## Cops: 8 cases linked to pair in FBI shoot-out

## JON ONEML


Metro robbery detectives, working with the FBL, say they hope to close as many as efght unsolved cases with the deaths of two suspectis killed during Friday's shoot-out with FBI agents.

The gun batile teft iwo agents, Eenjamin Grogan and Gerald Dove, dead on a South Dade street. Five other agents were wounded.

Metro $\mathrm{Sg}_{\mathrm{g}}$. Sandy Gutiman, who is working on the unsolved cases, said Grogan had made a prophetic temark to Metro detectives while they worked on the robbery cases:
"He said, 'Whoever comes across these guys first will really have their hands full."
"Or all the people it could have happened to, it is unbelievable it was him." saddened Guttman caid today. "We knew these guys were dangerous and ruthless."

Police suspect the dead men, Michael Lee Platt. 32. and Willinm Matix, 34, were involved in at least four robberles in Dude County tince October 1985, including athooting at a South Dade rock pit. Gutiman said police are waitiog fotursutis of

## Cops' theory on killers: Each slew the other's wife

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Five days after William Matix and Michael Platt killed two FBI egents in gunfight on Kendall street. detectives are pursuing a bizarre theory of spousal homicide - that each man murdered the other's wife.

Columbus Police Capt. Antone Lenate said Tuesday that Platt is: suspect in the murder of Patricia Matix.

In South Florida, investigators want to know where Matix was when Platis wife died of a shoigun blasi, believed suicide at the time.
"The two men were super. tight," said Metro-Dade robbery Sgt. Tony Monheim. "They went everywhere together. I-mean it was ridiculous. I think they might have even had some kind of pact together to kill their wives." So

bled to phone and dialed 911. The first time he got it wrong.
Matix was crouching between the right front corner of the Cutlass and the left front of a gold Camaro, which belonged to anoth. er resident. He began firing. At the came tme, Agent Manauzzi was crambling out of his gray Buick. Platt, still in the driver's seat of the Monte Carlo, pired the shotgun at Manauzzi. Buckshot grazed him cross the back
Manauzad was the first agent down. He crawled to cover
Seconds later, Grogan and Dove pulled up, right behind Manauzzi's car. They saw Platt with the thotgun. They slid hurriedly out the driver's-side door, knelt in sparse grass behind the left rear of their Buick and begen firing. Both had 9 mm semi-sutomatic pistols, but they couldn't get clear shot at Platt. Apparently. they didn't even see Matix, ducked down between the Cuthass and the Cemmo.
Special Agent Gordon McNelll, supervisor of the bank robbery surveilance, came learing south down 82nd Avenue la creamy yellow 1985 Buick LeSabre. He jerked the car to halt, the front end perpendicular to the back of Manauzri's car and the front of Grogen's.

## 'It wasn't doom'

Before McNell left for work that morning, his wife, Elaine, had anagging fear sbout the survelltence. "It wasn't doom ${ }^{\text {" }}$ the cat "It was fust reilizing that it and whea they did catch up with these two, that probably momething would happen."

Elane HeNeill had been ecretary in the FBI offloe for elght yeart. She didnt tay toything to her busbend, but somehow she may have communlcated her tears. McNeill was the only agent wearing bulletproot vest duriag the shoot-onk.

Unfortunately. 基 Sant much.

McNelll is a ble blond zuy, and when he fumped from his car he made anteryetarget. Somehow,


Matix missed him. McNeill dove behind the truak of his car.
Other igents were folining the buttle.

Azent Hanlon ran from his cold Chrysler after crashing fato the FPL wall. Someone had written on the wall: "Prychotropic Drugs Kill." Mireles, Hanlon's partder, dove alongside McNeill behind the Lesabre. He had a hotgun.
A shot hit McNell In the hand but be kept fring his dx-Ehot Smith Wesson. As he turned to reload, Matty hit him in the back with the Ruger Minl-14.
The weapon fires slug at 3,200 feet s secood. It Is desigaed so that the 223-callber bluge spla out of the barrel, tumbling timont. When they strite the human body, they chred internal ortans.

## Shot in the back

The siog mirack McNeill in the back fust outside the bulletproof vest. As the bullet ripped lato his stent exity, McNell tutnbled ais cards tato the mildale of 82 nd Avenue and fell. Two agents were dowa.

Roughly 30 seconds had elapsed siace the Monte Cerlo crashed.

