During July, 1971, the Black Panther Party (BPP) Chapter at Winston-Salem, N. C., operated from 1333 N. Patterson Ave., and 1306-A Underwood Ave. The establishment at 1333 North Patterson Ave. was purchased under a lease purchase agreement by HAZEL and LEE FAYE MACK; however, the MACKs continue to reside at 412 East 27th St., Winston-Salem, N. C., while the Patterson Avenue residence is being utilized as BPP Headquarters. The establishment at 1306-A Underwood Ave., is the residence of RUSSELL McDONALD, distributor of the BPP newspaper in North Carolina. LARRY DONNELL LITTLE, head of the BPP chapter, continues to reside periodically at 1326 Oak Street, residence of his mother OCHIE BELL LITTLE. LARRY LITTLE continues to receive telephone calls at both the Underwood Avenue and Oak Street addresses since the BPP has been unable to raise money for a telephone installation at the Patterson Avenue address to date.

A. SOURCES OF INCOME

During July, 1971, the group ordered or received an estimated 10,000 copies of the BPP newspaper, sales of which were under the direction of RUSSELL McDONALD. This appears to be the major source of income. [REDACTED] was not active during July, 1971, and there were no large donations noted. The BPP sponsored a solidarity rally for the High Point Four at a public park in High Point, N. C., on 7/25/71. The announced intent was to gain moral and financial support for the High Point Four who are four young blacks who were arrested at BPP Headquarters following a shoot-out when the High Point police evicted them. Approximately 200 people attended the rally and donations were nominal.

B. FOREIGN SOURCES

None reported.

C. EXPENSES

Half the price of the newspapers or \$875 would be owed to the California Headquarters of the BPP, in addition to an estimated \$20 per week air freight charge. As of 7/31/71, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] 1306-A Underwood Avenue, one of the current pads used by the BPP.

The new BPP Headquarters at 1333 North Patterson Ave. was purchased under a lease purchase agreement with a \$500 down payment and monthly rental of \$100 per month to be applied to the purchase price of the house.

The Winston-Salem group has requested permission from the California Headquarters to retain some of the money received from the sale of BPP newspapers to be used in making payments

[REDACTED] wanted to know why he had not received any information about the mule, and [REDACTED] indicated he had been away and that RUSSELL (LNU) was dealing with that situation and was presently in Beaufort, South Carolina. [REDACTED] said that the man already had a mule, but he still needed other things to work with on the farm, and that RUSSELL was working on that situation and would buy him what he needed to start operating.

[REDACTED] wanted to know where the man got the mule, and [REDACTED] did not have that information at this time and was instructed by [REDACTED] to find out about it as there had been too much talk about the situation and someone else probably worked on it and got it for him through one of the poverty programs.

It would appear that this information relates to WALLACE PARNELL of Burton, South Carolina who was the subject of a story appearing in the BPP newspaper "The Black Panther" issue of 8/9/71, page five, regarding the death of his mule "DOLY", which had fallen into a septic tank and drowned slowly.

Apparently as a follow up to the story featured in the BPP newspaper, the Party has been endeavoring to assist PARNELL in Burton, South Carolina by supplying him with another mule, but someone else apparently beat the Party out in this endeavor, and [REDACTED] is upset about it.

Of additional interest, specifically to the Atlanta Office, source indicated that [REDACTED] also discussed an individual by the name of SAM with [REDACTED] (who is believed to be SAM GILLIAM of the Atlanta Chapter of the BPP). In this regard, [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that SAM (GILLIAM) was in New York, and he said that SAM had been beaten in the head and was in a daze and was not talking since. [REDACTED] said he had informed the New York Chapter to have SAM checked right away by a doctor but had not received any

information and intended to call ANDREW AUSTIN about this situation to learn SAM's condition. [REDACTED] made no additional comment regarding this information, and no subsequent information was received from source indicating further contact regarding GILLIAM by [REDACTED] with BPP National Headquarters in Oakland, California.

