

I. SUCCINCT SUMMARY

NEW LEFT ORGANIZATIONS

The territory of Miami has only one functioning New Left organization, the "Southern Student Organizing Committee" (SSOC). SSOC has two local chapters, one in Miami (Miami-SSOC), the other at Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Florida (FAU-SSOC).

MIAMI-SSOC

Formed in the spring of 1967. Strength reportedly never exceeded five or so members.

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Activity, for the most part, consisted of staging and articipation in anti-war and anti-draft demonstrations. Their attempts to establish on-campus chapters at local institutions of learning proved unproductive. Recently, Miami-SSOC has been described as practically defunct.

the leading activist, in May, 1968, failed to report for induction as ordered. His status as a delinquent is currently being processed by the Selective Service System. An allegation has been received that he plans to flee the country and seek refuge in Canada.


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Organized in November, 1967, at Florida Atlantic University. They failed to obtain official campus recognition until April, 1968. Their activities during this period were restricted to obtaining this status. In the interim, resignations and student dropouts depleted their original membership of 11. To date, they are not known to have engaged in any specific activity as an organization.

In April,/1908, they were arrested by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office on an indecent literature charge stemming from the publication of the "Florida Free Press". This publication is an underground "hippie" type newspaper. Presently they are awaiting trial on this charge.

when FAU-SSOC was in a formative stage, certain students were concerned the organization was having a detrimental influence on the campus and that SSOC members who were also staff members for the student newspaper were changing the context of this publication to controversial issues rather than reporting school news, and decided on a course of action.

Since SSOC consisted of only 10 or possibly 12 members, they decided they would organize a group of stable students to attend a SSOC meeting at which new officers were to be elected. With their majority they could elect the officers from their own group and thus neutralize the activities of FAU-SSOC.

Thirty of these students attended a meeting whereat FAU-SSO difficers were to be elected. When it was apparent to the original SSOC members as to what might happen, they reverted to their by-laws and announced elections would not be held until the date stipulated in the constitution.

The leaders of the students who initiated this disruptive and neutralizing action contacted the Miami FBI to explain their purpose and to advise they were firm in their plans to follow through. They further stated they had contacted the FBI to insure themselves they were not getting involved in anything unpatriotic and unloyal to the U.S. Government. They were advised any information they desired to voluntarily contribute would be accepted by the FBI on this basis. They were cautioned that this did not indicate by inference any direct involvement with the FBI and that the entire matter would be considered, as in all cases, as information volunteered from interested public individuals.

IV. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE AGAINST ACTIVISTS

Background information is being obtained on SSOC activists and members. When completed, a determination will be made if such information in any way could be used to discredit them and ultimately the New Left organization.

Further, since the local chapters of SSOC are presently weak, consideration will be given to methods that might sow the seeds of disruption between the state and national SSOC organization with the local Miami organizations.

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

Referenced communication instructed recipient offices to furnish detailed information concerning allegations of police brutality, specific data with respect to immorality of New Left adherents, and action taken by college administrators against militant minority elements.

New Left elements within the Miami Division, to date, have not been involved in confrontation with college administrators. No encounters have occurred between New Left groups and police organizations.

Administrators at the University of Miami, Coral Gables, Plorida, a major campus, have established procedures for handling disruptive behavior, demonstrations or riots. The procedures call for a firm, rather than vacillating attitude, in considering student demands.

THE RESERVE

New Left activists in the Miami Division are presently under investigation. Consideration will be given to immorality on their part uncovered in these investigations to determine if it would have value under the captioned program.

Information with respect to the above will be furnished on a continuing basis as it occurs. Every opportunity to exploit the New Left to their detriment will be pursued.

The United Black Students (UBS) recently formed at the University of Miami, Coral Gables, Florida, but now is located off campus. It has not been included in the enclosed letterhead memorandum. The objectives of the UBS, such as scholarships for black students, more black instructors on the faculty, and introduction of black and African courses in the curriculum, have overtones of black militancy rather than those of New Left groups. The UBS staged a peaceful sit-in the University President's office to dramatize their detards in the University President's office to dramatize their detards. Fourteen were arrested for refusal to vacate the area. A report on the UBS and its activities has been submitted under the Racial Matters classification.

A minor protest occurred at the University of Bland in March, 1968. Students opposed to the Vietnam War, unorganized, staged an on-campus rally provoked by the presence of a U.S. Army Recruiting Team. Hawkish students briefly disrupted their attempts. The rally proceeded, however, in a peaceful manner. No arrests were made. No disruption occurred. The Army Recruiters were not subjected to interference. This incident also has not been included in the letterhead memorandum.

Campuses within the Miami territory presently appear to offer no potential for violence for the forthcoming school, year. The University of Miami, the major campus, has been publicly described and self-described as apathetic. New Left groups have not gained a foothold at this institution. Other campuses, the majority of which are state institutions, have as an enrollment principally commuter students who take little interest in campus activities and are on campus usually only when attending classes. It is, therefore, felt no violence will occur, although it is realized an influx of new students could rapidly change this situation.

