





MEMORANDOM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Special Agent in Charge Fay called from New York City on the night of April 16, 1934 and advised that Walter Winchell had given him information to the effect that Basil Gallagher, also known as "Red" Gallagher, a reporter on the Indianapolis Times, had just completed s took on the life of Dillinger. The book is right up to date, including Dillinger's raid on the Warsaw, Indiana Police Department. In a confidential note which Winchell received from Gallagher, along with the book, he advised that Dillinger gave \$45,000 to obtain the release of Pierpont, Mackey and Clark, and that he plans a series of raids on banks in and around St. Paul and in the middle west. He also plans to raid certain police arsenals in order to get bullet-proof vests, machine guns, etc. for the Barker-Karpis gang, which is mixed up in the Bremer case. Dillinger, according to the information plans to join Barker and Karpis. Winchell advised that Gallagher was formerly employed on the "old World" in New York and when the paper failed he went to Indianapolis and has been working for the Times since that time. Mr. Winchell was of the opinion that Gallagher probably had several confidential informants working for him in Indianapolis, who might have information concerning the whereabouts of Dillinger. Mr. Winchell suggested that a Division Agent contact Gallagher for any information he may have and suggested that Mr. Winchell's name be used in contacting Gallagher but that the information contained in the confidential note be not disclosed. Accordingly, I called Special Agent Bliss Morton at Indianapolis, in the absence of Mr. Connelley, and requested that he contact Gallagher for any information he might have.







It is noted that the new Ferd Sedan bearing licence number 86589 has been investigated and found to have been purchased by a Mrs. Fred Posticia, 600. North LaSalle St., Indianapolis. The city directories and telephone directories do not show a party by this name, but it is to be here noted that this is the address of Fred Hancock and is also the address given by Clark at the time he purchased the Essex from Rimbel Motor Co., on Oct. 6, 1958, foundate report on investigation of this car is being incorporated in memorandum of agents making the investigations.

The following memoranhum was submitted by Special Agent John F. Sears at Indianapolis, Indianas

April 8, 1934 Agents Sears and Weeksinspected Hudson Seden, Motor number \$56554. In connection with Mr. Larson's call from Detroit, to the effect that his confidential informant at Muncie, Indiana, had advised him by telephone that Dillinger is in Elkhart, Indiana, and that Hamilton is in Muncie, Indiana, and requesting that he, Mr. Larson, proceed to Muncie, Indiana to meet the confidential informant immediately, I advised Mr. Larson that should be develop any information of value upon his arrival at Muncie, that he should immediately contact Special Agent in Charge Purvis at Chicago, in . order that the proper arrangements might be made at Elkhart, Indiana to take Dillinger into custody and that he should also communicate immediately with Special Agent in Charge Connelley at Indianapolis, in order that Hamilton's apprehension might be effected at Muncie, Indiana. Mr. Larson advised that he would register at the Roberts Hotel in Muncie, Indiana, under the name of William Jonas and that he would advise the Division immediately upon contacting his informant. He advised, however, that the informant had requested that he make no effort to locate him, but that the informant would, as soon as the opportunity presented itself, contact Mr. Larson in his hotel room.

I called Mr. Purvis at Chicago and gave him the above information. Mr. Purvis stated that if the informant were able to point out to Mr. Larson in Muncie, where Hamilton could be located and that if he could also point out in Elkhart, Indiana where Dillinger could be located, it would be advisable for the informant to be taken from Muncie to Elkhart. I agreed with this suggestion and told Mr. Purvis to discuss the matter with Mr. Larson, in the event it appeared that the informant could indicate where Dillinger might be stopping at Elkhart. I suggested both to Mr. Larson and Mr. Purvis that the raids for Dillinger and Hamilton be conducted as nearly at the same time as possible, in order that the apprehension of one might not prevent the apprehension of the other. They both agreed that this would be advisable and stated that they would endeavor to do so.

I endeavored to contact Mr. Connelley at Indianapolis but was advised that he had left for Lexington, Kentucky at about 8:50 or 9:00 P.M. last night. Accordingly I talked to Mr. Morton at Indianapolis and gave him the above information and requested that a man be retained in the room at the Sinks Arms Hotel and arrangements be made whereby both of the men in Indianapolis could be notified immediately to proceed to Muncie, Indiana for the purpose of taking Hamilton into custody in the event a telephone call were received from Mr. Larson. Mr. Larson previously had been requested to contact either Mr. Connelley or Mr. Johnston at this hotel.

