On Nov Labir 49, 1938, I sent a letter to the Attorney denoral enclosing a copy of a letter of November 26, from ir. Dies, Chairman of the Special Committee of the House on Un-American Activities. In his letter Mr. Dies gave information in regard to a number of organizations which he believel should have registered with the Secretary of State in complianc = with the provisions of the act of June 8, 1938, requiring the registration of agents of foreign principals. You may remember that this correspondence was discussed at the meeting of the Cubint on January 4, 1939, and that the President decided that an investigation of some of the cases of alloged failure to comply with the law should be undertaken immediately and that it might by rell to begin by investigating one Pascist organization, one Communist organization, and one organization

avowedly under the influence of any foreign ideology but in fact under that influence as a result of boring from within. In his press conference on January 6, the President announced that the investigation was under way.

It was my understanding, from what was said in Cabinet and from conversations which I and other officers of the Department had immediately afterwards with Mr. McMahon, that your Department planned to send an investigator immediately to examine our files on the organizations mentioned in Mr. Dies' letter and to consult with officers of this Department, in order that a decision might be reached as to which three of those organizations should be investigated in the first instance. Since these conversations we have beind nothing fore of the fatter. I am writing to you to bring it to your attention with the thought that you may wish to take some action in regard to it. We are prepared to cooperate fully with any representative of your Department who may be assigned to examine the pertinent documents in our files.

Under date of Jamuary 3, 1939 Assistant Attorney General Mclahon addressed to he the following memorantum:

"Your attention is directed to the investigation of un-American propaganda and activities in the United States reported in the Hearines Sefore a Special Committee on Un-Addrican Activities, House of Powerent tives, Volumes 1 and 2 of which have through how minimal.

"Congressed Dies has requested the State Department to make an invertisation to determine whether derivation organizations are arouse of foreign principals required to register with the Secretary of line and whether any of such organizations by failing so to register have violeted the Act of June 2, 1932 (U. S. Code, Title 22, rection 23%, et seq.). The state bepartment has referred the setter to this Department for appropriate action.

"You will, therefore, please investigate as soon as possible into the existence of a conspiracy on the part of the Communist Party or the Workers' Alliance or the personnel of the Federal Writers' Project of New York City, and any or all other individuals connected with any of these organizations, to unlawfully divert public funds to non-governmental purposes, whether Communistic or otherwise.

"Since there were very few copies of the Hearings printed and because you may have difficulty in obtaining copies, I am forwarding you under separate cover photostatic copies of the feges of the record to which reference has been made for your use until you shall have obtained copies of the record from the Dies Committee or elsewhere."

Upon receiving the above mescribed memorandum I was in considerable doubt as to just what investigation was desired in connection with this matter and accordingly on January 8, 1939 I forwarded to Mr. McMahon the following memorandum:

"I am in receipt of your memorandum of January 3, 1939, in which you direct my attention to the investigation of un-American propaganda and activities in the United States reported in the Hearings before a Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, Volumes 1 and 2. It is noted that you further state that Congressman Dies has requested the State Department to make an investigation to determine whether certain organizations are agents of foreign principals required to register with the Secretar of State and whether any of such organizations by failing to so register have violated the Act of June 8, 1938 (U. S. Gode, Title 22, Section 233a, et seq.). You state that a list of 22 organizations is suspected of being agents of foreign principals.

"It is noted that you have requested, however, investigation only of the statements made by Edwin P. Banta as to whether there is a conspiracy on the part of the Communist Party or the Workers' Alliance or the personnel of the Federal Writers' Project of New York City, or any or all individuals connected with any of these organizations, to unlawfully divert public funds to non-governmental purposes, whether Communistic or otherwise. This investigation will be initiated by the Bureau.

"In vi:w of the fact that no request has been received from you to investigate the allegations that the organizations mentioned

in the third paragraph of your memorandum of January 3, 1939, are agents of foreign principals required to register with the Secretary of State, no investigative action will be taken on this phase of your memorandum of January 3, 1939.

Thereafter under date of January 6, 1939 Mr.McMahon requested an investigation into certain testimony given during the course of the Dies Committee's investigation indicating that members of Nazi Groups were engaged in espionage activities and Mr. McMahon requested that an appropriate investigation of this testimony be initiated including the activities of William Dudley Pelley of Ashville, Norther Carolina, leader of the so-called Silver Shirts.\*
Upon receiving this memorandum I addressed to Mr. McMahon a memorandum under date of January 8, 1939 in which I states:

"I am in receipt of your memorandum of January 6, 1939 dealing with further investigative activity desired by you of certain matters arising in the so-called "Dies Committee investigation." It is noted that in substance you desire an investigation to be made on those portions of the statements of Committee Investigator John C./Metcalfe which contain allegations made by this Investigator that Nazi groups are engaging in espionage activities, and secondly you request that an investigation be made of the membership, activity and connections of the "Silvershirts" with German Bunds. These two investigations will be initiated by the Bureau.

#In order that there may be a clear understanding as to exactly what the Federal Bureau of Investigation is investigating in connection with matters arising under the so-called Dies Committee investigation, I am recapitulating the three matters under investigation:

- 1. The testimony of Edwin P. Banta on pages 993, 994, 999, 1000, 1004 and 1009 of Volume 2 of the Hearings of the Dies Committee, in which testimony it is alleged that there is a possibility of a conspiracy to restrict employment on the Federal Writers' Project only to persons who are members of the Workers' Alliance, the testimony also alleging that there is an indication of diversion of public funds to persons who, instead of performing work on the project, conducted Communist activities in New Jersey and elsewhere and published communist publications at public expense.
- 2. An investigation of the allegations of Committee Investigator Metcalfe that Nazi groups are engaging in espionage activities within the United States.

3. An investigation of the activities, membership and connections of the 'Silvershirts' with German Bunds in the United States."

It does not appear from the Bureau files that any information concerning an examination of the files of the Department of State was furnished to this Bureau and consequently no investigation has been conducted. I frankly was apprehensive that some misunderstanding might occur in connection with this matter and consequently I brought to the attention of the Criminal Division on January 8, 1939 the exast scope of the investigation being initiated by the Bureau in order that if any further or other investigation was desired or expected it might be initiated.

I have ascertained today that this matter was handled in the State Department by Mr. Joseph Chreen, Chief of the Effice of Arms and Munitions Control. Mr. Green has advised a Edrewu official that he conferred with Assistant Attorney General McMahon about this matter orally on January 4, 5 and 6 and that Mr. McMahon informed him that he would send someone to the State Department for the purpose of ethesulting State Department officials concerning this situation and examining the files of the State Department for the purpose of determining what facts or information were contained therein. Mr. Green has advised the Purcau that the State Department has never been contacted by the Department of Justice in connection with this particular situation. I have made arrangements whereby Assistant Director Edward A. Tamm of the Bureau will confer with Mr. Joseph C. Green, Chief of the Office of Arms and Munitions Control at 10:30 A.M. on March 16 in order that this situation will be clarified at once and appropriate investigation initiated upon the subject matter of the State Department's request.

Localled Joseph C. Green of the Offic of Arm and munitions Control of the State Department stating that I had before me a letter of March 17 addressed to the Attorney General over the signature of Sunner Welles pertaining to a latter of November 26, from Mr. Dies, Chairman of the Special Committee in the House on Un-American Activities in connection with an investigation of agents with foreign principals. I told Green that it was apparent from the State Department's letter that there was to be a conference or that an investigator was to be sent over to examine the files of the State Department on organizations mentioned in dr. Dies letter, and that the State Department's letter states that nothing more has been heard from the Department of Justice. I informed Green that evidentally there has been some miscarriage in the plans because the matter of a Conference with the State Department or an examination of the files has never been referred to us.

Mr. Green informed that he has talked this me for over at considerable length with Mr. McMahon on January 4, 5 mass 6 and that he was going to send someone he had in mind over, the sales being that this person would look through the files of the 1942. Department and consult with them and then select three or exations as the President, directel, but that he had never heard any large more from the Department of Justice about the matter.