APPENDIX

SOUTHERN STUDENT ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (SSOC)

On November 1, 1966, a first source advised that the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC), with headquarters at 1703 Portland Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, was formed on the week end of April 3-5, 1964, to stimulate activity of southern student groups in areas of civil rights, peace, adademic freedom, civil liberties, capital punishment and unemployment. Originally, it was to be a white counterpart of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). It agreed to work with similar interested groups, such as SNCC, Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), and Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF). SSOC is a fraternal affiliate of the SDS.

Beginning in the Fall of 1966, SSOC became a membership organization and embarked on a campaign to form local chapters on various college campuses throughout the South. SSOC publishes, October through May of each year, a publication, "New South Student," which, according to the above source, has increasingly espoused and defended a pro-communist and anti-United States position on domestic and foreign policies.

On September 27, 1965, a second source advised that DONALD BONER of Nashville, Tennessee, while in attendance at a Communist Party, USA (CPUSA) Youth Conference, Camp Webatuck, New York, September 12, 13 and 14, 1966, gave a report regarding Nashville, saying that CP personnel were concentrating on organizing rent strikes, working with SSOC and SCEF, and establishing a Socialist Study Group for students. He predicted future rioting, which he said the CP must take advantage of. He emphasized that more CP youth must be sent South.

On August 12, 1966, a third source advised that DONALD LESLIE BONER, a white male, age 22, of 3105 Louise Drive, Nashville, Tennessee, had been in the CP about four months.

On September 27, 1966, and again on June 2, 1967, the second source advised that during the Summer of 1966,

the CPUSA concentrated its youth cadre in organizing projects in several cities, in an effort to recruit for and strengther local CP youth organizations. Nashville, Tennessee, was included in this project. The youth placed in charge of the Nashville project was DONALD LESLIE BONER, with funds to be made available for three to five full-time organizers in Nashville. JACQUELINE SAINDON, also known as Jackie, of the CP in New York, New York, a Queens College student, came to Nashville in the Summer of 1966, for this purpose. At the CPUSA Youth Conference held at Camp Webatuck, New York, September 12, 13 and 14, 1966, BONER reported that effective liaison had been made with SSOC; that contact had also been made with black militants on Nashville Negro college campuses, and that a beginning had been made toward organizing in the Nashville Negro community. He said he thought a riot was possible in the near future in the Negro community, and the CP must take advantage of same. He emphasized that some Following the main efforts were to work with SSOC and SCEF. conference, attendees BRIAN HEGGEN and PATRICIA LOUISE RABBITT, also known as Patti Rabbitt, traveled to Nashville to join BONER's organizing efforts there.

On February 28, 1967, a fourth source advised that Patti Rabbitt of Seattle, Washington, a member of the Northwest CP District, had gone to Nashville, Tennessee, to organize in connection with a CP assignment.

On June 8, 1967, a fifth source advised that PATTI RABBITT, BRIAN HEGGEN, DONALD LESLIE BONER, and wife CAROL STEVENS BONER, are all active members of SSOC in Nashville, and that HEGGEN is now Editor of the official SSOC publication, "New South Student."

On July 7, 1967, a sixth source advised that DONALD BONER and wife CAROL BONER attended a CPUSA Youth Conference at Camp Abelard, New York, July 1 through 4, 1967.

The masthead of the June, 1967, issue of "Southern Patriot," official publication of SCEF, lists CAROL STEVENS BONER and ANNE BRADEN as Editors, and CARL BRADEN as Executive Director.

The "Nashville Banner," Nashville, Tennessee, newspaper, issue of May 5, 1967, reported SSOC was preparing for the May 17, 1967, appearance of MIKE ZAGARELL, National Youth Director, CPUSA, at Vanderbilt University, and that BILL DOSS, Press Agent for SSOC, on May 12, 1967, brought to the "Banner" office publicity material which the CP had sent to SSOC.

The April, 1967 issue, Volume IV, No. 4, of "New South Student," published each month, October through May, by SSOC, carried an article on Page 22 entitled "CIA American Labor," by DONALD BONER, a review of a book entitled "The CIA and American Labor," authored by GEORGE MORRIS, Labor Editor of "The Worker," east coast communist newspaper. BONER is described therein as an active member of the Nashville SSOC Chapter.

TUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE (SNCC)

Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360-362
Nelson Street, Southwest, Atlanta, Georgia, describes itself as not being a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protes movements. SNCC was born out of the sit-in movement which erupted across the South, beginning on February 1, 1960. A conference at Raleigh, North Carolina, that spring, brought together many of the demonstrating southern students in a loose network of militant youth which was officially named SNCC in October of 1960.

CARMICHAEL was elected National Chairman by the Central Committee. In May of 1967, CARMICHAEL was replaced as Chairman by H. RAP BROWN, with CARMICHAEL assuming the position of Recruiter and Organizer for the SNCC. In August of 1967, at the invitation of FIDEL CASTRO, CARMICHAEL participated in the Organization of Latin American Solidarity Conference, which was held in Havana, Cuba. Subsequent thereto, CARMICHAEL traveled to Hanoi and other sections of North Vietnam. He returned to the United States in December of 1967, at which time his passport was picked up because of travel to unauthorized countries.

