
INFORMATION MEMORANDUM


On this date, authority was granted to this Bureau's Memphis Division to open an REI for a 180-day period on captioned matter, pursuant to "The Attorney General's Guidelines on General Crimes, Racketeering Enterprise and Domestic Security/Terrorism Investigations, " effective March 21, 1983, and revised April 4, 1989.

Information supplied by the Memphis Division established indication of the existence of a racketeering enterprise involving illicit drug trafficking.

The enclosed letterhead memoranda provides additional details regarding this matter.

I. SYNOPSIS

The Black Gangster Disciples (BGD) have traditionally been a loosely organized gang involved primarily in burglaries, robberies, and auto theft. Since the mid-1980's, however, drug trafficking appears to have become the chief profit-making activity for the gang.

The Memphis Police Department established a "Youth Gang Task Force" in the mid-1980's to address the criminal activities of street gangs. Their findings indicated an increase in gang membership and activity even at that time. Memphis gangs were primarily influenced by the Chicago based Gangster Disciples and Vice Lords.

The Black Gangster Disciples in Memphis have aligned themselves with the Los Angeles based Crips gang. As a part of the "Folk Nation", the BGDs maintain their own identity, however, new members are now being trained to think of the Crips as "Cuzzins". (The Crips typically refer to gang members as "Cuzz"). In the neighborhoods where the BGD dominate, a combination of BGD and CRIP graffiti has been observed. Total membership for the BGDs in Memphis is estimated between 900 and 1,000. Gang members recognize the confusion they have created by their changing organizational structure and use it to their advantage. Often times they use hand symbols, graffiti, and other gang affiliation symbols interchangeably.

II. <u>DETAILS</u>

A. ORGANIZATION

The Black Gangster Disciples (BGDs) are currently the most visible and are believed to be the most violent of Memphis street gangs. They are located geographically in South and Southwest Memphis where heavy recruiting is being conducted in the middle and high schools. Member complement includes the subgroups, the Gangster Disciples (GDs), the Gangster Disciples Queens (GDQs), a female gang, the Maniac Disciples (MDs), and the Insane Disciples (IDs). These four gangs are further divided into sets, and their members are between the ages of 12 and 19. The GDs strive to become full-fledged members of the BGDs.

Recruitment by the various gangs is on the increase, and many are joining to be protected from rival gangs. Others join gangs due to their fear of the gang members who attack them if they resist.

One initiation ritual requires a prospective member to be physically beaten by other members. The prospective members are expected to commit a crime to be accepted into the gang. In order to move up the ranks in the organization, members must commit crimes of a more violent nature, usually involving firearms.

It has been documented in the past year that gang members who are subjects of investigation by other FBI field offices have come to Memphis to recruit and teach existing gangs their methodology and ideology. The high incidence of drive-by shootings, several drug-related homicides, including execution-style murders, the sharp increase in the overall violent crime rate for juveniles, and numerous aggravated assaults in area schools are largely attributable to gang activity.

Memphis has compiled a list of over 200 individuals who claim to be or who are believed to be members of the BGD's. Through the cooperation of the Memphis City Schools, Juvenile Court and Memphis Police Department, the list continues to grow.

B. OPERATION

It has been determined through FBI Memphis debriefings of several BGD members and a rival gang member that several Memphis gangs and/or individual members are being supplied cocaine by local drug trafficking organizations. BGD members have stated that some drug traffickers who are currently being investigated or have already been prosecuted in the Western District of Tennessee (WDTN), are supportive of gang ideology and are cooperative with gang members when it comes to drug trafficking. BGD members involved in drug trafficking are supplied to some extent by these local drug traffickers. The cocaine is usually distributed by BGD gang members in the form of crack in the housing projects, around the schools and neighborhoods.

Some cocaine and marijuana is being supplied by gang members who travel to and from Los Angeles, Chicago, Detroit, New York, and other major cities carrying varying amounts of drugs. These members are not always Memphis based, but recognize Memphis as fertile ground for gang activity and drug trafficking.

C. FINANCES

Further investigation must be conducted in order to determine how the BGDs handle their finances.

D. POLICE/PUBLIC CORRUPTION

There is no known police/public corruption at this time.