Agents Grogan, Dove,and Hanlon were stll urying to get a clear thot at Platt. He was hiding between the Monte Cutlo and Mansuzd's car. Dove and Grogan were using the 9 mms . Hanlon had a Ife-shot Smith \& Wesson he pulled from an ankle bolster. He way hit once fin the hand but kept liring.
Behind the LeSabre, Mireles wa: oryine to get aclear shot at Matx, who was about 30 yards away still belween the cuthas and the Camera.

It was Matix who tot a clear thot at Mireles. The projectile caught his la the left forearm, severios the booe in one place and oplintering it In othera.

Mrele plumped to the zround In his red Windbreaker. Three Asente down.
-special Apente toonld Reigner. tat Gilbert Orrantia were braklog to thalk thireles Iell. They topped about 40 yards morth of MoNefli's car on the went side of the rasd.
Relsper is aWAT tean syeat, and he had his Grom with hlm. He saw Matix crouching near the Cutlass and opened up. Matix returned the fire. He hit Orranti

## Returning fire

Matix kept bobbing up and down beside the Cutlass Uke a caraval target - only he wes returning fire. geisner concentrated on Matix. One slug ricocheted off the rool of the Cutlass and lodged in trim board on the rool of the duplex. Another struck the Camaro, tearing strip of puint from the front bood. Thet bullet, too, bounced off and lodged in the roof.

Fially, Reisnet hit hls mark.
He eot Matix in the left forearm. and the slug ruplured an artery. A coroner would later describe this as a "spurting wound." It sprayed blood lo a narrow jet, all over the ground and the side of the car.
What it ralted to 60 was stop Matix.

The eunman crept away lrom Reisner toward the trunk of the
Cutless - and toward agents Grogan, Dove and Haslon. Reliner no longer had a clear shot.

He screamed at Grogan, Dove and Hanlon.
"He's coming around! He's com-

Iof round!"
The three agents, will crouched behind the trunk of Grogan's lemon-yellow Buick, were concentrating on Platt. They didn't hear Relsmer. And they didn't see Matix - until it was too lite.

Suddenly he was leaning over the trunk of Grogan's Bulck. He was iming the Ruger.

## Last words

"Oh, my God!" Grogan gasped.
It was the hast thing be said. Metix thot Grogan once in the chest, tevering the wort. The egent died tastantly.
Matx then shot Dove tour times. twice in the heed. He too ded Jastantly. Hanlon, without mmualtion, isy on the pround. Matlx ahot him in the groln, and Hanlon passed out.

Seven agents dows.
Matix tepped over the two dead genta. He stw Mireles in the red windbrekker, sitimg in the rasd behind the trunk of McNell's LeSibre. The agent was dazed and bleding.
Matix fired and missed.
Blood spurting from his arm, Matix collapsed into Agent Grosen's car and pulled himself to the
pursenger dide.
Platt mode his way around the front of Grogan's car and started toward the driver"s gent.

They were trying to get away.
Mireles. 33, huge, muscular man of 250 pounds, was still on the ground. But be levered the shotgun up with his good right arm and fired.

The blest struck Platt in the foot. He leaped into the car. Mireles fired at least two other times, the pellets ripping into the engine of the car.
The car wouldn't stert. When Platt turned the fgntion, the etarter whined.

## No one can say

No one, not even Mireles, can cay precisely what happened next.
Police sireas screamed in the distance, closer and closer. Agents Lay dead and wounded around him, and Mireles had emptied the shotgun's five rounds. The shell casings bay on the grouad beside him.
Agent Reisner was running toward Grogan's cer and the two gunmen. Even now, Reisner doesp't remember whether he put mis bulletproof vest on or beld it in front of bim Uke a shield. The tew eyewltnesser soid he held it in front.
Somehow, Mireles fot to his teet.
There were aimost seven yards between him and Grogan's car. Walkjag slowly, losing blood and berely consclous. Mireles walked the distance, emptying his Smith \& Wesson revolver at the two men in the car.
He shot Platt in the spine. He blt Matix in the face. Then he shot Matix In the splae. Both men were paralyzed.

Moments later, they were dead.
Iacredibly, Mireles wat atil on Wis feet whed be reached the car. Agent Relsner ras up behind him. He looked once at platt and Matix fa the front went. Then the eased Mireles to the bloodied grass.