Early this morning at about 2:00 A.M. I talked to Mr. Connelley at Lexington, Kentucky where he is registered under his correct name at the Brown Hotel, and gave him the above information. Mr. Connelley stated that he had proceeded to Lexington in company with Agents Barber and Smith, where they met Agent Hurley, on a lead which appeared to be very important, they having received information to the effect that Dillinger had an appointment with a Doctor at Lexington, Kentucky today for medical treatment. Mr. Connelley stated that they would be working on the case this forenoon; that he probably could not be contacted until about noon, but that he would immediately notify the Division, as soon as it was determined whether this was a reliable or unreliable lead, and that in the event it proved to be unreliable, he would return immediately to Indianapolis.

Accordingly, I presented the facts to Mr. Parrish, who advised that he did not want to give an opinion in this matter without first discussing it with Mr. Keenen who was more familiar with the facts and stated that Mr. Keenan was not in his office at that time but that he was probably up on the hill and he would endeavor to locate him and advise me.

I later talked with you at New York and you suggested that I immediately get in touch with Mr. Keenan and request that he take immediate action to prevent the appearance of this women before the inquest. 

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

I talked to Mr. Clegg this morning at St. Paul and suggested the advisability of obtaining the negatives and the fingerprints developed by the Police Department at St. Paul in connection with the trial of the Frechette woman. Mr. Clegg advised that this material is all in the possession of Mr. Tierney, of the St. Paul Police Department, who is now in Chicago for the purpose of giving testimony. I asked Mr. Clegg if we could get this material from Mr. Tierney after he returns to St. Paul so it could be enlarged in the event one of our men is compelled to testify in this case. Mr. Clegg advised that he did not know when Mr. Tierney would return from Chicago with this material and that he has to be at St. Paul on April 25 to appear before the Grand Jury; that the question arises as to when he would be able to get the material from Mr. Tierney for the purpose of forwarding it to the laboratory. Mr. Clegg advised that United States Attorney Sullivan has been in telephonic touch with the United States Attorney at Chicago and he has urged the United States Attorney at Chicago to postpone the removal hearing until after the 25th., so that certified copies of the indictment and warrant could be presented; that the only thing necessary then would be to prove the identities and it would not be necessary to disclose our evidence to the defense. Mr. Clegg stated, however, that on the other hand the Attorney General had wired the United States Attorney at Chicago to expedite the removal hearing; that he did not know the reason for these instructions, particularly in view of the fact that the indictment will probably be returned on the 25th. or 26th.







Further, that Hancock was supposed to have left Indianapolis on April 8, 1934, for Detroit, Michigan, where he can be reached in care of a man by the name of Mitchell, who works for the Dodge Motor Car Company as an inspector or an engineer.

At the main office of the Dodge Brothers Corporation, 7900 Joseph Campau, Hamtramck, Detroit, Michigan, G. H. Schoenback, Super-

intendent of Plant Production for Dodge Brothers Corporation and the Whiteler Corporation as a shole, was contacted. Personnel files of Dodge Brothers Corporation were examined, and they reflect that there are a total of 10 individuals amployed by said corporation in the two plants in Detroit under the name of Mitchell; further that of these employes two are inspectors, one by the name of Edward J. The second inspector, Times Mitchell, was born in England and has been in Detroit for approximately the past 20 years, during shieh time he has been continuously employed by Dodge Brothers Corporation, and dehies thevise a man by the hame of Hancock.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

He stated that Dillinger came to the Doctor's office on Saturday with the expectation of having medical treatment administered to him; that when he arrived there he stood in the hall and kept the Doctor covered with a gum in his pocket while he looked over the situation; that discovering that the Doctor had three men with him he did not remain, but made an appointment with the Doctor for yesterday. Mr. Connelley stated that he is positive it was Dillinger because of the fact that the description of the clothes worn by him fitted the description of the clothes that he is known to possess.

Mr. Connelley was instructed to handle this matter independently without local assistance of any kind. He was advised that if the local authorities had any information we should take advantage of same. He was also instructed to clear all of his information through the Chicago office. He was instructed to call the Chicago office at least once a day, but in the case of any developments he should call as often as necessary.

