





Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of July 12, 1933, inquiring to know what progress has been made toward the location of Max Levitt, with aliases.

I beg to advise that we have not made any effort to locate Levitt, as I discussed with Agent Gus T. Jones this matter and he suggested that we "lay off of Levitt" and I did not know it was desired to definitely locate him, however, efforts will be made to do so. I heard indirectly some days ago, from a source which I cannot now recall, that Levitt had returned to Chicago.

Receipt is also acknowledged of copy of a letter written by the Kansas City office on July 12, 1933, indicating that processes have been issued for Vernon C. Miller and Richard Tallman Calatas and enclosing photos of these Subjects.

The Kansas City office is not keeping us advised as to the progress of this investigation, nor as to any warrants which have been issued. For my own protection and information I would like to know at this time what steps towards prosecution of any of the suspects in this case have been taken and for whom Federal warrants are now outstanding. With regard to the Subjects for whom Identification Orders have been issued, please advise if any Federal process is outstanding. This question comes up whenever we discuss the apprehension of these men with other officers and I would like to be in a position to state the facts.

With reference to the above matter, the records reflect that the Subjects involved in the past have been connected with certain underworld characters in the Twin Cities, some of whom are now making their headquarters at what is known as the "Hollyhocks", a night club and roadhouse, located on the outskirts of the City of St. Paul. From this particular place in the past, record of many long distance telephone calls between underworld characters have been found. I am of the opinion that tapping of the telephone wires at this place will materially assist in this matter and authority to do so is requested.

For your information, the Signal Corp of the United States Army located in the Twin Cities at Fort Snelling will furnish the necessary equipment in the tapping of the wires involved and can be easily done without interference from any source.



Confirming telephone conversation between Assistant Director Nathan and Mr. Tamm of this office, you are advised that Special Agent Carney made an investigation at New Haven, Conn., where he interviewed Chief of Police P. P. Smith, who advised him that he had no information whatsoever regarding Vernon C. Miller, Vernon Miller or Vernon Marlin. Agent Carney further ascertained that the records of the Identification Bureau of the New Haven Police Department failed to reveal that anyone by the name of Miller was recently arrested there and further that the prints of Pretty Boy Floyd are not on file there.

Agent Carney was also advised that Chief Smith has no information regarding Floyd's presence in New Haven either at the present time or in the past. Mr. Carney discreetly learned from Chief Smith that he had no correspondence or communications of any kind with the Kansas City, Mo. Police Department regarding Floyd.



The telephone of Mrs. E. B. Connor, 1101 Central Avenue, Hot Springs, Arkansas, was the one used in relaying the first information from Hot Springs to Herbert Farmer's place at Joplin, Missouri. Mr. and Mrs. Farmer and Mrs. Mash have admitted this and indicate that either Calatas or Mrs. Calatas was doing the talking.

Mrs. E. B. Connor is known as Mary Connor or Louise or Lou Connor. She is thought to be the widow of a coal man, Eddie Connor, who was killed in New York about six months ago. Mrs. Connor disappeared from Hot Springs immediately after the occurrence here.

We are just in receipt of the attached, original, special delivery letter that arrived in Hot Springs after her departure and you will note from a perusal of the letter that the man writing it is her man. Every effort should be made to ascertain the identity of the writer of this letter as no doubt Mrs. Connor will at present be with him. She is described, as follows:

Age - 32 years
Height - 5 feet 5 or 6 inches
Weight - 140 pounds
Hair - light brown
Complexion - fair
Fair dresser.
Fair education.
Haughty disposition.
Speaks with southern accent.

If this woman is located she should be kept under surveillance and this office telephoned immediately in order that an Agent thoroughly familiar with this case can proceed to Chicago to aid in conducting an interview with her.

Agent Gus T. Jones recently requested that some telephone calls placed at Tulsa, Oklahoma, on the night that Walter Hamlin of Eureka Springs, Arkansas, was there, be traced. These 'phone calls, having been placed from pay stations at the Danmore Hotel at Tulsa, are as follows:

- July 8th Station 2-0926, Tulsa, Okla., called Muskogee, Okla., #4393, which is the office of D. S. Cannon, Sheriff.
- July 8th Station 2-0926, Tulsa, Okla., called Huntsville, Ark., Station "O", which is the Cogor Drug Store. (Note: Huntsville, Ark., is just a short distance from Eureka Springs, Ark., the headquarters of Walter Hamlin).
- July 9th Station 2-0925, Tulsa, Okla., called Oklahoma City, Okla., 5-7222, which is the Denny & Hill Garage, 2507 N.W. 10th Street.

It will appear from the above that the call placed by Hamlin from the pay booth in the Danmore Hotel was the second one listed, that is, the call to Huntsville, Ark., Station "O", the Cogor Drug Store.