, Eariler that morning, EHefted Platt had pleked up his best lriend, Millan Matx, 34, : violenceprone borm-again Christian. Matix wore work pants, blue pullover and heavy boots. Earlier he hed kised his 2-year-old daughter. Melissh, and said goodbye to the housekeeper. She kald later she never saw the .357 Magnum tucked into the leather choulder bolster:

Platt was dressed almost exactly Like Matlx, except for a buiky vest that concealed bis shoulder holster. It held a much fancier gun. a .357 Dan Wesson revolver loaded with 38 -callber roupds. Gun thops often sell the Dan Wesson in an ouk case with two to four inter. changeable barrels. Depeading on the aumber of barrels, the gun poes for anywhere from $\$ 400$ to数00.
the car had been used in several bunk robberies after it had been stolen. They wanted it bsdly.
"We're looking good." It" was Grogan eguin. "NPJ.891."

In the car with him, Grogan's partner was ready. This was what if was all about, for Special Agent Gerald Dove. He had law degree and could have had measy job behind s desk. But he was alweys telling friends how much he loved bis work at field agent.

Grogan and Dove both loved the camult of the strets. But lio some ways they were different, emblems almost, one of the old FBI. the other of the new FBI.

On this Friday morning. Grogan wore a Hght blue button-down कhltt easd dart tie. He favored the kind of beavy brogues that used to be made with crepe and gum-rubber soles, the find that gave old-time lawmen the alckname "gumshoes."
Before he'd ieft home, Grogan had done his usuad 50 push ups. He was a marathon numer who ran on bis lunch hour every day at Miami's Moore Park, 765 NW 36th Si. He worked hard at staylng in shape, but he had to. After all, he was 53, a year from reifement.
With his shagey brown hair. Dove looked ilmost like collegt

it.'

Lid. He was 30. On this Friday, he was wearing his ususi survelliance outfit: faded feans, trendy tennis shirt and runaing shoes.

## Good marksmen

Both gents were trained in SWAT team tactics. They were good marksmen, in great shape.

Beione Dove ieft hame Friday. be listened absently to the morning news as he shaved. There seemed to be lots of talk of terror this morning: Terror in the Middle Esti, in Europe. Terror in the skies.
As Grogan and Dove followed the dapk Monte Certo, they couldn't know that the terror was about to hit home.
The Monte Carlo made a right pura on Southwest 117th Streel. The driver was Michael Platt, 32, at peculfar gata who mowed lawns or Uving. He had spotted Grogan"s car. It was a hard car to miss, bie lemon-yellow Bulet Century, 1 gom model. It had trowe root.

The tine: 9.18.

## 10 rounds a minute

In the Monte Carlo, MuIx and Platt had two other wetpons on the seat. Plati liked the chort Smith E Wesson 12 -gatoge thotgun, fited with a pistol Erip. The gun hat no stock and measures about three feet. Matix had Ruger Mini-14 semi-automatic assault rifle. It has a folding giock and a 30 shot-clip. It can flre 40 rounds a minute.
Grogan and Dove didn't koow exactly what was in the Monte Carlo as they tralled It through the quiet neighborhood
"Southwest 81st Rasd, hesding south tgain." Grogan Eaid caimly into the car radio. Other agents were moving in fest.
"Right behind ys, bebe, give me - cross street."

It was Special Agent John Henlon. He was in gold Chrysler: 1983 model. Speclal Agent Edmundo Mireles was in the seat beside lim.

The Monte Carlo turned right on 120th Street, then a quick left onie B2nd Avemue. Special Agent Richard A. Manauzzi, in a gray Buick. fell in behind the gold Chrysler.

That made four cars in sow: The suspects in the Monse Cerlo, Grogan and Dove in the yellow Buik. Hanlon and Miteies in the gold Chryster and Mansuzzi in the gray Buick.
They were doing about 35 miles an hour as they passed Dr. H.R. Frick's Anlmal Orthopedic Hospital and the rear of a Farm Siore. where deliverymen were unloading boxes.
"Ben, we're right behind yat Bea." Hanlon radioed. "Do you wamt to do ht? Let's do it."

Let's get some marked units. let's get some," Grogan suld.

## Happened too fast

They didot. Everything happened too fast.
"If just looked at them and there are guys holding up something in the car," Grogan said. Matix and Platt were grabbing their guns.
The time 9:19. Grogan made a decision.
"Falony car stop," be ordered. "Let's do his."

