## FOREWORD

The writer feels that the issues involved in the McCarthy controversy are of paramount importance. The controversy rages beyond the boundaries of the United States and the word "McCarthyism" is a vernacular word spoken all over the globe and is being used in foreign lands as a derogatory expression with which to undermine American prestige and ridicule our political institutions. The international implications, therefore, of "McCarthyism" are of vital importance also in the arena of international affairs, where the correctness or incorrectness of American foreign policy is tested.

In addition, he submits that it is the duty of every American, concerned with the welfare of his country, to make up his mind on "McCarthyism" without passion and free from prejudice. His decision when made should be based upon knowledge of the facts and

the calm, objective judgment of reason.

The writer, fully conscious of the fact that he is dealing with a highly explosive political controversy, desires to stress that he is not a politician but one who takes his duties and responsibilities of American citizenship seriously. In order, therefore, not to be guilty of bias or partisanship he decided to find out for himself what were the facts; to seek out the truth and to be guided accordingly. With this objective in mind, he sought to determine for himself whether Senator McCarthy's activities and methods constitute a menace to the United States, and in the broader sense to the cause of freedom and humanity.

He hopes that the case which he presents in the following pages, arrived at after long and careful observation, will arouse your interest and meet with your fair and objective consideration. He will consider himself sufficiently rewarded for his efforts if what he has written will result in stimulating discussions among the readers of the pamphlet and others with whom they come in contact, discussions in which the participants will not attempt to prejudice the case before they have considered all the available facts, evidence

## THE BACKGROUND OF "McCARTHYISM"

A casual perusal of the daily press, the headlines, space and editorials devoted to condemning the activities of Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, the stream of derogatory statements against the Senator's methods, branded as "McCarthyism," that are the themes of countless speeches, atticles, resolutions, sermons and declarations, the anti-McCarthy sentiment that is being stimulated abroad and is rapidly spreading and growing, indicates that what Senator McCarthy is doing and what he stands for is tied in with the issues that concern the future of our country and the world.

It is interesting to note that all those arrayed against the Senator are seldom violent in their denunciation of communist subversion but they are always most violent in their denunciation of those who light communist subversion, especially the methods they employ.

The attack against Senator McCarthy as a personality and against his methods increases in ferocity, and daily gains momentum in the United States and abroad. Is this concerted, violently bitter attack justified? Is it based on partisan demagoguery or sound reasoning? Is it motivated by genuine patriotic sentiments concerned with the welfare and security of the country? Or is it the result of a premeditated campaign on the part of subversive elements to destroy Senator McCarthy's effectiveness in fighting subversion by destroying his reputation as an individual? In the final analysis is the campaign against McCarthyism beneficial or dangerous to the country?

Surely, every American who considers himself or herself a loyal and patriotic American now agrees that Communism is a menace to America. Most of those who violently and most viciously attack the Senator, charge that his METHODS of fighting Communism are wrong, unconstitutional, violate basic democratic American principles, create fear and mob hysteria, and do not harm but aid the communists and are unjustifiable in a country where freedom prevails and the rights of the individual are respected. Repeatedly we hear the cry from intellectuals, fellow travelers, educational and spiritual leaders (all of whom claim they are anti-communists), protesting against what they call the sinear tactics and outrageous METHODS employed by Senator McCarthy. The attack is not only directed against Senator McCarthy but all Congressmen, Congres sional Committees, Government officials, organizations and individuals who back up the Senator. All are smeared with the same brush of "McCarthvism."

I had this graphically brought to my attention when an organization which I had been supporting—the National Conference of

Chr stians & Jews, Inc., a non-political organization—joined the att. k upon Senator McCarthy, with no justification whatsoever. (Se copy of letter to the National Conference of Christians & Jews, reprinted in the appendix of this pamphlet, page 28).

## HOW THE COMMUNIST CONSPIRACY OPERATES

The efforts to uproot the communist conspiracy operating will in our midst—I am sure the reader will agree—is not exclusive y a matter of police action. Combating the communist menace is e of the most difficult and complicated tasks facing the country. It is when we are concerned with the communist problem con retely in relation to the organized communist movement that we become alarmed. Nobody, by just believing in communism, can har n us. But we now know, through sad experience, that those who belowe in communism—if they be people who mold public opinion or lave positions of responsibility in educational, religious, social or solitical life—especially if they hold down important positions in povernment and industry involved with the security of the United States—may do us infinite harm. Why? Because those who believe in ommunism, with rare exceptions, are sympathetically drawn toward the movement of communism, the objectives of which are to abvert our free institutions, destroy our government and set up an all-powerful, ruthless communist dictatorship.

Too often have we, through experience, learned that believers in communism who occupy places of influence have used their positions to undermine fatth in the American system and loyalty to our government and its institutions. While we do not challenge the dictates of a man's conscience, nor the right of an individual to believe in communism, we do challenge his right to tie in with the communist movement in any capacity whatsoever, as a member, fellow traveler, or supporter of fronts. IF HIS ACTIONS IN ANY WAY AFFECT OUR DEMOCRACY OR OUR WAY OF LIFE.

## IDEALISTIC COMMUNISM VS. MARXIST, SOVIET COMMUNISM

Communism is an idealistic philosophy based upon the common ownership of property to be used in common for the benefit of all. This communism has little, if anything, in common with the philosophy of Marxism or the communism preached in the Soviet Union or that advocated by the Communist Party of the United States. It has a long history that goes back to primitive times long before the advent of our modern complex industrial and economic era. In fact, many of the early religious communities practiced this form of communism. It was tribal communism. The gigantic police state of modern communism was unknown in these religious communities. The canonists, the interpreters of ecclesiastical laws during the late Roman Empire and during the Middle Ages, taught that the common ownership and enjoyment of property was a precept of natural law, the law based on reason and having its source in God. The utopian commonwealth (where perfection was achieved in social and personal relationships) described by Sir Thomas More in his "Utopia" was his interpretation of an ideal communist society. From time immemorial in different historical epochs, religious sects, spiritually inspired to live in common for each other, have practiced communal communism. UNDER NO CIRCUM-STANCES SHOULD THIS FORM OF COMMUNISM AND THE PHILOSOPHY OF LIFE IT PORTRAYS WITH ITS DEEP PRIMITIVE RELIGIOUS REALITIES AND WHOLESOME-NESS, BE CONFUSED WITH THE GODLESS, POWER-MAD MOVEMENT KNOWN TODAY AS COMMUNISM.

The drive of communism as a modern world movement to liberate the people from their capitalist oppressors by conquering the world and putting it under the domination of communism began in November 1917. In that year Bolsheviks, the communists of Russia, under the leadership of Lenin, succeeded—through a small minority of the Russian population—by sheer audacity and making false promises of bread to the poor, land to the peasants and peace to

all her people, in overthrowing the Russian Democratic Republic est. lished on the ruins of Tsarist autocracy.

They set up in its place a communist dictatorship, a totalitarian police state dominated by the communists. Shortly afterwards, they dress all other political parties out of existence and allowed only sarty, the Communist Party, to operate. Naturally, the head of the Communist Party became the supreme ruler of the country.

is soon as the communists took over in Russia, they proceeded to be their new found power, the resources of Russia and the bil his they obtained through confiscation of private property, to set be communist movements in all other countries, financed by Mohow and subservient to the Soviet Communist Party and loyal to be Soviet government.

#### THE RED PERIL IN EUROPE

For years, to the war-torn and poverty-stricken people of Europe, Con munism has been held up as an ideal and happy way of life. And this rosy picture is true, IN THEORY. In practice, however, TH IWORLD BEING AS IT IS, people live FOR THEMSELVES FIR iT, and are bitterly opposed to sharing their property and earrings with each other. In Russia, where Communism was put into practice on a national scale for the first time in history, IT HAD TO BE MAINTAINED BY FORCE AND CRUELTY, and conditions for the vast majority became worse than under the Tsars.

So effective, however, was the communist propaganda, that the fact about the terrible slave state, which was being formed, in Rus 1a, were not believed. The communist movement grew by lear: and bounds, its influence spread to such an extent that in Europe and Asia its challenge represented a serious threat to western civitation and to the political and economic systems and institution which sustained it.

Yet in spite of all this, communism emanating from Russia has bee a instrumental in the development—to a marked extent—of the rad all socialist and Marxist thought which so strongly influences Britch life and opinion.

n France the communist movement has grown to gigantic proportions. The Communist Party vote there exceeds the vote of every other party. Is it any wonder that France's political life is so bad paralyzed . . . that every few months the country undergoes a calinet crisis? The stability of the French government is a myth. A so rit of defeatism pervades the country. Communist infiltration of the French government accelerates this degeneration of the liberal Ref. of France founded on liberty, fraternity and equality.

In Italy, the mother country of Catholicism, where the vast majority of the people are members of a church which has fought communism, as a Godless philosophy, a mere handful of communist agents who have infiltrated the government, have so appealed to the imagination of the masses that they have deserted the teachings of the church to embrace the false gods of communism. These agents, who spent most of their lives in Moscow, moved triumphantly into Italy when the Mussolini regime collapsed at the end of World War H. They formed the Italian Communist Party, which mushroomed overnight into the largest single political group in Italy, The trade unions fell into the iron grip of the communists. The job of every Italian was at the mercy of the communists who controlled his unions and his right to work. Every avenue of Italian political, economic and cultural life was heavily infiltrated by communist agents who worked under the direction of the Soviet government. The head of the Italian Communist Party, a member of the executive Committee of the Communist International, a servile tool of Moscow, artained that post not through the votes of Italian communists but through an appointment made by Marshall Stalin, the communist dictator.

Without American support the anti-communist government of Italy could not remain in office for a single day longer because the communists of Italy have the means to take that country over. Do we want the deplorable conditions that now exists in these countries of Europe to happen in America?

In every country in the world, with few exceptions, the story repeats itself. Communism, Moscow-directed, marches onward and haunts civilization. The menace becomes more threatening and more immediate as communism spreads its empire and as its fifth column grows.

### COMMUNISM'S TARGET — THE UNITED STATES

It is not necessary to catalogue the damage that Moscow's communist agents and lifth column traitors have done in Europe, nor to indicate how--through the manipulation of propaganda cleverly disseminated in areas where it would be most effective-they poisoned the minds of millions of people in Europe, inisled them and converted them into dupes and instruments for the achievement of communist political objectives and subversion. That their counterparts in the United States are engaged in doing the same thing and striving for the same objectives, must be taken for granted. To hold otherwise is to be blind to the realities of the "Cold War."

The main target of international communism is the United States of America. The communists realize that our country is the

one and only obstacle that stands in the path of Red Imperialism's drive to conquer the world. They, therefore, have everything to gain should they succeed—through propaganda and by all the meas available to them—to poison the minds of the American people and full them into a sense of security on the matter of compunist subversion.

In the conduct of their psychological warfare factics, the commurists are masters of deception. They cloak their propaganda and r false American banners and secretly support movements in the Inited States which presumably have the most ideal objectives as a goal.

By emotional appeals, they paint rosy pictures of an ideal American government owning all the economic resources of the courtry and guaranteeing everyone a cradle-to-the-grave security, with our work and effort and sacrifice on their part.

In recent years a large number of Americans without realizing the ommunist nature and origin of the concept of the government as a suge welfare agency, have endorsed that concept and supported the soliticians and government administrators and advocate policies and incasures that will transform our government into a paternalistic, well re state. When Americans fall for the false philosophy of stat m-that the government owes everyone a living-that is the beginning of the breakdown of faith in the American system. It leac -as the communists desire-to the undermining of true Am rican ideals and the patriotic concepts of our democracy. It pro is that the communist danger has reached into the very vitals of a nerican life. Today the communists operate behind the scenes taki g full advantage of every development in their favor. Tomor ow they may strike for power. They must be fought now, vige ously, uncompromisingly and courageously. In the light of they revelations we must consider the question of "McCarthyism."

