Mr. WINCHELL said that he was reprinting the item exactly as used by MIKE CONNOLLY with the additional comment "Scooped Again", and this was to appear in the "New York Mirror" today.

WINCHELL said he did not want the FBI to do anything but said the reason he was calling the FBI was that he would like to know from Mr. HOOVER if he has any objection to the publishing of this album which was published in 1960, about the time Mr. WINCHELL became ill. He stated that no promotion of any kind, advertising, or publicity was given the album and had he been well, he would have assisted in the promotion of it.

He said that he spoke to Mr. RANDY WOOD, President, Dot Records, who had originally recorded this album, and RANDY WOOD said he did not believe the underworld intimidated LOUIS PRIMA in connection with the distribution of the album. WINCHELL said that he then asked WOOD if there was a chance of him getting it back and starting his own publishing and WOOD supposedly stated "We will do anything you want to do about it.

WINCHELL said after this conversation he thought perhaps Mr. HOOVER or some of his friends might have said something to all concerned about not wanting the album published and if that is the wish of the Director, he would forget the whole thing himself.

WINCHEIC said that in this album he bevealed a few

WINCHEIL said that in this album he revealed a few things never before published about the surrender of LEPKE. He mentioned a quarrel in the Stork Club where Mr. HOOVER "bawled me out." WINCHELL said that Mr. HOOVER lost patience with him and the mob and said, among other things, "You tell your friends", and WINCHELL said, "JOHN, they are not my friends." Mr. HOOVER said "They are your friends and they can make a fool out of you but you are not making a fool out of me and my agents."

WINCHELL stated that in the recording he paid tribute to the FBI as he has done for nearly 30 years and that he wanted to convince Mr. HOOVER that he was not "faking it"; that he was glad he did not lose his friendship, however, now, he said he is beginning to wonder if this thing has embarrassed Mr. HOOVER or the FBI in any way and if so, he would like Mr. HOOVER to tell him, so WINCHELL can keep it out of circulation.

WINCHELL said that last night he went to Music City (largest record store in Hollywood), and they did not have the album and had to look it up to see if it was ever published.

Mr. WINCHELL also stated that he had heard the FBI and other law enforcement agencies in Washington, D.C. are quizzing newspapermen at the Pentagon and elsewhere about the so-called news leaks and that he, WINCHELL, would not be surprised to get a visit from the FBI about news he had been printing about the Administration, the President, etc., and if the FBI wanted to quiz him, they should "send a man around".

The telephone call received from Mr. WINCHELL was rambling and disconnected and he was impatient with any attempt to obtain details or clarification. Mr. WINCHELL said he just wanted the information passed on to Mr. HOOVER and he cut the conversation short, ending with a number of facetious remarks such as "MICKEY COHEN sends his love to all", and "Happy Mother's Day".

Mr. WINCHELL was informed that his message would be relayed to Director HOOVER and no comments whatsoever were made to him.

This envelope bore the return address of the Ambassador Hotel, and was postmarked May 21, 1962. tained in the envelope was a registered letter directed to 20th Century Fox Corporation, 10201 West Pico Boulevard, Los Angeles, which had been marked "Refused by the Addressee." A return receipt attached to the letter identified the sender California 88 Also contained in the WINCHELL envelope was an open envelope addressed to Mr. WALTER WINCHELL, Hotel Ambassador, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, postmarked May 17, 1962 at Los Angeles. A note, bearing date of May 17, 1962, and captioned, "Dear WALTER," read as follows: "Please feel free to open this envelope -The content: of the registered envelope was determined to be a letter to the President of 20th Century Fox Film Corporation, commenting that the Association of Motion Picture Producers would ban the production "Cleopatra" in the United States because of Miss ELIZABETH TAYLOR's morals. The author referred to a film entitled, "Nothing Works," for which he desired to obtain some film footage. Walter Winchell called at 9:26 a.m. I talked with him by reference from the Director's Office. He talked for 20 minutes. He advised he had slept for only two hours within the last 36 hours. He wanted to know if "Mr. Smith" (meaning who reportedly has \$800,000 in stolen bonds in his possession) was OK. Winchell stated he was getting worried. I told Mr. Winchell that I did not have any information for him at this time, but to my personal knowledge I had heard nothing regarding the subject being physically harmed by anyone.

