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
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

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He said the war between the Japanese and Chinese is like two brothers arguing one telling the other what to do. BEY stated it is against Moorish religion to kill anything, and it is his opinion that it would be dangerous to compel a man to fight against his religion, as such a man might turn around and shoot those who make him fight. REY, formerly a member of MSTA #6, and now connected with ASTA at Baltimore, Waryland, stated he would go to jail before he would go into the army because Brother PROPHET, leader of HSTA, Chicago, Illinois, told BEY was him not to go. When ordered by the Selective Service Board to report for physical examination, he refused to let a negro doctor in Baltimore give him a blood test on the grounds that he is not colored. He was subsequently declared mentally disqualified for military service by reason of schizophrenia. BEY stated on April 14, 1939, that the negroes, Chinese, and Japanese are all from the same ancestry and hope some day to be supreme, that the whites are their enemies

and always will be.

DETAILS:

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This investigation is prodicated on information received from Reporter for the Richmond Times Dispatch, Richmond, Virginia.

Special Agent in Charge, H. I.

BOBBITT, on September 28, 1942, that he had received

some general information to the effect that negroes in the vicinity of St. James and Charity Streets, Richmond, Virginia, who attended a church in that location were organizing a sect along the Mohammodan lines. That these negroes were very ignorant and that there appeared to be one man who was the leader and two assistants who had full control of the group.

AT RICHADID, VIRGINIA

North 5th Street, who has a good knowledge of the negroes in the vicinity of St. James and Charity Streets, was contacted, and he advised that he had heard nothing of a religion such as that mentioned above but furnished the names of the following negroes living in that general vicinity whom he knew to be reliable:

Virginia Boat Club, advised that he had no knowledge of such a Mohammedan movement but stated that if there were such a thing it would be known to of the Richmond Urban League.

League, advised that the Moorish Science Temple is a Mohammedan group and is located at 13 East Charity Street. He stated that he recalled a negro named that Signed his pledge card for the Richmond Community Chest as he was of the opinion that was one of the members of the cult. That this cult is one of the many "store front" churches which had sprung up among the colored people during the depression and that since the negroes are employed full time they have no time to spend on such religious frills and that he is of the opinion that the Moorish Science Temple is no longer active.

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

The records of the Local Draft Board #5 reflect that EL, had stated in his questionnaire, "I have been a minister of Moorish Science since July 30, 1934 and was formally ordained July 27, 1934 by Prophet NOBLE DREW ALI (reincarnated) at Chicago, Illinois. I am Moorish-American—parents both born in Morocco." This record further reflected that EL was inducted into the army on August 11, 1942. Case #E79 of the Social Service Bureau, 1201 East Broad Street, reflects that EL had stated that he is a Moslem from birth, and that he and other members of this cult are not negroes but Asiatic Moslems.

According to this report AL and BEY attached to the names of the members are considered to be the free national name and that their surnames are slave names. Says he is the teacher of the Temple and receives no remuneration for this as all the members have small incomes or no incomes at all and are not financially able to pay him. As of November 1940 was occupying a room at using the same dining room and kitchen as the other occupants at the house, all of whom are

Clerk of Local Draft Board 4, made available the Selective Service record of BEY which reflected that he had checked his Selective Service questionnaire to indicate that he is a conscientious objector to both combatant and noncombatant military service.

Advised however that he could find no record which would indicate that the conscientious objector form had been sent to EY.

Board #4 dated February 2, 1942 reflects that an inquiry concerning

BEY had been made of his mother, who had advised the welfare worker that BEY had been living in Chicago, Illinois, since September 1941, and that he could probably be located through the Loharmedan Temple in Chicago, Illinois.

On February 27, 1942 BEY was classified in 1-A by the Local Draft Board. On May 15, 1942 he was given a physical examination by Local Board 18, 110 East Lexington Street, Balticore, Maryland, which reflected a positive test for syphilis: The same board was requested to give him a second blood test on June 16, 1942. By letter dated June 23,

