Belle Communist Club" of Detroit, Mich. was making arrangements and attempts to organize a delegation of 200 individuals to join other brigades from other cities enroute to Washington, D.C. to participate in the demonstration in Washington, D.C. on 9/23/46 sponsored by the ACEL. b7D

the above preparations
were discussed, at which time it was pointed out that ALBERT EINSTEIN and PAUL ROBESON headed this national crusade.

The "People's Voice" dated 10/5/46, Page 17, contained an article relative to the ACEL at Washington, D.C. This article stated in part that EINSTEIN and PAUL ROBESON were co-chairmen of the ACEL.

It is noted that the People's Voice has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, Page 225, as among publications which the Committee found "to be Communist initiated and controlled or so strongly influenced as to be in the Stalin Solar System."

b1 b2 b7D b7E advised that EINSTEIN was listed as one of the sponsors of the ACEL with offices at 23 West 26th Street, New York City and 1015 M St. NW, Washington, D.C.

The Daily Worker dated 9/14/46 contained an article entitled "Anti-Lynch Crusade Gets OK for Lincoln Memorial." According to this article, EINSTEIN was one of the sponsors of the ACEL.

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G. AMERICAN FRIENDS OF THE CHINESE PEOPLE

This organization has been cited as a Communist front by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, Pages 141 and 142 and by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities Report 3/29/44, Pages 40 and 147.

According to the Daily Worker dated 7/16/40, Page 4, EINSTEIN signed a letter pledging support to China which was issued by the American Friends of the Chinese People.

H. AMERICAN LEAGUE AGAINST WAR AND FASCISM also known as the AMERICAN LEAGUE FOR PEACE AND DEMOCRACY

This organization has been cited as subversive and Communist by the Attorney General of the United States and as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The Special Committee on Un-American Activities Report, 3/29/44, Page 53 stated that the American League Against War and Fascism was organized at the First United States Congress Against War which was held in New York City from 9/29/33 to 10/1/33. Four years later, in Pittsburgh, Pa., on 11/26-28/37 the name of the organization was changed to the American League for Peace and Democracy ... which remained, however, completely under the control of Communists when the name was changed as it had been before at the hearings before the Un-American Activities Committee, House of Representatives, 75th Congress, Washington, D.C. in 1938 (Dies Committee report, Volume 4, Page 3075).

According to [REDACTED] the International Committee of this Congress included EINSTEIN and others.

Leaflet dated 12/6/38 entitled "The Washington Congress for

OK per [redacted] that EINSTEIN was a delegate to the World Congress Against War held in Amsterdam in 1932, which organization was a forerunner of the American League for Peace and Democracy.

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I. AMERICAN PUSHKIN COMMITTEE

This organization has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, Pages 334 and 335 as a Communist front.

The report of the Special Committee on Un-American Activities House of Representatives, 78th Congress 1944, Page 1772 disclosed that a letter bearing the letterhead of the American Pushkin Committee for the commemoration of the death of a great Russian poet set forth a list of the sponsors of this organization which included the name of ALBERT EINSTEIN.

J. AMERICAN RELIEF SHIP FOR SPAIN

This organization has been cited as "one of the several CP front enterprises which raised funds for Loyalist Spain (or rather raised funds for the Communist end of that civil war) by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities report 3/29/44, Page 102.

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[redacted] met a letterhead of the American Relief Ship for Spain dated 9/3/38 published by the Hollywood Anti Nazi League for Defense of American Democracy bore the name of Professor EINSTEIN as one of the national sponsors of this organization.

K. THE CIVIL RIGHTS CONGRESS, CRC

This organization has been cited as subversive and Communist by the Attorney General of the United States and as an organization

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13 This organization was also cited by the Congressional Committee

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48 The 12/31/48 issue of the Daily Worker stated that rallies
49 and block meetings were scheduled to be held in New York City
50 commencing 1/8/49 to call on the Attorney General TOM CLOTHIER to dismiss
51 the indictment against the 12 Communist leaders in New York City.
52 According to an article in this issue, meetings which were organized

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under the auspices of the CRC were to elect delegates to the Freedom Crusade, Washington, D.C. on 1/18/49, the day after the trial of the CP leaders opened in Federal Court in New York City. EINSTEIN was among the sponsors of this Freedom Crusade.

The Worker, the Sunday edition of the Daily Worker dated 12/26/48 contained an article captioned "Crusade Launched to Defend 12 Lobbying in Capitol."

