The Bureau will note in Jacksonville letter to the Bureau, 3/12/CC, captioned "The New Left - Road to Anarchy" that every effort is being made to ascertain if any activities connected therewith exist in the Jacksonville Division.

To date, no New Left movement or its key activists have been identified in the Jacksonville Division.

During the past several weeks there has been considerable controversy on the campus of Florida State University, Tallahassee, Florida, for the refusal of the president to permit a publication of an article in the campus newspaper, containing vulgar language. A small group of students backed by some members of the faculty, demonstrated. As a result of this controversy the president submitted his resignation which was not accepted by the Foard of Regions.

This incident received considerable publicity in the press and other news media, most of which was favorable to the stand taken by the president of the Florica State University.

At the University of Florida, Gainesville, Florida, student unrest has existed over such things as student housing, student publications, the student code of conduct, racial relations, ROTC and the like.

Therefore, no recommendations are being submitted for potential counterintelligence action against the New Left movement in the Jacksonville Division.



on 5/9/68 that the administration of Florida State University, Tallahassee, refused authority to publish a story containing a number of four letter words in the "Legend," a campus magazine.

As the result, about 250 students and a few faculty members met in protest.

A vigil was maintained in front of the Administration Building of the University consisting of from 10 to 150 students from 5/9/68 until 5/16/68.

Demands were presented to the administration of the University which included prompt publication of the story in the "Legend," public apologies to the editor and student body, firing of the Student Publication Advisor, and the change of rules by the administration to allow the publication of any article which does not violate the law.

On 5/27/68 a statement by the President of Florida State University was read at a meeting of about 300 students. The statement indicated that the President accepted in full two recommendations of a special student - faculty committee, which had been created after the demonstration began. These recommendations were for a permanent change in rules at Florida State University which would enlarge the Official Board of Student Publications, which reviews all campus publications, to make a majority of the board students. In general the new recommendations would give students much more control over approval of student publications.



NEW LEFT ACTIVITY FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

The demonstration was initially led by the editor of "The Legerd" and sympathetic students, including members of the Young Liberals. The demonstrators called themselves the Grassroots Movement" and a large segment of the Florida State University student body and a number of faculty members either participated with the demonstrators or were sympathetic to it.

Principal leader of the demonstration was Lymen Flatcher, President of the student body; the Student Senate and many members of the student government backed the action.

At i mass meeting held on May 27, 1955, an announcement from the President of the University was read which acquiested the students demands regarding more student participation in review and approval of publications. The announcement, however, refused to allow publication of the article in question under university auspices.

The demonstration was discontinued by majority vote of the students.

The Article was later published, as originally written in "The legend" under the sponsorship of the student government but not the Florida State University.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 12, 1968, that Florida State University, Tallahassee, Florida, had an enrollment of 15,500 students during the spring quarter of 1968. Most of the student activists at this University have been members of the Young Liberals Organization, which is a local, independent, campus approved student organization, with faculty sponsor. In recent years it has been loosely organized and has a small, constantly changing membership.

This group has the stated goal of promoting projects to improve "liberal" values and the members have been involved in promoting civil rights, student rights, peace and an opposition to the war in Vietnam. It is considered to be a vehicle, outlet, more or less in the form of a discussion group.

While the Young Liberals may be considered a part of the New Left, it is not as clearly defined as some of the national campus organizations.

A second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on June 12, 1968, corroborated the above information furnished by the first source.

A total of about 150 students and a few faculty members stood or walked in front of the Administration Building where Mr. Humphrey was speaking. The group dispersed shortly after Mr. Homphrey left the building

Some of the individuals carried signs protesting the war in Vietnam. There was no heckling, disorder or interference with the Vice President's speech or visit to the carpus,

The tirse and second sources advised that a peaceful, "anti-tensorshup" demonstration and virgil were conducted by Florida State University students in front or the campus Administration Building, periodically, irom May 9, 1968, to May 2/, 1988.

The students demonstrated in protest at the refusal of Florida State University President to approve for campus publication an article in the Florida State University Library magazine "The Legend," which contained what he believed to be vulgar and obscene language.

The article had been approved by the Florida State University Board of Student Publications, but the president, tem the final authority, order the offensive words removed from the article.



The University of Plorida, located in Gainerville, Florida, is a state university system with an enrollment of approximately 19,000 students, and an anticipated enrollment in the Fall of 1968 of over 20,000.

On June 26, 1968, Source 1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the main Student Left Organization at the University of Florida, PAMPUS Ginesville, is the Students For Democratic Society/ Committee (SDS/SSOC), which southern Student Organizing Committee (SDS/SSOC), which members during the past year have also composed the rembership of the Student Peace Union (SPU) and the Student Committee on Academic Preedom (SCAF), both Cimpus Organizations.

APPENDIX

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left," which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

APPENDIX

SOUTHERN STUDENT ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (SSOC)

On November 1, 1956, a first source advised that the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC) with headquarters at 1703 Fortland Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, was formed on the weekend of April 3-5, 1964, to stimulate activity of Southern student groups in areas of civil rights, peace, academic freedom, civil liberties, capital punishment and unemployment. Originally, it was to be a white counterpart of the Student Honviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). It has agreed to work with similar interested groups such as SNCC and Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), and Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF). SSCC is a fraternal affiliate of SDS.

Reginning in the Fall of 1956, 5800 became a membership organization and embarked on a campaign to form local chapters on various college campuses throughout the South. SSOC publishes, October through May each year, a publication, "New South Student", which according to the above source has increasingly espoused and defended the pro-Communist and enti-United States position on domestic and foreign policy.

On September 27, 1966, a second source advised that f Nashville, Tennessee, while in attendance at a Communist Party, USA (CPUSA) Youth Conference, Camp Web tuck, New York, gave a report regarding Nashville, saying that Cr personnel were concentrating on organizing rent strikes, working with SSOC and SCEF and establishing a Socialist Study Group for students. He predicted future rioting, which, he said, the CP must take advantage of. He emphasized that more CP youth must be sent South.



NEW LEFT ACTIVITY, FLORIDA AGRICULTURAL AND MECHANICAL UNIVERSITY, TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 12, 1968, that Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University, commonly known as Florida A&M University, is located in Tallahassee, Florida. The student body of approximately 3,800 students and faculty are predominantly of the Negro race.

The above source and another source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 20, 1968, that there are no organizations on the campus of Florida A&M University definitely defined as the New Left, although there was considerable disturbance at or near the University on April 4, 1968, following the death of Dr. Martin Luther King.

ladvised on June 11, 1968, that prior to the incidents which occurred on the night of April 4, 1968, made inflammatory statements on the campus which may have influenced other students to participate in the disturbances that followed.

Handreds of students milled around on or near the campus and during the night rocks were thrown at cars driven by persons of the whote race on streets adjoining the campus.

Incendiary devices, consisting of bottles filled with kerpeene or gasoline, were thrown at mobile homes and wooden buildings near the campus. Several of these structures were completely destroyed by fire.

During the night, shots were fired from the vicinity of the campus at police who had set up road blooks to stop traffic from passing near the campus.

A white youth was burned to death it a fire of incendiary nature which burned a store building in which he was sleeping.

Because of the high state of tension, Florida A&M authorities plosed the University for one week. There were no further incidents after the students returned to classes.

Eleven ind viduals, mostly florida AdM students, were arrested by the Isliahassee, Florida, Police Department for involvement in the incidents dealing with the disturbances. These cases have not come to trial as yet

Captain removed the sufficient number of leaves and advised he would have these leaves delivered to the Department of Health, Jacksonville, Florida, for a positive analysis to determine if the weed is actually marijuana.
