MOTION FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION

Plaintiffs, upon the annexed complaint, move this Court for a temporary injunction, pending the final disposition of this cause, and as grounds therefor rely upon the allegations of their complaint and show the following:

- 1. Plaintiffs' constitutional rights to be free from enforced segregation on interstate and intrastate carriers and in the use of bus, railroad and airline terminal facilities in the City of Jackson and State of Mississippi are being violated by the statutes, ordinances, policy, practice, custom, and usage complained of in the complaint.
- 2. Plaintiffs have a constitutional right to be free from arrest or threat of arrest in the exercise of their rights and cannot be required by state law, policy, custom or usage to submit to such arrest, fines or imprisonment.

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray that this Court will take the necessary steps to convene a three judge court as required by Title 28 U.S.C. 2284, and will advance this case on the docket and order a speedy hearing of this action, and will grant a preliminary and permanent injuction enjoining the defendant and each of them, their igents, employees, attorneys, successors and all persons in active concert and participation with them, from:

PLAINTIFFS' MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION

Preliminary Statement

This suit seeks a temporary injunction enjoining defendants from continuing to enforce certain statutes of the State of Mississippi requiring racial segregation in dining room, waiting room and rest room facilities maintained by common carriers, to wit: Title 11, §3 2351, 2351.5 and 2351.7; Title 28, §§ 7784, 7785, 7786, 7786-01, 7787, 7787.5 of Miss. Code Ann. 1952 and any other statutes of the State of Mississippi requiring and permitting such segregation; from continuing to enforce ordinances of the City of Jackson, Mississippi requiring such racial segregation; from continuing to enforce a policy, practice, custom or usage, under color of state law, or city ordinance, of segregating Negro and white passengers on common carriers and with respect to the use of the facilities and services of depots, stations or terminals owned and/or utilized by such carriers for the business of transporting interstate or intrastate passengers for hire; from continuing

to enforce a policy, practice, custom or usage of segregation in the facilities and services of the Jackson Municipal Airport.

Plaintiffs submit the following memorandum of points and authorities in support of the motion for temporary injunction.

- 1. The jurisdiction of this Court is invoked pursuant to provisions of Title 28, United States Code, Section 1343(3).

 This action is authorized by law, Title 42, United States Code, Section 1983. This action is brought to redress the deprivation of rights, privileges and immunities secured to plaintiffs by the Constitution and laws of the United States [due process and equal protection clauses of the Fourteenth Amendment and Article 1, Section 8, Clause 3, the Commerce Clause of the Constitution and Title 49, United States Code, Section 3(1) (Railroad and Pipeline Carriers) and Section 316(d) (Motor Carriers)]. Plaintiffs have been deprived of these rights, privileges and immunities by the defendants while acting under color of state statutes, city ordinances, state custom and state usage, as hereinafter more fully appears.
- 2. The jurisdiction of this Court is also invoked pursuant to provisions of Title 28, United States Code, Section 2281 and Section 2284. This is an action to enjoin the enforcement of certain statutes of the State of Mississippi requiring racial segregation on common carriers, and in waiting room and rest room facilities utilized by common carriers, and providing criminal penalties for carriers and persons refusing to abide by such segregation. The statutes sought to be enjoined are Title 11, Sections 2351, 2351.5 and 2351.7, and Title 28, §§7784, 7785, 7786. 7786-01, 7787, 7787.5, Mississippi Code Annotated (1952).
- 3. This is a proceeding for a preliminary and permanent injunction enjoining defendants and each of them, their agents, employees, attorneys, successors and all persons in active concert and participation with them from:

This is a class action brought by the plaintiffs on behalf of themselves and on behalf of other Negroes similarly situated and affected by the statutes, ordinances, policies, practices, customs, regulations and usages complained of herein. This class action is brought pursuant to provisions of Rule 23(a) (3) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. The members of the class on whose behalf plaintiffs sue are too numerous to be brought individually before this Court, but there are common questions of law and fact involved, common grievances arising out of common wrongs, and a common relief is sought for each plaintiff and for each member of the class, as hereinafter more fully appears. The named plaintiffs fairly and adequately represent the members of the class on behalf of which they sue.
- 5. The plaintiffs are: Samuel Bailey, Joseph Broadwater, and Burnett L. Jacob. Each plaintiff is an adult Negro citizen of the United States and of the State of Mississippi, presently residing in Jackson, Mississippi.
- 6. The defendants in this case are: Joe T. Patterson,
 Attorney General of the State of Mississippi, the chief law
 enforcement officer of the State; the City of Jackson, a municipal corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the
 State of Mississippi; Allen C. Thompson, Mayor of the City of

 Marshall, a commissioner of the City of Jackson; W. D. Rayfield,

Plaintiffs allege, on information and belief, that Continental Southern Lines, Inc., owns and/or operates the Trailways bus depot located at 201/Pascagoula Street in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and utilizes this depot in connection with its business of transporting interstate and intrastate motor passengers for hire. 8. Plaintiffs allege, on information and belief, that the Greyhound Corporation owns and/or operates the Greyhound bus depot located at 219 No. Lamar Street in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and utilizes said depot in connection with its business of transporting interstate and intrastate motor passengers for hire. 9. Plaintiffs allege, on information and belief, that defendant Jackson City Lines, Inc., maintains an office at 800 West Monument Street in the City of Jackson. 10. Plaintiffs allege, on information and belief, that the Illinois Central Railroad Company, Inc., owns and/or operates the Illinois Central Passenger Station located at 300 West Capitol Street in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and utilizes said station in connection with its business of transporting interstate and intrastate passengers for hire. 11. Plaintiffs allege that the Jackson Municipal Airport Terminal is owned and operated by the defendant City of Jackson and that the defendant Douglas L. Lucky, Commissioner of the City of Jackson, has direct supervision and control over the said airport and its terminal. Plaintiffs allege that the rest rooms at said terminal are segregated and that Negroes are denied service