E. <u>COMMUNICATIONS</u>

A local GDQ recently advised there are individuals called "messengers" who have the job of keeping BGD members informed. The information comes from Chicago to Memphis by facsimile according to this GDQ, and is further disseminated by the "messengers". It is believed the messengers

are concerned with information which affects the BGDs as an organization.

Communication among individual sub-groups is generally by telephone. Memphis BGD's also allegedly meet on a bi-monthly basis at local hotels to discuss gang-related business. Information is also passed during informal meetings at the various high schools. BGD members believed to be dealing drugs near the schools have been observed carrying pagers. Other types of personal communications equipment used by individual gang members has not been identified.

F. CHARACTERISTICS

As a protective measure, the younger gang members serve as "lookouts" and "decoys" for marked police vehicles when they enter gang areas of operation. Other typical methods are used to disassociate themselves from the drug transactions with unfamiliar individuals.

BGD members have stated it is very easy to obtain weapons and most carry some type of weapon at all times. They advised that the attitude of most BGD members regarding shooting someone or being shot is that it is considered in the line of duty.

BGD members have robbed several pawn shops and have stolen weapons which they use in their turf skirmishes, and robberies. Vehicles can be borrowed from suspect car dealers who also provide cars to the local drug traffickers.

Other sources of supply of weapons must be determined.

G. ASSESSMENT

Based upon available information, the BGDs are considered the most formidable Memphis street gang. It is a Secondary drug trafficking organization with potential to expand its operation as membership and influence continue to grow.

The BGDs are armed with all types of firearms and have shown a willingness to employ these weapons in their drug distribution activities. BGD and other Memphis gang members seeking to rise in their respective organizations use violence to BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLES

get respect from the leaders, thus the almost daily drive-by shootings. Crimes of violence have increased dramatically among juvenile offenders over the past year in Memphis, largely due to gang recruitment and initiation rituals as well as drug distribution activities.

H. BASIS OF INFORMATION

Information contained in this organizational profile was obtained through FBI field divisions in Buffalo and Los Angeles; Memphis Division files and intelligence sources; state and local law enforcement agencies; and the Memphis City School System.

Because of the sensitive and complex ongoing FBI investigations, the above information is to be used for intelligence purposes only. Any projected investigative activity based on the above information should be coordinated with the Intelligence Unit, Organized Crime/Drug Branch, FBI Headquarters, and the Memphis Division of the FBI.

Enclosed for the Bureau are the original and three (3) copies of an REI profile of the BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLES.

REQUEST(S): Based on the information set forth, process the enclosed REI submission and obtain approval for the initiation of the GANG REI.

DETAILS: No previous REI has been conducted on the captioned investigation.

Information to date indicates that of the approximately 20 street gangs identified in Memphis, there are three or four accountable for the majority of the criminal acts committed. The BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLES (BGD) and the VICE LORDS (VL) are the two major gangs identified by law enforcement in the mid 1980's. The BGD are currently the most visible and most violent. They are located primarily in southwest Memphis in predominantly black neighborhoods.

The VL are a remnant of the past and less is known about their current activities. They appear to be active mainly in north Memphis where their graffiti is prominently displayed. One of the VL sets, formally known as was considered the largest and best organized gang in Memphis. It must be determined how the VL are currently organized and the extent of their criminal activities.

Heavy recruiting is being conducted in many Memphis high schools. Recruiting methods involve a great deal of intimidation and appears to be meeting with some resistance. Many students carry weapons to school in order to protect themselves from gang members. Numerous assaults involving firearms and knives have occurred on junior high and high school campuses during the current school year. The schools report the incidents are a result of gang recruiting and initiation rituals. One initiation ritual requires a prospective member to receive a physical beating from gang members. The Memphis City School system has formed its own task force on violence to address the gang problem and other issues.

In addition to the above mentioned gangs, the BLOODS and CRIPS have become entrenched in Memphis neighborhoods. The Crips appear to have the larger membership of the two, currently estimated at 1,000, having recruited BGD members and members of other gangs into their ranks. Recruiting efforts by the BLOODS are also apparent, but not to the same extent as the CRIPS.

Sets of the HOOVER STREET CRIPS and the GRAPE STREET CRIPS have been identified as well as the 62nd STREET BRIM BLOODS.

