Reference is made to your memorandum

A review of our files has been made to locate information concerning Peterls which might be of assistance to you in assessing Peierls as a security risk.

During the investigation of Klaus Fuchs, it was developed that Peterls was considered by fellow employees at Los Alamos to have been one of the closest, if not the closest, associates of Fuchs from both the professional and secial standpoint. It is noted, of course, that Peierle was the senior member of the British Group at Los Alamos and that Peierls and Fuchs had been closely associated in their work prior to that time, in New York and Great Britain.

a fellow employee at los Alamos, advised during interview concerning ruchs that he had been first introduced to Fuchs by Peterls, the head of the British Mission at Los Alamos. He said that Peterls endeavored to assist all British scientists at los Alamos and had made it a particular point to entertain Fuchs because of Fuchs! apparent loneliness. He said that Mrs. Peierls, whom he referred to as "Mether Peterls," had made it a habit to look after all of the younger men. The Peierises had bessted, according to That all worthwhile scientists in England had spent one evening in their home, and that so had all international visitors to the Peierless' neighborhood. he also was a guest of the Peierlees in December, 1948, when he visited England on a vacation trip and to confer with British scientists with whom he had been associated at Los Alamos recalled that during this visit, the Peierlses had given a cooktail party attended by most of the British scientists from Harwell, including Fachs. Both are now element of the United States and was naturalised at Boston, Massachusetts, on Pebruary 3, 1941. attended the Masachusetts Institute of Technology from 1935 to ixas and he holds degrees of B.S. and Ph.D. from this institute. of February, 1950, he was a member of the faculty at MIY. His wife, goedlettig co the reports of two informants of known relimbering accounted a mosting sponsored by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in Boston on the evening of March 29, 1948. This meeting featured an address by Madame Irene Joliot Curie, who made a tour of collowing day. A reliable informant identified as a paid-up member of the Cambridge Chapter of the rogradulve Citizens of America in 1947. Another informert of known reliability advised that reception in honor of savious chairman of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee on July 16, 1942, and acted as "helpers" in the fund raising efforts which followed the reception festivities.

Investigation in the Fuchs case developed that, in Hovember and December, 1945, Ere. Augusta H. Teller, wife of Dr. Edward Teller, a fellow employee at Los Alamos, made a visit to Mexico in the company of Fuchs and Dr. and Ers. Rudolph Peierls. Immigration records confirmed the return of Fuchs and the Peierless to the United States on December S, 1945, at Laredo, Texas. These records indicated that the Peierless were en route to England by way of Santa Fe, New Mexico, at this time. Mrs. Teller confirmed this trip during an interview son February 14, 1950. She stated that this was a vacation trip and that, to her knewledge, Fuchs had not met anyone unknown to her. The trip, she said, was made on the suggestion of herself and Mrs. Peierls.

Dr. Edward Teller advised on interview concerning Fuchs that he had first met Peierls in Germany at the University of Leipzig in 1928. He stated that the Communist Party was perfectly legal in Germany at that time and that if Peierls had any Communist sympathies he would have had no reason to hide them. He said that Peierls has shown no marked political

interests and had indicated no Communist sympathies. Teller stated that he had later known Peterls in England, and at Los Alamos during 1944 and 1945. When Peterls was back in the United States in 1946 and 1947, he had been strongly in favor of agreement with Russia. Teller continued that he could not recall that Peterls had discussed politics with him when he saw Peterls in England in 1948. He added that he had been at Peterls' home for dinner, along with a number of other people, and that he had sat next to Eugenia Peterls during dinner. He stated that during the dinner Mrs. Peterls had done "quite a bit of baiting" and had called him (Teller) a war monger. Teller stated that Peterls had never told him why he left Germany but that he always assumed that it was because Peterle was Jewish. He expressed the belief that Peterls had met his wife at a scientific meeting in Moscow. (65-599-5-915, page 37)