I told Mr. Green that we are most anxious to go into the thing thoroughly and entirely and that the Attorney General has instructed you to designate me to represent him at a conference with whomever is familiar with this matter in the Department of State. Mr. Green said that his office is familiar with the matter and an appointment was made for 10:30 A.M., on March 16, for me and someone best informed about the matter to call at the office of Mrl Green in order that someone can be started reviewing the files.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED HEREIN IS UNCLY SSIFIED TO

RE: INVESTIGATION OF AGENTS OF FOREIGN PRINCIPALS

The purpose of this memorandum is to make a matter of record the visit of Mr. E. A. Tamm and Mr. K. R. McIntire of the Eureau to the Department of State on March 16, 1939. At this time Messrs. Tamm and McIntire interviewed Mr. Joseph C. Green, Chief, Office of Arms and Munitions Control, Room 3602, Department of State. Attending this conference were also Charles W. Most, Assistant Chief, Division of Control, and L. H. Arice, whose title is unknown but who is employed in the same office.

Mr. Tamm explained our mission advising that it was the Bureau's desire to clarify any misunderstanding which had occurred with reference to the investigation of agents of foreign principals, which appears to have been requested by the State Department some time ago. Mr. Green briefly summarized the situation, which will be explained in full detail hereinafter from information taken from the official records of the Department of State. A brief discussion was entered into as to the organizations which should be investigated. It was decided that Mr. McIntire should go over the material in the possession of the State Department and discuss these matters with State Department representatives. ascertaining their views as to the proper organizations to be investigated. When this decision was to have been reached, Mr. McIntire was to contact Mr. Tamm, advising him of this fact so that appropriate consideration could be given to the decision b the Bureau and that such further conferences between Mr. Tamm and Mr. Green might follow, which would determine definitely the identity of the organizations to be investigated.

Accordingly, Mr. McIntire reviewed certain files made available to him by Messrs. Yost and Price. No information of any value was contained therein with reference to the activities of agents of foreign principals. The following, however, is set out in order to show com letely the progress of the present controversy. RECORDED & INDEXED

There is a memorandum in the State Department files of Charles k. Yost, dated November 26, 1938, showing that on that date Congressman

Mr. Yost advised that these organizations were not registered.

The files further reflected a letter of Congressman Dies to Secretary of State Hull, dated November 26, 1938, in which Mr. Dies mentioned generally the possibility of the following organizations being agents of foreign principals:

Communist Party

American League for Peace and Democracy

International Labor Defense

American Civil Liberties Union

German-American Bund.

In part, Mr. Dies stated as follows:

"We feel you have no difficulty in securing cooperation from the Department of Justice in the enforcement of this  $\mathtt{Act}."$ 

Dies further disclosed in his letter that there are some twenty-five letters which pass between the Chicago Post of the German-American Bund and the Nazi Government. Dies also stated, in part:

"We do not have time or help to digest the evidence with respect to the relation between these 'front' organizations and the Communist Party of the U.S.A. and Third International. However, your Department and the Department of Justice can do this.

It is, therefore, my earnest request that at an early date you instruct the Department of Justice, or any other appropriate agency, to proceed with the indictment of these various organizations and that they be prosecuted for failure to comply with this Act of Congress."

Dies further stated:

"Among the 'front' organizations which I suggest you should investigate in connection with this Act of Congress are the

Norkers International Relief XFriends of Soviet Union Worth American Commuttee to Aid Spanish Democracy American Society for Technical Aid to Soain Ariends of Abraham Lincoln Brigade Society to Aid Spanish Democracy XInternational Workers Order American Student Union Woung Communist League Young Pioneers of America Meague for Industrial Democracy \*Kaki Shirts Silver Shirts The Atalian Fascists The American Fascists The American Aryan Folk Association (Portland, Oregon) The American Guard American League of Friends of New Germany (Portland, Oregon) American National Socialist Party."

The Department of State's files reflect a letter of Summer Welles to Congressman Dies, dated November 29, 1938, which acknowledged Mr. Dies' letter of November 26, 1938, mentioned above. Briefly Mr. Welles stated that the function of the State Department is purely administrative; that the investigation of cases and their prosecution are, of course, functions of the Department of Justice; that a copy of Dies' letter of November 26, 1938, had, therefore, been sent to the Attorney General for his consideration and such action he might deem appropriate.

The State Department files also disclose a letter of Summer Welles to the Attorney General, dated November 29, 1938, in which he stated:

"I enclose for your information and such action as you may deem appropriate a copy of a letter of November 26, 1938, addressed to me by the Honorable Martin Dies, Representative in Congress, from the Second District of Texas and Chairman of the Committee Investigating Un-American Activities, in regard to organizations which he believes should have registered in compliance with the provisions of the Act of June 8, 1938, requiring the registration of agents of foreign principals.

There are enclosed also a copy of my reply thereto and two copies of the rules and regulations which have been issued pursuant to the Act. I should appreciate it if you would inform me from time to time of any action which you may take in regard to this matter. Should you desire to designate someone to examine the files of the Department relating to the organizations mentioned in Mr. Dies' letter, the Chief of the Office of Arms and Munitions Control will be prepared to make them available to him for examination."

The files further contain a memorandum of Joseph C. Green, mentioned above, of January 5, 1939, which states that Mr. McMahon of the Department of Justice called Mr. Green, asking him to clarify the President's request at a Cabinet meeting of January 4th, at which time the request of Congressman Dies, contained in the latter's letter of November 26, 1938, was discussed. Mr. McMahon told Mr. Green that Mr. Frank Murphy, the new Attorney General, was new and didn't understand fully all of the details of the matter discussed at the President's Cabinet meeting on January 4, 1939. Green told McMahon that the President wished to announce the investigation publicly, but did not intend to specify the organizations to be investigated. Green further told McMahon it was his understanding that the President wished the Department of Justice to begin its operation by investigating one case involving a Fascist organization, one case involving a Communist organization and one case involving an organization not avowedly under the influence of any foreign ideology but in fact under that influence as a result of "boring from within."

McMahon said that this explanation clarified the situation for him and asked what cases should be used for the initial investigation. To this Green replied that he was not prepared to say but suggested that McMahon send someone from the Department of Justice to see him, Green, as soon as possible to go over the material in the State Department files. Green added that after a representative of the Department of Justice had examined the State Department files and had discussed the situation with those interested at the State Department, he might be in a better position to select the particular cases to be investigated immediately. Green added to McMahon that he would cooperate fully with any one whom McMahon might wish to send and would give such advice as he could.

Now quoting from Mr. Green's memorandum:

"Mr. McMahon said that he would send someone to see me in the very near future."

The State Department files also reflect a memorandum of Joseph C. Green, dated January 21, 1939, to the Under Secretary of State. In

this memorandum he advised the Under Secretary of State that over two weeks ago the Under Secretary had informed him, Green, that the Department of Justice would investigate three cases of those suggested by Mr. Dies in his letter to the Secretary of State, dated November 26, 1938; that an agent of the Department of Justice would visit Green in his office within the next few days; that on January 5, 1939, Mr. McMahon called Mr. Green by phone and discussed the proposed procedure and said that he would send an agent to Green's office within a day or so.

The last piece of correspondence on file at the State Department of any significance to this matter is a letter of Sumner Welles to the Attorney General, dated March 13, 1939. The first portion of the letter states that on November 29, 1938, Welles sent a letter to the Attorney General enclosing a letter of Congressman Dies of November 26, 1938, which showed a number of organizations which Mr. Dies believed should be registered. He pointed out that this Dies correspondence of November 26, 1938, was discussed at a Cabinet meeting on January 4, 1939, at which time the President stated it was his desire that some of the cases reported by Dies should be investigated immediately; that it might be well to begin by investigating one Fascist organization, one Communist organization and one organization not avowedly under the influence of any foreign ideology, but in fact under that influence as a result of "boring from within." The letter further stated that at the President's Press Conference of January 6, 1939, the President announced that an investigation was under way. The letter further stated that it was Mr. Welles' understanding that the Department of Justice planned to have an investigator examine State Department files on the organizations mentioned by Mr. Dies and consult with officers of the State Department, in order that a decision might be reached as to which three of those organizations should be investigated in the first instance.