upon the same terms and conditions applicable to white persons in the airport terminal restaurant. Plaintiffs allege, on information and belief, that the City of Jackson has leased to one Cicero Carr, an individual, the space in the airport terminal allotted for a restaurant facility and that this restaurant facility is operated by said individual under said lease for the use and benefit of airlines passengers and the general public using the airport.. 12. Plaintiffs allege that defendant Joe Patterson, as Attorney General of the State of Mississippi, is under a duty to enforce Title 11, §§2351, 2351.5 and 2351.7 and Title 28, §§7784, 7785, 7786, 7786-O1, 7787 and 7787.5 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1952), and threatens to enforce such laws against plaintiffs and the defendant carriers if said laws are violated by the plaintiffs or the defendant carriers. Plaintiffs allege that these statutes (requiring separate railroad cars, separate partititions on busses, separate rest room facilities, separate waiting rooms, and the posting of signs designating the separate facilities assigned to the Negro race and the separate facilities assigned to the white race) are unconstitutional on their face. 13. Plaintiffs allege that each defendant carrier is enforcing segregation of white and Negro passengers transported by it on its transportation facility and is enforcing segregation in the depots, stations, or terminals owned and/or operated by each carrier and utilized by it, pursuant to the requirements of the statutes set forth above. 14. One hundred forty freedom riders have been arrested h6 at Jackson since 5/24/61. Forty-four have been released on b7C bond four have been released upon payment of fines and 92 remain in custody. All freedom riders in the Jackson City Jail and the Hinds County Jail are eating. The Jackson police arrested seven Negroes at the Jackson Municipal Zoo on 6/22/61 when they failed to comply with police instructions that they move. All were charged with breach of the peace. The police had received a complaint from a white woman that a Negro couple had pushed her small son away from a drinking fountain, and a Negro couple had been observed "hugging and kissing." Trial is tentatively scheduled for 6/23/61. Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), New Orleans, advised on 6/22/61that five freedom riders arrived in New Orleans by airplane from Los Angeles on 6/22/61, and one freedom rider arrived by airplane from Tucson, Arizona, on 6/22/61. Ten freedom riders from San Francisco are scheduled to arrive in New Orleans by train at 5:30 p.m., 6/23/61. These sixteen freedom riders plan to leave New Orleans at 7:10 a.m., 6/25/61, by Illinois Central Railroad train, City of New Orleans, to arrive at Jackson, Mississippi, 10:20 a.m., 6/25/61. Each of the eleven persons convicted at Tallahassee was released 6/22/61 on \$1,000 bond and defense attorneys announced that they will take an immediate direct appeal to the Florida Supreme Court. The ten freedom riders left Tallahassee by airplane at 11:47 p.m., EST, 6/22/61, for New York via Jacksonville. (Two may come to Washington instead of New York from Jacksonville.)

Charges were dismissed against the other Tallahassee residents who were arrested with the freedom riders on 6/16/61.

Julius W. Hobson, President, Washington, D. C., Chapter, CORE, advised that CORE plans a "march" in Washington on 7/4/61. It is anticipated that approximately 200 people will take part in this demonstration, but definite plans have not yet been made.

Three freedom riders are still scheduled to proceed to Tallahassee from Washington, D. C., by Eastern Air Lines, departing from Washington at 5:45 plm. and arriving at Tallahassee at 10:46 p.m., 6/23/61.

If the restaurant had been opened and if the group had demanded service, arrests would have been made by the Sheriff's Office to bring a test case into county court. Prior arrests were made by Tallahassee police.

Florida Civil Liberties Union has retained four attorneys to represent the freedom riders at Tallahassee. It has been indicated they will allege the Tallahassee police were without jurisdiction at the airport which lies outside the city limits although it is city-owned. It is also anticipated the defense will challenge the constitutionality of the unlawful assembly statute under which arrests were made.

Trial of three freedom riders arrested at Ocala, Florida, 6/16/61, scheduled for 6/21/61, has been postponed until 7/5/61.

Seventy persons attended CORE meeting at Washington, D. C., 6/20/61. The following transpired:

It was stated freedom ride from Washington, D. C., to Tallahassee, Florida, had been rescheduled from 6/20/61 to 6/23/61, at the request of CORE National Headquarters in order to postpone the trip until after the trial of freedom riders at Tallahassee, 6/22/61.

Primary purpose of the meeting was to discuss "Operation Vacation in Jail." This plan, still in formative stage, would send as many as possible from Washington for a one-week southern tour starting 7/1/61. All arrested would stay in jail as long as possible.

A committee was established to investigate discrimination in employment, particularly hiring practices of the Hecht Company and the Hahn Shoe Store. Committee also established to determine whether discrimination is practiced at the Levitt housing development at Bel Air, Maryland.

It was stated the next national project of CORE will be the picketing of Federal buildings throughout the country 7/4/61, but this will occur only if the Interstate Commerce Commission has not ordered desegregation of all interstate transportation facilities. All offices being advised.

Nine freedom riders proceeded from Montgomery, Alabama, to Jackson, Mississippi, by Trailways bus on 6/21/61 and were arrested at 6:15 p.m. when they entered the white waiting room in the bus terminal at Jackson and refused to leave. They will probably be tried 6/22/61.