Edward Teller was born January 15, 1908, at Budapest, Hungary, and his wife, Mrs. Augusta Harkanyi Teller, was born April 30, 1909, in the same city. Both became naturalized citizens of the United States on March 4, 1941, at Washington, D. C. Information has been received from a confidential informant that one Edward Teller had been on the roster of teachers at the Communist Workers School, New York City, in 1941, teaching Political Economy, Marxism, Leminism and the Ristory of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union. Dr. Edward Teller was interviewed in January, 1949, concerning the possibility of his being identical with the Edward Teller who was listed on the 1941 roster of the teachers at the Workers School, and he emphatically denied that he was identical with this individual. He stated that he had absolutely no background or qualifications which would entitle him to teach any of the subjects listed by the Workers School. He stated that he was in New York City in September, 1941, and that he taught at Columbia University from that time until June, 1942. The photograph of Dr. Teller was displayed to various informants, who identified his photograph as that of a man seen by the informants on various occasions at the headquarters of the Communist Party Workers School, New York City, during the early part of 1942. One informant identified his photograph as being that of a person who taught at the Workers School in 1941. It was reported on March 15, 1950, that a very confidential source close to the Teller family had received information to the effect that Mrs. Teller had remarked to a friend on one occasion, " I am worried for Eddie and I are



members of the Communist Party." There is also information that in the past the name and address of Dr. Edward Teller appeared on a "membership list" of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, which has been described by the Attorney General as a Communist front organization. Likewise, the name of Mrs. Edward Teller has appeared on a membership list of the "League of Women Shoppers," Washington, D. C., described by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as a Communist controlled front organization.

who is known to you by reason of his correspondence with Fuchs after the latter's arrest, was interviewed concerning Fuchs on April 28, 1950. At that time, he mentioned Rudolph Peierls and stated that he was rather displeased with Peierls because Feierls had denied knowledge of any of Fuchs' activities. He did not believe that this could be true, as Peierls and Fuchs were extremely close. He regarded Peierls as cowardly and said that Peierls was undoubtedly afraid to express himself further due to the fact that Mrs. Peierls was of Russian origin and not too many years out of Russia.

Approximately two weeks prior to this interview, the same reported by two independent sources as being mentally distraught. One source described him as obviously distraught and mentally deranged, and the other source stated that he was under the care of a psychiatrist and definitely a mental case.

concerning Fuchs on March 11, 1950, and at that time he stated that Fuchs was very close, socially as well as professionally, with Rudolph Peierle, who was one of the few who, in his opinion, knew Fuchs best. He said that it was his impression that while Fuchs was not rabidly "pro-Russian" he had shown a disposition to "favor" the Hussians to a limited degree, and in this regard he recalled that when Peierls, who appeared to Weisskopf to be quite anti-Russian, made a critical appraisal of Russia during a discussion of the Allies' relations with Russia, Fuchs would answer, "Well, there is the other side of it."

He received a Fair. degree from Gottinger University in 1991. From that time until September, 1937, when he entered the United States and became an associate professor with the University of Rochester, Rochester, Hew York, he had been a research associate at Berlin University, Berlin, Germany, the University of Copenhagen, Cambridge, England, and the Eurich Institute of Technology.

Information is swallable that since the successful explosion of the atomic bomb, has withdrawn from any military research concerning atomic energy, and on occasions has urged international control of atomic energy. He is reported to have said in October, 1945, that Russia was making a greater sacrifice in attempting to preserve the peace than was the United States, and he suggested that the United States destroy its stock pile of bombs for peace. The has had association with several individuals reported to be Communists or Communist sumpathisers. A considerable number of close acquaintances have described him as loyal, and it is reported that on one occasion, he refused to address the Boston-Cambridge Chaptans of the American Association of Scientific Workers, on the grounds that he thought it was a Communist Party organisation.

During investigation at les Alamos, information was received that Mrs. Peierls was considered to be a "character" and that she was loud and outspoken. It was stated that there were many rumors that she was a Russian and had formerly been everything from a private to a captain in the Russian Army.

with born citizen of Canada who taught mathematics at the University of Toronto and who, during a leave of absence from the University, returned to Poland where he resigned from his post at Toronto University. "The Ensign." a meakly Cathelic paper published in Montreal, Canada, quoted on March 18, 1950, as saying with reference to his tour of England that the work at Diraingham was open to inspection and that there was no secret work on the campus. He said that from Peierle, a Cerman refugee from Maxiam, he had learned some interesting details about the British and other atom bomb projects. These details indicated that Britain started work on the atom bomb before the United States did, according to the article.