Mr. Winchell asked if "Mr. Smith" (meaning gotten in contact with the disbarred attorney who allegedly has the keys to the place of confinement for the stolen bonds. I told him I was not aware that a meeting had taken place.

Mr. Winchell then read to me excerps from his proposed column The name of the FBI is not mentioned at any place concerning subject in the column. The column was written in a very dramatic manner and concerns only the information which Mr. Winchell gave us yesterday in his telephone call at 10:10 a. m Mr. Winchell desired to ascertain if the Director would object to his having this column printed immediately. I told him that inasmuch as the name of the FBI had not been mentioned in the column it would be somewhat presumptuous for us to object. He then wanted to know if printing of the column would interfere with our investigative activities. I told him that publication of his column was entirely up to him and that we were in no I position to object to it.

Mr. Winchell went on in a very friendly manner describing a "fake phone |call" that he made to the Director while interviewing in his hotel room. actually thought that he, Winchell, was talking to the Director. Winchell stated during this "fake phone call" he told the Director must be protected at all costs and that if the Director did not protect him he, Winchell, would never speak to the Director again as long as he lived. He stated that he also mentioned

such words as "John, if you go back on your word I will certainly expose this entire thing in my column." Mr. Winchell stated that such actions caused break down and tell the entire story. It further caused him to express a willingness to tell his story to the FBI in San Francisco.

Mr. Winchell stated we should call him back immediately in the event we have objections to the publication of his "exclusive." Both Mr. Rosen and I agree that we should let things stand as they are, i.e., I told Winchell that we could offer no objections to his filing the story and that it was entirely up to him as to whether he did it or not.

Mr. Winchell stated that he was most anxious to talk to the Director or Mr. Tolson. I told him that both the Director and Mr. Tolson were still in travel status and that unfortunately they could not be reached. He stated that if the Director wanted to talk to him he could be reached through the San Francisco "Call Bulletin."

By reference from the Director's Office, I talked with Mr. Walter Winchell at 10:10 AM this morning. Mr. Winchell was calling from the offices of the San Francisco "Call Bulletin," a Hearst newspaper.

Mr. Winchell told me he had called SAC Foster in New York to fill him in on the latest developments in captioned case. He advised that the subject of this case had travelled approximately 6,000 miles, round trip, in order to surrender himself to Winchell. He stated that the subject's motives were purely those of vengeance. Mr. Winchell added he persuaded the subject to freely discuss the facts with SAC Price and SA Bowser of the San Francisco Office. He stated that as a matter of fact, the subject had discussed this story approximately three times with FBI representatives.

Mr. Winchell stated approximately two-thirds of subject's story was strictly "cock and bull." The subject claims extensive mob connections and stated he was the only one of the subjects in instant case who did have mob connections. Mr. Winchell advised he had talked telephonically with the subject on a number of occasions since early Sunday morning, July 15, 1962. Mr. Winchell stated he was somewhat concerned over the fact that this case appeared to be not within FBI jurisdiction but possibly a matter within the purview of District Attorney Hogan's office in New York City. He stated Hogan might make a play to seal this case from the FBI. Mr. Winchell further indicated that the demands made by the subject are fantastic. He stated he had advised the subject that no deals would be made.

Mr. Winchell indicated that a further meeting with the subject would take place sometime this morning. He stated he already had his story written and had filed it with the "Call Bulletin" in San Francisco. He also advised he planned to go over to the opposition paper, particularly in view of the late enmity of the Hearst newspapers, and discuss the story. He stated his motives primarily in doing this would be to prevent a "leak" in view of the fact that the lives of an entire family might be endangered if such "leaks" occurred.