In connection with other activities of the Winston-Salem group at this time, [REDACTED] said that the bail was presently set at \$14,000 for the group referred to as the High Point Four and the chapter was having difficulty in raising the money. He indicated that one woman (not identified) might take some money out of the bank for one of the four, however, they would have to pay this back plus the interest she would normally earn at six percent if her savings had been left in the bank, and he thought that this was possibly a good deal cheaper than obtaining funds in other manners (not specified).

[REDACTED] inquired of [REDACTED] about the brother that had been sent out from Winston-Salem (this presumably refers to GARY LILY of Winston-Salem, who arrived in the San Francisco area 8/7/71 to study community activity, shoemaking, and clothing manufacture). [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that this individual was working hard and was a good brother.

Columbia and Charlotte note the information pertaining to WALLACE PARNELL in view of possible additional publicity which may appear in the BPP newspaper or in local papers in South Carolina regarding assistance furnished to him by the BPP.

Atlanta and New York note the references to SAM GILLIAM. In this regard, New York is advised that SAM GILLIAM is a member of the BPP in Atlanta who apparently recently disappeared and has now turned up in New York and may presently be working with the BPP chapter there or at least in contact with ANDREW AUSTIN who has been requested to check on him.

For information of the Bureau, SAS [redacted] and [redacted] are assigned to the Winston Salem, N. C. Resident Agency. SA [redacted] is engaged full time in the investigation of the Black Panther Party and related matters. SA [redacted] handles security and extremist matters investigation in addition to his criminal investigation. During the course of their investigation, SAS [redacted] and [redacted] have interviewed many Black Panther Party members and former members associated with the Winston Salem, N. C. Chapter of the Black Panther Party.

On [redacted] advised SA [redacted] that a political education class was held Sunday night, [redacted] at Black Panther Party headquarters, 133 North Patterson Avenue, Winston Salem, N. C. There were approximately [redacted] people in attendance and during the course of the meeting, JULIUS WHITE CORNELL, Jr., Captain of Defense, brought up the subject of FBI Agents [redacted] and [redacted]. CORNELL commented that those two FBI Agents, especially [redacted] seemed to be checking into all phases of their activities. CORNELL stated

he felt these two Agents were hindering the progress of the Black Panther Party Chapter, and he considered them a major obstacle to the Black Panther Party activities in North Carolina. After some discussion among the group, CORNELL recommended that they obtain photographs of Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] which could be circulated among all Black Panther Party brothers. CORNELL commented that these two Agents should be watched to "learn more about their ways." Source quoted CORNELL as stating further "we must deal with this problem and we will be able to do so after we learn their ways". Source reported there was no further discussion of this matter at that time and no assignments were made to take photographs or attempt to observe the activities of Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Source advised SA [REDACTED], however, that [REDACTED] feels some action will be taken later and that probably specific assignments were made privately to individual "brothers" to obtain more information regarding SAS [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

SAS [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have been alerted for any indication of a photograph or physical surveillance by the Black Panther Party. Additional informants [REDACTED] being contacted to be alert for any information that Black Panther Party members plan to carry out any sort of surveillance of Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The Bureau will be promptly advised of any developments in this matter.

Attached sets forth information received from an informant of the Charlotte Division to the effect the Winston, Salem, branch of the Black Panther Party (BPP) are concerned over the investigation of their activities by Special Agents of the Winston, Salem, Resident Agency. At a meeting of the Winston, Salem, Black Panther Party (BPP) held on the evening of 8-15-71 Julius White Cornell, Captain of Defense mentioned SA's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stating they were a major obstacle to BPP activities. He suggested photographs of the Agents be obtained and circulated among BPP members. In addition, their activities should be watched. Informant advised no further discussion of this matter was held at that time.

