That very little has been secured re $\because$. E . Mrimi and HONEY EOAN Murder's, the some very definite evidence re EEPDY DOill hes been secured, but is being denied by the porsons hevine sume.

Agent WEISS has been concentriting on the inNA BROM muraer, bu= working on the others incidentally, but continually with good results, to date.

Lgent also desires to state here that these csises are going to be very aifficult for the reason thet some of the muratrs ere over $2^{2}$ years old, none less than 9 months, private aetectives State detectives, volunteer det.ctives, have all peen forking on the cases, until many people are disgusted and unwliling to talk. The citizenship of Osage Country is also very low, in general, ana comoosea of many transient "pollickers"oll workers, poor whites, etc; and the Inaians, in general, are lazy, pathetic, cowardly, aissipateà ana unfriendly towards any one the asis them to talk or assist in this case. The "better class" of whito people are mainily engaged in grefting the Inaians, etc. as far as possible, so as to make a pile.

There is also a meneral element of fear ana indif-
ference thet pervaces the minde of many, so thet it is elmost impossible to Eet uny one to make a viling, franir, sna full statement of eny value in these cases. However there are a few as fine men and nomen in Osage County as may be found anywnere, but they are miznty few.

This agent and Acent weTSS both find thet in view
oz the quove indicated facts, and others, not mentioned, this case or rether ceses, to be extremely aifficilt, slow and unpleasent to ork, out believe that wo will eventurlly be successful in at lesot
two, if not more of them. A lot of time ic used in finding per one to be interview:. a, as many have move dj away to places unknown, many have moved to other points, many are away on visits, etc. enc outside of professional men, no one makes any effort to keep appointments With Agents, so that often several drives have to be made before the party sought cen be caught at home etc. In the course of a short time we hope to gain peoples confidence, that has been lost because nothing has ever been accomplished by previous investigators, or Investigations.

On Dec. 17 th Agent J. R. Burger, of the Kansas City office, joineo this Agent at Pawhima, and has since been engaged jointly with this Agent on this investigation. This Agent's report, dated Dec. 6th, is a joirt report for both Mr. Burger and this Agent, from Dec. 17th on. This, and future reports, while written by this Agent, are to be considered joint reports for Agent Burger and this Agent, also, and made to avoid unnecessary duplication and possible confusion. Copies of such joint reforts will be furnished to the Kansas city office as well es to Oklahoma City.

## RE: ANNA BROWN LURDER:

Dec. 26 th Agents interviewed ED SCHENCMS, Sr., at 1608 S. Waco, Wichita, Kans. 1 , SCFENCKS talked freely, as did his wife, but they both declared they had no definite information re. the ANLA BROWN, HENRY GOAN, or
W. E. SYITH murders; that they are convinced that $7 \mathrm{HALE}-\mathrm{BUR}$ mharT men are t responsitle for same, but have no

proof; that they, the SGraycic, lived in that section of the counttry for thirty-five years, and until recently;

The one ELIA kitumot, now wald to be at slider, okie., worked for BILI SIITH at or about the time of the AMA BPCMT murder, and afterward, and that ELLA FLILEMT had stated that BILL HALE was afraid of BILL SMITH and avoided SMITH after the ANMA BROWN murder, and wold not meet SMIMH in the road, etc.; that ELIA HALIPMT also probably had heard IR. SMITH before his death, $t \in 11$ whet he had learned about the ANHA BROWN murder, and that Agents should by all means see ELLA HALIETT, and her mother, $\angle N H A$ FALIPMT, the mother living now at zedfork, Okla. ED SCEENCIS, Sr. denied that he had ever stated to anyone that he had any evidence to give a grand jury in any of these cases, and declared that he Wished he did have some information or evidence to give, etc. We interviewed IP. and rps. SCImach fully, but the above was all they had to say of interest.

Dec. 28 th we interviewed iRS. ANT ELLEMT at Redfork, okla. She stated that she has not heard from her daughter, ELLA, for two months; that EILA was then employed in a hotel run ky a man named "GEORGE" at Shidler; that SETF LENIS of Burbank can probably tell where ELLA is if he has left shialer.