One hundred forty freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since 5/24/61. Forty-four have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines and 92 remain in custody. All of those in custody at the Jackson City Jail and the Hinds County Jail are eating.

Trial of the rabbis and ministers who were arrested at the Tallahassee airport on 6/16/61 is scheduled for 6/22/61. Eight of the defendants arrived in Tallahassee by airplane on 6/21/61. The restaurant at the airport had been closed prior to their arrival. Two white clergymen in the group entered the colored restaurant but there was no incident.

Prior to the arrival of the above group in Tallahassee, Chief Deputy ______ Leon County Sheriff's Office, Tallahassee, advised that the restaurant would be closed prior to the arrival of the rabbis and ministers. He also stated that if the restaurant should be opened when they arrive and if the group should seek service, they would be requested to leave the premises under the provisions of Florida Statute 509.141 of the Hotel and Restaurant Commission Regulations which states that the owner of a restaurant has the right to refuse service to any individual. ______ also stated that if the group should remain in the lobby for an unreasonable length of time and refuse to move on, they might be arrested on charges of unlawful assembly by the Tallahassee police.

Ed Hill, Tallahassee City Prosecutor, has advised that the Sheriff's Office was designated to handle any arrests in the airport restaurant so that a test case could be brought before the Leon County Court, Tallahassee. Hill also stated he has been informed that

C., and who were arrested at the bus station in Ocala, Florida, 6/16/61, were scheduled for trial at Ocala, 6/21/61. Trial has been postponed to 7/5/61. They are charged with failure to obey the order of a police officer who told them they could not eat at the bus station restaurant and who asked them to leave.

Information has been received that the Washington, D. C., Chapter of CORE held a meeting 6/20/61. Approximately 70 persons were present. Julius W. Hobson, President of the Chapter, reportedly stated that the freedom riders who were to leave Washington, D. C., for Tallahassee, Florida, 6/20/61, has rescheduled their trip for 6/23/61 at the request of CORE National Headquarters. It was desired to postpone the trip until after the trial of the freedom riders at Tallahassee on 6/22/61, but it was stated that the trip will be made on 6/23/61 regardless of the outcome of the trial.

The primary purpose of the CORE meeting at Washington was to discuss "Operation Vacation in Jail," under which as many members of the Washington, D. C., Chapter as possible will depart from Washington, 7/1/61, for one week's travel through the southern states. All of those arrested will stay in jail as long as possible before returning to Washington. Plans for this operation are still in the formative stage.

The CORE meeting established a committee to investigate discrimination in employment with emphasis being placed upon the hiring practices of the Hecht Company and the Hahn Shoe Store. A housing committee was established to determine whether discrimination its being practiced at the Levitt housing development, Bel Air, Maryland.

It was also reported that Hobson informed the meeting that the next national project of CORE will be a nationwide picketing demonstration on 7/4/61 if the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) has not ordered all interstate transportation companies to desegregate their facilities. If this project is put into effect, the Washington Chapter of CORE will picket the ICC offices in Washington for two hours, and Federal buildings throughout the country will be picketed. Hobson emphasized that these plans were contingent upon the action taken by the ICC. This information is being brought to the attention of all offices.







The Daytona Beach Group left Daytona Beach,
Florida, at 5:30 a.m., June 15, 1961, via Greyhound bus
and arrived at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Jacksonville,
Florida, at 7:30 a.m. the same date. According to
news reporter, the group consisted of the following
individuals:

A group of eighteen "Freedom Riders" from Washington, D. C., arrived at the Greyhound Bus Terminal a few minutes after the arrival of the Daytona Beach Group. A number of police officers and news men were on hand to meet these groups. Aside from these individuals there was no unusual crowd at the bus station; however, a member of the Florida Ku Klux Klan, was present

as an observer.

The members of both groups used the restrooms and restaurant facilities at the terminal on an integrated basis and no incident occurred.

The Daytona Beach Group departed Jacksonville via Greyhound bus at 8:27 a.m., June 15, 1961, en route to Tallahassee, Florida. A rest stop was made at Lake City, Florida, where the group tested restroom and restaurant facilities and no incidents resulted.

The group arrived at Tallahassee, Florida, at 12:40 p.m. on the same date and had lunch in what had formerly been the all white dining room at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, and no incidents occurred. The group was joined at the Greyhound Bus Station by colored, Tallahassee, Florida, who accompanied the group to the Trailways Bus Station in Tallahassee where tickets were purchased for Thomasville, Georgia. They departed Tallahassee, Florida, via Trailways bus at 2:00 p.m. They subsequently returned from Thomasville by Trailways bus, arriving at 3:50 p.m.

The Daytona Beach Group boarded a Greyhound bus for Tampa, Florida, and departed Ocalá, Florida, at 4:28 p.m. on June 16, 1961.

He said he believed Negroes should continue to test segregated transportation facilities until their goal is achieved, though faced with the prospect of an indefinite period of arrest.

He further stated ICC had been asked to issue an order reaffirming the prohibition against segregation at transportation terminals. Remarked "Once that comes, it will clear the matter up once and for all."

Reverend Dr. JACKSON emphasized he was not "condemning the Freedom Riders, but said "my approach would be different."

"Having lived in Mississippi," he said at a press conference, "Timow that Negroes going to jail won't touch the conscience of the segregationists. Their moral sensitivity is not that tender."

The Reve Dr. JACKSON said that "where the laws of a state are in conflict with federal law, the state must obey the federal law.