With respect to memorandum which I sent you concerning the purchase of two new automobiles at Mia, Oklahoma, evidently for Bob Brady, I am just now advised by the Chief of Police at Mia that the deal for the third car has not gone through and he thinks they got scared. He has ascertained, however, that the Ford Coupe which was purchased there on the afternoon of Saturday, July 8, 1933, was taken to Sulphur, Oklahoma, by Bruce Brady and Bob Ross, brother and half-brother of Bob Brady, where they obtained the Oklahoma Certificate of Title and license plate

in the name of J. B. Scott, whose address they gave at the tag office as Moore, Pontotoc County, Oklahoma. There is no Moore in Pontotoc County but same is in Cleveland County. This is only another evidence of their efforts to elude the address of the purchaser of this automobile. Chief of Police Neal advises further that he has ascertained that they delivered this car to someone at Wynnewood, Oklahoma, which is in Carvin County. Chief Neal also expects to ascertain within the next few days the location of Maurice Fitzgerald, for whom the Chevrolet Sedan was purchased. If we can ever locate these cars and put a shadow on them we will no doubt find Brady and some of the others.



Having reference to my report of even date, I enclose herewith eight 45 cal. automatic shells which were discharged by unknown parties in machine gun target practice on Monday, the 10th instant, at a place near Limestone Gap, Atoka County, Okla. at which time 600 shots were fired by four men. They were traveling in a black '38 Ford Sedan with Kansas license, number unknown, and accompanied by two women. One of these parties has been identified as "Pretty Boy" Floyd and another as an Indian named Alvin Karpis, who has recently been living in Chicago.

Mr. C. M. Reber, ballistic expert of the State Bureau, has selected these eight shells found on the spot from 600 which were fired, the eight being selected because of characteristic markings indicating that some of them were fired from a machine gun with a 20 capacity clip and some from a machine gun with a drum, while one or two were fired from a Colts 45 automatic pistol, according to Mr. Reber. I am forwarding these for comparison with shells found at the scene of the Kansas City massacre and they need not be returned.

With reference to your recent letter requesting bullets and shells used in the assassination of attorney J. Earl Smith in Rogers County, Oklahoma, I enclose herewith in separate box two bullets and one shell found near the body of Smith when murdered. These were obtained from Mr. Dennis Buskyhead, County Attorney at Claremore, Oklahoma. The bullets were found by Sheriff Dave Faulkner of Claremore, who states that the larger of the two was found in front of the automobile belonging to Smith, which automobile was found at the point where Smith's body was thrown. The smaller of the two bullets was found on the running board of the car and it is the theory of Sheriff Faulkner that this bullet fell out of Smith's mouth when he was thrown from the car after he had been shot.

Please preserve these exhibits carefully as they have to be

returned to County Attorney Bushhead.

On July 12, 1933 Mr. Carney, former prohibition agent, called at this office and stated that he had observed a party whom he is sure was Pretty Boy Floyd in Springfield, Ill. on July 4, 1933; that the above occasion was in connection with a trip which Mr. Carney made to Chicago, Ill., at which time he stopped at a Shell gasoline station on Highway #126 at the right of the intersection of Highway #4, north of Springfield in the rear of the State fairgrounds; that this filling station is run by a Dutchman; that while in this station he noticed a dark green Buick Sedan with Kansas tags, seems having a tan top, pull into the station and that said car was occupied by three blond men; that he recognized one of these as Pretty Boy Floyd; that he later learned that after he left this station same was held up by these men.

This office will exhibit photographs of Floyd and the other subjects in this case to the proprietor of this Shell station in an effort to obtain an identification.







There also appear on this application the names of Harold Schenfler, 135 N. Kitchener St., Detroit, and Edward A. Attix, 207 S. Chalmers, Detroit, business address Penobscot Building, Detroit.

Previous residences furnished by Galatas are as follows:

Pontchartrain Apartments, from summer 1922 to Oct. 1927
135 N. Kitchener St., Detroit - claims to have lived there in October, 1927.
505 Dexter Ave., Montgomery, Ala.

Mr. Engstler advised agent that he personally does not know Galatas but believes that George Walters will probably recall him. He stated that the latest address contained in his files for Galatas is 107 Harrell St., Hot Springs, Ark.; that Galatas moved to this address last February from the Morris Hotel, Hot Springs, Ark. He does not know what Galatas' business is, nor when he was last in Detroit, but stated that Galatas had sent him a \$20.00 check from Hot Springs last February in payment of lodge dues, but at present he could not find said check, which was found to be no good.

A tracing of Galatas' signature, as contained on his application for admittance to the Elks Lodge, was made by agent and is being submitted herewith."

