## DETAILS: AT LOS ANGELES CALIFORNIA:

Active investigation of subject is predicated on receipt of the Bureau letter referenced herein, which reflected that Source a had advised the Bureau that DIETRXCH, through her association with one lis an active agent for collaboration movement for the united States and France. Source A, ot the time she furnished her information to the Bureau, mentioned that Dremrich had recently been in washington and through her theatrical connections had arranged to discuss the JEAN GSBIN case then pending in the State Department. Mention of this will be made later.

inyestigation it is known to the writer that her mother is still residing in Berinn. It is presimed that her father is dead.

A review of the Los Angeles files reflecte in L. 1. 61-252, Seridy 45, which case is entitled: "NEXS-LETTERS", that in a News-Lettepussue of June 12, 1940 (News-Letter is a publication published by the News Research, Inc., 7046 kory yood Boulevard, Los Angeles), are a photograph and short statement reproduced from the German-published Sturner which reads as follows:
"Reproduction from the 'Stuermer', (a) captioned 'YaRLENE DIEIRIGH Taking Oath of $4 l l e g i a n c e ;$; (b) Famous film star becomes American citizen. She is dhom here together with Los Angeles naturalization official. (c) Film actress, MARLENE DIETRICH, born in Germany, has spent so many years with the moving picture Jews of Hollywood that she now has become an merican citizen. Mingling with Jews has completely de-Germanized her. This picture shows her taking the oath of allegiance in Los Angeles. What the Jewish 'judge' (STuERMER'S emphasis) himself thinks of the prescribed oath becomes ovident from his attitude; shirt-sleeved ( 1 )(STUERMER'S emphasis), he administers the oath by which MARLENE DIETRICH betrays her fatherlende

At the present time Subject is carrying on what is locally described as a "terrific love affair" with JEAN CABIN, the new French film star, who recently completed the picture "Moon-Tide" at 20th Century Fox Studis. GABIN is the Subject of Los Angeles file 100-6792; which is in a closed status. It suffices to mention here that CABIN had been reported as being pro-Ticky because he refused to align himself with other French stars publicly going all-out for Free France. However, investigation has failed to reflect that he is engaged in any un-American activities or in any way actively aiding the Vichy govermment. Wh Copy of instant report is being designated for the GABIN file, and, as it applies, further mention will be made of that affair hereinafter.

In the review of the Ios Angeles files, with reference to Subject, DIETRICH was connected with JOSEF VON STERNBERG, Director, who presentiy

VON STENNBERG telephonicaliy contacted the Los Angeles office on Jamaryi, 1942, mad nadvised Special Agent in Charge $B$. B. HOOD that he is a friend of FOILNDELIER, wad that he was apprising the Eureau of this fact, but that if there were any information he could fumish which might be of essistance to the Bureau, he would be only too glad to 'elp. A fere days later, Maplene IFEIRICH telephonically contacted the witer, who, as will appear hereinafter, had previously interviewed her, and stated that VON STERNBEPG was considerably disturbed because he had not been called on by the Bureau.

On Jamary 5, 1942, agent interviewed VON STERNBERG at length in the Bureau office with reference particularly to Vounsomykr. He mentioned that in the summer of 1939 VOLLHEELIER, who is a $\begin{gathered}\text { miter of considerable repute, tried }\end{gathered}$ to get MARLENE DIETRICH to meet representatives of the German movie companies in Paris to discuss possible contracts for the making of pictures in cerman. But DIETRICH, VOll STERNBERG stated, was furious at such overtures and would have nothing more to do, with him because she wanted to have no connection with anything German.

VCN STERNBERG is also mentioned in report of the writer dated at los Angeles February 14, 1942, in the case entitled: . FHAS. INTETNAL SECTRITI-G".
ddvised informants that DIETRICK was very close to VON STERHBERG, being in Irequent telephonic commanication with him. At the time be was interviewed, VON STERNBERG Etated he was born Kay 29, 1894, in Vienna; that he is a full Jew, an American citizen, and during the first World par he served with the United States Ary, being attached to the office of the Chief of Staff. He was a Corporal in the Signal Corps. He obtained his citizenship through the Fy-Anaturalization of his father in 2908.