A source advised that when CARMICHAEL was elected Chairman of the SNCC, the organization embarked on a program of eliminating Caucasians from its ranks. With the election of H. RAP BROWN as Chairman in 1967, it embarked on a world-wide struggle for human rights, and to take a firm stand against violations of these rights by the American Government and to strengthen its programs of opposition to the draft and to the United States involvement in Vietnam.

Literature distributed in February of 1968, identifies the SNCC as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.

On August 13, 1967, while addressing a group in the Watts area of Los Angeles, California, H. RAP BROWN said, "You better shape up in America, or we'll burn you down." Later in February of 1968, in a publicized note, BROWN wrote, "America, if it takes my death to organize my people to revolt against you and your children, your God, you poor, your country, and you organize mankind to rejoice in your destruction and ruin then here's my life."



TUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY (SDS)

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the Left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General, Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible Left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization, as of April 18, 1967, were located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

APPENDIX

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC. (SCEF)

The Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) was cited as a communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 12, 1947. In the same House report, "The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the SCHW.

An amendment to the charter of SCHW, dated April 26, 1946, changed its name to the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Incorporated (SCEF) and stated its purpose to be to improve the educational and cultural standards of the southern people in accordance with the highest American democratic institutions, traditions and ideals.

The masthead of the April, 1967, issue of "The Southern Patriot" indicates that it is the publication of SCEF, editorial and business offices of which are located at 3210 West Broadway, Louisville, Kentucky, eastern office of which is located at Suite 412, 799 Broadway, New York, New York. "The Southern Patriot" is published once each month, except July. SCEF is stated to be dedicated to ending discrimination based on race, creed, color, sex, national origin or economic condition.

Carl Braden is identified as Executive Director of SCEF and Anne Braden as Editor of "The Southern Patriot."

Mrs. Alberta Ahearn, 2311 Payne Street, Louisville, Kentucky, a self-admitted former member of the Communist Party (CP), Louisville, Kentucky, testified on December 11 and 13, 1954, in Jefferson County, Kentucky Criminal Court in a State sedition prosecution against Carl James Braden. She identified Carl Braden and his wife, Anne McCarty Braden, as having been known to her as members of the CP from January, 1951, to December, 1954.

The SCEF is self-described as having deep roots in the South where it began as the educational wing of the SCHW, organized in 1938 to work for economic and political reform.

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC. (SCEF)

When the SCHW disbanded in the late 1940's, SCEF continued as an independent organization, rallying support for integration and democracy and helping to stimulate and nurture new movements of the early 1960's. The SCEF maintained headquarters in Louisiana for twenty years, but in 1966 moved its headquarters to Louisville, Kentucky.

A source advised on March 2, 1961, that CLAUDE LIGHTFOOT, a CP functionary, stated at a meeting of the CP in Baltimore, Maryland on February 25 1961, that the CP is not connected with any progressive movement, but indirectly they do have some influence in the SCEF.

A second source, who is familiar with some phases of CP activity in the New Orleans area, advised on June 3, 1966, that during the time SCHW was in existence, members of the CP were members of and worked actively in SCHW; however, since the formation of SCEF, CP members have not been encouraged to work in SCEF. The source stated SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization, which he considers a CP front organization because it has gone along with the CP on certain issues, particularly on the racial issue.

A third source advised on May 25, 1965, that GEORGE MEYERS, a CP functionary, expressed great admiration for CARL and ANNE BRADEN and the SCEF, with which they are affiliated, and expressed the view that SCEF is the best organization in the South as far as doing effective work is concerned, and that they have a better idea of what they are doing, where they are heading, and influence other organizations for the better.

The second source also advised on June 3,1966, that many people who are officials and supporters of the SCEF, while liberal in their views, are by no means communists.

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

The program did an excellent job in exposing these individuals as being dangerous to our society and bringing out the nature of their militancy for exposure to the general public. Likewise the program exposed the fact that they were extramely active on college campuses in Florida which most of the citizenry fails to recognize or be aware of. The romarks made by a number of the members of the New Left and Black Hationalists certainly substantiated remarks recently made by the Director relative to their aims and purposes,

The first half of the program was devoted mainly to the New Left perticularly SSOC as it exists in Florida and mainly in the South Florida area. The second half dealt mainly with Black Kationalist particularly the Florida black front as it exists and operates in Florida. The program concluded with quotes from Director J. EDGAR HOOVER concerning the New Left.

Miami, Florida, an NBC affiliate, advised that Charlene Mitchell,
Communist Party, U. S. A. (CP-USA) presidential candidate, had
accepted an invitation to appear on "Florida Forum," a panel-type
program. The program will be taped on July 12, 1968, to be shown
on July 14, 1968.

On July 12, 1968, advised Mitchell arrived as scheduled on that date at 12:30 p.m. at Miami International Airport, was met by station personnel, and was accompanied by a young Negro whose name sounded like.

The one-half hour "Florida Forum" panel-type program was taped from approximately 2:20 to 3:00 p.m., including promotion taping.

Following the "Florida Forum" taping, Mitchell was interviewed for approximately ten minutes by WCKT-TV newscaster, Richard Whitcomb, and this interview will be used it conjunction with a regular newscast.

Mitchell then held a small news conference for local newspaper reporters.

