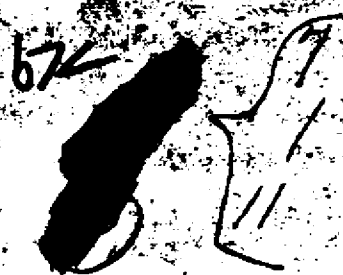

The card was received by Warden OLIN G. BLACKWELL, U. S. Penitentiary Alcatraz, California on 6/18/62. Warden BLACKWELL pointed out that this is probably "a phony" since all prisoners have their mail addressed to Box 1476, Alcatraz, California.

Attached is sample of handwriting of CLARENCE ANGLIN and the laboratory is requested to compare handwriting of CLARENCE ANGLIN with that on postcard and in addition to compare handwriting on fingerprint cards of JOHN W. ANGLIN, FBI # 4745119 and FRANK LEE MORRIS, FBI # 2157606.

San Francisco endeavoring to obtain additional handwriting specimens of JOHN W. ANGLIN and FRANK LEE MORRIS and will forward.

ALL SUBJECTS ARE CONVICTED BANK ROBBERS AND SHOULD BE CONSIDERED EXTREMELY DANGEROUS.

SAC Price telephoned from San Francisco. He advised that Agents conducting investigation in this case at Alcatraz had learned on a highly confidential basis that Bureau of Prison officials went ahead with the press conference yesterday after having received advice from someone in the Attorney General's Office, identity not known, that they should avoid giving the impression of trying to cover up or withholding information. In addition, Agents have learned that Drew Pearson, the columnist, is enroute to San Francisco and expected to arrive there later today. He has a reservation at the Fairmont Hotel. This information is also known to the warden at Alcatraz who has been told that Pearson has exhibited a tendency in the past to pay too much attention to what convicts tell him. Nevertheless, he is to be afforded the same treatment as any other newspaper reporter.

Price said the intensive investigation is continuing but as yet no evidence has been developed to indicate that subjects successfully made their way to the mainland. Likewise, however, there is no information to show that they did not. The paddle, obviously made at Alcatraz, was found between 100 and 200 yards off the shoreline at Angel Island which is in the Bay. The water there is about 12 feet deep. This is the only evidence which might support the conclusion the convicts reached Angel Island but this is no way conclusive.

SAC Price stated the work which the subjects performed in preparation for the escape is fantastic. Examination of the Mae West life preserver jacket which was left behind shows great ingenuity in its preparation. Using raincoats as material, the subjects not only sewed the seams but apparently used hot steam pipes to vulcanize these seams to make them air tight. They used a hollow plastic tube, such as is ordinarily contained in small spray devices in bottles, as a means of inflating the jacket. A heavy paperclip was attached to the tube so it could be closed after the jacket was inflated.

**ACTION BEING TAKEN:**

Price said Agents at San Francisco are continuing their intensive investigation. Absolutely no comment is being made to the press by our agents at San Francisco and a special effort will be made to avoid any contact with Drew Pearson when he appears at Alcatraz.

