



DETAILS: Investigation to date reflects there are a number of organisations in this area of Moslem faith. They call themselves Moors, and are followers of the Islamic, Moslem or Mohammed taith. Their beliefs are similar in that their teachings are from the religious pamphlet, "The Holy Koran", NOBLE DREW ALI is their prophet, and Macca is their holy city.

It appears that all of these groups are or have been connected with the MODRISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA, INFORMORATED (MST) headquarters, located in Chicago, Illinois, of which C. MIRKIAN BEY is the Supreme Grand Governor. The organizations located in this area are being set out along with officers and known members:

The above organization, as will be borne out later in this report, was formerly connected with the parent group of the MOCRISH SCIENCE TEXPLE in Chicago, Illinois.

TEMPLE NULBER 41 of New York City has listed as its Grand Shiek BEY, and it is believed that BEY is the individual referred to, and thus it is assumed that he is in charge of TEMPLE NUMBER 41.

During the course of the investigation of this case, it came to the attention of Special igents that a group of negroes, believed to be members of the MOORISH SCIENCE TRIPLE CHURCH, a year or two ago, purchased some property on Hancock Street, Brooklyn, New York, through the Brovoort Savings Bank of Brooklyn.

In this connection was contacted at the Brevert Savings Bank of Brooklyn and he furnished the records of his office con-

cerning the purchase of property at 239 Hencock Street, Brooklyn, New York, by the MOORISH N.TIONAL INSTITUTE, INCORPORATED. Prior to the time this property was sold, which was October 9, 1941, a credit investigation was conducted, and from the credit report, dated July 8, 1941, the following information was taken of an investigation made of eight of the most prominent members of this MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE Chapter Number 34:

According to this credit report, TEMPLE NUMBER 34 was incorpore ted in 1936 under a charter granted from the Home Office at Chicago, Illinois.

mentioned above, is reported to have stated that 75 to 80 families make up this group and that they have been holding meetings in private homes and they wished to purchase the property at 239 Hancock Street in order that they might have a meeting place; further, that they follow the teaching of Mohammed, that it is a regular racognized religious body, empowered by the State to make marriage, and so forth.

Street was sold for the purchase price of \$5,750. The property was formerly used as a meeting place for a political party, either Democratic or Republican.

On April 17, 1943, Special Agent and the writer observed the promises at 239 Hancock Screet, at which time it was noted that this is a large three-story stone building in somewhat of a run-down condition. The front door and part of the windows were boarded.

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At the time was interviewed, it came out that he had not registered for the Selective Service and Training act, although he was only years of age.

He claims at that time they had a membership of approximately 500 people himself took an active part and on several occasions made religious telks.

It is pointed but that this group is now located at 1796 Fulton. Street, Brooklyn, New York, and La known as the Moorish Science Temple, The Devine and National Movement of North America.

that approximately 3 or 4 years ago he attended a spacial meeting of the above group, at which time a Japanese was present and spoke, and was introduced to the audience as on official of the Japanese Government. that the topic of the Japanese's speech was concerned with the situation between the Japanese and the Chinese in China and concerning racial matters. This Japanese made the statement that their fight against the Chinese was the result of European domination by which he meant white domination. The Japanese speaker claimed that the Japanese and the Chinese were of the same belief and that it was the Japanese' intention to establ sh Chinese governments protected by the Japanese. He went on further to state that all the dark people in the world should organize to gain their freedes and liberation from white domination and should unite with the Japanese. AZIZ ended that the Japanese speaker had at any time made any reference to the Alerican negroes. However, he did not confirm or deny that the Japanese speaker in the above statement included the American negro as dark people of the world.

In speaking of his religion and concerning the Japanese stated that the Azhar University, located in Egypt, is one of the oldest universities in the world, that there they teach 60 different languages and that members

He wild not recall the names of members or leaders of the Temple located on Pitkin Avenue but did recall that two persons named to him as EL vore the Grand Shieks or leaders of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE on Gates Avenue, Brooklyn, New York.

He claims to only have attended meetings in Brooklym for a short time and subsequent thereto he attended a temple located at 432 lencx Avenue. New York City, which he believed was known as Temple Number 27. According to this group operated for approximately 4 or 5 years but is now nonexistent. He claims that after two or three years he dropped his membership of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE because he was not of the opinion that they properly taught the Moslem or Mehammed to the or teaching. That there was a membership of from 40 to 50 people at the Temple located at 432 lenox Avenue, and the only name, which he could furnish as having been connected with that group was one that he and other Moslems now hold services in his apartment under the organization name of the claims that all of their male followers are duly registered under the Selective Service help, that they are strict followers of the Moslem religion and, as such, are not in any way anti-white or in sympathy with the Japanese or other Isiatic races.

viously mentioned in this report, and he denies that he has ever made any Japanese statements or that any followers of the Moslem faith are pro-Japanese.

When asked concerning a university in Egypt that many of the Moslems attended, he advised that there is a Jam Alhazar University located in Egypt, which is a religious university, and which teaches the Arabic language and the Islamic religion. Genied that he has ever heard pro-Japanese statements made at any of the meetings of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE and he denied that he has ever seen any Japanese in attendance at any of their meetings.