SA's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have been alerted and other informants targeted to obtain additional facts. [REDACTED]

It is noted a number of the members affiliated with the Black Panther Chapter in Winston Salem, N. C., reside in High Point, N. C., a nearby city. These sources have been specifically contacted for any information indicating three or four "brothers" from the Winston Salem Chapter having traveled to Linden, N. J. or New York City recently. These sources had no information indicating anyone from the Winston Salem area had traveled to New Jersey or New York.

On 7/25/71, the BPP Chapter at Winston Salem sponsored a Solidarity Rally for High Point Four which was held in a public park in High Point, N. C. This rally was held to gain support for the four BPP members in custody awaiting trial following a shoot-out with police when the BPP was evicted from its local headquarters. Charlotte sources advise all BPP members were required to attend and these sources advised all active BPP members in this area were either in attendance at the rally in High Point on 7/25/71 or on guard duty at BPP headquarters in Winston Salem, N. C.

[redacted] says they have had the money for bond and also property bonds the Pritchard makes up excuses not to let them get out. [redacted] says that he would like to come out to SF. [redacted] says that would be alright but [redacted] would have to come up with his own money. [redacted] says that he wants [redacted] to send out one of his people. [redacted] says the person will be trained in community service; he will be trained in the operations of the clothing factory. [redacted] tells him that they have everything setup and even have people to train the brothers in the operations of the machines. 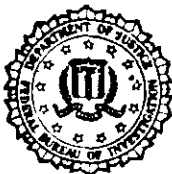

Speakers, according to LARRY LITTLE, would include GOLDEN FRINKS, Southern Christian Leadership Conference; BEN CHAVIS, North Carolina-Virginia Council for Racial Justice, as well as Attorneys JERRY PAUL and BUDDY TIEGER, who represented the High Point Four but who have been rejected by subjects since preliminary hearing.

CE T-1 advised that on July 25, 1971, the rally did not get under way until 3:45 P.M. on the pavilion of Washington Terrace Park with LARRY LITTLE welcoming the group which consisted of approximately 200 people, many of whom were the usual patrons who frequent the park on Sunday afternoons for picnicking and swimming. Thereafter, JULIUS CORNELL took over the microphone as master of ceremonies and introduced GOLDEN FRINKS as the first speaker.

GOLDEN FRINKS urged the blacks to fill up the local jail making the police feed them and turn loose chickens in the department stores in downtown area as propaganda and harassing tactics. He urged the blacks to visit white churches and not allow the ministers to preach until they assisted in raising bonds for the High Point Four.

BUDDY TIEGER did not appear; however, Attorney JERRY PAUL urged blacks to get on the jury in the up coming trial and vote "not guilty."

Thereafter, there followed a talk on solidarity for support of the imprisoned High Point Four by MARY MC DONALD of Winston Salem, North Carolina, and brief comments by GEORGE DE WITT.

On July 25, 1971, CE T-2 advised that among those at the rally from Winston Salem, North Carolina, were the MACK family, including CLARA, LEE FAYE, HAZEL, and RUTH, as well as NELSON MALLOY and MALIK.

CE T-2 reported that an unrecalled church in Greenville, North Carolina, brought a bus load to the rally and CE T-2 also observed 25 whites from Durham, North Carolina, wearing badges indicating they belonged to the "Peoples Treaty Organization."

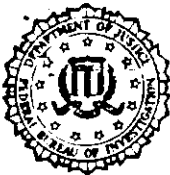

M., July 25, 1971, on behalf of "The High Point Four", who this source identified as individuals arrested February 10, 1971, after a shoot out on that date at Black Panther Party Headquarters, High Point, North Carolina.

On July 19, 1971, [REDACTED], North Carolina, advised that the rally reportedly is being arranged by JULIUS CORNELL, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on behalf of LARRY MEDLEY, RANDOLPH JENNINGS, BRADFORD LILLY, and GEORGE DE WITT, who are presently incarcerated and awaiting trial in Superior Court, High Point, North Carolina, during September, 1971, as a result of a shoot out at Black Panther Party Headquarters, High Point, North Carolina, February 10, 1971.