There are several gangs indigenous to Memphis that have been identified as being involved in drug trafficking. These gangs tend to be smaller in number and may actually be subgroups of some larger gangs. It must be determined how the recent recruiting efforts of the CRIPS and BLOODS have affected the gang territorial boundaries, membership complement and the drug trafficking operations of the existing gangs.

Memphis Division plans to aggressively address violent/drug gang activity via a joint task force with the MEMPHIS POLICE DEPARTMENT. Other federal, state and local agencies also recognize the urgent need to confront the gang situation and have pledged their cooperation in the efforts of the task force.

The objectives of the BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLE REI is to further identify Memphis street gangs, prioritize and target them for investigation based on the extent of their drug trafficking activities, their propensity for violence, and their involvement in criminal activity. Memphis will attempt to identify the gang leaders and members who facilitate the gang's drug trafficking operations. The types of drugs trafficked and the methods of operation, to include: identifying suppliers, means of transportation and distribution networks must be discerned. Memphis will attempt to determine the organizational structure and roles of the key members and associates.

THE BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLES (BGD) IN MEMPHIS HAVE ALIGNED THEMSELVES WITH THE LOS ANGELES BASED CRIPS GANG. IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS WHERE THE BGD DOMINATE, A COMBINATION OF BGD AND CRIP GRAFFITI HAS BEEN OBSERVED. TOTAL MEMBERSHIP FOR THE BGDS IN MEMPHIS IS ESTIMATED BETWEEN 900 AND 1,000.

IT HAS BEEN DOCUMENTED IN THE PAST YEAR THAT GANG MEMBERS WHO ARE SUBJECTS OF INVESTIGATIONS BY OTHER FBI FIELD OFFICES HAVE COME TO MEMPHIS TO RECRUIT AND TEACH EXISTING GANGS THEIR METHODOLOGY AND IDEOLOGY. THE HIGH INCIDENCE OF DRIVE-BY SHOOTINGS, SEVERAL DRUG-RELATED HOMICIDES, INCLUDING EXECUTION-STYLE MURDERS, AND NUMEROUS AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS IN AREA SCHOOLS ARE LARGELY ATTRIBUTABLE TO GANG ACTIVITY.

The Investigative Support Section, Administrative REQUEST(S): Unit is requested to process the herein contained names for Deputation by the FBI with Title 21 authority and by the United States Marshal's with Title 18 authority.

The Memphis Division is initiating a Gangs Task DETAILS: Force to identify street gangs for investigation based on level of drug trafficking and propensity for violence during commission of criminal activity. Leaders and members of gangs will be identified as well as organizational structure and documentation of the specific areas of operations unique to a drug trafficking organization.

The Memphis Division sponsored Gangs Task Force consists of one (1) FBI, Supervisory Special Agent, four (4) FBI Special Agents and three (3) officers of the MEMPHIS POLICE DEPARTMENT (MPD). Additionally, one deputy of the SHELBY COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT (SCSD) will be assigned to the Task Force and is presently the only local office who has not been deputized.

General deputation is being requested under both Title 18 and Title 21 authority due to the nature of the offense which is being investigated by the Gangs Task Force.

Deputized participants will be operating under FBI guidelines and supervision and conducting investigations and making arrests in the same manner as Special Agents. They will receive training in Federal legal procedures, FBI firearms policy and procedures, and FBI high risk arrest procedures.

Since the opening of the REI, two confidential informants and one cooperating witness have been opened and are being operated by Task Force personnel specifically for this REI. During the upcoming authority period, these sources should provide significant intelligence regarding the BGD organization and possibly other drug trafficking organizations.

The goal of the BGD REI is to collect all available intelligence regarding the activities of this organization and determine its structure and magnitude as well as its methods of operation. These objectives will be realized through various investigative techniques including:

- 1. Development of quality confidential informants (CI) and cooperating witnesses (CW) and debriefings of known reliable sources who can provide relevant information.
- 2. Expansion of our resource base by working closely with other Federal, State and Local agencies and glean all available data regarding anyone associated with members of the BGD gang.
 - 3. Analysis of appropriate databases.

As of 8/24/93, \$1,839.51 has been expended in operational funding in connection with captioned matter. There have been no drug evidence purchases.





BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLES RACKETEERING ENTERPRISE INVESTIGATION

I. SYNOPSIS

The Black Gangster Disciples (BGD) Street Gang under investigation in Memphis has been determined to be a faction of the BLACK GANGSTER DISCIPLE NATION (BGDN) based in Chicago, Illinois. Of the estimated 900 to 1,000 suspected members in Memphis, the Memphis Gang Task Force has identified approximately 400 since the initiation of this REI investigation. The membership continues to grow, feeding primarily from the induction of junior and senior high school students.

The BGD is the largest street gang operating in Memphis and one of the most violent. A number of BGD members has been interviewed and provided valuable information regarding their organizational goals and activities. What they refer to as "taking care of business" includes a host of illegal activities.

Intelligence to date shows that high ranking BGD members from Chicago have full knowledge and operational oversight of drug distribution in Memphis. Memphis members have also been found to be engaged in murder, kidnapping, robbery, prostitution and burglary.

II. DETAILS

A. ORGANIZATION

The largest set of the BGD goes by the numerical identifier 2.7.4. This set has the largest membership and appears to be the most organized. It's members live and operate in the South and Southeast area of the city, which they refer to as the "Third World". The organizational structure is more defined, but there has been and continues to be a struggle over who will be the designated leader.

The female BGD members generally hold subservient roles and are not divided into sets separate from the male members, however, they perform duties assigned to them by the male member who initiated them into the gang. Scores of young females recruited during the normal school year are not full-fledged

members, but serve as sexual partners for the male members or as prostitutes to help make money for the gang. Female members who perform sexual acts with a number of male members as their primary means of gaining membership do not gain the respect of male members and cannot rise in the rank structure as do the females who choose to engage in a physical battle against a specified number of made female members.

Intelligence gathered indicates the majority of the females and many of the younger males have not experienced the total intake ritual requiring the memorization of the gang literature handed down from the Chicago leadership, the required physical beating by other gang members and the commission of a criminal act prior to becoming a member. The membership prerequisites vary from one set to another. The willingness of a new recruit to support the criminal enterprise by the paying of dues and engaging in criminal activities is apparently more important than having knowledge and understanding of the doctrine of the BGDN.

The structure of the BGD organization regarding drugs centers around distribution. To date, it is undetermined the volume being distributed by the street dealers.

B. OPERATION

BGD members are heavily involved in robbery, including that of other drug traffickers. A common technique employed is to have a female BGD member lure the targeted individual to a secluded area where he is assaulted and robbed of any drugs and money or jewelry. Intelligence is being gathered to determine the scope of the BGD's drug trafficking activities. It has been indicated that members within the BGDN organization in Chicago are responsible for supplying at least some portion of the cocaine and crack being distributed by memphis BGD members. The method of operation including the processing of the crack and the transportation routes used to deliver drugs to Memphis must be determined.

During a debriefing of a Memphis BGD member who has

Information was provided regarding the purchase of multikilograms of cocaine by Memphis drug traffickers from BGDN members in Chicago. Further intelligence regarding such transactions will be key to the furtherance of the REI.

C. FINANCES

One female member has been identified as a treasurer for the Memphis BGD organization. The duties of the treasurer include maintaining bank account(s) for the gang. Each member is required to pay dues on a monthly basis. The dues go into the treasury. Members are allowed to make loans from the organization and repay the loans with interest. When BGD members are arrested, funds are taken from the treasury to pay the bail.

D. POLICE/PUBLIC CORRUPTION

There is no verified information regarding corruption at this time.

E. COMMUNICATIONS

BGD members continue to hold regular meetings. Scheduled meetings en masse have been held at the Scottish Inn, 1970 East Shelby Drive in the "Third World". Younger members meet informally at the Crystal Palace Skating Center, 3364 South Third Street and other such night spots as well as on the public school grounds.

Numerous copies of gang literature including names of members belonging to particular sets have been confiscated upon

arrest of various gang members by the local police. Members xerox copies of materials and pass it along to others.

While incarcerated, BGD members have used 3-way calling to issue orders or conduct other gang business. A member will also cause his own arrest in order to relay information to another member in the jail.

Federal Express and other overnight mail companies are believed to be used for communications purposes as well as for the transportation of drugs.

F. CHARACTERISTICS

In debriefing BGD members, it has been found the teachings are followed are followed religiously by the more learned members. They emphasize the goals of the organization are to move up in society, especially in the ownership of businesses. Legitimate businesses being opened by gang members will facilitate money laundering. These members hold higher ranks than other members.