She departed Miami for New York as scheduled on the late afternoon of July 12, 1968.

There were no public demonstrations or incidents.

The Richard Whitcomb Report was shown over WCKT-TV at approximately 6:45 p.m. on July 12, 1968. Mitchell answered as follows in response to questions of Whitcomb:

She stated that the New Left is now unorganized, that the CP-USA agrees with some of the points which the New Left is advocating, and that she is sure the New Left will move in the future in a proper direction. She said the New Left learned

more about black and white unity at Columbia University, New York City, than at a million demonstrations. She stated that she believes there should be more academic freedom for the students on college campuses.

Mitchell stated that women in America should take a more active part in peace and black liberation movements, as the women do in communist countries.

In answer to a question as to the relationship between the CP-USA and Cuba, she stated that the CP-USA has no communication with Havana. She said she has never been to Cuba. She stated she agrees with the Fidel Castro line of communism and while it is fine for Cuba, it may not be fine for the United States.

When asked why so many Cubans are leaving Cuba under communism, she stated that those who are leaving are loyal to former President Fulgencio Batista and would naturally not want to live under a communist regime.

In Section B, Page 1, of the July 13, 1968, issue of "The Miami Herald," a local daily newspaper, there is a photograph of Charlene Mitchell and an article captioned "She's Leader of Red Band in America," with the by-line of Arnold Markowitz, Herald Staff Writer. This article is as follows:

"As a candidate for the presidency of the United States, Charlene Mitchell has to overcome a few handicaps: she is a woman, she is a Negro; she is the nominee of the Communist Party.

"Mrs. Mitchell, a 38-year-old daughter of a Cincinnati hod carrier, was in Miami Friday for news-paper and television interviews, and she came over as something of a realist.

"She does not expect to defeat Hubert H. Humphrey or Richard M. Nixon in November. No, not even Guy H. Rouse. Mrs. Mitchell never heard of Guy H. Rouse, Miami's own candidate for President, but then hardly anyone ever heard of Mrs. Mitchell until last Sunday, when the Communists in convention assembled decided that she should run for president.

"'If by some wild stretch of the imagination I should be elected...' is the phrase with which she begins talking about what she'll do if by some wild stretch of the imagination she should be elected.

"And, if anyone should say that such a sense of realism is unreal in a Communist -- or, for that matter, that Communism is a nasty, even murderous system -- Charlene Mitchell has an explanation:

"'There are no people in the world who are more brainwashed than the people of the United States. Everything bad that's said about Communists is accepted like biblical truth. I'd dare say that more than 90 per cent of the people in this country have not read the Communist Manifesto."

"Mrs. Mitchell, now a New Yorker by way of Cincinnati, Chicago and Los Angeles, is a pleasant, articulate woman who speaks like an average city housewife with above-average knowledge of what is going on in the world. Her interpretations of international events differ with those of most free-world students of contemporary history, but one is reminded that those other people are, after all, brainwashed.

"Although brainwashing (according to the allegedly brainwashed historians) is a Communist technique, it does not appear to have succeeded entirely with Charlene Mitchell.

"For example, she does not approve of everything that all Communist governments do -- for example, Fidel Castro's regime, which is trying to export revolution from Cuba to the rest of Latin America.

"'I don't think revolution can be exported,' she said. '... every people has the right to determine its own future. You can't put yourself in another person's place. That would be patronizing.'

"Self-determination of political future is what Mrs. Mitchell says she wants for the Vietnamese.

"I hope the whole world goes socialist, and eventually Communist, she said. I'd very naturally think, in Vietnam, that this would be the solution to their problems. But the people in Vietnam should make the determination."

"One of Mrs. Mitchell's first presidential actions (if by some wild stretch et cetera) would be to stop the war in Vietnam.

"'I would immediately say "The war is over, fellow; come back home." Then I'd go to Congress. I'd say "I want you to give the \$30 million a year you're spending on the war to construct a healthy and hopeful America."

"There is an even higher priority in Charlene Mitchell's mind"

"'As president, the very first thing I'd do, if by some wild stretch of the imagination I should be elected, would be to invoke the duty of the president and enforce every law on the books regarding racism.'

"America's racial problems form a major part of candidate Mitchell's concern. She was asked whether her candidacy is primarily an appeal to the new black militancy, a potential voting bloc of proportions.

"I would hope that our platform would appeal to black people, of course, she answered. More specifically, we want to deal concretely with the need to end racism."

"In spite of her natural racial consciousness, Mrs. Mitchell insists she is not running to prove a racial point. She would not be satisfied morely with the election of a Negro Democrat or Republican. It has to be a Communist.

"In espousing peace, majority rule, political and economic self-determination and an end to racism, Mrs. Mitchell and the Communist Party plainly are appealing to popular causes. The candidate is

"equally shrewd in avoiding expressions of loyalty to the least popular of her fellow Communists in other countries.

"'I've admired all of them at one time or another,'
Mrs. Mitchell will say guardedly. As an advocate of
abolition of the death penalty, she is unwilling to
be known as a supporter of bloody purges and mass
executions.

"Still, she can find it in her heart to defend the violent aspects of the Bolshevik Revolution in Russia and the Communist ascendancies in China and Cuba.