THE FECTIONS WHICE : negro weekly newspaper of New York City, in an article dated February 28, 1942, stated that the long secret Japaneseinspired ABB Plan" for Harley was brought out into the open this week with the errest by FBI men of ROBERT /JORDAN, one of Harlen's bess known street corner orators and leader of the belieplan-Pacific Movement. In substance this article states that JORDAN is known to have spread Japanese propaganda openly in his street coechos. The article further claims that Jap agents, pretending they sought better relationship between Japan and the United States, decided that American negroes would be an important factor in this plan. The "BB Plan" was based on religion, the sponsors' theory that this medium is the best through which to gain control over the negro. This plan was allegedly launched through the late SUFI ABBUL HAMID, a well known negro character in Harlom, agitator and street speaker, who organized the Buddhist Temple at 103 Morningside Avenue. according to this article, the "BB Plan" represents Black Followers of Buddhism and preached Buidhism as a religion of color the world over, the key to racial mon-white country in the world is Buddhist success. Japan the most powerful millions of Buddhists were also in China, India, Parsia and other countries, with a result in cooperation smong them through the faith. Under this plan American negroes who become Buddhists, automatically won Japanese citizenship.

Another article appeared in THE PEOPLE'S VOICE on the same subject in the March 21, 1942 issue in which the PEOPLE'S VOICE advised that their investigations have uncovered the fact that there may be some connection

between the World BB Plan and the activities of DUSE MOHELMED ALI, who operated the MOCRISH SCIENCE TEMPLE during the days of MARCUS GARVEY. According to this crticle, RASHID ALI had a national organization with headquarters in Detroit, and members of his organization were taught that they were not negroes but Moors. All the members generally had Islamic names.

Special Agent in Charge J. R. Ruggles of the Savanneh, Georgia Field Division in a letter dated February 11, 1943, furnished this office with a newspaper clipping concerning WILLI M. RRIGGS, DEY, which clipping was furnished to Special Agent in Charge J. R. Ruggles by Chief of Police Orangeburg, South Carolina on February 8, 1943. Chief of Police someone whom he did not recall had given him this clipping, stating that it had been clipped from some negro newspaper.

This clipping contains a picture of BRIGGS-BEY and lists his address as 1578 Fulton Street, Brooklyn, New York.

The clipping in substance is a published letter in which BRIGGS-BEY states that have been warned by the Japan Covernment that scon a starvation will take place in Europe; that the jobs that we have now will be taken from us and given to suffering Europeans which will cause the black people to suffer more than anyone else. Japan has declared we have always warned you isiatic people of North America if you want to keep what you now have and want your rights in the United States, you had better make a new move.

BRIGGS-BEY goes on to say that he will leave for Tokio, Japan, as soon as he can raise \$1,000 to pay his expenses; that he will investigate and find out what the attitude of the Japanese people is towards the black people of the United States and the world as a whole. In this connection, BRIGGS-TEY makes a plea for contributions from his fellowmen.

There is nothing to indicate the date on which the above clipping was published.

As previously reported in reference report of Special agent of this office, dated April 14, 1943, a number of members of the MODELSH SCIENCE TEXPLE of Brooklyn, directed by EL, and located at made a trip to Mashington, D.C., where they were supposed to have contacted some officials of the government regarding a loan to this organization.

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agents of this office in connection with another investigation at which time he was questioned concerning alleged visits to the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPIE, and he advised that he had attended one meeting at which time he made several remarks but that he and his talk were not generally accepted, and he felt out of place among tembers of that group, was questioned further on this and he could not explain what he meant by his not being accepted by members of the Moorish group, although he would not admit that they were un-American or pro-Japanese. The questioning did not indicate that they were loyal Americans.

In connection with the above-reported delegation of officers of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEXTURE to Washington, the same is reported in an article applicating in "THE PROPLE'S VOICE", a negro weekly newspaper published in New York City under the date of April 17, 1943. S. W./GARLINGTON, the writer, reports in an inserving with Grand Shiek F. TURNER-EL, and the article in substance is as follows:

The Moors, who have been thinking of doing something about the Food for Treedom program sent a delegation of Moors, headed by their representative and diplomatic spokesman, Grand Shiek T.M.D F. D. TURNER-EL, to Wishington, where they were received by Fideral officials and secured an F.H.A. grant to purchase livestock and general equipment for their 500 acre farm in Berkshire, Connecticut.

The article states this is not the first United States loan for the Hoors; that a few years back they received one to build up their chicken farm on Gordon Heights, Long Island.

According to the article, Grand Shiek TURNER-EL, Eastern District Head of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF NORTH AMPRICA, informed "There are no negroes; that merely is a slave term; colored people actually are of Moorish descent because of the fact that their forefathers came from Morocco 316 years ago. They are citizens of the United States by birth and Moors by ancestr."

The article goes on to say that members of the MOORISH SCIENCE TETFLE are said to be two million strong with chapters or units throughout the nation. There is a Temple in Brooklyn at 1797 Fulton Street, and RICHLRD /SCOTT BEY is the Local Grand Shiek.

