Re Indianapolis letter to Bureau 6/30/69 and Bureau letter to San Francisco 7/2/69.

The Indianapolis Chapter of the Black Panther Party (BPP) has in recent weeks been collecting or attempting to collect funds for the purpose of starting a Breakfast for School Children Program. At least one church has been contacted by the BPP in an attempt to obtain a place to have their breakfast program. The church advised the BPP that they would have to get the proper permits such as food handlers' permits, etc., if they wanted to use the church facilities. The church contacted was the [REDACTED] which is about one block from BPP Headquarters.

Inasmuch as they have contacted at least one church, it is felt they will continue to either get that church or one of the other churches near their headquarters. In referenced Bureau letter, the Bureau advised that certain articles were available for use as counterintelligence against the BPP. It is felt that since the BPP is currently trying to locate a place to have their Breakfast Program, it is felt that if a copy of each of the articles enclosed in referenced letter were sent to each of the four churches which are close to BPP Headquarters that this might have a good effect as a counterintelligence move against the BPP. It is felt by the Indianapolis Division that a quick counterintelligence move might successfully bring to a halt their attempts to establish a breakfast program. The Indianapolis Division, therefore, will be submitting a letter requesting the authority to anonymously send literature concerning the BPP Breakfast Program to the four ministers of the churches that are most likely to be used by BPP.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

No operations are currently under consideration. BPP meetings are currently being held to designate new leadership following a recent power struggle [REDACTED] and his followers and BPP members desiring new leadership. As soon as the new leadership is determined, Cointelpro operations will be considered.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

None.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

None.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

At the current time the Seattle Chapter of the BPP is in the middle of a power struggle to determine the eventual leadership of the organization. Operations of Seattle Chapter BPP have been disrupted and BPP membership is believed to be at an all-time low. As pointed out in previous communication, four of the most prominent BPP members are currently in custody and a struggle for leadership among the remaining leaders has split the Seattle Chapter BPP into several factions.

Re Detroit letter, dated 6/20/69, and Bureau letter, dated 7/3/69.

Detroit proposes utilizing the following counter-intelligence technique as a disruptive measure within the Detroit Black Panther Party (BPP). The counterintelligence technique would be in the form of an anonymous letter sent to a representative number of Detroit BPP leaders and members. This letter will be signed "A Concerned Sister" with the expectation that it will cause suspicion of [REDACTED], a Detroit BPP leader, as the author of the letter. The letter will read as follows:

"Dear Brothers and Sisters:

"Who's next? You, me, who knows. Do you really believe Brother Baynham blew his brains out. Do you believe he shot the top of his head off and then took the time to hide the gun in a safe hiding place so that the pigs couldn't find it. The pigs call it 'suicide' and none of the local brothers or sisters challenge this. Who's kidding who. Why was Brother Baynham's rich black blood splattered all over a dirty room in a lousy racist city. Was this 'suicide' and the 'mercy killing' of one of our other brothers in New Haven arranged by Chief Executioner Hilliard. Why doesn't Chief Brother Hilliard speak out on our lost brothers.

BACKGROUND

ELIJAH MUHAMMAD, leader of the Nation of Islam, has written a scathing article regarding beards which appeared on Page 5 of the July 4, 1969 issue of "MUHAMMAD SPEAKS". The article addresses itself to all Black Men and attacks beards as "germ-carriers", "unsanitary" and "non-modern". The article is illustrated with a very unflattering picture of a bearded Negro with flies buzzing around his mouth.

Many Black Militants throughout the United States prefer to wear a beard and a list of them would probably include [REDACTED]

It is not felt they would react favorably to reading the above described article.

RECOMMENDATION

St. Louis Division proposes that Chicago, who is office of origin for the NOI, prepare reprints of the above described article and mail it anonymously to all bearded Black Militants throughout the United States. Should this suggestion be adopted, the Bureau would have to instruct all divisions having Black militant activity to send the names and addresses of all such bearded extremists to the Chicago Division.

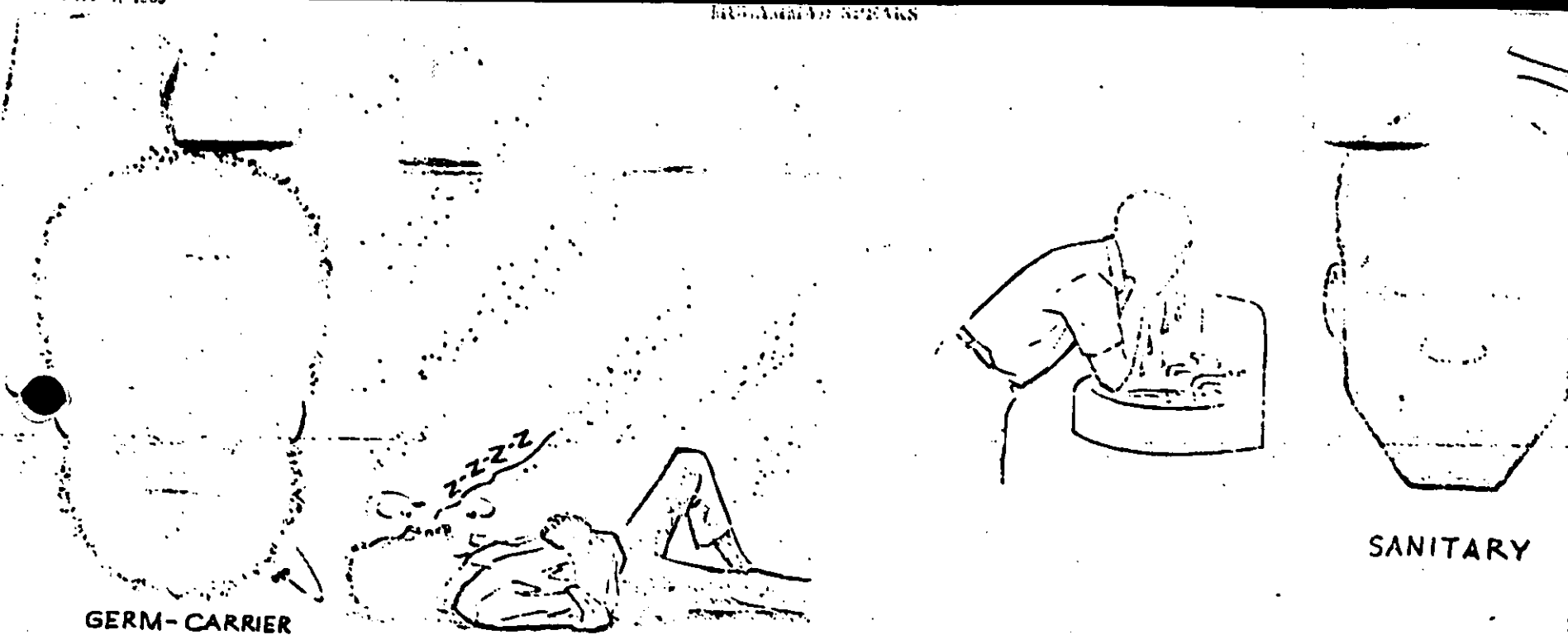

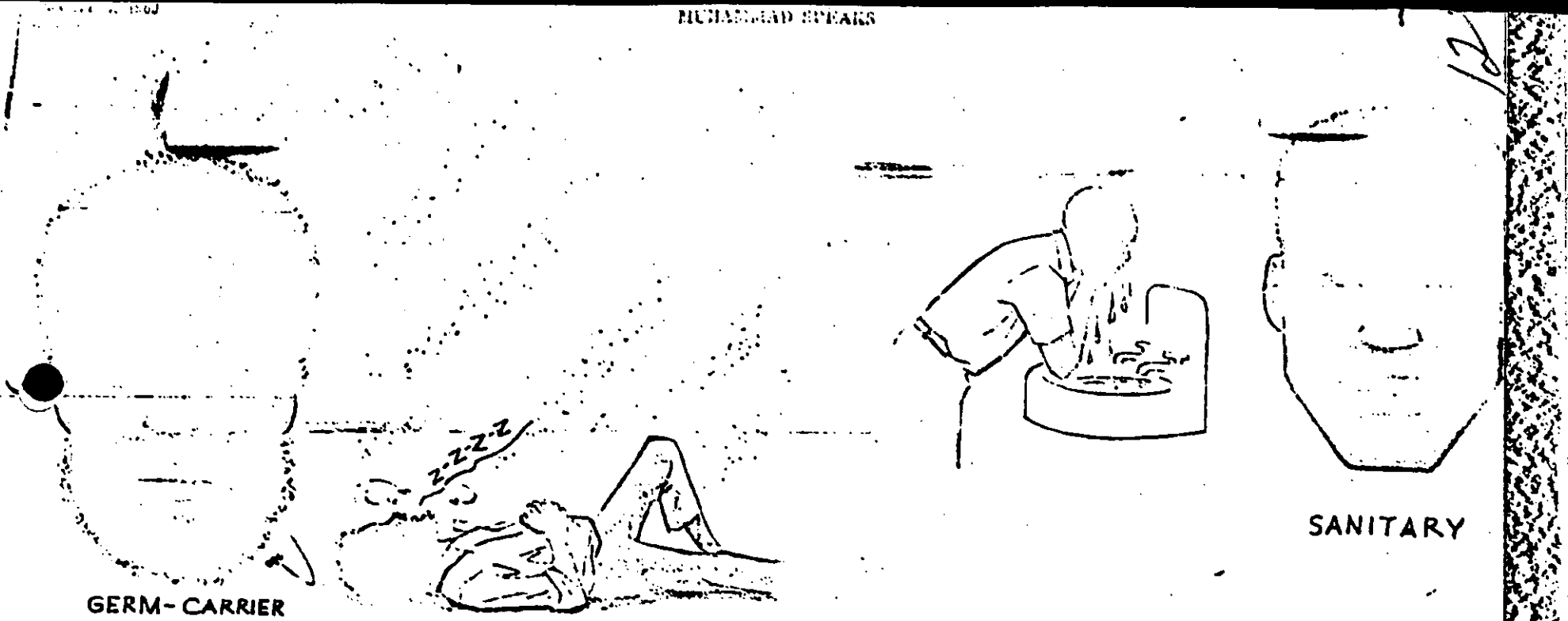

Recommendation in relet that an article by Elijah Muhammad, leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI), which appeared in the 7/4/69 issue of "Muhammad Speaks," be distributed to all bearded black militants throughout the U.S., is not being approved.

You have indicated that dissemination of this article, which is critical of the beards being worn by black militants, would increase irritation between the NOI and other black militant groups. You have also indicated that it would injure the degree of cooperation between these groups and the NOI and should detract from the favorable light which many blacks regard "Muhammad Speaks." Inasmuch as the article has already appeared in the above-mentioned issue of "Muhammad Speaks," it is felt that further distribution to militant blacks would not have sufficient effect to justify the expenses of the program.

NOTE:

Suggestion submitted by reSLlet is not being approved as the article described above has already been distributed in the newspaper "Muhammad Speaks." Further dissemination of this article, which is critical of beards worn by black militants, is not felt justified.

Inasmuch as the NYO enjoys excellent high level
liaison with the [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] it is proposed at this time that in order to thwart
the BPP in the breakfast and luncheon program it has sponsored

The discussion of the above mentioned documents will pertain to the fact that they represent the true feelings and attitudes of the BPP toward the people of the community and that the breakfast and luncheon program is just used by the BPP as a vehicle to assemble and train children in the violent and subversive ideals of that organization.