For the purpose of clarifying the above a bit further, it should be stated that at the inception of the conference of Messrs. Tamm and McIntire with Mr. Joseph C. Green and Messrs. Yost and Price, Green stated that upon the receipt of the letter of Congressman Dies of November 26, 1938, he frankly didn't know what to do with it and for that reason dispatched the letter signed by Welles to the Attorney General on November 29, 1938, concerning which Green stated frankly that he "passed the buck." He further said that Brien McMahon called him telephonically soon thereafter, alleging that he Green had "passed the buck" and that he, McMahon, desired to know just what course of action he should take. At that time and the date of that telephone conversation is not known, Green advised Messrs. Tamm and McIntire that he told Brien McMahon that if the latter would send an agent to the

State Department to go over its records, it might be possible to determine which of the organizations should be investigated. To this McMahon stated he would have someone from the Department of Justice visit Mr. Green within the next few days and go over the information in the possession of the State Department.

Green further informed Messrs. Tamm and McIntire that some time thereafter he held another telephone conversation with Mr. McMahon, the latter again advising that he would have someone from the Department of Justice review pertinent information at the Department of State, but that he, McMahon had to leave town on the Muscia case, for a few days and as soon as he got back he would have someone contact the State Department. The third and last call of McMahon to Green appears to be that one mentioned above on January 5, 1939, when McMahon asked Green to clarify the President's request at the Cabinet meeting of January 4, 1939.

After an examination of the files stated above, Mr. McIntire, accompanied by Messrs. Yost and Price conferred with Mr. Mobert E. Murphy. It appears that Mr. Murphy is the man to whom the State Department refers all radical and subversive matters and it further appears that the Department will be guided by his opinion as to which organizations ought to be investigated on the basis of agents of foreign principals. It was his opinion that the Bureau ought to investigate the German-American Bund as representing the Fascist side of the picture and the Communist Party itself as representing the Communist side of the picture. Neither of the three gentlemen at the conference were able to determine the third organization which ought to be investigated. Accordingly, Mr. Murphy suggested that they discuss this matter this afternoon mutually and that Mr.McIntire would call Mr. Murphy tomorrow morning to ascertain his decision.

Mr. McIntire after conferring with Mr. Murphy will hold a conference with Mr. Green and if the decisions of Mr. Murphy with reference to the investigation of the German-American Bund, the Communist Party and a third organization are agreeable with Mr. Green, Mr. McIntire will assure him that an investigation to determine whether these organizations are acting as agents of foreign principals will be instituted immediately.

For the information of the New York office the satters referred to hereinbelow were likewise contained in Bureau letter of January 15, 1939, directed under personal and confisential cover to Br. D. M. Ladd of the Chicago office relating to several matters, one of which was a requested interview with John C. Metcalfe concerning certain espionage activities in the United States.

For the information of the Washington Field office and the Hilwaukee affice advice is herewith furnished to the affect that the Bureau has received a memorandum from Mr. Brien Hollahon, Assistant Attorney General, in which he requested that investigation be conducted of certain espionage activities. Among other things Mr. Mollahon directed the Bureau's attention to the testimony of Arnold Gingrich when he appeared before the Dies Committee Investigating Un-American Activities.

For purposes of this particular investigation the attention of the offices receiving copies of this letter is specifically directed to that testimony of Arnold Gingrich appearing on pages 1232, 1233 and 1234 of the Dies Hearings. Photostatic copies of pages 1221 to 1235, inclusive, are being furnished herewith to the Milwaukee and Rashington Field offices, it being noted that identical copies were furnished to the New York and Chicago offices on January 15, 1939.

It will be noted that on pages 1232, 1233 and 1234, Singrich makes reference to the alleged espionage activities of Edward Japes Smythe, Chairman of the Mational Committee Against Communism, and Ernsk Coerner. Your attention is also directed to the letters introduced by Gingrich which were allegedly sent by Smythe to Goerner. Please also note the officers of the Mational Committee Against Communism listed on page 1237 of the Eparings.

It is my desire that an immediate, thorough and complete investigation be instituted concerning any alleged espionage activities on the part of both Smythe and Georges.

The Chicago office is being requested herewith to reinterview Arnold Gingrich in an affort to obtain copies of the letters which Gingrich furnished to the Dies Committee.

For the confidential information and assistance of the offices receiving copies of this letter there are being enalosed herewith copies of memoranda on both Smythe and Germer prepared by the Bureau. The data contained in these memoranda have been obtained from confidential sources, for which reason no part of the memoranda should be contained in a formal report to the Bureau recording the results of the requested investigation. You are specifically advised that the memoranda are furnished only for information purposes and as a source for possible leads.

The attention of the Milwaukee office is directed to the allegation that attached to literature which German sands out are copies of a publication known as Morld-Service." "World-Service" is a German-Maxi propaganda sheet published at Erfurt, Germany. The fact that German distributes "World-Service" would seem to indicate that he may be acting in the expacity of an agent of a foreign principal under the terms of the Act approved June 8, 1938, requiring the registration of agents of foreign principals with the Secretary of State at Washington, D. C. I wish that you would pay particular attention to this matter and obtain full details with reference thereto.

The attention of the Milwaukee office is likewise directed to the statement that a reprint of an article by Goerner entitled, "The Pending Sevolution," which appeared in the Deutscher Weckruf und Beebachter, was reprinted in the publication entitled Maximal American," dated October, 1938, which is the official organ of the American National-Socialist Party, having

The attention of the Milwaukee office is likewise directed to the statement that a reprint of an article by Goerner entitled, "The Pending Revolution," which appeared in the Deutscher Meckruf und Bechanter, was reprinted in the publication entitled Matienal American," dated October, 1938, which is the official organ of the American Matienal-Socialist Party, having national headquarters at 147 East 116th Street, New York City. You should bear in mind the possibility of Goerner being an agent of the American Matienal-Socialist Farty which might implicate him as being an agent of a foreign principal. The October, 1938 issue of "Mational American," page 4 declares: "Our foreign news is supplied by the following news services:

Forld-Service XBombay Press Service XAnti-Bolshevism."

The program of the "National "merican" is stated to be:

"The United States of \*merica - one nation and one people - racially pure; economically secure; socially just; and politically unified.

The American Mational-Socialist Party is dedicated to the realization of these ideals.\*

For the information of the Milwaukee office pages 107 and 108 of the final report of the Dies Committee to Congress, dated January 3, 1939, refer to Ernst Goerner of Silwaukee, Visconsin, and allege that packages coming to the United States from abroad contain printed material from the pen of Ernst Goerner. This would seem to indicate that Ocerner might be acting as an egent of a foreign principal.

Again it is reiterated that the information contained in this letter and the memoranda attached horato is only for your confidential information and as a source for possible leads.

This investigation must be completed within one week of the receipt of this latter.

Copies of all literature available with reference to Smythe and Goerner should be obtained and if possible three cepies of the same should be furnished to the Bureau. Five copies of all reports in this matter should also be submitted to the Bureau.

#### EDWARD JAMES SMYTHE

Smythe is reported to be a notorious Anti-Semite. He has promised pogroms against the Jews that will make" - - the bloody purge or Hitler look like a picnic". In 1934, Smythe operated an organization known as the "Protestant Civic Welfare Federation" of which he was Executive Secretary. His office is located at 516 Fifth Avenue, New York City. On November 9, 1934, he wrote a letter to General Smedley D. Butler declaring that "- - the present system of Government was organ-12ed - by Bernard M. Baruch, Felix Frankfurther, a Hungarian-Jew-Communist, U. S. Supreme Court Justice Louis O. Brandeis, Professor Rex. Tugwell, another Jew, and Henry Morgenthau, Sr. (all five Jews) nine months before even Roosevelt was nominated".