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Local Draft Board 18, Baltimore, 1942, Chief Clerk BEY had appeared at Providence Marrland, advised that Hospital on June 23, 1942 to take a blood test, but when a negro doctor had attempted to give BEY this test he refuse i to allow the negro to take his blood, stating that he BEY, is not a negro but a Moorish-American. BEY then left the hospital BEY, is not a negro but a Moorish-American. without having the test made and went to the draft board and said he does not claim the negro race as his and would like for that matter to be straightened out. Then on June 29, 1942, addressed a letter to Local Draft Board 4, Richand, Virginia, which is as follows: "I receive your letter date June 24, 1942, and I am very serry that the doctor and the board got the wrong conseption about my statement during the time he was about to take my blood test. The question about the matter is that I discovered that my description of registrant was check wrong and when I asked then about the rectification they didn't seem that they wanted to give me consideration. It is written in our Devine questionnaire on page 4, question 62. It saids that the shade of the Moorish-American skin are olive, and if any Moorish 1.M. register up in this nation or in any state according to the complexion which is provided for the following, they have violate the Devine laws and the laws of the land that was hand down for us to go by. Therefor as a citizen of the United States of America I have founded its necessary for my complexion clive to be rectify on my description of registrant as it is being done on others. I am not to cause any confuision but this registration was made through misunderstanding. I am looking for my appointment stating when they can take my blood test."

The Selective Service questionnaire also reflects that on June 22, 1942, BEY had written a letter requesting a duplicate registration card to replace the one he had lost, in which he also requested that his nationality be listed as Moorish-American and complexion be checked as olive, "because the negro problem is being solve only as it can and that is by the Moorish National Devine Movement incorporated in this Government."

According to BEY then talked freely and told her that they belonged to the Mohammedan faith, and she discussed the difference between Mohammed and Christ as well as the difference between the Western Peoples.

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informed that BEY had said that all of the colored people, namely Regroes, Chinese, and Lapanese, belonged together and they all sprang from the same ancestry.



BEY stated in his questionnaire, "I am not a minister of religion.

I do customarily serve as a minister. I have not been formally ordained.

I am a student preparing for the ministry in a theological or divinity school. I am attending the Moorish Science Temple of America which was established before September 16, 1939, and is located at 13 East Charity Street, Richmond, Virginia. I was classified IV-H by the Selective Service Board on January 25, 1943."



BEY was interviewed for the ostensible purpose of determining the reason why service questionnaire that he is a conscientious objector to both combatant and noncombatant military service.

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During this interview BEY advised that he had never been ordained as a teacher of MSTA #6, but has permission to teach from Brother PROPHET, NOBLE DREW ALI (reincarnated) whom BEY said is really Mohammed III. He said that NOBLE DREW ALI is located in Chicago, Illinois, and is the head of the Moorish Science Temples all over the world. He said that LLI was formerly the teacher of MSTA 6 but that he is presently in the Army.

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According to BEY, the MSTA in Richmond started about 15 or 20 years ago. He exhibited his membership card bearing the date April 1932.

According to him only a very few persons attended the meetings of the Moorish Science Temples. He explained that this is due to the fact that the Hoslem rules are so strict. He said for example they are allowed to eat no meat nor do they use tobacco or liquor. He said that none of the members of the Moorish Science Temple in Richmond are of draft are other EL who is already in the army and who has been in Baltimore for the past two years and is connected with the BEY is truly a conscientious MSTA there. When asked if Objector to both combatant and noncombatant military service to the wall of his room and took down the Constitution of MSTA which also contained a picture of ROBLE DREG ALI. He then pointed to a section of the Constitution of MSTA stating that the Moorish-Americans are to abide by the laws of the United States and to cause no confusion. He also said that many members of the Moorish Science Temple of America are in the armed forces.

He stated that the only advice which is given by Prophet NOBLE DRE: All in regard to joining the Army is for the members to study the Koran. He pointed out that the Koran teaches that Moslems shall not kill anything, then he added that as a result of this rule the Moslems eat no meat. He explained that they do eat fish but said that the fish are not killed, for they die a natural death, when they are removed from the water.

BEY said that he thought that on the basis of this BAY would be justified in opposing to combatant service. However he said in this regard that the Moslems will fight if necessary, and he cited as an example that a Moslem will walk around a snake to avoid trouble. However, if the snake gets in his way the Moslem will kill the snake. He said also that the Moslems will fight to protect their women who are sacred to them. He stated that it is his opinion that the present war being waged is a religious war and that Allah will see to it that the side which is in the right shall win the war. BEY said however that he personally has not yet decided which side is in the right. He was unable to explain why he thinks this is a religious war except to say that his study of history leads him to believe so. He did say however that there are only two nationalities in existence on this earth. He said that these two nationalities are European and Asiatics. The Europeans are made up of the so called white people whom he added are not really white or they wouldn't have any blood, and he said that the Asiatics include the negroes, the Chinese, and Japanese, also all the people of the world who are not called white. He further stated that the war between the Chinese and Japanese is like two bruthers arguing, one telling the other what to do.