2. The NYO further suggests that during the aforementioned proposed conference the following matters be brought to the attention of the [REDACTED] in a general sense without any specific documentations:

A. The possibility that the membership of the NOI Mosque Number 7 located in Harlem, NYC, may take exception to the facilities of a Roman Catholic Church being used to dispense the "White Man's food" to black children and may consequently resort to violence in some form to stop this.

B. The idea that whatever food is being distributed by the BPP most likely was obtained from local store owners through open or subtle extortion methods.

It is the opinion of the NYO that the above outlined proposal of a direct contact with the [REDACTED] far outweighs any attempt by anonymous or surreptitious means to disrupt the BPP in their breakfast for children program being operated in All Saints Roman Catholic Church in New York City.

The NYO feels that said proposal can be presented in a manner which would show concern for the Church's position in this sensitive matter without causing embarrassment to the Bureau.

It is hoped that the end result of this proposal would be the withdrawal of the use of Church facilities by the BPP in New York City.

New York must, of course, realize that when this occurs the name of the FBI is divulged as the source. It is, therefore, incumbent upon the New York Office to guarantee that the Bureau will never be divulged by the person to whom this information is furnished.

New York should advise the name of the person in [redacted] to whom this information will be furnished together with available information indicating that he can be considered a trusted friend to the Bureau and will keep all information furnished in a confidential manner. Take no action without prior Bureau authority.

NOTE:

New York has recommended that public source information concerning the BPP and its "Breakfast for Children" program be orally furnished to a representative of the [redacted]. Prior to considering this, we are requesting the name of and background information concerning the person to whom this information will be furnished.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

No additional tangible results have been observed in addition to those which appear in referenced San Diego letter dated 7/1/69.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

At the present time San Diego is experiencing a near riot situation including confrontations between the San Diego Police Department and various black citizens. There is no indication at this point that any of the difficulties have been sponsored or organized by either the BPP or US. It is logical to assume, however, that members of both of these groups are participating in the confrontations on an individual basis.

to the effect that a contingent of BPP members are planning on travelling from Oakland to San Diego in order to participate in any forthcoming disorders.

Attempts are being made to verify this information at the present time. In the event the information is factual, determinations will be made regarding the mode of travel utilized by these individuals. In the event that they travel by air and are in possession of weapons, appropriate action will be made to effect their arrest and prosecution.

In the event they travel by means other than aircraft, the San Diego Police Department will be apprised of their mode of travel and anticipated arrival time. Efforts will then be made to cause their arrest by the local San Diego authorities prior to their ability to participate in any disorderly conduct.

The entire racial situation in San Diego is not good at the present time and is being followed very closely in order to capitalize on any potential counterintelligence activity. Appropriate requests will be submitted, if needed, concerning any anticipated counterintelligence action to be taken.

APPENDIXBLACK PANTHER PARTY

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY GEORGE SNARE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

I quoted in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "... we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

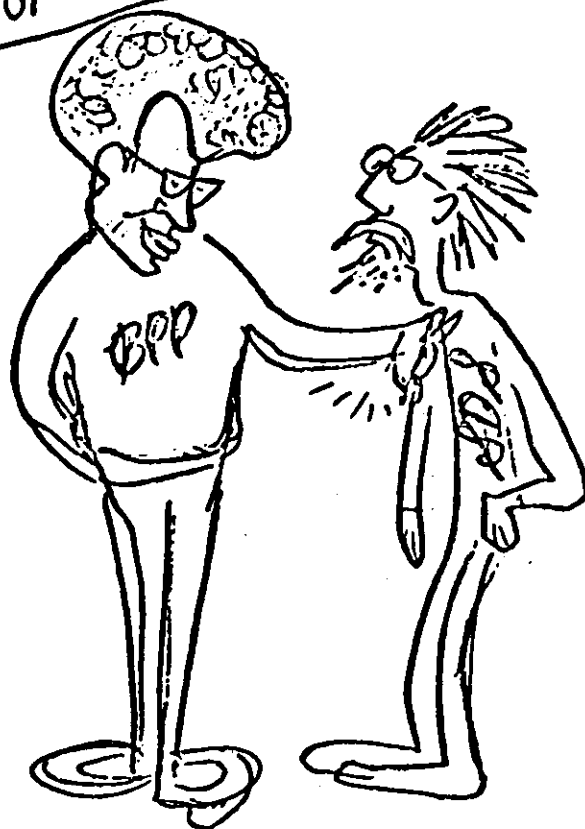

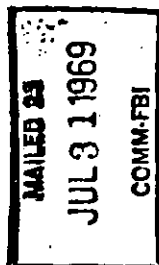

Inquiry at that church resulted in the receipt of information that-the BCP would be continued as long as possible. The Bureau has been advised that health permits are not necessary for those employed in this operation in San Francisco.

The 6/14/69 edition of "The Black Panther" appeared without the name of STOKELY CARMICHAEL in the masthead. The position of Prime Minister was set forth but no name appeared below the title. Apparently CARMICHAEL has been read out of the BPP and it is not believed anything could be accomplished at this time by directing a letter to him to that effect.

Bureau authority is requested for the following counterintelligence projects:

1. Inquiries have failed to indicate any further distribution of the BPP Coloring Book in this area. The Bureau has previously been furnished a copy of this book by the Kansas City Division. Due to the particular vicious nature of the book it is believed that a normal person might become incensed if he were to realize the book might be used in connection with the BCP. We have received no definite information to this effect. Nevertheless it is suggested that San Francisco be allowed to reproduce the copies of the coloring book by Xerox and mail them anonymously to persons who might take action to disrupt the BCP or at least cause them to refuse to offer cooperation to the BPP in the future.

If permission is granted a copy of an unsigned letter will be prepared on a personal typewriter. Paper and envelopes utilized will be purchased locally and the letters will be mailed from a Post Office near the recipient in order that no connection can be made with the mailing and the FBI.

A copy of the proposed letter is included as an enclosure.

In the event this mailing is approved San Francisco also requests permission to mail to the same individuals after a week interval, a copy of the handbill distributed by BPP at picketing of Safeway Market and in another week, to the same individuals, a current copy of "The Black Panther." It is believed that fair appraisal of this material would convince anyone of the unreasonable demands of the BPP and their violence prone nature. A photostat of this handbill is also enclosed.

2. Bureau permission is also requested to make at least five phone calls to both National Headquarters of BPP at Berkeley and at San Francisco Headquarters. A different Agent will be utilized to make successive calls to each office. It is contemplated the caller will not identify himself but will

merely ask if the BCP is in operation (at National Headquarters if it in operation in Berkeley; and at San Francisco is it in operation at Sacred Heart). The caller will advise that he was approached for a donation the previous day or night and no names will be utilized. It will be explained that the caller merely wants to verify if the solicitation the previous day was legitimate.

It is felt these calls might cause some suspicion that some of the members are pocketing donations for their personal use. No names will be utilized.

Reference is made to Denver airtel, 6/9/69. San Francisco feels obliged to point out the possible danger of planting the idea in the BPP that a certain member, now separated from the BPP, furnished information allowing the successful apprehension of two BPP members wanted for murder. The fact that those people were wanted for murder indicates the possibility of BPP taking violent action against this individual. Even if such action could be justified against an active leader it is not felt that Bureau should become even remotely involved in furnishing anonymously incorrect information that might lead to the homicide of a young teenager who has apparently separated from the BPP.

A review of referenced report disclosed that the Jewish Defense League (JEDEL) is a militant Jewish defense organization which teaches its members the art of self-defense and the use of small arms. This organization was formed to "protect Jews from those who threaten them in any way." Its militancy is due to its desire to protect itself from all forms of anti-Semitism, both "black and white" It rejects all "hate" and "illegality."

A review of the above report presents an interesting counterintelligence possibility. It appears that this organization will act when notice of anti-Semitism is received. It appears that it will also act when presented with evidence of hate activity. The report points out that members of the organization care about "The American Dream." It is believed that JEDEL has financial backing.

New York should review referenced report with a view in mind of establishing an anonymous source within JEDEL. In other words, it may be possible to establish a rapport between someone in a leadership capacity and an anonymous person. We would then be in a position to furnish JEDEL with information we wish to disseminate and for other counterintelligence activity. The person furnishing the information would, of course, be fictitious. The information would, of necessity, have to be factual. New York should forward a suggested initial communication establishing the necessary connection between JEDEL and the fictitious source.

The above-referenced letter enclosed a copy of five different articles for possible counterintelligence use. The Indianapolis Chapter of the Black Panther Party (BPP) has in recent weeks been collecting, or at least attempting to collect, funds for the purpose of establishing a Breakfast Program to help clean up their image in the community. As a result, at least one church, the Second Christian Church, 130 West 29th Street, Indianapolis, has been contacted in an attempt by the BPP to locate a place to have their Breakfast Program. The church informed the BPP that if they desired to use the church kitchen and facilities that the BPP would have to get certain permits and licenses and that if the BPP would obtain them, then they would consider letting the BPP use their facilities. They have not been recontacted since that time by the BPP, but anticipate being called upon again.

It is also likely that the BPP might call upon several other churches near their headquarters in looking for a place for the Breakfast Program. It is felt that copies of the articles enclosed in referenced letter would be most helpful in discouraging these churches from allowing the BPP to use their facilities for the Breakfast Program.

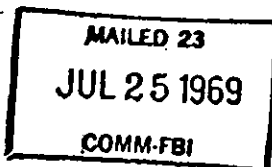

These articles pointed out the hideous nature of the BPP and its "Breakfast for Children" program. One of the articles described a "Panther wedding" where the children sang songs like "Off the Pig." Indianapolis has advised that the BPP is presently attempting to collect funds for the purpose of establishing a breakfast program in Indianapolis and have contacted several churches in an effort to obtain facilities for these breakfasts. Indianapolis has recommended that copies of these articles be anonymously mailed to the ministers of the churches. We are granting this request but advising Indianapolis to mix-up the articles so that one would not think that there was a concerted plan in the mailings.