"But this conflict must be corrected by the agencies of law, by the courts, and by the Federal Government itself. In making protest, I would make sure I was acting in harmony with the law."



A second source advised on October 26, 1959, that the name of the Oakland Branch of the SWP was changed to the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP.

A third source advised on May 1, 1961, that the San Francisco Branch and the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP follow the policies and directives of the National SWP with which they are affiliated.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The three freedom riders, who were to proceed from Washington, D. C. to Tallahassee, Florida, on 6/23/61 changed their plans and flew to New Orleans on 6/23/61. CORE, New Orleans, advised that the three freedom riders from Washington, D. C. are joining the freedom riders who have come to New Orleans from Los Angeles and San Francisco California, and Tucson, Arizona. The combined group of 21 will proceed to Jackson, Mississippi, by Illinois Central Railroad train, City of New Orleans, leaving New Orleans 7:10 AM, 6/25/61 and arriving at Jackson, 10:20 AM (CST) 6/25/61, (12:20 PM, Washington time).
The local press at Honolulu, Hawaii, reported on 6/23/61, that sympathizers of the freedom riders will picket when Governor John Patterson of Alabama arrives in Honolulu on 6/24/61. This item was furnished to the paper by John Reinecke, who was convicted under the Smith Act as a Communist Party functionary in Honolulu but whose conviction was reversed by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in 1958. Reinecke said he will lead the pickets.
Third Army Headquarters, Atlanta, has reported that Paul D. Johnson, Lieutenant Governor of Mississippi, has received a letter from Mississippi State Sovereignty Commission which alleges that 2,000 freedom riders coming from New York and Chicago by all means of transportation will appear in all major cities in Mississippi during the week of 7/4/61.
New Orleans Chapter of CORE, has received a letter from CORE, New York, encouraging the picketing on 7/4/61 of the Federal building housing Department of Justice offices and offices of Illinois Central Railroad. said that this is part of a nation-wide plan but discretion rests with individual CORE chapters as to whether picketing will occur in any given locality. doubts that picketing will occur in New Orleans.

They all appeared before Judge Lewis O. Myers, Marion County Judges Court, Ocala, on June 16, 1961; bond set at \$500 each charge on each of the above individuals. They were released on bond on that date, with bonds returnable June 21, 1961.

The records of the Marion County Judges Court, Ocala, as checked on June 21, 1961, reflect the above persons were arraigned before Judge Lewis O. Myers, Jr., on that date and all entered pleas of not guilty to the above charges. They were represented by Jacksonville, Florida, attorney. Judge Myers set trial date for all three as July 5, 1961.

A source who is in a position to furnish reliable information advised the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on June 11, 1961, that two groups of "Freedom Riders" would leave Washington, D. C., on June 13, 1961, via Greyhound Bus, making various stops in southern States to determine if bus terminal facilities were integrated. One group reportedly consisted of eighteen clergymen, while the other group, which subsequently separated into two sections, was made up of fourteen professional and union people.

This memorandum will deal only with the first section of the Professional Group of the "Freedom Riders" to arrive in Jacksonville, Florida. Information concerning the second section of the Professional Group and the eighteen clergymen, referred to above, are the subjects of other memoranda.

One group reportedly consisted of 18 clergymen, referred to as the Interfaith Group, while the other group, which subsequently split into two sections, was made up of 14 professional and union people.

This memorandum will deal only with the group consisting of 18 clergymen during the time they were in that part of Florida under the jurisdiction of the Jacksonville, Florida, Office of the FBI. Information concerning the group of 14 professional and union people is the subject of other memoranda.

The Interfaith Group entered Florida from Georgia at 6:48 a.m. June 15, 1961, via Greyhound Bus and arrived at Jacksonville, Florida, Greyhound Bus Terminal at 7:34 a.m. The group consisted of 7 white ministers, 7 colored ministers and 4 Jewish Rabbis.

Members of the group used the rest rooms and restaurant facilities on an integrated basis and no incidents occurred.

This group left Jacksonville for Tallahassee, Florida, at 8:34 a.m. June 15, 1961, by Greyhound Bus. They stopped en route at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Lake City, Florida, where they used the rest rooms and restaurant on an integrated basis without incident.

The group arrived at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Tallahassee, Florida, at 12:40 p.m. June 15, 1961, and had lunch in the formerly all-white lunchroom without incident.

The group thereafter traveled to the Tallahassee Airport in private automobiles, where they purchased tickets to New York City via Eastern Airlines.

The Tallahassee Police Department, in anticipation of possible racial disorder, sealed off the airport and permitted only those who had official business to transact to enter the grounds.

Upon attempt to use the facilities of the airport, it was discovered by the group that plumbers were repairing the rest rooms and that the restaurant had been closed allegedly for cleaning. Eight of the group subsequently returned to New York City that afternoon on Eastern Airlines Flight Number 268. The other 10 members of the group indicated their intention to remain at the airport until the facilities were opened to them.

He said they returned to the airport at 7:25 a.m. that date, after first learning the airport restaurant normally opens at 7:00 a.m. He said they found the restaurant still closed and stated that they now intended to remain in the terminal until they could secure service at the restaurant. advised that he had just been informed by the Chief of Police, Tallahassee, that he had a town of 50,000 people to protect and could no longer keep his police force at the airport for protection of the said the chief of police had Interfaith Group. returned to Tallahassee with all but two of his men and that in addition there were two Florida State Police Officers in the airport.