Mr. Connelley is of the opinion that information concerning the whereabouts of Dillinger will be obtained through sources of information in Indianapolis and vicinity, which they are now covering.

#### MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

SAC Larson called at 11:45AM this morning and stated that he had just received a call from Mr. Purvis. Mr. Purvis stated that the newspaper carried a bit headline this morning to the effect that Dillinger was seen last night in a drug store in South Bend, Indiana, and earlier in the day he was seen in Elkhart, Indiana. The newspaper article stated that he is Headed for St. Joseph, Michigan, which is about forty of fifty miles north of Elkhart. The police also raided a house in South Bend.

Dillinger is reported to be wearing a grey topcoat and traveling in a black LaSalle sedan in company with Van Meter.

Larson stated that he is waiting on information from his informant and it is just a matter of sitting tight. He has confidence in this informant because of corroborated facts already given him. and the definite statements made concerning the location of Dillinger.

I asked Mr. Larson to advise the Division also of any calls received from this informant.

Mr. Purvis and the other agents are under cover at Devereaux's home and can be reached over telephone number 44493.

This is with reference to my long distance telephone conversation of yesterday afternoon with Mr. Stapleton, of the Division, during which he informed that the Division has a letter which was received by a Congressman from a County Judge located at Harrodsburg, Kentucky, which informs that several days ago a message was sent from Harrodsburg, Kentucky, by a man who locked like Dillinger, to a Mrs. George T. Williams, 500 Main Street, Daytona Beach, Florida, and requested that the identity of Mrs. George T. Williams be determined with a view of ascertaining whether this information was in any way related to this case.

Special Agent L. E. Kingman, at Daytona Beach, Florida, was informed by Jim Haney, Chief of Police, that he, Haney, had also received a letter dated April 15th from Charles Corn, County Judge, at Harrodsburg, Kentucky, which appears to be a letter similar to that Judge Corn sent to a Congressmen at Washington.

Agent Kingman at Daytona Beach determined that Mrs. George T. Williams is the wife of a man who operates a small hot-dog stand at Daytona Beach; that her husband, George T. Williams, is a liquor runner, and has also dealt in hot ears out of Daytona Beach; that he is in and out of that City frequently, and that Mrs. Williams is a middle-aged woman.

Agent Kingman also determined that Williams has made frequent trips to Shelby, Kentucky, from Daytona Beach, and in fact, was in Kentucky four or five months ago to straighten out his mother's estate, and is said to have operated a toa room in the vicinity of Shelby, which recently was burned. Williams also went to Kentucky about the middle of March, and it is likely that he is the man will sent the message to Mrs. Williams.

Agent Kingman further determined that Williams in many respects resembles Dillinger, and that he looks enough like him to be taken for Dillinger by a person who is not familiar with the latter.

Chief of Police Haney advised Agent Kingman that Williams for a long time has been operating as a liquor runner with a man in Daytona Beach by the name of Bob Hearn. These two men are believed to have handled stolen automobiles in and about





Please be informed that on this date Mr. Caldwell of the Department appeared at your office and exhibited to me the original memorandum signed by the Director, dated April 10, 1934, addressed to Mr. Stanley, relative to the telephone call had between the Director and Congressman Pathan of Texas concerning possible legislation offering areward for the apprehension of Dillinger. I informed him that the Director was out of the building just at that time and I was unable to furnish him with any information concerning this phase of the matter, whereupon he stated that the bill would be prepared in rough form and undoubtedly Mr. Stanley would contact the Director in this regard.



E. Friend, Manager of the Postal Telegraph office at Roanoke, produced the original of the telegram in question which he advised was received at the office at 9:35 P. M. on April 1, 1934 by Mr. D. F. Peters, a Postal Telegraph employee. Mr. Peters advised Agent Schoales that the writer of this telegram was a man 35 years old, 5 feet 9 inches in height, weighing about 165 pounds, of stout build, with brown hair, smoothshaven and dressed as a business man; that he seemed to be normal mentally and refused to give an address when he left the telegram in question. Mr. Peters also advised that this party seemed to be in a hurry and asked when he left the message if it would be perfectly confidential; further, that this man was alone and when he left the telegraph office he walked toward the Hotel Roanoke.