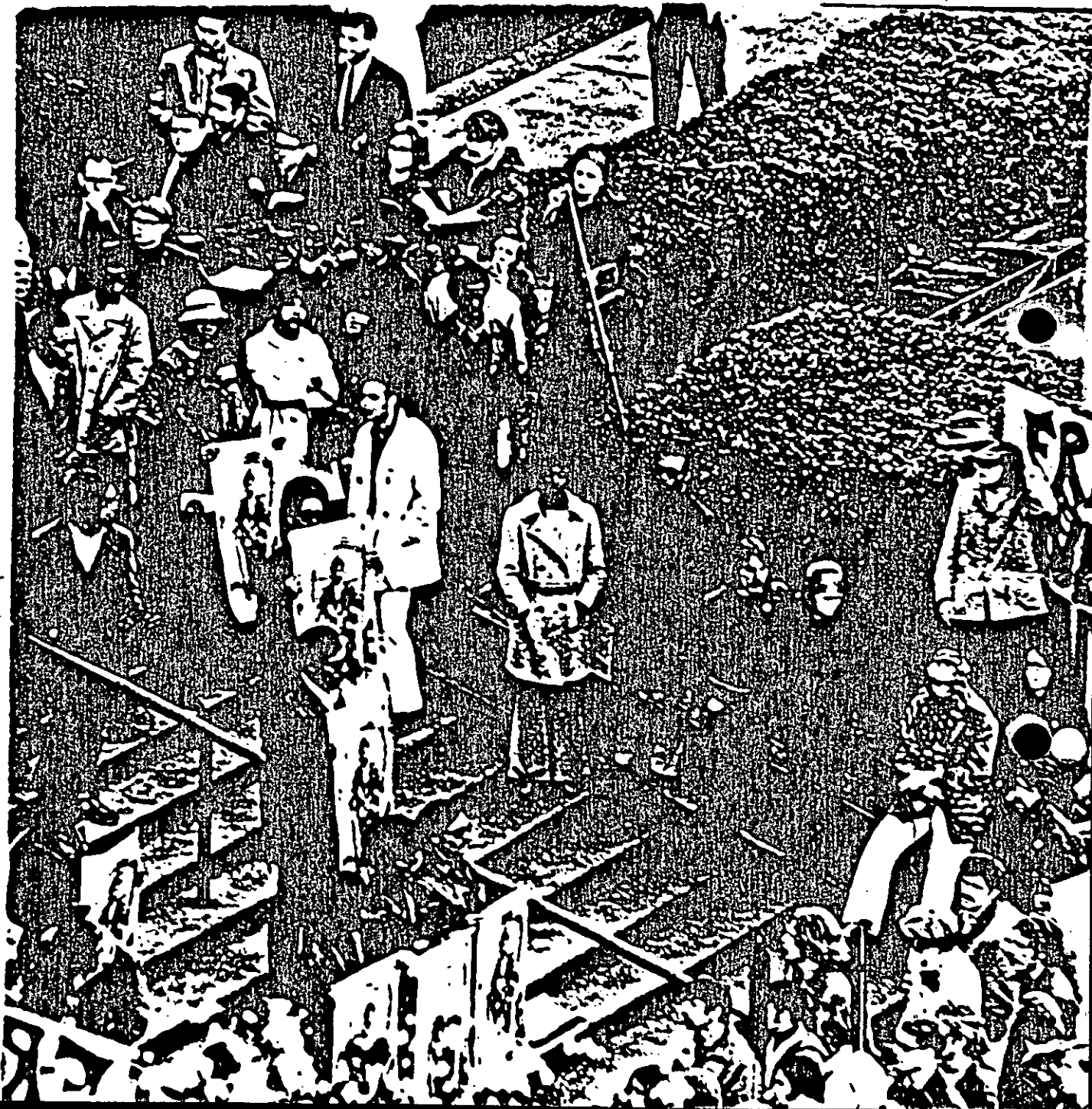

To white members only!!

In order to establish good rapport and harmonious working relationships with the BPP and to correct obvious deficiencies, the following rules of conduct should be observed:

1. All Panthers and members of the Negro race will be called Black ^{or their given name.} Under no circumstances should any racial slur be used or derogatory comment be made.
2. The word "boy" must never be used referring to the Negro for obvious reasons.
3. All ideas originating from the Negro should be welcomed and praised even if they have no value. The praise should not be overdone, but is useful in building confidence and trust.
4. In all contacts with the Negro, as in the planning and execution of plans, all details should be spelled out to insure nothing is overlooked. Firm friendly guidance is necessary to achieve our goals.
5. The Black man should be always considered as correct in any conflict with the "hite society. The proper emotion should be shown and the proper action taken.
6. The BPP goal, as far as the Panthers are concerned is to forward the Revolution. The Panthers must never become aware whose revolution is being considered!

Remember! In order to insure our success, we must be able to control the Black mass. After this memo is read, it should be destroyed.

A coalition of the various black groups in Indianapolis initiated a breakfast program for underprivileged children. The coalition call themselves "The Black Coalition." The breakfast program has been held now for about two weeks at St. John's Missionary Baptist Church, 17th and Martindale in Indianapolis. The breakfast program is funded primarily by St. John's Missionary Baptist Church and other churches with some support from the black militant groups in Indianapolis. Members of these groups are responsible for fixing and serving the breakfast to the children. Included in these groups is the Black Panther Party.

On 7/19/69, a photograph appeared in "The Indianapolis Recorder," a local Negro owned and operated weekly newspaper. The photograph was of several Black Panther Party (BPP) members serving breakfast to some children. The caption to the photograph stated the BPP had initiated the program and gave the BPP in Indianapolis credit for the program, without mentioning the other local black groups.

responsible for operating the program. [REDACTED] indicated he had already spoken with BPP persons working with the program and had set them straight in the fact that the Black Coalition, not the BPP, was responsible for the program. [REDACTED] advised that the BPP was not allowed to put up posters or pictures concerning the BPP, although they had requested to do so. Also they were not allowed to speak to the children with any political or black hatred talk. The children were fed and several members of the BPP were helping to fix the food, serve and clean up after the breakfast each morning. [REDACTED] stated this did not give the BPP a chance to talk to the youngsters. Immediately following the breakfast, the children are taught Bible stories through film strips. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], he stated he was not going to allow the BPP to take credit for the breakfast program or to use it for the purpose of indoctrination by the BPP. [REDACTED] felt that since the only thing BPP members were doing was working fixing food and cleaning dishes of which he was sure they would soon get tired, he expected the BPP to soon quit participating. Natural Allies of Black Panthers

THE Black Panther Party begins a national conference in Oakland tomorrow, revealing, no doubt, in its designation this week by J. Edgar Hoover as representing "the greatest threat to the internal security of the country" among black extremist groups.

The record supports the F.B.I. chief's statement that members of the Black Panthers have "perpetrated numerous assaults on police officers and have engaged in violent confrontations with police in cities throughout the country." In the past half year alone, scores of Panthers have been arrested in various cities around the nation on charges ranging from possession of concealed weapons to arson and armed robbery.

Present emphasis in Panther policy is on coalition with other radical groups, white or black. An announced goal of the Oakland convention is to establish a "united front against fascism."

The Panthers have been working with groups such as the Students for a Democratic Society, organizations to which they refer as "white worker alliances."

At least, among the white extremist groups, the Black Panthers have found their natural allies.

But they will find few other citizens—black or white—who will subscribe to a doctrine of arson, robbery or other violent acts under the excuse of countering "fascism." Violence, after all, is a basic weapon of fascism.

As noted in referenced letter, the BPP in Des Moines, Iowa, is attempting to secure space for use as its headquarters, its former headquarters having been condemned by the City of Des Moines because of the extensive damage to it caused by an explosion in April, 1969. Sources continue to advise that the BPP in Des Moines has all but disintegrated during the past few months and has been involved in no activity.

On 7/22/69, it was determined that the BPP in Omaha had been evicted from the building housing its headquarters since the organization had paid no rent on this space since September, 1968, however, the BPP moved back into this building on the same date. At present, this matter is in the hands of the Omaha City Attorney who will decide further action to be taken in this matter.

The Omaha BPP has not been involved in any organizational activity since 5/18/69, when it held a rally in an Omaha city park. Recently received information indicates that there are only between six and ten members of this organization and they are involved in no organized activity.

No counterintelligence accomplishments have been obtained under captioned program since submission of referenced Omaha letter.

This matter will continue to receive close attention and suggestions for counterintelligence activities against the BPP and its leadership at a future date will be submitted by separate communication.

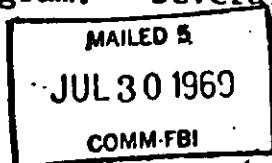

The following items of counter-intelligence interest are forwarded for info of the Bureau and receiving offices:

The Jackson Division on 7/30-31/69, conducted a Police-Community Relations Two-Day Seminar at the Jackson Police Academy under the sponsorship of the Jackson, Miss., Police Department. Among topics discussed by FBI instructors with the crowd of over 65 officers in attendance, were Black Nationalist groups and the fact that police officers should be alert to any criminal activities or acts of violence perpetrated by Negroes affiliated with black extremist groups.

In the early morning hours, 7/31/69, two of the officers who attended the session on 7/30/69 were on duty in the vicinity of a Negro ghetto area of Jackson. They observed a 1960 Chevrolet with three bearded militant looking Negro occupants cruising suspiciously in the vicinity of a large gun shop in the ghetto area. The officers stopped this car on a traffic violation. Subsequent inquiry by the officers with the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) revealed that the car was stolen from New Orleans, La., on 7/29/69. Officers in searching the car found a fully loaded .30 caliber semi-automatic M-1 carbine and a bolt action rifle as well as burglary tools. The three were booked on possession of burglary.

tools and related local charges and during the booking process [REDACTED] the driver of the car when it was stopped, admitted he was a writer for "Muhammed Speaks", a Nation of Islam (NOI) publication and related Black Nationalist affiliations.

[REDACTED] is known to the New Orleans Division of the FBI as a Republic of New Africa (RNA) activist from New Orleans, La., who is on the Security Index and the Agitator Index of that office.

The Jackson Division confirmed from contact with the New Orleans Division that [REDACTED] was a convicted felon. Additionally, the New Orleans Division advised that [REDACTED] had been arrested and convicted on criminal trespassing charges recently in New Orleans stemming from his participation in the presentation of the "Black Manifesto" at the First Presbyterian Church in New Orleans in May, 1969.

Based on the above info and interview by Bureau Agents of the three individuals arrested, Federal complaints were authorized and warrants issued on 8/2/69, charging [REDACTED] with ITSMV and with a violation of the Gun Control Act of 1968.

[REDACTED] who was with [REDACTED] in the car, was also charged with ITSMV charges.

[REDACTED] was charged with misprison of a felony for failing to make known to proper authorities his knowledge concerning [REDACTED] involvement in transporting a stolen vehicle across state lines. [REDACTED] was the third occupant of the auto.

This threesome was afforded a hearing before the U. S. Commissioner, Hattiesburg, Miss., on 8/2/69, and were remanded to the Forrest County Miss. Jail, Hattiesburg, on Federal charges in lieu of \$5,000 bond on each charge. After

Federal process was obtained and the threesome had their hearing, a press release was issued by the SAC, Jackson regarding the matter. Newsmen who had heard about the Black Nationalist affiliations concerning [REDACTED] inquired of the FBI regarding these affiliations; however, were referred to local officials and their own sources in New Orleans to determine these affiliations and to possibly determine any prior convictions on the part of [REDACTED]. The newsmen had heard that [REDACTED] had Black Nationalist affiliations from talking with police officers who had talked with the threesome following their arrest. Subsequently, several representatives of the news media issued news articles and TV and radio reports regarding the arrest of the threesome, including in this report information from their sources in New Orleans who confirmed prior arrests [REDACTED] part and other information regarding Black Nationalist affiliations of [REDACTED].

As a result of the above news cast and news articles much unfavorable state publicity was obtained regarding [REDACTED] his companions, and the Black Nationalist Groups [REDACTED] is affiliated with. The Associated Press and United Press International also ran stories on the threesome's arrest.

Re: Publicity
[REDACTED] came to Jackson, Miss., by auto on the evening of 8/1/69, to check into local charges regarding the threesome. When she heard that the local charges would probably be replaced by Federal charges, she decided to leave Jackson immediately and return to New Orleans. This information is being used by Jackson Agents to discredit RNA leadership through Jackson sources by showing this leadership "deserting their compatriots when the going gets rough".

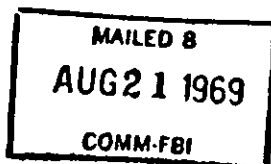

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

An intensive interview program directed at BPP members continues to be effected.

No results have thus far been observed concerning the mailing of the Bureau-approved anonymous letter to [REDACTED] concerning [REDACTED]. It is not anticipated at this time that any direct results will be observed in this regard in the near future.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

On 7/24/69, a Bureau-approved fictitious-name call was placed to [REDACTED]

The racial situation in San Diego has returned to near normal after the riot situation of 7/13/69. Post mortem analysis of the riot indicates that it was spontaneous in nature and was not promulgated by any particular group.