According to this article, members of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE follow the Islamic religion and wear the Moroccan costume, the fez for mem and the turban for women. All add to their names the suffix EL or BEY, signifying their Moorish descent. For instance, the Grand Shiek was born plain T. FREDERICK DOUGL. S. TUPMER in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1910, the son of an Islamic missionary couple.

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It is pointed out that about this time it is known that an officer of the New York City Police Department did make some inquiries of MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE groups in Brooklyn and Manhattan. The benefit of his investigation was set out in reference report of the writer.

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Investigation will be continued in an effort to ascertain the location and membership of the various groups mentioned above and any statements reported by them as possibly falling within the violation of the sedition statute.

Will obtain informants to attend meetings of all the above organizations set out in this report in an effort to ascertain whether or not they are pro-Japanese, and if so, whether they are making statements upon which prosecution might be made. If investigation fails to reflect seditious statements are made by leaders or members of this group, the leaders should be questioned and membership of each group obtained in order that a preliminary chack might be made to determine whether or not they are complying with the Selective Service Act.

It is hoped that in the very near future a complete coverage of some of the meetings of the MOORISH SCIENCE TRAPLE located at 1796 Policin Bireet, Brooklyn, New York will be obtained and if such reflects that no statements are made which might be prosecuted under the Selective Service act or the sedition statute, consideration will be given to an open investigation of the MOORISH SCIENCE TRAPLES in this area. This step is contemplated in view of the fact that this group has been the one reported to be pro-Japanese, and is the most well-known Temple in this area.

It was ascertained from EL that his attitude concerning the Japanese as reported in the reference report was not suggested to him by any other person connected with the subject organization but rather he secured this information from reading books and "from my own thinking."

He further advised when questioned concerning EL's connection with the FBI that he had misinformed the agents on the provious interview and he has since found out that EL is not connected with the FBI.

He continued that he had heard that the EL had had conferences with government officials in Washington and thought he was connected with the government and therefore automatically assumed it was the FEL.

According to EL and EL and EEY were in Springfield on July 16, 1943 and also visited the Focket farm in focket, massachusetts.

He was further questioned on the membership of this organization in wassachusetts

but did not secure any members.

FL advised the interviewing agents that he has been employed for the pringfield, cassachusetts, for about a week.

When the writer inquired of EL if he knew BEY in New Mayon, he remarked "Cortainly, he is my brother-in-law."

In view of the information accured from EL concorning the relationship of DEY to EL's wife, the undeveloped lead in reference report to contact is being disregarded.





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
This investigation is predicated on information received BEY who was interviewed by the writer under pretext during the time he was employed by the

Pittsburgh, Pa., as a civilian employee. At that time BEY advised he was not a colored person but was a Moorish American and a nember of the Recrish Science Temple of America which met in the home of its BEY at local leader Pitteburgh. BEY refused to we any further information regarding the activities of the Moorish Science emple of America or BEY other than to state that their national eadquarters were in Chicago and that their national leader was one

from Arad On April 26, 1943, the writer under pretext of interviewing BEY in connection with a Conscientious Objector case, obtained the DEY who lived at following information from him. Pittsburgh, Pa., advised that he is the leader or prophet or the Moorish Science Cample of America in Pittsburgh, and that his organization at the present time has about 200 members and was very vociferous in stating that members of his organization were loyal to this Country and were not conscientious objectors to participation in the War. In substantiating his claim, he stated he knows of three members of the organization from Newark, N. J., who are members of the armed services. One of these members he knows by BEY. Newark, F. J., who visited his home during the month name is one of april. 1943.

BEY explained that the Moorish Science Temple of America orgulization in Pittsburgh reached its height in terms of membership in 1929 where it had about 700 members. In 1929, the founder of the Moorish Science Ten it of america, NOBLE DREW ALL, died and the organization split into two branches, one following Colonel C. KIRKMAN BEY and the other following In Pittsburgh a Hindu by the name of Moslom organization in Pittaburgh in 1929 and took some of their members into his organization.

It is noted that BEY stated that the reincarnation of NOBLE DREW ALI took place on August 7 1929 and that the Moorish Science Temple rganization which was led by has never had any



publication either in the form of a newspaper, magazine, or circular.

In connection with this investigation, it should be noted that as Hay 15, 1943, on BEY will alian Pulice Department in connection with a liquor raid and was hold for this coffice inaction as he had no registration card for Selective Service on his person and stated that he did not register for the Draft. BEY was interpreted by the writer and almosted that he, through negligence, had failed to register for the Draft although he knew it was violation of the law. BEY stated he was vears old and accordingly, massmuch as he was willing to register, registration was effected and no prosecution is contemplated. However, investigation is continuing inasmuch as BEY made conflicting statements regarding his age and it appears he may be under 45.

It should be noted that BEY admitted he was a member of the Moorish Science Temple of America at Indianapolis, Ind., and has been attending meetings of the Society of the organization here in Pittsburgh.

He described BEY whom he knows as a the leader of the Pittsburgh organization and advised that meetings were held at various sembara! homes, the only one he can remember being somewhere in the Pittsburgh.