At the FBI Academy in Quantico, va, every agent is tuught how to make felony car stop. The procedure is diagrammed, executod and reviewed as carefully as a militery landing or a football play. Other law enforcement agencies teach modified versions of the felony sar stop procedure. In every case, the object is to stop a neeing vehicle whise enabling police to control the vehicle's movement and maintain cover from any gunfire.

This time, it didn't work.
Grogan accelerated around the Monte Carlo, almost certainy on the driver's side, according to crime-scene technicians who meensured tire tricks afterward. Han-
the FPL station, fust north of the Monte Cario.
Platt gol the car going agkin. completed the U-turn and bolted north. The stall gave Manauzzi just enough time to complete his U-tura. As the Monte Carlo rocketed north up the street. Manauzzi rammed it hard on the driver's ज्ञाe.
The two cars careened up and over the sidewalk and slammed into 20 -year-old bottiebrush tree. They had traveled maybe 30 yards, locked together. Starlied neighbors peered from windows. The time: 9:20.
The bloodiest atoot-out in FBI history began seconds later.

Maux clambered out the Monte Carlo's passenger-side window. He couldn't get has door open because it was wedged tightly egainst a caf aiteaty parked in the driveway, shiny black Cutlass. It belonged to Cory Sukert. 21, a University of Miami senior, He was in the house, looking out.
He saw Matix. clenching the Mini-14 assaute rife, slither across the Cutlass' bood. Sukert thought first of his car polish, then he hit the floor. Frantically, he secres.

lon, in the gold Chrysler. gunned the engline and tried to pull up on the right side of the Monte Carlo, as Manauzzi moved up behind it. Platt swerved the Monte Cario to the right, bashing Hanton's gold Chrysier on the lefi front quarter panel and driver's door. Both cars rebounded and spun out of ember:

The Chryster knocked down a three-foot post, took out a spindly melaieuch tree and slammed into the wall of a Floritis Power \& Light substation.
The Monte Carlo shot up onto. the grass io the same direction and uprooted another melaleuca. Platt yarkedithe wheel lo a tharp teft
un and acctierated erylag to complete I U-turn. His cer hit another thick, three-foot post.

Green radiator fluid spewed - vidly. The Monte Carlo stalled. Grogan made a U-tura about 30 yards down the rond. Manauzed yord the same the the driveway of

This, and the fact some propectlles were nover recovered, may pisuent investigalors from ever making a full and cemplete reconstruction.

Highway in Suniland. The afents had spent months trying to track down the two suspects by the time they spotted the pair driving in a stolen car.

The bottom line . . . is that we didn't want (Matix and Plati) 10 get back on South Dtxle Highway," Hinlon said.

McNeil, who was in charge of the investigation, talked bout the dedication of his "extremeiy close comin ies."
"I'm glad they (Matix and Platt) were not able to go on and burt anybody else," sald

McNell, who still has a butet lodged in an area just above his colon. "I'm glad we were sble to help the public."
Hanlon described Matix in the gun bettle es "grade B . opaghetti Westera bod man."

Ed Mireles, the FBI agent who charged beck so slay the two Elliers after being wounded, was to be reieased from South Miami Hospital today or tomorrow, said hospltil spokesman.
"We won't know when he will be relessed untll his physician gives the OK," Tom Jones said. "He took a pretty power. fulhit."

"I also want to thank all the fire rescue personnei that went out to the scene after the shooting to help us. I want to thank all the EMTs lemergency medical technicians for their tine work, all the helicopter crewi that responded and risked their uves to help us." he said.

I want to thank the ooctors, the nurses and the staff of South Minml Hospital," he continued. "They're tremendous people. They id a tremendous pob , literally putting my arm back together. 1 can't thank them enough. They'll always have \& place in my heart."

Smiles on the faces of the hospital personnel who stood nearby sllently returned Mireles' compliment.
"I also want to thank the public," the agent continued. "The public has been tremendous. I have recelved hundreds of letters from people and schoolchildren with thelr support and their prayers and theirmell wishes.
"Aad I really - personally and for the

F8I - appreciate the support that the public has given us. Thank you." And then the blg man - dressed in slacks, brown and blue-striped knit shirt and loafers - left. There was nothing more be needed to say.

He was stlll smling as he stood to enter a white, unmarked bureau vehicle, Jeep Wagoneer with the look of bulletproot class and.armor.

As the vehicle pulled out, two other egents were inside. One was Mireles' wife. Liz.