The letter is reported to have continued as follows: "The International Jewish Clique rewrote the constitution of the Republic of Germany, and jammed it down sixty-eight million German Christians, and enslaved them, economically, socially and politically."

"They are trying to do the same here, but they will find us a much harder job, because when the one hundred and twenty million Christians awaken, the bloody purge of Hitler will look like a picnic."

Information is outstanding to the effect that Smythe is a radical of the worst type and is endeavoring to organize a group for the purpose of engaging in strong-arm and terroristic tactics in this country.

Smyth is Chairman of the National Committee against Communism, which has its national headquarters in Washington, D. C., and also headquarters at 67 West Forty-Fourth Street, New York City, suite 506. The lett-rhead of the National Committee against Communism states its principles as follows: "Organized to inculcate the principles of Americanism in Industrial, Religious, Fraternal and Educational Circles". The letterhead also carries the statement: "If your FRETLOM and LEMOCRACY means anything now is the time to defend it". The National Committee against Communism claims to be "the oldest Anti-Communist group in the country, composed of both Catholics and Protestants".

Information has been obtained to the effect that Smythe is closely associated with the notoriously pro-Nazi organization of Kurt Mertig, known as the Citizens Protection League. A combined meeting of the Vitizens Protection League and the German-American Republican League, both of which organizations are headed by Kurt Mertig, was held on the night of March 15, 1937, at the New York Turn Hall for the purpose of protesting anti\_Nazi utterances in this country. The matting was called by Kurt Mertig. This meeting was addressed by Fdward James Smythe, and it is reported that "what the meeting lacked in size, however, it made up in vehemence". Smythe was continually interrupted by applause as he predicted "a revolution - not a Communist, of, no-but an honest American revolution-we are going to take this country back from the Jews". It is reported that Smythe stated that pending the revolution he nominated for "political destruction" President Roosevelt and Jeremiah Mahoney. With reference to Mayor La Guardia, Smythe stated at that meeting that he would "drop him back in the sewer where he belongs".

On March 30, 1937, the German-American Bund held a propasanda meeting at the New York Turn Hall. Among the speakers were such outstanding persons in the Nazi movement as James Wheeler-Hill, leader of the New York local of the German-American Bund, Fritz Kuhn, national leader of the German-American Bund; Edward James Smythe, Chairman of the National Committee against Communism, and several others. The meeting was attended by about eight hundred people. All of the speakers made most vehement attacks upon President Roosevelt and the Administration.

Information is outstanding to the effect that the National Committee against Communism is affiliated with the German-American Bund. This affiliation, however, has never been definitely established.

During February and March, 1935, the Protestant Civic Welfare federation, of which Smythe was Executive Secretary, distributed literature of the Independent Republican National Christian-Centile Committee, which had its headquarters in the Mayflower Hotel, Washington, D. C. This organization sponsored for President in 1936 Louis T. McFadden. One of the slogans of this organization was: "Keep the Jew out of control of the Republican Party, 1936".

The Protestant Civic Welfare Federation was the subject of an incurry by the late Honorable Louis McHenry Howe, former Secretary to the President, in a memorandum directed to the Bureau on February 21, 1935.

Copies of bulletins distributed by the Independent Republican National Christian-Gentile Committee sponsored by the Protestant Civic Welfare Federation were obtained and a perusal of these bulletins discloses that the said organization sponsored Louis T McFadden for President in 1936. It is reported that McFadden is the former member of Congress who attempted to impeach President Herbert Hoover. A circular of the Protestant Civic Welfare Federation stated: "Every true American should join at once the Legion Against Communism". The literature distributed by the Protestant Civic Welfare Federation made a vigorous attack upon Jews, Communism and the National Administration.

Smythe was the subject of an inquiry by the U. S. Postal Service regarding a possible fraud in the solicitation of funds in connection with the National Federation of Independent Republicans, Incorporated.

The records of the New York Police Department disclose a record for one Edward James Smythe, who was charged with grand larceny in 1914. He was discharged. Another record of the New York Police Department discloses that another Edward James Smythe was arrested on the charge of grand larceny in 1917, but was acquitted. This same individual was charged with felonious assault in 1920, but was discharged, and was charged with grand larceny in 1928, but was discharged. Information noted below would seem to indicate that this second Edward James Smythe is identical with the Smythe concerning whom this memorandum is written.

In January, 1928, the Smythe who is the principal subject of this memorandum was charged with grand larceny in the Yorkville Court. He was released on a \$1,000 bail. This record appears to be identical with that of the Edward James Smythe mentioned above, who was tried for grand larceny in 1928 and was discharged. The search disclosed confidential records, among which was an extensive Democratic mailing list.

In 1927, Smythe was the promoter of a Democratic pageant, which was allegedly organized to promote the presidential candidacy of Governor Smith, Prior to this time he promoted a drive for \$250,000 for tuberculosis sufferers. He discontinued this promotional scheme when the District Attorney commenced an investigation.

At the time of his arrest in January, 1928, on the charge of grand larceny, from which matter he was discharged, he alleged that his journal, The National Democratic Review, was the official organ of the National Democratic Club. He also declared that his arrest was made for the purpose of discrediting him before he could begin his campaign on behalf of the presidential candidacy of Senator Reed of Missouri.

Smythe was associated with the National Hoover-For\*President League during August, 1928. This League had no official connection with the Republican Party and was repudiated by that Party when it was learned Smythe maintained an association with the League. Buring August, 1928, the Federal Grand Jury in New York City instituted an investigation of the National Hoover-For-President League upon the request of the Republican National Committee.

During August, 1928, an individual, giving his name as James Flannigan, was arrested at Hackensack, New Jersey and later admitted his identity as Edward James Smythe. This arrest appears to have been in connection with the Grand Jury investigation of the National Hoover-For-President League. At the time of his arrest on this occasion, Smythe was posing as an agent not only for the National Democratic Publicity Bureau, but also as a representative for the National Hoover-For-President League. It appears, however, that he was assuming this dual character for the purpose of selling advertising space in the journals in which he was then interested.

Information has also been obtained to the effect that during July, 1928, Smythe was removed from the Tombs to the psychopathic ward of the Bellevue Hospital, New York City for observation.

The records of the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation fail to disclose any criminal record for Edward James Smithe.

Goerner wrote an article entitled "The Pending Revolution", which appeared in the Deutscher Weckruf and Beobachter, the official organ of the German-American Bund, for July 14, 1938. A reprint of this article appeared in the publication entitled "National American" dated October 1938, which is the official organ of the American National-Socialist Party which has national headquarters at 147 West 116th Street, New York City.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Freen of the State Department called and made inquiry as to whether Mr. McIntire had completed his investigation at the State Department. I informed Mr. Green that Mr. McIntire had obtained everything on the three organizations; nemely, the Bund, the Communist Party, and the League for Peace and Democracy, that was available at the State Department and was now well into the surstantive work. In answer to Mr. Green's question as to wheth r I thought the above named organizations were the proper ones to subsit to the Attorney General as the three to investigate, I explained to him that those were the three upon which everyone apheared to agree and that it was my opinion that they were the most logical organisations. I further pointed out to Mr. Green the fact that we will be able to furnish data from our own files sufficient to establish the agency agreement, the propaganda activities, and everything except the financial connection, which, of course, we will attempt to establish by investigation.

I advised Mr. Green that if there were any further information desired from the State Department, we would feel free to ask them for same.

Mr. Green stated that he did not feel that it was necessary to confirm by letter the syreement on these three a encies.