## ARE THE METHODS OF McCARTHY'S CRUSADE AGAINST COMMUNISM JUSTIFIED?

One of the most effective barriers that stands between the communists and their success is the merciless crusade that Senator Mc arthy and his committee wages against them. Those who oppose his anti-communist crusade from the communists down to the confuse 1, well-meaning "liberal," decry his methods. The proof of the day erous ramifications of the communist conspiracy pile up, thanks to "cCarthy's efforts—yet we talk of METHODS.

Every American has the right to think as he pleases and advicate his beliefs, but when he secretly plots to destroy his country it homes the duty of those responsible for the affairs of our govern-

ment to expose him and label him for what he is. THAT IS THE LAW OF THE LAND. The methods prescribed by Congress in such matters are legal and constitutional. These are the methods under which Senator McCarthy and his Committee operate.

The first step that must be taken to root out the communist consputacy is to expose its operations and the individuals who are engaged in the conspiracy. The most important step to begin with involves an investigation that will expose the facts and make them public in order that an informed public should know the danger that confronts us. Such investigations do not preclude, after the facts are established, prosecution and imprisonment of the individual engaged in the communist criminal conspiracy or those who, as communists or together with them, defy and violate the laws of the country. The congressional investigations have been of tremendous help to the agencies of justice empowered to proscute criminal offenders.

It is not always pleasant, either to the investigated or the investigator, to expose those accused of disloyalty to their country and it is an exceedingly difficult job for many reasons. The communists engaged in the conspiracy usually work secretly, in the dark. They very often carry on their criminal activities under assumed names in the same manner that ordinary criminals use aliases. They pose as loyal Americans while pursuing their sinister and seditious activities. They are not bound by moral scruples. In order to protect themselves and also to provide a protective cloak behind which to operate, they seek out and draw into association with them, individuals whose respectability and patriotic standing it is most difficult to question.

Under these circumstances there are absolutely no other methods than those used by investigating committees that can be employed to expose and ferret out the conspirators. The aim of the congressional investigations—as has already been shown—is not the punishment of the individual for that is the province of the Justice Department and the Courts. THEIR MAIN AIM IS TO AWAKEN PUBLIC CONSCIOUSNESS TO THE COMMUNIST DANGER WHICH THREATENS AMERICA. Those who oppose the investigations have been unable to suggest other methods that would do the job.

The investigative powers of Congress are not something that are new and have just been invented to meet the communist issue. Congressional powers in this field are as old as Congress itself, and have always been fully recognized and their constitutionality established.

Why, then, the mounting campaign against the investigating activities of Senator McCarthy and his committee? It is because the

communists and all those who knowingly or unwittingly have a sociated with or collaborated with the communists, fear exposure because Senator McCarthy, as Chairman of his committee, relentiessly pursues his objectives without fear or favor to anyone. The sollight is thrown on the communist conspiracy for the public to yew it in all its stark frightfulness. All the suspects are exposed a d those in high places are not shielded.

No critic of Senator McCarthy has dared charge that the Senator is illegal methods in his investigations. Neither can they prove it he has arrogantly usurped powers not granted him constitutionally by Congress. In his investigations McCarthy sticks scrupnisly to democratic procedures. Rest assured, if he did not, he would under terrific attack on that score alone. How, then, are we to lige his methods? We must judge them by the results they achieve, ovided the results are beneficial to the country.

Senator McCarthy's success lies in the fact that his personal a ivities before he became Chairman of the Senate Permanent S b-Committee on Investigations, and afterwards, forced many to itors who held high posts in the government (who feared the sene fate that befell Alger Hiss) to resign from government employement. To get these traitors out of government positions where they old serve our enemies and do us inestimable harm was certainly be aeficial to the country. In this respect Senator McCarthy rendered a great patriotic service to the American people.

By his fearless exposure he alerted the American people to the C nmunist danger. He showed the American people how to recognic the insidious methods used by the communists, including the ks and stratagems used by the communist front organizations and the phony appeals of the so-called "liberal" intellectuals who plug immunist propaganda, which under the guise of liberalism has gened considerable headway in the country. Is Senator McCarthy to be condemned for doing an effective job in this respect? Here, it is impossible to fully estimate the positive results which he achieved and the great service he has rendered to the country.

### McCARTHY'S AMERICAN FIGHT — DO THE PEOPLE APPROVE?

But, say his opponents, Senator McCarthy must be wrong because what he is doing does not meet with the approval of the Averican people. Let us examine the facts.

Senator McCarthy's recent victory in the State of Wisconsin a; a ast a nationwide campaign of gigantic proportions, supported by ac most powerful papers and financed by large contributions from a sources outside of Wisconsin, is a testimonial of the people of h s own state that they stand four square behind him. From the

latest Gallup polls and from other fact-finding agencies, from events and popular demonstrations on behalf of the Senator, convincing proof rolls in that the common people of America, who constitute the heart and backbone of our country, from whose homes come the youth that we depend upon to fight and die for our country -- the overwhelming majority of them wholeheartedly approve what Senator McCarthy is doing. The people of America are at last awakening to the dangerous ramifications of communism. Due to Senator McCarthy's exposures the American people have become alarmed at the shocking evidence that some of our nation's leaders, by their misdirected sympathics for leftist and communist causes and individuals, have lent their names and the prestige of their high offices to the communist causes and communist agents whose activities are more dangerous than the communist enemies their sons fought on the field of battle in Korea. The enemies on the field of battle, our soldiers can easily recognize. The internal enemy who masks his treachery is difficult to recognize. We need a McCarthy who has the courage to do what must be done to throw the spotlight on these masked traitors.

### "BIG NAMES" VS. McCARTHY

Senator McCarthy's fight against communism, the methods he uses to expose its criminal activities, is not a partisan fight; it is an AMERICAN FIGHT. He is backed fully by Representative Francis E. Walter of Pennsylvania, ranking Democratic member of the House Committee Investigating Un-American Activities, when he declared:

"Communists are using well-known and highly placed persons as dupes, and the bigger the name the better for their cause."

But the "Big Name" technique is not confined to the political party in the campaign to discredit Senator McCarthy. The "Big Name" technique is exploited by the Communist Party, by the leftist and so-called "liberal" press, to justify a smear campaign against the Senator.

The big smear is a tactic of personal abuse unrelated to facts or the truth. Its wide use in the campaign to destroy the reputation of the Senator is obviously aimed at ending the exposure of the communist infiltration. Its use by the opposition—because they have no legitimate case to stand on—indicates that the opposition is desperate. It is impossible to go into detail in an examination of the Big Smear. All that can be done in this pamphlet is to present a few cases. For example:

In the widely read "Life Magazine" of August 3, 1953, in an

article enjoying the top position on the newsfront page, we read the following headline, "An Eisenhower Raps McGarthy." The news item that follows is an insult to the int Pigence of the American

people. Here is the full quote of the s

Toe McCarthy, who has betters lately, last week got it—A? Q- from an Eisenhower. Arthur, an older broth the President, and a Kansas City banker, said in an interview with a Las Vegas reporter that the Senator is 'THE MOST DANGEROUS MENACE TO AMERICA! He refused to back down when McCarthy demanded to know if the quote was accurate. Thave nothing personally against Senator McCarthy, said Mr. Eisenhower, 'BUT I DEPLORE HIS TACTICS. It is a shame he is a member of the G.O.P.'"

Why was this opinion of a mid-Western banker—one who played no role whatever in public life—nationally unknown—given such prominence? It certainly is not justified by the fact that the banker happens to be a brother of the President of the United States. It was printed because the editors of Life Magazine do not approve of Senator McCarthy's methods.

### "HATE AMERICA" CAMPAIGN

Of course, these violent and abusive critics of "McCarthyism" speak out freely and loudly. Evidently, McCarthy and his methods do not terrorize or prevent them from freely expressing themselves and there exists no mob hysteria in the United States which deprives them of their liberty to do so. When such criticism of Senator McCarthy is made in a country in which the so-called "liberals," leltists, Marxists, give their full support to a "Hate America Campaign" initiated by the communists of England on orders of the Soviet Union, we—as Americans—must sit up and take notice. We must take notice especially if such criticism of McCarthy is lacking in dignity and unjustified by facts and the truth. We must take particular notice if it gives aid and comfort to the communist "Hate America Campaign," the campaign's central theme being that "McCarthyism" is proof that America is a fascist country bent on driving the world into war.

Adlai E. Stevenson, upon his arrival in London during his world tour, rushed to tell the English press in his usual clowning vein, in words of clever sophistication and loaded with inuendos that he, like the English, was opposed to Senator McCarthy and his methods. By so doing he delighted the supporters of the "Hate America Campaign" in England. Again, on the occasion of the Jefferson-Jackson Day dinner in Philadelphia, Mr. Stevenson said that the Four Freedoms of Franklin D. Roosevelt have been replaced

in America by Four Fears, principal of which is the lear of communism. No one but a clown would make such a comparison. Can such conduct on the part of an American who contended for the Presidence on the ticket of the Democratic Party be justified?

The sad comment that the expressions of many men who, through a turn of 1 suddenly elevated to positions of importance, are accepted such expressions breate. Sens McCarthy and his methods. That their expressions may be fantastically ridiculous, void of the truth, obviously biased and vindictive, does not change the sympathetic reception they receive in intellectual circles and in the press, generally. To the credit of the American people it must be stated that it is remarkable that such a large percentage of them have not been influenced by such statements.

Just as Adlai Stevenson, by his remarks, gave aid and comfort to the "Hate America Campaign" raging in Europe, so did Senator Herbert H. Lehman of New York—commenting on his recent trip to Europe. He listed the conduct of the Senate Investigation Committee headed by Senator McCarthy as the cause of a "distorted" view held by Europeans of our country. He declared, what he obviously helieves, that "They (the Europeans) believe that the American people have completely succumbed to fear, panic and hysteria." He continued, "Many are convinced that we have lost our love for peace and our devotion for individual justice." Did Senator Lehman stand up in defense of his country and attack this unjustifiable criticism of our country? He did not. Upon his return to the United States he used the criticism of the "Hate America Campaign" to justify his position against Sen. McCarthy.

At a recent dinner held in New rk, Senator Lehman attacked Senator McCarthy in a still more shocking vein when he said that the Soviet cause had gained more from the "paralyzing influence of "McCarthyism" than it could have from a knowledge of all the country's vital defense secrets." Of Senator McCarthy's METHODS, Senator Lehman said they had started as a "guerrilla activity," had become "a full scale assault on the government service, the schools,

the stage, the publishing world and even the churches."

Let us take the example of United States Representative Emanuel Celler of New York. While traveling abroad he gave an interview in Rome to the press on the Harry Dexter White case exposure. In his interview, he made the following statement that, "The Republican Administration is trying to sacrifice its former President's reputation on the altar of political desperation." He then added that "The Brownell accusations certainly haven't done American prestige much good abroad."

