



No suspects known to regarding the enclosed material.

A letter contains threat to individual reading letter, and mentions captioned matter, while reversed side of envelope contains threat to President Ronald Reagan.

Examination of return address area on face of envelope appears to have previously listed return address which had been written in pencil and which was subsequently erased, and the name "Bobby Doe" added over the erased impressions.

On 4/29/81, Special Agent (SA) U.S. Secret Service, Los Angeles, California, was advised of the enclosed letter, and on 4/30/81, Special Agent Los Angeles, Secret Service, obtained a copy of the letter.

REQUEST OF THE BUREAU

The FBI Laboratory is requested to determine if enclosed items bear similarities to any previously known letters received for examination and to examine the return address area of the envelope in an effort to determine writing impressions which have been erased.

The Identification Division is requested to determine if any latent fingerprints are on the envelope or enclosed letter.

a list of his preliminary findings concerning certain types of bairs and fibers that had been found common to the bodies and/or clothing of numerous murdered children and adults in the Atlanta, Georgia area.

cussed the results of his comparisons of these hairs and fibers with samples obtained from the home of Wayne Bertram Williams, 1817 Penelope Road, Northwest, Atlanta, Georgia, and fiber samples and other debris taken from a white Chevrolet station wagon driven by Williams.

findings, which A chart prepared to reflect is an attachment to this PD-302, contains the names of 28 mordared and one missing victims presently being investigated by the Task Force. The fifter findings as indicated on this chart were optained has advised that these results are based for the most part on microscopical comparisons of fibrous debrie from the clothing and/or bodies of various victims in these cases. Chemical tests, or tests other than a microscopical comparions have not been conducted. (John Harold Porter is not presently included on the Task Force's list of victims, but appears to be related to these cases by fiber evidence and is included on the list as victim number 30.7 the has also indicated that in some instances, these findings should be considered to be preliminary and additional microscopical work may be necessary. The association of many of these fibers, as well as other fibers, with Wayne Bertram Williams will be discussed later in this interview, and are not indicated on the attached chart.

advised that dog hair has been found on the clothing and/or bodies of nine (9) victims. These dog hairs include both guard hairs and fur hairs, with the guard hairs ranging in length from approximately one inch to three or four inches, and generally have a white base with a black tip. The fur hairs are almost all white in color. It was friginally felt that these hairs were consistent with coming from a Siberian Husky, an Alaskan Malamute, a Norwegian Elkhound, a Keeshond or a black and silver German Shepherd. There was some brown coloration in some of the questioned hairs.

The Williams family have a large, Shepherd-type dog that was tied in the back yard of their house at 1817 Penelope Road, during the search of the house on June 3, 1981. This dog does not appear to be a pure breed and the dog's cost has several shades of brown in it. Hair samples were obtained from the Williams dog and are presently being compared microscopically with the questioned dog hairs proviously removed from the victim's clothing and/or bodies.

Although this dog has more brown in its coat than would be expected from an examination of the questioned hairs, it is certainly consistent with the general type of large, long-haired dog that was expected to be the source of the questioned hairs. A microscopical examination and comparison of these dog hairs has not yet been completed.

Light violet secondary acetate fibers were removed from the clothing and/or bodies of eightsen (18) of the victims. In addition, light violet acetate fibers were also recovered from John Barold Porter.

These acetate fibers have been found in large numbers on some victims. This would indicate the acetate fibers came from a fabric composed of spun staple yarns, which would be expected to shed fibers very easily.

During the search of the Williamses' home, a large bedspread was prosent on the king size bed in the bedroom of Wayne R. Williams. This bedspread was composed of purple acetate yarns and light green cotton yarns and has a fringe of long, cotton yarns. The acetate fibers present in this bedapread exhibit the same microscopic characteristics as the light violet acetate fibers found on many of the victims and are consistent with originating from this bedspread. This bedspread also appears to be old and worn and would be expected to shod fibers easily because of its age, as well as its construction. The mas not reported finding any cotton fibers on the victims or their clothing, which could be compared with the cotton fibers on the bedspread. Light color cotton fibers are very common and are usually of no value for significant comparison purposes. However, these light green, cotton fibers would have also been transferred to the victims' clothing if the clothing had come in contact with the bedspread in question, and, accordingly, the victims' clothing will be searched for cotton fibers of this type.

Light violet fibers were found on the clothing from the homes of ten of the victims. Of these ten victims where light violet, acetste fibers were found on their clothing from their homes, only five (5) of the victims had light violet (ibers associated with them when their bodies were recovered.

Darron Glass was reported missing on September 16, 1980 and has not yet been located.

Michael McIntosh was recovered nude.

Eddie Duncan and Joseph Bell were recovered wearing only shorts.

Accordingly, in the above cases, the lack of the light violet fibers on the victims themselves can be accounted for by the small amount of clothing on the victims and that Glass has not been located.

Coarso, yellowish-green, nylon fibers were recovered from the clothing and/or bodies of 13 of the victims. In addition, a coarse, yellowish-green hylon fiber was removed from John Harold Porter.

These coarse, nylon fibers were compared microscopically with fibers present in the green, wall-to-wall carpet from the Williamses' home and were found to exhibit the same microscopic characteristics as present in the carpet fibers from the Williamses' home. A coarse, green, nylon fiber, similar to the fibers in the carpet from the Williamses' home, with the exception of having been subjected to considerable heat, was located in the hair from victim William Barrett. The green carpet in the bedroom of wayne 8. Williams has several charred or burnt areas.

