

Revenge, gangster quarret held motives in Bugsy Siegel murder

Two slugs that punctuated the career of Bugsy Siegel last night with some pretty definite periods, also left some pretty important question marks.

Who did tt? Why? Who's'

Bugsy's life was not see that lacks in plenty of meet for theorizing as to who dunit and why —placing a finger almost daywhere in any known racket could develop a reason for billing him.



He said he had been sitting nearest the window, directly in the line of fire, and that one of the .30 caliber carbine shots had ripped through his sleeve?

"I didn't even notice it in all the excitement," he said, "until somebody pointed at my coat sleeve when I got to the Beverly Hills police station."

He admitted that he was assoclated with "Bugsy" as a stockholder in the ganglord's fabulous \$5,000,000 Flamingo gambling casino in Las Vegas, but added "I don't know of any trouble that could have caused shooting, and I have no ide vho could have fired

'A COMPLETE SHOCK'

"It all came as a complete hock to me and I have no nkling of what was behind it." A few minutes before taking the stand Smiley went to the county morgue, where Siegel's body has lain unclaimed on a slab, and identified the body.

He looked at the body for a few seconds and said laconically:

"That's him."

BIG TOE TAGGED

The body was unclad, save for a sheet, and a tag attached to the big toe of the right foot marked the gangster's epitaph. It read:

"June 21, 1947. Hoznicide. Benjamin Siegel, 810 North Linden drive."

Later the coroner's office was notified by Groman's Mortuary, 830 West Washington boulevard, that they had an order signed by Dr. Maurice Siegel, the slain man's brother, to remove the body for funeral services and burial Arrangements were being com pleted today.

A second witness, the flaming red-haired Miss Mason, corrobor ated Smiley's story before the jury which returned a verdict that the underworld czar's death was caused by a cerebral hemorrhage "as a result of gunshot wounds inflicted by a preson or persons unknown.

"I was upstairs with Mr. Hill pulling tacks out of a carpet because we were going to move to Florida.

Continuing her testimony, Miss Mason said "we heard guick shots downstairs."

"Then I heard Mr. Smiley yell for us to call a doctor quick," she said.

They're shooting through the windows,' he was yelling. Douse all the lights'."

In answer to Chief District Attorney S. Ernest Roll's query as to whether Siegel maintained a room regularly at the Hill home, she said:

"There was a guest room there, and many guests used

"Did Mr. Slegel have a key to the door?" "I don't know," she replied.

PARIS CABLE

Miss Mason also testified that telegram to Charles Hill from is sister was received from Paris n June 20, which read:

"Arrived O. K. Send all of my things in care of Nicholas Foulilatte, 4 Rue de Castiglione, Paris."

Charles Hill also took the stand briefly, relating the same story told by the others.

After the inquest, District At torney William E. Simpson "invited" Hill and Miss Mason to his office, where they were interrogated at greater length.

District attorney's investigators revealed that Miss Mason. who once was personal hair-dresser to Marie "The Body" Mo-Donald, was engaged to Hill and that they planned to marry soon.

Efforts were being made to prevent a large Chicago-style gangster funeral, and keep the services private for the sake of Siegel's two daughters, Barbara, 14, and Millicent, 16, who arrived here from New York last Sunday.

Meanwhile, it was reported from Las Vegas that Miss Hill, who had left for Paris a week before the slaying, became ill from an overdose of alceping tablets when she visited the Nevada resort town with the gang chief last month, according to Clark County Physician Jack Cherry.

Siegel brought her to the dec tor's office on May 5 to have her stomach pumped out, Dr. Cherry said.

"When I asked them whether it was an accident or a suicide attempt, they would give neither reason nor motive," he said.



Warren to Open State Probe of Gangsterism

Governor Exrl Warren today declared he is "alarmed" has the development of organised gangsterism in California and will launch a special crime commission investigation into every phase of underworld operations and official corruption.

His disclosure of the plans was accompanied by caustic comment about the development of an Eastern-type "mob" underworld in the state. It takes when he was asked whether he is "disturbed" by the gang activities offinaxed by the killing of Benjamin "Bugay" Biegel, the nation's top "mob" leader.

"Yes—I am concerned about It," Warren replied. "No one can read of an assassination like Biogel's and listen to the stories of organized gangsters coming into our state without having great concern over it.

SALARMING'—

"We kept the gangsters out for many years and it is alarming to see them coming in now."

The Governor said he intends to use 5B \$41, creating a special commission for crime studies, "to look into conditions throughout the state and make an appraisal of them for the purpose of getting enforcetment agencies together to stop the spread of organized crime."

The Governor said law enforcement activities in the state are ceptered in the Department of justice, headed by Attorney General Fred N. Howser. But when asked whether he has inquired of Howser what steps the Attorney General is taking, Warren re-

"The only general law onforcement official in the state is the Attorney General. The constitution says he is the chief law enforcement officer in the state and shall have direct supcevision of the District Attorneys and Shariffs to maintain law and artist."