Joining the pack in a similar vein is Norman Thomas, a

perennial candidate for President on the Socialist Party ticket. Norman Thomas, who never received more than a corporal guard's number of votes, recently returned from Europe. In parrot-like fashion he repeated what the other politicians opposed to "Mc-Carthyism" had said. The Rev. Norman Thomas declared that never before had he found American prestige in Europe "so low." He attributed this decline to "McCarthyism." He was also critical of Scott McLeod, administrator of the Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs of the State Department for the statement McLeod made that he would not knowingly employ a Socialist in the State Department. Mr. Thomas said in response to McLeod's statement that he would try to see President Eisenhower to ask him, "Who's running the show-the President or the McCarthys or the McLeods?" Did Norman Thomas, the Socialist who once supported a "militant" program declaring for proletarian dictatorship in the United States. defend his country when he was in Europe against the "Hate America Campaign?" He offers absolutely no evidence that he did. To blame the low prestige of the United States in Europe on Senator McCarthy, as Norman Thomas and the others do, is a deliberate distortion of the facts and obviously intended to smear the Senator Norman Thomas is not misinformed. He knows the score. He knows very well that American prestige is low in Europe because of the Kremlin engineered propaganda campaign against the United States. conducted on a grand scale and backed up by millions of dollars and tons of literature. He also knows that the responsibility must be put on the communist infiltration in all walks of European life, especially on the cultural and intellectual levels. He knows also that Europe's so-called "liberals" in these categories have spearheaded this vicious campaign against the United States and have made anti-McCarthyism one of its central themes. To blame that on McCarthy is to play the enemies' game.

Everywhere we hear the charge from those who do not now like what Senator McCarthy is doing, that the Senator is a "rabble rouser" who did nothing to expose communist infiltration until live years ago. "Where was the Senator before?" they cry, "when this conspiracy was taking on shape and its roots being deeply set in American soil?" But if five years ago the Senator did nothing, WHERE WERE THEY? Their failure to act, knowing the facts, as they claim, condemns them, as well as the forces in the government supported by them, who failed in their responsibilities in this respect. The country owes its gratitude to Senator McCarthy who five years ago saw the danger and had the courage to fight against it, practically alone, against the opposition of all those who did nothing against communist infiltration.

#### COMMUNISM AND THE NEW-FAIR DEAL

But let us examine this question of Senator McCarthy's record against communism, historically. Five years ago Senator McCarthy we a member of the minority group in Congress. The New-Fain and combating the communist conspiracy was resisted by the apower. McCarthy's voice was swamped by those in the generalment, who were determined to steer the ship of state away from the course that made America great. The advocates of social and economic theories at variance with the principles upon which our nation was founded made full use of their positions in the government to flood the country with their pet ideas, many of them based on Marxist collectivism and borrowed from the program of the communists.

An examination of the record of American political life for the past 20 years will disclose that some of the highest executive legislative and judicial positions in our government were filled by these theorists with leftist sympathies who sought to transform our Republic away from its constitutional system, its equality of opportunity, its economic system, democratic process and free institutions, in conformity with their socialist ideals.

In the late thirties, just before the outbreak of World Way II, Congress alarmed at the extent of Red infiltration-constituted the House Committee on Un American Activities, headed by Congressman Martin Dies, to investigate it. The Dies Committee, as it was popularly called, used the second legal methods McCarthy now uses. It became the target of a conwho succeeded in enlisting the support of the so-called liberals, to call for its dissolution. Congress, impressed with what was brought to light by the Committee, refused to abolish it. However, other agencies of the government, notably those connected with the executive branch, hampered the committee's work, put all kinds of obstacles in its way and refused to act on matters which the committee brought to its attention. The result: the exposures of the Dies Committee were not followed up, the communist conspiracy was permitted to continue its criminal activities and the communists and their agents, working within the government, were permitted to hold on to their positions.

Because the government did nothing to clean its house of Red infiltration, the infiltration increased. Communists and their fellow-travelers in impressive numbers succeeded in penetrating important agencies of our government. Especially was this true of the State Department. Here the infiltration reached into the top ranks responsible for the initiation of American foreign policy. The result

was that American foreign policy was slanted in such a way that the position of the Soviet Union was strengthened in international affairs and the position of the United States treacherously weakened. Often, as a result of communist influence in State Department affairs, the United States lost the initiative in the field of foreign affairs.

These developments can be laid at the door of the New Deal regime of Franklin Delano Roosevelt and the Fair Deal regime of Harry S. Truman, which ridiculed the exposure of Alger Hiss in the State Department as a "Red Herring."

Our government officials responsible for the affairs of state permitted narrow partisan political considerations to outweigh the demands of national security. When Congressional investigating committees heard evidence which threatened startling exposures of prominent New and Fair Dealers, both Roosevelt and Truman heaped abuse upon the committees and did everything in their power to discredit their work and destroy their effectiveness, curtailed their funds by approximately one third and thus effectively tied their hands.

#### **AUTHOR'S PERSONAL EXPERIENCES**

May I relate in this respect a personal experience. Some ten years ago I had reason to suspect the motives of a prominent charity organization. This organization, under the guise of assisting in the education of underprivileged youth, both in the United States and abroad, exploited its training program to indoctrinate the youth with communist propaganda.

I reported the facts, concerning this communist indoctrination in my possession, to the proper official channels and authorities in Washington. After going over the evidence in detail, they admitted to me that the case was important but "TOO HOT FOR THEM TO HANDLE."

When I suggested that I drop the entire matter, I was advised that the charges I had made against the organization were too serious to be dropped and that I should present the facts to higher government authorities with power to deal with them. They put me in contact with these higher authorities and made an appointment for me to present my facts to them. I did so immediately and these higher authorities accepted my charges against the charity organization as SERIOUS AND IMPORTANT.

Years later, in 1952, I was finally informed that they, the higher authorities to whom I had submitted the evidence "HAD SOME-THING" on this organization but it could not be disclosed to me.

After waiting another year I requested these higher government authorities to give me permission to quote their statement so that I could approach my Governor and Senator (who were lending the prestige of their names and offices to this organization) and request them to reliain from further support of an organization engaged in the indoctrination of youth with communist philosophy.

Ewas informed, however, that all such information was strictly confidential and that I COULD NOT QUOTE ANY PART OF IT.

Meanwhile, this organization collects millions of dollars for charity by exploiting the names of prominent individuals who are impressed by its program but who have no means of knowing how many of the millions so collected are diverted for communist purposes by those who administer the affairs of the organization.

#### McCARTHY'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The shielding of the insidious activities of communists in gov ernment and in all other fields became exceedingly more difficult after McCarthy started his crusade to drive out the communists and their supporters from positions in the government and elsewhere, from which they could effectively carry on their operations. Since January, 1953 as Chairman of the Senate Permanent Sub-Committee on Investigations, he has pursued his task with a singleness of purpose and courage, doing what has to be done to protect the welfare and security of the country and sparing no one involved in the communist conspiracy. He repudiated the velvet glove and the whitewash methods of some of his predecessors in the Executive Branch of the government and in Congress. In the executive sessions which his committee holds, he seeks to determine the legitimacy of the evidence available and to give the individuals involved an opportunity to clear themselves, to make amends for mistakes and to protect their individual reputations, if that is possible. McCarthy is not out for victims. He is out to protect the people of the United States. After he is satisfied that he has all the facts and that innocent people will not have their reputations jeopardized, he turns, through the public meetings his committee holds, the full spotlight upon the vast network of Red intrigue in order that an informed and properly alerted American public opinion may make itself felt in our national life. His methods have succeeded in arousing the American people to the communist danger and have made every government official conscious of the fact that the American people will not tolerate anyone in the government who collaborates with communists. The Communist Party hates McCarthy because he has created a healthy fear of his committee's power in every disloyal American heart.

## "McCARTHYISM" AND THE "COLD WAR"

International communism, supported by the Soviet Union, Red China and the Red Satellite countries, is engaged in a psychological war against the United States commonly called the "cold war." One of the features of this war is the propaganda arried on all over the world for the purpose of breaking do to the prestige of the United States and destroying the unity of the United States and its allies among the civilized nations of the world. It is only natural to expect that opposition to McCarthy and his methods should become an integral part of the Red's "cold war" objectives. Into this category falls the criticism that McCarthy's methods are distasteful to our allies abroad; that they are creating bad impressions in England, France, Italy and the Far East. The criticism of McCarthy's methods because of their adverse effects on the influence of American foreign policy, is most serious. For it implies that McCarthy's methods are responsible for setting up obstacles in the way of peace between the Soviet Union and the non-communist world. The communists stand four-square back of this criticism because they maintain that "McCarthyism" put road blocks in the way of our Allies who have repeatedly indicated their willingness to purchase peace from Russia at any price.

## COMMUNISM'S BED-FELLOWS — THE ART OF INFILTRATION

In order to understand the heart of the above criticism and other important aspects of the questions raised by Senator McCarthy's methods, it is necessary to lamiliarize ourselves with the pattern of communist infiltration, one of the most important weapons by which the communists break down the morale of a country from within as a prelude to taking the country over.

The number of admitted communists in any nation is small. Standing alone they could do very little damage. Their strength depends upon two exceedingly important factors. One: the communists are part of an international movement numbering in the millions and backed up by the power, the resources and military might of Soviet Power, stretching across the continents of Europe and Asia. Two: the periphery around the Communist Party far outnumbers the confessed communists, who form the center. This group is made up of those who are ideologically akin to the communists. They consist of Socialist grandfathers and first cousin Fellow Travelers, and when we add to these the many more thousands of second cousin communist sympathizers, we arrive at some proportion of the Americans who, while pretending loyalty would, in case of a Red invasion of our country, not raise a hand in

defense of our flag, but would, haul it down and raise and salure the Red Flag of Communism. Like the communists they believe that capitalism has outlived its usefulness, that the system is about to die and that it should be pushed into the grave. This group is very numerous and important because its most influential members do not operate openly as socialists. Marxists or Communists. From this group come many who occupy strategic positions from which they wield great influence in the government, in the fields of science, culture and entertainment, in the educational institutions and the press, and also in the field of religion.

History has shown us in Russia, Czechosłovakia, Poland and in other countries that this large group of ideological bed-fellows and communist fellow travelers and sympathizers create the demoralization and division of the country and this prepares the conditions which enable the communists to take over.

Through the manipulation of this large group, which numbers itself in the hundreds of thousands, the communists are able to stir up and take advantage of class, racial, national and religious antagonisms. The communists use this important intermediary group wherever possible to stir up strikes and social disorder, to direct these disorders into political channels in order to weaken, in the masses of the people, loyalty to their government by instilling in them a hatred of its institutions of law and order. The tactics of demoralization and disloyalty are directed against a nation's elders, with special emphasis upon the nation's youth, for once the moral fiber of the youth of a country is undermined and its loyalties directed into communist channels, the security of the nation is threatened. If such factics are not checked by a nation alert to the danger, the government will eventually weary of resisting evil, and a sense of national frustration and hopelessness will set in. We must be prepared to fight and die for freedom. Once the will to do so is gone the "peace at any price" doctrine will prevail. The people lacking a conrageous and fighting leadership will become the victims of defeatism and the communists will take over.

#### PEACE AT ANY PRICE

"Peace at any price" may well be the case history of the present English policy toward the Soviet Union. English policy seeks to avoid war by placating the Reds, by greatly enlarging its trade with the communist world, by its full recognition of Red China and demanding her inclusion into the United Nations. English policy today bolsters up the position of the Communist world in international affairs and weakens the united front of the free nations pledged to protect Western civilization from communism. The

English policy of appeasement of communism got its initial emphasis from the extreme pro-Soviet Left Wing of the Labor Party headed by Anuerin Bevan. It, then--in a modified form--became the policy of the powerful British Labor Party and the British Trade Unions, It succeeded in infecting the government of Winston Churchill. Winston Churchill who rose to fame and grandeur as a statesman because he opposed the appearement policies of Neville Chamberlain toward Adolph Hitler, now assumes an almost identical role toward totalitarian Russia. In evaluating Winston Churchill's desire to appease the communist world, let us not forget the statement signed by Hitler which Neville Chamberlain made public to the English people when he returned from Munich. In that statement Hitler declared he had no designs on the British Empire. With that statement Chamberlain fulled the British people into a false sense of security when along with it, he made the pronouncement, "WE SHALL NOT HAVE ANY MORE WARS IN OUR LIFETIME."