Contrary to the belief that most gang members come from poor and violent neighborhoods and/or families, many of the newly recruited BGD are from middle income families and are top students in their schools.

G. ASSESSMENT

Recognizing that the BGD gang in Memphis is still in the early stages of growth and organization, law enforcement has an excellent opportunity to address the situation. The apparent link between the Memphis BGD gang and the local drug traffickers who are presently under investigation by the various law enforcement agencies must be fully examined, enhancing significantly the impact of this REI.

The current juggling of the leadership positions of the BGD is a disruption within the organization. Close monitoring of any Chicago members traveling to Memphis may produce verification of their intentions to carry out death threats against local traffickers and further empower Memphis BGD members in the drug trade.

H. BASIS OF INFORMATION

Information contained in this organizational profile was obtained through Memphis Division files and intelligence sources; state and local law enforcement agencies; and the Memphis City School System.

Because of the sensitive and complex ongoing FBI investigations, the above information is to be used for intelligence purposes only. Any projected investigative activity based on the above information should be coordinated with the Intelligence Unit, Organized Crime/Drug Branch, FBI Headquarters, and the Memphis Division of the FBI.



I. SYNOPSIS:

The Memphis BGDN Street Gang is the largest and most violent street gang in Memphis, Tennessee. According to estimates, approximately 1,000 BGDN members reside within the Memphis, Tennessee area. Since the investigation was initiated, approximately 300 members have been identified.

The Memphis BGDN Street Gang has very definable ties with the Chicago-based BGDN. The Memphis BGDN is made up of the Black Gangster Disciples, Gangster Disciples, Gangsters, Dark Side, Third World, and Triple Six Mafia factions. Memphis has experienced a marked increase in violence among male and suprisingly, female gang members. The violent crimes committed by these gangs are not confined to traditional jurisdictional boundaries and often occur in states other than Kansas and Missouri. Their illegal activities include burglary, robbery, murder, auto theft, and extortion, with drug trafficking appearing to be the chief profit making activity for the BGDN.

II. DETAILS

A. Organization

The Black Gangster Disciple Nation (BGDN) gang members are currently the most visible and violent of the Memphis street gangs. They are located geographically in the south and southwestern portions of the city. The BGDN is engaged in heavy recruitment in the middle and high schools in the area. Member compliment includes the Gangster Disciples (GDs), the Gangster Disciple Queens (GDQs), a female gang, the Maniac Disciples (MDs), and the Insane Disciples (IDs). The BGDN members are between the ages of 12 and 30.

Recruitment by the BGDN is on the increase. Most individuals join the gang because they want to. However, in some cases individuals join the gangs or the gang to be protected from rival gangs. Although some are intimidated into joining gangs, the actual number appears to be low.

One initiation ritual requires a perspective member to be physically beaten by other members of the gang. The potential members are also expected to commit a crime to demonstrate their loyalty to the organization. Respective GDQ members have the choice of either sleeping with male gang members or being beaten by female gang members in order to join the organization. In order to move up in rank, members must commit crimes of a violent nature normally involving firearms.

It has been documented over the past two years that gang members from Chicago, New York, California, and Kentucky have traveled to Memphis to recruit and teach existing gangs their methods. The presence of the Los Angeles Gangster Crips in the Memphis area is one example of the aforementioned practice.

The numerous aggravated assaults in area middle schools and high schools are largely attributed to gang activity. The high incidence of drive-by shootings, drug related homicides, robberies, and other violent crimes demonstrate the violent posture that many street gangs have assumed.

The above list represents a small portion of known BGDN members in the greater Memphis area. In Memphis, the Violent/Drug Gang Task Force (VDGTF) has compiled a list of over 300 individuals who are thought to be members of the BGDN. Through the cooperation of the MEMPHIS CITY SCHOOLS, JUVENILE COURT, MEMPHIS POLICE DEPARTMENT, and the SHELBY COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, the list continues to grow.

B. Operation

It has been determined through Memphis VGDTF debriefings of several BGDN members and rival gang members that several Memphis gangs are being supplied cocaine by local secondary drug trafficking organizations that do not have any true gang affiliations.