BEY had been discharged from his employment with the prinsubordination. It should be noted that at the time of the above mentioned interview by the writer with he was very inscient and refused to answer such questions as whether he was villing to fight against the Germans or Japanese and whether he was loyal to the United States. In answer to these questions, hemerely stated he did not have to answer any questions.

either in August or September. 1942, on the day before he wore his Moslem symbol for the first time tated to him that the colored people of this country would be better off under the Japanese than they are now. In stated this was so because the colored people aren't free in this country.

Penn Rotel. that no one else was present at the time of this conversation with and that although this is the only specific statement he recalls, during the period of time prior to his wearing of the Moslem Star and Crescent, frequently expressed himself as being proJapanese and anti-white. However, immediately after joining the Moslem organization, he became very tight linned and did not continue meking such statements. that had told one formerly of who is presently serving in the U.S. Army, Serial

would guarantee that he would not be drafted. That had told him that at one time he was a Hindu and that at another time he merely stated he was an oriental. That only Orientals, such as Hindus and Japanese could belong to the organization he belonged to.

that he never heard make any pro-Japanese or un-American remarks; however, he stated he did not associate with and only saw him on infrequent occasions.

who is employed as receptionist for was interviewed inaspuch as it had been determined that she had asparated from her husband because of his activities in subject organization.

That in the fall of 1942, her husband had purchased a motorcycle which was equipped with a side car. As a result of having this motorcycle, he became acquainted with the leader of the Hoorish American organization in Fittsburgh whose name she did not know but who she knew also owned a motorcycle. Around Thanksgiving, 1942, her husband told her he was no longer a negro but was a Moorish American and that their true home was along the Wile River in Africa. He stated the white men have made fools of the colored people but now he knows this and that white people know he is no longer a fool.

that her husband had seemingly changed over night.

Prior to joining this organization, he had been very neat and careful in his dress; now he doesn't wear a tie and won't have starch in his shirts. Formerly he was very much afraid of heine drafted and now he says he does not mind because he is "right now". While she was still living with her husband, he attended meetings at the home of the leader of the Moorish Americans almost every night. He told her they used one room in the leader's home as their temple.

In January, 1943, the left her husband because of his religious foraticism. About a month ago, which was the last time has seen nor husband, he said that in six months things would be different for him. She stated she asked him what he meant but he would not give her an explanation. He also stated at this time he knew something the United States Government would give a large sum of money to know. She asked him what it was he knew and he replied, he probably was talking too much.

It should be noted that the she and her husband are been married about five years but because of his connection with this organization, she has requested that he ship in a divorce on grounds of her desertion. It is noted that prior to her husband's joining this organization, he led an exemplary life; that he had never been in any trouble and was always very religious. It is noted that it is state her husband is probably over-religious and is somewhat skeptical of things he read in the Bible.

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The following background information relating to the arganization from as the NOOFISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AFRAIGH W.s obtained from the University of Chicago

made available a report compiled by of the new defunct Illinois writers Project, a IPA project. is now associated with the Office of Civilian Defense for the Chicago area. That the report was based on an inquiry conducted for anthropological reasons to determine if there was any cultural connection between various Regroes and their cults in the Chicago area. The following information was obtained from this report:

"Two organizations striving to foster racial pride have attracted numbers of Chicago negroes from time to time. These are the Mcorish-American Science Temple and the Mation of Islam, ordinarily referred to as 'cults.' Essentially, they are religious bodies, opposing the Christian faith. Lembers of the Mcorish American Science Temple insist that they are not negroes, and avoid the use of the word or of 'black' when referring to themselves, maintaining that they are really Mcors and that their skin is 'plive-hued.'

"In 1825 a small negro wearing a flaming rod for similar to those word by Turks appeared in empty lots and on street corners of Chicago's south side to proclaim a stortling new doctrine. He was loble brow Ali, born Timothy Drow in North Ca roling, Prophet of Islam, and founder of the Moorish American

Science Temple. Little is known of Drew Ali's early history. He is reputed to have been an expressman in Newark, New Jersey, where he is said to have founded the first Moorish-American Science Temple as early as 1913.

"Drew's main contention was that the people commonly known in America as negroes are of Moorish descent and thus Asiatics. Let six of his 'Divine Constitution and By-Laus' reads:

".ith us all members must declare their nationality and their Divine Creed that they may know that they are a part and partial (sic) of this said government and that they are not Negroes, Colored Folks, Elack People or Ethiopians, because these names were given to slaves by slave-holders in 1779 and lasted until 1865 during the time of slavery, but this is a new era of time new, and all men must proclaim their free national name to be recognized by the government in which they live and the nations of the earth, this is the reason why Allah the Great God of the Universe ordained keble Draw Ali, the prophet, to redoem his people from their sinful ways. The Moorish-Americans are the descendants of the ancient loabites who inherited the Northwestern and South-western shores of Africa."

"Prophet hoble Drew Ali did not immediately raily many disciples to his banner, the Moerish star and crossent on a field of red. But he persisted, and at length was able to set up permanent head-quarters. Though semi-literate, he possessed an eloquent tengue, a persuasive manner, and a native shrowdness which enabled him to sway the poor and unlettered people who listened to him. Most of them remembered the race riots of 1919; all of them had experienced discrimination and other wrongs. Drew Ali was offering them pride of race and dignity. In 1927 a successful convention encouraged Drew Ali to expend his proselytising activities to other cities.