LOE Angeles file $61-444$, entitied: vJOE WON STIERNBERG, LISCELIANEDUS T, INFORLSITON CONCERNING", sets forth data to the effect that VON STERNBERG had abeen reported as a posaible Subject of investigation beceuse he objected to an irport being placed near his home. It developed that this objection was based aolely on the fact that the airport would disturb his paace and quiat. Informayetion is also oontained in this file that DEETRICH, being close to YON SIERNBERG, Tas also so inclined. No information of any positive nature is conteined in this File, which would be of interest to this investigation.
cosetilne. VON STERNBERG was observed being in the house before it was finished and explained to informant that he went there to "get inspiration from the risw. This matter was brought to the attention of this office for fossible valve.

In Los ingeles file $100-4880$, catitied: reference is made to report of the writer dated at Los Angele s June 13, 2941 , herein on page 3 interview with MARIENE DIEIRICH is set forth. At this time she was living at the Beverly Hilis Hotel, Beverly Hills. It hed been ©leged - andernector and producer, was being financed by Nazi funds, and it was known that DIETRICH had been acquainted with him.

## STEIKICH stated that she was positive

 pro-Nazi because he hed never associated with any of them when Living inf france, and she explained that the money in this ins ance came from the Chase National Bank in New York. She mentioned, too, that RENE: CLAIRE the director, was of the same opinion as herself with reference toOf particular interest here, is page 4 of that report, wherein DIETRTCH, in the general discussion which followed the intervier, eet forth her theories concerning HITLER. Sho stated that in 1936 she was in Paris and that DOH RIBBENTMOP was trying to get her to go back to Germany to make a picture. (He told her that RITJER wanted her to come back to be a German actress and also do play. These overtures were being made at the very time that she was trying to get a paseport to this country. Upon telling the German official that she had contracts in Amarica, he told her that if she would come and visit EITLEF for several dass, she would get her passport. She excused and got out of this by stating that the Cerman press had been against her and that she had to go to America, For the sake of her political beliefs and getting even whth HIMLER, DIEIRICH stated that for two hours she debated calling HIIIER directiy on the telephone telling him that she would come and visit him and when she got there she planned to kill him. She described HITLER as being 'not a normal human being mentally' and described his evident feeling for her as the has a tick for re?
"Continuing, Miss DEIRICH stated that she had been informed that HITER had made some French diplomata sit for four hours through the remunning of one of her pictures and these diplomats told her that they neariy died because they could not smoke or even talk while he was watching her act. This pioture had been made by LUBITSCH, a Jew, and so had not been showen generally in Germany at all."

At the time DEEMTCH contacted agent with referance to VON STERNBEIG, namely, on Jaumary 5, 1942, she also inquired as to whether there was ary information available from the Los Angeles office files regarding the pro-Nazi sentiments of were confidential and that no information therein with reference to him was available to her. It was recalled to her that she had been interviewed, inasmuch as this office had been advised that she might have information indicating that was pro-Nazi. She admitted that she had none; in fact, that he
was quite the contrary. She stated that should any such information come to her attention, she would advise this office.

Los Angeles files also contain memorandum submitted by Special Agent

In Los angeles file $100-4920$, entitled: carman ACIIVITMES IN THE IOS ANGETES AREA', Serial 836, Source advised Special Agent
December 23, 1941, that ERICH RmMRQuE, the author of the book wall Quiet on the Western Front, is definitely anti-Fascist and is constantly in the company Oof MaRLENE DIEIRICH, Tho, Source stated, is quite woll-known to be mo-Nazi among the movie people and who is a person who would think it was mart to be a foreign gent. Source had no further information with reference to subject. $62 / 610$
With reference to manages, it will be recalled that he fought in the German Army during the first World Far, came to this country some years ago,
 stood that as a result of same, he was officially banned from over again apparing in Germany. REMarque is a Subject of Los Angeles file 100-5669, antitled: "ERICH MART FREMARQUE, INTERNAL SECURITY-G", same being in a closed status at the present time and merely containing miscellaneous memorande with reference to REMARQUE, who from time to time has been reported to this office as being possibly pro-Corman. However, none of these reports contain any specific information. DIETRICH carried on an affair with REMARquE for a period of about three years up until two years ago, their open association causing considerable comment upon the part of neighbors, Agent has had occasion to discuss REMAROUE with several individuals prominent in the movie industry, and none of them believe him to be actively pro-German or engaged in any activities detrimental to the best interests of this country. Reference to him will be made later. He is at the present time residing in the Beverly-filshire Hotel, Beverly H111s, and being on enemy alien, is subject to the curfew.