In his affidavit of Oct 12, 1938, appearing in the Weckruf for Oct 20, 1938, p. 2, Kuhn reasserts the truth and correctness of the aims and purposes of the Bund which he propounded inhis innaugural address to the Bund members only, in N.Y.C., on April 17, 1936. He repeated it as follows;

#### "I said:

As an organization of American citizens, it (the Bund) proposes to take an active part in the affairs of the country while complying unqualifiedly with its duties to the United States. We shall shadcate the American people to become friends of the new Germany. \*\*\* As American citizens (we shall) advance our political inherests, defend our natige land against lies and slander. \*\*\* We shall always observe loyalty as citizens of this country, linked as it is with the desting of our ancestral me race. Hence we call ourselves American Germans and our movement the German American Volksbund.\*\*\*\*



#### ORIGIN

The following information as to the origin of the German American Bund is taken from excerpts of the Yearbook of the Bund for 1937.

On October 12, 1924 the National Socialist Association, 'Teutonia' was founded in Chicago, Illindis. "... As soon as October 12, 1924 ..... Fritz Gissibel with a few friends founded the 'Teutonia', that little association out of which the League of the Friends of the New Germany was destined to grow."

On June 30, 1933 the League of the Friends of the New Germany was established in Chicago, Illinois. "In 1933 there was found in no time at all, an enthusiastic group of fighters which opposed to the enemies of Adolph Hitler, the determined League of the Friends of the New Germany."

On November 14, 1934 the Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter became the official organ of the League of the Friends of the New Germany.

On March 29, 1936 the name of the League of the Friends of the New Germany was changed to the German American Volksbund. "In the Spring of 1936 the name was changed to America-German League when it was realized that the idea "Friends of the New Germany" would no longer do justice to the present-day tasks of the movement. By changing the name in this manner the League in no way gave up its aims of before...."

On June 3, 1936 the German American Bund was established.

On December 1, 1937, Fritz Kuhn was elected Bund leader of the German American Bund.

After long and mature reflection we arrived at the conclusion that the name of Friends of the New Germany as that of an organization of American citizens of German blood implies a too restricted attitude, whereas the exercise of our objects demands a wider field and our movement a broader foundation. During the first years of our movement no better title could have been selected for our activities, but today every German by birth or descent should be a friend- an assumption which we take for granted - a friend of present-day Germany."

Mr. Murphy advised me that since all of the matters pertaining to the investigation of agents of foreign principals are handled by Mr. Dunn, it would be highly advisable to direct all correspondence to Mr. James Clement Dunn. ## ME: THE GERMAN-AMERICAN BUND (Amerikadoutscher Volksbund)

As an organisation of American citisens it (the Bund) proposes to take an active part in the affairs of the country while complying unqualifiedly with its duties to the United States. We shall educate the American people to become friends of the new Germany \* \* \* \* \* As American citisens (we shall) advance our political interests, defend our native land against lies and slander \* \* \* \* We shall observe loyalty as citisens of this country, linked as it is with the destiny of our ancestral race. Hence we call ourselves American Germans and our movement the German American Volksbund \* \* \* \* The Bund is American in its inception and in its field of endeavor.\* (3)

Frits Kuhn made the following statement on the occasion of the Saar Festival, which was held under the auspices of the German-American Bund, the United German Societies of Greater New York and the Society of the Saarlanders, which was held on January 17, 1937, in New York City:

"The German American Bund is an organization of American citizens of bleed which grew out of the 'League, Friends of the New Germany,' which was a movement founded immediately after the rise to power of National Socialism in Germany - founded for the purpose of fighting the anti-German agitation.

In willing collaboration with all American German Leagues..... it endeavors to bring about .....the unification for a strong cultural, political and economic COMMUNITY OF ACTION - obligated to American and tied to Germany..... It is the goal of the German American Bund to bring back again to the great community of the blood and fate of all Germans, the Germandes of the United States, which, through the unhappy World War and the post-Far period, partly had been aliemated from the German homeland and German folkdom and partly faced the most recent developments in Germany without understanding." (1)

So bound together by our blood, ideals, and sympathies, by our free will, firs conviction, and determination to further the interests of both the United States of America, the country of our free choice or adoption, and Germany, the land of our birth and ancestors, we are obliged and we resolveds

- Above all to uphold and defend the construction and the laws of the United States of America;
- 2) To respect and honor the Flag and Institutions of the United States of America, and to cultivate their lefty ideals;
- 3) To promote Good-will, lasting friendship and continued beneficial relations between the United States of America and Germany;
- 4) To defend with all lawful means at our disposal the good name and honor of our mother-country bermany against all base defamation, will-ful and poisonous lies, and purposeful malice, emanating from any ill-wishing jealous, avaricious and ignorant source whatsoever, be it race, people, tribe, clan, nation, association or individual, against a propaganda still being spread by print, script and south, openly and covertly, through books, magasines, newspapers, leaflets, and just covardly rumors;

- 5) To try to bring home to our American co-citizens the real and indisputable German achievements in the sciences and arts, the German inventions and contributions toward the advancement of agriculture, industry and commerce, the great, world-wide recognized, German institutions of learning, the German high standard of the various professions, handcrafts and labor, the outstanding German laws and institutions for the protection and welfare of especially the working classes, the high German ideals of liberty, of justice, of honor, and of education, the honorable and energetic effort the new German Government is making to promote equality of classes of mental and physical workers, as long as they really work earnestly and intelligently not alone in their own individual interest but also in the interest of the commonwealth, the commendable, virtuous and forceful efforts of the new German Government to oppose, suppress, punish and eradicate all selfish interests trying to chisel, defraud, or graft;
- To abstain from useless, harmful, and ignoble propaganda and incriminations of any kind;
- 7) To act at all times, everywhere, and under all conditions as straight-forward, courage us, just and honorable descendants of the Germanic Race, setting an example of blameless conduct, thereby unavoidably creating an atmosphere of genuine Good-will towards the German People and their Government;
- 8) To work incessantly and courageously for the fundamental right of every civilized nation to tend to their own business of self-government without any undue interference, threats, boycotts, or other illegal violence from outsiders;
- 9) To co-operate freely and willingly with all of good-will to promote satual understanding and friendship among nations and for an honorable peace among markind;
- 10) To keep our league clean of heart and mind, banning all selfish inclinations, and to stand unwaveringly for our motte: "ALL FOR ONE AND ONE FOR ALL!:
- 11) To be and remain worthy of our Germanic blood, our German Fatherland, our German brothers and sisters, who are now fighting for their very existence and honor; to cultivate our German language, customs and ideals; and to be upstandingly proud of this all;

12) To always remember that only in UNITY is STRENCTH, and that, if firsty united, we then will be of real value and a desirable and respected class of law-aliding citizens of the United States of America.\* (1)

The Purposes and Aims of the German-American Bunc (Amerika-deutscher Volksbund) are as follows:

"To unite all honorable, serious-winded, courageous and unselfish men and women of the Germanic Face, now loyal citisens or residents of the United States, proud of their Germanic blood, and treasuring German traditions, language, and ideals of mational and individual liberty, justice, truth, duty and absolute honesty, into one great, free, proud and respect-demanding German American Bund for the mutual benefit of the United States of America and Germany.