He also said that he was talking to someone in Capitol Square in Richmond some time ago who tald him that Hirohito of Japan had tried to make peace with Chiang Kai-shek, the dictator of China, but that Chiang Kai-shek was not willing to do so. He was unable to recall the identity of the person who had told him this.

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He went on to say that he felt BEY could not oppose to noncombatant service unless-then he paused and said, "No, I'm sure Brother PROPHET did not tell him to do so." He said he personally would oppose to combatant service because it is against his religion to kill, and he would not like to go into noncombatant service as he does not wish to have anything to do with this war. However, he said if he were called for noncombatant service he would comply rather than cause any trouble. He stated he is of the opinion that it would be dangerous to make a man fight against his religion because such a man might turn around and shoot the man who was making him fight. He advised that he had never heard EL, former leader of MSTA 6 make any comment on his views of the subject of war, and he said that the subject is apparently well satisfied in the United States Army. He went on to say that there were some persons in Chicago, Illinois, who were arrested for violation of the Selective Service rules and who said they were connected with the MSTA. However, he said that he had learned from Brother PROFHET in Chicago, Illinois, that these men who had violated the law were not connected in any way with MSTA. He said that a large number of F. B. I. agents had at that time gone to Brother PROPHET, had taken his picture, read all of his literature, and had decided that Brother PROPHET was all right.

He went on to state that MSTA advocates peace and that the members are of the belief that there is room enough in this world for everyone to live in peace.

The records of the Richmond Police Department reflect that BEY has no criminal record there other than a minor traffic violation.

According to BEY belongs to a Moorish Temple in Richmond which is a branch of a national organization, and that the literature is sent from the national head-quarters which is located in another state. Said that he had noticed nothing in their discussions which would lead him to believe that BEY is in any way sympathetic with the Japanese or in any way un-merican. He said that BEY is a regular purchaser of war savings stamps.

Case Delta Solits EL of 1524 Brook Road is connected with the Moorish Science Temple. This record reflects that this person was born about 1874 near Weldon, North Carolina, and that she is unemployed and too old to ever work again. According to this record, this person is dependent upon members of the Moorish Science Temple Church for her shelter, and she receives food and fuel from the city funds. She is illiterate and has two children who will have nothing to do with her because of her religion. According to this record LULA SUITS spends her spare time caring for the children of other members of her faith who live at 1524 Brook Road, and the rest of the time she spends attending services at the MSTA. She apparently enjoys the companionship of the other members of the household, and she states, "They are sufficient unto themselves and do not care to mingle with people on the outside."

On November 15, 1941 she told a case worker of the Social Service Bureau that children should not be permitted to attend picture shows, parties, or dances. When LULA was advised that pictures are frequently educational, she said she agreed, and for that reason moving pictures were shown in the MSTA, and in this way the children derived a benefit from them without going to a "show house" to see them. She said the rules of her church are so strict that very few persons attend the meetings.





Case #8659 of the Social Service Bureau reflects that FINK COBB BEY claims he is not a negro but a woor and has the religious name BEY. record states he has the appearance of a negro although he has a full beard. He lives with colored people in a colored district. According to his statement he voluntarily became a Moor about 8 years ago and used the name BEY although legally his name is COBB. He has had very little schooling but can write his name. In January 1941 he moved to 1524 Brook Road to a house occupied by other members of the same faith as he, where he lived 8 months and moved to 618 North 28th Street. He contemplated moving back to 1524 Brook Road, but he returned and was unable to get along with the occupants and again moved on December 4, 1941 to 520 North 27th Street. His family does not live with him as they are unable to get along but did share his room at 1524 Brook Road for several weeks during the summer of 1941. He requested the Social Service Bureau to put the name BEY on his relief check. He said he had not had his name legally changed to BEY as he did not have the money but exhibited his MSTA membership card as proof of his name.

