
As the Bureau is owere WORTMAN and DOWLING have been carried as top hoodlums by this office for a period of time. The activities of these two men are very closely aligned and in fact, their activities in many fields are identical. In preparing reports on these two individuals there would be exact duplications on many phases except for their personal backgrounds.


In view of this it would appear logical that WORTMAN should be earried as the top hoodlum and DOWLING be earried as his principal lieutenant and associate.

In connection with these individuals, it is also pointed out that regular summaries have been submitted regarding these individua and it is desired that this effice be advised if this information should be repeated in detail in the submission of reports as per relet or if it can be briefly summarized.

For further information of the Bureau, it is pointed out that WORTMAN and his associates have been under grand jury investia getien in the Eastern District of Illinois since September, 1956, and the grand jury has met periodically since that date regarding WORTMAN, DOWLING, and other associates and enterprises and that the grand jury has eccupied a tetal of approximately 75 days on the WORTMAN matter.



The Bureau is requested to advise if judicial permission should be requested to review this grand jury testimeny; it is pointed out that U.S. District Judge WILLIAM G. JUERGENS of the Eastern District of Illinois has always been very cooperative with this office and is very familiar with the WORTMAN-DOWLING activities. It is also pointed out that USA CLIFFORD M. RAEMER and his Chief Assistant, Mr. MAAG, of the Eastern District of Illinois, have always been very cooperative and it is felt they will furnish any and all information that would be requested. It is estimated that a complete and thorough review of all available material and preparation of a report would probably take 5 or 6 agents a total of three weeks. This, of course, is taking into consideration developing of leads in this district that would be developed therefrom.







The only known conviction for a felony on the part of WORTMAN is in connection with the assault on a federal agent wherein WORTMAN was convicted on a trial in U.S. District Court, Springfield, Illinois, and was sentenced to serve ten years in the federal penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, on June 25, 1934.





WORTHAN was arrested by the U.S. Marshal, St. Louis, Nissourt, February 24, 1954, for contempt of court charge. According to the St. Louis and East St. Louis area press, WORTMAN was called before a Federal Grand Jury investigating labor racketeering in the St. Louis area and at the Grand Jury WORTMAN refused to give the Grand Jury his address. As a result of this action, Judge MOORE ordered WORTMAN to jail and was held in contempt of court. According to the article WORTMAN refused to give his address, stating that his personal life and business was under investigation by the Internal Revenue and that he would not answer the question because the answer might incriminate him. As a result of this, WORTMAN remained in jail until April 6, 1954. The press reported that while in jail, WORTMAN ordered special meals and paid for various meals and cigarettes and other luxuries for the prisoners in the city jail.

67C The St. Louis office by letter dated April 15, 1954, advised that WORTMAN, was arrested on October, 1927, while driving a truck north on Broadway. WORTHAN and were reportedly arrested as suspects and this arrest resulted in the confiscation of 51 five-gallon cans of alcohol, a bootleg value of \$1020.00.

ORVILLE HODGE was formerly Auditor for the State of Illinois and subsequently was convicted in both state and federal courts in Illinois as a result of the so-called "Hodge Scandals", where HODGE allegedly misapplied, or misappropriated, or embezzled several million dollars of state funds. These matter received nationwide publicity and in the course of the publicity it was frequently pointed out that HODGE was associated with WORIMAN. Various press releases indicated that WORIMAN gave to HODGE some \$200,000 as campaign contributions and as a result HODGE was supposed to arrange for WORIMAN to operate his gambling casinos in the St. Clair-Madison

Counties area without interference from state authorities.

WORTMAN, from various and numerous newspaper accounts in the metropolitan St. Louis area, is reportedly close to and has influence over law-enforcement officials in St. Clair County, including the E. St. Louis Police and the Belleville, Illinois Sheriff's Office.




