


BRITISH PURCHASING AGENTS OFFICIALLY DENY THAT THEY ARE INTERESTED IN BUYING OLD LIBERTY ENGINES, BUILT FOR AIR COMBAT IN FIRST WORLD WAR. BUT THEY ARE KNOWN TO HAVE SCOUTED FOR THEM AND TO HAVE LOCATED PROBABLY SEVERAL THOUSAND, SOME OF WHICH WERE BOUGHT AT AUCTION FOR FROM FIFTY SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS EACH IN THE POST WAR SALES. THEY ARE NOW USED CHIEFLY FOR MARINE ENGINES AND THE BRITISH ARE BELIEVED TO BE INTERESTED IN THEM FOR SMALL PATROL CRAFT. HOWEVER SOME OF THE FIRST AMERICAN OWNERS THEY AND THEY APPROACHED ASKED FANCY PRICES, RUNNING AS HIGH AS THREE TO FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS. According to our informant, Count Teleki who, since the unification of the Ministries of Agriculture and Supply, was at the same time Minister of National Supply, submitted to the Council of Cabinet an alarming report on the food situation of the country. This report showed that Hungary's agrarian population is suffering of malnutrition and is facing a most serious clothing problem.

This situation was created, Count Teleki claimed, by the unfavorable German-Hungarian trade agreements and the presence of thousands of German army "instructors" who rob the country's supplies like an armada of locusts:

Count Teleki asked immediate measures even at the price of breaking agreements with the Nazis, as the sentiment among the peasants is growing so bitter that in many regions organized resistance was reported endangering farm production.

Since Premier Count Paul Teleki, the brother of the Minister of Agriculture, could not satisfy his request, Count Michael Teleki resigne in protest to the government's policies.

During the World War I, similar dissension in the Hungarian cabinet of Count Stephen Tisza occured, when the army of Fieldmarshal August von Mackensen, stationed in Southern Hungary, practically stripped the country of its food.

According to the best information in Washington, the Italian popular while very bad, is not as serious as it has been reported. There is discontent in Italy, but no greatxexexexxxxx wide-spread movement against the present government. (Off the record, the State Department recently complained to the Agriculture department about a statement which the Agriculture experts made on alleged State Department information as to the desparate conditions in Italy. The Agriculture department replied that while it knew the facts were not as bad as they had painted them, it sounded well and was good propaganda.) According to the best military information, the Italians are expected to give up the whole of southern Albania, including Valona, and dig in on a line from Lake Ochrida ka through Ligasan to the sea. Though an attempt may be made to hold Valona, Rome circles do not expect that it can be successful.

Signs are piling up that point to a new German move in the Balkans, 13/4/ this time centering around Yugoslavia. Whereas two weeks ago the Yugoslav government appeared more determined to resist, this determination has evidently diminished in direct proportion to the movement of German troops onto the Yugo slav frontiers in the north, all the way around. There is a tendency to believe that Yugoslavia may fold up without any struggle, and that the Yugoslavs may swallow their Trakingsxxx anti-axis feelings and take another long step toward cooperation. This might be accompanied by a general settlement of some of the outstanding difficulties of the Germans in southeastern Enrope, and perhaps also ax the end of the Greek Italian war, by Germany enforcing a peace. There are reports that Ribbentrop will meet with Cinzer-Markovitich of Yugoslavia in the middle of January, another straw in the wind as to what is going on, coming as it does at the time of the visit of the B lgarian statesman to Vienna.

The mystery of the German troop movements in Rumania and the ultimate purpose of the strange Axis activities in Michael's kingdom have been partly clarified by an important communication received here from a high Rumanian source.

During the last few days a movement known as Free Rumania, similar to General Charles de Gaulle's organization started an active campaign of sabotage in the Rumanian oilfields, industry and railways.

This movement is being directed from London by Viorel V.