So bound together by our blood, ideals, and sympathies, by our free will, firm conviction, and determination to further the interests of both the United States of America, the country of our free choice or adoption, and Germany, the land of our birth and agreetors, we are obliged and we resolved:

- 1) Above all to uphold and defend the constitution and the laws of the United States of America;
- To respect and honor the Flag and Institutions of the United States of America, and to cultivate their lofty ideals;
- 3) To promote Good-will, lasting friendship and continued beneficial relations between the United States of America and Germany;
- 4) We pledge our best efforts to expose and depose Communism, Marxism, Internationalism and Un-American Boycott Fackets within the United States of America.
- 5) To defend with all lawful means at our disposal the good name and honor of our sother-country Germany against all base defamation, will-ful and poisonous

- 6) To try to bring home to our American co-citizens the real and indisputable German achievements in the sciences and arts. the German inventions and contributions toward the advancesent of agriculture, industry and commerce, the great, worldwide recognized, German inctitutions of learning, the German high standard of the various professions, handicrafts and labor, the outstanding German laws and institutions for the protection and welfare of especially the working classes, the high German ideals of liberty, of justice, of honor, and of equestion, the honorable and emergetic effort the new German Government is making to promote equality of classes of mental and physical vorkers, as long as they really work earnestly and intelligently not alone in their own individual interest but also in the interest of the commonwealth, the commendable, virtuous and forceful efforts of the new German Government to oppose, suppress, punish and eradicate all selfish interests trying to chisel, defraud, or graft;
- 7) To abstain from useless, harmful, and ignoble propaganda and incriminations of any kind;
  To act at all times, everywhere, and under all conditions as straight-forward, courageous, just and honorable descendants of the Germanic Hace, setting an example of blameless conduct, thereby unavoidably creating an atmosphere of genuine Gold-will towards the German People and their Government;
- 8) To work incessantly and courageously for the fundamental right of every civilised nation to tend to their own business of self-government without any undue interference, threats, boycotts, or other illegal violence from outsiders;
- 9) To co-operate freely and willingly with all of good-will to promote mutual understanding and friendship among nations and for an honorable peace among mankind;
- 10) To keep our league clean of heart and mind, banning all

selfish inclinations, and to stand unwaveringly for our mottos \*ALL FOR ONE AND ONE FOR ALL\*;

- 11) To be and remain worthy of our Germanic blood, our German Fatherland, our German brothers and sisters, who are now fighting for their very existence and honor; to cultivate our German language customs, and ideals; and to be upstandingly proud of this all;
- 12) To always remember that only in UNITY is STREMGTM, and that, if firstly united, we then will be of real value and a desirable and respected class of law-abiding citizens of the United States of America." (1)

The Constitution of the German-American Bund was first unanimously adopted at the Mational Convention at "Deutschhorst," Croydon, Pennsylvania, in 1935 and assended in Buffalo, New York, in 1936. (2)

Article II of the Constitution provides the following aims and Purposes:

- (5) To try to bring a better understanding to our American fellow-citizens of the real and indisputable German achievements in the sciences and arts, the German inventions and contributions toward the advancement of auriculture, industry and commerce; the great, world-wide recognized, German institutions of learning, the German high standard of the various professions, handcrafts and labor, the outstanding German labs and institutions for the protection and welfare of the country as a whole, the ancient German ideals of liberty, justice, honor, and education.
- (6) To abstain from useless, harmful, and ignoble propagands and incriminations of any kind;
- (7) To act at all times, everywhere, and under all conditions, as straight-forward, courageous, just and honorable descendants of the Germanic Race, setting an example of blameless conduct, thereby creating an atmosphere of genuine Goodwill towards the German people and their government;
- (8) To work incessantly and courageously for the fundamental right of every civilised nation to tend to its own business of self-government without interference from outsiders;
- (9) To co-operate freely and willingly with all persons of good-will to promote autual understanding and friendship among mations and for an homorable peace among mankind;
- (10) To keep our Bund clean of heart and mind, banning all selfish inclinations, and to at and unwaveringly for our own as well as the welfare of our fellow-citizens.

- (11) To be and remain worthy of our Germanic blood, our German Motherland, our German brothers and sisters, and to cultivate our German language, customs and ideals; and to be upstandingly proud of these principles;
- (12) To always remember that only in Unity there is Strength, and that, if firmly united, we shall be of real value and a desirable and respected class of law-abiding citizens of the United States of America.\* (1)

At the time of the 1936 Mational Convention of the German-American Fund in New York City in September, 1936 there was promulgated the following statement of "Purposes and Aims of the German American Bund":

"To unite all honorable, courageous and loyal Citisons and Aspirants to Citisonship of the United States of America, of the Germanic Mace, proud of their blood, traditions, language and ideals of freedom, justice, duty and absolute homesty, into one great, nation-wide, respect-commanding German American Bund, solemnly resolved:

1-Above all to honor and defend the Constitution, Flag and Institutions of these United States of America and to sultivate the lofty ideals of the founders of the Mation!

2-To sealously combat all athoistic Teachings and all abuse of the pulpits designed to andermine the Morels, Ethics or Patriotism of Americans, and to as vigorously defend the right of every Han to absolute Religious Freedom in every other respect!

3-To unequivocally oppose all Bacial Intermixture between Aryans (White Gentiles) on the one hand, and Asiatics, Africans or other non-aryans on the other, to the end that the race-legislation already in twenty-eight States of the Union and to a degree incorporated in our Country's immigration laws, may be scientifically perfected and applied throughout the Nation; to earnestly strive to further a true respect, understanding and friendship between these racially dissimilar groups, based upon a recognition and not upon a denial of the

### Almighty's immutable racial Laws!

4-To uncompromisingly fight, with every lawful means at our disposal, against all Subversive Internationalism, in order that Marxism and all allied phenomena, from the Conmunist Party which openly advocates the overthrow by force and violence of our Government, to the liberal-pacifistic forces undermining the morale of Youth, from the Alien-controlled. international so-called Labor Movements preaching the madness of class-batred throughout the world to the Rackets of international high Finance which are englaving the Mation, may be outlawed and uprooted; to just as staunchly champion every American Political Movement, Labor Organization, Financial Institution and so forth, insofar as nothing is placed above the Mation and no Alien Leadership or Domination is tolerated serving the interests of true Social Justice, teaching each element of the Citizenry to understand the need for cooperation with the others and recognizing as its ideal the following basic principle: 'The Common Good before Private Cain'!

5-To unite with all Americans defending the Aryan Culture and Code of Ethics upon which this Mation was founded, helping to build a great American Movement of Liberation under the Swastika, the common Symbol of the Defenders of Aryan Mationalism against the Bolshevik Scourge, regardless of the form of Government or Religion involved, which is already being used in Germany, Great Britain, the Netherlanus, the Scandinavian Countries, Thite Russia, the Ukraine, France and Belgium, Canada and other Countries, in order that the Dictatorship of a small, racially and ethically alien, Jewish-international minority, to which the Mind of the entire Matlon is rapidly being subjected, may be broken, restoring true Proportionate Representation to the bundred million Aryan Americans in the vital fields of the Press, Hadio, Stage, Screen, Education, Legislation, Justice, Finance and the Professions, so that the Aims outlined in the preceding paragraphs may be achieved and these United States reconstituted the sovereign and independent God-fearing and cultured, racially and ethically healthy Nation envisaged by its Founders!

6-To strive for a true Peace, based upon smtual understanding and friendship between our Country and others, by recognizing and respecting the differences which waist between even the various Aryan Nations and by defending the fundamental right of every civilised Country to govern itself without interference

from outside, by disseminating other Countries and of value in serving the cause of such Peace and Friendship, and finally by exposing and combatting all atrocity and boycott propaganda, base defamation, distortion of news and malicious lies, tending to create hatred and a war-paychosis promising benefit only to the everlanting international parasites!

7-To recognize as eternal Law that only he can serve his God and Country well who strives to develop his capabilities in accord with his inherited characteristics, and that consequently a renegade to his Race cannot be a good American Citisen; to therefore defend our might to cherish the German Language and German Customs and our Right and Duty to defend the good name of all things German against slanderous attacks of any kind, essenating from any ill-wishing, jealous, avaricious or ignorant source whatsoever if be it Hation, Race, Tribe, Association or Individual; to force mation-wide recognition of the incentrovertible fact that our Organization desires to be no more and no less than a useful part of the desperately needed Great Aryan Movement for a Free and Clean America, accords the same respect to every other Element of our Country's Citisenry which it demands for ours, is as American as any other and is entitled to the same Rights and Privileges under the Bill of Rights accorded to any other Organization in the country!" (1)

Likewise at the time of the 1938 Wational Commention of the German-American Bund in New York City in September 1938 the Bund's Declaration of Principles was enunciated as follows:

"The following declaration was made by Chairman Fritz Kuhn at Camp Nordland in an address to the thousands of members and visiting delegates on Sunday, September 4:

- 1. A socially just, white, Gentile-ruled United States.
- 2. Gentile-controlled labor unions free from Jewish Moscow-directed domination.
- Gentiles in all positions of importance in government, national defense, and educational institutions.
- 4. Severance of diplomatic relations with Soviet Russia, outlawing of the Communist Party in the United States, prosecution of all known Communists for high treason.