The East St. Louis, Illinois Journal, in August, 1956, earried an article covering the history and activities of WORTMAN and in this article, it is pointed out that in May, 1955, a raid was conducted by the Police Department in rooms above the Terrace Lounge on Collinsville Avenue in E. St. Louis, which lounge is a WORTMAN operation. It pointed out that one WILLIAM BROWN was arrested at this time in connection with a race distributing operation, at which time BROWN was operating with a battery of seven telephones. According to this newspaper article, the charge against BROWN was subsequently dismissed by a Police Magistrate on the grounds that a search warrant used by the E. St. Louis police was faulty. The article also pointed out that found in this raid was a telephone bill addressed to GORDON FOSTER, in care of the Terrace Lounge. Police Commissioner BEEBE at the time made a statement that the evidence found by the police did not mean anything because many persons use the Terrace as an address.

In this same connection, it is noted that within the past week, Police Commissioner BEEBE issued a statement to the St. Louis and E. St. Louis press that he wanted to have BUSTER WORTMAN and others brought to the police station for questioning.

Over the past years the press of the metropolitan area of St. Louis.

have furnished information that BUSTER


WORTMAN is considered to be the biggest racketeer and hoodlum in the metropolitan St. Louis area. In this connection, it is pointed out that a Federal Grand Jury has been investigating WORTMAN & ASSOCIATES activities in the Eastern District of Illinois, since September, 1956.

The press of metropolitan St. Louis area for years has earried detailed articles regarding WORTMAN & ASSOCIATES and has labeled him as the downstate Illinois lieutenant of the old CAPONE gang and has also labeled him a leader of the EGAN gang, formerly operating in St. Louis, and also has identified him as a member of the Mafia.

In connection with WORTMAN'S association with the old CAPONE gange, the press has frequently printed articles stating that a halfsister of WORTMAN, one RUTH VIRGINIA WORTMAN, was allegedly arrested in Kennett, Missouri, in 1947 and charged with driving a stolen ear across the state line. Miss WORTMAN, a Chicago resident, to Id authorities in Kennett that she borrowed the ear from RALPH CAPONE, a brother of AL CAPONE, to drive to the funeral of CARL SHELTON, who was murdered at Fairfield, Illinois, on October 28, and continued her trip to Missouri to visit friends. allegedly explained that CARL SHELTON was her godfather. further aligning WORTMAN with the CAPONE gang, the press has frequently reported that after NONROE "BLACKIE" ARNES was killed in gangland style December 13, 1944, that WORTMAN then took over as downstate Illinois lieutenant of the CAPONE gang. It is noted that ARMES was the one who was convicted with WORTMANin federal court at Springfield in 1934. WORTMAN in press accounts is further linked with the CAPONE gang as the result of the operation of the Trans-American News PublishingCompany in St. Clair County in 1946. This organization allegedly attempted to muscle in on the Continental Press Service, which was operated by JANES W. RAGEN of St. Louis and the Pioneer News Agency in St. Louis, headed by PAUL "BEV" BROWN and CLARENCE "GULLEY" OWENS. The press reports the Continental

Press had a nationwide monopoly on horse race results at this time and the Pioneer Agency served the St. Louis area with results after obtaining them from Continental in Chicago. The Trans-American Agency also became known as the Reliable News Agency and in 1946, was incorporated with GORDON FOSTER as one of the incorporators. The press has pointed out that by 1943, the Reliable Agency had split the operators of Pioneer and apparently had a monopoly in the field. The press reports that in the late 1940s and 1950, this Pioneer-Reliable organization were doing a handbook business of a million dollars per year. It is noted that most of the above information was brought out during the course of the Kefauver Committee investigations in the St. Louis area in about 1950.

Other information from the metropolitan St. Louis area press reflects that of MORTMAN & ASSOCIATES also operated an extensive policy business in the metropolitan St. Louis area, which grossed millions of dollars of business each year; also in operation were a number of gambling easinos, particularly in St. Clair and Madison Counties, Illinois.