Tilea, former Rumanian Minister to the Court of St James. He is a young and dynamic Transylvanian who was one of King Carol's most valuable brain trusters and who has excellent connections with various dissident groups in Rumania, including high army officials.

Violent outbreaks against the German army "instructors" took place in Rumania. Even the pro-Nazi Iron Guard considered itself is trayed by their German protectors and split in two factions. One, the largest and most dangerous in its extremism is led by Ion Ciorogaru, demands the restoration of Transylvania and works hand in hand with secret Eritish agents, while the other group is lead by Vice Premier Horia Sima, who is a stooge of the Nazis.

Another anti-German group which is constantly gaining in popularity is that led by former Premier Iuliu Maniu, the most influential peasant leader in the country. He has mobilized Rumania's farmers which form 80% of whe the population and by an effective sabotage campaign are cutting supplies to Germany to an alarming extent.

Meanwhile the dissatisfied army officers, who are being bullied and humiliated by the Nazi "instructors" have began revolting against them and serious clashes are reported from the cities of Iasi, Turnu Severin, and Craiova where German officers were stabled to death with baionets by uniden-

tified attackers. German soldiers refuse to salute Rumanian officers and demand that they should be saluted first by the native army.

The massacring of leading Rumanian liberals, intellectuals and Jews is a diversion created by the Gestapo with the object of drawing away the attention of the masses from the much deeper conflict between the German army an one hand and the local patriotic organizations.

The Rumanian peasant has many points in common with the Greeks and is only waiting for the right moment to revenge himself on the Germans who pay him starvation prises for his products.

Annoyed by the rebellious attitude of the Rumanian population the Germans have decided to occupy the entire country. According to eur informant the purpose of the presence influx of German troops into Rumania is, apart from establishing a springboard against other Balkan countries, to crush local resistance and force the population to work at the point of the German bayonet, as is being done in all other occupied territories.

Another object of the transfer of German divisions into Rumania is to bolster up their morale which is gradually decaying as indicated by serious signs of disaffection in undernurished, idle Saxonian and Bavarian regiments. Thus the Reichswehr is recuperating both physically and morally in bountiful Rumania, at the same time saving freight and rolling stock which was used for food transports to Germany.

As a final threat to Rumania the Germans have authorized the mobilization of the Hungarian army with a view to occupying remamining of the province of Transylvania which is still coveted by Budapest irredentists. In this manner the Nazis hope to pursuit placate the Hungarians who have also become restive and are asking themselves what will become of them if Germany should permanently establish a military base in Hungary.

PERISCOPE:

Japan's high officials are taking extra precautions these days against assassination. A group of extremeists broke through police lines at a recent public function and attempted to Assault Premier Konoye. The ultra-patriots, knowing little of the complexities of international affairs, believe Konoye is pursuing too soft a course toward China. After the attempt against Konoye police guards on all cabinet ministers were doubled. Foreign Minister Matsucka, over-worked and in poor health, has confided to friends that he believes he may be the target of an assassination attempt.

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vacillating between the French Vichy government and General de Gaulle, has been greatly improved by the fact that two high Moslem princes are now serving in the British and Turkish forces.

Prince Ali Khan, the son of the late Aga Khan, former leader of the Indian Moslems, joined the British Army in Palestine.

The late Aga Khan, a direct descendent of the Prophet Mohhammed, was the Kalif of the Ismaelite sect of the Moslem on numbering a few millions and scattered all over the Moslem world. The family of the pro-British Aga Khan are revered by this sect as divine.

The powerful Alauite tribes in North-West Syria are Ismaelite Moslems. The decision of Ali Khan to join the British forces, impressed Syrians generally.

Serving in the Turkish army is another Moslem prince, the son of Emir Abdullah, the very pro-British ruler of Transjordania.

Emir Abdullah is being talked about as the future king of an enlarged, free Syria. The enlastment of his son in the neighbor Turk Army disposes Syrians favo ably toward the Turks.

The race superiority of Germans over other peoples has resulted in a curious ruling in East Slovakia where, in coal mines, Germans and Slovaks work together.