"Her point is that the shooting didn't start until after the revolutions had succeeded, when the factory owners objected to giving up their holdings so that all might share equally in a nation's resources.

"These points of view entered Mrs. Mitchell's mind, she said, during the 1940s.

"'The Communist Party was the organization that seemed to be most active in the struggle for black people,' she said. 'I knew some members of it, and I'd read some things about it, and I decided to join.'

"She joined the party 22 years ago -- an action with which she says her parents disagreed but which they do not actively oppose because they feel she has the right to her own political beliefs.

*During her six years in Los Angeles, she did youth work for the party and was an administrative secretary for it. Since 1957 she has been a member of its national committee.

"Now, as field secretary for the Party's Commission on Black Liberation, she confesses to a take-home salary of less than \$75 a week.

"She has a husband who works as a die cutter, but she would not disclose his name because she expects that could cost him his job. They have been married for

"18 years and have a son who will be 17 next morth.

"Neither her husband nor her son opposes her Communist activities, she said."

The "Florida Forum" program, with Mitchell as guest, was shown over WCKT-TV from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. on July 14, 1968. During this program, Mitchell answered as follows in response to questions of the panel:

When asked why more Negroes had not accepted the Communist Party, if communism is the solution to the problems of this country, she stated that people are always trying to place Negroes in a different category from white people and that Negroes have to find their ideology the same as everyone else. When the Communist Party answers their needs, Negroes will join the Communist Party the same as white people.

When asked whether her candidacy was not a sham and it was pointed out that Gus Hall, General Secretary, CP-USA, had stated there were only 100,000 CP-USA sympathizers in the United States, she stated that they do not expect to win the election. However, they do expect to present the CP-USA platform in terms of a socialist America.

When asked if this was a "do or die" time for the CP-USA, she stated that it is a critical time in the history of the United States and this is why they are striving to place communists on the ballot for political offices.

In answer to an inquiry as to why she was chosen as the presidential candidate, she said that she is one of 70 or more members of the National Committee of the CP-USA, which is the policy making body for the Party. She stated she has been involved in all policy making decisions of the CP-USA and is considered a respected part of its leadership.

When asked how many Negroes are on the National Committee, she stated there are probably about 25, but she really did not know.

In answering a question as to her solution to the rising crime rate and the Negro riots, she stated that she preferred to use the phrase Negro upsurge and not begro riots.

She said that this country has to deal first with what produces these upsurges and that she believes our system will have to be changed to bring this about. She stated that if she should become president, one of her first acts would be to immediately enforce all laws dealing with racial discrimination which are present time.

When asked about the content of the CP-USA New Program, she stated that the CP-USA does not believe the American people at this time are ready for a change and that in their own time and own way, they will see the need for change to socialism.

When queried about the CP-USA New Program and its apparent "pitch" for support from the New Left, she stated that since 1928, the CP-USA has placed special emphasis on assisting the Negro people and that the CP-USA has been a part of every struggle of the Negro people in the United States.

She stated that she had been in every civil rights demonstration; however, she was never jailed, a fact she was neither proud or ashamed of. She stated it was commonly known that members of the CP-USA have been jailed as a result of civil rights demonstrations and have been beaten while in jail.

She stated the CP-USA influence in the New Left at the present time is in the terms of debating ideologies and that the CP-USA agrees with the New Left on many points.

She was asked whether the CP-USA still advocates force and violence to change the social system. She stated the CP-USA has never called for, set out in literature, or advocated through any of the CP-USA leaders the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. She stated that there is a whole section of the CP-USA Program which deals with the peaceful transition to socialism.

She pointed out that violence did not begin in the Soviet Union until after the majority of the people had succeeding in establishing the kind of government they wanted and only then, when the leaders of industry objected to giving up their properties, was their violence.

In answer to a question as to whether civil rights demonstrations are organized by the CP-PS4, she said here have

The state of the s



been civil rights demonstrations which communists have been instrumental in organizing.

When questioned as to whether Dr. Martin Luther King, dr. knew she was a communist, when she took part in ris demonstrations, she stated that she had never met Dr. King but that none of the organizers of these demonstrations had ever objected to her presence.

When asked again about how the Party expected to obtain the support of the New Left, when there seemed to be basic differences between them, she stated there are differences in solving problems. She stated much of the New Left feels that all they have to do is to get a few persons together, make a statement, and the statement will accomplish the act if they are loud enough. However, the CP-USA believes that any change will come only when the majority of the people are for that change. She pointed out that the CP-USA was quite openly a part of the August New Politics Convention held last year in Chicago.

When asked about the criticism of the New Left by Gus Hall, she asked the panelist where did Gus Hall take any "pot shots" at the New Left. When she was assured it was publicly stated by Hall that he had criticized the New Left, she answered by stating that Hall was only debating with the methods utilized by the New Left. She said communists do not withdraw criticism just because it is directed toward the New Left and that to do so would be opportunism of the worse kind.

She was asked if she agreed with Stokely Armichael's comments about the necessity for guerrilla warfare and "running to the hills" in the United States. She stated she wanted to answer this question in the context of her knowledge of Carmichael. She said the assertion of the need for alerrilla warfare and "running to the hills" is ridiculous and completely wrong. She said this is all brought about by the fristration of black youths because of the failure in this country by the stated that in speaking in the context of violence, the police and this can be well documented.