## Agent's mother is proud of son

BEEVILLE - Like many events of its kind, the Mismi thootout that took the - lives of two FBI agents last Friday has ? nippled throughout the nation. It carried - special meaning to this South Texas lown. The mother of Fol special weent Ed Mir-
i eles, wounded in the shootour and credited with killing two bank robbery guspecis, is on her way to her son's bedside in Miami. Mireies, sccording to eyewiness sc. counts, was seriously wounded by gunfire. But retrieved his weapon and fathlly shot fwo men who earlier had killed two FBI

"Yes. I am proud of him, but I didn'l want this to happen." Mrs. E.M. Mireles said of her 33 -year-old son, a native of

Alice who gradusied from high school in Beeville.
Mrs. Mireles said her son had surgery Tuesday, but was due for more. She said physicians will tranaplam skin from hie legs to abadly wounded left arm.
Mireles' condition is listed as fieir at a Miami hospital.
"I min flying from Corpus Christi at 6:49 .m. Thursday to be with him and hir wife. Lic." suid Mrs. Mireles.
Mrs. Mireles said it has been hard to concentrate since the FBI notified her last Fridey of the shoolout and the wounding of her son.
"I haven'i been able to think of anything else since I received the telephone call," she said. "My mind has been on Miami."

Mireles traduated in 1972 from A.C. Jones High School, where he played. fuotball and buskeiball.
Following high school. Mireles served four years in the U.S. Marine Corps. 7n. cluding embassy duty in Sophia. Bulgsha. He was lop-ranked sharpshooter in the Marines.

After he was discharged, she snid, Mircies. ertiered and graduated from the Universuly. of Maryland.
"He applied for the FBI and was accepted" in 1979. Mrs. Mireles said.
Mireles served at the FBI headquarters in Washingion, D.C., beíne transferting ito Miami about ycar ago. His wife also is;an FBI agent. They have been married slighly. more than a year, Mrs. Mircles said.

Knigm-Aider Naws Smores.
MLAMI - As bis fellow FBI agenis lay blecding and dving yound tím and two suspected bank robbers tried to get away in a government car. Special Agent and former South Texan Ed Mireles, wounded badly in the leff arm. crawled about seven yards to the driver's side door, stood up. steadied himself and emptied his revolver through the open window.
As the two men in the car lay dying Mireles sank to the ground, bleeding Polict sirens screamed io the distanct. The worm massacte in the biston of the FBI was ovet.
The bad tuys thought all the agents were down, and they were geluing ready to leave" said an invesugalor charged with recreating the scene. Somehow. Mireles got to the car. I don't know how. He killed them both with his sevolver."
The agent's heroism was one of the few bright spots in a ragedy week ago that lefi Agent Gerald Dove and Special Agent Benjamin Grogan dead and Mireles and four oher agents wounded on quith tree-lined Ken. dall Suret.
No passers-by were wounded in the thootine largely because the FBI agents wailed to make the arrest unil they were on a side sureet and heid beir fire when molorists gol $^{0}$ in the way.

Metro detectives say the men who thol the sesals, William R MaLis and Micbell Lee Plath, were suspects in more than a half-dozen robberies of armored cars and bants, the killing of one bant suard and the woundin: of two others. They're also suspected of shooting at least three ouber people al Ment Dade rock pit frequented by target shooters, bul police say ectther man had a criminal recond.

Despite William R. Matix's death in an FBI shoot-out a private investigator hired by his attos. neys is still trying to solve the murders of Matix's wife and a co-worker at Riverside Hospital.

Matix filed a 3 million wrongful death suit against Riverside on Dec. 20, 1985. The suit sajd Matix "suffered wevere mental anguish" after Pa Cricia Matix's murder in a research laboratory two years earlier, on Dec. 30, 1983. The suit says the hospital did not provide adequate security.

Mr. Matix's attorney, Craig Treneff, said the suit is based on m theory that an unidentified construction worker bound, gagged and repeatedly atabbed Mrs. Matix, 30, and Joyce McFadden, 33 , -mboobodies were found in a hospital laboratory.

Treneff asid the private investigator is seeking the construction worker's name and will try to build case showing that the worker is responsible for the murders. Columbus police have questioned a construction worker in the alayings.