Our files reflect that a Personnel Security Questionnaire filled out by Mrs. Eugenia Peierls en July 11, 1944, while she was at Les Alamos, reflected that her father, Nikolai Kannegiesser, was born in Russia but is



both born in Russia. She listed her parents-in-law as Henry Poleris and Elsa Peierls, both of Montelair, New Jersey, and stated that they were born in Germany and were German citizens. with reference to Peierls' relatives in the United States, your attention is invited to our memorandum number 7467, dated October 31, 1949, concerning Fuchs and Peierls. The Immigration and Naturalization Service records reflected that Heinrich Peierls, father of Rudolph Peierls, made application for an immigration visa on February 14, 1940, at London, England. This application reflected that he was born February 6, 1867, at Breslau, Germany, and had resided in that country from his birth until March, 1939. Thereafter, he resided in England at 9 Adamson Road, London NW 3. His mother was Anna Weigert and his father, Simon Peierls, both deceased. His wife was listed as Elizabeth Marie Peierls, nes Hermann. The application reflected that he intended to join his

The records further reflect that as of September, 1940, Reinrich Feierls was retired. A brother is listed as Siegfried Peierls, New York City, and his two sons were named as Alfred H. Peierli, Surrey, England, and Professor Rudolph Peierls, Birmingham, England. The file reflected a statement by Heinrich to the effect that he had previously visited the United States in 1937, but there was no record of such a visit. The file reflects information to the effect that Heinrich Peierls died on June 29, 1945.

According to these records, Elizabeth Maria Peierls, wife of Heinrich Peierls, was born June 1, 1883, at Frankfurt au Maine, Germany. Her parents, who were listed as deceased, were Anne Ernst and Carl Hermann. The records listed har sister as Mrs. Helens Pulda, Ithaca, Msw York. Her sister's address was first given as in care of Mashington, D. D.

Blisabeth Maria Peierls, in an application for naturalization, set out that she married Meinrich on June 15, 1922, at Berlin, Germany. From this it would appear that Elizabeth is apparently the second wife of Heinrich and is not the mother of Rudolph and Alfred Peierls. She was naturalized October 19, 1945, at Rewark, New Jersey.

Alfred Heinrich Peierls, sen of Heinrich Peierls, made application for an immigration visa on October 21, 1926, at Montreal, Canada. This reflected that he was born February 24, 1999, at Berlin, Germany, and that his residence for the five years prior to his application was Berlin, Germany, and Schenectady, New York, he having resided in the latter place from 1924 to 1926. The file indicated that Peierls had been connected with the Allegemeine Elektricitats-Geselleschaft, Berlin, Germany.

These records also reflected information concerning the entries into the United States of Rudolph and Eugenia Peierle, which are known to you. These records reflected that as of February, 1942, the Peierless had two children.

With reference to the activity of Peterls subsequent to his departure from the United States, information is available that from Webruary 13 to 17, 1946, a conference on "Science and the Welfare of Mankind" was held in London, according to a report written by a delegate to the conference. The report stated that the British Association of Scientific Workers formed a Committee of Atom Scientists. Professor R. E. Peterls was listed as a member of this committee, which included

The April, 1949, issue of the Bulletin of Atom Scientists contained an article setting forth the views on freedom of science, acceptained by Professor R. E. Peierls and Peierls and Spoke for the possible exchange of scientific information between a countries and both mentioned the desirability of scientific intercourse with Iron Curtain countries, and were critical of United States treatment of scientists. In this regard, Peierls is quoted as follows: "One hears a good deal of talk about the dangerous effects of scientists who held subversive views of one kind and another, and this, fortunately, is not taken very seriously in this country. I believe most of you know that in the United States things are rather more difficult in that respect." (65-58805-672)





This copy of the memorandum was funnish by Mr. AEC, Brookhaven Office on 3/22/66. Mr. at the same time made available the data contained in AEC files pertaining to the subject.