As a result of the cable censorship stop placed locally, there was forwarded to this office from the Office of Cable censor on June 9, 1942, a tablegram sent to REMAROUE in care of YARLENE DIETRICH, which read as foliows "Please inform whether suits you rent Swiss House against dollar transfer Americh. Sincerest greetings. Signed, "The Office of cable Censor referred this message to the local Federal Comunications office to see if it should be released. There was no information in the Los Angeles files with reference to . and from the contents of the fruarcue file, it clearly appears that this item refors to property owned by REMARQUE in Burope. :

Los Angeles file No. entitied: . . . . . . . . S., ESPIONAGE-Gn, Bureau file satans information in Writer's report of March 4,2940 , that when was in the Los hugeles area, ahe was trying to get in touch with warLeNE DIETRICH and ERICH REDAMQUE. At that time DIEIFICH told an informant of this office that she was goine to have nothing to do with and that the same istrue of REMARQUE.

Los Angeles file No, $100-0-22571$ contains a long-hand note from onef from dated warch 8, 1942, wich read as follows: rround this German girl's picture in the Bible where I put it five years sge. I dreamed the same dream three times about her, then hunted up the paper and cut out the picture. Now I am wondering what she is doing." The picture he enclosed was a photograph of DIETRICH shown as she was leaving the Federal Building in Los Angeles where she took out her first papers for American citizanship and took the oath of allegiance.

Los Angeles file 9-0-221 contains a letter forwarded to this office by Attorney, whict Producer had asked him to forward to the Bureau. This letter, which was printed in ink, mado light of DIETRICH'S ability as an actress but was in no sense an axtortion letter.

Los Angeles file No. case entitled:
WAS., ESPIONACP-G", contains the informstion that Subject, while in California, was traveling with the international society set, made up of such individuels as His relations ERICH REMARQUE, MARLENE DIETRICH, GREIA GARBO, and His relations with these associates was purely social. Investigation of this matter, in which the Washington Field office is origin, according to the local, file fails to reflect that he is angaged in espionage activities.

Los Angeles flle No. $\quad$ entitled:
 intervier with subject by agent. It had been reported that Subjects were negotiating with DIEIRICH for the making of a picture. She was interviewed with reference to them, advising that she never actually talked to them, the matter being handled by her agent, and so knew nothing about them. Instant case is in a closed status.

Los Angeles file No. $\quad$ entitled: $\quad$ in the repart of Special Agent dated at San Francisco harch 25, 194, contains on page 8 the information fhat Subject clains to be a good friend of MARLENE DETRICH and her husband, RUDOLFSIEBER. It is noted that the report of Special Agent not enfaged in espionage.

Los Angeles file 65-0-222 contains a letter from this office to the Bureau lated November 10, 1938, setting forth information received from kind F. GRUEE, Agent in Charge, U. S. Secret Seryice Office, this city, which stated that one employed
reported that a man supposed to be the uncle of Manicne DIEHHCH made frequent trips to unknown points, and thought he might be engaged in espionage according to this information, related that man named KRON or KROM, Living somenere in Westwood Village and about 40 to 45 years
 as being about 52 to 58 years of age and very intelligent. Informant did not know the name of the supposed uncle but thought he used the name DIETRTCH, and had no specific particulars. From information available, it does not appear that DIEMRICH has any relatives in this, country other than her husband and daughter.

Los Angeles file 100-0-25349 contains a near ancum dated December 10, 1941, entitled: "DP, HAL G. GiELER, INTERMAL SECURITY-G". It states that on November 11, 1011. Solved advised that she was well-acquainted with BTETER. having met him

Ios Angeles file 100-0-283 states that on June $12,1940$. motion picture and radio actor, residing at telephonically communicated with this office to advise that he thought the activities of WARLENE DIETRICH and her family were very suspicious. At that time he pointed. as, out that she was so promerman that she would not even allow her daughter to ride in an English saddle, and that she lived at the Beverly Hills Hotel where she could meet many influential people. This information was furnished to Special Agent.

interviewed at his apartment tire stated that while he did not know MARLENE DIETRCCH personally, he had frequently observed her at Schwab's Drug Store, 8026 Sunset Boulevard, which is at the corner of Sunset and Laurel Canyon. This drug store, according to is frequented by movie people. Somewhere $\quad$ heard that varcicNe Diem THICH was so pro-German that she would not allow her daughter to ride in an angle ah saddle. He also stated that when she would come into the drug store with her daughter and a Cerman-appearing fellow, she would order a coca-cola and engage in an ardent conversation with this man and her deughter. In order to find out what they were talking about, he stated he would get in behind the counter and
mix himself a Coca-Cola, whereupon they would start talking about the weather in English, whereas theretofore they had been speaking in German. He did, not know the identity of this man, but when Agent magested that it might be, ERICH REMARQUE, 2 known consort of HEIRICH, he informed that it probably was he.