Churchill seems to forget that the security that Hitler promised Chamberlain was not worth the paper it was written on and before the ink was dried England was plunged into the agonics of the Second World War. It seems we, too, are prone to forget the lesson of history—that there can be NO COMPROMISE WITH EVIL., WITHOUT SUCCUMBING TO EVIL ITSELF AT THE EXPENSE OF LIBERTY AND HUMAN FREEDOM.

Thus England, in placing her faith in the policies of appeasement and compromise, concludes that trade with the enemy is more important than national honor, peace at any price with the communists preferable to the defense of liberty. And what is true of England in this respect is much more true of France and the Scandinavian countries. The appeasement of communism has in all the other countries of Western Europe, considerable support. It may not be surprising, if this appeasement is pursued energetically and to its logical conclusion, that the freedom loving people of France and perhaps England too, will prefer to let the communists take over rather than risk another conflict.

#### APPEASEMENT OR VICTORY?

The United States is today recognized as the leading world power, the greatest and strongest nation in the world. At best, its ties with its allies are extremely weak. It has often been deserted by them on important international issues in the United Nations. Western unity is, therefore, in a precarious condition. The ties which hold the anti-communist nations together may break at any moment. The lack of stamina and moral courage in the face of the

communist enemy which has set in, in England, France and other countries also, finds support in influential circles in the United States and may yet become the official position of our country. This state of mental and moral exhaustion threatens America, the growth and strongest nation in the world, at a time when the United Heserted by its allies in the United Nations, stands abjectly hat in hand, at Panmunjon and humbly begs the Red assassins for an armistice and the return of the handful of un prisoners—the few left from the thousands the Chinese turdered in cold blood.

in Korea, on the other hand, is concentrated an army and navy and air force, that in the opinion of the best military minds of the world, could if given the order, decisively defeat the communists, lustead, we forcibly retired our ablest general in the Far East, whose knowledge of that area is unsurpassed. By such forced retirement of General Douglas MacArthur we robbed the American people of victory. Who stayed his hand? You can't blame Senator McCarthy's methods on that score. Responsible for this was an incompetent and ill-advised President, and a Secretary of State, bent on appeasing communism, and our army generals, Marshall and Bradley, who could see no relation between the Russian and Chinese Reds and thought we could buy off the Chinese communists by selling the Chinese Nationalists down the river. The policy we pursued in China played right into the hands of Moscow. It was fashioned, as we now know, by advisors to the State Department who favored Moscow and the Chinese Reds. Instead of supporting our ally in the Far East, Chiang Kai-Shek, American policy tried to force him to unite with the communists. We did everything to undermine his prestige in China and his power to resist the encroachment of the Reds by creating in the minds of the American people the belief that the Chinese Reds were not communists but just ordinary agrarian reformers.

Congressional investigation committees have now proven to the American people, especially through the investigation by the Senate Internal Security Committee of the American Institute of Pacific Affairs, that our diplomatic defeat in China was due to a large extent to a well defined conspiracy operating in our government, the members of which had successfully infiltrated strategic policymaking posts of the government through which they molded American policy for the Far East.

These are the facts underlying the American rout in the Far East. It is tied in with the conduct on the part of our officials handling foreign affairs for the past twenty years which can best be characterized as impotence, cowardice, treachery and incompetence. Should such conduct on the part of our responsible government

dicials, who have charge of foreign affairs, continue, it will threaten he security of America far more than the knowledge that the omnunists too, have the atom and the hydrogen bombs. The tritude of appeasement and defeatism which prevails in Europe as no place in the United States. It is perfectly understandable who me of our allies in the United Nations and the communists would ke us to make the methods which flow from such conduct official nd to substitute the appeasement methods which were "Made in urope" for the uncompromising, no surrender methods of Senator oe McCarthy, which are "Made in America."

Why deceive ourselves? Today, we stand alone. Our allies in the United Nations feel no compunction when they desert us on ajor issues. Tomorrow they may abandon us entirely. England is ady to accept Red China into the family of nations with rights that to our own. She is preparing the grounds for such action in the United States and hopes that she may force us to agree to it, if ow can we depend upon England when she sells Red China rategic materials she lacks in the building up of her war potential. If the House of Commons the leader of the Labor Party, Clement thee, (the collapse of whose labor regime was prevented by merican aid and loans in billions of dollars) has the audacity to sult our government and to deride our constitution. He repeats the charge manufactured by communist propaganda that our leaders and an "all out war" and accuses our President of being a mere gurehead—that Senator McCarthy is the actual ruler of America.

#### "YANKEES GO HOME!"

Paris, too, forgets that we sacrificed the lives of thousands of our boys to liberate France from the Nazis in order that Frenchmen ould regain sovereignty over the soil of their country. The Frenchmen torget, too quickly, that we poured out billions of dollars epresenting the fruits of American labor and industry in order to ave French economy and the French people from starving. How are Americans rewarded? The American visitor arriving in Paris by boat train is greeted by large signs on which are printed the logans manufactured by communists: "AMERICANS GO HOME! WE DON'T WANT YOU!"

Yes, let us go home. We have a job to do in America and it nust be done here first, if the civilization we believe in is to be aved. Let us apply the methods of Senator McCarthy in resolutely und courageously liquidating the forces of subversion operating vithin the confines of our country. Let us confront our communist nemy from without, with a people united in their determination o crush the enemy. Only by our united moral consciousness in

defense of our freedom and never by compromising with evil can we stay the raised mailed fist of communism.

If we keep America strong and require of every American his undivided loyalty and devotion we can save America and ultimately the world.

In conclusion, and to summatize my convictions, I would like to quote a prize winning slogan of mine on Foreign Affairs which was inserted last year in the Congressional Record. It goes as follows:

"Help those who are willing to defend freedom, but keep the home fires burning, lest they be extinguished, and the whole world left in darkness."

The momentous struggle between our civilization and communism is on. The problem for us reduces itself to the proposition, either we keep on our historic path to the achievement and maintenance of peace through strength and fortitude or we allow ourselves to degenerate economically, socially, morally and spiritually so that we cannot resist the rapid advances of communism by following a trend which has already set in, in many parts of the world and which leads to utter ruin, the loss of freedom and the debasement of mankind.

The choice lies with the United States, the one nation with the resources and the power to resist, with each and every one of us who make up the American people. Either we follow appeasement, the road to defeat—the course upon which most of Europe seems destined to embark—or we adopt the American methods of the Paul Revere of the Twentieth Century, Senator Joseph McCarthy.

Over vast areas of the globe, today, man is living in a jungle world. In the struggle for survival, man's finer instincts have been destroyed, and he has been reduced to the law of the beasts of the jungle. For two generations we have been at the mercy of tyrants and dictators . . . the Nazi Hitler, the Communist Stalin and now Malenkov with his aides, the rulers of the Communist Satellite countries and Mau Tze-Tung of Red China. They have imposed and continue to impose their savage wills upon the world by war, terror, mass slaughter, totture, slavery and inhuman cruelty never before paralleled in history.

## THE WORLD LOOKS TO AMERICA — THE DECISION IS OURS

Because our statesmen, those responsible for guiding our country in these perilous times, failed to recognize and understand the evil of totalitarianism and communism in the past and particularly during World War II, we are forced today—in order to save ourselves from destruction—to spend billions of dollars for new

instruments of war which are capable of destroying civilization. If we had dealt with communism resolutely in the past when it was weak, and in addition had spent a fraction of the enormous expenditures required now to maintain our security, in promoting goodwill and a better understanding among the peoples of the world, we would not now be suspended over a powder keg needing just a spark to send us all to mass destruction.

If our Fellow Travelers and Communist sympathizers do not like the American way of life, let them go to the Russian jungle of tyranny, hate and cruelty, where all this started, rather than plot to bring the jungle to America. If they do, they will soon wish to return to our own land of liberty, to defend it instead of plotting its destruction.

Decisive in the present historical moment for America and for the entire world is what America will or will not do. The hour of decision is ours. Upon the decision which we make hangs the destiny of mankind. And the decision which the United States makes will depend upon the faith of the American people in American civilization and their undaunted will to stand guard over its great traditions and ideals. Our forefathers through sacrifices and toil fearlessly tackled the dangers and hardships of a wilderness to fashion a new civilization based upon human brotherhood and equality, in which man found ample reward for his labor, freedom to worship in the religion of his choice and a place to make a home for himself and his progeny under conditions of freedom undreamed of before. Thus did our forefathers blaze a new path for the world by opening up new horizons for man and raising the lofty ideals which influenced the cause of liberty all over the world. The ideals that made America great, which constitute the foundation stones of our Republic, are dynamic, living ideals of tremendous force in our crisis ridden world.

We must never forget that the United States is a bastion of freedom for the entire world, and that the communists from within and without are mobilizing for a concerted attack upon this bastion.

There is only one thing left that can save us if we have the faith and the will to make it come to pass. Let us come out of the Russian-made jungle and return to that way of life our forefathers once made the most powerful force in the world—a civilization that has often conquered evil in the past and has always led mankind toward the light—the light of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Let us return to the ideals that became the first foundation stone of that civilization and upon which our American Republic is founded. Let us require of all who enjoy the blessings of that Republic, an undying loyalty to it. Let us boldly proclaim this faith, defend it, and strike down all those who would undermine and destroy it. Only thus can we be worthy of it and keep it alive.

Matthews, an honorable American, a former Protestant c ergyman and missionary, and formerly a valued and competent s aff investigator of the Committee of which Senator McCarthy is c nairman, has been publicly attacked in the press and pulpit because 1 had the courage to say, in an article written for the "American t ercury" magazine, that the largest single group supporting the communists in the United States today, is composed of Protestant c ergymen. I am sure you are aware of the fact that Mr. Matthews as thereafter compelled to resign his position with the Committee 1 reason of these attacks.

The statement referred to above, was immediately seized upon 1. Communist sympathizers, fellow travelers, the liberal leftist 1 ess, left wing politicians and confused members of the Christian and Jewish clergy as justification for violent smear attacks, not only a jainst Mr. Matthews, but also against Senator McCarthy and his committee. It also served as the basis for strenuous criticism of the titre campaign which Senator McCarthy has been waging to expose the most sinister conspiracy in our history, to destroy from within, cur American democracy and way of life.

Some of this criticism was to be expected, considering its source, it what was not expected by those seeking to guard our freedoms, as the misleading telegram sent to the President of the United ates in the name of the National Conference of Christians and ws, by three prominent ministers of the Protestant, Catholic and wish faiths, protesting that Mr. Matthews, and by implication, nator McCarthy, who supported him, had indicted the loyalty of e entire Protestant faith and that such a charge was unjustified id deplorable.

This telegram, which brought the incident into nation wide publicity, forced the President to condemn Mr. Matthews' statement id resulted in the latter's resignation without a hearing, from the

Committee. It gave the Democratic members of the Committee an opportunity to make political capital out of the situation; and by their refusal to attend any more of the Committee's sessions, to destroy its prestige in the hopes of impairing its future usefulness.

This is mob rule and "job burning at its worst," for none of the critics of Mr. Matthews told the whole truth of the matter. They forgot to mention that in this article Mr. Matthews had also said that the "vast majority of American Protestant clergymen are loyal to their solemn trust as ministers of the gospel" or that the 7,000 ministers be did accuse represented approximately 3% of the 250,000 Protestant clergy in this country.