Winchell stated he was concerned over the fact that a number of bell boys in his San Francisco hotel had looked at him sympathically. Two or three had allegedly told him 'I am certainly sorry about what has happened.' Mr. Winchell stated this was obviously the tip-off that the underground had planted a story that he was either to be killed or kidnapped.

Mr. Winchell advised that the subject had specifically asked him if he could assist in liaison with the insurance companies. The subject reportedly stated he was not worried about the FBI, however, did want to turn the \$800,000 in bonds over to Winchell and wanted Winchell to deliver these bonds to the insurance companies. Mr. Winchell stated if he found it necessary to hop a plane with the \$800,000 in bonds he naturally wanted FBI protection on the trip. I told him we would discuss this matter further if the situation actually occurred. Naturally no commitment was given to him.

Mr. Winchell reiterated that the subject was making fantastic demands. He stated he has a son and that his son should receive an immediate pardon. The subject told Winchell this could come about by District Attorney Hogan making a simple telephone call to the Governor's office. The subject also allegedly told Winchell that he knows where the body of one Benedict McCray (ph), one of the subjects in this case, is buried. Mr. Winchell stated he placed little stock in this claim inasmuch as he considers subject to be a maniac.

Mr. Winchell indicated upon meeting subject at the airport he noticed he was being surveilled. He stated after meeting subject, whose planewas 12 minutes late, the taxi driver who drove them into San Francisco from the airport, reported to Winchell they were being followed. Winchell stated this undoubtedly was the San Francisco Police conducting a surveillance.

Mr. Winchell stated there is to be a "meeting" between the subject and a fellow by the name of this morning. He described as a disbarred attorney, reportedly has the keys to the place of confinement for the stolen bonus.

Winchell stated he had asked the subject why he was revealing all of the above facts. The subject claimed he was doing it because of his desire to obtain vengeance. He also claimed he had deliberately allowed the FBI to apprehend the other subjects "in order to keep the FBI busy."



in the office developed no further specific information as to the substance of WINCHELL'S remarks. To determine if immediate action was necessary, KFMP-TV was contacted to find out exactly what WINCHELL said. Although his reference was an ad-lib statement at the end of the broadcast, as set out verbatim in my airtel of 7-5-62, it was necessary for the complete tape to be run to find this reference. The tape was not reviewed in detail as such.

For the Bureau's information, KFMB-TV is a very conservative station and has been extremely cooperative with this office in all matters. On 7-16-62, while contacting personnel at this station, Mr. GEORGE STANTIS, Program Director, volunteered that no action has been taken by his station with regard to the WINCHELL broadcast and there is no possibility the Bureau will be brought into the picture.

I regret I did not consult the Bureau, particularly in view of the fact it involved WINCHELL. Based on the facts I had available at the time, which did not indicate a dispute in any area, it was my judgment the contact with KFMV-TV was necessary to determine if action, particularly any action of interest to the Director, was necessary.

Walter Winchell called at 6:40 p.m. today. He merely wanted to indicate that the editor of the San Francisco "Call Bulletin" had told him a day ago that his news story filed in captioned case was no damn good and should be thrown out the window. Winchell stated that our excellent cooperation with him had allowed him the opportunity to call the editor back and advise that the FBI had just broken this case and, therefore, the editor had been wrong all along. Winchell asked once again that his appreciation be extended to the Director.

Mr. Winchell also inquired as to the reasons for District Attorney Hogan's press release which scooped his, Winchell's, column. Mr. Winchell had apparently heard of Hogan's release while talking with the New York Mirror at 5:30 p.m. today following my call to him. I told Mr. Winchell that we, of course, had no control over Hogan and that as a matter of fact any release that Hogan made was strictly his own business in this case. Winchell stated he understood this fact and that he had no gripes whatsoever with the FBI.