"Drew Ali had written and published his 'Koran,' a slim pamphlet consisting of a curious mixture of the Mohammedan holy book of the same name, the Christian Bible, and anecdotes of the life of

Jesus - the whole bound together with the Prophet's own pronouncements and interpretations. The Prophet began to do a profitable business in various nostrums and charms he concected, among them Old Moorish Healing Oil, Moorish Purifier Eath Compound, and Moorish Herb Tea for Human Ailments.

"More and more 'Asiatics' flocked to the star and crescent standard. They flaunted their fezzes on the street and treated the white man with undisguised contempt. The Prophet announced that each devout Moorish American must carry a card bearing his credentials and his real (or Asiatic) name, signed by the Prophet with his seal. Often enough 'slave' names were transformed into 'real' ones by the simple addition of 'El' or 'Boy,' these being titles signifying Moorish dignity. The membership card and butten, when displayed to Europeans would convince them that the bearer was enlightened and a member of an organization to be feared and respected.

"To the Prophet this theory of new-found independence had been a more or less purely ethical or theoretical point, and he had not reckened on its practical effect among his zealous followers. Alarming reports of street brawls, threats, insults, and minor violence centering around Moorish-Americans were brought to his notice. Members were accesting the white enemy on the streets, showing their membership cards and buttons, and proclaiming in the name of their prophet, Noble Drew Ali, that they had been freed of European domination.

"Recalling the downfall of the militant Abyssinians and contemplating the current difficulties of the Garvey movement, Drew Ali issued this order:

> 'I hereby warn all Moors that they must cease from all radical or agitating speeches while on their jobs, or in their homes, or on the streets. Stop flashing your cards before Europeans as this only causes confusion. We did not come to cause confusion; our work is to uplift the nation.

"Drew Ali's leadership was soon contested. In 1929 he became embreiled in a quarrel with Claude Green, politician and former butler of Julius Rosenwald, who previously had joined the temple. One day Drew arrived at his office to find that Freene had moved all the furniture outside and declared himself Grand Shoik. A civil war ensued, each faction enlisting support from temples in other cities. Greene was shot and stabbed to death in his offices at the Unity Club on the night of Merch 15, 1929.

"Drew Ali, arrested as he sat with his wife and group of followers colebrating (authorities charged) the murder of his rival, was defended by Attorney Aaron Payno and Walliam L. Dawson, temple members who later gained political prominence.


"Draw Ali was released on bond and shortly thereafter died under mysterious circumstances a few weeks later. One theory is that he succumbed to injuries inflicted by the police during his imprisonment, another is that he was set upon by partisans of Greene after his release and beaten so severely that he never recovered.

"After Drew Ali's death attorney Aaren Payne attempted unsuccessfully to hold the group together. Each among several of the
Prophet's disciples announced that he alone was the rightful inheritor to Drew Ali's leadership. Steve Gibbons El (formerly
the prophet's chauffeur) and Ira Johnson Bey (who had been imported from Pittsburgh to assist in quelling the Greene revolt)
cach maintained that the dead leader's spirit had entered his
body. Johnson, a man of action, invaded the office of Monly El,
another a spirant, and demanded recognition as Grand Sheik.
Mealy El demurred and received a terrific mauling. Johnson then
dispatched his henchmen to kidnap Kirkman Bey, who claimed
possession of Drew Ali's last will and testament.

"Kirkman's wife, secretly surmising that her husband was being detained in Johnson's apartment, directed the police thither. A gun battle ensued in which two policemen and one Moor were killed. Sixty-three Moors were arrested, and Johnson was committed to the State Hospital for the Criminally Insuno, where he subsequently died. Steve Gibbons also was approhended after he mad forced his way into Attorney Payne's home in search of Drew Ali's papers.








"Gibbons, too, was sent to the insane asylum, but was released several years later. In 1941 he was heading a Chicago temple on East 40th Street and still asserting claim to the title of Grand Sheik of all Moorish-American Science Temples. Gibbons was one of six contestants, each one a temple loader and each one designating his own as Temple No. 14

"Services in each temple observe with minor deviations, the pattern established by Drew Ali. First, a minor shelk, a shelkess or the chairman reads and emplains Drew Ali's version of the Koran. Then follows a more elaborate discourse by the Grand Shelk (in some temples called the Governor), the whole ceremony being punctuated at intervals by Christien hymns with the words Allah, Drew Ali, and Moslem being substituted for God, Christ, and Christian. Friday is observed as the holy day of rest, because on Friday the first man departed out of the flesh and on a Friday the first man was formed in flesh and on a Friday the first man departed out of the flesh and ascended unto his father God Allah, for that cause Friday is the Holy Day for all Hoslems all over the world."

"Since Drew Ali considered Marcus Garvey his forcrunner (in a relationship analogous to that of John the Baptist and Jesus) and paid tribute to him in his 'Acran' and in his sermons, Moerish-Americans frequently laud and quote the Jamaican organizer.

