Permit me to express to you my sincere regrets concerning the recent unfortunate tragedy at Kansas City. I know you feel this unforseen happening keenly, as do I and every member of the Bureau, and it is because of my desire to be of assistance that I am taking the liberty to address this letter to you in the hope that the perpetrators of this most horrible massacre may be brought to justice. I realize, Mr. Hoover, that everything possible is being done; that no clue, however insignificant it everything possible is being done; that no clue, however insignificant it with offers of assistance, opinions and clues, most of which may have already proved to be valueless. However, I know that you will accept my few suggestions in the spirit with which they are given. You may recall that I was closely associated with Special Agent Caffrey during the Holden-Keating apprehension and thereafter during the furTher conduct of the investigation. The Frank Eash file was assigned to me for some period of time while I was at Kansas City and I became familiar with his activities as well as those of the various members of his several gangs.

Since the murderous attack of last Saturday I have read every press account available and have noted the various expressions of opinion. When Caffrey and I talked with Bailey at police headquarters, immediately after his apprehension last July, he admitted that he was acquainted with Nash, but, of course, would volunteer nothing further. He professed to be a member of a liquor-running crew between Chicago, Illinois and Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and advanced that as reason for his having been in possession of the bond later identified as having been taken in the Fort Scott, Kansas bank robbery for which Bailey was subsequently convicted. During the further investigation, after the apprehension of Holden and Keating, a relentless search was made to locate one Bernard Phillips, alias Phil Courtney, a former Leavenworth convict who was on the golf course when Holden and Keating were apprehended, but was not playing with them and at the time we did not have any information concerning him. The woman with whom he was living and who claimed to be his wife, one Mary Crawford, alias Winnie-Winkle alias Mary Courtney, was taken into custody together with the Holden and Keating women and she was questioned at length, but refused to divulge any information whatever concerning herself or Phillips. However, the investigation disclosed, and the Bureau and Kansas City files will show that Phillips is a dangerous criminal. He is wanted by the Minneapolis police for the robbery of a bank there in March, 1932, at which time he, with six others, procured two hundred thousand dollars in each, and there is a thousand dollar reward for his apprehension. The investigation further disclosed that Phillips is very close to Holden and Keating and that he is a killer maikly; he being hired to do all the shooting that is necessary to the gang's welfare. He was a former Minneapolis or St. Paul motorcycle patrolman; had service during the World War as a Machine-Gunner and, if I recall correctly, he is said to be somewhat mentally unbalanced; knows little or nothing more than the use of a machine-gun at which he is most adept. In this connection I recall that the woman employed by the Travelers' Aid Society, Union Station, Kansas City, in a press dispatch, was quoted as saying that one of the men in the gang was rather large and that it was he who, she believed, might have been wounded or fell as the gang made its getaway, but managed to pick himself up and get into their car.

There is a possibility that the man she had reference to is Bernard Phillips. I sincerely believe that he has been with Nash continuously since Keating and Holden were apprehended and as soon as he learned that Nash had been apprehended he, together with the other members, and possibly by instruction of Harvey Bailey who, I believe contacted Nash immediately after his escape from Lansing, came to Kansas City determined to retrieve Nash and to kill any and all who opposed theirn demands.

I believe if Phillips and Bailey can be located that some information of value will be procured. Of course not through them, but I feel that they, or at least Phillips, may possibly be identified by one or more of the witnesses to the tragedy, for I don't believe any one would mistake Phillips.

The foregoing information is submitted, as previously mentioned, for whatever value it may possess and with a clear understanding, on my part, that perhaps I may have overlooked some essential in the various press accounts that would clearly disprove my views. However, Mr. Hoover, if there is anything atvall enlightening therein you may be assured that I am happy to have been in a position to offer something towards bringing this matter to a definite conclusion through the presecution and just punishment of the parties responsible for this terribly unfortunate tragedy.