5. Immediate cessation of the dumping of all political refugees on the shores of the United States.

6. Thorough cleaning of the Hallywood film industries of all alien, subversive doctrines.

7. Cossation of all abuse of the freedom of the pulpit, press, radio and stage.

8. A return of our Government to the policies of George Washington. Alcofness from foreign entanglements. Severance of all connections with the League of Nations." (1)

The most recent expressions of the Purposes and aims of the German-American Bund are as follows:

6-To strive for a true Peace, based upon mutual understanding and friendship between our Country and others, by recognizing and respecting the differences which exist between even the various Aryan Hations and by defending the fundamental right of every civilized Country to govern itself without interference from outside, by disseminating among our Countrymen all Truths known to us concerning other Countries and of value in serving the cause of such Peace and Friendship, and Tinally by exposing and combatting all atrocity and boycott propagands, base defamation, distortion of news and malicious lies, tending to create hatred and a war-psychosis promising benefit only to the everlasting international parasites!

7-To recognize as eternal Law, that only he can serve his God and Country well who strives to develop his capabilities in accord with his inherited characteristics, and that consequently a renegrade to his Race cannot be a good American Citizen; to therefore defend our Right to cherish the German Language and German Customs and our hight and Duty to defend the good name of all things German against slanderous attacks of any kind, esanating from ili-wishing, jealous, avericious or ignorant source whatsoever, be it Mation, Lace, Tribe, Association or Individual; to force nation-wide recognition of the incontrovertible fact that our Organisation desires to be no more and no less than a useful part of the desperately needed Great Aryan Movement for a Free and Clean America, accords the 'same respect to every other blement of our Country's Citisenry which it demands for ours, is as American as any other and is entitled to the same Rights and Privileges under the Bill of Aights accorded to any other Organization in the country!" On June 23, 1936, James Pheeler-Hill, Mational Secretary of the German-American Bund and Gustav Slmer, Mational Organizer of the Bund, testified before the McMabos Committee of New York State investigating subversive activities. Both persons testified that:

"The purpose of the Bund was to build a great American movement of liberation under the swastika, the common Symbol of Aryan Mationalism....." (1)

During the School investigation Fritz Kuhn also identified the purposes and aims of the Eund to be

"to build an Aryan movement under the swestika..." (2)

It is to be noted that

"helping to build a great American Movement of Liberation under the swastika, the common Symbol of the Defenders of Aryan Nationalism....."

is No. 5 of the statement of the Aims and Purposes of the Bund, as expressed at the time of its September, 1938 National Convention at Wes York City and as recorded in the Deutscher Weekruf und Beobachter for September 8, 1938, page 2.

At the time of the September 1338 National Convention of the Fund Wilhelm Kunze, National Director of Public Relations of the Fund, declared:

"No change in the aims and purposes of the Bund were either made or considered necessary, nor are any changes contemplated for the future." (3)

Frits Kuhn has declared that the

"fundamental aims are to promote better relations between the United States and Germany." (4)



The following resolutions were adopted by the German-American Bund at its National Convention in New York City in September, 1938:

### "For a Gentile-Controlled America

Resolutions Unenimously Adopted by the Sixth Mational Convention of the German American Bund

WHEREAS this Mation was conquered, pioneered and built by White Hen, whose Culture, Form of Government and Edeals of Americanism are being undermined and destroyed by an alien minority with an unassimilable code, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that we desend a socially just, White-Gentile ruled United States; and

WHEREAS the Federal Government has countenanced and encouraged the development of the CIO for the promotion of sovietising through terroistic measures such as Sit-Down Strikes, Seizure of Property, Sabotage, etc., under the leadership of such radical Jews as Sidney Hillman, David Dubinsky and others, and,

WHENEAS these Communist-controlled organizations and individuals are being melded into a powerful United Front by the Jewish Labor Committee for the roposed revolutionary overthrow of our hepablic, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that we demand Gentile - controlled American Labor Unions, free of Jewish, Moscow-directed domination; and

WHEREAS there has been an ever-increasing control of our Gourts and Public Offices by Tolondic Jews, and because of their claim, that they thave fortunate contacts with the various judges of the surress bench and,

WHEREAS, by systematic reorganisation of our armed forces, officers loyal to the Constitution have been replaced and demoted, therefore

RESOLVED, that we demand Gentile citizens in all positions of importance in the Courts of Law, in the Mational Defense Forces, in Educational Institutions and in Government; and

WHEREAS the Soviet Government has consistently violated certain terms of its Recognition Agreement with the U. S. Government, to wit; the spreading of vicious and subversive propagands, sixed at the overthrow of the existing constitutional government, the countenancing and promotion of the Communist Party in the U. S. A., therefore

RESOLVED that we demand severence of Diplomatic Relations with Soviet Eussia, the outlawing of the Communist Party in the United States, and prosecution of all known Communists for High Treason; and

MMEREAS the Secretaries of State and Labor propose to set aside immigration restrictions for the purpose of receiving into this country the unwanted Jews of Europe, and

THEREAS such mass-imagration of unassimilable sliens would further unbalance our economic system, by glutting the unemployment and relief rolls with num-citisens, therefore

NESOLVED that we demand immediate cossetion of all dumping of undesirable aliens, disguised as political refugees on the shares of the United States; and

WHEREAS the Hollywood Film Monopoly has been exposed by the Dies Congressional Committee as a hotbed of subversive influences.

RESOLVED, that we demand a thorough cleaning of this most important medium of propagands and entertainment; and

THEREAS, through the efforts of the left-wing Federal Council of the Churches of Christ, there has been organized a complete consorable of all Christian news releases, under control of the Conference of Jews and Christians, and REBREAS the Public Press and Radio by reason of powerful influences exercised by Jawish Advertisers, Stockholders, and political powers, are not free to render their proper service as American Institutions,

RESOLVED, that we demand action to end abuse of the Freedom of the Fulpit, Press, Radio and Stage, which is undermining the Patriotism and Morals of the American People; and

WHEREAS intervention in European affairs on the part of our Government, occasioned by undue influence of Jewish-in-spired British Imperialism, and unduly close relations with international religious or other movements with political size, have only furthered the cause of injustice in Europe and tend to divide our racially and religiously mixed population into marring factions, and

WHEREAS International Control exercised over these United States by the League of Nations has practically destroyed the Sovereignity of this Nation, and

WHEREAS the League of Mations is an international organization directed by the Jewish Agency for the benefit of world-Jewry, acting through the Fank of International Settlements, the International Agricultural Mortgage Credit Company, the Committee for Intellectual Cooperation and the International Lator Bureau, the seat of all world labor disorders, therefore

RESOLVED that we demand a return to the policies of George Washington on the part of our Government, alcofness from all foreign entanglements and the severance of all official or secret connections with the League of Nations or its Agencies; and

WHEFEAS the Tripartite Agreement regulating the Value of the Dollar, the found and the Franc, and other similar arrangements represent a curtailment of the sovereignty of the Nation and have caused continual disturbances in our economic system,

REFOLVED, that we deman an abrogation of such agreements binding us to international banking and credit institutions, and the creation of a Mational American Financial System, with the value of the medium of exchange based on the productive ability of our people and on the natural resources of the Mation.\* (1)

# DEUTSCHER-KONSUM VERBAND, INCORPORATED (Germen Consumers Association)

On July 4, 1935, the business organisation of the German-American Bund, the Deutscher-Konsum Verband, also known as the German Consumers Association, was established. (1)

The Deutscher-Konsum Verband was incorporated in the State of New York pursuant to Article 2 of the Stock Corporation Law. The Certificate of Insorporation bears No. 5183 and the incorporation was filed with the Department of State of the State of New York on April 3, 1937.

