



Editor, Daily Worker:

It has come to my attention that on Feb. 17, 1956, your paper carried an article entitled "Pearl Buck Urges UN Seat For China." This article purports to contain an accurate account of an address which I delivered on Feb. 16 at the Temple Beth Miriam, in Long Branch, New Jersey. It begins, and I quote:

"Pearl S. Buck, Nobel Prizewinning author, called last night for admission of China to the United Nations."

Icam much disturbed by what appears to be a deliberate di torton of my remarks on the occusion mentioned. With reference to the question of whether Communist China should be admitted to the United Nations, I replied in the negative, that is, I do not approve of giving Com-munist China a seat in the United Nations. I stated that, quite aside from my personal epinion on the subject, the basic charter of the United Nations adoes not presently admit of Communist Chinese membership. It was my further opinion that only change in the United Nations! charten, thereby permitting ladmissio of all nations, would make the entry of Communist China postible.

Enclosed is a copy of a report entitled "Pearl Sydenstricker Buck, also known as Mrs, Richard J. Walsh, Security Matter - C, " which appears to relate to the subject of your name check request.

A review of FBI files further reflects that Pearl Buck, not further identified, was a member of the Board of Trustees of the American Council of the Institute of Pacific Relations in 1944. (McCarraw (on Mittee)

Assorting to a report on the Institute of Pacific Relations (IPR) issued by the Senate Subcommittee on Internal Security in July, 1952, it is stated, among other things, that the IPR has been considered by the American Communist Party and by Soviet officials as an instrument of communist policy, propaganda, and military intelligence which disseminated and sought to popularise false information including information originating from Soviet and communist sources. The report further states that a small core of officials and staff members carried the main burden of IFR activities and directed its administration and policies. Members of this small core were characterized in the report as either communists or procommunists.

#### Grave Injustice'

I am writing on behalf of a group of Chinese in the United



States who, though relative, ly small in number, are suffering under a grave injustice. They are those who have overstayed the terms of their admission into the United States but who cannot return to mainland China

because they would face physical persecution. Many of them have been in the United States over ten years, the Immigration Service having withheld deportation to China on the ground that they cannot safely return.

More than 500 of them, I understand, are now to be sent to Holland. The basis for this is that they entered the United States on Dutch ships. Deportation is based on a section of the McCarren-Walter Immigration Act which says that a person can be deported to any country "willing to accept" him. The procedure followed on arrival, it seems, is for the Chinese deportee to be placed immediately in detention. He is held there at the expense of the Holland-American Line until the line can make arrangements to place him aboard one of its vessels. These Chinese have never been in Holland but merely shipped on vessels of Dutch registry. The situation is anal-ogous to a Chinese seaman on an American vessel which he deserts in another country. Would the United States at the request of that country agree to the de-portation of such a Chinese sea-man to the United States? Serv. ice aboard an American vessel would impose no obligation to receive him here as a deportee.

.The whole arrangement appears to be a means of providing seamen for the Hollan

can Line. In essence the Chinese here are not actually being dehere are not actually being deported to Holland but merely removed in the custody of the steamship line. They are to be placed aboard the company's ships, where their bargaining power will be minimal. There they will stay indefinitely until dither they succeed in securing either they succeed in securing admission to some country or the master of the vessel no longer needs their services and succeeds in putting them ashore in some

country.
Our State Department and other agencies spend millions of dollars and make strenuous efforts to acquaint people elsewhere with our democratic ideals.

It would hardly seem compatible with these ideals to sanction this pseudo-deportation of these Chinese. Their removal comes us comfortably close to being an i pressment of seamen, a cat for which Americans wintto v in 1812. PEARL S. BUCK

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#### PEARL BUCK

Pearl Buck was investigated by this Bureau during 1952, which investigation was predicated upon information obtained from an informant, whose reliability could not be determined but who had attended social gatherings with Pearl Buck and who considered her to be a definite communist sympathizer.

The investigation developed that several individuals contacted considered Miss Buck's political sympathies in parallel with those of the Communist Party. The investigation failed to develop any indication that Miss Buck was or had been a member of the Communist Party or that she had at any time made statements advocating the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence.

The investigation further revealed that for several years prior to 1952 Miss Buck was President of the East-West Association with headquarters in New York City, which organization arranged lectures and promoted books designed to bring the eastern and western nations together by fostering a knowledge and understanding of their respective peoples.

This Bureau's files contain many allegations that Miss Buck in her writings and speeches has been against universal military training, militarism, racial segregation, and has been critical of the government of Chiang Rai-shek. (62-101935)



Pearl Buck was investigated by this Bureau during 1952, which investigation was predicated upon information obtained from an informant, whose reliability could not be determined but who had attended social gatherings with Pearl Buck and who considered her to be a definite communist sympathizer.

The investigation developed that several individuals contacted considered Miss Buck's political sympathies in parallel with those of the Communist Party. The investigation failed to develop any indication ? that Miss Buck was or had been a member of the Communist Party or that she had at any time made statements advocating the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. 18 AUG 20 1965

The investigation further revealed that for several years prior to 1952 Miss Buck was President of the East-West Association with headquarters in New York City, which organization arranged lectures and promoted books designed to bring the eastern and western nations together by fostering a knowledge and understanding of their respective peoples.

The 11/21/38 issue of "Peoples World" contained an article captioned "36 American Authors Ask Embargo on Nazis". The article related that 36 American authors, including Pearl Buck, demanded that President Roosevelt rebuke the Nazi reign of terror by severing trade relations with Nazi Germany.



The 2/7/39 issue of "Peoples World" contained an article captioned "78 Writers Ask Lifting of Embargo". The article revealed that 78 American writers, including Pearl Buck, had issued an appeal for the lifting of the embargo which prevented the Spanish Republic from buying arms for its defense.

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

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

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

Darden, Jr. of Virginia to grant a stay of execution for Odell Waller who was convicted of murder and sentenced to be executed. Pearl S. Buck was among the signers of this letter.

The 6/26/42 issue of the "DW" contained an article captioned "Negro Achievement Day to be Observed Here Tomorrow". The article related that Negro and white people of New York would honor noted Negroes at ceremonies at a Victory Dance in the Golden Gate Ballroom, 142nd St. and Lenox Ave., NYC... Pearl Buck and others would participate in the ceremonies.



The Press Service of the Workers Defense League (WDL) (100-5557) set out information that on 7/1/42, a petition to President Roosevelt to appoint a commission of inquiry to investigate the Odell Waller case appeared in a full-page advertisement in the "Washington Star" placed there by the WDL. Quoting Pearl Buck's statement that Waller "has become a personification of all to whom democracy is denied in our country," the petitioners told the President that "your intervention will help restore the badly shaken faith of our Negro minority in American democracy".

This document indicated that Odell Waller was convicted of murder and was electrocuted on 7/2/42 at the State Prison in Richmond, Va.