Shortly after noon, on June 16, 1961, the 10 members of the Interfaith Group were taken into custody by the Tallahassee Police Department and charged with unlawful assembling. Also arrested on same charge were 3 local individuals, who had joined the group at the airport. All were immediately transported to the Leon County Jail, Tallahassee, and were arraigned by City Judge John Rudd. Bond was fixed at \$500 and all were committed to jail when bond was not posted. The members of the group appeared before Judge John Rudd on the morning of June 17, 1961, and entered not guilty pleas to the charges of unlawful assembly. The trial date was set by Rudd for June 22, 1961, at Tallahassee, Florida.

After leaving the Tallahassee Jail, the group proceeded to the airport, where 8 members booked passage on National Airlines Flight 362, which departed from Tallahassee at approximately 3:35 p.m. June 17, 1961, for Jacksonville, Florida. They changed planes at Jacksonville, Florida, at approximately 4:55 p.m. and proceeded to Newark, New Jersey, by Eastern Airlines Flight 608, which was due to arrive at the Newark Airport at 8:30 p.m. on that date.

Governor Farris Bryant of Florida issued the following statement on June 16, 1961, as to his position in regard to the "Freedom Riders":

"Florida has accorded to the Freedom Riders the full protection of her laws. Regardless of cost or convenience, their trip across Florida was made peaceful and without incident. Unfortunately these people were not willing to leave Florida without creating discord and securing attendant publicity. In the last ten minutes of their scheduled stay, they embarked upon a new course designed to make trouble. If not deterred by local authorities they would have succeeded with damage to the poise and dignity of this state. We offer the full protection of the law to all in Florida who seek to pursue lawful purposes, but we issue no licenses granting immunity from arrest to those who violate our laws by their actions. Neither the cause, nor the composition of any group of people frees them from their obligation as citizens."

"Freedom Riders" (Interfaith Group)

The "Florida Times Union" newspaper, Jacksonville, Florida, dated June 18, 1961, contained an article which disclosed that the Congress of Racial Equality had warned that a new team of "Freedom Riders" would come to Tallahassee next week for a second effort to "crack the racial barrier at the airport restaurant."

The above information was discussed on a continuing basis with _______Military Intelligence (CIC), Jacksonville, Florida, and local authorities in the cities through which the group passed.

Chief Charles Mc Laughlin, Rye, New York Police Department, advised=on June 21, 1961, that at about 10:30 PM on June 19, 1961, an attempt was made to burn a wooden cross on the lawn of the home of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Sterling, Kirby Lane, Rye, New York.

Cross was made out of a six foot length of flooring and cross piece was made from a piece of light wood molding. Cloth was wrapped around the wood and held in place by wire. Material appeared to have been covered with kerosene. Due to fact cloth was wrapped tightly about wood, it did not burn completely.

Mr. Sterling was at home at time of incident. He heard a sound similar to that of a fire cracker and some shouting. He went out of house and saw fire burning on the lawn which he extinguished with a garden hose. He reported that when he got outside, he observed no one in the vicinity and does not recall hearing the sound of an automobile leaving the scene.

RACIAL MATTERS; DESTRUCTION OF aircraft or motor vehicles: civil rights

One hundred sixty-four freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, since May 24, 1961. Fifty-five have been released on bond, four have been released after paying fines, and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred four remain in custody.

It has previously been reported that a petition for a writ of habeas corpus was filed in U. S. District Court. Biloxi. Mississippi. by a freedom rider who was errested at Jackson on June 2, 1961. U. S. District Judge S. G. Mike has now-informed attorneys for the netitioner that the petition must be denied because state remedies have not been exhausted. Judge Mice said that he will file a written opinion this week but he is giving further consideration as to whether or not the court should retain jurisdiction until state remedies have been exhausted.

We have been informed that representatives of organizations promoting freedom rides held a meeting at Jackson on June 27. 1961. which was described as a regular weekly meeting of the Freedom Hide Coordinating Committee. Field Service, Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), New York City, and Reversed Martin Luther, Hing were said to be the speakers. The meeting reportedly gave no consideration to discontinuing freedom rides but expressed an intention to continue freedom rides into Jackson. Mississippi, and other unspecified localities. It was said at the meeting that moral pressure is bearing heavily upon the people of Mississippi and the Freedom Ride Coordinating Committee will seek to maintain moral and legal pressure at Jackson. Walker stated at a press conference that upon his release from Minds County Jail on June 27, 1901, he was missing a diamond ring valued at \$275, as well as \$75 in cash. He alleged that some of the money belonged to his wife. Sheriff J. Robert Cilfoy advised a representative of the press that he will make an immediate investigation of Reverend Walker's complaint. It is noted that Reverend Valker and his wife were arrested as freedom riders at Jackson, Mississippi, on June 21, 1961, and were released on bond on June 27, 1961.

The local press has reported that York, Pennsylvania, representatives of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) will ride on a freedom train from Philadelphia to Washington, D. C., on July 12, 1961. It was stated that this is in connection with the fifty-second annual NAACP convention being held at Philadelphia from July 10 to July 16, 1961, and that the freedom riders will visit their respective Congressmen to press for civil rights legislation.





Hargis said that two thousand or two thousand five hundred freedom riders would come to Jackson but Chief of Detectives Pierce believes this statement was made purely for the purpose of obtaining publicity. The exact date of the meeting could not be determined but it was indicated that it was hold about two yeeks after the freedom rides started.

Cur sources in New Orleans, including contacts with COTES and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored Feople (NAACF), have no information regarding any mass freedom rides. We have been advised that a creal group of freedom riders will travel from Nachville, Tennessee, to Jackson, Esselssippi, cometime during the weekend of July 1, 1961.