The so called liberal press, including the New York Times, treated the publicity attendant to the incident in the same unfair manner. For example, the July 15th issue of the New York Times devoted several columns of prominent space in the form of both editorials and news items, to the attacks upon Senator McCarthy, whereas the courageous statement of the Right Rev. James P. DeWolfe, Protestant Episcopal Bishop of Long Island, was given a fraction of space in an obscure corner. I need hardly have to point out to you that the remarks of Bishop DeWolfe suggested that he agreed with Mr. Matthews' estimated percentage of disloyalty among his own clergy and he called upon his church officials "to clean their house of such subversive clergymen."

The intrusion of the National Conference of Christians and Jews into this situation is still more incomprehensible in light of the fact that in 1947, Rabbi Benjamin Schultz, now Executive Director of the American Jewish League Against Communism, Inc., invited your organization to investigate Communist infiltration in all religious bodies, and was informed that such matters were none of its business and that it was not concerned with it.

If your organization is not concerned with political matters, why did it so dramatically intervene in this affair? It was more than a simple defense of one of your religious groups. To the millions of American Protestants, Catholics and Jews, whose sons are fighting and dying this day, who accept unquestioningly the pronouncements of their spiritual leaders, it became a verdict of truth, regardless of the fact that it was brought in without giving the accused his day in court and without a shred of evidence to support it. And to the Communists and their fellow travelers, its timing and the prominence of its authors made it a political bombshell, used not to discredit Mr. Matthews but to SMEAR AND DESTROY SENATOR McCARTHY and his Committee.

Whom are we fighting, the Communists or Senator McCarthy? Who deserve our loyalty, the traitors within our midst, or our representatives in Congress who are striving to ferret them out?

At this very hour our youth are dying in far countries to keep the Red Menace from our shores. Is it asking too much of the spiritual leaders of our youth to support and aid our Government authorities in their efforts to expose the enemy on the HOME FRONT, particularly an enemy that denies God and seeks to destroy all of our spiritual decencies?

If in the future our land is bathed in the blood and horror of an atomic war, it will not be the work of the enemy from without. History will record it as the work of those termites from within, who, posing as the upholders of American freedom, were in reality cating away its foundation until the whole noble structure became so weakened, that it came crashing down in ruins.

This letter sums up the feelings and reactions of one who has had the personal experience of accusing one of the most prominent and brilliant attorneys and authors in the Country, of being a Communist. This man was recognized in the labor movement as a leading legal light in the United States, who had the honor of practising before the United States Supreme Court and whose books on constitutional law are to be found in the Congressional library.

To accuse such a man whose reputation was of an outstanding, loyal American, required boldness on my part and faith in the facts as I knew them. It exposed me to smear attacks and many months of physical and mental anguish but in the end I pulled the mask from this "great American's" face and exposed him for what he was, one of the founders and fathers of the Communist movement in America and one who was plotting the overthrow of the very American institutions he was pretending to uphold.

The smears and misrepresentations and false accusations which I suffered are only a small fraction of the abuse that Senator McCarthy and his Committee are daily confronted with.

It is my sincere belief that if Senator McCarthy and his Committee are permitted to exercise their legislative duties in exposing and inquiring into every expressed disloyalty, no matter where it leads or whom it strikes, the Senator will one day receive the lasting gratitude of the American people for having saved our Country from the deplorable fate that has overtaken the strong and democratic Government of England and the once beautiful French Republic, where orderly democratic processes have been replaced by factional Socialist and Communistic groups, each striving to seize the dictatorial powers, thereby creating revolutionary trends and destroying the freedoms and liberties of their people. THIS MUST NOT HAPPEN IN AMERICA.

The Bureau is in receipt of a letter dated is rch 10, from an individual who signs his name as The letter contains no return address although it was portrarted in Jersey (in New Jersey, on March 10. There is no record of in Bureau files or in the New York City or Jersey City teleprone books. The letter, therefore, cannot be acknowledged.

In the letter, the writer states that while sitting in the "Chuck Full of Nuts Restaurant" on the corner of Fulter and Church Streets, New York City, approximately two months ago, he heard two unidentified individuals, both described as six feet tall, wearing plasses and "the scholarly type," discussing senator Joseph VcCarthy and the Director. Lemand advises that the discussion was as to the hest means of petting rid of the Director and Senator VcCarthy in order to make it appear accidental and that the method agreed on was to push that into the path of a moving train.

Although there is no way of identifying investigating the individuals who he drecribed, it is felt that this information should be brought to the attention of Senator VoCarthy. It is felt advisable, however, that such information he orally furnished to the Senator rather than by a letter to him in order to prevent any possible publicity.





Senator Benton has quoted from your letter as follows:

"This bureau did not send any such chart to the State Department, and, of course, made no evaluation of information as was indicated." I would like to ascertain whether this is a true and accurate quotation from your letter, whether the "chart" referred to in this quotation does in fact, as Sendor Benton asserted, refer to the "FPI chart" mentioned by Senator McCarthy on the floor of the Senate on June 6, 1950 which, Senator McCarthy states, was sent to the State Department sometime in 1941 or 1947 and which made evaluations of derogatory information and lighted individuals then exployed in the State Department whom the FPI considered to be Soviet agents, Communists, Communist sympathizers, and suspects — in short whether Senator Benton ucted the Director's statement incorrectly or in any sense out of context so as to misrepresent him.

Your alleged denial of this alleged "FII chart" has been made public, not only in the published hearings of the su committee and in a story on page one of the New York Times of September 29, 1951, but also in the widely circulated book, "cCarthy; The Man, The Senator and The "Ism", by Anderson and "ay. The matter is obviously of public concern. My purpose is solely to ascertain for certain, in this important matter, whether Senator Benton's statement has in any way misrepresented the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The captioned individual, who resides in Chicago, Illinois, forwarded a letter dated 3-1-54, to the Bureau requesting information in Bureau files. He was afforded an acknowledgment

3-5-54, in which he was informed of the confidential nature of our files and the reasons therefor. The Bureau is now in receipt of another letter from dated 3-9-54, in which he elaborates upon his original request and points out that he is merely seeking verification of a statement publicly attributed to the Director. He indicates the mutter is of public concern and his sole purpose is to ascertain whether a statement made by Senator Benton involving Senator McCarthy has in any way misrepresented the Director.

Bufiles reflect that on 6-7-50, the press reported that Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, on 6-6-50, released information which he indicated came from a 1946 document prepared by a State Department investigator who made reference to an FBI chart of agents, Communists, sympathizers and suspects in the State Department as of 5-15-46. In the document the State Department investigator was critical of the Bureau. At the Director's request he was advised the State Department investigator in question was Samuel Klaus and that the report of Klaus contained numerous erroneous statements. The Director agreed the matter should be protested and on 6-14-50, a letter was forwarded to Under Secretary of State James E. Webb which contained the following statement: "The comments made by Mr. Klaus in his report concerning this alleged 'FBI chart,' as they appeared in the newspapers, are completely erroneous. This Bureau did not send any such chart to the State Department, and, of course, made no evaluation of information as was indicated in the report." (121-23278-135,185%)





As you know, Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, on March 24, stated during a hearing of the Senate Appropriations Committee, where he enjoyed immunity, that I had wiolated the Espionage Act.

While I am convinced that this is not the case, and while I am quite proud of my record in protecting the national security, I would be delighted to have you submit all of Senator McCarthy's allegations to a grand jury. I would also like to suggest that simultaneously you submit certain allegations regarding Senator McCarthy to the same grand jury, to ascertain whether he has not been guilty of violation of the Espionage Act, the Corrupt Practices Act, and possibly other Acts.

Regarding Senator McCarthy's allegations against me, let me say that

It is a fact, as McCarthy states, however, that some production figures were discussed by with But, as McCarthy also admits, they were not published. I might say in passing that hardly a day passes that I do not discuss with certain public officials confidential matters which are not published. This probably occurs with every other responsible newspaperman in Washington, and obviously is no violation of the Espionage Act. I can assure you that whatever confidential information was given to was not "used for other purposes,"

McCarthy's statement that a second official named then working in the Justice Department, called me in to give me the facts in an espionage case mystifies improve completely. I think McCarthy is pipe-dreaming.

As you know, Roy Cohn, when working in the Justice Department under President Truman, did seek to prosecute me in connection with some of the allegations now

made by Senator McGreeny. Mr. Cohn's superiors rule against any prosecution, but I would be delighted if you would submit the entire matter to a grand jury. I trust, however, that you will be equally fair in submitting the following facts to a grand jury regarding Senator McCarthy.

Specifically, here is a record of Senator McCarthy's activities which, if engaged in by an ordinary citizen, would, I am sure, have led to a grand jury investigation long ago:

- 1. The Army publicly stated, Sept. 11, 1953, that McCarthy violated the Espionage Act when he published a 75-page restricted Army intelligence report on Siberia. On the outside, the document was clearly stamped: "This document contains information affecting the national defense of the United States within the meaning of the Espionage laws, Title 18, U.S.C., Secs. 793 and 794. The transmission or revelation of its contents in any manner to an unauthorized person is prohibited by law."
- 2. Senator McCarthy also violated the Espionage Act in a speech Jan. 22, 1951, in which he made public "Document No. 3019, dated Dec. 15, 1950," this being a military report cabled from Korea. Revelation of the date of a coded message makes it possible for a foreign power to break the code.
- 3. McCarthy collected \$10,000 from Congressman and Mrs. Alvin Bentley for the express purpose of fighting communism. According to an official Senate report he used the money not to fight communism but to speculate on the soybean market.
- 4. During four years as a senator, McCarthy deposited \$172,623 in the Riggs
  Bank a lot of money for a senator with a salary of \$12,500. The Senate report
  which details his finances states that \$19,000 was deposited in cash from unidentified
  sources; \$40,562 in checks from unidentified sources. If these were campaign
  contributions, McCarthy is required by law to report them. Did he do so? If not,
  did he report them under his income tax?
- 5. McCarthy has also "borrowed" the bank account of his assistant, though a kickback law prohibits a senator from accepting financial contributions from an employee.

You have already whitewashed several other serious charges detailed by a Senate committee regarding McCarthy: namely, his acceptance of a \$10,000 check from the Lustron Corporation exactly one week to the day after the Senate investigating committee launched an investigation of Lustron; also, a \$20,000 note endorsed by a Pepsi-Cola lobbyist exactly one month after McCarthy introduced a bill to abolish sugar rationing at a time when Pepsi-Cola wanted more sugar.

I earnestly suggest that you submit the above to a grand jury along with the allegations Senator McCarthy has brought against me.



RE STATEMENT BY SENATOR MCCARTHY ON APRIL 6, 1954, THAT HYLROGEN BOLB DEVELOPMENT HAI BLEN DELAYED EIGHTLEN MONTHS

Reference is made to television appearances on CBS of Senator Joseph McCarthy on the evening of April 6, 1954, during which time the Senator answered certain charges made against him by CBS commentetor, Edward R. Murrow. At one point in the broadcast, Senator McCarthy stated that the development of the hydrogen bomb had been delayed for eighteen months and implied that this was the result of Communists in the Government.

You will recall that by letter of December 23, 1953, from the Atomic Energy Commission to Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, the ALC made certain charges against Oppenheimer upon which they based the ratification of his clearance. These charges are the bases for an AEC hearing which begins on April 12. The last charge in the AEC letter was that Oppenheimer in 1945, expressed the hydrogen bomb was not feasible. The letter further charged that in the Autumn of 1949, and subsequently, Oppenheimer strongly opposed the development of the hydrogen bomb, and that even after it was decided to proceed with the development, Oppenheimer continuedly opposed the broject and declined to cooperate fully in it and that he was instrumental in persuading outstanding scientists not to work on the hydrogen bomb project. As result of these actions, the AEC charge "definitely slowed down its development."