According to this article, WILLIAM L. PATTERSON, Executive Secretary of the CRC, sponsor of the Washington Conclave, informed the Worker that a special report on the case of the 12 indicted CP leaders would be delivered at the Legislative Conference on 1/17/49. The article further stated that among those sponsoring the conference there were included such notables as Dr. EINSTEIN and others.

Records of [redacted] another Government Agency which conducts security and intelligence type investigations, disclosed that information was received to the effect that the latest attempt of the CP and the CRC to lobby in Washington, D.C. was the announcement of a Freedom Crusade to be made in Washington, D.C. on 2/17/49. Furthermore, it was reported that the Freedom Crusade would be preceded by a national civil rights conference which according to the Communist press will make plans for an offensive by the American people to end 'second class citizenship' for the Negro people, trade unions, Communist progressive, liberals, and all other radical religious and political minorities.

These records further disclosed that among the sponsors of this movement was Dr. EINSTEIN and others.

According to the Worker, the Sunday edition of the Daily Worker dated 1/16/49, EINSTEIN was a sponsor of the Freedom Crusade.

According to the Worker dated 1/30/49, numerous individuals throughout the world were protesting the trial of the 12 Communist leaders in New York City. Among the names of individuals and organizations set out in the article as having protested the trial of the 12 CP leaders was the "Freedom Crusade Call." According to this article, EINSTEIN was among the signers of this call.

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L. COMMITTEE OF ONE THOUSAND

This organization has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, Pages 34 and 35 as a "Communist created and controlled front organization" which was "created to raise funds for the defense of the 19 unfriendly witnesses before the Congressional Committee on Un-American activities investigation of Communist activities in Hollywood ten of whom were indicted for contempt of Congress."

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[REDACTED] that a telegram dated 1/12/48 signed by Dr. HARLOW SHAFLEY, Washington, D.C. was sent to a prominent Hollywood screen writer on the West Coast. This telegram was an invitation to join the writer and nine other individuals who were listed and included the name of Dr. EINSTEIN in launching a committee of one thousand to seek the abolition of the Un-American Activities Committee.

The New York Sun, a daily newspaper of New York City, dated 1/22/48 contained an article which reported that a new organization to be known as the Committee of One Thousand was organized for the purpose of persuading Congress to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The article stated that the organization's first move at its headquarters in Washington, D.C. was to place a full page advertisement in a newspaper which called for donations. Among those individuals whose names appeared as signatures in this advertisement was ALBERT EINSTEIN.

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[REDACTED] another Government agency, disclosed that Dr. HARLOW SHAFLEY of Harvard University had announced plans to recruit one thousand prominent Americans behind the drive to abolish the House on Un-American activities as the " betrayers of American ideals." Reportedly this Committee was backed by such individuals as ALBERT EINSTEIN.

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M. COMMITTEE FOR PEACE THROUGH WORLD COOPERATION

This organization has been cited by the Special Committee on Un-American activities, Report 3/29/44, Page 105 as an organization

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with the same aims as the American League for Peace and Democracy, a Communist front which beat the drums for collective security against the Fascist aggressors in accordance with current CP line.

According to the Daily Worker dated 4/2/38, Page 4 EINSTEIN was an endorser of the Committee for Peace Through World Cooperation.

N. CONFERENCE FOR PEACEFUL ALTERNATIVES TO THE ATLANTIC PACT

This organization has been cited by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 378 on the Communist "peace" offensive 4/25/51, original date 4/1/51, Page 56 as a meeting called by the Daily Worker in 7/49 to be held in Washington, D.C. and as having been instigated by Communists in the United States who did their part in the Moscow Campaign.

b1 b2 b7D [REDACTED] that arrangements were made between RICHARD MORFORD, Executive Director of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship and GENE CONNELL an office staff member of the National Council of the Arts Sciences, and Professions (NCASP) relative to a "night letter" telegram prepared by the NCASP which was to be sent out over the signature of ALBERT EINSTEIN and two other individuals calling to leaders of civic, church, labor and community organizations throughout the nation to assemble in Washington, D.C. on 5/20, 21/49 to manifest their opposition to the Atlantic Pact.

The Daily Worker dated 5/11 '49 stated that a meeting of church and civic leaders to "make their opposition to the North Atlantic Pact manifest" had been called for 5/20, 21/49 in Washington, D.C. by EINSTEIN and others.

According to the Daily Worker of 5/30/49 and 8/9/49 the Conference for Peaceful Alternatives to the Atlantic Pact was a conference held in Washington, D.C. and the sponsors included EINSTEIN and others.