When asked if she would welcome the support of Stokely Carmichael in her campaign, she said she would and say would

hope that there are provisions in the CP-USA Program which he could endorse and support.

When asked whether there is a Communist Party in Florida, she said there is but she is not sure of its size since she just recently came into the CP-USA National Office and is not acquainted with all of the various districts. She was asked the location of the Florida headquarters of the CP-USA, and she answered, "I don't know." When asked the number of CP-USA members in the United States, she stated she believed there are about 14,000 members.

In answer to a question as to why there are fewer civil rights in communist countries, she stated there are more civil rights in socialist democracies than in the United States and this was shown by the conduct of the students in Czechoslovakia. She was asked about the Soviet troops currently in Czechoslovakia in connection with the student unrest, and she stated they had been there for several months and were not sent there because of student demonstrations.

When asked whether in a communist country, particularly Cuba, a person could speak in a manner such as Stokely Carmichael had spoken in the United States, she stated she had never been in Cuba. She said Cuba is in the process of establishing its government and all of these problems will be straightened out.

She was asked whether any of the communist countries have the freedoms which are taken for granted in the United States. She stated those countries which have socialism have determined how they want to handle their governments. She said she has not studied the constitutions of all the socialist countries and does not know what the rights are in each country.

At this point, the moderator advised there was no time for additional questions.

I. Organizations

Miami has two "New Left" organizations, the "Southern Student. Organizing Committee" (SSOC), and the "Students for a Democratic Society" (SDS).

The SSOC has two local chapters; Miami - SSOC, an off-campus chapter in Miami, and Florida Atlantic University - SSOC (FAU - SSOC), at Boca Raton, Florida. Both chapters have been reported as all but dormant.

The SDS, in September, 1968, reorganized at the University of Miami, Coral Gables, Florida - (UM - SDS). To date, they have not been granted official recognition as an on-campus organization by the University's administration.

II. Potential Counterintelligence Action

SSOC

Activists in FAU - SSOC have shown a propensity for involvement in situations to their own detriment. Three, in September, 1968, were found guilty of violating Florida obscenity laws. One was arrested for the possession of narcotics. When these charges are finally adjudicated, it is believed the information would present an opportunity for exploitation to their further detriment and that of their organization.

A. University of Miami Chapter
Students for a Democratic Society
(UM-SDS)
Coral Gables, Florida

Reorganized in September, 1968. Official recognition granted was lifted just prior to the year end holiday.

B. Miami-Dade Junior College Chapter Students for a Democratic Society (MD-SDS)
Miami, Florida

Organized in Fall of 1968. Denied official recognition by College Inter-Organizational Committee. Presently appealing this decision to the Student Personnel and Activities Committee.

Referenced Miami communication made mention of two other New Left organizations, namely the Florida Atlantic University Chapter of the Southern Student Organizing Committee (FAU-SSOC), Boca Raton, Florida, and the Miami-at-Large Chapter of the Southern Student Organizing Committee (M-SSOC), Miami, Florida. Both these chapters are now reported as defunct.

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II. POTENTIAL COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

A. UM-SDS

The UM-SDS, with some 40 members, is split into two camps, namely the "Che's" (militant action group) and the "Mahatma's" (national issues, pacifism). When this chapter becomes better organized and if the split still exists, it is felt that if it could be broadened, it would work against the solidarity of this chapter.

The UM-SDS, just prior to the holidays, had its official campus recognition rescinded. This results in it being denied campus facilities and privileges. It appears its alternative now is to meet off campus. This the UM-SDS is reluctant to do, since it could isolate them from the main student body. The UM-SDS Steering Committee reportedly intends to meet informally and covertly on campus. Should the Committee attempt to do so, it is felt that by alerting appropriate administration officials, these meetings could be thwarted, which conceivably could contribute to the disorganization and isolation of the UM-SDS from the student body.

Presently, the membership of the UN-SDS is being identified. Where it appears their use of drugs and/or immorality could be exploited to their detriment, local authorities will be advised and the Bureau will be notified of the specific action to be taken.

B. MD-SDS

Junior College have voluntarily, and on a confidential basis, furnished information on the MD-SDS. They have been furnished public source material concerning the SDS and have stated it is their intent to frustrate to the fullest the attempts of students at Miami-Dade Junior College to form an SDS chapter.

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III. PENDING COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

Copies of Barron's article entitled "Campus Battleground" continue to be distributed. During the current period, copies were furnished to the



In addition, of Miami was furnished 20 copies each of the reprints entitled "Reds on Campus" and "An Analysis of the New Left: A Gospel of Nihilism." It is his intent to make these reprints available to students known to him as loyal Americans, in order that they might have ammunition for rebuttal with other students now associated with the UM-SDS.

<u>SD</u>S Is-Hottest Activist Group

Of all the violent student activist groups flexing their political and philosophical muscle in America, none has drawn so much national attention as Students for a Democratic Society.

It's very pretense to demoeracy is a sham.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has called it and other groups "anarchistic," and linked its leaders, its activities, methods and mood to the Communist Party, and called it part of a "dangerous conspiracy."