"January 8, the Prophet's birthday, is a special occasion in all temples. Full Moorish regalia is worn by these members who can affort it, and there is likely to be feasting and distribution of gifts as in Christmas celebrations in Christian churches. A number of unconverted guests are invited; the customary speeches take on a more evangelistic tone. Expositions of the teachings and principles of the Prophet are offered in a simplified form for the benefit of those still under the influence of Christianity, called "The Folly."


"The leader of each of the bickering factions has striven in vain to build up an organisation as powerful (and as lucrative) as the parent body disrupted by internal warfare and the death of Drow Ali. According to Attorney Aaron Payno, the Prophet in one year amassed a fortune of \$36,000.00 and commanded a





moved to Chicago, Illinois in about 1915 and lived at and lived at this address for about six years. He moved to in Chicago, Illinois, in 1920 and I lived with him at this address. I had served a term in the State Reformatory at Pontiae, Illinois, at that time. I married and she has been dead since 1931. We had one child by the name of and she now lives at and is still single so far as I know. I receive letters from her from time to time.

"'I do not know how it happened to start but my father, became acquainted with an organization known as the Moorish Science Templo of imerica. The headquarters of this organization was first at the home of my father at 1841 State Street in Chicago, Illinois. father started up this organization in Chicago, Illinois and was the head official of it till 1929 when he got into trouble and was sent to the penitentiary at Joliet, Illinois. He had two associates. One was known as Ali Drew and Charles Mirkman, and these three men succeded in getting a large membership for this organization. Ali brew was killed about 1929 or 1930. There was also a man by the name of Green who was also connected with this organization but he was also killed. Green was shot in the head and both Drew and my father were arrested for the murder. Dron got out of this trouble and my father was also lot go as they could not prove anything on him in connection with this murder. Drow was later poisoned and his doath was put out as being heart trouble.

"My father was voted out as head of the organization in July 1929 and C. tirtmen was voted in and my father was then under him. My father did not like the idea of being under C. Curtmen and actually kidnapped C. Curtmen which was an September 25, 1929 and held him at my father's home at Chicago, Illinois. Police officers came to arrest my father and to rescue Charles Curtman and my father resisted two of these police officers and killed two police officers. My father had other members with him in this kidnapping and two of these were also sent to the penitentiary with my father. The names of the two men with my father in this crime were Jackson. The old man Jackson died in Joliet prison and the boy is now out.

has never been released from prison and has now been transferred to the State Penitentiary at Menard, Ills. where he is known as convict



"'I became a member of the corish Science Temple of America in 1919 at Chicago, Illinois at the insistence of my father. I was a member of it for a long time and was still a member when I got into trouble in 1935.

I do not know for sure that they actually married but both of them told me they were married and I have no right to doubt them and I not ly believe they did get married.

sent me to St. Louis, No. to help organize this movement in St. Louis, No. Before I left a Japanese whose name I have forgotten was at the home of my aunt, and her husband and this Jap gave me something over \$200.00 to pay my expenses in going to St. Louis, hissouri and getting a place to hold meeting and to organize the colored people there in the Mooritah Science Temple of America.

"This Japanese explained to me and to and my aunt that the money was from . Japanese organization and that I should tell the colored people at St. Louis, Mo. and other places I might go that Japan was offering the colored people equal rights with the white men; also that there was goint to be a war between Japan and the United States some time in the future and that when the United States drafted all the young men into the army, I mean the young white men, that the remaining colored men would start a revolution in the United States while the white able bedied white men were away from home and that we could win in that conflict. We were also teld by this Jap to encourage all young colored men not to join the United States Army with the white men in order to have a larger number of colored men for service when this time came.

"'I have been shown a photograph of a jap by the name of Takahashi and while I cannot positively state that he is the same Jap who gave me the above money, I believe that he is the same Jap and I would know him if seen fac to face.

also advised me that what this Jap said was the thing for me to do.

"'I wish also to state that in furtherance of this cames I went to St. Louis, Mo. in 1934 and was also there in 1933. I had made a speech in Chicago, Illinois. When I went to St. Louis, No. I also made a Speech at 2709 Walnut Street - upstairs. There was a number of members there. I was supposed to take the place of my lather in the organization or be a lieutenant under and I was to give my decision about four days after this meeting.

"'I finally gave my decision to and my aunt, and that decision was that I was not going to have anything further to do with this organization.

"This decision was made by me about May 11, 1934 and that night I was at 2330 Pine St. in St. Louis. Mo. and intending to go back to Lundale, West Virginia, I was grabbed by four people and was seriously cut up on the back and side which scars are still plainly to be seen. I know that the same of the four persons who grabbed me and cut me up. I also know that a colored man by the name of also was among the four who grabbed me and that was the one who did the cutting on me. He said "once a member always a member."

