

Construction of a new maximum security Federal prison on the crab Orchard Wildlife Refuge, Rural Route 2, Carterville, Illinois, is contemplated during the next 30-90 days. According to local newspapers, bids have been received for the general contract which totals nearly \$8,000,000. Blount Brothers Construction Company of Alabama has reportedly submitted the low bid somewhat over \$7,000,000 for the general contract. According to newspaper accounts, it is estimated that nearly \$1,000,000 has already been spent in clearing, filling, and grading of the 600-acre prison tract on the Crab Orchard Wildlife Refuge.

FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN, aka "BUSTER" is presently under indictment in United States District Court, Eastern District of Illinois, East St. Louis, Illinois, charged with Federal income tax evasion and conspiracy to evade Federal income taxes. WORTMAN is commonly referred to in the St. Louis, Missouri, and East St. Louis, Illinois, press as the head of a criminal organization principally engaged in gambling known as WORTMAN and Associates. The press alleges that he is the major racketeer in the metropolitan St. Louis area which also covers the St. Clair County, Illinois, area on the east side of the Mississippi River.

WORTMAN resides near Collinsville, Illinois.


Information has been developed that the Southern Recreation Club, also known as the Southern Social Club, East St. Louis, Illinois, is actually a rather large bingo game being operated at 6503 St. Clair Avenue, East St. Louis, Illinois, under the auspices of VFW Post #6372 of Washington Park, Illinois. The operation was previously located at 5870 St. Clair Avenue, East St. Louis, Illinois. This bingo game has allegedly been operating since June or July, 1959, and is reportedly under the complete control and domination of members of the WORTMAN organization of the East St. Louis

There are allegedly anywhere from 400 to 700 or 800 people who play at the bingo game three nights each week, namely on Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday nights; special buses bring players from St. Louis, Missouri, as well as the Alton, Illinois, area. It has been alleged that the actual proceeds from the bingo games amount to as much as \$5,000 per week or more, and that WORTMAN allegedly receives a percentage of the take.

Arrested With Wortman

In the early 1930s, Tebeau was arrested in St. Louis with Edward "Ted" Wortman, Busters' brother. Tebeau's latest arrest was in 1958 when he was picked up in St. Louis as a gambling suspect. He is close to Wortman, serving recently as the night manager of the Paddock Louige, a Wortman gang meeting place in East St. Louis.

Tebeau is the "bag man"—the man who takes the money for the night's play at the bingo game, and leaves with the "take" in a black, cloth covered, briefcase each night. He makes daily trips to report to Wortman at his moated headquarters in a rural area near Collinsville.

Shanks, 55, of Ferguson, Mo., was sentenced in 1924 to the reformatory in Booneville, Mo., for 17 months on a robbery charge. In 1925 he went back to the same institution for a 5-year term on an attempted robbery charge. In 1930 he was sentenced to the Illinois Penitentiary at Menard from 1 to 20 years for auto theft. In 1939 he was arrested several times in California. In 1940 he began a one-year to life sentence at the Folson State Prison in California for robbery. He was paroled in 1944.

Since 1944. Shanks has confined his activities to the St. Louis area, with a record of pick-ups on holdups, armed robbery, auto theft, and rape cases.

State's Atty. John M. Karns Jr. said Saturday that "I am aware of the situation, but at this time I don't want to make a premature statement. However, I am confident that steps will be taken to clean up the situation in the not too distant future."

Canteen Township Supervisor Wetzel G. Harness said. "It is well known that a bingo game operation is going on at the St. Clair Avenue location."

Harness said he knew of no connection between the bingo and "outside" associates.

"I have no policing powers and if an investigation into the operation is in order, it will have to come from the policing bodies, such as the sheriff's department."

Sheriff Daniel Ring could not be reached Saturday for comment.

Sen. Monroe was contacted for comment on a resolution introduced in the House last week proposing to remove the state constitution's ban on lotteries-considered a bar to bingo.

The Illinois Council of Churches is opposed to legalized bingo, and Gov. Otto Kerner said he would veto the measure.

On the bingo proposal, Ben. Monroe said: "I'm not strong one way or the other. Personally, I think bingo is nice entertainment; if the proceeds go to a private organization or to charity. I'm for it. I certainly wouldn't want to make it the basis of a state tax, however. I say if the people want to play bingo, let them play. It's better for them to throw their money away on bingo than at the race tracks. I can't see anything wrong with bingo."

State Sen. James Gray (D-East St. Louis) said: "I'm not going to worry about the bingo proposal. I don't think it ever will pass the House, so the Senate won't have to deal with it. The governor has said he would veto such a move. However, as things stand now, and generally speaking, I am inclined to be against the proposal."

State Rep. Otis Miller Jr. (D-Belleville) said: "I'm opposed to any form of legalized gambling. However, I would need more time to study the proposed bingo legislation. I would like to have bingo clarified. As it stands now, someone must be giving permission for the bingo operations, and this is bad. If church, civic and fraternal organizations want to operate bingos or the like to make a profit, something should be done to keep them from going through these people to get permission. I'd like to see this clarified one way or the other. As it stands I don't know how I would vote on the proposal."

State Rep. Frank Holten (D-East St. Louis) and State Rep. Alan J. Dixon (D-Belleville) could not be reached Saturday for comment.

WORTMAN said his "fellows" do not have to pull any type burglaries and "that sort of thing" because they are all making a good living with what they are doing. WORTMAN re-fused to acknowledge or explain what he meant by "what they are doing". WORTMAN said again if he ever heard of any of his "fellows" doing any rough stuff, he would getrid of them immediately.

WORTMAN was asked whether he knew to which WORTMAN replied that he knew who was but that was never employed by WORTMAN or on WORTMAN's payrell.

He said he did not know if there was any association between WORTMAN said as far as he knew, and further that "some of my boys" have helped in the past to get a job and that "some of the boys" helped

WORTMAN was asked who was running the Paddock Lounge at the present time and he replied that as far as he knew, was running the place. DETAILS Frank Leonard Wortman, his brother Elmer, and Edward Dowling dominate racketeering in Southern Illinois and St. Louis, Wortman has close ties with the underworld gang which is in control in the Chicago area. He cultivates political contacts to promote his racketeering interest and has been selected as one of the Bureau's top priority subjects for development of a case for possible prosecution. He is now under indictment in a Federal income tax case with his trial scheduled for May, 1961. Wortman is extremely security conscious. He conducts all of his racketeering activities from his home known as "The Moat. which property is entirely surrounded by water except for one bridgeway which is the only means of access. Wortman issues orders from his home to his hoodlums who hang out at the Paddock Lounge, 429 St. Louis Ave., East St. Louis, Illinois. The Springfield Office feels that high-level intelligence information on Wortman, his associates and other underworld outfits can be secured by installating microphone coverage in the Wortman home. Springfield has been authorized to install a microphone at the Paddock Lounge and through additional coverage at "The Moat" it is believed that all phases of Wortman's activities will be covered. **REC-91** Springfield proposes a method of installation which involves selecting a period when Wortman and his family are absent from their This may occur while residence for a period of at least two days.
