Your office should remain alert to learn which unions are being supplied eyeglasses by the subject's optical business. If possible, your office should consider checking bank sources as well as informants in this regard.

It is possible the subject's business supplies eyeglasses to welfare plans of unions which furnish treatment to union members. In that event, it would be possible for him to pay kickbacks to the operators of a welfare plan in return for orders being placed with his company by a welfare plan. Such kickbacks could be arranged by the subject charging the welfare plan an excessive amount for eyeglasses he supplied and when the welfare plan paid the bill, the excessive amount could be kicked back to certain parties.

By this means a portion of the funds of the welfare plan would be considered to be converted to the use of another in violation of the embezzlement prohibitions in the Welfare and Pension Plans Disclosure Act (WPPDA) which is a felony. In the event any such possibility is discovered, it should be discussed with the U. S. Attorney and the Bureau should be advised under a separate case caption, in accordance with instructions pertaining to WPPDA.







Assistant United States Attorney, EDWARD BRODSKY, Special Prosecutions Unit, Southern District of New York, advised on May 28, 1962, that periodically he has various persons appear before a Federal Grand Jury but the appearances relate to the narcotics case and they are not specifically directed toward FRED RANDACCIO or STEVE MAGADDINO or other persons who may be connected with the murder of ALBERT AGUECI.

On June 8, 1962, BRODSKY advised he did not know of any proposed Grand Jury action relating to a narcotics indictment of FRED RANDACCIO or STEVE MAGADDINO. However, he added he is resigning and Assistant United States Attorney VINCENT BRODERICK would be handling this case.

Assistant United States Attorney VINCENT BRODERICK, Southern District of New York, advised June 8, 1962, that he does not know if at the present time RANDACCIO or MAGADDINO are being considered in regards to a future narcotics indictment.

On May 9, 1962, BU T-7 advised that VITO DOMIANO, also known as Buck Jones, of 1 Crestwood Street, Buffalo, New York, now deceased, operated a shoe store in a partnership with another man on Chippewa Street in Buffalo. BU T-7 b6 explained that he was well acquainted with the fact that b7C DOMIANO was the "number one man" in the operation of the numbers rackets in Buffalo, New York, prior to his death. BU T-7 stated that DOMIANO was well regarding by gamblers as a "reasonable and just man." He stated that DOMIANO was appointed by STEVE MAGADDINO of Niagara Falls, New York, to organize the numbers rackets in Buffalo and to work with the of North Park Furniture Company and Kaufman's Bakery in Buffalo. He stated that was a principal financial backer behind all numbers operations in the Buffalo area prior to DOMIANO's death. <u>According</u> to BU T-7, | ofa former tinued to handle a large portion of the numbers rackets in lafter DOMIANO's death. Buffalo for BU T-7 stated that did not have the brains nor the backing to operate this racket and fired him because he considered a "lush" and not devoting enough time to the numbers rackets. Later opened up a furniture store on Elmwood Avenue in Buffalo with a partner of Polish extraction. He stated this business was thrown into bankruptcy shortly thereafter and the matter is still pending in Bankruptcy Court, Buffalo.

In regards to FRED RANDACCIO, BU T-7 explained that RANDACCIO was feared by most of the bookmakers and gamblers in the Buffalo area because of his strong-arm tactics and RANDACCIO did not earn the respect afforded VITO DOMIANO. BU T-7 commented that while VITO DOMIANO was the number one man in the numbers rackets in Buffalo there was very little trouble among gamblers and bookmakers and "at least there were no killings." The informant was unable to furnish any specific information concerning any particular murder in which RANDACCIO was responsible.



In June, 1961, in charge of the Gambling Squad, Buffalo Police Department, determined through telephone call checks that had placed telephone calls through a number registered to at the King Edward Hotel and the Seaway Specialties Company, 383 Queen Street, West, Toronto, which was previously operated by
It should be noted that on January 29, 1962, BU T-4 advised that FRED RANDACCIO was contacted that morning by someone from Rochester, New York. He stated that RANDACCIO was furious because this unidentified man had contacted him by telephone and identified himself as a person who had sold him some jewelry.
On the same day BU T-5 reported that RANDACCIO, SAM MIANO, FRED S. MOGAVERO, ROY CARLISI and PASQUALE NATARELLI had met an unidentified man at the Delaware Texaco Service Center in Buffalo, New York, where they discussed

the precautions necessary in disposing of some jewelry. The informant was unable to furnish any additional information relating to this jewelry other than the fact that one piece of jewelry was a greenish colored stone having about twenty-five points.

On May 4 and May 7, 1962, BU T-3 advised that FRED RANDACCIO is involved in a deal wherein he, RANDACCIO, is to locate someone who can exchange a large sum of money into bills of a small denomination.

BU T-3 stated that after RANDACCIO returned from Florida in April of 1962, RANDACCIO met with his associates at Panaro's Lounge on Hampshire Street in Buffalo. He stated that RANDACCIO mentioned the fact that he wanted to locate someone who could exchange \$100,000 made up in \$1,000 bills for bills of a smaller denomination. He stated that someone employed by a bank in Buffalo would handle this deal if RANDACCIO could arrange a transfer through a third party. RANDACCIO complained of the fact that the person with whom he had discussed this deal had turned him down because the unidentified person thought he was being set up as a "patsy." RANDACCIO was warned that this deal would be hard to handle because most banks are alert to any deal involving an exchange of cash for \$2,000 or more, and that they will normally notify the Bureau of Internal Revenue of such transactions. According to RANDACCIO, the \$100,000 is make up in \$1,000 bills and was considered "clean money", and had offered a commission of \$1500 to the person who could make this exchange. It was the informant's impression that there is additional funds involved which are not made up in \$1,000 bills.

On May 4, 1962, BU T-3 advised that RANDACCIO and MIANO have two contacts identified only as "two Jews in Ohio" who would handle stolen merchandise, however, RANDACCIO has mentioned the fact that he does not prefer to deal with these two unidentified individuals.

On November 28, 1961, a meeting was held at Buffalo, New York between STEVE MAGADDINO, RANDACCIO and DANIEL SANSANESE. Information furnished by this informant relating to gambling activities in Canada has been previously reported.

BU T-l noted during this meeting that DANIEL SANSANESE attempted to explain the activities of a group of gamblers in Canada who are engaged in either smuggling gold or bonds of some description into the United States. SANSANESE advised the informant that one member of this Canadian group had made a profit of \$10,000.00 on some deal down in Philadelphia, and the informant understood that a Canadian known as participated in a deal involving Canadain bonds.

BU T-1 stated that he learned from SANSANESE that a few years ago, SAM SALLI and attempted to interest two men in Cleveland, Ohio in buying some Canadian bonds through a contact of their's in Niagara Falls, New York. Informant stated that the two men from Cleveland were referred to as ANGELO AMATO and JOHNNY DE MARCO.

BU T-1 stated that one of these men came up from Cleveland and spent three days with SAM SALLI and in an effort to buy the bonds which, according to the informant, were stolen. ANGELO AMATO wanted a 20 per cent guarantee on the profit from these bonds; however, he had been talked down to accept a 12 per cent cut on the deal. Informant stated it was his opinion that SAM SALLI and were not in position to close this deal after taking ANGELO AMATO to Niagara Falls, New York. Informant stated that AMATO returned to Cleveland without completing the deal concerning the purchase of the Canadian bonds.

NATARELLI stated that he has been advised by his attorney that he does not have to say anything to law enforcement officrs, but he has no desire to be disagreeable and will answer those questions which he chooses to answer. He pointed out that when he is propounded a question he does not desire to answer, he will merely state, "I will not answer."