Gus Hall, general secretary of the American Communist Party, has said that SDS is one of the groups "going for us."

A Columbia University professor, who watched last Spring as SDS seized college buildings, held college officials as hostages and closed down classes for 35,000 students, said in a recent report

in Barron's Weekly on the Columbia disaste:

"To sucept SDS' alternative amounts to carte blanche for violence, and invites the complete breakdown of law and order."

THE FACT that a renewed effort is being made to establish a chapter of SDS at the University of Miami should arouse alarm.

Not so much that students would want to form such a group, but that the University of Miami administration may soon face the same decisions of Columbia's officials, who in the end buckled and allowed 300 students to bring insurrection to a college campus and close down an entire institution.

When he underwent his first test of student power attempts last Srping U-M president Henry King Stanford bent over backwards to let Negro students spell out demands.

After pronising to study the demands, the United Black Students group—merely a handful of activists—promptly ignored convention and protocol and tried to close down the president's office with a sit-in.

The violation of good faith by the students left Dr. Stanford shaken by the experi-

What he faces this student year will make that last episode seem like an exercise in kindergarten sandbox games.

One young worker in the local group, who will stand trail for refusing induction into the armed forces this month, already has received a telegram from SDS' national hero, Columbia insurrectionist Mark Rudd, commanding him to start "more. Columbias" in Miami.

STUDENTS for a Democratic Society has its roots in the National Conference for New Politics, formed in June, 1966, for the purported purposes of mustering people who want to work for civil rights, peace and an end to poverty.

In 1967, the National Conference's national council Included former members of the Communist Party and and Revolutionary Workers League, which has been cited by the Attorney General as subversive.

In speaking of the movement, FBI director Hoover said:

"If anything definite can be said about the Studores for a Democratic Society, it

is that it can be called anarchistic . . . it has seized upon every opportunity to foment discord among the youth of this country.

"(It) is a mood of disillusionment, pessimism and alienation.

"At the center of the (new left) movement is an almost passionate desire to destroy, to annihilate, to tear down."

SDS had a hand in the Chicago riots during the Democratic Convention.

The FBI reported that in February of this year, officers of the SDS, the Communist Party and the National Conference met in Chicago to coordinate plans. The Communist Party offered funds for a central office.

"What does this open allout thrust for power and approval mean to patriotic Americans," FBI director Hoover asked in a memorandum to law enforcement officials throughout the nation. The Huide



chairman of the SDS chapter at that university. In an open letter to President Kirk to? Columbia University), which appeared in the public press in May, 1968, Rudd stated, Your power is directly threatened, since we will have to destroy that power

before we take over."

The SDS held a national, convention at Michigan State University in June, 1968. At this convention, methods to disrupt Selective Service facilities and law enforcement were discussed in a 'sabotage and explosives'

workshop.

Suggestions included: flushing bombs in toilets to destroy plumbing; using sharp, tripod-shaped metal instruments to halt vehicles; firing Molotov cocktails from shotguns; jamming radio equipment, and dropping

"thermite bombs" down manholes to destroy communications systems.

The protest activity of the New Left and the SDS, under the guise of legitimate expression of dissent, has created an insurrectionary climate which has conditioned a number of young Americans — especially college students — to resort to civil disobedience and violence.

Hoover concluded his statement on SDS and the New Left too by saying that I the movement was becoming "more and more anarchistic, militant and violent."



Radicals Await Word From U

The fate of two militant, radical student organizations, charged repeatedly with defying University of Miami officials and violating both regulations of the University of Miami and the laws of the City of Coral Gables, rode in two registered letters that were to be delivered this week.

UM officials refused to reveal the contents of the findings of the Committee on Student Organizations or their decision on Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and United Black Students, UBS, two campus organizations which sprang from the same ultra-left roots and leadership until after the letters had been received by the leaders of the organizations.

Actions open to the University were abolishment or suspension of SDS and UBS.

Expulsion or suspension of their leaders.

—Any other punishment the University is authorized to impose.

-Exoneration.

Even while the Committee on Student Organizations was investigating the latest charges against SDS its chairman, and member of the SDS Steering Committee. Bub Weinberg, was breatning defiance by branking the administration at UM "totalitarian" and "insensitive." In a position paper, the SDS challenged the authority of the CSO and demanded its abolishment.

Meeting at the Student Union Monday night following the CSO hearings a meeting that a UM spokesman characterized as replete with four-letter words and profanity, SDS members pressed their attack on the University.

SDS' latest confrontation resulted from the coffin-burning ceremony on Election Day Nov. 5 in which its leaders allegedly defied authorities by burning a coffin symbolizing what they said was the "death of American politics," and repeatedly relighting the fire after it had been doused by U-M security guards.

The local SDS chapter, however, did not participate in acts to disrupt the election.

UM officials Monday night watched the SDS rally, but took no active part. The "crowd" was estimated variously as 50 SDSers and other students to 300 by the SDSers themselves.