It was quite obvious that Mr. Winchell was talking for an audience. He, later in the conversation, put on Nick Giorgani (ph.), a member of "The Untouchables" cast. Giorgani merely stated "hello" and then gave the phone back to Winchell.

Winchell stated he would appreciate the FBI giving him a "cup of sleep." I told him that he should try to get a little rest.

SUBJECT: INTERSTATE TRANSPORTATION OF STOLEN PROPERTY Pursuant to instructions, I called Mr. Walter Winchell at 5:23 p.m. today. He was at the Beverley Hills Music Hall serving as Master of Ceremonies at a movie premier. I told Mr. Winchell, as I had earlier today, that the Director had specifically instructed me to get in touch with him prior to the issuance of a press release by the FBI in the captioned case. I mentioned to him that Miss Bigman, in reiterating his request, had indicated that he wanted at least a 30-minute break. Mr. Winchell was advised that we planned to move our press release at 6:00 p.m. sharp from Washington, D. C. Mr. Winchell expressed appreciation. He stated that "John always keeps his word and lives up to his reputation and friendship." Mr. Winchell inquired as to the details concerning our press release. I told him we had not put together a release as yet, however, he might like to know that our Agents had recovered approximately \$200,000 in stocks and that two men had been arrested. He asked for further details and I told him they were not available at this time. I interrupted Mr. Winchell's line of talk to specifically remind him that we were not taking it upon ourselves to advise the New York Mirror and the Los Angeles Herald Examiner that the FBI had no objections to his release being issued. Mr. Winchell stated this was not necessary in view of the fact that we had contacted him personally. Mr. Winchell again expressed his appreciation and stated he would be in touch with the Director later on to personally indicate his gratefulness. BACKGROUND:

Walter Winchell's column of 7-19-62, which was set forth in the format of a memorandum to him from his "Girl Friday," contained references to Winchell's participation in the surrender of Buchalter. One reference mentioned Don Whitehead's book, "The FBI Story," giving the surrender date of Buchalter as August 24, 1939. According to Winchell's "Girl Friday," the surrender took place on Sunday, August 25, 1939. She also made reference to another individual who did not get the facts straight by stating that the crime expert for Collier's "stupidly reported: 'Despite their denials underworld-insiders insist the top G-Man and WW split the \$50,000 reward for Kepke's capture." The name of the crime expert was not set forth. The Director has asked, 62-31615-"Let me see the Collier's article."

#### INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

With respect to the unnamed individual identified as the crime expert for Collier's, Winchell in his recent letter to the Director made reference to "such as Mr. Velie's ridiculous thing in Collier's that 'Despite their denials, insiders of the underworld say that G-Man Hoover and WW split the \$50,000 reward, etc!"

Bufiles reveal that Lester Velie, upon whom a summary memorandum was prepared by this Section on 1-8-62 and is attached, was associated with the now defunct Collier's magazine as an associate editor from 1946 to 1952. Since then he has apparently been associated with "Reader's Digest." A review of reference material in the Bureau Library does not indicate that Velie authored any articles in Collier's regarding Buchalter although he did write many articles on organized crime for that publication. A review of all references to Lester Velie in Bufiles was conducted and there was no indication that he has made the allegation which Winchell has attributed to him regarding the \$50,000 Lepke reward. He did write an article for "Reader's Digest" in July, 1955, captioned "Gangsters in the Dress Business" which mentioned Buchalter as having been one of the individuals responsible for the hoodlum element in that industry. There was no mention of the \$50,000 reward in the "Reader's Digest" article. NOT RECORDED

Bufiles reveal Buchalter was actually arrested on 24-39 and not Sunday, 8-25-39 as indicated in the Winchell column. Also, the 1939 Almanac reveals that 18-25-39 was a Friday and not a Sunday as claimed by Winchell's, "Girl Friday."

