

About fifteen days ago, surveillance was placed on the Sharone Amertments by Special Agent J. J. Keeting, who is on special assignment at Chicago on this case. Agent Keeting determined that the apartment hotel was in the hands of receivers, and that George H. Dubin, 127 M. Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois, was receiver, and that Max L. Satt, attorney, who is in the same office as Mr. Dubin, was the attorney for the receiver. On Wednesday, October 25, 1933, Agent Keating, after checking up the reliability of Dubin and Satt, and finding them to be reputable, interviewed them at their offices.

George H. Dubin, and Max L. Satt advised that they took over the receivership of this hotel some two years ago; that the hotel was formerly owned and managed by Mr. and Mrs. Bidderman; that when the hotel went into the hands of the receiver, Larry Bidderman was installed as manager. On the agreement of the receivership, the Biddermans were permitted to keep an apartment in the hotel, which is 507, and the son, Larry, was allowed to keep room 506, free of charge. Mrs. Bidderman was installed as assistant manager. Larry Bidderman, who is a man about 30 or 51 years of age, is a habitual drunkard, and a short time after he became manager, he sold some of the furnishings of the hotel, without the anthority of the receiver, and due to this was custed as manager. Mrs. Hilda Polachek, who is the sister of Attorney Satt was installed as manager in April, 1953. She still holds that position, and Mrs. Bidderman is still assistant manager.

While Larry Bidderman was manager of the Sherone Apertments, he became acquainted with Mrs. J. A. Herris, alias Mrs. J. A. Williams, alias Bobbie Moore, and installed her in the hotel, as telephone operator. When he was relieved as manager, Bobbie Moore's services were dispensed with as telephone operator. She now lives in apartment 101, which is directly in the rear of the hotel office, with her two children, who are going to a parochial school. She is not employed at this time. Mr. Satt stated that it is rumored that she is married to Larry Bidderman, and that Mr. Bidderman, Sr. gives Bobbie Moore an allowance of \$65.00 and that fromttime to time he has seen Mrs. Bidderman turn over to Bobbie Moore, various sums of money. It was determined that the bookkeeper at the Hotelis a niece of Mrs. Bidderman and that one of the telephone operators, named Charlotte Everling, is also Mrs. Bidderman's niece. Miss Amelia Schmidt, who is also a telephone operator there, is a sister of one of the stemographers employed in the office of Mr. Satt. The night clerk is Otto Mohrann.

The manager, Mrs. Polachek resides with her four children, in apartment 207. She is a writer, and was formerly secretary to Jana Adams, at Chicago, Illinois, for approximately ten years. She is a momen of refinement and education.

Due to the set-up at the hotel, and the intimacy of Bobbie Moore with the Bidderman family, it was determined that the only person in the hotel, who could be talked to comfidentially, was accordingly, she was interviewed at the office of the receiver.

After viewing the photograph of Vivian Mathews, she stated that it looked like the woman in 211.

the photograph of Vivian Mathews, stated positively that Vivian Mathews is the woman in 21.

After surveying the neighborhood in the vicinity of the Sherone Apartments, and after visiting several apartment houses in the neighborhood which might be an ideal location for covering the Miller Apartment, 15 was impossible to locate a vacant place of vantage. Agent Keating again and made arrangements to rent apt. 207 in the Sherone Apartments, which would give agents of the Chicago Division Office opportunity to watch the Sheridan Road entrance, and the Galt Avenue entrance of the aforementioned hotel. This apartment, which was the only apartment available, is on the same corridor as the Miller Apartment, the Miller epartment being in the rear of the building, and agents' apartment in the front and side of the building. On October 29, 1933, Special Agent J. L. Medela, and his wife, through previous arrangement, rented this apertment under the name of Mr. and Mrs. John L. Malleck. On instruction of the Director, Agent Nichols of the Kansas City Office proceeded to Chicago, Illinois, and through his efforts, a tap was successfully placed on the telephone of Vivien Mathews, on the morning of October 31, 1935. This tap was connected on the telephone in apartment 207, which was occupied by Agent Madala.

A check-up with the telephone company disclosed that on October 11, 1933, at 10:33 P. M. from Long Beach 0807, a station-to-station call was made, duration three minutes, to Crete, Illinois, number 114-R2; also that on October 21, 1933, at 4:28 A. H. call station-to-station was made from Long Beach 0800 to the Royal Palm Hotel, Detroit, Michigan; Cadillac 8310, duration call 13 minutes. The aforementioned calls were charged to apartment 211 at the hotel. information relative to the Detroit calls was communicated by Special Agent Keating to Special Agent in Charge John M. Keith at Detroit, Michigan, who supervised the investigation relative to this matter there. Investigation at Detroit was unproductive. Investigation at Crete, Illinois disclosed that telephone number Crete 114-R2 is in the name of Thomas Young. Thomas Young was superintendent of the Lincoln Field Racetrack, and this telephone is installed in his house, which is adjacent to the Field entrance. Thomas Young is now in Louisville, Kentucky, where he controls enother track. There are no races at the Lincoln Field, and have

The Bidderman family and Bobbie Moore are reputed to be habitual gamblers, and visit the race tracks practically every day. Vivian Mathewa has also accompanied them regularly to the tracks. It was therefore deemed advisable not to make further inquiry as to the Crete call, as apparently the calls were relative to a race horse tip. As to the local calls made by Vivian Mathews, the places have been established, but no direct inquiries have been made as yet. It was deemed advisable not to shadow Vivian Mathews, but merely to cover the apartment continuously, and listen in on telephone calls.

service elevator; by so doing she does not have to enter the hotel lobby at all, and can go directly to the apartment of Bobbie Moore, by the service elevator. The rear entrance of the hotel which is the service entrance is opened until 9:30 P. M. each night, and the Galt Avenue entrance is open until 10:30 P. M. After 10:30 P. M. all guests of the hotel must come in at the Sheridan Road entrance, Through the ventilator in Agent Medala's apartment, all parties in the corridor may be seen, and also all parties entering or leaving apartment 211. Observation of the apartment occupied by Vivien Mathews may also be made through the service door of the apartment occupied by agents.

Sherode Apartments, and the vicinity of the apartment house has been carefully surveyed, so that in the event Miller should visit there, he may be taken with a minimum danger to the men assigned to this job.

Every phase has been carefully considered, such as the possibility of Miller wearing a custom-made steel vest under his shirt, and also the possibility of confederates, or body guards. Agent Keating was informed the possibility of that Miller is now associating with "Pretty Boy" Floyd.

The Post Office and telegraph companies are also cooperating.

All details have been worked out in conferences by the writer, in conjunction with Agents Guinene and Keating, and it is believed nothing has been overlooked.

As this investigation progresses, you will be advised accordingly.