In addition to the above, Agent Socey has ascertained that the address of 1039 Penobscot Building, as given by Galatas, is and has been since 1929 the address of Edward A. Attix, an attorney. Inquiry regarding his status is now under way and it was learned that Inspector John Hoffman, Special Investigation Squad, Detroit Police Department, now resides across the street from this man. Inspector Hoffman has agreed to treat the matter in strictest confidence and to cooperate with a view of learning anything he may with regard to Attix and, among other things, to carefully observe if Galatas should put in an appearance at the Attix residence. No criminal record could be found on Galatas at the Detroit Police Department.

Other discreet inquiries are now in progress with respect to George Walters, above mentioned.

The above information was made the subject of a telegram to both the Bureau and Kansas City office on this date. Such additional information as can be obtained will be promptly forwarded and instructions contained in letter from the Kansas City office dated July 12, 1933 relative to the procedure to be followed if Galatas can be located will be kept in mind.



MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

I called Agent in Charge Colvin on the 'phone and endeavored to explain to him that the Federal Government has issued no reward for the apprehension of Pretty Boy Floyd; that, however, as he might understand, an Identification Order is out and is in his hands; that if any person inquires they can be told there is no Federal reward; that it can be indicated to the inquirer, however, that if information is received leading to the arrest and conviction of Floyd for the Kansas City murders this Bureau would feel very liberally inclined. With regard to Mr. Colvin's advice that there was no Federal process outstanding for Floyd, I indicated that I knew all about that, strange as it may seem, and that all he had to do was to pick up Pretty Boy Floyd and advise Kansas City, and everything would be all right.

Eight Men Are Name

Chase Starts For Slayers Of Officers

Escaped Kansas Con- victs and Pretty Boy Floyd Among Suspects

KANSAS CITY, Mo., July 6 (AP).—The Department of Justice Thursday ordered the arrest of Charles (Pretty Boy) Floyd, Oklahoma killer, five escaped Kansas convicts, Verne C. Miller, former Huron, S. D., Sheriff, and William Weissman in connection with the machine gun slaying of four officers and their prisoner, Frank Nash, at the Union Station plaza here June 17.

The announcement by Director of Police Reppert that Miller and Weissman were known to have had a part in the slaughter was followed by the appearance of circulars issued by the United States Bureau of Investigation, asking for the arrest of Floyd and the five convicts.

The circulars were issued at Washington under direction of J. Edgar

Hoover, director of the bureau. They named Harvey Bailey, Wilbur Underhill, Ed Davis, James Clark and Robert G. Brady, who escaped from the Kansas penitentiary Memorial Day, and Floyd.

Six Men Described.

The circulars bore the pictures of the six men, described them minutely and said they are sought in the murder of Otto Reed, chief of police at McAlester, Ok.; William J. Grooms and Frank E. Hermanson, police officers of Kansas City, Mo.; Raymond J. Caffrey, special agent of the United States Bureau of Investigation, and their prisoner, Frank Nash, at Kansas City, Mo., June 17, 1933.

In addition the department asked the arrest of Harry J. Garner and Bernard Phillips for complicity in the killings.

Bailey was said by police to have been a close friend of Nash, who was slain in the attempt to effect his escape. Bailey was the leader of the prison break Memorial Day in which the warden, Kirk Prather, was kidnaped. He was identified through a photograph by a station usher as the man who inquired the time of arrival of the train bringing Nash from Arkansas to Kansas City.

The usher said the man limped and carried a cane. Bailey was wounded in the leg in the prison break. A man answering Bailey's description came to the house where Miller had been living two hours after the killing, police were informed.

During Bailey's trial at Fort Scott, Kan., for bank robbery, he was identi-

fied by an officer of a Lincoln, Neb., bank as the leader of the group which robbed the institution of about \$2,000,000 several years ago.

Underhill, an escaped Oklahoma prisoner, was the slayer of Merlve Colver, a Wichita, Kan., policeman.

Skilled in Use of Arms.

Miller, who served a term as Sheriff at Huron, S. D., was widely known for his skill with firearms. He was convicted of embezzling funds while in office and sent to the State penitentiary. Later he went to St. Paul and Minneapolis, where he was accused of shooting an officer.

Weissman is wanted at Los Angeles for the slaying of David Antink, drug company treasurer, in 1926, and for the killing of John G. Finiello, a prohibition agent in Elizabeth, N. J., Sept. 19, 1930.

Floyd, who emerges from the Osage badlands for a foray against a bank now and then, is accused of half a dozen murders. Police say he was in Kansas City the night before the plaza slayings. A witness to the shooting identified him as one of the machine gunners through a photograph.

Miller had been living in Kansas City in a fashionable residential district where he was known to neighbors as a gentleman of leisure who devoted considerable time to golf.