On the night of 7/31/62 I called ASAC Bryant in New York to advise him that allegedly has been calling Walter Sinchell on the West Coast and complaining that the FBI has cast him adrift and that we are giving him rough treatment. I requested Mr. Bryant to have the informant contacted promptly and ascertain what he is calling Winchell about and what his complaint is, and further to let the Bureau know whether this informant has been complaining to us and how we have handled him. I requested Bryant to have the NY office get control of this informant and handle him tactfully, so he is not going to call Winchell and complain again. I told Bryant that the Bureau feels this is something for the Bureau to handle and the informant should not be calling Winchell, but at the same time we want to handle it tactfully.

ASAC Bryant called back on the morning of 8/1/62 and advised as follows:

was contacted on this date at his home,

He stated he had not
contacted Walter Winchell on the West Coast and further that Winchell
has not contacted him since approximately the weekend of 7/21-22/62.

Advised that the 7/21-22 contact was made with him by Winchell
for the purpose of inquiring how "it came off." He told Winchell
everything went fine; Winchell asked him how he was treated and he
told him he had no problems, that he had been treated fine, and that
he was leaving at that time for upstate New York and would be goneabout a week; further that he had no complaints to make the corrections.

The informant advised today that 128 had 100:962 desire to talk to Walter Winchell and to prevent any further contacts with him by Winchell he is having the two telephone numbers in his home changed to unlisted numbers to prevent such a contact.

stated he had no complaints relating to his handling by the FBI; that he did not feel he had been "cut adrift" or that the FBI had given him a rough time. Completely to the contrary, he expressed appreciation for the consideration for his security that had been shown by the agents handling this case.







The Red Underworld 🎋 🦠 The Red Underworld

History is not above strangs transa. The same week Communist saboteurs were nabled in New York—some Americans were defending freedom of speech for Alger Hiss. Although he is described in dailies as a convicted perjurer, the dimensions of his crime are much deeper—and more diagraceful. The passage of time has tended to obscure the truth about the case. Briefly, these are the facts: Alger Hiss perjured himself before a Federal Grand Jury when he denied he furnished confessed my Whittaker Chambers with documents or copies of documents from the State Dept. In other words, Hiss lied when he denied he was a Communist spy.

It should hardly come as a surprise to learn that the Cuban saboteur leader cloaked himself with the United Nations—and is now striving to escape justice via diplomatic immunity. The FRI warned a long time ago: "Many Communist sples have been Soviet employees of the United Nations, They are guests of the United States and supposedly dedicated to the cause of international peace but they are in fact contributed." but they are, in fact, carefully selected envoys of the international Communist conspiracy, trained in trickery and deceit and dedicated to the concept of fully exploiting the freedoms of the countries they seek to destroy. It is too much to expect that they would not prosti-

And there is this touch of added irony: The Secretary-General of the San Francisco Conference which organized the United Nations in 1945—was Alger Hiss,

The wheels-within-wheels drama of espionage was strikingly exemplified by the following: Back in 1959 two Soviet spies (both exemplified by the following: Back in 1959 two Soviet spies (both members of the United Nations) held a clandestine meeting with an American on a street corner in Springfield, Mass. They were trying to induce this Yankee to furnish information regarding U.S. cryptographic machines...While this meeting was taking place—they were under observation by another Russian agent—who was conducting a countersurveillance. At the same time all concerned were being observed by FBI agents—who were cotaining photographs of the Russian sneaks.

Since this country recognized the USSE in 1933, the Communists have made extensive use of diplomatic officials as intelligence agents. These officials have been assigned to Soviet embassics, consulates, trade delegations, news media and the United Nations. The BI files note: "A former Soviet intelligence afficer who deflected from the Soviets has estimated that from 70% to 80% of the Soviet officials in the U. S. have some type of intelligence assignment."

Another peculiar and fascinating fact is that most American and British Eed agents are Petunias.