The BGDN members are involved in murder, robberies, carjackings, and the distribution of illegal narcotics (namely cocaine). Cocaine is normally distributed by BGDN members in the form of crack, in and around housing projects and schools in the greater Memphis, Tennessee area. The main distribution points are located in areas under BGDN control.

A portion of the cocaine and marijuana distributed in the Memphis, Tennessee area is also being supplied by gang members who travel to and from Chicago, Los Angeles, Detroit, New York, and Kentucky. These members are not always Memphis based, but they recognize Memphis as fertile ground for gang activity and drug distribution. Each BGDN member pays dues of \$18.00 per month. The BGDN money is kept by a treasurer (normally a female). The money is used to bail members out of jail and pay attorney's fees. Members are allowed to borrow up to \$200.00 for miscellaneous uses without having to pay interest. If more than \$200.00 is borrowed, the member is required to pay double that amount back in a reasonable period of time. Individual BGDN sets have been known to accumulate over \$25,000.00 or more in their legal defense fund. The amount of money accumulated in each individual set's fund, depends on the size of the membership.

C. Police/Public Corruption

To date, there is no evidence of police corruption associated with the BGDN; however, their have been rumors to the effect that some police officers are working with the gangs.

D. Communications

The Memphis BGDN have individuals called "messengers" who have the responsibility of keeping BGDN members informed. The information comes from Chicago to Memphis, which affects the BGDN as an organization.

Communications among individual subgroups are generally accomplished by telephone, which includes local and long distant telephone calls. Memphis BGDN members also allegedly meet on a bimonthly basis in local hotels or gang members homes to discuss gang-related business. Information is passed during informal meetings at various middle schools and high schools. BGDN members believed to be dealing drugs near the schools have been observed carrying pagers and using portable telephones. The BGDN members attend out of state regional meetings for information to bring back to their members. During the weekends, BGDN members get together at locations around the city, to discuss business. Upper lever BGDN members use FEDERAL EXPRESS, UPS, and other courier companies to transport drugs and pertinent communications.

E. <u>Characteristics</u>

The female members have been known to go to the airport where they set up "Johns", either through prostitution or drug deals, and then rob them. The females have also been known to go to public businesses (namely hotels) and pick up male individuals while pretending to be prostitutes. Upon gaining access to the individual's hotel room, the individual is then robbed by male GD members after they are let into the room by the female GDQs. The female GDQs or "Queens" have also been known to set up fake drug deals and rob the potential drug customers.

During a street drug distribution operation, young gang members serve as "lookouts" and "decoys" for marked police vehicles. Once a vehicle thought to be a police vehicle is observed, the individuals attempt to lure them away from the actual drug distribution point.

During a street distribution operation, individuals designated as security personnel can normally be found within a few yards of the individuals who are actually engaged in selling the crack cocaine. The security personnel normally hide their gun(s) within arms reach, so as to gain easy access when the need arises. By maintaining the gun in the area as opposed to on their person, the security personnel avoids detection by the police.

F. <u>Assessment</u>

Based on the available information, the BGDN appear to be the most formidable Memphis street gang as a drug trafficking organization with the potential to grow and expand its' operation as its' membership and influence expands.

The BGDN members are armed with all type of firearms and display on a daily basis a willingness to employ these weapons in their gang and drug distribution activities. Individual BGDN members attempting to advance in the organization, use violence to gain respect from their leaders. Crimes of violence have increased dramatically among juvenile offenders in the Memphis, Tennessee area. This dramatic increase is largely due to gang recruitment and initiations as well as the fact that the younger members committing acts od violence in an attempt to gain respect from older more seasoned members.

The VGDTF is in the process of addressing the BGDN organization as follows:

- 1) Develop, expand, and enhance the current BGDN intelligence data base;
- 2) Identify the gang hierarchy and formulate strategies to attach the organization's head;
- 3) Engage gang members as often as possible in an attempt to identify members that might be willing to become FBI informants;
- 4) Identify the field generals assigned to various areas of the city so as to better assess the scope of the BGDN situation as it exist in the Memphis Division;
- 5) Provide training for VGDTF and state and local law enforcement gang units;
- 6) Coordinate school systems, communities, community service agencies, and other organizations in a multi-faceted alliance designed to attack the problem from all sides.