The press of E. St. Louis, Illinois, reported the results of raids by the Internal Revenue Service on May 6, 1957, when handbooks were raided in the St. Clair County area. As a result of these raids, 13 men and 4 women were charged with bookmaking without purchasing the federal tax stamp. Subsequent to this raid, the press reported that GORDON FOSTER and his close associate, ROBERT SHERR, also were arrested. FOSTER was arrested at a motel and bar operated by ROBERT SHERR at 6500 Bond Avenue, E. St. Louis, Illinois.





In connection with the coin mechine business, the press of St. Louis and East St. Louis, within the past several days, have reported the alleged purchase of the W-R Cigarette Company of St. Louis, Missouri, by BUSTER WORTMAN and his brother, TED WORTMAN. The prese reported that this eigerette company was previously operated by ROBERT BROWN of St. Louis, who was mysteriously slain in that city January 24, 1956. Subsequent to BROWN'S slaining, the control of this company went to the hands of the City of St. Louis alderman A. BARNEY MUELLER. MUELLER according to the press, was reported to be a silent partner of BROWN in the algarette business. The press reported that an estimated \$200,000 was placed on this particular transaction. The press has reported that there is apparently considerable friction between WORTHAN'S purchase of the W-R Cigarette Company and the operation of other coin machine businesses in St. Louis, allegedly operated by gangaters JOHN VITALE, TONY GIARDANO, and ANTHONY LOPITARO.

B. <u>CRIMINAL RECORD</u>

FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN has FBI #739186; he has one felony conviction for assault of a Federal officer, and was sentenced on June 24, 1934, to ten years United States District Court, Spring-field, Illinois, and conditionally released from Leavenworth Federal Penitentiary March 6, 1951. This conviction resulted from an assault from WORTMAN and some of his associates of a Federal Prohibition Agent at the time of a raid on a still near Collinsville, Illinois. WORTMAN has numerous other arrests primarily in St. Leuis, Missouri, between 1926 and 1959 on charges including auto theft, robbery, concealed weapon, speeding and investigation; he has also been arrested by East St. Leuis, Illinois, Police. WORTMAN was convicted of contempt of court in United States District Court, St. Leuis, Missouri, and served 30 days, being released April 6, 1954, and ordered for reappearance before Federal Grand Jury. This contempt of court arcse from his refusal to answer questions before a Federal Grand Jury.

ELMER SILVESTER DOWLING has FBI #1644966. He was convicted of assault with intent to kill and sentenced to 30 years in the Misseuri State Penitentiary and served time in that institution from May 29, 1940, until his discharge September 26, 1941, when the Supreme Court of Misseuri reversed and remanded the decision of the trial court. DOWLING has no other felony convictions. He has been arrested on several occasions for traffic violations and passer of worthless checks and liquor violations and gambling between the years of 1924 and 1946.









A. PERSONAL HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

The records further reflect that a Certificate of Marriage was filed November 5, 1943 showing WORTMAN and DONALD were married by GUST SCHULTZ, Justice of the Feace at Cape Girardeau, Missouri on October 31, 1943.

ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING

On June 24, 1958 SA checked the records of the Recorder of Deeds Office at the Marriage License Bureau in an attempt to ascertain a record of marriage for ELMER DOWLING and EUNICE RENECK. The records were checked from 1942 through 1949 and failed to reflect any marriage between DOWLING or RENECK.







On April 18, 1958 a hearing on the charge that the Chicago-St. Louis Express Company, Inc., 1030 South 11th Street, took over control and management of another trucking firm without the ICC approval, was scheduled before the U.S. District Court in St. Louis, Missouri. However, the hearing was continued until the fall term of the District Court on the above matter.