One of the more orhinous puzzlements is why the State Department remained mum about Castro's Communiam after he snatched power... Earl E. T. Smith, who was our ambassador to Cuba 1957-59, has disclosed that the State Dept. had reports in its files of Castro's Communist affiliations provided by U.S. Ambassadors to Cuba, Mexico and many other sources. As a matter of fact, the Assistant Secretary of State for Latin-American Affairs in 1956 was stationed in Bogota when Fidel Castro, at the age of 21, was an active organizer of Communist revolution

As the loregoing indicates, the dynamite for the current crisis was planted in Cuba many years ago. As we have reported there was a similar pattern in Berlin, In August, 1945—a few days after World War II ended—a Soviet spy ring was uncovered in the United States military government in Germany. German nationals, being trained in U.S. stenographic and office procedures, were threatened and intimidated by Soviet secret police into reporting on United States installations, commanders, directives, methods and plans.

Col. Heimlich, Chief of Military Intelligence for U.S. forces in Berlin (1945-46), has testified before a Senate committee: "Germans' living in the Soviet sector of Berlin and employed in the Wastern

living in the Soviet sector of Berlin and employed in the Western Zone were recruited for esplonage purposes by the Communists by the Simple expedient of holding their families as hostages."

The Red apy network extends everywhere and has been functioning for years. For example, during the period of the Hitter-Statin Pact, Communists here incited strikes through unions under their control in North American Aviation of California and the Allis-Chaimers plant in Michigan. Over the years pinks and other fools have casually diaminsed the danger of native Reds—since they are numerically small. Well, Americans have now been made aware—by the capture of the Cuban saboteurs—what a few Communists can accomplish. The Cuban Reds planned death and destruction on a massive scale. All you need is a few Reds—and a few bombs.

It is important to note that the Communist leaders have not stressed the seed for large numbers of members. They would rather have a small, hard core membership. Besides, every Communist is supported by legious of fellow travelers, sympathizers, apologists, dupes and just plain dopes, many of whom have bylines or are on the staffs of great American newspapers and magazines and do hat-het lobs on columns like these. The top G-man once estimated that for every CP member—there are at least ten fellow-travelers. Each party member or sympathizer must be evaluated in terms of his political, social and economic weight and influence and the fact that he has the backing of a major power.

When Red sgents are captured, headlines are ignited and Americans are aroused. But in a brief time—the old complacency returns, Despite the extensive investigations of Congressional committees, despite the exposes in books, newspapers and magazines, despite the many volumes of sworn testimony—many Americans are still unaware of the peril and ramifications of the Communist underworld. In this reporter's opinion it is only by constant vigilance, by incessant exposes by continually reminding the people of the prim faris—that the nation can be alerted. The Benedict Arnolds can only be stopped by the Paul Reveres.

My phone has rung several times this morning saying, "Did you notice that Walter winchell has made mention of our hassel with the state Department of Education over that March 8th memo?" Thank you walter winchell. This memo was issued to Divil Defense instructors and school superintemeents through a small pressure group in one of our towns (woodstock) and has given rise to a strong sentiment of resentment among most Vermonters...in fact ALL Vermonters... who have become aware of it. I am enclosing one of my own columns which I write for cur weekly paper here in Manchester. This explains the thing quite fully... whe it was and how from a small group of indignant Vermonters, the matter has grown to such (proper!) proportions that a Senate hearing is coming up this week at our state capitol. I should see you my latest column on this, but haven't a copy at hand... Is ent it to our Fishop of the diocese in burlington , since he has shown interest in this matter also. I mustn't take more of your time. You are a busy, busy man I know. Eut I DO want to say this. I hope that your readers will not assume from your brief comme in Monday's MIRLOR that we Vermonters sporove of this directive from our Department off Education. We are in rebellion against it. Forgive this hurried note... this is the Easter season and my hustand is a florist! Petween teaching and housekeeping and doing my little column and fussing about our state departments, and the Cuban situation (I can't convince myself that the administration is right in this matter...how can the Curand fight successfully without our help?) I never have time to re-write letters. (This is my husband's typewriter and I am muttering little swear words at it! Mine SHOULD be backfrom the repairman's soon.. warmest regards from Vermont...warmest thanks for your interest. I have three letters on my desk and my phone has rung several times since Monday asking me if I was aware of the directive sent out from the State Board of Education's office . . . the directive headlined Monday and Tuesday in The Bennington Banner, (Detailed below.)