G. Bases Of The Information

Information contained in this organizational profile was obtained through FBI field divisions in Chicago, Los Angeles, Minneapolis, and Indiana. A great deal of information has also been obtained from the Memphis Division's files, informants and other intelligent sources such as state and local law enforcement agencies, as well as the MEMPHIS CITY SCHOOLS and the JUVENILE COURT SYSTEM.



B. Operation

The Memphis BGDN street gang has displayed a remarkable ability to adapt to it's surrounding. Individuals identifying with the BGDN street gang, continue to form alliances with several of the local secondary drug trafficking organizations. Most of the local drug trafficking organizations are family operated. If members of the Memphis BGDN are unable to obtain drugs from their Chicago connections, they turn to the local organizations. The local distributors tend to do the same.

Members of the Memphis BGDN street gang tend to be involved in murders, robberies, car jacking, and the distribution of illegal drugs (namely cocaine). Cocaine is normally distributed by BGDN members in the form of crack, in and around housing projects and schools in the greater Memphis, Tennessee area.

Each BGDN member is required to pay dues of \$18.00 per month. The BGDN money is kept by a treasurer (normally a female who may or may not be an actual gang member). The money is used in most cases to bail gang members out of jail and pay attorney's fees. Members are allowed to borrow up to \$200.00 for miscellaneous uses without incurring interest charges. If more than \$200.00 is borrowed, the member is subject to incur interest charges that could require them to pay double the amount borrowed back. Individual BGDN sets have been known to accumulate as much as \$25,000.00 or more in their legal defense fund. The amount of money accumulated in each individual set's fund varies depending on the actual size of the gang.

C. Police/Public Corruption

To date, there is no evidence of police corruption associated with the Memphis BGDN street gang.

D. Communications

Communications among individual subgroups are generally accomplished by telephone, which includes local and long distance telephone calls. Memphis BGDN members also allegedly meet on a bimonthly basis in local hotels or gang at their homes, to discuss gang-related business. Information is passed on during informal meetings. BGDN members involved in the distribution of drugs have been observed carrying pagers and using cellular telephones.

Some Memphis BGDN members have attended out of state regional meetings. The last known regional meetings were held in Chicago, Illinois and Kansas City, Missouri.

Upper lever BGDN members allegedly use FEDERAL EXPRESS, UPS, and other courier services to transport drugs and pertinent information.

E. Characteristics

The Memphis BGDN, like the Chicago based BGDN, are affiliates of the Folks alliance. Members of the BGDN tend to wear their clothing and jewelry to the right. The gang's colors are black and blue. The Memphis BGDN has also been known to use numbers to represent the letters of the alphabets, when they are attempting to encode messages (example A = 1, B = 2 and so on).

During a street drug distribution operation, young gang members serve as "lookouts," drug distributors and "decoys."

During a street distribution operation, individuals designated as security personnel can normally be found within a few yards of the individuals who are engaged in the distribution of "crack" cocaine. The security personnel hide their guns within arms reach in most cases, so as to avoid detection if detained by the police.

F. Assessment

Memphis BGDN gang members tend to be well armed. Individual BGDN members have been found to use several different types of firearms.

Individual BGDN members attempting to advance in the organization, use violence to demonstrate their loyalty and toughness.

Crimes of violence have increased dramatically among juvenile offenders in the Memphis, Tennessee area. This dramatic increase is believed to be largely due to the increase in gang recruitment and gang initiations, as well as the fact that the younger members tend to commit acts of violence in an attempt to gain respect from the older more seasoned members.

The Memphis VD/GTF is in the process of addressing the BGDN organization as follows:

1) The continued development, expansion, and enhancement of the BGDN intelligence base;

- 2) Identification of the members of the BGDN hierarchy in Memphis and the formulation of strategies to attack the various BGDN hierarchies;
- 3) Engage gang members as often as possible in an attempt to identify members who are potential FBI informants and cooperating witnesses;
- 4) Identify the field generals assigned to various areas of the city so as to better assess the scope of the BGDN situation as it exist in the Memphis Division;
- 5) Obtain training for V/DGTF and state and local law enforcement gang units;
- 6) Coordinate V/DGTF investigative efforts with the school systems, various community organizations, community service agencies, and other neighborhood oriented organizations in a multi-faceted alliance designed to attack the problem in a holistic manner.