[REDACTED] added that CORNELL appears anxious to develop moral and financial support for these individuals in their upcoming trial.

This developed no information and ATF Agent [REDACTED] advised he knew of no one in the Winston-Salem, N. C., area, he would consider a logical possibility in this matter.

On 6/8/71, all Pistol Permit Applications held by the Forsyth County SO for the last three years were reviewed in an effort to develop similar handwriting. This was negative.

On 5/4/71 [REDACTED] PD, who are knowledgeable in Negro racial and/or firearms matters in this area, were contacted concerning this matter. None could provide the name of anyone who could logically be the prospective Firearms Editor.

On 6/25/71, these same individuals were again contacted with negative results.

It has been noted the writer who aspired to be the anonymous Firearms Editor of the Black Panther Paper went to some lengths and planned to go further to hide his identity. In keeping with this effort to maintain his anonymity, it is logical to believe he may have traveled to the Winston-Salem area to post this letter.



While at Winston-Salem she observed no automatic weapons and one of the members whose name she does not recall attempted to show her how to shoot a rifle, however, she is afraid of guns and was unable to handle a rifle. She was required to attend the opening of the Black Panther Party Office in High Point, North Carolina, during December, 1970, with all the other members. She advised that the panther members, after selling their newspapers for \$.25 each, turned all of the money back into the individuals in charge of the group and received their necessities such as

BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP), also known as  
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to the official newspaper of the BPP, the BPP was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY G. SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, GEORGE MURRAY. This article ended with the following:

"Black men, Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

DAVID HILLIARD, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said "We will kill Richard Nixon."

DAVID HILLIARD, in the "New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by the Minister of Culture EMORY DOUGLAS as follows:

"The only way to make this racist U.S. government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, is . . . by taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forces . . . are dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U. S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Fascism, under control of the BPP, have been established in various locations in the USA.

Re Director's airtel to SAC, Albany, 5/17/71, captioned "National Firearms Act, State Firearms Control Assistance Act, Unlawful Possession or Receipt of Firearms, Racial Matters".

Concerning the BPP within the Charlotte Division, it should be noted there is a chapter located at Winston Salem, N. C., with some activities of this chapter carried out at High Point, N. C.

Informants and other sources and law enforcement officers have reported the group in possession of approximately 12 rifles and shotguns, none of which are in violation of Federal Firearm Laws. No information has been developed that the group is in possession of explosives or has made other incendiary devices such as molotov cocktails for stockpiling.

Appropriate informants have been alerted to the Bureau's desire to receive information concerning possession of weapons by black extremists and this has been followed closely. In addition, during the development of background data concerning each BPP member, particular emphasis has been given to that phase pertaining to arrests and military service which could possibly place the individual in a category where ownership of weapons would be a violation.

There are currently no firearm law violations under investigation concerning the BPP, however, in the event information is received of a possible violation, investigation will be immediately instituted.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP), also known as  
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to the official newspaper of the BPP, the BPP was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY G. SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, GEORGE MURRAY. This article ended with the following:

"Black men, Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

DAVID HILLIARD, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said "We will kill Richard Nixon."

DAVID HILLIARD, in the "New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by the Minister of Culture EMORY DOUGLAS as follows:

"The only way to make this racist U.S. government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, is . . . by taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forces . . . are dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U. S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Fascism, under control of the BPP, have been established in various locations in the USA.

Special Agent of Charlotte Office was present at High Point Police Department at time to insure information of interest in Bureau's investigation of BPP was obtained. He was requested by police department to take major case prints of the Panthers arrested in connection with the shooting. Special Agent took prints and has been subpoenaed to appear in local court at High Point 5-10-71 to testify he fingerprinted subjects and observed them signing fingerprint cards. Testimony necessary in chain of evidence to show identity of individuals. Special Agent in Charge, Charlotte, recommends Special Agent testify and U.S. Attorney has no objections. Domestic Intelligence Division concurs with recommendation of SAC.