Yes. I had known about it several days, but had personnally been trying to discover the true facts of the directive before speaking about it here. Suzanne has never been accused of being a "witch hunter"... we all know the unhappy results of unconsidered and unformed public comment. But now that the matter has reached the newspapers, there seems little point in withholding comment here.

Monday's issue of the Banner stated that Education Comsr. A. John Holden had ordered the state's Civil Defense Adult Education personnel and superintendents of schools (because some superintendents have teachers instructing classes in Survival Training Courses, though this is not true in Manchester, of course) to eliminate from these classes material relating to the "conflict between communism and our way of life" and "the conflict between ide-ologies". The March 8th directive from the Commissioner's office also ordered that "all material by J. Edgar Hoover formerly used in the course is no longer authorized".

Three reasons were given for this directive. (1) In these topics are points on which even informed scholars disagree. (2) It is very difficult for a person who is not a scholar in the field to give a balanced interpretation of some of these points, and in a few situations controversies have developed which interfere with the accomplishments of the main objective—training in survival techniques. (3) Since people enrolled in the course already are motivated to learn survival techniques, any motivating effect of the material in question is superflous."

The item states that Bennington County civil defense officials contacted by The Banner were unanimous in opposing this directive. Two lof them well known to us said that his move is the start of "what appears to be an attempt to undermining the state's entire civil defense program." This was said, and more.

A members of the 7-man Vermont Board of Education told The Banner reporter that the board had seen the directive, but had not voted on it. The board member also said that "to my knowledge" the sentence ordering deletion of J. Edgar Hoover's material was not contained in the order when the Board of Education saw it. IA board member also stated that he feels that the reason for this diective deleting anti-communist material and Hoover's from the course is a growing opinion (among the board members? in the Governor's office? Suzanne does not know) that Civil Defense Adult Education Coordinator Edward H. Romney has become "over zealous" (in stressing anti-communism).

County Civil Defense officials assert that Romney has been doing an excellent job. They claim no surprise that his performance has been attacked from some quarters. Romney (continues the article, quoting county officials) has stressed education in the fundamentals of communism varies society; the material along this line has led him into conflict with some peace groups in Vermont.

Tuesday's Banner continues with this discussion. In the directive, Mr. Holden states, "If you have questions about this new policy, you should get in touch with Mr. Romney."

The Banner reporter stated that Mr. Romney, being questioned, said, "I am still on the job and as long as I can do it, I'll stay." Romney said that he would obey the order affecting his department. Changing it "would be strictly up to the people of the state and up to another order from the Commissioner," he said. He added that he considered the offending directive "a test of public oninion". (Suzanne agrees on this.)

This directive came to my attention because an indignant man from out of town brought it to me. This was several days before it reached the Banner and before The Rutland Herald (Tuesday) issue stated "CIVIL DEFENSE UPROAR HITS HIGHER NOTE"

I felt, personally, that the one to ask about this was Commissioner Holden, himself. If I were commissioner I would feel this way. And the directive DID trouble me. So I phoned Mr. Holden as soon as my caller left. Poor Mr. Holden. He must have thought that board mem ber Kristenson must have said some thing to irritate me again! I phone him only when I am irate about M-Kristenson. A year ago in Apri when Mr. Kristenson stated that h was "appalled" by Commissione Holden's recommendation that per sons seeking certification as adult e<sup>a</sup> ucation CD instructors be require to take a loyalty oath, and furth made it clear that he was again loyalty oaths for ALL teachers (cal ing it an "invasion of the freedom " which my country was founded") phoned Mr. Holden, I phoned Go ernor Keyser, too, who had appoir ed him! (Poor Governor Keyse Well (he said) he DID come vo recommended . . .)