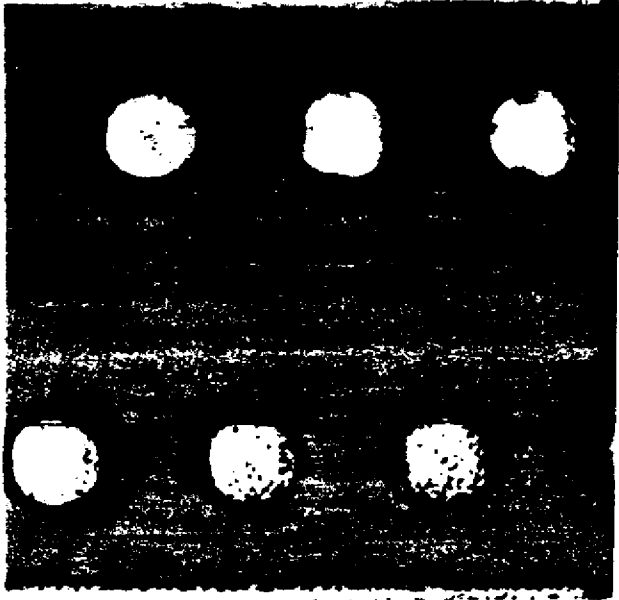
Open doorway shot showing entire back

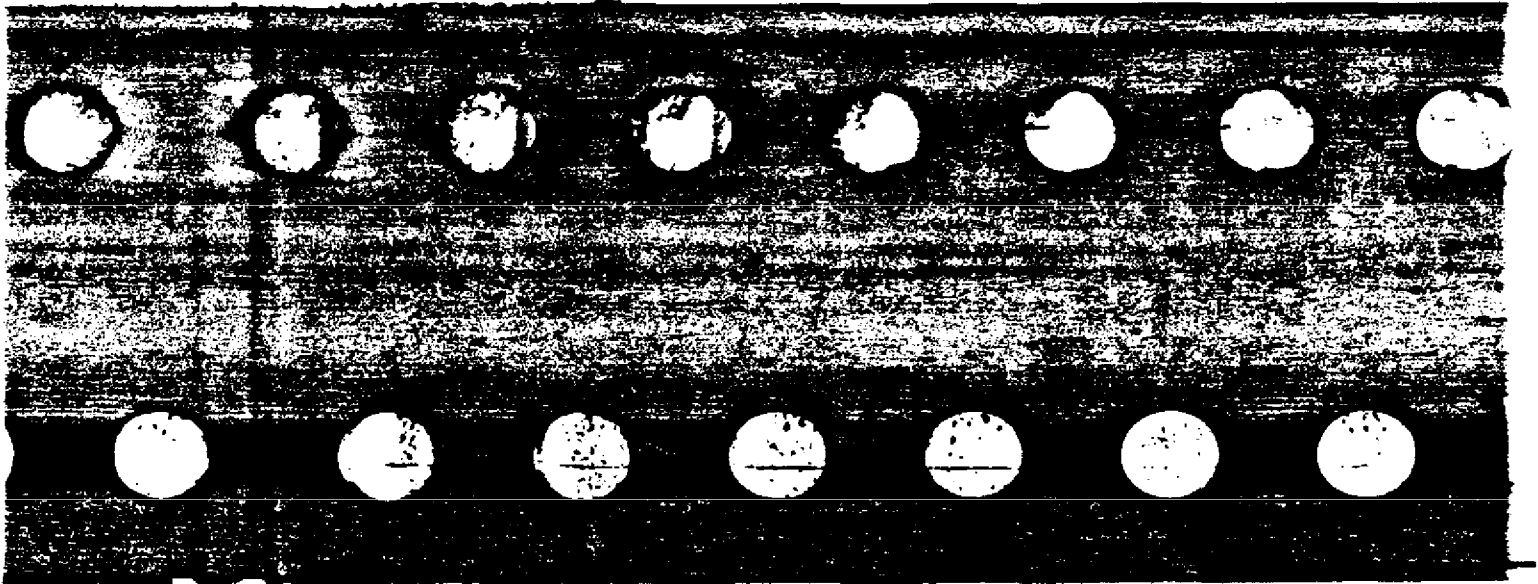




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