Under date of 1/4/66, Brookhaven National Laboratory (BNL) transmitted a letter to AEC, Brookhaven Office, requesting AEC alien visitor approval for Dr. RUDOLPH E. PEIERLS, a British National. The letter indicated that BNL intended to offer an appointment to Dr. PEIERLS as a temporary employee in the capacity of Visiting Senior Physicist in the Physics Department effective on or about March 20, 1966, for a period of five weeks. (letter relates that during his stay at BNL he will engage in unclassified research with the Theoretical Physics Group.

advised that the subject arrived at BNL, with his wife, on 3/19/66, and is currently residing in apartment 3-D on the site of BNL. He further advised that BNL has assured AEC that AEC will be informed if PEIERLS intends to visit other AEC installations during his visit to the United States. has further indicated that PEIERLS will be concerned principally with nuclear theory and will work with staff theorists.

This is an interim response to your recent request for indices checks concerning Dr. Peierls in connection with his proposed temporary employment at Brookhaven National Laboratory. Indices checks have not been completed because of referrals to other agencies. This information has been requested and will be furnished upon receipt. Information received to date has been included with information contained in Division of Security files and is summarized below.

Dr. Rudolph Ernst Peierls, Information Prior to 1951

Dr. Peierls was born June 5, 1907, in Berlin, Germany. He received his education in Germany and Switzerland and emigrated to England in 1933 because of racial prosecution in Germany. For two years he was a "Research Fellow" at Manchester University and for the next two years at the Royal Society Mond Laboratory in Cambridge, England. He was appointed to the Physics Department in Birmingham University in 1937. There is no positive information on how he met and when he married his wife. It has been alleged that he spent some time teaching in Russia sometime during 1930-39 and that he met and married his wife in Russia. Another source advised the FBI that he believed Dr. Peierls met his wife while attending a scientific conference in Moscow. In any case, based on the age of their oldest child in 1944 it appears they were married sometime in 1933-34. Dr. Peierls became a naturalized citizen of Great Britain in March 1940.

In 1951, Peierls was Vice President of the Council of the Atomic Scientists' Association, reportedly a Communist front organization. He was reported to have been a member of a delegation that visited the British Home Office on August 1, 1947, to ask clemency for Dr. self-admitted and convicted Soviet Agent in the Canadian-Soviet spy case, who was then in prison in England.

Mexico in 1944 reflects the birth of both her parents in Russia. Mrs. Peierls listed attendance at Leningrad University from 1925 to 1929 and indicated employment at the Leningrad Geophysical Laboratory during 1930 and 1931. From 1939 to 1941 she gave her employment as a nurse in a Birmingham hospital in England. During 1941 through 1943 she showed employment with General Electric in Birmingham as a Planning Engineer. She became a naturalized citizen of Great Britain in March 1940 at the same time as her husband.

MENER EX Allegations concerning her membership in the German Communist Party and the Communist Party in England are discussed below.

Dr. Peierls Association with Klaus Fuchs

Klaus Fuchs was born in Germany in 1911. He fled to England in 1933 because of Communist Party activities and attended Bristol and Edinburgh Universities receiving his Ph.D. in mathematics and physics at the latter. When the Nazi attempt to cross the English channel seemed imminent, Fuchs together with other selected aliens, was sent to an internment camp in Canada. Following the German invasion of Russia in 1941 he was returned to England where he was employed on unclassified research activities at Glasgow University.

Peierls heard about Fuchs and invited him to help in the war research Peierls was conducting at Birmingham University. At that time Peierls had been selected as the head of the British Tube Alloy Project, which paralleled the work being done in the U.S. by the former Manhattan Engineering District (MED). Fuchs came to live with Peierls in 1941.


Both Peierls and Fuchs were selected as part of the British mission which came to the U.S. in December 1943 to work with MED scientists. Peierls was in charge and continued to be in charge when they were both transferred to Los Alamos in March 1944. While at Los Alamos, Peierls was noted for his theoretical work on implosion and contributed heavily to theoretical work on the "super" bomb. They returned to Great Britain in 1946, Dr. Peierls leaving in January while Fuchs followed him six months later. Both were the subject of security assurances received by the MED from the British government.