The New Origina Chapter of CORE to planning a demonstration to take place between 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on July 4, 1961. There reportedly will be a parade from the St. James A. M.E. Church to the effices of the Illinois Central Hallroad. The marchors will carry placerds supporting the freedom ridors and demanding that the Interstate Commerce Commission order the desegregation of transportation facilities. At least ten members of CORE plan to participate and they may be joined by representatives of the Consumers League, the NAACP, Negro fraternal organizations and graduate chapters of Negro college fraternities.

Julius W. Hobson, President, Washington, D. C. Chapter, CGRE, advised on June 28, 1901, that three hundred local members of CCRE vill assemble on the Mall at 11:00 a.m. on July 4, 1961. They will proceed to Judiciary Square, Fifth and E Ctreets, Northwest, carrying signs protecting the arrest of freedom riders. The protest vill be directed against the states rather than the Federal Government.

If was originally planned that a demonstration would be held in front of the interstate Commerce Commission building in Washington, D. C., on July 4, 1961. For Mobson said that this plan was abandoned no it was felt that it would be in poor tasts to demonstrate in front of a Federal building. He also said that COMM members believe the Federal Government

to doing everything in its power to promote racial equality. In this regard he made reference to legal action being taken by the Department of Justico to integrate restaurants in Louisiana.

Mr. Mobson commented that he has recommended to national heconverters of CORE that the freedom rides be discontinued because of a chortage of funds and because he feels that CORE has proven that segregation exists in transportation facilities in Mississippi, Alabama and Florida. He believes that legal action should now be taken in these states to effect the integration of transportation facilities. He added that the Washington Chapter of CORE will not sponsor future freedom rides but will devote its activities to housing matters in Washington, D. C.

It was further stated by Mr. Hobson that CORE groups throughout the country plan to hold demonstrations on July 4, 1061.

It has previously been reported that a suit was filed in U. S. District Court, Tallahassee, Florida, on behalf of three Negro ministers who seek to integrate the airport restaurant at Tallahassee. A hearing in this matter has now been scheduled for July 18, 1961, before U. S. District Judge G. Harrold Carswell.

The Department will be advised promptly of further pertinent developments.

Memorandum for Mr. Belmont

DETAILS

One hundred sixty-four freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, since $5/24/61$. Fifty-five have been released on bond, four have been released after paying fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred four remain in custody.
It is noted that a freedom rider who was arrested at Jackson on 6/2/61, has previously filed a petition for a writ of habeas corpus in U. S. District Court, Biloxi, Mississippi. U. S. District Judge S. C. Mize has informed the attorneys representing that the petition must be denied because state remedies have not been exhausted. Judge Mize also informed the attorneys that he will file a written opinion during the week but is giving further consideration as to whether or not he should retain jurisdiction until state remedies have been exhausted.
With regard to the meeting at Jackson on 6/27/61 of organizations which promote freedom rides, a reporter for the "Jackson Daily News," furnished the following information. The meeting was attended by
Director, Field Service, Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), New York City; N.4 Reverend Martin Luther King, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta; 69
Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, Atlanta: GA Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, Atlanta and Nashville; TEM. Reversed Reversed Reverse Christian Leadership Conference
Reverend Bernard Lee, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta: Senior Field Representative, CORE, New Orleans;
James Bevel, Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, Nashville: 7 Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, Memphis: 7
Reverend Ralph Abernathy, Montgomery Improvement Association.

Memorandum for Mr. Belmont
and Martin Luther King reportedly were the spokesmen at the meeting which was described as a regular weekly meeting of the Freedom Ride Coordinating Committee. It was stated that there was no thought given to discontinuing the freedom rides but that freedom rides will continue to proceed to Jackson, Mississippi, and other places which were not specifically named. It was said that moral pressure is bearing heavily on the people of Mississippi and the group will seek to maintain moral and legal pressure in Jackson. It was claimed that bond money is available for any convicted freedom rider who wishes it.
James Saggus, Associated Press, Jackson, advised that a press conference was held after the above meeting at which time Reverend Wyatt T. Walker alleged that upon his release from Hinds County Jail 6/27/61 he was
missing a diamond ring valued at \$275 and \$75 in cash, including some money which belonged to his wife. It is noted that Reverend Walker and his wife were arrested as freedom riders at Jackson on 6/21/61 and were released on bond on 6/27/61. Saggus said that Sheriff J. Robert Gilfoy stated that he will make an immediate investigation of Walker's complaint.
On 6/27/61 the Civil Rights Division requested a preliminary investigation regarding alleged brutality to freedom riders at the Hinds County Jail, Jackson, Mississippi. This request was based upon a newspaper article quoting Kenneth Shilman, former freedom rider, as having alleged that Felix Singer and Terry Sullivan were dragged along a concrete corridor, had their clothes ripped off, and were subjected to the use of "wrist breakers" and electric shockers. Signed statements setting forth details of the complaint have been obtained from all of whom were arrested at Jackson,
Mississippi, as freedom riders and all of whom have been released. The complainants state that when the prisoners were being moved from Jackson to the Mississippi State Penitentiary at Parchman, Mississippi, on 6/15/61, decided to practice noncooperation. It was, therefore, necessary for them to be dragged or carried to the prison van at Jackson and Sullivan's head was allegedly hit against the van as he was being placed in it. Except for this instance the alleged mistreatment occurred at the penitentiary when continued to practice noncooperation while being taken into the penitentiary and while being moved about within the penitentiary for fingerprinting, issuance of clothing, etc.