Police Capt Antone Lanata said "new avennes" were opened in the case arier Mr. Matix, ${ }^{*}$ suspected benk robber. was killed Friday near Mismi in a shoot-out wiih FBI agenta. Michael Lee Flath, Mr. Mastix's business partner and his suspected partner in the robleries, and two FBI agents were kilhod as well. Five agenta were iqjured.

LANATA SAID police will be looking for evidence in Miami that could link either Mr. Matix, $\mathrm{M}_{\text {, }}$ or Platt, 22 , to the Riverside murders. The Dispatch reported yeaterday that Mr. Matix left Delaware County for Florida with more than $\$ 375,000$, moti of it from bife insurance policies on his wife.

Treneff said be is waiting for one of Mr. Matix's heire to notify him whether to continue with the civil suit aceinst the bospital. Franklin County Common Pless Judge Tommy Thompson placed the tuilt on inactive statue Friday until to executgr in named for Matix'r estate.

Based on search warfants and accounts from police and other sources, the following is known:

On Dec 80,1983 , at 5:05 p.m. the badias-af. Mrs. Matix nad McFadden were found by their supervisor. The supervisor, who was on racation, told police he went to the lab to pick up his mail. The time of death was between 4 and 5 p.m.

- McFadden's body was lying face down in a pool of blood. Her throat was cut, and she had been stabbed 19 times. Her wedding rings, with diamonds totaling 0.6 carata and valued at gbout \$2000, were missing. Less than $\$ 20$ was miscing from her purse. Bloody boot prints were found on the floor.
- Mrs. Matix' 6 -body was found in $=4$-by- 6 -foot tissue culture lab, or cold room, in the lab. Her throat was cut, and she had been stabbed 16 times. Her diamond wedding ring also wns missing. Police have not determined the value of the ring. Police found 150 fingerprints in the lab.
- The same weapon was used on both women. It is described as a utility or folding knife with a 1 . icchenide blade. Both women were gagged with Lepe. A roll of tape was found. Fiber evidence tugestre the assailent wore cloth gloves.

POLICE BELIEVE their biggest break came in August 1984, when they matched the bloody beet. print to a JCPensey boot After aifting through 20,000 credit card receipts, they identified a conatruction worker who worked at the hospital the day of the murders. He owned a pair of boots that matched the prints found in the reaearch lab.
The worker told police he was assigned to work in a stairwell bext to the research lab. His account of the day differed "greatly" from bis co-worker's occount, police said.

The man told police he left the lab area about 345 p.m. In a second interview, he changed the time to 4:30 p.m. Police zaid they believe the first woman wat asasulted sbout 4:30 p.m.

In an addendum to a search warrant, police mald the man may have kept the murder weapot.

Police mearched the man'a home and veveral "cars Aug. 24, 1984. No evidence was found to link theman to the murders, they maid.

Mr. Matix's body has been nown from Miami to a Dayton funeral home. Funeral home officiale anid no arrangements have been made.

NEW MADISON, Ohio - The FBI called William R. Matix a cold-blooded killer, but Matix treasured a stuffed wy elephant from his childhood and kept it on his bed until the day he died.

The William Matix who was killed Friday in Miami shootout with eight FBl agents was person who laughed while his mother spanked him then ran to the barn to weep.

Columbus police say Matix is a suspect in the 1983 murder of his wife.

In en interview yesterday, Yvonne Emerlek, 60, Matix's mother, said, "I swear' to God, if he dropped me dead on this apot, that I had no idea that Bill nas like that.
"I I hod knorm. I'd have gone to the police myself."

Emerick and her husband, Ray Emerick, ast in their small farm house bere, about 30 miles west of Dayton, and talked, cried and sometimer laughed while recalling their son.

Mr. Emerick had open-heart surgery several years ago. He sat in a living room chair where tears gave way to words. Mrs. Emerlek, victim of six strokes and one heart attack, est at a kitchen table.

Mrs. Emerick wept the most when she talked sbopt the two FBl agents gunned down by her son and his busidess partner, Michasl Lee Platt.
"I know what their wives must be going through It's a werrible thing." she said.

And, deep in her hear, she wonders how her son, a man who wrote poems of love to his family, became such a atranger.
"My only feeling is somewhere down the live, and it hasn't been too far, something sapped. It had to," she maid.

Ifatix was born in 1951 in Lewisburg, Ohio, near Dayton. By age 12 his father and mother were divorced. His mother remar. fied, and be, his brother and two sisters moved to New Madison.

Things were tight I mean very tight We didn't heve money, Mra. Emerick said. "We. don't have anything."