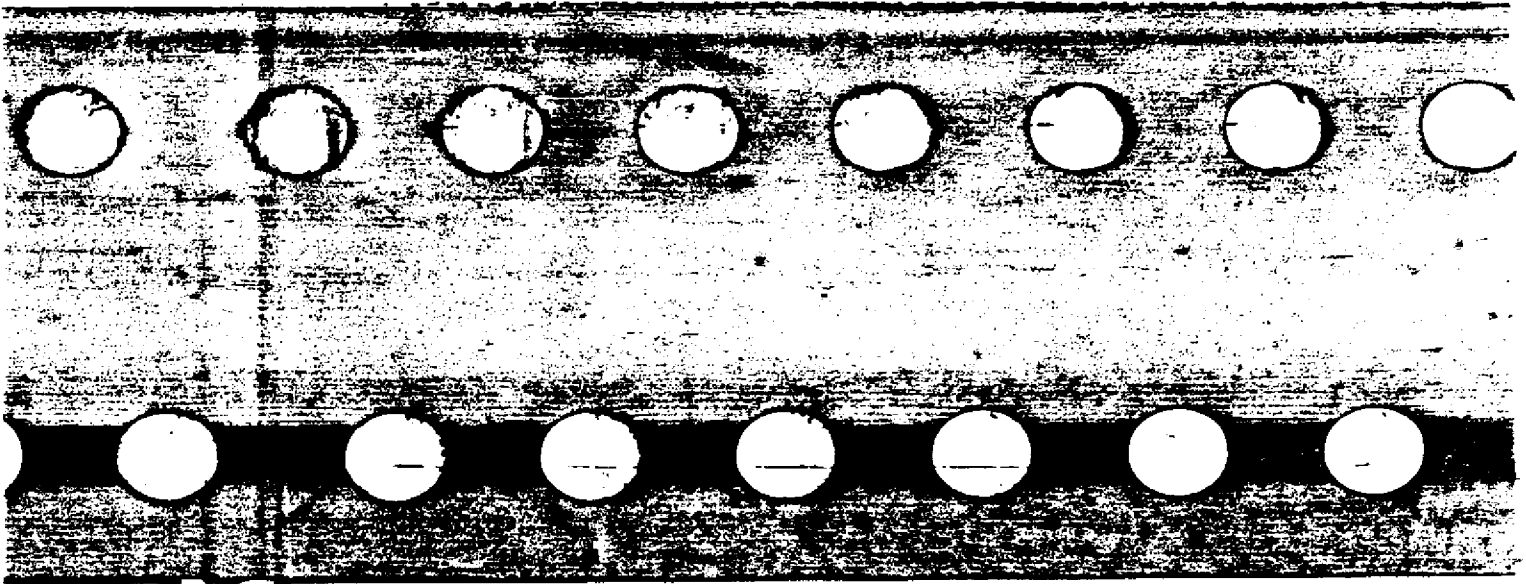
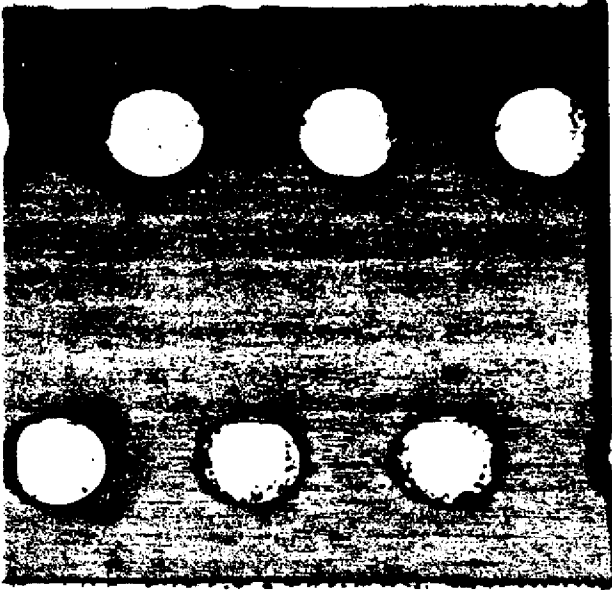
Showing directly down into  
vent used as escape exit.