Due to widespread national publicity given the BPP Coloring Book, a careful study for some weeks in depth of factors and personalities in Kansas City, Missouri, (site of the only Kansas City Division BPP Chapter and a past local Breakfast Program) suggests very limited, if not questionable or detrimental, effects from a counter-intelligence distribution now of the BPP Coloring Book and related national and local news items critical of the BPP Breakfast Program.

The above conclusion is based on data, available to the Kansas City Office, namely (1) no local or national distribution of the Coloring Book, or of BPP propaganda for children in connection with the Breakfast Program, is known or documentable as proven; in fact, San Francisco reports

are to the contrary, as well as substantial proof of publication or distribution of the Coloring Book or such propaganda with approval and support of the national BPP; (2) widespread national publicity as to the Coloring Book and Breakfast Program are now "old hat" locally. An anonymous attempt to couple the Coloring Book with the discontinued Breakfast Program in Kansas City, Missouri, as a counterintelligence action to educate key "naive" Negro ministers who supported the Breakfast Program in Kansas City, Missouri, based on the lack of proof mentioned above, could backfire with defensive publicity.

Such types of defensive publicity are exemplified by the attached copies of news items in the Kansas City Times, 8/2 and 8/4/69, and the Kansas City Star, 8/3/69, daily Kansas City, Missouri newspapers.

Also attached is an article dated 7/10/69 from the Kansas City Star.

The Kansas City Division will be alert to recommend counterintelligence action in future developing situations, should the BPP "Breakfast Program", "Liberation Schools", and "Health Clinics" resume, start or get underway.

With reference to Bureau letter 7/15/69, relative to a counterintelligence proposal for utilizing a previously submitted cartoon for anonymous distribution in the Kansas City area, no recommendation is being made for such distribution at this time due to the summer cessation of the Breakfast Program and the widespread sensational type of publicity, attached, which should depict for intelligent readers the true character of the BPPs. A recommendation as to possible future distribution of such cartoons will be made when it is considered timely.

CONCERN OVER NEGRO'S IMAGE

Chief C. M. Kelley Explains Quote About Black Community

INTEREST IN RAPPORT

He Says Police Have Worked Hard to Build Relations

C. M. Kelley, Kansas City police chief, expressed concern yesterday that the image of the city's black community might be damaged by a Black Panther claim that Negroes are "ecstatic" over the death of John Edward Dacy, policeman.

Dacy was killed July 21 when he entered a jewelry store and loan company during a robbery. Three persons are being held in the slaying.

In National Publication

The claim of ecstasy was made last week in an article published in the Panthers' national publication and carried over the byline of the deputy health minister of the Kansas City Black Panther chapter. Other black leaders subsequently denied the claim.

Kelley, interviewed after the article appeared, was quoted as saying: "I certainly hope none of our fine citizens in the Negro community suffer because of this."

Herman Johnson, metropolitan chairman of the N. A. A. C. P., said in reaction to Kelley's statement that the Negro community would be angry if the police chief meant other blacks would be hurt in the war of nerves between the Panthers and the police.

Kelley said yesterday that the quote, while accurate, was incomplete. Not included, he said, was a comment that Negro citizens might suffer from reflections of adverse comment on the article.

(The reporter who covered the story for The Star corroborated last night Chief Kelley's statement that the quote was incomplete.)

He Fears Stereotyping

He said a psychological process called "stereotyping" could cause persons to generalize on the characteristics of a small group, projecting these traits to others who share the same color or background. He continued:

An example is to classify all people as thieves because one of them is found guilty of theft. To say all Irish are hot-headed because some anger quickly. To say all Negroes are violent and irresponsible because some advocate an "eye for an eye" means to obtain what is thought to be just retribution.

I was quoted recently in an article, reflecting my thoughts regarding an item which appeared in a Black Panther publication. I at first considered remaining silent and would have done so except I thought my comments might help put this whole matter in a proper perspective. I did say, and meant it sincerely when I was quoted: "I certainly hope none of our fine citizens in the Negro community suffer because of this."

What I also said but what was not included in the quote was that people are prone to stereotype this kind of action and I was afraid our good Negro citizens would suffer from reflections of adverse comment and interpretation. I knew had already been made. We have met with numerous groups of the black community. I thought we understood one another and I feared such a report as we may have established would crumble through careless and thoughtless utterances of a very few. I regret any misunderstanding arose.

I do not, however, feel that I contributed to the misunderstanding and I did not have any other thought in mind except to try to protect the many Negroes who are just as law abiding just as anyone for peaceful recognition of the rights of all men as I. No threat to anyone was inferred or intended.

Insofar as the comment about the action of the Panthers being tantamount to a declaration of war, I appear there also to have been grossly misunderstood. I do fear that such threats as issued by the Panther group might precipitate an armed confrontation between the police and that group. We do not want this, will try desperately to avoid it, and, as I said in the interview, will not be pushed into initiating it.

It has occurred in some cities however and I wanted to point this out as an unfortunate commitment to violent threats and show of force. I had hoped this could stimulate a greater degree of reasonableness and deliberation on the part of all concerned. I still hope this is true and I repeat that the Kansas City, Mo., Police department feels its responsibilities keenly as conservators of the peace and will not engage in unbridled retaliation through violence.

We do intend, however, to maintain our pledge to keep the peace.

Pete O'Neal, Identifying Him-
self as Marxist-Leninist,
Sees Struggle

FOLLOW MAO'S DOCTRINE

Chapter Leader Says Purpose
Is to Liberate the
Black Colony

By Harry Jones, Jr.
(A Member of The Star's Staff)
The head of the Black Panther
party chapter here now openly
identifies himself as a Marxist-
Leninist and predicts an "armed
revolution" in Kansas City and
nationally.

"We are Marxist-Leninists,"
Pete O'Neal, the 24-year-old
Panther leader said in an inter-
view today. "We follow the doc-
trines laid down by Mao Tse-
tung. If you want to call that
Communist, go ahead."

To Free Black Colony

O'Neal, who took the reins of
the Panther chapter here in late
January, had until now avoided
open espousal of Marxist-Lenin-
ist views, in so many words.

"The purpose of the Black
Panthers," he said, "is to liber-
ate the black colony and stimu-
late the revolution of the
mother country."

He was asked what he meant
by "revolution."

"Taking the power out of the
hands of the few and giving it
to the many," he replied.

He was asked how this would
be done.

Sees Armed Revolt

"By armed revolution," he
said. "There's a holocaust com-
ing. People are going to die.
They're going to litter the
streets."

An ex-convict, O'Neal admits
to having been a man of basely
criminal intent until the riots
in Kansas City in April of last
year. Then he became "aware,"
as he puts it, of the black man's
position in society and the respon-
sibility he feels he has to rectify
the wrongs visited upon blacks
by the "racist power structure
and their arm, the police depart-

ment."

Shortly after becoming a
Black Panther here, O'Neal de-
nied any Communist leanings,
stressing that he was concerned
with local problems confronting
blacks.

Asked in February why the
Panthers studied and quoted
Mao and Che Guevara, O'Neal
replied: "A person can quote
Jesus Christ and not be a Chris-
tian. I'm sure a person can
quote Mao Tse-tung and not be a
Communist. Mao and Che are
revolutionary people and we are
revolutionary people. These peo-
ple have been successful in the
revolution, and this is basically
why we study their tactics. We
are studying their tactics, not
their ideologies."

Books he cited then as having
had the most influence on him
were "The Autobiography of
Malcolm X," "Malcolm X
Speaks" and Eldridge Cleaver's
"Soul on Ice."

Carries 'Red Book'

Now, five months and consid-
erable study later, he carries the
so-called "Red Book," titled
"Quotations from Chairman
Mao Tse-tung" with him at
times and is able to quote some
passages directly from the book
without opening it. He also has
started reading "Das Capital."

The kind of society he envis-
ages for the United States is
"the revolution" is successful is
"socialist," but not necessarily
like that of any country in exist-
ence today.

It would certainly not be like
that of the "revisionist" Soviet
Union, which he views with con-
tempt as having practically be-
come an ally of the United
States.

Nor would it have to be identi-
cal to the system in Red China,
he said, although he was quick
to express admiration for that
system, observing: "The people
of China are freer today than
any black man in America."

Trial-Error Period

He conceded that a period of
"trial-and-error" would probably
occur after the revolution here
and that not everything would
necessarily work smoothly at
first.

But those who are now op-
pressed, he said, would finally
be free.

Free from what, he was
asked.

"Oppression," O'Neal said.

"Hunger. Want."

He said he does not see the
struggle as racial in nature but
as between the "haves and have-
nots." Many white "John
Browns" will be fighting side by
side with the Panthers when the
revolution comes.

Asked how the revolution
might start, he said one small
incident in a single city could set
it off, spreading from one city to
the next.

Lists Possible Motives

O'Neal is far more convincing
when he talks of the plight of the
black man in Kansas City than
when he discusses the evils he
sees in capitalism. His manner
raises the question of just why
now, he has chosen to identify
himself with an ideology that li-
ation to most blacks as well as
whites in this country.

At least four motives seem
possible:

○ He means it all, every word
of it.

○ He feels he should believe it
and through study is attempting
to embrace the ideology.

○ He feels he must espouse
such beliefs to stay in harmony
with the Black Panther party
nationally.

○ He sees the vocalization of
such beliefs as another strate-
gic means of provoking the "op-
pressive power structure" into
more repressive activity against
him and the Panthers—thus en-
gendering more grassroots sup-
port for his organization in the
black community.

"I hold that it is bad as far as
we are concerned if a person, a
political party, an army or a
school is not attacked by the en-
emy," Chairman Mao said in
1959 (pg. 15 of the "Red Book").
"for in that case it would defi-
nitely mean that we have sunk
to the level of the enemy."

"It is good if we are attacked
by the enemy, since it proves
that we have drawn a clear line
of demarcation between the
enemy and ourselves."

"It is still better if the enemy
attacks us wildly and paints us
utterly black and without a sin-
gle virtue; it demonstrates that
we have not only drawn a clear
line of demarcation between the
enemy and ourselves but have
achieved a great deal in our
work."

WOULD SOFTEN PANTHER VIEW

Black Leaders Believe
Most Decry Dacy
Slaying

DEPLORE KELLEY STAND

Police Chief Criticized
for Reaction to
Article

If black people in Kansas City have any emotion about the recent slaying of John Edward Dacy, a white patrolman, that emotion is regret, the Metropolitan N. A. A. C. P. chairman said yesterday.

Herman Johnson, N. A. A. C. P. leader, said the Black Panthers are wrong in stating in their national publication that black people here are "ecstatic" about the death of the officer.

As Small Minority

"There are 110,000 black people in Kansas City and about 15 Black Panthers," Johnson said. "I don't know of anyone else who feels the way they do about someone's death."

The article celebrating the murder of the officer appeared over the byline of Miss Andre Weatherby, deputy minister of health of the Kansas City Panther chapter. She has spoken at Black Panther rallies here. The article was endorsed Friday by Pete O'Neal, Panther leader in Kansas City.

Critical of the Panther report, Johnson also reacted sharply to a statement by C. M. Kelley, Kansas City police chief. After reading the article by Miss Weatherby, Chief Kelley commented:

"I certainly hope none of our fine citizens in the Negro community suffer because of this."

Johnson said the black community will be angry if Kelley means that others will be hurt in the police campaign against Panthers.

In Long History

"They've been beating up people down here for a long time—long before we had Panthers and articles such as this one in the Panther newspaper," Johnson said.

"Criminals have been shooting at police for years, but that doesn't mean you go after the whole black community just because you can recognize them by their color."