G. <u>Bases Of The Information</u>

B. Operation

The Memphis BGDN street gang has displayed a remarkable ability to adapt to it's surrounding. Individuals identifying with the BGDN street gang, continue to form alliances with several of the local secondary drug trafficking organizations. Most of the local drug trafficking organizations are family operated. If members of the Memphis BGDN are unable to obtain drugs from their Chicago connections, they turn to the local organizations. The local distributors tend to do the same.

Members of the Memphis BGDN street gang tend to be involved in murders, robberies, car jacking, and the distribution of illegal drugs (namely cocaine). Cocaine is normally distributed by BGDN members in the form of crack, in and around housing projects and schools in the greater Memphis, Tennessee area.

Each BGDN member is required to pay dues of \$18.00 per month. The BGDN money is kept by a treasurer (normally a female who may or may not be an actual gang member). The money is used in most cases to bail gang members out of jail and pay attorney's fees. Members are allowed to borrow up to \$200.00 for miscellaneous uses without incurring interest charges. If more than \$200.00 is borrowed, the member is subject to incur interest charges that could require them to pay double the amount borrowed back. Individual BGDN sets have been known to accumulate as much as \$25,000.00 or more in their legal defense fund. The amount of money accumulated in each individual set's fund varies depending on the actual size of the gang.

C. Police/Public Corruption

To date, there is no evidence of police corruption associated with the Memphis BGDN street gang.

D. <u>Communications</u>

Communications among individual subgroups are generally accomplished by telephone, which includes local and long distance telephone calls. Memphis BGDN members also allegedly meet on a bimonthly basis in local hotels or gang at their homes, to discuss gang-related business. Information is passed on during informal meetings. BGDN members involved in the distribution of drugs have been observed carrying pagers and using cellular telephones.

Some Memphis BGDN members have attended out of state regional meetings. The last known regional meetings were held in Chicago, Illinois and Kansas City, Missouri.

Upper lever BGDN members allegedly use FEDERAL EXPRESS, UPS, and other courier services to transport drugs and pertinent information.

E. <u>Characteristics</u>

The Memphis BGDN, like the Chicago based BGDN, are affiliates of the Folks alliance. Members of the BGDN tend to wear their clothing and jewelry to the right. The gang's colors are black and blue. The Memphis BGDN has also been known to use numbers to represent the letters of the alphabets, when they are attempting to encode messages (example A = 1, B = 2 and so on).

During a street drug distribution operation, young gang members serve as "lookouts," drug distributors and "decoys."

During a street distribution operation, individuals designated as security personnel can normally be found within a few yards of the individuals who are engaged in the distribution of "crack" cocaine. The security personnel hide their guns within arms reach in most cases, so as to avoid detection if detained by the police.

F. Assessment

Memphis BGDN gang members tend to be well armed. Individual BGDN members have been found to use several different types of firearms.

Individual BGDN members attempting to advance in the organization, use violence to demonstrate their loyalty and toughness.

Crimes of violence have increased dramatically among juvenile offenders in the Memphis, Tennessee area. This dramatic increase is believed to be largely due to the increase in gang recruitment and gang initiations, as well as the fact that the younger members tend to commit acts of violence in an attempt to gain respect from the older more seasoned members.

The Memphis VD/GTF is in the process of addressing the BGDN organization as follows:

1) The continued development, expansion, and enhancement of the BGDN intelligence base;

- 2) Identification of the members of the BGDN hierarchy in Memphis and the formulation of strategies to attack the various BGDN hierarchies;
- 3) Engage gang members as often as possible in an attempt to identify members who are potential FBI informants and cooperating witnesses;
- 4) Identify the field generals assigned to various areas of the city so as to better assess the scope of the BGDN situation as it exist in the Memphis Division;
- 5) Obtain training for V/DGTF and state and local law enforcement gang units;
- 6) Coordinate V/DGTF investigative efforts with the school systems, various community organizations, community service agencies, and other neighborhood oriented organizations in a multi-faceted alliance designed to attack the problem in a holistic manner.

G. Bases Of The Information

Information contained in this organizational profile was obtained from the Memphis Division's investigative files, informants information and other intelligence sources such as state and local law enforcement agencies, as well as the Memphis City Schools and the Memphis Juvenile Court System.