There is, of cource, the possibility that Senstor McCarthy is aware of the AEC charge against Oppenheimer in this regard. is interesting to note that members of Congress and other high Covernment officials have publicly denied the statement made by Senator. This is for your information. ACTION:





Is McCarthy A Communist?

If we were to this week attack a public official of any Valley community as being a Communist we rather imagine we would have to produce some strong sound evidence on which to base our charges.

Let us suppose we condemn the head of a certain community and charge him as being a member of the Communist party. As we said we'd have to come forth quite rapidly with

some proof or else.

Today, we have a member of the United States Senate attacking persons, people, churches, schools, government branches, etc. as being Communistic and following the headlines gained that day, we seldom hear or see any action taken on the charges.

Perfectly innocent people are disgraced in their own homes, their neighborhoods, their places of business and their churches by the rash charges being made by this public figure at the displeasure of our own President, Dwight D. Eisenhower.

As a Republican, McCarthy enjoys some sort of freedom from being silenced, which we feel would be different if McCarthy's political followings were along the line of the Democratic Party!

If he hasn't charged an individual or organization as having Red leanings and someone else beats him to the punch then he comes forth with the story that his files were not complete on the case or he knew some other agency was working on the case—but always Senator Joe knows about the particular incident.

Would it be possible that McCarthy himself is a dues paying member of the Communist Party? Could it not be that he is a top flight leader of the Party working to place distrust in the minds of every American citizen before the enemy strikes a fatal blow?

Certainly if the Communists have such a strong hold on our country as this radical charges then we must have members of the Senate and the House of Representatives who are or who were in the Commies' circle of Communism.

office, advised that the Communist Party would conduct a command attroxing the personal reputations of Senator Joseph Scoterthy and FBI Director John Edgar hoover and that articles would be published in furtherance of this attack. You requested a memorandum concerning Greenfield.

Elvedor Greenfield was born on June 27, 1890, in Cleveland, Thio. he has been a member of the Communist Farty since 1931 and has held positions in the Communist Party in Idaho, California, and Ohio. In 1952 he was a write-in candidate for Jovernor on the Communist Farty ticket in Ohio. For the mast several years he has served as Tuilic Relations Director of the Ohio Communist Party.

In December, 1952, the Cleveland Office suggested that Granfield be considered for prosecutive action under the Brith Act. A prosecutive summary report was submitted and was referred to the Department for consideration. The Department subsequently authorized prosecution against Greenfield and seven additional Communist Party leaders of the State of Thio and on October 6, 1953, these individuals, including Greenfield, were arrested by Bureau agents. Greenfield was held under \$15,000 bond which was subsequent reduced to \$5,000, he was released under \$5,000 bond on November 22, 1953, and is presently swaiting trial. As yet no date has been set for the Cleveland trial although pre-liminary motions have been filed by defense counsel.







TELLO WISCONSIN! For four years this country has been suffering from a high fever brought on by the charges of headline-hunting congressional investigators who claimed that our government has been infiltrated by apies, subversives and persons who do not measure up on loyalty tests. Despite all the hullabaloo that has been engendered by publicity and vote-seeking political demagogues, the fact remains that a good job has been done in protecting the national security against the penetration of any spies or agents. The hysteria was started four years ago when the Senator from Wisconsin made a statement in a Wheeling speech that there were 205 known Communists in the State Department. During the past two years the McCarthy committee has spent \$400,000 in looking for Communists in government. In all the hysteria brought on by the ballyhoo of mccarthyism, the fact remains that the McCarthy committee has not brought about

the exposure and the conviction of a single spy or subversive in government. One of the reasons for this is the long list of laws that have been set up to surround with the utmost secrecy all plans, information and data that would be useful to the enemy and whose leaking to unauthorized sources would endanger the national security. Among these is a law providing for a fine of \$10,000 or a term of 10 years in prison for any person who would steal or transmit to others top secret data that has been classified as material whose secrecy is essential to our national security. Despite this, the nation last week witnessed the spectacle of a member of the United States Senate seeking to give publicity, before a nation wide television audience, to a document that had been stolen from government files. When the Senator was asked how he came into possession of this data, he declined to give the name of the person from whom it was received because he had received it in confidence. What do you suppose the average prosecuting attorney would do to the operator of a fence, charged with receiving stolen goods, and who pleaded that he could not reveal the source of the stolen goods because it would violate a confidence?

Now the thing that amazes me is that, up to the time this was dictated, I have seen nothing to indicate that an all-out manhunt is to be made to find the person who stole the data classified as top secret and coming within national security rules. Can't you picture the contempation that would have arisen over the country if a Communist had stolen document of this kind? After all, the law providing for a \$10 boo time and years in prison doesn't apply only to Communists,—it applies to anyone gallty of stealing top secret, classified material. Where is the FBI? In the business of building up this man J. Edgar, Hoover to a legendary superman sta-

tus. we have heard the radio commentators and the boot-licking journalists tell us that the FBI "always gets its man." Is Mr. Hoover now making any effort to run down the thief who stole this data? Of Is he how in a quandary because his good friend, Sen. McCarthy, whom he publicly praised not so many months ago, is now in possession of this top secret material which was stolen from government files? Pres. Eisenhower said that the stealing of this document was reprehensible, although he was careful not to say that it was reprehensible on McCarthy's part to attempt to make public use of this material. Why shouldn't McCarthy he put under oath and made to tell who gave from the document. Why shouldn't Mr. Ifloover, the head of the department which has now been ballyhooed for decades as the eagle eye which gets its man, now be asked to live up to its press notices and the carefully nurtured myth that Hoover is a superman and a supercop?

On August 11, 1951, a mysterious wittness was hustled behind closed doors of the Senate Internal Security Committee. His name was Albert Levitt. He was a confemed ex-Communist, who had come so squesi on his past ano-

"Doc" was chief investigator fdr the group and his first bag headline came when Chairman Dies startled the press of the country with the sensational story that the Un-American Activities Committee offices were burglarized and files on secret activities were filched.

The story of the burglary is not exactly as Martin Dies told the quickly assembled reporters, although Dies really believed it to be true at the time. The real scoop on the sensational "robbery" is

"Doc" Matthews was in the habit of throwing "hot parties" in the staff office late at night. On this occasion, somebody went wild and smashed a window with an empty whiskey bottle. "Doc" and Bob Stripling, secretary of the committee, quickly sobered up and had to figure a way "out" and fast "Doc" hit on the bright idea of blaming the Communists; so, Bob and "Doc" jerked open the file cases and scattered the contents over the floor. ### McCARTHY VS. TYDINGS

I sat across the desk from former United States Senator Millard Tydings of Maryland. On the walls of his effice are pictures taken during the first World War. Tydings entered the army as a private and rose to the rank of Lt. Colonel. Among his awards are the Distinguished Service Cross and the Distinguished Service Medal gained for brayery in action. He served in the Maryland legislature. He was in the U. S. Senate for 24 years and spent 35 years in the service of his govern-

sub-committee assigned in March 1950 to investigate Joe McCarthy's charges of Communists in the State Department. After extensive hearings and the inability of Mc-Carthy to come up with a single name or actual act of subversion in the department, the committee rendered its report. It lambasted McCarthy's charges as a "fraud and a hoax." It accused Joe of "hit and run" tactics, of a "cavalier disregard for facts," of "twisting, coloring, perverting, and distorting" the truth.

Joe McCarthy was fighting mad. He spent hours and days figuring ways of getting revenge on the chairman of the committee, Millard Tydings Tydings was up for re-election. McCarthy enlisted the aid of his good friend, Mrs. Ruth McCormick Miller, editor of the Washington Times Herald and niece of the extreme right-wing publisher of the Chicago Tribune, Colonel Robert McCormick.

McCarthy's office supplied the written material and the Times-Hereld supplied 500,000 copies of the now-famous fake photograph showing ex-Communist Chief Earl Browder and Senator Tydings in friendly conversation. To accomplish this photographic magic, the Times-Herald art department took an old picture of Browder and another of Tydings, placed them together and re-photographed the composite. The result was a false photograph of the men supposedly engaged in carnest conversation.

This picture was sent all over the state of Maryland with particular concentration in voting areas which might have been on

They later married, although "Tank" had been happily married and a father of three children before taking to himself another bride. This marriage made "Tank" the multi-millionaire who now entertains Joe McCarthy and the horsev set at his swank estate, where Joe disports himself in the swimming pool by forcing hapless females under water.

After McCarthy's victory in his campaign for the Senate. Joe burst into the hotel room where the voting returns were being tabulated. 





You will recall that you expressed approval of this policy during the hearing of the Senate Appropriations Committee this year when the Attorney General appeared before that Committee. Because of this establish and, we believe, wise policy, the Department regrets that it is no able to furnish the detailed information from the FBI investigarive reports concerning which you have requested.

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



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Is Senator McCarthy really a secret Communist?

The newspapers of the country are not playing fair with the American people. There is a great deal of information which many papers possess and which is not being printed so that the people might better be in a position to realize what is taking place in the country today.

I have just returned from the capital of the United States. Conditions in Weshington, D.C. indicate a definite and hurried trend toward totalitarian principles. The city is blanketed by fear. People speak in soft tones. They peer over their shoulders before expressing an opinion and government officials both high and low nervously look around the room before giving expression to their thoughts for fear the room is bugged.

It is a mood of hysteris which now has the nation's capital in its grasp. The newspapers, with few exceptions, are weefully derelict in their plain duty to inform the citizens. The press is cowed. It, too, lives in fear.

The pall on freedom which has descended on the country can be traced to one man. The person who has done more to weaken the country's security against internal subversion by intimidation, blackmail and smears is the junior sensior from the state of Wisconsin, Joseph McCarthy.

What is the strange hold which McCarthy has on government officials? Why does the newspaper industry, almost to a man, fear him? Why does the Callup poll show him to be steadily rising in popularity? Who is McCarthy?

Senator McCarthy is really a secret Communist!

From out of his past, the whisper has rised like a ghost to haunt him. When I first heard it in Washington, I thought it too incredible to be true. I knew he was a sadist and a pervert and if I had only stopped to think, the answer should have been, and why not a Communist?

WeCarthy has been operating through a defense mechanism caused by a guilt complex. When McCarthy started on his first large publicity campaign, he uttered a charge that the State Department was honeycombed with homosexuals. According to the senator from Wisconsin, perverts were security risks because of their susceptibility to blackwail through fear of exposure.

I always thought that Volumby "protestath too much" and a search of his past disclosed that he, too, was a homosaxual. His tectics became clear. By leading a supposed fight against perverts in government, he could avert suspicion from himself. For anyone to say that McCarthy is a sex deviate, would bring an instant retort: "ridiculous, he is the foremest fighter against pervente."

And yet, the plain unvarmished truth is that McCarthy, by his own admission is

a security risk on the grounds of homosexuality.

His next big compaign was against Reds in Covernment. Another phase of a defense mechanism operating through a guilt complex. And yet, the hottest rumor in Washington is that McCarthy was a Red and for all we know, might still be a secret Communist. In get the story, the hottest story in the country and here it is:

On August 11, 1951, a mysterious witness was hustled behind closed doors of the Senate Internal Security Committee. His name was Albert Levitt. He was a confessed ex-Communist who had come to equal on his past associates. He talked all right, but he said such more than Chairman Fat McCarran had bargained for.

Albert Levitt, the ex-Communist, testified that he had seem Joe McCarthy at Communist meetings — the same Joe McCarthy who is now pretending to lead the fight against Communism. Levitt's testimony was never made public. The secret transcript has been mysteriously removed from the committees' files. Levitt himself has disappeared.