He noted that police have complete intelligence information on virtually all Panthers and their associates, including names, addresses and photographs.

"If the police feel the Black Panthers have declared war, then let them fight the Black Panthers—not everybody else."

"If a white person kills a policeman, then a white person has killed a policeman. But if a black person kills a policeman, then the whole black community is subject to retaliation. This is what we mean by racism."

Makes an Objection

Leon Jordan, leader of the Freedom, Inc., political club, also objected to Chief Kelley's statement concerning injury to other Negro citizens. He said the black community here will never learn to live with Chief Kelley or with Joseph Kelly, president of the police board.

He said he also agrees with Miss Weatherby's implication that much has been taken from black people.

"I'm for getting it back, but not that way—through robbery," Jordan remarked. "The Panthers have many fine thoughts, but the methods they suggest is what bothers the Negro community."

"The killing of that officer, the killing of any man, diminishes me."

He said the Panthers are setting the scene for a confrontation in which many Negroes will be killed, and he hopes they will not be out of town when it occurs.

An Expert Label

"These guys have a couple of guns and intend to fight people with tanks. Violence—hell, they can't go against the white man on violence. He is an expert at it."

"My great grandfather was born in this town, my grandfather, my father and me. I know that my people are the ones who will be killed."

Jordan said black leaders are asked to try to stop the Panthers when what is needed is a stop to the white money which keeps them going.

"We have information at this point that one organization sends \$5,000 a month," he said. "The black community hasn't been putting up this money. They've bought cars. They've bought everything."

He said much of the help comes from "old-time liberals, who sent money to keep Martin Luther King marching through Georgia."

Not Same Philosophy

Jordan said this is a new era, and the Panthers are not of the philosophy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

"Whether these liberals know it or not," Jordan said, "they're helping keep our people down-trodden today."

The Rev. Phil Lawson, director of the Methodist Inner City parish, has been in close contact with the Panther party since it was founded early this year and has supported certain of its programs. He was asked whether he believed, as the article indicated, that black people were "ecstatic" about Patrolman Dacy's death.

"I'm not ecstatic about the death of any man," he replied. "I'm not sure the killing of individual police officers or anybody else helps anyone."

He said, however, that he sees little difference in the use of force by society through the police and use of force by individuals.

Two Sides Seen

"I would assume that if they were committing the holdup had been shot," he said, "there would be no concern for these men or their families. That indicates a perversion."

He said he agreed with Miss Weatherby's implied concept that every human being is entitled to his share of the fruits of society.

"But armed robbery is not right," he said. "This is the method of violence. You're giving property a higher value than human life."

"While" he said there are aspects of the article he does not approve, he said he was not discouraged with the Panthers.

"They see into some issue deeper than other people," he said. "I am more disappointed with Kelley's statement. Chief Kelley is a person with political and military power. He has an army, weapons and the legal right to declare war. Pete O'Neal has none of that."

Always the Victims

Mr. Lawson said that in the past black people have been the principal victims of violence, lynchings, race riots and police beatings. He said this makes today's violent talk by blacks more understandable, even if it does not excuse placing guilt for past wrongs on an individual such as Patrolman Dacy.

"He was a human being, cut up into the same kind of bags as the rest of us," Mr. Lawson remarked. "I don't blame Officer Dacy anymore than I blamed the men who held up the stores for all the wrongs of society. He's a product of our society the same as they are."

The Rev. A. L. Johnson, pastor of Zion Grove Baptist church and president of the Council for United Action, said the impact of the article on Patrolman Dacy's family concerns him.

"It would be quite disturbing to the man's family," Mr. Johnson said, "but I hope they would realize it was not the mass of black folks speaking. There are those who still have hopes we can live in this society as human beings together."

Mr. Johnson said many, if not most, black young people are being attracted to the Panther philosophy, but most black people do not condone violence.

"There's a lot of injustice, and I am ready to fight it, but my methods are different," he said.

"Lots of policemen have bad attitudes, but this boy's name didn't register with me. He was within his rights. He was trying to do his duty in preventing a holdup."

DISTURBING TO POLICE

Kelley Says the Article
May Undo Efforts at
Co-Operation

This week's issue of the Black Panther party's national newspaper carries an article from Kansas City reporting "ecstatic" reaction to the fatal shooting here last week of Patrolman John Edward Dacy.

Two young men, presumably members of the Black Panther chapter here, were seen selling the newspaper on the third floor of police headquarters about noon yesterday. Police Chief C. M. Kelley's office is on the third floor. **MD**

Endorses the Story

Percy O'Neal, head of the Panther chapter here, said he sold a copy of the newspaper to Judge Richard L. White at the municipal court yesterday morning and told him there was an interesting article on page 15, the page on which it was carried. Last night O'Neal endorsed the article completely.

Chief Kelley said last night the police officers share a disgust over the article and added, "I think that this type of thing indicates practically an open declaration of war."

The article is bylined "Sister Andrea Weatherly, deputy minister of health" of the Panther chapter here. Miss Weatherly has spoken at Panther rallies in Kansas City.

The article appears beneath a photograph of Dacy lying on a stretcher outside the store in which he was shot. The outline beneath the photograph reads "Kansas City Fascist Pig Performing His Final Duty."

Seen as Terror Act

The headline over the article reads, "Off-Duty Pig's Last Act of Terror." The article reads as follows:

TO: National Headquarters
FROM: Kansas City Chapter
DATE: July 22, 1969

SUBJECT: Death of the Oppressor
The people of Kansas City are in an ecstatic state today following the execution of a pig. Three (3) unknown heroic brothers had the pleasure of "rotting a pig."

The late pig, John Edward Dacy, 31 year old slum lord, was shot by three black brothers. In the same area where he owns property, Dacy was a well known pig and well known exploiter of black people. The brothers were in the process of getting back what was theirs from Jo-Art Loan Company, 333 Main Street, when Super Pig Dacy, who was on duty, made the fatal mistake of trying to stop them. The brothers retaliated by firing on the pig three times, striking him in the head and upper body with a .22 caliber pipe. Persons on the scene reported that pig Dacy fired two shots from his "rot-duty weapon," a .38 caliber revolver. "Dead-eye" Dacy was not able to hit anyone.

The Kansas City Pig department, with their great degree of technology, and after calling in a task force of 80 extra men, cannot locate the brothers who are still free. Right on! Chief Clarence M. Kelley, Chief of the Kansas City Pigs, has intensified the force but the people are protecting the brothers.

The people of Kansas City, Missouri are saying aloud, "No more occupation of our community." They are tired of the pigs that are here to contain them and carry out their fascist acts. The brothers in their revolution set of obtaining the pig and beating the heat, set an example for others in the black community. Chief Kelly and his sty of pigs will not find the brothers and since they are looking they had better beware. The people are at large, and today's pig may well be tomorrow's bullet-riddled bacon.

Let all the oppressors of the people beware. Dacy was an off-duty pig; the next pig may be on duty. As Harry mentioned in "Correct Handling of a Revolution," the pig may well be sitting at a counter drinking a cup of coffee and come on mission. The brothers are ready and they will deal with the fascist pig.

Since the Panthers established a chapter here in late January, they and the police have been engaged in a tense war of nerves.

Questions to Visitors

The police at first placed Panther headquarters under 24-hour-a-day surveillance, stopping and questioning almost everyone, black and white, who left the building. They cut down this practice after a few weeks, but the surveillance of known Panther members has continued. Arrests have been numerous.

The Panthers regard this as police harassment.

Their actions against the police have been provocative from the start. They openly call the police "pigs" and at times tried to "patrol" the police in the Negro community. They posed for photographs with rifles at a press conference.

At a Panther rally on the steps of the federal courthouse building in early May, 22 men and four women Panther members repeatedly chanted verses punctuated with the exclamation, "Off the pigs!" which was shouted with the right hands upraised, fists clenched.

Provocation to Peak

In terms of provocative acts by the black activists, however, this article carried with it the strongest emotional sting yet.

Chief Kelley, when asked for his reaction to it, grimaced and pulled a copy of it from a pile of papers on his desk.

While some persons may look upon the article as "just a bunch of rhetoric that really doesn't mean what it sounds like it means," Chief Kelley said, it is bound to have an effect on the officers.

He said the police department had worked hard to bring about better understanding between officers and the Negro community.

"But this type of thing, among those officers who are coming to a point of understanding, is going to destroy all they've been taught," he said. "They're going to be saying to themselves, 'Wait. What I've been taught is entirely wrong.'"

The article also will engender a new sense of fear among many policemen, he said.

He objected to the apparent backing he said the article gave to bandits, and said the viewpoint therefore was "antisocial" and "anti-law."

Backing for Bandits

"You have to stop holdups," Kelley said. "It's not just a matter of property. It's a matter of law and order and justice and tranquility and peace. Yet this condones holdups."

After saying he believed the article indicated "practically a declaration of war" by the Panthers, the chief added:

"We certainly won't ourselves do anything to start such a war, but the activities of the Panthers certainly should be better understood by the people in light of what they say."

"All of us share a disgust about this type of thing. While we don't want to start trouble, this seems to mean they're trying to invite trouble."

"I certainly hope none of our fine citizens in the Negro community suffer because of this."

Backed by O'Neal

O'Neal, reached last night at the Panther headquarters, spoke strongly in endorsing the article.

"We believe every word of it," he said.

He said the police "escalated" matters on July 22 when a large number of policemen surrounded a home occupied by several Panthers at 3903 Olive street, hoping to enter the house in search of one of the persons being sought in connection with the Dacy shooting.

A police helicopter also was used, he said.

Neighbors in the area demonstrated overwhelming support for the Panthers that night, O'Neal said, by training firearms on the police from windows and rooftops in the event trouble broke out.

Chief Kelley said several Panthers were present, but did not confirm the reputed show of support.

He said several patrolmen had reason to believe that a juvenile being sought for questioning in the Dacy shooting had run to the house when he fled police. The youth was thought to associate with Panthers.

Wait on Evidence

Chief Kelley said the patrolmen contacted superiors concerning a search warrant, but were advised they probably did not have sufficient evidence for a warrant.

The youth turned himself in at police headquarters the next day, and is one of two juveniles being held in the shooting, Chief Kelley said. He said the youth was not a Panther.

An adult also being held has been charged with first-degree murder and robbery.

O'Neal said two policemen made threats when they were not admitted to the house, adding that those two "could be next." Both officers are Negroes.

Asked if the Panthers were endorsing holdups in the article, O'Neal replied that robbing a place such as Jo-Art's for a small amount of money was a trivial thing to do, "but we understand black people reacting to oppressive conditions."

"If you're going to liberate something from the oppressor," he said, "it should be from something like City National or Commerce Trust."

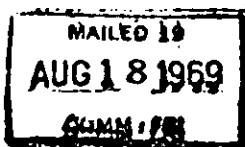

- (2) Three boxes weighing a total of approximately 40 pounds containing black inch-long pellets, resembling a type of insulation for copper wiring, etc., with perforations. (See photo). Of the three pellets shown in the photograph, one is on its side with a yellow stripe running lengthwise. The second has been broken in half showing the core of the pellet and is photographed from above. The third is also photographed from above but is intact. (S)u

At a later date [REDACTED] volunteered that on a recent trip to East St. Louis, Illinois, he had seen several boxes of what he termed "compressed gunpowder." When asked to describe the items, their description exactly fit the pellets mentioned above in #2. (S)u

At that time, through an established contact of the Alton, Illinois, RA, a test was run on the pellet at the Olin-Matheson Plant in Alton, a copy of the results of which is enclosed for each office. ETC

It is the opinion of the Springfield Division, after igniting several of the above-mentioned gunpowder pellets, that they are highly flammable and would make excellent primers or fuses for homemade type explosives. Because of their flammability, the ghetto source mentioned above, who furnished the pellets, requested they be taken from his premises, which they were, and have been stored in an appropriate storage vault at the Illinois National Guard, Camp Lincoln, Illinois. (S)u

The Bureau is requested to advise if they have received any previous inquiries concerning the above items (1 & 2), especially with reference to their being in the hands of black militants in other Field Divisions.

