In this connection, BRIGGS-EY E :kes a plan for oontributions from his fellownen.

According to this article, members of the HOORISH SCIENCE Trepre follow the Islanic relieion and wer the Moroccan costume, the fez for me and the turben for wonen. ill add to their names the suffix EL or BEY, signifying their Moorish deseent. For ingtancy, the Grand Shiek was born piain T. FREDERICK DOUGL S. TUPYGR in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1910, the son of an Islamic missionary counle.

Thouth somi-lituretc, ho possossud an cloguont tonguc, a porsuasive manner, and a notive shrowdnoss which oncblod him to sway the poor and unlettercd peoplc who listonod to him. host
 perioneod diserimination and other trongs. Drew All wes offorinf thom pride of racc and dignity. In 1927 a succossful convention oncouragod Irc: ili to cepend his prosclytising activitics to other citics.
"Drew Ali had iritten and publishod his 'fioran,' a slim pamphlet consisting of a curious mixture of the Mohamedian holy book of the same nome, the Christian Bible, and anecdotes of the life of

Jesus - the whole bound together with the Prophet's own pronouncements and interpretations. The Prophet began to do a profitable business in various nostrums and charms he concocted, among thea Old Moorish Healing Oil, Moorish Purifier Eat Compound, and Moorish Herb Tea for Human Ailmints.
"More and more 'Asiatics' flocked to the star and crescent standard. They flaunted their fezzes on the street and troated the wite man with undisguised contempt. The Prophet announced that each devout Moorish american must carry a card bearing his credentials and his real (or Asiatic) nome, signod by the Prophet with his seal. Often enough "slave' names wore transformed into 'real' ones by the simple addition of 'El' or 'Boy." these being titles signifying Moorish dignity. The nomborship card and button, when displayed to Europeans would onnvinco them that tho bearer wis enilghtoned and a member of an organication to be foarod and rospectod.
"To the Prophet this theory of new-fcund independence had been a more or less purely ethical or theoretical point, and he had net reckoned on its practical effect among his zealous followers. Alarming reports of street brawls, threats, insults, and minor violence centering around Mcorish-Americans were brought to his notice, Limbers were accosting the white enemy on the streets, showing their membership cards and buttons, and prow claiming in the name of their prophet, Noble Drew Ali, that they ha d been freed of European domination.

[^0]> I hereby warn all Moors that they must cease from all radical or agitating spachos while on their jobs, or in their homes, or on tho streets. Stop flashing your cards before Europeans as this only causes confusion. We did not ono to cause confusion; our wert is to uplift the nation."


"Gibbons, too, wus sent to the insane asylum, but was released several years later. In 1941 he was heading a Chicago temple on Ecst 40th Street and still asserting claim to the title of Grand Sheik of all hoorishamerican Science Tomplese Glbbons was sie of six contestants, each one a temple loader and each onc designating hit own es Templo No. It
"Servicos in each templa observe with minor deviations, the pattern established by Drew dil. First, a minor sheil, a sheikess or the chairman reads and explains Drew Ali's version of the korar. Then follows more elaborete discuurs? by the Grand Sheik (in some temples called the Governcr), the whole cercreny being punctuaioe at interrals by Christien hymas with the wards Allah, Drew Aii, and Mosler beir. substituted for God, Chrisi, and Christian. Friday is cbserved ae tho holy day of rest, 'becsuse on Friday the first man departed jut of the flesh and on a Friday the first mas wes fomed in flesi and on a Friday the first mar doparted out of the flech and as onded unto his iather boc Allah, for thet causo Filuty ses the Holy Day for call Liesleas all over the werld.'
"Since Drcei Ali eonsidored Rarcue Garvoy his fororumor (In a relationship analogous to that of John the Baptist and Jesus) cnd paid tribute to him ir, his "Mcran' and in his scrmons, Hocrish-Americans frequontly leud and quete the timaioan of ganizer.
"January 8, the Prophet's birthday, is a eyecial occasion in all temples. Full Moorish reselie is worn ty these members who zan affort it, and there is likely to be feasting and distribution of gifts as in Christmas celebrations in Christisn churches. A number of unconverted guests are invited; the customary speeches take on a more evangelistic tone. Exporitions of the teachings and principles of the Prophet are offered in a simplified furm ficr the boneflit of those still under the influence of Christianity, called "The Folly."
"The leader of cach of tho bickering factions ha. striven in vain to build up an organization as powerful (and as lucrativo) as the parent body disruptod by internal warfare and the death of Drcw Ali. According to Attornoy Aaron Payno, tho Prophet in ono year amasnod a fortuno of $\$ 3,000.00$ and commanded a

Reference is also made to the report of Special Agent dated March 26, 1943 at Newart, N. 6piritual rebirth occurring on August 7. 1929. Some time after that he did die and his successor is believed to be one with hodquarters at, 447 East 40th Street, Chioago, Illinoise
"There has been no information roceived or developod by the Newark Field Livision up to this time indicating that this branch of the faith is pro-Japanese, about one-half dozen of the younger male members hese bech dratted and no serious difficulty has boen reported in their cases. At this beginning of the drafting therc was one momber whe sought to obtein deferment on religious arounds but thet was tomporary. Ho finally was inductod. Tll has beca known to say that he beliowos in serving this country at all times, partioularly in the time of war, and thet he firmiy believes in the purchase of war bonds.