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[REDACTED] called attention to the national conference being held in Washington, D.C. on 5/20, 21/49 concerning the Atlantic Pact, which conference [REDACTED] stated had been initiated by five outstanding individuals including EINSTEIN.

b6 b7D [REDACTED] that a report of the Conference on Peaceful Alternatives to the Atlantic Pact, Washington, D.C. on 5/20, 21/49 disclosed this conference was initiated by five individuals including EINSTEIN.

O. COUNCIL ON AFRICAN AFFAIRS

This organization has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as a subversive and Communist organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

According to the Daily Worker dated 4/22/47 in an article captioned, "EINSTEIN says Liberation of Colonies Urgently Needed", Professor EINSTEIN sent greetings to MAX YERGIN, Executive Director of the Council of African Affairs on 4/21/47. According to this article, EINSTEIN said in part "no reliable or lasting peace will be possible without the political and economical emancipation of the now subdued and exploited African and colonial people."

at a meeting on 3/10/47 of the Council of African Affairs, [REDACTED] promised to introduce WILF SACHS to DR. EINSTEIN for the purpose of arranging financial support through EINSTEIN for SACH'S work in South Africa.

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P. EXILED WRITERS COMMITTEE

This organization has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, Pages 234 and 270 as having been established by the Communist League of American writers to bolster the Communist front American Committee to Save Refugees. The Exiled Writers Committee worked with other Communist fronts in the Spanish Communist Refugee Agitation, which merged into the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in 1942.

b6 b7D [REDACTED] advised that in the latter part of 1941 at the headquarters of the Exiled Writers Committee, 381 Fourth Ave., New York City, he observed a list of anti-Nazi writers who had been assisted in reaching safety in this hemisphere by the Exiled Writers Committee. According to the informant, the name of Professor EINSTEIN appeared on this list.

Q. INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE OF THE ARTS, SCIENCES AND PROFESSIONS (ICCSF)

This organization has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, Page 262 as a Communist front which grew out of the Independent Voters Committee of the Arts and Sciences.

The Fourth Report of the Senate Fact Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, 1948, relative to Communist front organizations issued by the California Legislature disclosed on Page 262 that the Senate Committee produced a letter dated 3/12/45 on the letterhead of ICCSF, wherein EINSTEIN and others were listed on the Board of Directors of this organization.

According to an article in the People's Daily World dated 6/12/45 captioned "Leading United States Scientists Attend Moscow Fete", Dr. HARLOW SHAPLEY, Director of the Harvard University Observatory and other prominent scientists and intellectual leaders were in Moscow, Russia that week to attend the 220th anniversary celebration of the

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Academy of Sciences of the USSR at the invitation of the Soviet Government.

According to this article, Dr. SHAFLEY was to present the Soviet Academy with a scroll of greetings from EINSTEIN and others in behalf of the ICCASP.

According to the Daily Worker of 6/14/45 EINSTEIN was a sponsor of the ICCASP.

b1 b2 b7D [REDACTED] that a leaflet issued by the Independent Citizens League of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions concerning a conference of this organization to be held on 6/22-23/45 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel, New York City listed the name of EINSTEIN among the members of the Board of Directors of this organization.

b2D [REDACTED]
made available in 7/45 the letterhead of the ICCASP, on which letterhead was listed the offices and sponsors of the Committee. According to this letterhead, EINSTEIN was a member of the Board of Directors.

According to the informant, the organization was scheduled to encompass the ICCASP and the National Citizens Political Action Committee and various independent state positions.

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were a number of individuals who were proposed as possible sponsors or backers for the meeting which was to be held by the Conference of Progressives in mid January of 1947 at Washington, D.C. to whom the Communists would look for support in the formation of this new nation-wide front organization.

b7D [REDACTED] indicated that such well-known individuals as EINSTEIN, SHAFLEY and others were among those listed as proposed supporters of the meeting scheduled by the Conference of Progressives.

R. INTERNATIONAL LABOR DEFENSE

This organization has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as a subversive and Communist organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The Congressional Committee on Un-American activities Report 1115 dated 9/2/47, Pages 1 and 2 stated that the International Labor Defense "was part of an international network of organizations for the defense of Communist lawbreakers." At a conference held in Detroit, Mich., 4/27, 28/46 the International Labor Defense and the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties merged to form the new front, Civil Rights Congress.

As previously noted, the Civil Rights Congress has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The Worker dated 10/11/42 contained an article concerning a dinner held under the auspices of the International Labor Defense at the Hotel Commodore, New York City in 10/42. According to this article, EARL BROWDER, former publicly known Chairman of the CP USA, was a speaker at this dinner and scores of telegrams and greetings were read from such well known anti Fascist leaders as ALBERT EINSTEIN, PAUL ROBESON, and others.