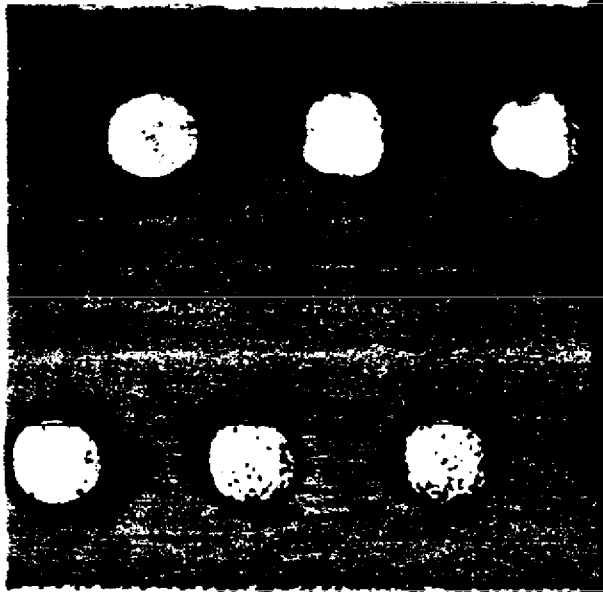

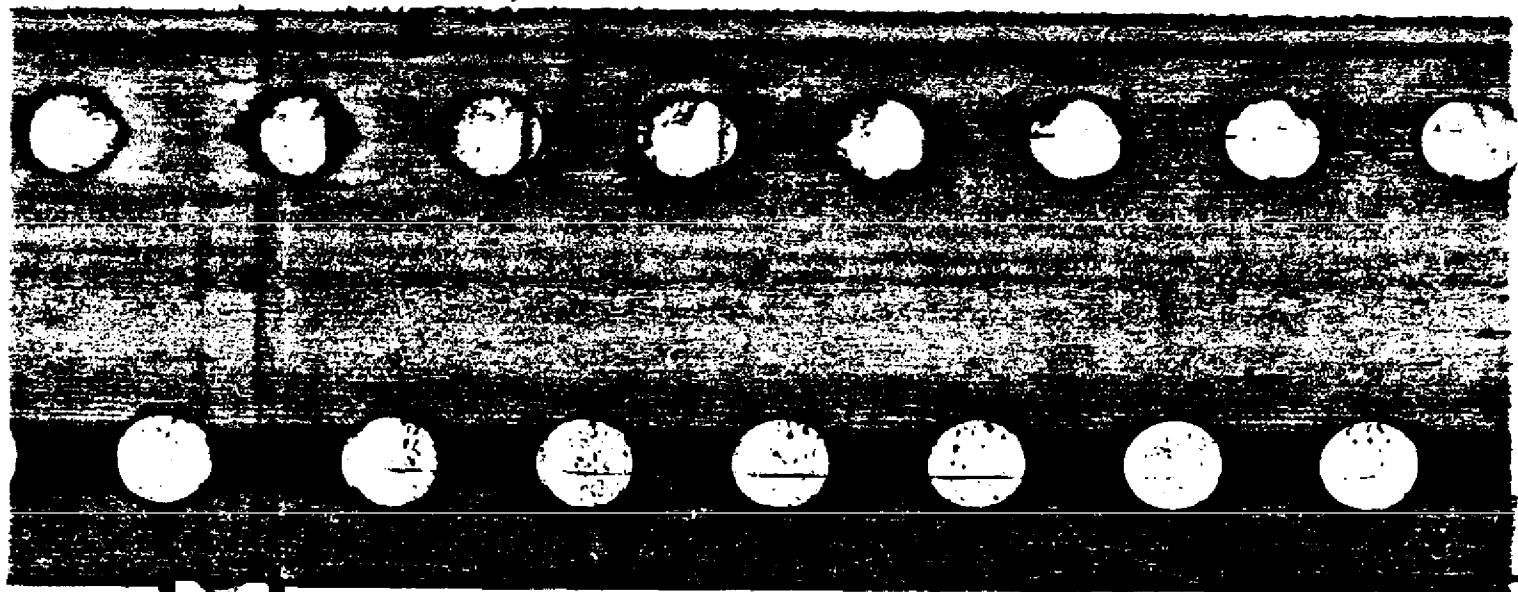
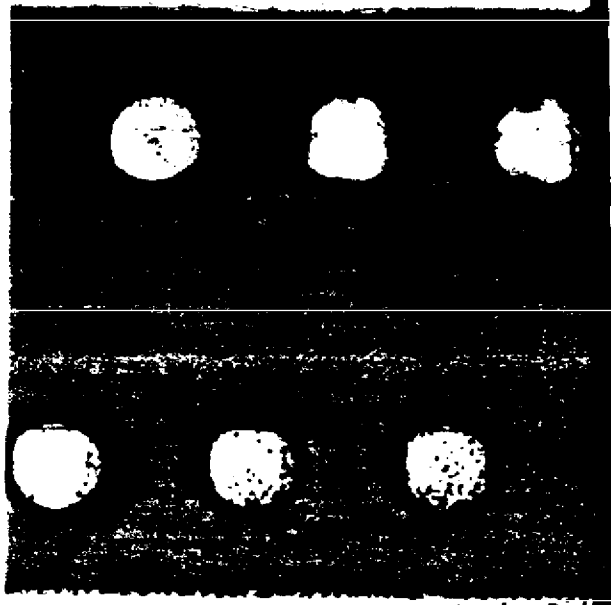
Shows final exit out of Cellhouse