The Chicago-St. Louis Express Company, was charged in a criminal information in September 1957 for taking control of the Daisy Express Company on December 6, 1955 and operating the company in interstate commerce. An indictment of the company President, JOHN J. BURKE, for income tax evasion, on March 6, 1958 was an outgrowth of that inquiry. The St. Louis Globe Democrat dated April 16, 1958 referred to the above information and stated


the Chicago hearing concerns a petition by the Michigan Express Company, Inc., of Grand Rapids, Michigan, which is seeking ICC permission to purchase the Chicago-St. Louis firm. In August of 1957 the Chicago-St. Louis firm was denied permission to sell to the Michigan company. Way bills of the St. Louis company filedwith the ICC showed that its principal business was the transportation of coin operated machines from St. Louis to Chicago to Mayville, Wisconsin, Grand Rapids and Hammond, Indiana, and also from Slinger, Wisconsin to St. Louis and from Chicago to East St. Louis.

The article further states that the petition was denied by the ICC pending the prosecutive filing of criminal charges against the company by the Bepartment of Justice. The article further noted that Mr. BURKE and his wife were charged with evading \$24,957.00 in income taxes from 1951 through 1954.

Another article appearing in the St. Louis Globe Democrat dated February 10, 1958 reflects that one of the largest eigarette vending machine companies in Madison County, Illinois, lost nine of its 12 locations in Brooklyn, Illinois, to a rival firm dominated by FRANK "BUSTER" WORTMAN. The article noted that the firm mentioned is the Zimring and Sons Tobacco and Candy Company, 1832 State Street, Granite City, Illinois, which has been in business for 25 years. The article further noted that the company took over the abovementioned stops was the W-R Cigarette Company, which formerly was owned by the late ROBERT L. BROWN, Lawyer and parliamentarian of the Board of Aldermen, St. Louis, Missouri, who was shot to death in gangland style on January 24, 1956. It is noted the slaying of BROWN is unsolved.






It is noted that leads pertaining to the background and business acquaintances and relationships of WORTMAN and are being handled in the Federal Grand Jury investigation being conducted in East St. Louis, Illinois. It is noted in the report of SA lated 2-20-58, leads are directed to the St. Louis Division to ascertain officials operating the Flaza, Rite-Way, and W & R Companies as well as employees of these companies. Here again it is noted that this information should be more readily available to the Springfield Division through their liaison with the United States Attorney's Office handling the Federal Grand Jury concerning WORTMAN, therefore, the leads concerning and the Plaza, Rite-Way, and W & R Companies, will not be handled by the St. Louis Division unless the Springfield Division is unable to ascertain the information requested.

It is further noted that St. Louis was requested to interview MILTON WEIFENBACH, former Federal Parole Officer in St. Louis. In this regard, it is noted that WEIFENBACH is deceased. The above information was furnished by St. Louis.

As the Bureau is well aware, WORTMAN and his associates have been under intensive investigation by the Internal Revenue Service, the Treasury Department and by the Federal Grand Jury of the Eastern District of Illinois for the past several years.

D. CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES

The St. Louis Post Dispatch in an article dated July 9, 1958 shows that questionnaires prepared by the police and the State Liquor Control Office at Jefferson City, Missouri, had been distributed to operators of 1300 taverns and package liquor stores in St. Louis County. The distribution followed reports that underworld sources hoped to use some taverns for gambling after making loans to owners. stated in the article that 300 St. Louis County tavern operators had not answered these questions relating to sources of financial assistance and that they were going to be reported to the State Liquor authorities. The article continues that three liquor establishment operators who did answer the above questionnaires admitted loans from Plaza Amusement Company or the E & W Finance Company indicated as enterprises of gangster FRANK (BUSTER) WORTMAN at 1912 Washington Avenue.

W. (JACK) HOLLEY, 316 Woodside Drive, Kirkwood, Missouri, following his purchase of that building on or about September 8, 1958. It was indicated in the article that HOLLEY's purchase of the building was revealed by records in the Madison County Recorder of Deeds Office. It was stated that HOLLEY, until recently manager of Grandpa Pidgeon's in Bridgeton, Missouri, had stated he bought the property from A. WALTERS of St. Louis. The article stated HOLLEY was unable to give any further identification of the seller and declined to reveal the price. It was stated that included in the purchase by HOLLEY were approximately eight acres of land adjacent to the building.