In these mines the native Germans are supervised by the SS-Guard imported from the Reich, while the Slovak miners are being watched by the Slovak Hlinka Guard.

The ruling is that German miners can be subjected to physicial disciplining only by the Nazi SS-guardists. But Slovak miners can be beaten both by the Hlinka Guardsmen and the Nazi SS.

The ruling was occasioned by a bitter strike which miners organized against the low wage scale, the forman to the dismay of the Nazi authorities in this strike the German workers made common cause with their Slovak commades.

Finally, the strike was broken when Herr Karmasin, leader of the German minority in Slovakia, ordered all stores to be closed in the mining towns thus subjecting the miners and their families to hunger.

NEWSWEEK of Nov. 25, 1940, p. 15, carried an aerial photo showing the USS Saratoga & Lexington, aircraft carriers, at anchor off Honolulu at what is known as the Waikiki beach anchorage. In background loomed Diamond Head, extinct volcano cone and site of secret army rangefinders & observation for control of coastal batteries, manging from 16 inch guns to various types of anti-aircraft batteries. On attached map of island of Oahu, crosses marked along entite south coast of the island, and along north and north-east coasts, indicate sites of these varied coastal batteries, the bulk of them being mobile (railroad & motor truck). Along the south coast especially, this is the most formidable concentration (with exception of around London & Berlin, today) of big guns & anti-aircraft fire in the world. Idea of anti-aircraft concentration on south coast particularly is to wallop at aerial invaders because that is logica 1 way for invaders to approach to avoid mountainous backbone of Oahu island (see map). This south coast screen of anti-aircraft fire, based right on the ocean front, in theory will block invaders from penetrating thru to the vital installation of the navy base in Pearl harbor.

As result of joint army-navy exercise outlined in Dec. 25 memo, navy now has come to this conclusion:

It will no more anchor aircraft carriers outside Pearl harbor. The Reason is that lying out there, immobile, they would be duck soup targets for enemy dive bombers & submarines. Plan, now, is to take all carriers, even in peacetime for war time drills, into Pearl harbor, the carriers discharging bulk of their planes on to landplane fields noted on recommendations map herewith.


Idea is that these aircraft carrier planes thus would be free to hop off (they cannot hop off carriers at anchor) and reinforce pursuit & other planes possessed by army on Oahu and so put up a much better mass defense against invaders.

In past navy has explained to press that carriers anchor outside Pearl harbor because carriers are too large to safely navigate harbor entrance, and, besides, they contain so much gasoline that if one caught afire, gasoline would burst & spread over calm waters of harbor & threaten all other shaps within etc.

Admirals have been forced into this new decision because of proof of aircraft efficiency against warships as proved by Europe war. Each week finds admirals more & more aircraft conscious. Besides, local joint army-navy drills have endor sed what Europe is daily proving with real thing.


Now, according to this new strategy, carriers will be snug in Pearl harbor, doubly protected by army's anti-aircraft fire curtain and by joint navy-army pursuit defense.



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## CONFIDENTIAL.

In order to coordinate the interested activities and to eliminate duplication of effort, it has been decided, with the concurrence of the Departments concerned, that all intelligence and investigational activities undertaken in the New York Area by the representatives of the Departments of State, war, Navy and Justice shall be coordinated through a single agency -- to be known as the Area Controller.

This Area Controller for the New York Area will act as a clearinghouse for problems and will be consulted by the designated representatives of the interested Departments. He will assign priorities and responsibility for the various problems; which, it is desired, shall be duly laid before him by the representatives of the Departments. Reports of results will invariably be made available to all four Departments.

The necessity for scrupulous care in preserving the security of information and in protecting contacts is apparent.


As Area Controller for the New York Area, Commander Vincent Astor, U.S.N.R., is designated, and appropriate orders will be issued him by Naval Intelligence.

I assume, of course, that Mr. Berle will be in attendance at this meeting.