This was all the information could furnish concerning MARLENE DIETRICH.
attention is directed to the fact that LARIFNE DIETRICH and ERICH REMARQUE have been mentioned in Los Angeles file .... regarding but that there is nothing definite to indicate that they are engaged in espionage activities.

bID Angeles office chained no information with reference The same is he of the files in the office of From Source it was ascertained on May 29, 1942, that Subject was born MARY MagDALENE VON LOSCH in Berlin, allegedly December 27, 1904. According to her biography in the motion-picture almanac, she was educated in a private school in Weimar and a musical academy in Berlin. of the marriage with RUDOLF SIEBER she has the daughter MARTA, who is about 17 years of age. Under the heading "Stage and Screen Background", she trained in the MAX REINHAROT School of Drama in Berlin. Currently, MAX REJNHAPDT has a drama school in Hollywood, where Subject's daughter is studying. DIETRICH made her first appearance in a German version of "broadway". Her next part was in an untitled musical comedy. For three years thereafter she divided her time between stage work and cinema, probably, according to this source, working for Tobis, Ufa, Berlin. The pictures in which she worked that were released in the United States were, "I Kiss Your. Hand, Madame", and Three Loves". In 1932 she appeared in Paramount Pictures, "The Blue Angel", "Morocco", and "Dishonored". It was her appearance in the Cerman-made "Blue Angel" in which she worked for VON STERNBERG that got her into the United States under contract to Paramount. She made several pictures for Paramount in 1933 through 1936, when she ended her association with that studio with the picture "Desire". In 1937 she appeared in the British-made "Knight Without Armor", returning to Paramount for the picture "Angel", and then went into eclipse until she was resurrected by JOE PASTERNAK, the producer at Univerbal Studios, for the picture, "DESTRY Rides Again". During her work at Paramount Studios, DIETRICH always worked under VON STERNBERG with the exception of one she made under ERNST LUBITSCH, who started the picture, "Hotel Imperial", ran up a production cost of $\$ 900,000$, and then the picture was never finished. It appeared. that DIETRICH just could not "give" without VON STERNBERE, and all during the production there were squabbles with her new director and production officials.

With reference to her personal history, Source continued that wderpite her marriage to SIEBER, with whom she has not lived for many years, at lagat as long as she has bean in the United States, DrEMRICH has been promiscuous in a bland, flamorous sort of way. Shes of course, was VON SIERNBERG'S mistriciss. DIEIRIEA has never boen able to thold man'. She gets them and loses them in perigas of amour ranging from 'quickies' to 'six nonths'. It made MarLene out as doing all the chasing and oven taking cabin back after the GINGER ROCERS incident.

MARIERE has another film to do for Universal but told REMARQUE that che didn't like the one prepared for her.

Upon receipt of reference teletype from the Washington Field Office, reflecting that Source $A$ was to be on the west coast, this source was contacted on Hazy 27, 1942, at which time she advised she was leaving the city but would be available on May 29, 1942, at which time she was interviewed by agent with reference to information in her possession concerning Subject. Source $\mathbb{A}$ explained the background of the film set-up in Europe, stating that Ufa no longer exists and is now called Continental Films, and that that setup is endeavoring to sell films in South America; that it consists of a merger of the German, French, and Dutch Film Companies. Continental Films has distributed in Russia and the United States up to the declaration of war. Source A was pressed for what connection Subject had with and at which time she replied that it is POSSIBLE that MARIENE is involy ed, whereupon she went on to state that when 20 ch Century Fox studios got JEAN CABIN under contract to come to this country, he had just flown away from Paris, in fact had gotten out of Paris just fifteen minutes before the Germans came in. From there he went to the south of France, where he was entertaining in the home of the VAUSAUGES (chocolate manufacturers). While there, a German representing Continental Films contacted him and tried to get him to join the company. This he refused to do. Source a advised then that DIETRICH showed no interest whatsoever in GABIN until he began to make a success in this country. Then she started to pursue him and at the present time has him, $=$ according to Source A, "ga-gan.