The records show that the Committee sat during the week when this testimony was brought out. All records of the committee were preserved except the transcript for

the day when Levitt made the charges.

It is not too difficult to imagine what happened to this amazing testimony since Pat McCarran and Joe McCarthy are button-hole buddles. But the important question is not so such who hushed up the story, but is it true? Was Albert Levitt telling the truth under oath?

To find the answer, I have searched McCarthy's past. It is no secret that McCarthy as a youth was a radical left-winger. For the record, he was a New Deal Democrat. He was in theree of ticket sales for President Mosevelt's Pirthdev Ball in Waynes, Wis-

consin on Jamuary 30, 19 Seven months later, he was elected president of the Young Democratic Clubs of Wisconsin's Seventh District. He also ran as the Democratic candidate for Shawano County prosecutor.

Behind this Democratic front, however, young McCarthy had the reputation of a pinko. He was quick to take the sturp and deliver bitter speeches about the "Hoover depression." He hung around with the radical element in Wanpaca. When he accepted a job in the law office of a staumen Republican in nearly Shawano, the Wanpaca County Post wrote jokingly on February 20, 1936: "Just to add a dash of sest in the life of Mike Eberlien's new hired man (McCarthy), we carefully padded his brief case with a couple of copies of the New Masses, a recent edition of the Daily Worker and a west-pecket sized Das Kapital."

This was a teasing reference to the fact that VcCarthy's new boss didn't realize he had hired the neighboring town's leading pinko. Of course, McCarthy was able to change his political spots overnight to adjust his policies to suit his purpose. In time, he ran the gamut from the far left to the far right. He has given voice to every philosophy under the political sun. But what ere his true beliefs? Where does his allegiance lie?

Newspapers are charged with the duty of guarding the liberties and freedow of America. The United States is the haven of the free world. If a threat to our liberties is not challenged by the newspapers of the country, we, too, will join the inevitable march towards a totalitarian state. It destroyed Germany, it will prove the eventual downfall of Russia and, if the present trend continues in this country, it is conceivable that we too may be in line to go the way of all dictatorships.

If other newspapers will remain silend because of fear of advertising and circulation boycotts, which has been McDarthy's methods of silencing opposition, this newspaper will do its duty in the interests of freedom. Ours may be the only voice shouting in the wilderness.

I cannot expect some stupid, gullible people to believe me because there are none so blind as those who will not see. But I hope, that among the rest, if only a slight spark of understanding is kindled, the truth might neurish and grow until the flame becomes a conflagration which will consume this evil influence that has descended over our land and has caused a blight on the thinking, liberty and freedom of the people.

This series will continue daily until all the evidence I have gathered against McCarthy is brought out. His sadism, perversion and traitorous conduct will see the light of day.

I do not intend to be smart, facetious or crude because human weaknesses should not be exploited. Beneath this seemingly pleasant and official interchange of communications, there is an undercurrent of gross immortality which seems to typiny the people with whom Senator McCarthy has surrounded himself.

Surine was warried and the father of 3 children:

During the next few months while I was out on bail, I saw Duris neveral times. She referred frequently to the fact that she had nothing to worry about because Surine would take care that nothing happened to her.

"I also learned from Doris that Surine was visiting with her almost every day, that he slept with her occasionally at the Abbey Hotel where he had put her up. I was present on a number of occasions when Doris called Surine and when Surine called Doris to make arrangements for a date later. Surine frequently picked up Doris

at Burke's restaurant where she drank heavily.

"Maturally, I was sore having Surlne, the same FEI man who had arrested me, going around with my girl friend and sleeping with her while I was waiting trial. So I made a complaining call to the FEI. I understand that Surine was dismissed from the FEI as a result of the subsequent investigation into his relationship with Boris. Incidentally, I pleaded guilty, and Boris never testified against me. We are still good friends.

I also have in my posse, on an affidavit from the woman . the case, Doris Jo Perry. She substantially confirms the sything stated by Weber except hat her affidavit contains many more details, all tending to show the immorality of the man who today has terrorised every witness to be brought before the McCarthy committee. Fear of Don Surine is only secondary to that of McCarthy.

Surine expects every witness to enswer questions truthfully before senate committees

though he himself committed perjury on more than one occasion.

Ed Babcock, snother one of McCarthy's administrative assistants, was picked up by Washington police in 1950 and charged with the offense of solicitation for a lewd and immoral purpose, which is the District of Columbia charge for soliciting another man to engage in unnatural sexulacts. Babcock pleaded guilty and paid a heavy fine while the press tried to hush the story.

Charlie Davis, another operative of VcCarthy, was dishonorably discharged from the United States Navy for confessed homosexuality. He admits he belonged to the Communist party organization in Southern California right after World War II. Records show Davis

is of extremely low moral character and would do anything for money.

Roy Cohn and G. David Schine, the attorney and investigator, respectively, for the McCarthy committee, are in a class by themselves. Their puerile behaviorism is in complete character with the type of investigations which McCarthy pursues; neither consistent,

constructive, informative, intelligent or investigative for that matter.

The favorite story in Mashington today is about EXELE Cohn and Schine following McCarthy down the corridors of the senate building after a committee meeting. Joe happened to lapse into his normal gait which is a little to the left of manly and Schine, observing the effectinate crawl, poked Cohn in the ribs and in real be-boy language tittered: "dig that crary convertible."

Parnell Thomas, a member of the committee who had red-beiting embitions of his own. Later Thomas became Chairman of the Committee and really did a job on the Beis until he was retirned from the Committee, and by Congress because of a minor transgression like padding payrolls. Thomas exchanged his Congressional immunity for pris-

on stripes.

The best description of "Doc" Matthews comes from no less an authority than the "old describer" bimself, Westbrook Pegler who, in one of his better columns referred to Matthews as a "fellow-traveler" and "self-confessed female impersonator." Of course, Pegler and Matthews have since made up and are both now playing on the same team.

Is Senator VcCarthy a secret Communist?

I set across the desk from former United States Senator Millard Tydings of Maryland. On the walls of his office are pictures taken during the first World War. Tydings entered the army as a private and rose to the rank of Lt. Colonal. Among his awards are the distinguished Service Cross and Distinguished Service Medal gained for bravery in action. He served in the Maryland legislature. He was in the U. 3. Senate for 24 years and spent 35 years in the service of his government.

Tydings was chairman of the Armed Service Committee in the Senate for many years. Se authored the Phillippines Independence bill and the bill to construct the atomic subsecrime also beers his name. Time Magazine, in 1950, named him among the ten outstanding

senators in the United States.

Tydings was chairman of the sub-committee assigned in March 1950 to investigate Joe McCarthy's charges of communists in the State Department. After extensive hearings and the inability of McCarthy to come up with a single name or actual act of subversion in the department, the committee rendered its report. It lambased McCarthy's charges as a "fraud and a hoax." It accused Joe of "hit and run" tactics, of a "cavalier disregard for facts" of "twisting, coloring, perverting and distorting" the truth.

Joe McCarthy was fighting mad. He spent hours and days figuring ways of getting revenge on the chairmen of the committee, Millerd Tydings. Tydings was up for re-election. McCarthy enlisted the sid of his good friend, Mrs. Ruth McCormick Miller, editor of the Tashington Times Herald and niece of the extreme right-wing publisher of the Chicago

Tribune, Colonel Robert McCorwick

PoCarthy's office supplied the written material and the Times-Herald supplied 500,000 copies of the now-famous fake photograph showing ex-Communist Chief Earl Browder and Senator Tydings in a friendly conversation. To accomplish this photographic magic, the Times-Herald art department took an old picture of Browder and another of Tydings, placed them together and photographed the composite. The result was a false photograph of the men supposedly engaged in earnest conversation.

This ploture was sent all ofer the state of Paryland with particular concentration

in voting areas which might have been on the doubtful list for Tydings.

Many things happened during this campaign. A Baltimore printer, William Fedder, was kidnepped and held for six hours in the back seat of a moving automobile while Don Suring, Rwell Moore and George Miles, all of Sen. McCarthy's staff, tried to force the printer to turn over to them a letter written to him by John Butler, the Republican senatorial candidate makes and opposent of Tydings, said letter being sufficient evidence to send Butler to jail for violating the Maryland Corrupt Practices Law.

Suring bragged to Fedder that, if he did not get the letter, he would put the printer through a FoCarthy investigation and fix him good. Suring further stated he

Is FoCarthy a secret Communist?

While in Washington recently, I heard former Governor Harold Stassen, present head of the Wutual Security Agency, interviewed by the press upon his return from South America. Stassen was brisk and straightforward in his answers to all economic questions. When a

reporter asked him to comment on charges of disloyalty in hil department made by Senator Jos McCarthy, Governor Stassen became muts. He made no attempt to defend his employees though he knew the charges were false and infamous. The mere mention of McCarthy's name brought an immediate reaction. He shadow-boxed, side-stepped, hedged and evaded. The brisk, direct answers had ceased. The Governor was a man in fear.

I had always been an admirer of Harold Stassen. What I saw and heard nauseated me.

Why do grown men have to live in fear?

Extreme right-wing thinking and left-wing philosophies require the same mental processes. There is no difference between the Communists on the left and the Fascists wax of the right. The both exist through the enslavement of man's mind. They can only thrive through fear.

Hitler and Stalin rose to power through identical methods. Attack, attack, Create fear - promote confusion, keep the world off balance. Attack, attack, never defend,

never look back, attack, attack.

The VcCarthy apoligists who say they "disagree with his methods but his intentions are noble," are either stupid, gullible people, or people with a motive; a base, traitorous motive to destroy democracy.

How can a man's intentions be notle when he, himself, is a cheat, a liar and a thief. VcCarthy has never had a sincere thought or motive during his entire public career. His

whole life is a fraud.

Sven his service in the Marine Corps during the war was a fraud on the wonderful organization of men who appear spearheaded the attacks in the Pacific campaigns.

How many Marines were able to bamboorle a commission before they consented to serve in the Corps? McCarthy did. And he waited until logg after the war was on, August 1942, to be exact. How many Marines had safe deak jobs during the war? McCarthy kept his feet firmly planted on a deak in somes which had been made safe by the Marines months before. How many Marines were permitted to spend half the war gears bank home campaigning for public office while in uniform? McCarthy did.

How many Varines were permitted to resign from the Corps when the going got rough? McCarthy did. McCarthy had been applying for leaves to stay in Wisconsin to campaign for public office. The Marine Corps finally issued an ultimatum to Joe to fight or resign.

Joe left the service.

How many Marines had to wait 10 years before it could be determined if they were brave enough to marit a medal? McCarthy was decorated in 1952 in his senate office after browbeating the Marine Corps for ten years to give him a medal. The Corps needed his vote in the Senate at appropriations time and McCarthy got his medal. Nobody knows what the decoration was for unless it was for bravery in action when he slipped and broke a bone in his foot while emerging from a swimming pool during "shellback initiation" aboard the Nevy tender "Chandeleur" as the ship crossed the equator.

McCarthy was known in his outfit as "the only guy in the Farine Corps who could pro-

mote anything up to and including the Congressional Medal of Honor."

He's been a promey all his life and he'll die one, and this is the "man" who is being grouped for President of the United States. VoCarthy, in a speech before a Manufacturer's Association of suburban Cicero on January 20 of this year, stated that under no circumstances would he be a candidate for president in 1956. He told reporters that Ike was his choice.

The build-up is starting, McCarthy strategy calls for his playing coy for a couple of years. McCarthy will keep insisting he is not a candidate even though no one asks him, in order to create a demand for his candidacy. He even thinks like a woman, playing hard to get.