I am taking the further liberty of mailing this letter to you direct and, I believe, such procedure will meet with your approval and the approval of Special Agent in Charge T. D. Quinn to whom I have furnished a copy for his information.

Mr. Harvey advised from Kansas City that although a woman who witnessed the shooting has identified the picture of "Pretty Boy" Floyd as that of one of the men with the machine guns, he doubts that this identification should be considered positive; that another witness, Samuel F. Link, has said positively that Harvey Bailey was one of the men with the machine guns; that Mr. Vetterli has recognized from the photographs that a man named Bob Brady, another escaped convict, as one of the gummen; that he, Mr. Harvey, ascertained yesterday at Lansing that beyond a doubt Harvey Bailey was the ring-leader of the men who escaped from the penitentiary, which information was received from Warden Laws, one of the officers kidnaped in the prison break, who was taken from the prison in a car by six escaping convicts; that four of these convicts, namely Bob Brady, Harvey Bailey, Wilbur Underhill and Ed Davis, have been tentatively identified as being connected with the shooting at the Union Station: that Mr XLink, who is acquainted with Bailey, having known him for some time, says he drove his car up before the station to park the same, just where the gummen were waiting for the victims to leave the station, and that these individuals swore at him, telling him to "get out of there", and pointed a machine gun in his face, and that he then moved his car a little further down the street from which place he witnessed a part of the shooting.

I requested that the report covering the statements of informant Link be forwarded to the Bureau by air mail. I inquired whether this information had been given to the police and was advised it had not.

Mr. Harvey stated that it is believed Bailey has gone to Oklahoma; that Mr. Nathan suggests that I.O.'s be prepared immediately covering the men wanted in connection with this shooting; that the newspaper articles regarding this matter had been favorable to the Bureau and that he had sent to the Bureau a number-of the clippings.

Mr. Harvey stated that they needed more Agents and it was decided that Bruce Nathan, Dwight Brantley and Harold Anderson should go to Kansas City to assist in this investigation.



Esteemed Sir:-

The cold-blooded massacre of officers at the K.C. Union Station this morning proves to my satisfaction that my prophecy, that martial law would yet have to be resorted to to deal with American banditti. is correct as set out in my letter of April 18th. Ther are enough outlaws hidden in the hills of Oklahoma to wipe out a town of 500 inhabitants.

The press, however, must be censored if the best results are to be obtained. The public is becoming increasingly indignant over the way newspapers broadcast inform tion that aids desperadoss in making their escape. For example:

- A conversation among bandits was overheard in which their plan to head for the Warsaw Hills was obtained. Immediately the press broadcasted this information. Their confederates can easily inform the fugitives that their destination is known and to change their route.
- 2. Recently a detective was shot. A local newspaper furnished the information that the death car was heavily nickel-plated with an unusual number of accessories which were nickle-plated. Being advised that the description of their car was known, they naturally removed the conspicuous accessories to avoid detection.
- The papers this morning carried advance information that Nash was being brought to Mansas City as per clipping enclosed. What business had the press to publish this item? This information was disseminated by the early morning editions for the benefit of desperadoes before the underworld even had retired and in plenty of time to round up local killers.

As long as newspapers are really accomplices of desperadoes in helping them make their get away, no blame should attach to police officers for failure to "bring them in".







MEMORANDUM TO -SPECIAL AGENT IN CHARGE:

This morning about 10 AM., Fred C. Kohut, residence Milby Hotel, Houston, Texas, called at the Federal Building and informed me that Mr. Homer C. Howell, 710 East 10-1/2 Street, Houston, reported to him that Mr. R. J. Barrell, Box 212, Galveston, Texas, who is employed as a Messenger for the United Fruit Dispatch and the Southern S. S. & Transport Company, told him, Howell, that while he was on a street corner in Prescott, Arizona on Friday, June 16, 1933, a man stepped up to him and asked him if he would be there for a while, and when he informed the man that he would, this man asked him to hold a package and he would return in a short time; that he, Harrell, waited about two hours and when the man did not return, he took the package with him on the train and upon examination of same found it contained a full loaded sub-machine gun; that he, Harrell, has this gun in his possession in Galveston and would not turn it over to anyone but a Covernment Agent.