Receiving offices are requested, where feasible, to exhibit photographs to racial informants in an effort to determine if the use of these items is widespread by black militants.

A member of your staff delivered a sample of powder for identification. The sample was identified as an artillery or cannon-type propellant. Propellants of this general type are utilized in the BALL POWDER process at East Alton. It is ground and the deterrents removed by an extraction process in order to recover the nitrocellulose for subsequent processing into BALL POWDER. Such powders are government surplus stocks and most likely were manufactured at government installations during World War II or the Korean conflict. Following are known government owned-contractor operated facilities in the country which have the capability of producing this type of powder:

Badger Army Ammunition Plant, Baraboo, Wis.
Radford Army Ammunition Plant, Radford, Va.
Sunflower Army Ammunition Plant, Lawrence, Kan.
Indiana Army Ammunition Plant, Charlestown, Ind.
Alabama Army Ammunition Plant, Childersburg, Ala.

The Hercules Powder Co., Kenil, New Jersey, a commercial supplier, also has the capability of producing such powders, as well as the Naval Powder Factory, Indian Head, Maryland, which is government-owned and operated. Of course, the powders could be stored at many other locations and loading facilities scattered throughout the country.


The Ordnance Ammunition Command located in Joliet, Illinois engineers all activities in these areas and should be able to supply more detailed information. There are storage facilities located in the same area, which may contain powders of the type in question.



This type cartridge is not designed for use in military shoulder-type grenade launchers. (X) U

The copper band on the cartridge, which is depicted in the photograph, is the rotating band which is an integral part of the projectile portion of the cartridge. (X) U

According to information available to the Laboratory propellant powder of the type depicted in second photograph furnished as an enclosure to relet is not used in 40mm cartridges. Based on size and configuration, propellant powder of the size shown in the photograph is used in larger military ordnance such as artillery rounds. (X) U

The Laboratory can recall no instance in which cartridges or propellant powder such as that being discussed was submitted to the Laboratory.

I am sorry for not having written sooner, however, I have expended considerable time and effort in gathering facts concerning a matter which is of interest to all of us who are alumni of Yale. Frankly, I am extremely alarmed with our administration in allowing the BlackPanthers to openly operate on campus.

A series of events have taken place in recent months involving this organization which are repugnant to me; however, because of my sensitive position, I am unable to identify myself, and must remain anonymous.

Earlier this year, officials of our Medical School invited representatives of the Black Panther organization to participate in a lecture at Winslow Auditorium concerning the Black Panthers and American health. During a dissertation by two Panthers, a Mr. Gonzalvez and Mrs. John Huggins, those in attendance were encouraged to support a Black Panther sponsored free medical clinic for colored people. In its own right this would on the surface appear to be a generous undertaking to the community by Yale. However, recent events would indicate that this was merely a ploy by the Panthers to cajole Yale into providing financial assistance to a clinic which in the event of armed revolution would provide secret medical care for wounded members of the Black Panther Party. I feel this is well documented based on the following information.

On May 17th, a Black Panther all-day retreat was held on the campus in Linsly-Chittenden Hall. It was attended by approximately fifty persons from throughout the State and was presided over by national leaders of the Black Panther Party from California. Rory Hithe gave a speech on the discipline and assassination of Black Panther informers. Mrs. Huggins was also present. You will recall that her former husband, John Huggins, Jr., was murdered in a racial dispute at UCLA in January of this year. You will also recall that Huggins' father is the Manager of the Fence Club.

During the evening of May 19th, with the permission of our administration, Mr. Bobby Seale, National Panther leader from California, appeared at Battel Chapel for a speech. He received several thousand dollars for this appearance. Men and women who attended were searched for weapons at the door. Throughout the speech, persons in the audience smoked, and the speech by Mr. Seale was punctuated with numerous vulgarities and obscenities of the worst sort. Among those in attendance was our "Chaplain" Bill Coffin who appeared not to be the least bit concerned by Seale's foul language.

I feel it is a sad day in America when an individual is not allowed to enter a house of worship until searched and a speaker is allowed to flagrantly use obscenities and four-letter words before the altar of God. I am also distressed to think that Yale would allow individuals of his calibre on our campus. Certainly the administration was aware of the past reputation of Mr. Seale as well as known acts of violence committed by the organization he represents.

On May 22nd, three days after Mr. Seale's appearance here, the New Haven Police Department raided the Black Panther headquarters in New Haven and arrested three Panthers in connection with the torture and murder of a reported Panther from New York City. Subsequently, additional Panthers were arrested and according to the local press the victim had been held captive and tortured for several days prior to his death. Undoubtedly, Mr. Seale was in town at the time he was held captive and possibly when he was murdered. Is it possible he knew about this situation? I cannot help but wonder if he gave the orders for execution.

I fail to understand the purpose of bringing these people to our institution. Are they teaching or setting an example for our youth who are very easily influenced at this age? Are they here for educational purposes? It appears Mr. Seale's qualifications for teaching relate only to revolution and violence. At one point in his speech he stated that the "kids" have to be taught how to use guns so they can "kill the racist pigs" when they come into their neighborhoods. Was Mr. Seale here to give guidance concerning poverty programs? During his speech he did not present one single suggestion aimed at overcoming our national or local poverty problems. In short,

he contributed nothing toward our educational processes. No one in our community benefited from his appearance.

Most disappointing of all was the fact that the reputation of Yale was tarnished by this and other events. This reputation was achieved through the efforts of great men like Hale, Vanderbilt, Calhoun, Pierson and others and not the likes of Mr. Seale.

I contend that the above events have brought immeasurable notoriety to our institution. My advanced age and conservative image leave me helpless - but the above events call for action on the part of each and every thinking alumni. I feel great damage has been done and unless appropriate steps are taken in high places to prevent recurrences of similar situations, Yale's reputation may be further tarnished. Of additional concern is the fact that appearances of persons like Mr. Seale and the offering of Yale facilities to militant groups such as his could lead to violence and destruction not only in the community but also on the Yale campus.

I submit this letter for your consideration. Yale is not the first school to have been duped by these people. Possibly you can help prevent further disastrous mistakes - poor and weak decisions and "fuzzy" thinking by college administrators throughout the country.

Again my apologies for finding it necessary to remain anonymous.

It is believed that this information should be added to the anonymous communication mailed [REDACTED]. New Haven should add a postscript to the anonymous communication pointing out Seale's arrest and clear involvement in the murder of Alex Rackley, together with New Haven newspaper clippings pertaining to the murder and the arrest.

New Haven must insure that this matter is handled so that the Bureau is never divulged as the source of the communication. Advise of any results received.

NOTE: New Haven has forwarded a proposed anonymous communication purportedly from a disgusted member of the Yale University Alumni. The letter is addressed to [REDACTED]

The letter is a complaining one and points out [REDACTED] that Yale University has gone out of their way to aid and comfort the Black Panther Party. At the United Front Against Fascism Conference, held in Oakland last weekend, a leaflet was circulated, viciously attacking Professor Don Freed, organizer of the L.A. Friends of the Panthers. The leaflet, headed "Don Freed Is A Pig," maliciously accused him of being an informer for the Pig Power Structure. Similar attacks have been waged against such people as Professor Leon Nower, head of the San Diego Friends of the Panthers, and Professor Paul Zilsel, of Cleveland, who also is organizing in support of the Black Panther Party.

Who are these people? And why have they suddenly become the focal point of such vilifying accusations? These men are indicative of the growing masses of white-middle-class people who are attempting to expose the true nature of our decadent society.

Don Freed has been a strong supporter of the Black Panthers. He was instrumental in forming the Newton & Cleaver Defense Fund, and more recently, the L.A. Friends of the Panthers. An attack

on Don Freed is an attempt to create disunity within the white community, and is also a direct assault on the Black Panther Party.

It is very important for the people to understand that once you start, as these men have, to become a moving force against incipient fascism in America, you are an immediate threat to the Power Structure. These men are exercising their democratic rights to expose and oppose the oppressive system that exists in our country.

In forming the Friends of the Panthers, these professors have succeeded in creating a link between the poor and oppressed white people, and the Black Panther Party. We recognize the Panthers as the vanguard in the revolutionary struggle against fascism in America.

We support the Panther Ten-Point Program and are attempting to work in a parallel fashion with them in their fight against racism and imperialism. We also support fully their program of Decentralization of Police and will work along with them to implement this

program.

Therefore, we too have become a threat to the Power Structure. Leaflets will continue to be circulated in a vain attempt to destroy the Black Panthers by discrediting men who, like these professors, have organized and raised the level of consciousness of white people in order to join in the struggle for liberation.

The reactionary forces will make a last desperate struggle to maintain the status quo and suppress all progressive movements in our country. But they cannot frighten us away with leaflets, threats or terrorists tactics. For it is the mere existence of these tactics that exposes their inner weakness, while at the time, acts as a force to unify the masses to oppose these reactionary forces and put an end to the power of Finance Capital.

A telephonic check with the Seattle Office during the night and early morning of August 6-7, 1969, revealed that one of the automobiles, a black over red 1969 Pontiac bearing Washington State licenses, was possibly occupied by UFAP-Forgery Fugitive [REDACTED] and had been rented in Seattle, Washington by a Negro female resembling [REDACTED] on June 13, 1969.

This automobile was observed in front of a New Haven BPP member's residence on the morning of August 7, 1969, however, before surveillance could be established contact was lost.

The facts of the case were presented to AUSA [redacted] New Haven, who advised that he would authorize ITSMV charges against all occupants of the vehicle.

All in service radio units of the FBI were alerted and the car was observed proceeding North on Route 84, near Vernon, Connecticut.

With Connecticut State Police assistance, the car was stopped and the following individuals charged with ITSMV violations:

The San Francisco Division telephonically advised that [redacted] they had learned that with the exception of [redacted], the other individuals were in the "training cadre" of the Boston Chapter of the BPP.

During the Commissioner's hearing held on the evening of August 7, 1969, [redacted] threatened [redacted] who was present at the hearing as a witness and affiant by using the words, "We're going to be back and we're going to get everybody."

[redacted] was immediately advised of this statement and he filed the additional charge of intimidating a witness against [redacted] and the warrant was issued on August 8, 1969.

[redacted] was required to post a \$15,000 bond on the ITSMV charges and \$6,500 on the intimidation charge. [redacted] was required to post a \$15,000 bond, [redacted] a \$7,500 bond, and [redacted] \$5,000 bond.

Search of the automobile yielded the taped conversation of what is believed to be a BPP meeting held in New Haven on August 6, 1969, by [redacted] and members of the New Haven and Boston Chapters.

Also recovered was what is believed to be the membership list of the New Haven Chapter.

This is to recommend attached item concerning Leroy Eldridge Cleaver, fugitive leader of the extremist Black Panther Party (BPP), [REDACTED] on a confidential basis for lead purposes.

Cleaver, Minister of Information of the BPP, is a fugitive from justice, having jumped bond in California. Cleaver has appeared in Algeria, stating he resided in Cuba prior to coming to Algeria. We have received information that Cleaver is unable to return to Cuba because of a rape charge against him there. In addition, Cleaver appears to a source to be mentally ill; his long history of sex crimes would certainly indicate this, and this may be another reason why he cannot return to Cuba.