Tell the public they can't have something and the demand becomes overshelming, whether it is sugar during times of war or the presidency of the United States.

The Texas oil millionaires have switched to McCarthy. He is just as anxious for right-

wing support today as he was for Communist aid in 1966.

In seeking the Communist vote in his campaign against Bob LaFollette, McCarthy stated: "Communists have the same right to vote as anyone else." His statement that: "Stalin's proposal for world disarrament is a great thing and he must be given credit for being sincere about it," would bring charges of treason against anyone else but McCarthy. These were

McCarthy's public sentiments in 1946, after the war was over and Russia had already started

its campaign of fear against the rest of the world.

Today, McCarthy brands as a Communist anyone who thought well of Russia as far back as 1932. Persons called before the "cCarthy Committee who innocently became a dupe of the Reds in early youth and have since recanted are still branded as traitors by the phony Red fighter, although he himself attended Communist cell meetings in Wisconsin in 1936 and had the reputation of the town's leading pinko. But to espouse the cause of the Communists as late as 1966 in his campaign for the United States Senate and still be called sincere by the stupic people who think his "intentions are noble," is almost too much for sensible people to endure.

It is easy for McCarthy to play both sides of the game from extreme left to extreme

right because both sides are the same.

The \$200,000 appropriation for the extension of the McCarthy Committee passed the Senate the other day with only one dissenting vote. Hitler had to set fire to the Reichstag before his power became absolute. It will not be necessary for McCarthy to follow this tactic because the fire of fear burns deep in the minds of the members of Congress. It is consuming all opposition.

If the extrame right-wing vlements are successful, it may not be necessary for Russia to yo to war. To may have a Communist in the White House even sconer than the Soviet time-

table envisioned.

If McCarthy is not a secret Communist with a mission to take over the country for the Soviet Union, then he is a lumatic. He shows absolutely no responsibility for what he says or does. He is not the menace. It's the people who fear him who are endangering the country.

One thing about the man, ha's smart enough to know when he can't win. He's a good enough lawyer to realize that truth is a defense in a libel action. McCarthy has had every opportunity to serve me with papers if I ever wrote an untruth about him. He knew I was in Washington and he knew where I was staying. I traveled the length and breadth of the senate office building wax many times and sat in the Senate gallery three days in a row!

For people to make before this mountebank is the shame of the nation. What he needs is a Napoleon hat and a Greatcoat so he can stick his hand into the lapel and play emperor.

These are the times which try men's souls. What a Daniel Rebster could do in the United States Senate today.

A century ago, Abraham Lincoln declared that a foreigh tyrant could never conquer this country, could not by force take a drink from the Ohio River. Our real danger, he warned, would come from the hands of a domestic tyrant, a demagogue who would rise in our own midst, an ambitious man who would burn and thirst for power. This tyrant would not come before the people, beating his breast and shouting his true purposes. He would come in dark disguise, a wolf in sheep's clothing, and would end up devouring the whole flock.

It doesn't take much experience in the political woods to recognize the trail of a tyrant. All who have tramped through history have left the same footprints. They have appealed to the passions and trampled down reason. They have preached blind patriotism, played on public fears, inflamed hatreds and prejudices. They have struck down their critics with charges of treason. And they have all worn the same disguise; they have posed as patriots.

Adolph Hitler passed himself off as the German savior; he taught the enemies of Hitler were the enemies of Germany. Benito Mussolini posed as an Italian patriot; he preached that the enemies of Fussolini were the enemies of Italy. Josef Stalin enshrined himself as a Russian hero; he claimed that the enemies of EXERCE Stalin were the enemies of Russia.

Today, Senator Joe McCarthy calls himself a Crusader for America; and he shouts that the enemies of McCarthy are the enemies of America.

Like the tyrants of the past, McCarthy waves the flag, hirs up our red blood, gives lip service to American idea. But behind this red-white-and plue smokescreen, he tramples roughshed over individual rights, kicks justice in the face and violates all the rules of fair play that are sacred to America. The methods of McCarthy — trial by accusation, guilt by association, character assassination — are no more American than Russia is a people's democracy.

It is high time we took Abraham Lincoln's advice and examined some of the footprints that are being stamped upon our society today. With this as my purpose, I offer another

installment in the sordid, shocking unAmerican record of Joseph Raymond McCarthy.

I proved in a previous article that McCarthy started his political career as a pinko, that his own past is as cluttered with Communist associations as the victims he denounces. Like a true demagogue, however, McCarthy was able to subordinate his own political philosophy and adopt any line that would get him ahead. He traveled the full political cycle from far left to far right, zigzagging as suited the circumstances. He hitched his political wagen to the fastest-rising star, riding up with the Democrate during the New Deal days, then switching to the GOP when the elephant started moving faster than the donkey in Wisconsin.

But through all this erratic political maneuvering, McCarthy followed a careful blueprint. He studied the masterwork of power politics, the readmap of tyranny — Adolf Hitler's "Nein Kampf." McCarthy's close political cropy of the 1930's, Jerry Jolin, has admitted

that McCarthy was a devoted student of "Mein Kampf."

How well did McCarthy learn the lesson of Wein Hampin? How close has he followed

Hitler's techniques? Here is the record:

1. Then Adolf Hitler was nothing but a loud noise in German politics, he began accusing the Social Democrats of the years of "Marxist misgovernment." He used the Communist smear freely to discredit those whose power he coveted, or who stood in his way. In his time, Hitler exposed and jailed more alleged Communists than anyone in history. McCarthy, too, has used the Communist club to attack the

opposition party and beat his enemies over the head. '

2. Hitler undermined the democratic structure by attacking the heroes of the German Republic. He poured out invective against prominent German statesmen, both military and civilian, who stood up for democracy. Some of Hitler's old speeches sound strikingly like McCarthy's attack on General George Marshall, the World War II hero and Nobel peace prize winner. McCarthy accused Marshall in participating "in a conspiracy so immense and ar inflamm so black as to dwarf any such previous venture in the history of man." In the same speech, McCarthy accused General Dwight Eisenhower of conspiring with Marshall to sell out the world to the Communists.

3. Hitler persecuted all religions that would not how to his will. Yet, he picusly proclaimed that the state had no intention of interfering with religious beliefs, but only wanted to weed out the "Marxist element" in the clergy. The investigation of the churches today is also disguised as an investigation of individual clergymen. Hitler was a renegade Catholic, he didn't hesitate to strike down Catholic priests who defied him, such as Father Joseph Rassaint, who had written anti-Communist articles but, nevertheless, was accused of collaborating with the Communists. Though McCarthy, too, is a Catholic, he has not hesitated to accuse his Catholic critics of following the Communist lines, such as Commonweal Magazine which is as bitterly anti-Communist as it is anti-McCarthy.

4. Hitler's favorite device was the Big Lie, since he claimed that people "are more easily victimized by a large than by a small lie." It would take a full volume to trace all the twists and turns of VcCarthy's untruths. He is the only member of the U. S. Senate who can be called a congenital liar without fear of libel. He once went so far as to document a lie by inserting into the Congressional Record

a forged FBI report on the loyalty of Edward Posniak.

5. Hitler was surrounded by strong-arm men, who intimidated his opponents. McCarthy never goes anywhere unless he is accompanied by a couple of musclemen. During the Maryland election campaign, McCarthy sent three of his strong-arm boys — Don Surine, Ewell Moore and George Niles — to take a frightened Paltimore printer on a midnight ride. They tried to browbeat the printer, William Fedder, to give them an incriminating political document.

6. Hitler rose to point by organizing German youth, that building an elite corps of fanatical followers. McCarthy also became a political power in Wisconsin by reorganizing the state's dormant Young Republican clubs. He put in his own men, homosexuals such as Ed Babcock and Steve VcMahon, to take over the leadership of the Young Republicans. Eventually, they rallied enough support to overthrow the Republican Old Gward and get the GOP senatorial nomination for McCarthy. Now McCarthy is quietly forming Freedom Clubs and McCarthy Clubs across the country in an attempt to band his functical followers together.

7. Hitler was financed by millionaires and industrialists, who visioned a return to unhampered, unlimited free enterprise. He was also supported by powerful conservatives who did not condons his methods but believed they could control him for their own ends. Today, FcCarthy is financed by Texas oil millionsires and midwestern industrialists. Certain conservatives, while deploring his methods, have used him as a technique for vote-getting. The early supporters of Hitler lived -

and died - to regret it.

8. Hitler, in his drive for power, weged a vigorous campaign for more authority for the Reichstag, because it was only through the Reichstag that his Nazi Party could wield power. Senator McCurthy also derives his power from the legislative branch and is fighting for the bricker amendment and other measures to increase Congress' authority. After Bitler seized complete control, of course, he trans-

formed the Reichstag into a rubber stamp.

9. German law seemed to have no control over Hitler. McCarthy, too, appears to be above the law. He was elected to the Senate in violation of the Wisconsin Constitution. The State Supreme Court expressed its indignation, but failed to take legal action against him.

McCarthy accepted \$10,000 from Lustron Corp. exactly one week after his Senate Investigating Committee began investigating Lustron. He arranged for a Pepsi-Cola lobbyist to endorse a \$20,000 note one month after leading the Senate fight to get more sugar for the soft-drink makers. There are federal laws against

such conduct.

McCarthy has cut corners on his income taxes since he was a circuit judge, but in each instance, he has been allowed to settle out of court. He repeatedly borrowed the bank account of his assistant, hay Kiermas, to speculate on the stock market, though the kickback law prohibits a Senator from taking money from his employees. McCarthy's complex financial manipulations have violated the Wisconsin banking laws. The Army publicly accused McCarthy of violating the Espionage Act by publicising classified material. Yet, in all these cases, the Justice Department shows no inclination to prosecute.

10. Ritler had the habit of rearranging history to suit his own fancy. McCerthy, too, has been caught revising the past to conform with his idea of what should have happened. One conspicuous example was his rewriting of the Senate hearing at which Voice of America official, Donald Creed testified. The questions and answers

were changed to suit McCarthy.

11. Of course, Hitler was notoriously anti-Semitic. McCarthy loudly denies that he is anti-Semitic, pointing to the fact that he has a Jew, Roy Cohm, on his staff. The fact is that Cohn is an opportunist who has discredited himself in the eyes of his own people. McCarthy will go on pretending that he is friendly to the Jows because he cannot afford to alienate them yet. However, McCarthy slipped into the Senate Recording room once at 3 A.M. to make a recording for the notorious anti-Semite, Upon Close. On another occasion, McCarthy arranged to have Upon Close's propaganda actually printed in the Congressional Record. McCerthy's chief lieutenant, Don Surine, conspired with another Anti-Semite, Gerald L. E. Smith, to smear Anna Rosenberg, the former Assistant Secretary of Defense. Surine even carried a letter of introduction from Smith. Other anti-Semites, such as Benjamin Freedman and the Rev. Weeley Swift, used McCarthy's office as headquarters for their undercover campaign against Mrs. Rosenberg. This was brought out during sworn testimony. It was also Joseph McCarthy who defended the Maxi storm troopers after they had

been found guilty of murdering American G. I.'s in cold blood at Malmedy.

McCarthy charged that American "vengeance teams", made up of Jews, had tortured the Nazi SS men into confessing.

Meanwhile, McCarthy is being praised to the skies in Germany by Dr. Werner Naumann, who was nominated in Hitler's will to succeed Goebbels as propaganda minister and who was arrested only recently by the British for heading a Nazi conspiracy to everthrow the Nast German government.

There are many who will say that I have not proven McCarthy is a secret Communist but only that he is a Fascist. Is there a difference?

The record is clear. Those who are The McCarthy must fight Communism, Fascism and McCarthylam.

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