"I succeeded in getting away from them and went to the County Hospital in St. Louis, Mo. The police took mo to the hospital. I did not toll them who had cut mo. I never saw until 1935 after that. I went to best Virginia after I set out of the hospital. I was at Lundale, West Va. and my aunt and cousin came to see me. They wanted me to come to Pittsburch. Pa. and talk the matter over with a Japanese by the name of and said they could make me see things more plainly. I told them that I did not care to again join the organization but was willing to do anything to



holp my father. They said that the way for me to help my father was to meet this Jap in Pittsburgh, Pa. This was in July or August, 1935.

and was met at the station by my auntiple of the cousing and C. Curtmen. I had notified them I was coming on a cerrain train. They took me to meet a Jap by the name of who lived about twelve miles out of Pittsburgh. Pa. I wish also to say that also mot me with the rest I have named above.

"This Jap explained to me that there would be a war between the United States and Japan in about 1944; that the colored or Cark races are to hang together; that it was one of the duties of members of the Moorish Science Templo of America to try to get all colored members not to join the military forces of this country; that when war between this country and Japan was started and all the white men were in the Army that there would be enough colored young men left to cause a revolution in this country and take over things here while the soldiers while away in forcign service.

"'I agreed to join and this Japanese gave me over \$500 to go out in West Virginia to organize amoung the colored people.

"'I was then out on parole from the State Penitentiary at Jeliet, Illinois and instead of going out to work for this organization I went back to Jeliet, Illinois and gave myself up as a parole violator. I was latter transferred to the State P enitentiary at Menard, Ills. where I am now confined and so far as I know none of the above mentioned persons know where I am.

"'If the phove information will be of assistance in the trialof any case egainst any of the individuals I will be gled to testify as I have stated in this statement.'"

March 26, 1943 at Newark, N. J., in which there was mentioned the fact that there
are presently seven temples of the Moorish Science Temple located in New Jersey.
It was further stated that there are two distinct branches of that organization.
The following excerpt is taken from the reference report which is pertinent to the
instant case:

"The branch at 230 Court Street, Newark, N. J. is under the leader-EL, who has been the leader for more than 10 ship of Activo templo yoars. Its resides at mombership is about 200. This temple is known as Tomple to. 10 ca According to the statements made to the writer the national roll. on several occasions in recent menths by leader of Temple No. 10 in Newark, N. J. at 230 Court Street, five of the temples located in New Jersey believe in the reincarnation of NOBLE DREW A LI, founder of the faith and also believe in following strict diotary laws involving abstinonco from moat, alcohol, and tobacco. They do not shave and wear the Moorish for at all times. that the reincarnation of NOBLE DREM ALI was a spiritual rebirth occurring on August 7, 1929. Some time after that he did die and his successor is believed to be one headquarters at 447 East 40th Street, Chicago, Illinois.

"There has been no information received or developed by the Newark Field Division up to this time indicating that this branch of the faith is pro-Japanese. About one-half dozen of the younger male members have been drafted and no serious difficulty has been reported in their cases. At the beginning of the drafting there was one member who sought to obtain deferment on religious grounds but that was temporary. He finally was inducted. EL has been known to say that he believes in serving this country at all times, particularly in the time of war, and that he firmly believes in the purchase of war bonds. He has said that his members are cooperating in such purchases to the best of their ability but specific purchases are not known."



She further learned that the organization currently has considerable money and that they are able to buy much food and the finest gowns for the members.





Negroes not members of the subject organization are referred to as "coolies," and that white men are called "devils." stated that that the subject organization was the original Moslem group and that several A years ago a split in the organization resulted in the formation of a second Moslem group who had headquarters at 104 East 51st Street, Chicago, Illinois.

In this connection it should be noted that the Moslem group referred to by is undoubtedly the group known as the Allah Temple of Islam, whose headquarters are at 104 East 51st Street. The leaders of the Allah Temple of Islam were arrested for sedition and some seventy members of the temple were arrested and sentenced for failure to register and comply with the Selective Training and Service Act. The Allah Temple of Islam is the subject of Chicago office file 100-9129.

related that there was a large meeting or convention held at the subject organization's meeting place during the first week of August, 1943, and that had related to her that the meeting was in celebration of a Moorish holiday.

whose third floor apartment overlooks the rear yard of 447 East 40th, there were in excess of 100 members attending the celebration.

EL explained that the purpose of her visit to the office was to secure information concerning the subject, and further to request assistance of the Chicago office to enable her to receive support from the subject. readily admitted not having been married to the subject and further stated that he had formerly been married to a woman not a member of the townle, and that to the best of her belief that he was not diverced from this woman. EL was unable to furnish the address of the wife of the subject, but stated that she would endeavor to locate this person.

that the subject had formerly entrusted money to her received in the form of contributions for support of herself and her three children, but that following the illness of her mother and the moving from 447 hast 40th Street he had apparently not retained his faith in her. As a result of this, the subject had taken all money from her and had not given her enough to live on and support her three children. She requested to be a dvised of the action she could take against the subject short of a court action which could force him to properly support herself and her three children. EL was advised that this office was unable to assist her in any way and suggested that she contact a lawver for further advice on the subject. She stated that the mother of the subject who formerly resided in St. Potersburg, Florida, had been living for some time at 447 East 40th Street, and that she was of the opinion that the subject may leave and return to Florida with his mother, thus leaving herself and the children without support. 