Mr. Kohut stated that upon learning the above he sent a telegram to the Director of the United States Bureau of Investigation, and that I would likely get a request from the Director to make an investigation of the matter.

In compliance with the Director's telegram, which you relayed to me by telephone, I ascertained thru the United Fruit Company in Galveston by telephone where I might locate R. J. Harrell, and telephoned him, advising him I would call and see him in Galveston. I immediately proceeded to Galveston and located him at 409 -21st Street, and he was interviewed at the Federal Building and made the attached affidavit, which is self-explanatory. He stated he told Mr. Howell the story about the gum simply to excite Mr. Howell's curiosity and told him to get his furtile brain to working and figure out why the man would give him a machine gun to hold and then run away; that Mr. Howell had at one time informed him he was studying detective work under a former Government detective, whose name he could not remember, but who evidently was Fred Kohut, and he simply gave Howell the story as a problem to figure out, not knowing that it was going to be related to someone else and cause an investigation. Harrell stated he informed Howell about the man giving him the gun when he talked to Howell on June 11th, and not on June 16th, as stated by Fred Kohus.

After returning from Galveston I interviewed H. C. Howell at his residence, 710 East 10-1/2 Street, Houston, where Fred Kohur was present, visiting Howell. Mr. Howell stated that Mr. Harrell gave him the story on June 11th when he was visiting at his house, and that he in turn informed Fred Kohut about what Harrell had related to him. Howell stated that at time Harrell informed him anout the matter, he firmly believed that he was telling him the truth, but Harrell then told him he could not show him the gun as he had it in his baggage, which he had checked thru to Galveston. Howell stated that while Harrell is prone to joke with his friends, he firmly believed him to be telling the truth when he related the story about the man giving him the gun.

I informed Mr. Kohut in the presence of Mr. Howell that if he had any more information he desired to furnish to the Bureau, he should report it to the Resident Agent in Houston or to the Special Agent in Charge at San Antonio, and not furnish same direct to the Bureau, as the San Antonio Office would conduct such investigation as the facts merit.

This information is being furnished in memorandum form, as I do not believe you require a report, but desire to furnish the information obtained in letter form to the Bureau.

Before me the undersigned, a Deputy United States Clerk, personally appeared R. J. Harrell, who being duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

My name is R. J. Harrell, and I reside at 1808 Avenue "M", Galveston, Texas. I am employed as an extra Messenger and Inspector for the United Fruit Company, at Galveston.

On June 11, 1933, I met H. C. Howell in Houston, Texas. He is employed as a Candy Maker at his home, and sells home made candy. He told me he was studying detective work under a man in Houston, whose name I do not recall. I told Howell that I had just come from Prescott, Arizona, and a day or two before, I believe I said Friday, June 9, 1933, while I was standing on the street corner in Prescott, a man came by me and asked me to hold a package for awhile; that I stood at this corner some time and the man did not return, and I came on to Galveston and brought the package with me. I told him I opened the package and found an automatic gun in it. I do not believe that I said it was a sub-machine gun. I do not remember whether or not I said the gun was loaded. At the time I told Howell about the man giving me a package, I told him it was in Prescott, Arizona, for Howell knows that I occasionally make trips for the United Fruit Dispatch thru that section, however, I have not been in Prescott, Arizona, for over a year. I merely told this tale about the man giving me a package which proved to be a gun, just to excite Howell's ... curiosity, and I wish to state that there is no truth in my statement to Howell, and it was told to him only as a joke.

No one has ever given me a sub-machine gun or any other kind of a gun. I never saw a sub-machine gun, and do not know what one would look like. I wish to state that in telling Howell this story about the sub-machine gun or automatic gun, I had no intention of causing any trouble, and did not expect that he would tell the story to anyone, which would result in the Government making an investigation about the matter.