Source A stated that before we left Europe, DrEmICH was closely hasociated with and but could furnish no further information as to what this association consistad of, other, than being employed in makine Prench pictures and these men were comnected with the French ifin industry. she knew nothing as to whether there was eny more intimate relation, and oven whether thry mere good friends, but she assumed that they must have bean. She did not know whether metrich hed bean in comection with them since the war or even if she hed come to this country, but in view of MardeNe's infatuation for GABIN, or at least her purguing him, and because DIETrictil had once laom and Source A thought it "gossibisk" that they vere commancating now and stau trying to get GABIN to go back to France and make pictures for continental Filme.

At this point Sowrce brought out that she had been hired by 200 can cat try Fox Studios and Colonel marrm zandce in particular to hande the cope of JEAN GASIN with the State Department; that thise case presentiy consisted of trying to gat an inmigration quota number or maike appropriate arramgements so that GABIN mould not have to retarn to France. Ste indicated tiat he was having trouble doing that: that he was only in this country under a viastor's vias. To that end she adrised that about a month ago she was in Washington, D. Oe, moking the necessary arrangements contacting the necessary peopie to proparly present the case to the state Department. She said GABIN did not want to to back to France; that his etatus is presembly beine reviewed by the mangration Department; that she has checked into the matter thoroughly, written letters back to France, ote, and is convinced that he is the simple, ordinary, peasant type of Frenchman who not oniy does not know enougit to be engaged in ary subversive activities but mould not do so.

Thise in Washington woricing in cabifis behalf, she had him come dow to the city from Mew York where he was then stopping. Shortly thereafter, DHeritury came dom to Washington, aliled GABMN on the 'phone in Source Ats office, told him that she had arrangements made for him to stay in a rocm next to har in the Carleton Hotel, and that she was going to get overything fixed up with the War and State Department so that he would have no trouble remaining in this country. Source A indicated that she was very incensed at thit presumptwous and dictatorial action on the part of DIEmichi in trying to take the matter out of Source A's hands. The other sister; Mrs. a daughter and one son, In a cerman prison comp. GaBIN said he had had two letters from . his parents are both dead. His present wife is a second wife and there are no children from either marriage. mentioned above is connected with 20th Century Fox Film Studios. and resides at and resides at was insted. he resides at is a friend for 20 years One at 20 th century Fox stucuos nade a statement concerning GABIN'S good character presently in London connected with 20th Century Fox, was listed as being a firiend of cabin's.

Source i told Agent What believed that an anomyous letter had been sent to either the State or the Justice Department which resuited in GABINIS difficulty in remaining in this country. She felt that the Vichy government was behind the anonymous letter, although she had no positive information in the matter.


With reference to GABIN, Sourg Ftetion that he wis retyent Gbotut tabing a stand during the present-situatioy, which is true of all Frenchmen wio thevere ralatives in France. Like all Frotormen, he $2 l$ so talks too much and is allutur his native land. It would baco a too-mixed-up affair for him to take angy, in definite step, al though Source stated that he signed mith the other Freichmeny
 Supe they all had relatives in France, and to sisn might bring trouble on them. Source insisted that as a resuit of passociation with GABIN, ne was convinced that there was nowng to worry about GABIN'S being mixed up in any un-American actiyities. According to this source,
and sister. With rexerence to. . this source knew nothing. As for he has two brothers in France and a son yo just recentiy got out of Horocco and has joined the American forces. Source prought up GABIN'S affair with DIETRICH,
and with reference to her stated that DIETRICH had made a picture in England. Before the United States was in the present war, Source stated that as does DIETRICH, and that that may account for attachment to her, although she certainly would not be in favor of Germany's bombing England. This source init that if were interviewed, she would tell DIETRICH aborts it.

Wi reference to this source advised that she hates Subjects husband, RUDOLF SIEBER, has for ten years been Living in New York with a Russian girl. This source also mentioned that IIETRICH'S mother is still in Berlin, and as far as this source knows, nothing has ever happened to her. As for DIEIRICI'S being associated with any French officials, same had never com to the attention of this informant.

With reference to GBIN and DIETRICH, Source advised that DIEIRICK has GABIN hooked. He was, at the time of agent's interview with this source, living at DIETRICH'S house. Also, over the affair he has broken with his two or three closest friends. While in New York without GABIN, HIETRICH sent a continual stream of wires and flowers. On the retum trip 15 mires were sent during the course of the journey across the country. This was just after the GABIN and GINGR HOCKS affair, which masplayed up in the newspapers. Source In explaining the relationship between SIEBER and hie wife, MARIENE DIEIRICH, stated that during the time Subject was having difficulty with GABIN and their affair was rocky, STEBER sent GABIN a wire asking him to be nice to MARLENE because she was such a sweet girl.