Klaus Fuchs was arrested by the British in February 1950 while employed on the British atomic energy program. He confessed to espionage activities in behalf of the Russians and was convicted and sentenced to imprisonment. He has since served his jail term and is currently employed in scientific work in East Germany.

FBI Investigation in the U.S. in 1950-1951

It was also found that captured German documents consisting of original documents of the German Communist Party listed the name of "Comrade" Kannegiesser. It was not known whether this individual was identical with Mrs. Peierls, nee Kannegiesser. Investigation also disclosed that Mrs. Peierls had been publicly opposed to Britain's participation in World War II until Russia entered the war.

1951 AEC Action in Connection with Declassification Conferences with the UK

Dr. Peierls was selected by the UK to attend several U.S.-UK Declassification Conferences for which security assurances were furnished the AEC. Prior to the 1951 conference, the adverse information concerning Dr. Peierls and his wife was presented to the British, and the UK response was:



- 1. Peierls was a close friend and associate of Klaus Fuchs and they roomed together at Los Alamos. The association between them developed naturally as a result of scientific assignments and no "sinister implications" were drawn therefrom.
- 2. Mrs. Peierls was born in Russia. However, the allegation she was a member of the British Communist Party was "unfounded". The British had no information which would connect Mrs. Peierls with "Comrade" Kanegiesser mentioned in the captured German documents.
- 3. The British do not consider the Atomic Scientists' Association as a Communist front.
- 4. Dr. Peierls did not teach in Russia.

The AEC approved Dr. Peierls' attendance at the Conference. One of the prime considerations was that he would have no additional access to classified information other than he already had.

Subsequent Information Received Concerning Associates of Dr. Peierls

In February 1952, CIA reported that Dr. Peierls obtained UK clearance through the influence of the second who had been reported to have had an open code telephone conversation with Donald MacLean just prior to the latter's departure from England. Strachey was also reported to have been responsible for having the surveillance on lifted, which reportedly made possible Pontecorvo's escape to Russia. Association with American Communist

His roommate at the University of Wisconsin was President of the American Youth for Democracy (AYD) and reportedly a known Marxist. The AYD has been designated by the Attorney General under Executive Order 19450. association with continued at Yale University during 1946-47 where they studied and worked together. was also active with the Communist Party County Committee of Connecticut during the latter period. In applying for a passport in 1954, admitted joining the student branch of the Communist Party at Yale University in January 1948. In February 1963, a scientist who worked with at the Niels Bohr Institute in Copenhagen, Denmark, reported that he was known as a "harmless Communist sympathizer".

Association with Alleged Soviet Agent

A current CIA check disclosed a report that in December 1950 Dr. Peierls was an associate of Dr. who was described by a reliable source as a known Communist and alleged agent who was living in England in 1950. reported function was to collect scientific and technical intelligence in England for the Soviets.

described as an ex-German scientist who in 1950 was believed a British citizen. There is evidence that in 1945 he cooperated with both U.S. and British intelligence and furnished information to the Russians also. Shortly after the Russians occupied Berlin, furnished the Russians the names of German scientists in atomic research and the location of two tons of heavy water which he said he feared might be destroyed by the Germans. In a 1948 report by U.S. sources, this action was attributed to his residence in the Russian sector. Information contained in a letter written by a German scientist working for the Russians in Moscow in 1946 states that approached the Russians to work for them and that this scientist recommended him to the Russians.

His reported assistance to the U.S. and British consisted in furnishing information on German scientists both in East Germany and working in Russia. An American scientist associated with U.S. intelligence, reported that in his contacts with British intelligence they had left no doubt that was closely associated with them. In December 1950, information that was a suspected Communist agent trying to collect scientific and technical intelligence information in England for the Soviets was made available to the British. The British reply was that his contacts were known and they did not consider him to be engaged in espionage, particularly since there was no supporting evidence for such allegations.