In this connection she stated that the subject has four brothers, all of whom are presently serving in the U.S. Army. She advises that the subject had registered and had undoubtedly claimed her self and the three children as dependents in the request for deferment.

El advised that her children attended the Esslem school at the headquarters of the subject organization and that the school was taught by ill, who was formerly a publich school teacher. She substantiated the information furnished above by the other persons interviewed. That she had no desire to injure the subject. She indicated, however, that were it not for the children and that their welfare was a totake, she might possibly divulge more information concerning the subject which would be of interest to this Bureau.





Reference is made to your memorandum of September 16, 1943, and to the attached investigative reports relating to the above-named organization.

A careful review of the file relating to the above-named organization has convinced the Criminal Division that each unit of the cult must be considered individually for the purpose of developing prosecution of its leaders under the sedition statutes. There seems to be little uniformity in the teachings which are promulated by the purported leaders of the respective units.

Special reference is made to the report of Special Agent dated August 15, 1942, at Little Rock, Arkansas, relating to the rine Eluff Chapter of the Moorish Science Temple of America. It is believed that the statements alleged to have been made by may be the basis of prosecution under Fitle 50, Section 35, or under Title 50, Section 311. However, it is believed that the government will have to develop additional witnesses besides if at all possible.

It is requested that investigation be conducted to ascertain whether is identical with who is presently in the armed forces. It should be ascertained whether made the alleged seditious statements in the presence of any additional persons that may be developed as witnesses and whether in the presence of persons coming under the provisions of the Selective Service Act.



She stated, however, that the interest which formerly existed within these two temples is absent inasmuch as the majority of the negroes are earning more moncy than they ever have previously and have less time to consider religion. She explained that the organization over which she was Divine Hinistress had a present membership of approximately thirty individuals and that the teachings of the members by her are taken direct from the Holy Koran and no other literature is used. She stated the organization realizes, as well as all of the members of the organization,

that they are "part and parcel of the United States and this government". She advised that for that reason she had emphatically ordered the members to discuss at no time the present war or any racial problems while they were in attendance at a religious meeting of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA. She stated neither she nor any of the members desired war, but that she believed since the United States had entered into the present conflict that it was the duty and obligation of each citizen to obey the laws and regulations set up pertaining to the present war. She added she is specifically opposed to any agitation or trouble-making between the colored individuals and whites and that she preaches continually to the members of her temple that they should do everything possible to avert and prevent trouble between the two races.

BEY stated the individuals presently attending the meetings held by Sister

Sister PEY advised they were continuing to hold Divine Services from 7:30 until 9:30 each Friday and Sunday night at 1700 North Third Street, Kansas City, Kansas: She at led Sunday School was held from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. on each Sunday afternoon.

KIRKMAN BEY of Chicago, Illinois was in attendance at this meeting, as well as other representatives from the various temples throughout the United States.

Sister Wichite, Kanses to visit Wichite for the purpose of establishing a branch templo of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMPRICA there. She advised she was going to Wichite, Kanses on Monday, September 13, 1943, for the purpose of determining if there were enough individuals interested in establishing a temple and if so one would be established. She advised it was likewise necessary to locate an individual who is en "eighth grade scholar" to be divine ministress. She stated it was her understanding that the who was formerly a member of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA at Chicago, Illinois, had an adequate education and was fully qualified to fill this position.

The names appearing on the membership list of Temple No. 46 of the MOCRISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA and as obtained from the Recording Secretary's books were checked against the indices of the Internal Security Units of the Kanses City, Kanses and Kanses City, Missouri Police Department, as well as the Kanses City Field Division. The indices checked in these three departments were negative as to any subversive activities having been reported regarding those individuals.

Sistor Kansas City. of Breach Temple No. Kenses, 46 of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA was interviowed it which time she advised that Branch Tomp we do. 46 presently has a membership of 68. She added, however, there are only approximetely thirty individue le who regularly attend and are estuelly considered active membors. She stated substantially the same in regard to the activities of Brench Tomplo No. 46 as Sister BEY stated regarding Temple No. 46. In addition she stated that Branch Temple No. 46 weets regularly at Slaughtors' Hall, 1315 North 9th Stroot, Kenses City Kenses. Sho said the times of meeting were from 7:30 until 16:00 p.m. on rridcy and Sunday nights and from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoons. She stated it was proper for the members to contribute 50¢ per menth to the MOORISH SCIENCE. TEMPLE OF AVERICA but that in the event the members were unable to pay this they could contribute whatever their financial condition enabled them to do. She added out of this 50 per month from the members, money was


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sent to support the National Home at Prince George, Virginia, a portion set aside to aid the members who become sick and unable to appropriately erro for themselves, and the remainder went into a dorth fund, which embled members to be given a decent burial in the event they were not carrying adequate insurance at the time of their death to cover the expenses incurred by a proper burial.

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

62, 67d arrangements were made with whose identity is known to the Bureau, to supply information on the Boorish Science Temple that meets at number 2 12th Avenue, Newark, New Jersey. This is an off-shoot of the cld Temple 10 described above. This split occurred in 1933 over various matters including the strict orthodox nature of the older temple members.