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

that the 16th National Convention of the It was ascertained Moorish Science Temple of America was held at 1032 Orleans, Chicago, Illinois, from September 15 to September 20, and that CHARLES KIRKMAN was the Supreme Grand National Advisor and Moderator of that branch. It was further ascertained that he had a following of approximately 1500 members located in fifty-four active chapters throughout the United States. The details concerning the various chapters are contained in Chicago file 61-293. Subject required the secretary of each chapter to submit a financial report. He stated that the Internal Revenue Department was requiring him to file an income tax return from his organization, which is a religious corporation under the state laws of Illinois. The Subject also required that each chapter report any and all members working in defense plants, those buying war bonds and stamps and those serving in the armed forces, along with their addresses. The exact purpose of the statistics was not divulged. In the course of the convention the Subject stated he knew the FBI had been investigating the Moorish Science Temple. He said that he had been informed that certain members within the organization acted as informants for the FRI. He openly asked all members present if they were acting in such capacity and, if so, if they would please apprize him of the fact. No member responded to his request, however. He advised the members that they had nothing to fear from the FBI if they obeyed the laws of the Government. He also told the members present that now was the time for Negroes to better themselves financially and socially by getting jobs in defense plants.

Two organizations striving to foster racial pride have attracted numbers of Chicago Negroes from time to time. These are the Moorish American Science Temple and the Nation of Islam, ordinarily referred to as "cults."


Megroes but are proud of the name, contending that the Negro is "the
original man." Neither endorses the "Back to Africa" Movement.


In 1925 a small Negro wearing a flaming red fez similar to thomeworn by Turks appeared in empty lots and on street corners of Chicago's South Side to proclaim a startling new doctrine. He was Noble Drew Ali, born Timothy Drew in North Carolina. Prophet of Islam, and founder of the Moorish American Science Temple. Little is known of Drew Ali's early history. He is reputed to have been an expressman in Newark, New Jersey, where he is said to have founded the first Moorish American Science Temple as early as 1913. There is also some evidence to indicate that he had established branches of his cult in Pittsburgh and Detroit before he came to Chicago.

Drew's main contention was that the people commonly known in America as Negroes are of Moorish descent and thus Asiatics. Act six of his "Divine Constitution and By-Laws" reads:

> "With us all members must declare their nationally and their Divine Creed that they may know that they are a part and partial (sic) of this said government and that they are not Negroes, Colored Folks, Black People or Ethiopians, because these names were given to slaves, by slave holders in 1779 and lasted until 1865 during the time of slavery, but this is a new era of time now, and all men must proclaim their free national name to be recognized by the government in which they live and the nations of the earth, this is the reason why Allah the Great God of the universe ordained Noble Drew Ali, the prophet, to redeem his people from their sinful ways. The Moorish Americans are the descendants of the ancient Moabites who inhabited the North Western and South Western shores of Africa.

Prophet Nobel Drew Ali did not immediately rally many disciples to his banner, the Moorish star and crescent on a field of red. But he persisted, and at length was able to set up permanent headquarters. Though semi-literate,





he possessed an eloquent tongue, a persuasive manner, and a native shrewdness which enabled him to sway the poor and unlettered people who listened to him. Most of them remembered the race riots of 1919; all of them had experienced discrimination and other wrongs. Drew Ali was offering them pride of race and dignity. In 1927 a successful convention encouraged Drew Ali to expend his proselytising activities to other cities. It is difficult to ascertain just how many temples resulted, but those in Pittsburgh; Detroit; Charleston, West Virginia; Lansing, Michigan; and Youngstown, Ohio are fairly well authenticated.

Drew Ali had written and published his "Koran," a slim pamphlet consisting of a curious mixture of the Mohammedan holy book of the same name, the Christian Bible and anecdotes of the life of Jesus—the whole bound together with the Prophet's own pronouncements and interpretations. The Prophet began to do a profitable business in various nostrums and charms he had concocted, among them Old Moorish Healing Oil, Moorish Purifier Bath Compound and Moorish Herb Tea for Human Ailments.

More and more "Asiatics" flocked to the star and crescent standard. They flaunted their fezzes on the street and treated the white man with undisquised contempt. The Prophet announced that each devout Moorish American must carry a card bearing his credentials and his real (or Asiatic) name, signed by the Prophet with his seal. Often enough "slave" names were transformed into "real" ones by the simple addition of "El" or "Bey," these being titles signifying Moorish dignity. The membership card and button, when displayed to Europeans, would convince them that the bearer was enlightened and a member of an organization to be feared and respected.

