



ADOLPH LEWIN, FRI W dba Universal Gem and Jewelry Company, Inc., Room 604, 5 North Wabash, had been under

investigation, CG Division, as an active jewelry fence

Investigation determined that on 4/17/74, a Hammond Company, San Antonio, Texas, salesman's hotel room in Dallas, Texas, was burglarized of a quantity of an undetermined amount of jewelry. Portions of this jewelry would bear trade name "Princess" and tags with the initials "BMH".

Investigation determined that on 2/14-15/74, the hotel room of the entertainer LEE LIBERACE was burglarized of jewelry amounting to \$24,055, including a Tiffany platinum pocket watch encrusted with diamonds. USA's Strike Force, NDI, Chicago, Illinois, contacted and furnished above information. An affidavit in support of a Title III application was forwarded to the Department of Justice on \$/20/74. On 4/2/74, the Attorney General authorized the implementation of the Title III application concerning the Universal Gem and Jewelry Company, Chicago, Illinois, and the U.S. District Judge, NDI, Chicago, Illinois, issued the court order for this implementation on 4/3/74. Chicago Office was partially operational as of 4/4/74, but not fully operational until evening of 4/5/74. On 4/17/74, a conversation was monitored between

#### DETAILS:

The Chicago Division has been conducting an intensive investigation of ADOLPH LEWIN, doing business as Universal Gem and Jewelry Company, Incorporated, Room 604, 5 North Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, who was suspected of being engaged in the "foncing" of stolen jewelry. Investigation ind determined that MATIN, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Rumber was presently on Federal probation which extends until May 29, 1975, after having pleaded guilty in United States District Court (USOC), Northern District of Illinois (NDI), to two separate indictments. LEWIN had pleaded guilty to a viciation of the United States (U.S.) income tax law, and also to giving false statements to the Treasury Department in connection with transactions involving the buying and selling of gold and silver.

"Princess" and other items stolen were affixed with a company tag bearing the Hammond trademark, which consisted of the initials "BMH" in a diamond. This tag also reflected the gold contents of the item which in most instances was 14 carats.

The Dallas Office of the FBI advised by a communication dated March 5, 1974, that between the hours of 7:00 P.M., February 14, 1974, and 12:45 A.M., February 15, 1974, Jewelry valued at \$24,065 belonging to LEE LIBERACE, a well-known night club and television entertainer, was stelen from MBERACE's suite at the Statler-Hilton Rotel, Dallas, Texas, where he had been registered since February 10, 1974. According to the Dallas communication, at the time of the burglary, LIBERACE was performing at McFarland Hall Auditorium, Dallas, Texas.