CELL #152 Utility corridor view

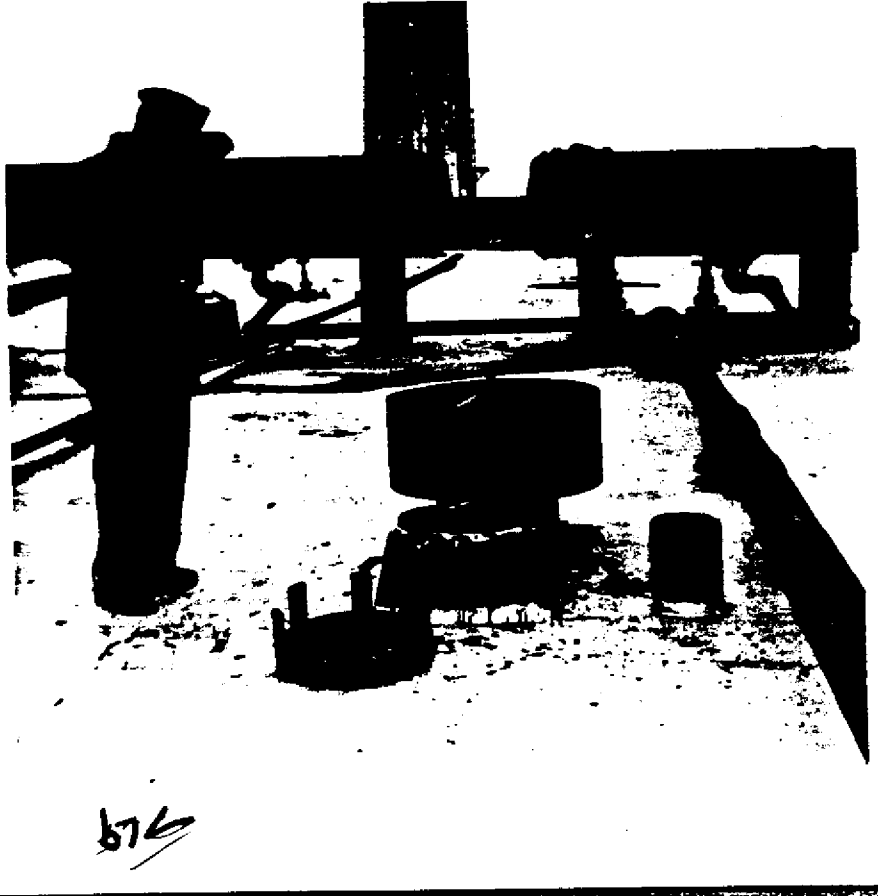
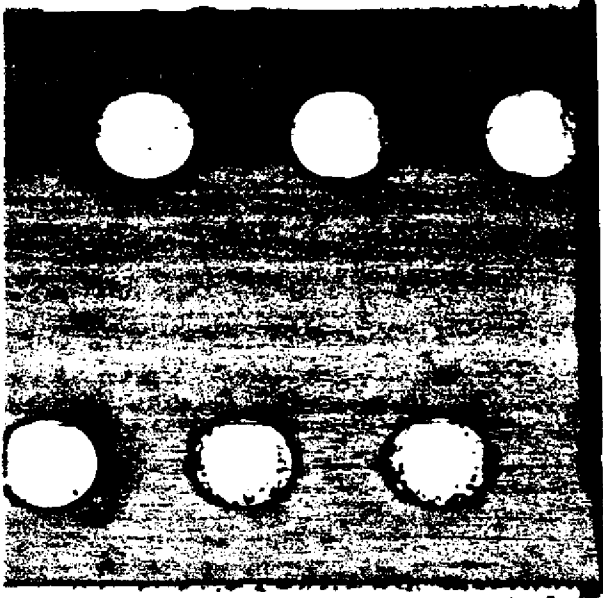

## Synopsis:

At 7:15 a.m., 6/12/62, FRANK LEE MORRIS, JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN, and CLARENCE ANGLIN, all inmates of the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz Island, California, discovered missing from their cells by officers of the Penitentiary, and dummy faces were found in their beds. Escaped by digging holes through back walls in ventilator areas of their cells; climbing plumbing pipes in utility corridor behind cells and then broke through bars and ventilator lid onto roof. Climbed down from roof on the large pipe at rear of cell house, over the fence, and to the northeast shore of the island. A similar hole in cell of inmate [REDACTED] as well as a dummy face. They left [REDACTED] about 9:37 p.m. on 6/11/62, supposedly to return and finish [REDACTED] hole, and not seen since. Later that night [REDACTED] completed the hole in his cell, proceeded to the roof, and ascertained they had gone. He returned to his cell and to bed. Escapees had taken a six foot by fourteen foot raft made from rubberized raincoats and three yoke life preservers similarly made. These articles had been made and stored on top of third cell tier under cell house roof, and Escapees had worked on same in evenings after breaking out of cell. [REDACTED] states they planned to escape to Angel Island in San Francisco Bay and then to the mainland. They would commit burglary to obtain guns and clothing; then steal a car and leave area. An authorized complaint was filed 6/13/62 before USC, San Francisco, b7c b7D

