On July 5, 1972, the United States Secret Service, Washington, D. C., furnished the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) with a letter written to [redacted] and Governor GEORGE C. WALLACE at the Governor's Mansion, Montgomery, Alabama. This letter was signed, [redacted] and contained an address which indicated [redacted] was confined at the Maryland State Penitentiary, Baltimore, Maryland. This letter contained numerous newspaper articles with notes over some of the parts of the articles indicating displeasure or hate towards persons described in the articles, and further contained a two-page letter which gave allegiance to Governor WALLACE's political opinions and theories, and continued to be hostile and threatening in nature to numerous political leaders, who are set forth as victims above.

The following investigation was conducted at Baltimore, Maryland, on July 17, 1972:

[redacted] Maryland State Penitentiary (MSP), 954 Forest Street, Baltimore, Maryland, furnished the following information concerning [redacted]
[redacted]:

[redacted] advised that he is very familiar with [redacted] since [redacted] confinement in 1964. [redacted] has been a patient of [redacted] since he entered the Penitentiary, and [redacted] is very familiar with [redacted] prolific letter writing activities. [redacted] was shown a xeroxed copy of a letter received by Governor GEORGE C. WALLACE of Alabama, and stated that it was positively written by [redacted]. [redacted] estimated that [redacted] has written approximately 1,000 - 2,000 letters since his confinement to the MSP in 1964. He stated that all letters written by [redacted] were censored by prison officials until a recent court decision barred censorship of all inmates' letters by prison officials.

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[redacted] described numerous diagnoses by psychiatrists and psychologists, dating from March, 1965, regarding [redacted]. Consensus of the psychiatrists and psychologists in their diagnoses is that [redacted] suffers from a paranoid schizophrenic condition, as well as being diagnosed as extremely prejudice along racial and religious lines. Therefore, [redacted] and other psychiatrists and psychologists have considered [redacted] to be dangerous and [redacted] has been placed in segregation at the MSP, dating from 1970, as protection against assaults by [redacted] on racial and religious groups of which he is opposed.