This was discussed with of the Civil Rights Division and it was pointed out that prior to any investigation at the penitentiary it would be necessary to notify the Governor or the person acting for him. The Governor and the Lieutenant Governor are presently in Honolulu and the Acting Governor is George Y. Yarborough, President Pro Tempore of the State Senate said that he did not desire any further investigation pending his review of the statements of the complainants on 6/28/61.
Prior to the above discussion with made to interview Sheriff J. Robert Gilfoy, Hinds County, Mississippi. Sheriff Gilfoy subsequently contacted the Agents and advised that when were transferred from Jackson to the penitentiary they acted as though they were completely lifeless. They stated that they refused to move and upon being lifted into the prison van they both laid on the floor. When the van arrived at the penitentiary all of the prisoners except got out. It was necessary
to carry from the van and said at that time that he would
not move a muscle and would have to be dragged wherever he was taken. They let
themselves go limp and were lifted by two deputies who heldsthem under the armpits
and carried them permitting their feet to drag. refused to


All persons handling the prisoners in the move from Jackson to the penitentiary were deputies of the Hinds County Sheriff's Office. They had been instructed by the Governor, the Sheriff and other officials to handle the prisoners in such a manner that no criticism could result. The space occupied by the prisoners at the penitentiary is being loaned to the sheriff's office and a deputy sheriff is on duty at Parchman to insure that the prisoners are properly treated and that no incidents arise. The prisoners are dressed in gymnasium trunks and T shirts in accordance with prison regulations. Sheriff Gilfoy denied that the prisoners had been abused in any way and stated that no electric shockers were used at any time. He also said that the deputies did not have wrist breakers and none were used in his presence.

A source who is in a position to furnish reliable information advised the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on June 11, 1961, that two groups of "Freedom Riders" would leave Washington, D. C., on June 13, 1961, via Greyhound Bus, making various stops in southern States to determine if bus terminal facilities were integrated. One group reportedly consisted of eighteen clergymen, while the other group, which subsequently separated into two sections, was made up of fourteen professional and union people.

This memorandum will deal only with the second section of the Professional Group to arrive in Jacksonville, Information concerning the first section of the Professional Group and the eighteen clergymen, referred to above, are the subjects of other memoranda.

This group entered the State of Florida from Georgia at 4:25 p. m. on June 15, 1961, via Greyhound Bus and arrived at the Jacksonville, Florida, Bus Terminal at 5:15 p. m. on that date.

This group was met at the terminal by two members of the first section of the Professional Group and by of the "Florida Star", weekly negro newspaper published in Jacksonville. Fla

The terminal facilities were tested on an integrated basis without incident and no unusual crowd was present at the terminal. However, Member of the Florida Ku Klux Klan, was present as an observer. The arrival of this group at Jacksonville was covered by local press and Police Officers.

At 5:50 p. m., this group left the terminal in three private automobiles for the purpose of spending the night in private homes in the Jacksonville area.

The group left Jacksonville by Greyhound Bus at 9:56 a. m., enroute to Tampa, Florida, with a rest stop at Ocala, Florida.

The group arrived at Ocala, Florida, at 12:23 p. m. on June 16, 1961, and entered the bus station waiting room. Five or six white males were in the waiting room, three of whom claimed the negro "Freedom Riders" stepped on their feet and bumped them as they entered the waiting room.

Arguments reportedly ensued and Chief Criminal Deputy, Marion County Sheriff's Office, Ocala, immediately intervened. told the group that he did not want to have any trouble and that they could not eat at the bus station restaurant and asked them to leave. The "Freedom Riders" reportedly refused to obey his order to leave and he placed three of them under arrest, charging them with failure to obey the lawful order of a Police Officer and attempting to incite a riot. The three individuals arrested were subsequently released on June 16, 1961, after \$1,000.00 bonds were posted The \$1,000.00 bond confor each by sisted of \$500.00 on each of the above-mentioned charges. These three individuals appeared before Judge Lewis O. Myers, Marion County, Florida, and pled not guilty on the foregoing charges. They are to appear for trial on June 21, 1961, at Ocala, Florida. They then departed from Ocala with at 7:10 p. m. on June 16, 1961, enroute to Tampa and St. Petersburg, Florida.

The above information was discussed on a continuing Military Intelligence, (CIC), Jacksonville, Florida, and local authorities in the Cities through which the group passed.

THE PHYSICIANS' FORUM, INC.

Records in the Office of the Clerk of the New York State Supreme Court, Foley Square, New York, reflect that the Physicians' Forum, Inc. (PF) was issued a Certificate of Incorporation on April 27, 1944, under the laws of the State of New York, to operate as a non-profit, membership organization principally in the United States. The PF, under the name of the New York Physicians' Forum, had been in existence as an unincorporated association since about 1939.

A source, on September 13, 1954, furnished a folder of PF entitled, "What Is The Physicians' Forum?" which stated in part that to maintain freedom of thought and expression in medicine, the Forum opposes the imposition of "loyalty oaths" as a prerequisite for licensure, for hospital appointments or privileges, in medical schools, on hospital staffs and against patients; to re-establish the freedom of the medical press, the Forum urges medical society publications to open their volumes to diverse views on controversial subjects; and to provide a forum wherein socially liberal doctors may express their views in opposition to the policies of organized medicine.

The report of the Sub-Committee to Investigate the Administration of the Internal Security Act and other Security Laws of the Committee on the Judiciary, United States Senate, 82nd Congress, 1952, on "Subversive Influence in the Educational Process" on page 37 sets out the testimony of BELLA DODD, member of the National Committee of the Communist Party from 1944 to 1948. DODD testified that the PF was established primarily by the Communist Party and although not all members of the PF were Communists, the "initiative for organizing the PF came from the Communist Party, came from the ninth floor (35 East 12th Street, New York City), where the National Committee of the CP existed."