charging Escapees MORRIS and ANGLIN brothers with violation Title 18, Section 751, U. S. Code. Federal warrants issued and bond recommended in the amount of \$50,000.00 each. USA, San Francisco, withholding prosecution as to **[REDACTED]** at this time. **b7c**

DETAILS:

FACTS OF OFFENSE

On June 12, 1962, at 7:15 a.m., FRANK LEE MORRIS, Alcatraz No. 1441; JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN, Alcatraz No. 1476; and CLARENCE ANGLIN, Alcatraz No. 1485, all inmates of the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz Island, California, were discovered missing from their cells by officers of the Penitentiary. Dummy faces were found in their beds.

Their exit had been accomplished by digging holes through the back walls in the ventilator areas of their cells. Crawling through these holes into the utility corridor, they then used the plumbing pipes to crawl on top of the third tier of cells. Thence, they broke out onto the roof of the cell house through bars and a ventilator lid. They climbed down from the roof on the large pipe at the rear of the cell house and went over the fence, proceeding down steep embankments to the northeast shore of the island in the vicinity of the power plant.

A similar hole was discovered in **[REDACTED]** Alcatraz No. 1335, cell, as well as a dummy face. **[REDACTED]** stated they were to escape together, but the hole in his cell was not quite completed. At 9:37 p.m. on June 11, 1962, MORRIS went to get one of the ANGLINs to assist **[REDACTED]** but they never returned. Later that night **[REDACTED]** completed the hole in his cell and proceeded to the roof but they were gone. Also, a six foot by fourteen foot raft made from rubberized raincoats and three yoke life preservers similarly made were gone. These articles had been stored on top of the third cell tier under the cell house roof where Escapees had worked on same in the evenings after breaking out of their cells. **[REDACTED]** returned to his cell and went to bed. **b7c**

He said they had planned to escape to Angel Island in San Francisco Bay and then to the mainland. Upon arrival to the shore, they had planned to inflate the raft with a Concertina which they had made into a bellows. They would then commit burglary to obtain guns and clothing and then steal a car to go as far from the Bay area as possible. Beyond that no plans were formulated.

FEDERAL PROCESS

On June 13, 1962, Assistant United States Attorney FREDERICK J. WOELFLEN, San Francisco, California, authorized the filing of a complaint, which was filed by SA [REDACTED] b7c on the same date before United States Commissioner DONALD B. CONSTINE, San Francisco. The complaint charged FRANK LEE MORRIS, JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN and CLARENCE ANGLIN with a violation of Title 18, Section 751, United States Code, in that on or about June 12, 1962, at Alcatraz, San Francisco County, Northern District of California, they did escape from an institution; to wit, United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California, in which they had been confined by direction of the Attorney General of the United States. Federal Warrants were issued for their arrest and these were lodged with the United States Marshal at San Francisco.

Assistant United States Attorney WOELFLEN recommended bond in the amount of \$50,000.00 each.

On June 12, 1962, United States Attorney CECIL F. POOLE advised SA [REDACTED] b7c he would withhold prosecution at this time as to [REDACTED] pending location of the three Escapees.

PERSONAL HISTORY

RE: FRANK LEE MORRIS

MORRIS is a white male, whose birth is variously listed as September 1, 1922, 1925, 1926 and 1928, at Washington, D. C.; Mobile, Alabama; Elizabeth City, North Carolina; and Ednor, Maryland.

MORRIS' criminal history dates back to November 13, 1940, when he was committed to the National Training School

for Boys by the District of Columbia Juvenile Court and sentenced to six years, nine months and eighteen days. He was paroled and violated same and was remanded to the Federal Reformatory, Chillicothe, Ohio, on January 22, 1943. From November 19, 1945, to July 12, 1948, he served time for burglary at the Louisiana State Penitentiary. On January 11, 1949, he was received at the Florida State Penitentiary to serve four years for breaking and entering. He was received at the Louisiana State Penitentiary on June 13, 1952, to serve a ten-year sentence for possession of narcotics and armed robbery.