Whliam was a shy boy who stutterad, she geid.

Classmates often taunted him, but he found a way to make it an edvantage. He became the class comedian; his mother said.
"He could make ansone laugh at the drop of a hat," she said

By the time he was 10 , Matix was working in hayfields for 75 cents a des to help support the family. During school months be worked until 1 am on a chichen farm she said.

Although William made fun of his own speech problem, he a as too embarrassed to try out for the high school basketball team because of it, his mother said. Before graduation the enlisted in the Marines winhout telling his family.
"He said, I love my country.' He said, "Mother, don't iry to stop me," "she alid.

Visions of glory turned sour when he became a cook in the Marines, Mrs. Emerick said.

After he left the Marines, he worked in a manufacturing plant in Troy, Obio, for a year before joining the Army where he became a military policeman, she said. While attending a speech school in Washington, D.C. he met his first wife, Patricis.

Matix's mother said he left the Army,
went to cooking achool in New York and a meat-cotting chool in Toledo. In 1976, be tharried Patricis. He moved to Columbus *eler, ther landing a job an a grocery store和eat cutter. Laver. the couple draved-to Delaware.

Christmas 1983 anas Iilled whin joy, Mra. Emerick ssid. William and Patricia spent the holiday in New Medison. Five days later Patricie and a co-worker were bound, gagged and stabbed to death al Riverside Hospital.

Patricia aras buried in a pants suit, her Christmas gift from William.

William moved to Florida because he wanted to get rid of the pressure, his mother said. Also, Michael Lee Platt had offered him a job, she said.

Mrs. Emerick admita there is a side of her mon ghe never sam. He remarried in Flosida without first telling his family. Not until the day after his death did Mrs. Emerick learn he had an infant son.

She may never know what changed her san, she said. Her only hope now is that people will forget and forgive.

There will not be a funeral uervice for Mr . Matix, his mother said.

The funeral home was told to bury the body and notify the family later.

Matix now lies in an unmarked grave in New Madison, still close to his mother's heart.

## Second wife says she doesn't grieve

MIAMI (AP) - The estranged wife of William R. Matix said she does not grieve for her husband and thinks the "FBI did me a favor by taking him out."

Christy Lou Matix, 29, said she had no idea her husband may heve been involved in six bank and armored car robberies.
"I have the exact same questions everyone else had," she waid Wednesday. "How conld it be? Why didn'i anyone know? He
*as a master of deceit and disguise."
Matix, 34, was known as a born-Egain Christian wholiked making oooden toys. He married Cristy Horne in May. Within two months, Mrs. Matix, then pregnant, moved out.
"I didn't underatand why I left." she said. "It ent against everything I believe in bout family and children. Now I know. The Lord took me out of there."

"He seemed restless." said Rev. David Culyer, the couple's pastior at the Catvary Baptist Church in Delawite. "he was the kind of buy who couldn't stay setlied in one wocation. ${ }^{2}$
Putricia's parents helped, giving het hundteds of doliars.
Eventualy, she took a job es a I lab assittant af Riverside MethodIst Hospitis.
She liked her work, but Paurich's friends also have seen quoted as sayine that Matix developed an insatiable eppetite for money, and that the couple fought - and briefly separated - over finsucial disagretments.

When the baby came. Matlx was studying to be helicopter mechanic. Without other reliable means of support, Patricia reluctantly teturned to work six weeks fiter giving birth.

At the end of the first week, on Friday, Dec. 30.1083 , she was brutally murdered. Also killed in the laborntory was Joyce MicFad. den, 33 . co-worker.

The murders occurred between 4:35 p.m., when the women were last seen alive, and 5.03 p.m. when the crime scene was discovered by their boss.

Police believe that Patricia was killed first, because her body was hidden in a refigerated room. MeFadden's body was found on the floor of the lab. and police say she may have been killed after she surprised the murderer.

Columbus police Capt. Antone Lanata said one of the two women struggled briefly - he won't say which - but the other did not, tuggesting that this victim knew her hiller.
William Matix clamed he was home with Melisss during the crucial 28 minuses between $4: 35$ Pm. and 5:03 p.m. He said he spoke with Patricia by phone at about 4:10 p.m. and police zaid telephone records subsiantiate the five-minute call.
Nevertheless, Lanata said, Matix easily could have left home after the catl, drives to the hospltal and then killed the women - all before $5: 03 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