The should be noted that the morphology of these green carpet fibers is somewhat different than carpet fibers normally encountered. Attempts to identify the manufacturer of these green fibers through contacts with fiber producers have been negative to date.

advised that light yellow, nylon fibers, which also appear to be from a carpet, were recovered from five (5) of the victims. Many of these fibers also appear

to have neen subjected to some type of heat or open flame. These nylon fibers exhibit the same microscopic characteristics as light yellow, nylon fibers that were found in the vacuum sweepings from the Chevrolet station wagon driven by Williams. Some of the light yellow, nylon fibers in the vacuum sweepings from the station wagon also had been subjected to some type of heat.

A number of light yellow, secondary, acctate fibers were recovered from victims Terrell and Baltazar. Light yellow, acctate fibers similar to those from Terrell and Baltazar were also recovered from clothing obtained at the homes of Baltazar, Joseph Ball and Eddie Lamar Duncan, after their bodies were recovered. An apparent source of these acetate fibers has not yet been identified.

Two dark green, hylon fibers were recovered from the shoes of William Barrett and exhibit the same microscopic characteristics as fibers present in the composition of the carpet in the white station wagon driven by Williams. These fibers recovered from the shoe of Barrett, could have originated from the station wagon driven by Williams.

advised that light violet, acetate fibers, microscopically like those in the bedspread from Williams' home, have been found on the clothing of three (3) days, but was found alive. - Left for Atlanta, Ga., via Eastern Airlines at 9:20pm, arrived Atlanta 11:00pm and went directly to the office. I photographed the suspect's vehicle, which totaled 30 photographs. As the crime scene search proceeded until 6:00 am 6/4/81, when the search was terminated. I then checked into a motel and returned to the office at 11:00am 6/4/81. I took an additional 15 photographs of the vehicle as the search was completed. I left the office at 7:30pm.
- Arrived at office 8:00am and was requested by Atlanta to call SA POFEU Unit Chief, and notify him that the subject's home was going to be searched and an additional photographer would be required. At this point SA conversed with SA and he then called Mr. Kelleher to explain the request for an additional photographer.







On 6/25/81 at 11:15 a.m., Commissioner Lee Brown, Atlanta, Georgia, called and stated he was getting inundated with inquiries from the news media for comment in response to statements attributed to FBI Agent \ He stated that if those comments were accurate, he believed they were certainly inappropriate. I told Commissioner Brown that we had called Agent yesterday and talked with him by phone and he advised the statements were taken out I told him we were in the process of conducting an administrative inquiry and that Supervisor was to be interviewed later today, 6/25/81, and a statement obtained from him. Appropriate additional inquiries will be made and then an analysis will be made for the purpose of making a determination as to whether. or not Agent acted improperly.

Commissioner Brown mentioned the fact that Agent was quoted in a magazine article recently and this appeared to be a second incident where he may have spoken improperly. Commissioner Brown asked my views on what should be told the news representatives, who were making inquiries of him.

I told Commissioner Brown that in a situation like this, we would advise the news representatives of our press policy and tell them that we had ordered an administrative inquiry. I pointed out to him the FBI policy was not to comment on the details of a pending case.

Commissioner Brown stated that he would respond to the news / inquiries by saying that he had contacted FBI Headquarters and was told that FBI policy was not to comment on details of pending cases and that the FBI was conducting an administrative inquiry regarding the comments attributed to Special Agent 23 JUL 7 1981

Commissioner Brown expressed appreciation for the opportunity to discuss this matter and stated he was certain that we could work things out in a manner that would be least disruptive to everyone's goal, that is reaching an early resolution of the tragic situation in Atlanta.





A review of records and old carpet swatches for the pertinent period several years ago determined that the only carpeting which seemed to have enough similarity to possibly be identical with subject's carpet was an E&B carpet with a trade name of "Pageantry." This carpet was manufactured by E&B only during the period 3/20/69 to 1/4/72. It was made of 100% Wellman nylon yarn consisting of 57% round nylon and 43% trilobal nylon. However, E&B's records show it to be Wellman type 151B nylon, rather than 181B nylon. The swatch enclosed for the Laboratory is the "Pateantry" trade name and is further identified as No. 131 and has a color name of "Winter Moss" which appears very similar or identical with subject's carpet.

The Laboratory is requested to compare the "Pageantry" carpet with Williams carpet in an effort to determine whether they could be identical as to type of nylon fiber, etc. \ Advise Atlanta and Dallas results of examination.

For the further information of the Atlanta Division, Evans and Black Carpets, Dalton, Georgia, would have access to records of dye standards used by E&B during the early 1970's.

If the Laboratory determines the Pageantry Carpet is identical to Williams carpet, Dallas can forward to Atlanta a list of several hundred retailers who handled carpet in the Southeast region for E&B as of 1975.

PURPOSE: To advise of the status of toxicological work in ATKID.

DETAILS: Complete toxicological examinations have been conducted on specimens from victims Timothy Hill, Larry Rogers and William Barrett. Tissues from Michael McIntosh and Nathaniel Cater were examined for dimethylsulfoxide. A general screening examination is being conducted on tissues from Nathaniel Cater, the victim for whose murder a suspect has been charged. This examination is restricted due to the poor quality of the submitted specimens. None of these examinations have indicated a drug, poison or other unnatural chemical substance.

While all logical courses have been pursued and test conducted were as thorough as possible, there remain many thousands of compounds which could have been used and still escape detection in these screening procedures. At this point the task becomes a matter of a random selection of one of these unique substances and conducting tests specific for that substance. The tests for each material would take hours to weeks. In the absence of specific leads, this would appear to be unreasonably inefficient. The Atlanta Office has been requested to review the background of the chief suspect in the case for names of any particular drugs or other chemicals with which he may be associated. No such substances have been developed to date.

RECOMMENDATION: That upon completion of the examinations on Cater's tissues, no further examinations should be conducted without specific leads developed through investigations ongoing in Atlanta. The tissues will be retained in the Laboratory for six months against the possibility of the need for additional tests.