At the time of MORRIS' escape from Alcatraz, he was serving a sentence of fourteen years for bank burglary, which sentence he received on September 19, 1956. He was received at Alcatraz on January 18, 1961, as a transferee from the United States Penitentiary at Atlanta.

The bank burglary for which MORRIS was serving time at Alcatraz was committed in the company of [redacted] and [redacted]. They burglarized the Bank of Slidell, Slidell, Louisiana, during the night of November 24-25, 1955. They obtained \$6,165.00 in coins which weighed a total of 1,200 pounds. Entry to the bank was gained through a hole in the wall in back of the first floor. They attempted to come down through the ceiling through the office upstairs but did not succeed. A hole was burned in bank vault No. 1, but they did not gain access to it. They were successful in burning a hole in bank vault No. 2. Tear gas located in both bank vaults was discharged. MORRIS and his two accomplices were taken into custody by Sheriff and Deputies of Terrebonne Parish at Houma, Louisiana, in September 1956. **b7c**

They were accompanied by [redacted] and [redacted]. They were subsequently turned over to Federal authorities and charged with bank burglary. MORRIS and [redacted] entered guilty pleas on September 19, 1956, and MORRIS was sentenced to fourteen years on one count and five years on a second count, to run concurrently. [redacted] was last known to be at the United States Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia. [redacted] was incarcerated at the Federal Medical Center, Springfield, Missouri, for approximately three years and was then afforded a mental competency hearing. He was subsequently remanded to the Louisiana State Penitentiary on April 25, 1961, where he is presently incarcerated with a Federal warrant filed as a detainer. **b7c**

While MORRIS was incarcerated at the Florida State Penitentiary, he escaped on three or four occasions and presently owes time for these escapes. While incarcerated in the Orleans Parish Prison, New Orleans, Louisiana, on Federal bank burglary charges, MORRIS was in solitary confinement. On January 11, 1956, it was discovered he had sawed through two cell bars by using a piece of copper tubing and concrete from the floor as an abrasive. He was subsequently charged with an attempt to escape; however, this charge was dismissed when he entered a plea of guilty to the bank burglary charge.

On September 20, 1959, MORRIS attempted to escape from the United States Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia, with [REDACTED] b7c made good his escape but MORRIS was blocked off and was captured by a guard while running back to his cell. MORRIS denied implication in the escape attempt and was not prosecuted.

RE: JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN

ANGLIN is a white male, whose birth is variously listed as May 2, 1930 and 1931, and May 7, 1930, at Donalsonville, Georgia, and Colquitt, Georgia.

At the time of his escape from Alcatraz, ANGLIN was serving a 10-year sentence for bank robbery which had been imposed on February 10, 1958. He was received at Alcatraz on October 24, 1960, as a transferee from the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas. The crime for which ANGLIN was serving time at Alcatraz was committed by him in the company of his two brothers, CLARENCE and ALFRED.

The Bank of Columbia, Columbia, Alabama, was robbed on January 17, 1958, and subsequent investigation identified the three ANGLIN brothers as the robbers. They were apprehended January 22, 1958, at Hamilton, Ohio. At the time of their apprehension they were in the home of [REDACTED] b7c

On November 25, 1959, while serving time in the Federal Penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, ANGLIN attempted to escape by sawing through the bars of his cell. The following names and address were found hidden inside his fountain pen and a candy bar:

RE: CLARENCE ANGLIN

ANGLIN is a white male, whose birth has been variously listed as May 11, 1930, 1931, 1932; April 11, 1931, and March 11, 1930, at Donalsonville, Georgia, and Colquitt, Georgia.

At the time of ANGLIN's escape from Alcatraz, he was serving a sentence of 17 years for bank robbery and attempted escape. He received this sentence on February 10, 1958, and was subsequently transferred from the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, to Alcatraz.