The radical left's penchant for burning is also what got UBS into trouble at UM when some of its members took newly printed University Bulletins — the list of courses offered — and burned

UBS, which had been joined by SDS, which spawned it, was protesting the fact that the Bulletins did not carry Black-oriented courses which they claimed had been promised following last year's demonstrations at the UM in which some of their leaders where agrested and convicted after staging sit ins and other demonstrations.

Lestist Groups Play Tag With UM

University of Miaml officlals and leaders of two ultra-left activist groups on campus are reportedly playing a cat-and-mouse game.

UM has sent registered letters notifying Bob Welnberg, head of the local Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), and Willard Butler, head of United Black Students (UBS), of the University's position following hearings on probation violations before the Committee on Student Organizations.

But UM officials refuse to discuss the contents of the fetters and the SDS and UDS leaders have reportedly refused to acknowledge the letters.

Weinberg and SDS advisor, Kenneth Smith, appeared before the Committee, made a presentation, but refused to stay for any further proceedings.



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

The organizations above are presently experiencing difficulty with the University administration which appears to be a curtailment of their activeness in organizing and engaging in disruptive activities. The principal perpetrators. most of whom were a radical element associated with "The Movement" or the UM-SDS WSA, have been identified through photographs and presently will be subpoensed by the State Attorney's Office in an attempt to develop sufficient evidence for prosecution. Additionally, the free individuals, identified as the affinity group of 'The Movement', are the prime suspects in the fire bombing of an Army vehicle and all but one have been brought before a Federal Grand Jury to testify in this matter. Miami will follow and pursue this action by the University, State and Federal Agencies since such action on their part continues to nullify and hamper any success on their part. Miami will be particularly alert for stepped-up actions by these organizations and will seize on every opportunity that presents itself for disruptive action.

Miami presently has intensified investigations on nine individuals and if information is developed that presents a situation where counterintelligence could be effective, such action will be taken.

V. Tangible Results

An individual, an Israeli and during the Spring, 1969-70 school term a student at the University of Miami, was extremely active and a member of the UM-SDS WSA. His activities have been furnished to the Miami INS, who is presently actively investigating the matter for the purpose of excluding or deporting the subject.

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A REPORT FROM THE CHICAGO REGIONAL SDS MEETING 7/20/70

For a long time now we have been talking about fighting sectarianism and building a mass student movement under the leadership of SDS. Let's be truthful---we haven't done this. We feel that there has to be a National Convention as soon as possible to discuss the following critical questions:

- 1. How can we transform SDS? A mass student organization can't afford to have one political line on every issue. The student movement must be led by the principles of anti-racism, anti-imperialism, anti-male chauvinism and a pro-working class outlook in order to succeed. But there are many ways to implement this strategy. The WSA line that developed out of last year's NC is not the only way. We need transformation-NOW-in order to grow.
- 2. We can't wait 2 months. This total reevaluation of SDS must come <u>before</u> we attempt to formulate programs for the coming school year. Our paper coalitions have failed; we have paid lip-service to the ideas of fighting sectarianism. We can't effect such a complete change in a piecemeal way on a regional level. We need a national meeting now!
- 3. The leadership has to be changed. It is clear that PLP dominates the NIC to the exclusion and stifling of other political tendencies. We think that a much broader spectrum of leadership is necessary to guide the kind of mass movement that we have described. This crisis in leadership cannot be put off.
- 4. NLM? Ugh---who wants to sell it the way it is now---with 18 articles on the smashing success of CWSA! And right now another issue (NLM has just discovered the anti-war movement without explaining what happened to all the workers back home) is waiting out at the airport for "someone" to pick upCOD!! NLM should be the weapon of the student movement---not the sectarian property of one tendency. We're reluctant to sell a paper that doesn't speak to the people's needs.

Let's have a convention in late August as originally planned. Build for it. Bring new people.

The majority of the leadership from the spring 1970 term have not returned to the University. Only one of an affinity group of six, who are prime suspects in the fire bombing of an Army vehicle, has returned. Five of these six have been brought before a Federal Grand Jury to testify in the fire bombing matter. Ten other activists leaders have been subpoenaed before the State: Attorney's Office in an attempt to develop sufficient evidence for prosecution for their part in disruptive campus activities following the Kent incident.

Miami will be particularly alert for stepped up actions by these organization and others that might emerge and will seize on every opportunity that presents itself for causing disruption within their ranks.

IV. Pending Cointel Action

Miami has secured the identity of all editors of official campus publications (campus newspapers) within the Miami Division. The SAC

has directed a personal letter to each, enclosing a copy of the Director's Open Letter to College Students. This should give additional exposure of the contents of the open letter to the college community.

Miami presently has intensified investigations on two individuals and presently will increase this number to four. Where information is developed that presents a situation where counterintelligence can be effective against these individuals, such action will be taken.

V. Tangible Results

An individual an Israeli, and during the spring 1969-1970 school term a student at the University of Miami, was a member and extremely active in the UM-SDS. He was a leading figure in causing the University of Miami to shut down following the Kent incident. He was scheduled to be subpoensed by the State Attorney's office for his actions. His activities were furnished to the Miami INS who conducted an active investigation for the purpose of excluding or deporting Through sources, it was subsequently learned that who traveled to England and Israel the summer vacation period, had decided not to return to the United States for he believed INS would take action against him.