IRS. ANNA FALIETT stated that her daughter, ELIA, had gone to work for $\operatorname{HRINEST}$ BURKERRT and LIZZIF a at Grayhorse a few days before ANITA BROWN'S body was found, and that ELLA was working at ERNEST BUREJART'S at the time the body was found, and for some time afterward; that EILA began working for FRNTST BURKFART just after LARMEA UPRIGFT (DOQY) left them; the ELIA was subpoenaed to Pawhuska as a witness in the case but knew nothing. (None of said witnesses was called to testify at Dawhusia.)
was. ama EALEEMT stated fur her that ELTA was at the EREST BTRKPART home at Grathorse, Saturday, lias 21, 1521 amd talked to ANNA BROXN at the time and place; that ANNA BPCMN Fac then sitting in the summer-house at EPNESM BCRKHETM'S home, drinking heavily; that ANNA BRONN employed BLIA FALIETT at that time to begin work as housekeeper for ANA at Fairfax: and miLIA was to start to work for ANNA BROWN at Fairfax the following, or second following morning. MRS. PaLLET M stated that she does not remember what time of day her daughter BLIA tel ked to Amin BPOMN that day, nor whether anyone else was there at the time, except ANNA'S mother, LIZZIE Q. (ARS. WiLLET as plainly notate all interested in giving us information, though apparently not friendIf to the BURZFASTS or the EAIES. She was questioned exhaustivedy, $k$ ut the above was all we could get her to tell. ELTA FALTEMT will be interviewed.)

TIIILIAM BPACRETN Informed us that he talked to RITA HALIETT in 1S21, regarding this case, but that all she told him of value was that she sid she had heard that two Indian women had seen ANHA BROTN and BRYAN BTRRKHART together in a Buick oar that satur day night; that ELIA was then working for BILL SMIMH and wife (She should know all about J. L. BRIDGES family at errictrarayhor Be and Pair fax.)

Dec. 18th wrote J. A. GrSTapSON again for his reports, and on Dea. 24 th and 25 th Agent Burger made efforts to secure acme from MRS. GUSTAFSON at Kansas City, without success. Dec. 30th received a so-called "summary report" re. Amin Brown and CHARTFS TEITEHON from $\operatorname{CR}$. GTSMAFSON, but said reports are very brief, and contain nothing not heretofore ascertained and reported by Agents. Te now have working under cover on this case, without pay.

RE: REST ROAN MURDER:
Dec. 27th. Agents interviewed ROY BUNCH, County Jail, Enid, Okla. ROY Six-months Federal sentence on a whiskey conviction; that he has another such sentence and conviction, pending on appeal, and that his wife has also a similar conviction and sentence on appeal. (It will be recalled that the present MRS. ROY BUNCH was the wife of HERPY ROAN at the tine ROAN was killed, and that she married ROY BUNCH a few days or weeks after her husband was murdered

POY BUNCE stated to us that he had never told BILL BRYaNt or anyone else that he, BUNCH, knew witnesses mho sam BOB PARER and SAT: NULY following HENRY ROAN the day RCAN disappeared and near the spot where ROAN'S body and oar were afterward found that what he did hear and state was that some persons at Burbank, Okla. had seer sal TULY and BOB pries chasing ERNPY ROEN out of Burbank sone tire before Roan's body was found. BUNGE stated that he had never learned whether this occasion was one week or two or three weens before RQAN was found dead, and that he did not remember the names of the persons at Burbank who had told him this, but the le could find them, as they lived at Burbank. (This report is an old one, regarding $S A T$ IULK and BOB PARKER, and ACt. C. S. Weak ley informed sgt. Weiss that he, Weak ley, had investgated, and had determined tint it was several weeks before ROAN disappeared that MULZ and PARYER had chased ROAN at Burbank. This disposes of this.)

ROY BUNCE stated further to agents that since he, BUNCR, has been put in jail on his present sentence, his wife, IARY PCAN munch has tola him that W. K. Hew has been trying to visit her; has left some stuff smelling and looking like whisky in s bottle at her
house for her to drink, enc has tried to get her to sign parers acknowledging claims by His against the ECAN estate; BUCE states that his wife is afraid of EA DE, and did not drink the so-celled whiskey.