The Communist Party, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



THE PHYSICIANS' FORUM, INC. (CONTINUED)

On May 11, 1960, the above source advised that the PF continues to be active in its program of supporting legislation which would provide medical care for the recipients of Social Security benefits; is active in its campaign seeking Social Security benefits for physicians; and is active in its campaign of alerting the medical profession to the problems of radiation hazards and its control.

The June 14, 1961, issue of the "Bradford Era," daily newspaper published at Bradford, Pennsylvania, contained an article captioned, "Rabbi Here Joins 'Freedom Riders' Going South," which set out that Rabbi Allan Levine of Temple Beth El had joined the ranks of the "Freedom Riders."

The article stated that Rabbi Levine was listed as one of a new group of "Freedom Riders" heading south by regularly scheduled bus to test racial segregation, and that his group had arrived at Raleigh, North Carolina, on Tuesday (June 13, 1961) without incident. According to the news item, Rabbi Levine's group was composed of eighteen men--four rabbis, eight white ministers, and six Negro ministers. They were met at the bus station in Raleigh upon their arrival from Washington, D. C., by television and newspaper photographers.

The article concluded that to that date there had been no incidents reported and that they were heading into the deeper south.

Bernard Lee, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta, and Reverend Ralph Abernathy, Montgomery, Alabama, may also attend the meeting at Jackson. said that the purpose of the meeting is to review the present policies relating to freedom rides and to shape new policy. personally anticipates no major changes in freedom ride practices and indicated that the meeting will be chiefly concerned with achieving better coordination between the various groups.
Julius W. Hobson, President, Washington, D. C. Chapter, CORE, advised on 6/26/61 that no more freedom rides will originate at Washington, D. C. but freedom riders will now depart for the South from CORE headquarters in New York City.
Hobson stated that on $6/28/61$ he will make available the final plans for the "march" in Washington, D. C., scheduled for $7/4/61$.

The Petition of Elizabeth Porter Wyckoff respectfully shows:

- 1. That your petitioner is a citizen of the United States and a resident of the City, County and States of New York.
- 2. That your petitioner is now imprisioned and restrained of her liberty in Hinds County Jail, in the City of Jackson, County of Hinds, State of Mississippi, in this District, in the custody of J. R. Gilfoy, Sheriff of said County of Hinds. Hinds County Jail is a jail of the County of Hinds, State of Mississippi under the jurisdiction of the said Sheriff of the County of Hinds, State of Mississippi.
- 3. That the cause or pretense of such imprisonment and restraint is not known to your petitioner. Your petitioner has been informed, however, and verify believes that your petitioner is held as a county prisoner under the exclusive jurisdiction or custody of the said Sheriff of Hinds County, State of Mississippi, pursuant to a judgment of the Municipal Court of the City of Jackson, County of Hinds, State of Mississippi, wherein and whereby your petitioner was convicted of violating Section 2087.5, Mississippi Code of 1942, anno., as amended and sentenced and committed to imprisonment in two suspended the said Hinds County Jail for a period of frame months/and fined \$200.00. A copy of the said judgment, marked Exhibit "A", is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference. Petitioner is presently confined in the Hinds County Jail until she works off her fine @ three dollars a day.

- 4. That the aforesaid judgment, sentence and commitment are void and without authority of law and the imprisonment of the petitioner is a denial of due process of law under the fifth and fourteenth admendments to the Constitution and also violative of the first and fifteenth admendments to the Constitution of the United States as hereinafter shown. The Court rendering and issuing such judgment, sentence and commitment was without jurisdiction so to do.
- 5. That your petitioner was charged and convicted of wilfully and unlawfully congregating with others in and around the Continental Bus Terminal, 201 East Pascagoula Street, City of Jackson, County of Hinds, State of Mississippi on June 2, 1961, all with an intent to provoke a breach of the peace.
- 6. That the true cause of your petitioner's arrest and conviction was the fact that she accompanied members of the Negro race engaged with her in interstate bus travel, into a waiting room in the aforesaid Continental Bus Terminal marked and delineated for the sole use of members of the Caucasian race.
- 7. That your petitioner has been advised by her counsel and verily believes that, under the Constitution of the United States as defined and set forth by various decisions and rulings of the Supreme Court of the United States, as an interstate traveler, she had an inviolate and absolute right to enter the aforesaid waiting room in the company of other interstate passengers, Caucasian, Negro or otherwise, and that her arrest, conviction, sentence and commitment are unlawful, invalid, illegal, and violative of the Constitution of the United States.
- 8. That your petitioner has not exhausted her remedies available in the Courts of the State of Mississippi because, in view of the short duration of petitioner's commitment and her inability to furnish bail, any such remedies would be unavailing, moot and academic, since, as your petitioner has been advised by counsel, her term of imprisonment will, under any circumstances, antedate any such relief. Furthermore, your petitioner has been advised by counsel and verily believes that any resort to the

Courts of the State of Mississippi would be unsuccessful and that the expense involved in taking such steps would be more expensive than she can afford.

That no previous application has been made for the writ herein prayed.

WHEREFORED, petitioner prays that a writ of habeas corpus, directed to J. R. Gilfoy, the Sheriff of the County of Hinds, State of Mississippi, by whom relator is detained, issue for the purpose of inquiring into the cause of imprisonment and restraint and of delivering her therefrom, pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided.