To the Prophet this theory of new-found independence had been a more or less purely ethical or theoretical point, and he had not reckoned on its practical effect among his zealous followers. Alarming reports of street brawls, threats, insults, and minor violence centering around Moorish Americans were brought to his notice. Members were accosting the white enemy on the streets, showing their membership cards and buttons, and proclaiming in the name of their Prophet, Noble Drew Ali, that they had been freed of European domination.

Recalling the downfall of the militant Abyssinians and contemplating the current difficulties of the Garvey movement, Drew Ali issued this ukase:

"I hereby warn all Moors that they must cease from all radical or agitating speeches while on their jobs, or in their homes, or on the streets. Stop flashing your cards before Europeans as this only causes confusion. We did not come to cause confusion; our work is to uplift the nation."

Drew Ali's leadership was soon contested. In 1929 he became embroiled in a quarrel with CIAUDE GREENE, politician and former butler of JULIUS ROSENWALD, who previously had joined the temple. One day Drew arrived at his office to find that GREENE had moved all the furniture cutside and declared himself Grand Sheik. A civil war ensued, each faction enlisting support from temples in other cities. GREENE was shot and stabbed to death in his offices at the Unity Club on the night of March 15, 1929.

Drew Ali, arrested as he sat with his wife and group of followers celebrating (authorities charged) the murder of his rival, was defended by Attorneys AARON PAYNE and WILLIAM L. DAWSON, temple members who later gained political prominence. The Prophet, from prison issued a message to his flock:

"To the Heads of all Temples, Islam:

"I, your Prophet, do hereby and now write you a letter as a warning and appeal to your good judgment for the present and the future. Though I am now in custody for you and the cause, it is all right and it is well for all who still believe in me and my father, God. I have redeemed all of you and you shall be saved, all of you, even with me. I go to bat Monday, May 20, before the Grand Jury. If you are with me, be there. Hold on and keep faith, and great shall be your reward. Remember my laws and love ye one another. Prefer not a stranger to your brother. Love and truth and my peace I leave all.

"Peace from

Your Prophet

Noble Drew Ali.

This proved to be Drew Ali's final official proclamation. Released on bond, he died under mysterious circumstances a few weeks later. One theory is that he succumbed to injuries inflicted by the police during his imprisonment, another is that he was set upon by partisans of GREENE after his release and beaten so severely that he never recovered.

After Drew Ali's death Attorney AARON PAYNE attempted unsuccessfully to hold the group together. Each among several of the Prophet's disciples



announced that he alone was the rightful inheritor of Drew Ali's leadership. STEVE CIBBONS EL (formerly the Prophet's chauffeur) and IDA JOHNSON BEY. (who had been imported from Pittsburgh to assist in quelling the GREENE revolt) each maintained that the dead leader's spirit had entered his body. JOHNSON, a man of action, invaded the office of MEALY EL, another aspirant, and demanded recognition as Grand Sheik. MEALY EL demurred and received a terrific mauling. JOHNSON then dispatched his henchmen to kidnap KIRKMAN HEY, who claimed possession of Drew Ali's last will and testament.

KIRKMAN's wife, secretly surmising that her husband was being detained in JOHNSON's apartment, directed the police thither. A gun battle ensued in which two policemen and one Moor were killed. Sixty-three Moors were arrested, and JOHNSON was committed to the State Hospital for the Criminally Insane, where he subsequently died. STEVE GIBBONS also was apprehended after he had forced his way into Attorney PAYNE's home in search of Drew Ali's apers.

CIBBONS, too, was sent to the insane asylum, but was released several years later. In 1941 he was heading a Chicago temple on East 40th Street and still asserting his claim to the title of Grand Sheik of all Moorish American Science Temples. GIBBONS was one of six contestants, each one a temple leader and each one designating his own as Temple No. 1.


Services in each temple observe with minor deviations, the pattern established by Drew Ali. First, a minor sheik, a sheikess or the chairman reads and explains Drew Ali's version of the Koran. Then follows a more elaborate discourse by the Grand Sheik (in some temples called the Governor), the whole ceremony being punctuated at intervals by Christian hymns with the words Allah, Drew Ali, and Moslem substituted for God, Christ and Christian. Friday is observed as a holy day of rest, "because on a Friday the first man departed out of the flesh and on a Friday the first man was formed in flesh and on a Friday the first man departed out of the flesh and ascended unto his father God Allah, for that cause Friday is the Holy Day for all Moslems all over the world."