Furnishing the above information [REDACTED] on a confidential basis would not jeopardize any Bureau sources and, if verified by the news media source, would expose this BPP leader as a degenerate who has continued his criminal behavior after his involvement in the revolutionary, black extremist, BPP.

Is Anyone for Coloring?

A FEW WEEKS ago it got out that a publication existed called the "Black Panther Coloring Book." Ordinarily, when the word spreads that an interesting book exists, the publishers rush to make it available to the general public.

But in this case the response was to suppress the publication; indeed, to refuse to make it available to anyone at all. So successful was the suppression of the Black Panther Coloring Book that even industrious journalists were unable to put their hands on a copy, so that, very quickly, it moved out of the news.

AN ANTI-LEFT newsletter called Combat (a subsidiary of National Review) got hold of a copy of the Coloring Book and reproduced it on the assumption that the contents of the Coloring Book are of enormous public interest, as indeed they are. They bear on the question of what is the proper attitude of the public, and of the government, towards the Black Panther Party. Ought it to be an attitude of toleration, or of patience, or of — what?

There are 22 full page drawings, with captions. One shows a jackbooted pig, dressed in the full paraphernalia of the policeman. The caption is: "This is a pig. He tries to control black people." The pig-policeman rises up taller than the surrounding skyscrapers in another picture, a pistol in one hand, the other stretched out to receive a bribe. A white businessman, also a pig, is vacuuming money out of the black area of the city. Caption: "The pig tries to protect the white stores in black communities that rob black people."

Next is a Black Panther (the human being) followed by a little boy and little girl. His pistol is ablaze, and one sees that the slug has entered the throat of the pig policeman, and blood is spattering out — "Black brothers protect black children."

The little children learn quickly. The next tableau shows a pig policeman his hands held high at the beckoning of a pistol which is almost as big as the little boy who levels it at his head.

There are another half dozen pictures, all of them drawn in the style of primitive proletarian art, all of them to the same purpose: all of them depicting heroism as the act of killing policemen.

Now there appears to be some confusion concerning the exact provenance of the pamphlet. A Catholic priest in San Francisco, where it was first distributed, rushed to aver that it was not an official publication of the Party, that it had been distributed only for the sake of "evaluation," whatever that means. But a defector from the Black Panthers testified that the book was authentic, that he himself had worked in the print shop where it was produced.

AT THIS POINT the leadership of the Panthers, who have been soliciting respectability, denounced not only the pamphlet, but the defector, insisting that he had become an agent provocateur: i.e., that he had been planted inside the Black Panthers in order to discredit them. And back and forth and forth and back, reeling the mind.

When Bobby Kennedy was assassinated, he appeared in the official Black Panther newspaper lying in his own blood, his features drawn over into the shape of a pig. The good priest in San Francisco will have a difficult time shriving the Black Panthers. Those who wish to see what it is all about will be sent a free copy of the reproduction of the Coloring Book. 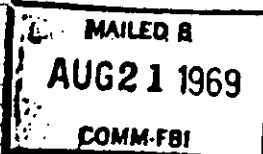

This was an attempt to disrupt the Breakfast Program and to prevent the formation of Panther "Liberation Schools" which were being planned. As a continuing disruptive technique permission is requested now to anonymously mail copies of an article printed in a San Francisco newspaper by conservative writer William F. Buckley, Jr. This article points out the vicious nature of the Panthers and the ridiculousness of the BPP Coloring Book. We are authorizing this proposal. There is not a chance that the Bureau will be divulged as the source with resultant embarrassment.

The following plans are submitted for Bureau's and other offices' consideration.

The first plan is more limited in scope and is based on the assumption that it makes no difference whether the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) meets the Black United Front's (BUF) demands or not, and on the fact that the National Welfare Rights Organization (NWRO) has already agreed to lend its support to the NMC without any conditions attached. The NWRO is essentially a Black organization of welfare recipients. It would seem sufficient to arrange for the NWRO to receive copies of the actual BUF demands upon the NMC, either anonymously or otherwise, to start NWRO people to thinking, "Why should we poor assist the NMC for nothing when the 'fat cats' at BUF are getting paid for the promise of their support?" Logically, the NWRO should come to the conclusion

that it should make similar demands on the NMC on condition that if its demands are not met, it will withdraw its support. Even if the NWRO does not reach this conclusion, it is certain that many of its members will be resentful of BUF and the NMC. On the other hand, BUF should resent the NWRO demanding its share of the "loot". This could also alienate other Black groups who may be planning to support the NMC.

The NMC will be placed in the untenable position of either meeting the demands, which would obviously weaken the organization financially and otherwise, or if it refuses, lose the Black support which it seeks. It is conceivable that the resulting situation might force the NMC to cancel its mass rally on Washington, D. C., 11/15/69.

In order to implement the foregoing, WFO would utilize sources and other means to agitate within the BUF, insisting its demands are reasonable and due the Black community; therefore, the NMC must meet them. Within NWRO it would be argued that "we" poor people need help much more so than does BUF; that the NMC must help us, too, if it wants our support.

Field offices having NMC representation would utilize their sources in splitting the NMC. Some sources would be directed to argue that to meet the demands is "pure extortion". Others should take the position that it is the duty of white liberals everywhere to support the needs of the Black community. That this is one of the paramount goals of liberals, to fight for the eradication of racism, ghettos, poverty and inequalities between Blacks and whites, wherever they exist. Through mutual respect and cooperation, both can be more effective in their struggles against The Establishment.

This division of opinion should create serious schisms within the NMC Steering Committee and between the organizations which it represents.

The second plan contemplates that the NMC will meet in part, at least, the BUF demands, and would not preclude execution of the first.

WFO contemplates the enlistment by the Bureau of a [redacted] who would be fed sufficient material and leads with which he could write a special feature "expose" of the "blackmail" of the NMC by the Black militants. Even if the NMC refuses to meet any part of the demands, it would seem that a newsworthy story could be written concerning the attempted "extortion".

Assuming that the "expose" is written and picked up on one of the wire services, it would serve the purpose of alerting Black militant groups in other cities to the possibility of milking white liberals in their community. For example, the Black Panthers in Chicago might get the idea that they could demand and get money for their support of the October 11, 1969, demonstrations in connection with the conspiracy trials. This could be repeated in other areas such as New York, Los Angeles, et cetera. The resulting bickering, resentment and distrust could be fomented by sources with the hope that the New Left and the Blacks become so ineffective they will be devoting all their time and energy defending themselves. At the very least, it should turn around the tendency for groups such as the Students for a Democratic Society and the Black Panthers to unite for common goals.

During the two-week period 8/4-15/69, Baltimore did not take any specific counterintelligence measures against the Black Panther Party (BPP).

For the information of the Bureau, the Baltimore Chapter of the BPP remains without significant leadership [REDACTED]

It has been brought to the attention of the Baltimore Office that the BPP headquarters has been playing a record by ELDRIDGE CLEAVER very loudly and disturbing the neighborhood. A private citizen made an anonymous phone call to the Baltimore Police Department complaining about the noise. As a result of this complaint, Baltimore Police Officers were dispatched to BPP Headquarters and attempted to gain entrance peacefully to tell the residents to turn down the volume of the record player. The officers were not admitted and they left the area.

It is being suggested by Baltimore that when it is known that the BPP members are playing their various propaganda records or attempting to broadcast to the neighborhood the BPP message, that an anonymous phone call be made to the Police Department complaining of the noise.

As noted in referenced letter, a press release was made in Omaha on August 4, 1969, by Assistant Chief of Staff JUNE HILLIARD, National Black Panther Party, stating that there no longer was an official chapter of the Black Panther Party in Omaha and EDDIE BOLDEN had been expelled from the party and was no longer connected with the BPP.

Since that time information has been developed that HILLIARD, while in Omaha, gave instructions that two "brothers" should be sent to Oakland, California, for training however, these instructions were later changed to send two "brothers" to Kansas City for training.

Although the BPP in Omaha is considered defunct by National Headquarters, it appears that this chapter at a future date will be reactivated possibly under the leadership of [REDACTED] who, according to Kansas City, recently arrived in Kansas City, Missouri, to attend a BPP training school.

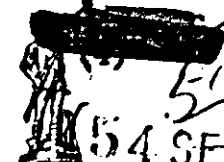
In view of the foregoing Omaha does not feel that concrete recommendations could be made at the time re counterintelligence measures aimed at crippling the BPP.

There are no counterintelligence operations now being effected at this time. Cleveland continues to remain alert for any activity which might logically lend itself to counterintelligence operations.

3. TANGIBLE RESULTS

Cleveland has not achieved any tangible results under this program since the submission of referenced letter. Forty-five photographs [REDACTED] and agent personnel of the Cleveland Office depicting activity by black extremist elements were submitted under the general counterintelligence program captioned COUNTERINTELLIGENCE PROGRAM, BLACK NATIONALIST - HATE GROUPS - RACIAL INTELLIGENCE (VISUAL AIDS).

[REDACTED], is a Negro male, associate of [REDACTED] who is [REDACTED] Tougaloo College Political Action Committee (PAC), a SNCC affiliate. He is on the Jackson Division Agitator Index.

In the Spring of 1969, [REDACTED] received a grant of \$6,000 from the Episcopal Church to finance his Jackson Human Rights Project in the Georgetown ghetto area of Jackson. Only about \$2,200 in funds have been provided [REDACTED] so far from this initial grant.

As a counterintelligence measure, it is desired that certain self-appointed leaders of the black militant group in the community be discredited before reaching any prominent stature. In this regard, the following suggestion is being set forth for consideration and approval:

On 7/28/69, [REDACTED] advised a large group of individuals representing themselves to be members of the Florida Black Front (FBF) and led by [REDACTED] appeared at 11:00 AM, 7/20/69, at the Day Spring Baptist Church, Jefferson Street. Approximately sixty Negro Baptist pastors were attending their weekly meeting of the Baptist Brotherhood, consisting of Negro Baptist pastors from Jacksonville and adjacent counties. The group made a demand of \$1000. as an immediate grant for Welfare Mothers Organization efforts. Pastors were not permitted to leave for over three hours, at which time they agreed to the payment demand.

Arrest warrants were initially issued for fourteen individuals, the majority of whom are employed with or in conjunction with Greater Jacksonville Economic Opportunity (GJEO), a project financed by Office Economic Opportunity (OEO), in conjunction with the City of Jacksonville.

Charges have been dropped or dismissed against all defendants, with the exception of [REDACTED] organizer for the FBF and [REDACTED] an organization under GJEO; [REDACTED] FBF, [REDACTED] Project Unity, and [REDACTED] a group working with youth groups under GJEO; and [REDACTED]

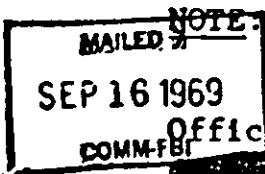

1) COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Due to the fact that the Black Student Association (BSA) - Memphis State University (MSU), is not a functioning organization during the summer months, no counterintelligence operations are under consideration directed against the BSA at MSU.

The black militant group known as the Invaders is not operative at the present time. Its headquarters are closed and no meetings are being held. LANCE "SWEET WILLIE WINE" WATSON, along with five other Invaders, is engaged in protest demonstrations at Forrest City, Arkansas, and informants have advised that due to arrests of numerous members of the Invaders and constant surveillance and observation of Invaders by local law enforcement officers, this organization does not presently exist as a functioning unit. Informants have advised that WATSON plans to return to Memphis in the Fall of 1969 and attempt to reactivate this Invader organization.