I read in Sunday's paper about the murder of the Special Agents and other officers in Kanaas City. and was shocked to learn of terrible tragedy. I trust, however, that your Agents may be able to apprehend the killers within a very short time.

I believe some of your very best agents should get in touch with as he may have some very valuable information concerning this case

In our investigation in 1927 into the Cherryvale Kansas Bank robbery, he was our confidential informant and gave us the information that cause the. apprehension and conviction of oney Robinson, Hamm, and others who participated in the robbery, and also caused us to recover more than one hundred thousand dollars in bonds. Of course, I can't remember all the names of the defendants (subjects) but know that Robinson was convicted, Hamm apprehended in Miami and afterwards convicted and, perhaps, Judge West of Kansas City Kansas was not prosecuted. Other subjects were one Dr. Zeller and a Dr. Safford from whom we recovered several of the bonds.

You will find the reports from the Kansas City Buraau Office were made by Agent. John Keating with whom I worked on the case.





I advised Mr. Vetterli at Kansas City by telephone that it had been determined that the latent fingerprints sent in by the police department at St. Paul in connection with the HANN kidnaping case, appeared to be those of Frank Nash upon first inspection. I advised that these prints were being enlarged and a positive identification would be made as soon as possible.


Subsequently, I talked with Agent Coulter at St. Paul and also gave him this information, and requested that it be ascertained where and when these prints were taken, in order to place the whereabouts of Nash immediately prior to his capture in Hot Springs Agent Coulter advised that he understood that these prints were taken from beet bottles found in 204 Vernon Avenue, St. Paul, which place was rented by three strange men and two women under fictitious names, and that these individuals had disappeared from that place at 2:55 a.m. on either June 19th or 20th, and that he had the descriptions of these individuals. I instructed that those descriptions be sent by special delivery to Kansas City.

Later, I advised Special Agent in Charge Jones, now at Kansas City, of the instructions issued to the St. Paul office with regard to the descriptions and fingerprin's. I suggested that an Agent from Kansas City proceed immediately to St. Paul, and secure the facts.

Mr. Jones stated that they believed they had found the hang-out of some of the suspected individuals, and that they had Agents surrounding the place, working three eight-hour shifts.





MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Agent Sackett at Philadelphia called and stated that further investigation of Mathan M. Green there, who appeared to be the owner of the car noted in St. Paul a week ago, developed that this car had been financed by the Huber Investment Company at Philadelphia; that Nathan M. Green had defaulted on his payments in April or May and that the Ruber Investment Company thereupon turned the matter over to the Burns Detective Agency and the Minneapolis branch of that agency seized and re-possessed the car under the name of the Huber Investment Company on May 4, 193 He stated that at that time Green was located by the Burns Agency investigator J8 at 908 Ashland Avenue, St. Paul, where he was living with his sister. The Burns man drove the car to the Stendard Garage at 215 South 3rd. Street, Minneapolis, and a storage check, #578, was received by the Burns Agency for the care Subsequently the car was sold by the Burns Agency in Minneapolis. The date is not definitely shown, but the records of title and the were shanged in Pennsylvania on May 17, 1933, placing the same in the name of the Huber Investment Company. Said company said that they do not now have title to the car and the title has not been changed because of the fact that they have not received the check for the sale from the Burns Agency. However, they know that the car was sold about May 17.

I called the St. Paul office and gave them this information, together with a file number in the Burns Agency at St. Paul, foll and suggested that the man that they would be interested in is probably the man who purchased the car last and not Nathan Green. St. Paul will conduct immediate inquiries at the Burns Agency.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Agent Sackett of the Philadelphia office called late on the afternoon of the 23rd instant and advised that cautious inquiry concerning Nethan B. Because of other urgent matters which were immediately before me at the time Agent Sackett called, I suggested that he promptly communicate with the St. Paul office and furnish the information that he had so far ascertained and also to continue with a discreet inquiry concerning Green.