The crime for which ANGLIN was serving time at Alcatraz was committed by him in the company of his two brothers, JOHN and ALFRED. The Bank of Columbia, Columbia, Alabama, was robbed on January 17, 1958, and subsequent investigation identified the ANGLIN brothers as the robbers. They were apprehended January 22, 1958, at Hamilton, Ohio. At the time of their apprehension they were in the home of

On October 8, 1960, CLARENCE ANGLIN attempted to escape from the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas, by concealing himself in two metal bread boxes. He had cut the top out of the lower one and the bottom out of the upper one and concealed himself between the two. His brother JOHN was believed to have assisted him, but this could not be substantiated. CLARENCE was discovered by a bakery steward while the improvised box in which he was concealed was still inside the bakery. CLARENCE had a knife and an improvised bar on his person. He offered no resistance. He received an extra two-year sentence as a result of this attempted escape.

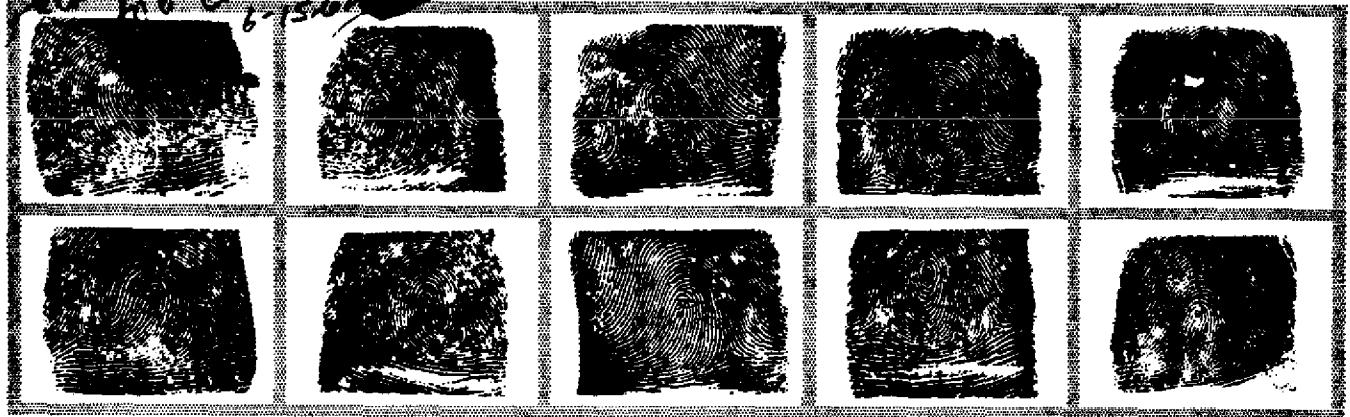

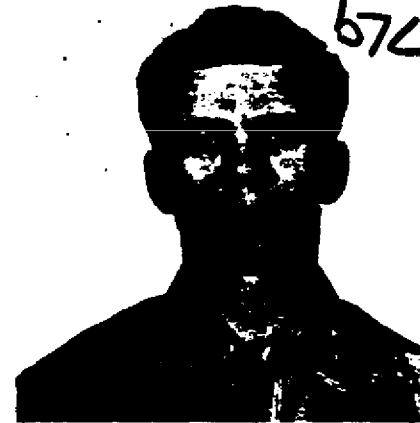

BLACKWELL then told ██████████ that SA ██████████ would desire that another Agent be present and after some discussion, ██████████ agreed that SA ██████████ could be present. BLACKWELL stated that ██████████ agreed to be interviewed by these Agents in private with no other inmates or prison officials in that area. b7c

Since the escape, Warden BLACKWELL has had his officers tear out eight ventilator holes in the roof of the main cell house and install new escape-proof metal bars and lids. In addition, his officers have systematically completed checking the first floor of B Cell Block on the east side and will proceed to do this through the entire Cell Block areas.

Accordingly, to protect ██████████ from the incorrigible inmates at Alcatraz, it was arranged through Warden BLACKWELL for his officers to check all cells on the third tier, east side of Cell Block B, particularly around the ventilator grills. SA's ██████████ and ██████████ started interviewing inmates on this tier and gradually interviewed inmates ██████████ and ██████████. By this time the holes dug in their cells had been located. ██████████ denied knowing anything as to the escape or as to digging any holes. b7c

██████████ furnished information as to ██████████ part in the escape attempt, as well as to the activities of the other subjects and their escape plans. ██████████ also advised that ██████████ and ██████████ another Alcatraz inmate, both confined in cells near ██████████ had acted as lookouts about one week each for ██████████ and then had told him they would not watch for him any more.