In view of the above, no counterintelligence operations are under consideration directed against the Invaders other than a continuing interview program directed against all rank-and-file members of the Invaders and those BSA members who are not in school at the present time.

A succinct summary of Black Nationalist Movement in the Indianapolis Division follows:

A. Nation of Islam (NOI)

The NOI in the Indianapolis Division presently has approximately 160 members, which is a slight increase since the date of the last letter. Temple Number 31 in South Bend, Indiana, continues to be the largest having about 70 to 80 members. Mosque Number 33 at Gary, Indiana, is the second largest with 40 members, and Muhammad's Mosque in Indianapolis is third largest with 27 members. Muhammad's Temple, East Chicago, Indiana, has six members; Muhammad's Temple in Evansville, Indiana, has five to six members; Muhammad's Mosque of Islam in Fort Wayne, Indiana, has five to six members, while Muhammad's Mosque in Muncie, Indiana, is no longer meeting for lack of a meeting place. The exact number of members presently in Muncie, Indiana is unknown. Each of the mosques or temples averages from four to seven visitors in addition to the members at their meetings.

There are only two designated temples in the State of Indiana those being Temple No. 31 in South Bend, and Mosque No. 33 in Gary, Indiana. Known Muslim businesses now operate at Muncie, and Indianapolis, Indiana. All of the leaders of the temples and mosques in the Indianapolis Division continue to adhere to the teachings of ELIJAH MUHAMMAD, their leader and

preach according to the following: the white race has upset the peace of the Aboriginal People by exploitation, robbery, murder and death, inasmuch as it is the nature in which they were made; that the only white people who are allowed to use one of the names of ALLAH (GOD) are those who have accepted Islam; that under Christianity the black brothers and sisters will not go to heaven, but under Allah, you will have heaven right here on earth.

No known or proposed violence or problems have been caused by the NOI in the Indianapolis Division and their potential does not seem a threat at this time. There is always a possibility however that the NOI might change due to some incident and cause trouble although not expected.

B. Radical Action Project (RAP)

The Radical Action Project (RAP), also known as the Black Radical Action Project, is located at 2264 North Meridian Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. The RAP is presently without funds, and the organization as such has become essentially defunct. Only two individuals, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Organizer of RAP, remain with the organization and they operate the Afro-American Bookstore which is owned by RAP. The bookstore is kept open by them and occupies most of their time even though the bookstore is not making money. Both individuals are in a bad way for funds for personal use and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] has been speaking at various rallies, etc., and has been pushing for unity among the black groups and their white allies, but has been unsuccessful in uniting the groups. RAP has operated within the existing legal structure and to date has posed no real threat of violence. It presently appears RAP will fold in the near future without funds.

C. Black Panther Party (BPP)

The BPP in Indianapolis operates from its headquarters at 113 West 30th Street, and persists in being the most active of the black extremist groups in Indianapolis at least with a potential for violence. [REDACTED] remains as [REDACTED] of the BPP in Indianapolis; however, he will soon be [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] In addition, [REDACTED] is no longer Minister of [REDACTED] and has been suspended from the BPP. [REDACTED], Minister of [REDACTED] has been removed from his position by [REDACTED] The BPP in Indianapolis has approximately 15 active members.

The BPP has had problems financially since their inception in Indianapolis and they presently have a conflict in the Chapter over misuse of funds, violation of BPP rules by members, and personality conflicts among leaders. As a result, the Indianapolis Chapter is in a state of confusion and members show distrust towards each other. The Chapter has requested assistance from National BPP Headquarters and two individuals from the Chicago Chapter of the BPP have been sent to Indianapolis to help with settling disputes and problems and to report to National Headquarters.

The BPP in Indianapolis, along with a coalition of the black groups in Indianapolis, has started a Breakfast for School Children Program, however the BPP has not been allowed to teach BPP ideas and doctrine to the children and are not allowed to put up posters, etc. by the other groups.

The BPP have not been responsible for any trouble in Indianapolis to date; however, it is still felt that they possess the most potential for violence of any of the black groups. The BPP is followed regularly in a bi-weekly intelligence letter.

1. Operations Under Consideration

Interviewing all members of black extremist organizations active and inactive members alike, will be continued, as it is felt that this is the most productive method of producing possible informants as well as a way of learning information of value for intelligence purposes. While the BPP as a rule will not talk to agents and little success has been recognized in recent attempts to interview BPP members, it does keep the leaders of the BPP worried and unsure if someone is talking to the FBI and they do not know about it. Interview of the members also serves as a way to help determine the feeling in the black community and to help evaluate individuals potential for violence.

2. Operations Being Effected

Refinancing of RAP by the Episcopal Church was discouraged and any sources of funds for RAP are being discouraged causing RAP to continue in their financial troubles. Anonymous mailings of several articles on the BPP breakfast program and organization along with the BPP Coloring Book were made to several ministers in the black community near BPP Headquarters to help discourage their support of a Breakfast for School Children Program run by the BPP.

In addition in all interviews attempts to intensify the jealousy among various organizations and members are played upon. This is serving to keep the black groups from uniting whereby they might pose a more serious threat to the peace and safety of the community.

3. Tangible Results

RAP is suffering from lack of funds and will logically be folding in the near future. The BPP, along with the black coalition, which is a group of black organizations, have started a Breakfast Program, however the BPP has been allowed only to help fix food and to clean up after the breakfast, and can not teach the children or display any posters, etc.,

concerning the BPP. In addition, the Chairman of the BPP, [REDACTED] has expressed concern that attempts to interview members of the BPP are continually being made, and a distrust and conflict has arisen among members of the BPP.

In accordance with instructions set forth in Bulet dated 3/4/68, the following data is submitted:

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

As the Bureau is aware, [REDACTED] of the Black United Front (BUF) in Washington, D. C. (WDC) recently sent a letter to a representative of the New Mobilization Committee against the War in Vietnam (NMC) demanding that the NMC make a good faith payment of \$25,000 to the BUF to obtain the support of the BUF for the anti-war demonstration being planned by the NMC for 11/15/69. This demand of the BUF has caused considerable confusion in the NMC which is now divided into factions, one which opposes any payment, the other which supports the idea of the payment. The NMC is further confused by the fact that it is already in debt for previous anti-war demonstrations and has no money readily available to make any payment to the BUF. Further, members of the BUF Central Committee, who supported [REDACTED] proposal to demand the money from NMC, have privately agreed, according to WFO sources, to provide only token assistance if the money is paid by NMC and to oppose and work against the 11/15/69 demonstration if payment is not made.

Two plans to exploit this situation in furtherance of the aims of the counterintelligence program were set out in re WFO airtel 8/22/69. In the event that the plans as set forth do not meet the approval of the Bureau, it is felt that a laissez faire approach will accomplish the same result because there is certain to be ill will between the various factions involved regardless of whether payment is made or not.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

WFO is not currently effecting any operation under the counterintelligence program.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

As the Bureau is aware, WFO was closely following the activities of the United Black Brotherhood (UBB), an organization originally formed by [REDACTED] to be the Washington Chapter of the BPP but which failed to get approval of the BPP National Office. [REDACTED] subsequently took over this group and said that the UBB would be a front for the Black Guard (BG) of the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM). [REDACTED] that UBB members were going to Richmond, Virginia, to take part in a demonstration there. [REDACTED] that some firearms would be taken by the group. Cooperation between the FBI and local authorities brought about the arrest of this group in Petersburg, Virginia, at which time, four long guns were seized from the group. Although charges against the group were subsequently dropped, the firearms seized were not returned.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

A complete review of activities concerning the BPP is being conducted at the present time due to the numerous changes which have been inherent in BPP activities in the San Diego area. This review is being conducted to determine specifically where the BPP is presently most vulnerable.

[REDACTED] formerly of Los Angeles, has [REDACTED] of the San Diego BPP and information concerning him is being reviewed to determine how he can most effectively be attacked.

Reports received concerning the National Revolutionary Conference Against Fascism at Oakland on 7/18-21/69, are being reviewed to determine if any potential exists for counterintelligence activity related to this conference.

[REDACTED] has been an open advocate of the BPP "Breakfast Program" and the BPP activities in general. He has additionally provided sanctuary for BPP members and allowed them to utilize his church for overnight lodging. Requests aimed at neutralizing both [REDACTED] and the "Breakfast Program" are being prepared and will be submitted promptly.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

The only operation presently being effected in the San Diego Division is the continuance of the intensive interview program of BPP members.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

No tangible results have been noted since the date of referenced letter.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

Conflicts between the BPP and rival US Organization in the San Diego area continue and appear to be increasing.

On 8/14/69, according to a BPP bulletin, members [REDACTED] were shot at by US members.

On 8/15/69, [REDACTED] a member of the BPP, was shot and killed in the San Diego area allegedly by members of the US Organization.

In addition, there have been other unverified reports of shootings and beatings, including a beating of [REDACTED] the San Diego BPP. The beating [REDACTED] was, however, at the hands of other BPP members and is believed to be a result of what has been referred to as unacceptable conduct on the part of [REDACTED]. No additional information concerning this beating has been received.

Numerous efforts on the part of leading Negro businessmen in the San Diego area to effect a reconciliation between the two factions have been unsuccessful to date. Whenever it appears that a reconciliation is imminent, another beating, shooting, or killing erupts to nullify all efforts in this regard.

All of the above mentioned activities are being closely followed for any potential counterintelligence activity. In the event any instance occurs which would lend itself to this program, the appropriate counterintelligence action will be requested.

For the information of the Bureau, the following information does not pertain to counterintelligence action concerning the Bpp.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Attempts are presently being made to identify a young 14 year old female member of the US Organization in San Diego who has allegedly become pregnant as the result of the US cultural activities. When this individual is identified and, provided the information can be verified thus protecting the informant, appropriate requests for counterintelligence action will be submitted.

A request is currently being prepared concerning promptly. and will be submitted

Information concerning the incorporation of the US Organization has just been received from the Los Angeles Division. Upon evaluation of the information contained within the Articles of Incorporation, appropriate counterintelligence action will be requested as it may relate to the Internal Revenue Service and the filing of incumbent tax forms.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

During the past 90-day period, a fictitious name telephone call was placed to [REDACTED] protesting the occupancy of the building at 6181 Imperial by the US Organization. Results of this phone call appear in the Tangible Results section of this letter.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

On 7/24/69, a Bureau-approved fictitious name call was placed as mentioned above. Upon receipt of the information, [REDACTED] appeared surprised and disturbed over its content and related that [REDACTED] were quite elderly and could not sustain any financial loss inherent from their building being occupied by a militant group.

Although it cannot be specifically determined that the telephone call was responsible, the following day the US Organization was furnished with an eviction notice ordering them to vacate the premises at 6181 Imperial.

US has now obtained new quarters and moved into a building located at 4183 Market.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

As mentioned above, a 14 year old girl who is a member of the US Organization has become pregnant. A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has stated that the US members utilize the female members of the organization as community property and it was the result of this type of activity which was culminated in the girl's pregnancy.

Information has also been received that the BPP is talking about killing [REDACTED]. In this regard [REDACTED] is reportedly attempting to obtain assistance to do the killing.

The San Diego Police Department Intelligence Unit has been apprised of the alleged threat against [REDACTED].

The conflict between the US Organization and the BPP continues to widen at the present time and in the Los Angeles-San Diego area has thus far resulted in the murder of four BPP members, all allegedly at the hands of members of the US Organization. There continue to be numerous

unverified reports of shootings and/or beatings throughout the area and it would appear that activities of this nature will continue to increase in the forthcoming months.