Since Drew Ali considered MARCUS GARVEY his forerunner (in a relationship analagous to that of John the Baptist and Jesus) and paid tribute to him in his Koran and in his sermons, Moorish Americans frequently laud and quote the Jamaican organizer.

January 8, the Prophet's birthday, is a special occasion in all temples. Pull Moorish regalia is worn by those members who can afford it, and there is likely to be feasting and distribution of gifts as in Christmas celebrations in Christian churches. A number of unconverted guests are invited; the customary speeches take on a more evangelistic tone. Expositions of the teachings and principles of the Prophet are offered in a simplified form for the benefit of those still under the influence of "The Folly" (Christianity).

CENTILITIES

The leader of each of the bickering factions has striven in vain to build up an organization as powerful (and as lucrative) as the parent body disrupted by internal warfare and the death of Drew ali. According to Attorney AARON PAYNE, the Prophet in one year amassed a fortune of \$36,000.00 and commanded a membership of 12,000. Politicians respected and courted him, and Congressman OSCAR DE PRIEST was reputed to have joined the temple.





Subject: Disaffection in Wegro Cult.

May 8, 1943.

Sussary of Information:

It is reported that a national, semi-religious organization of Degroes, known as the Moorie, Cult, teacher that the Negro is not subject to the laws of this country, but having been brought here originally against his will, still owes allegiance to his African home. Other teachings include disregard for the United States flag, which is replaced by a flag of their own, no participation in politics, and a benevolent attitude toward dancing and swing music.

Male members reportedly wear a distinctive headgear similar to a fez and the women wear a purple headgear, the description of which is not known at present.

This organization is reported to be nation-wide, concentrating on the youth of the Perro communities, and when one of the members is drafted into military service, great sorrow is expressed.

In connection with activities of the organization in Anderson, Indiana, it is stated that so-called divine services are held weekly at a church on 16th Street, Anderson, which operates under a charter from Chicago. A convention was held here last summer which was attended by many visitors from Chicago.

The herd of the Anderson branch is Helico Boore, an employee of the Delco Remy Company. Another local leader is known as "Big-Foot" Townsend.

It was observed by the writer that the house at a local Sired which is the reputed meeting place of the subject group, is an uncainted, rather large and delapidated wooden house, in the negro section of Augusta. In the front of it is a sign-reading, "Moorish Lunchroom" and a blue and grace half-moon cutout is pasted on the glass of the front door. On one occasion a negress, approximately 5' 5" and appearing to be about 40 years of age, was observed to pull a small wagen into the yerd of the shouse and to enter the house as though she is the individual who resides there. This negrees was attired in a long skirt of a red. material and were a piece of cloth wrapped about her head in the fashion of a turban.

Summary of Information:

Information received at this office indicates that Bubject the Grand Sheik of Temple #52, Flint, Michigan. Subject was questioned a in regard to pro-Japanese activities of this organization on February 15. 1943, and he denied any talk in his temple about Japanese.

Subject's home was searched with his permission, and there was revealed a large picture of Tojo in uniform, also a neve clipping about the p "untouchables" of India fearing the Japs; also an unregistered revolver the disrepair).

On February 18, 1943, Subject called the FBI office and state he had not been able to eat since the interview of February 15, and that he wished to give a statement and to "tell the truth."

Contents of the statement given by Subject were as follows:

Leaders of his Temple told members (as late as Movember, 1942); that the Japs would win; that the Japs would save the dark skinned people; that he (Subject) joined the organization in 1931, quit soon thereafter. and returned in 1937; that he was made Grand Sheik in 1940. Subject stated that he got the picture of Tojo from a female member whom he advised not to carry around a thing like that; that he couldn't explain the news clipple found in his home.

- Subject further declared that it is the belief of the leaders of the Temple that the Japs are friends of the Moors; that clippings are passed around to members relating Jap victories.

Subject is reported to be the leader of group for which met at 2510 St. John St., Flint, Michigan. It is further reported that Subject has a son in the U.S. Army located at a camp in Indiana; name: Robert Verey Jones