The Certificate of Incorporation discloses that the purposes for which the sain corporation was formed are as follows:

- \*1. To buy, sell, acquire, own, lease, occupy and deal in real estate, in connection with the objects of this corporation, and for the purpose of the business of this corporation.
- 2. To make and execute mortgages and issue bonds and other obligations in payment of property purchased or acquired by this corporation, or for any object in or acquired by this corporation, or for any object in or about its business.
- To borrow money, incur debts and liabilities for the objects of the corporation, and secure the same as alove provided.
- 4. For the purposes of carrying on the business and furthering the objects, to do any and all of such acts and things and all other acts necessary and proper for carrying on its business.
- 5. To manage property purchased by this corporation, and to purchase and sell stock.
- 6. To organize business men and consumers and to conduct an information service between Germany and America.

7. To carry on business in the various states, territories, districts and insular possessions of the United States and in foreign countries as factors, agents and commission sermants; to solicit, receive, pack, crate, ship, bill and collect for all articles of merchandise offered by domestic manufacturers for sale and disposal in foreign countries, and to investigate, buy, secure, pack, crate, ship, bill and collect for all machinery, goods, wares, merchandise and commodities of domestic manufacture desired by corporations, associations, individuals or first located in foreign countries. To import and export goods, wares and merchandise.

The amount of the capital stock of the said corporation shall be the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.) Dollars, which shall consist of common stock.

The number of shares of which the said capital stock shall consist shall be Fifty (50) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.) Dollars each.

The office of the corporation is to be located at 178 East 85th Street, Borough of Manhattan, City of New York....\*

The Certificate of Incorporation provided for four Directors until the first annual meeting of the stockholders. These first named Directors are as follows:

Max Rapp Fritz Kuhn William Luccike Herman Schwartsmann.

Each Director is listed as having taken one share of stock.

The Secretary of State at New York is designated as the agent of the corporation upon whom process in any action or proceeding against it may be served. (1)

One authority points out that the Deutscher-Konsum Verband holds a Christmas Fair each year in all the larger cities of the United States,

".... in order to signify thereby, also outwardly, that the American-German Peoples League is very serious about taking care of the economic interests of our business people on this side and on the other side of the great Atlantic. Thereby the Christmus Fair is the living expression of the iron determination to form commercial relations between America and Germany, as well as to put up on the other hand a resistance - more successful in each succeeding year recently against the Jewish boycott of German goods, a resistance in an unspeakably difficult struggle which on the side of their ensaios is being waged with equal bitter determination - a fight for the continued existence of the Gerean racial Christian businessman in our new home country. Justice is being done to this endeavor in a very special manner this year by the Christnes Fair of the D.K.V. in the most beautiful and elegant exposition hall in Greater New York, the Grand Central Palace, which aside from its Fair purpose will serve for free purchases and sales, maintaining a huge exhibition of German goods which causes justified and approving attention for beyond the city limits. (2)

The D.K.V. is also described in the following language:

"The German Consumers Association (D.K.V.) is the economic interests representation of German-American businessmen and consumers; its goal is the mutual support in the economic field for the furtherance of imports and the furtherance of the turnover of German products, for the fighting of the boyactt of German goods and for the strengthening of the independent Aryan businessman.

Through the regular issuance of economic guidebooks and by means of robat savings stamp system, this goal is

"The German-American Business League, Incorporated, is the representative of the economic interests of German-American consumers and business people.

The aim of the League is mutual support upon the economic field in order to augment the sales of German products, and to fight unlawful boycotts.\* (2)

"The G.A.B.L. has the following working system: the consumer receives a discount book, in which a saving stamp is placed by the businessen for each ten cent purchase. The book contains space for five hundred stamps. The filled book may be exchanged at the office of the League and the consumer shall receive \$1.25 in cash for every filled book." (3)

The D.K.V. was not founded for profit. It was originally intended as a matter of self-aid to those holding German ideas. (4)

In popularising the Christmus Fair for 1937 the D.K.V. an-nounced:

"The great Expesition and Christmas Market of the German-inerican Business League, Incorporated, to be held in New York Sity from the 16th to the 24th of December, 1937, represents a hitherte unattended opportunity to increase the demand for German goods and service here and for United States goods and service in Germany, to enlighten the buying public regarding the latest achievements in German manufacture and merchandise......

Additional attractions for the public will be the daily door prises, including a round-trip ticket to Germany to be given away on Wednesday evening, December 22..... (2)

The close sommestion between the Deutscher-Konsum Verband and the German-American Bund is shown by the official positions in the German-American Bund for the first Directors of the Deutscher-Konsum Verband.

The D.K.T. publishes at intervals a Trade Guide containing the names of agrarian serchants acceptable to the German-American Bund. Copies of these Trade Guides are available.

The corporation was not intended to be eluducted for pecuniary purposes. (1)

\*As soon as October 12, 1924, that is anny years before Adolf Hitler seised power in Germany, Prits Glasibl with a few friends founded the 'Teutonia', that little associstion out of which the league of the Friends of the New Germany was destined to grow. He took up the fight against the indifference of the old Germans and against the opposition which grow stringer and stronger. They did that as soon as it had become clear that here a movement had started which would stop at mothing in order to achieve its great final goal, namely, the renewing of Germanian on a racial basis. "The Germany of today regards every single one as a recial German courade who is of German descent and of German bleed and who will publicly confess to the German language and German Kultur. The Germany of today does not ask that you neglect your duties as Americans, but the Germany of today says; Only he can become a good American who is also a good German." (1)

"....and he (Adolf Hitler) has given this goal to an entire action and thereby he has given it to us (German-Asericans) too and we will reach it and we will accomplish that the people in America will once sore have respect for the German and respect for the German home country, that they will be glad of the resurrection of Germany and give homes to its leader, the saviour of the world against Bolshevian." (2)

In dedicating Camp Mordland it was explained:

"With the festive set of today we are attempting to give over officially this magnificent little piece of God's earth to its real destinations service to the German racial idea."

"The mission which our fleagh has to fulfill is a hely one just as every service in the interest of our German racial idea is a hely and soble one. We, the living generation who have called into life this enterprise, consecrate this work to the service of the German racial idea in America."

"Casp Hordiand is a fundamental column of our movement which in a worthy manner may take its place at the side of about twenty other enterprises of a similar nature which already exist in America. It is furthermore a project which is supposed to lay the foundation stone for real estate purchases in the cities

It is there that our boys and girls shall be educated; it is there where the spirit of camaraderic and the feeling of belonging to one community is to be inculcated into them; it is there where they shall learn the 'you for me, I for you'; it is there where they shall be strengthened and confirmed in national Socialism so that they will be conscious of the role which has been assigned to them as the future carriers of German recisi idea in America."

"Hereby we give you over, 'Comp Nordland', to your holy mission. We consecrate you as a little piece of German soil in America, as a sample of our motto: 'Obligated to America, tied to Germany.'\* (1)

"By fighting the Jew I fight for the work of the Lord."
Der Fuehrer (Adelf Hitler.) (2)

"THE PORUMLA TODAY IS: either actively with us — or against us. There can so longer be any neutrality in any place where our enlightenment has penetrated. To remain neutral furtheres means: to take an attitude against us, against an upright taking care of our interests of Germandon in the U.S.A." (3)

Page 39 of the Yearbook of the German-American Bund for 1938 contains the picture of the German Ambassador, Dr. Hans Dieckhoff, below which is the caption "Exmited Visitori".

"On August 8, 1937, the newly appointed German Ambassador in Tashington, Dr. Hand Disckhoff, paid a visit to the summer camp of local Buffalo. The Ambassador is shown stending in front of a group of girls of the Girls Division, Buffalo, greeting the delighted growd of people."

The 1938 Yearbook of the German-American Bund appears to have been prepared to a large extent by a Bund member, Severin Finter-scheidt. On page 2 of the Yearbook Winterscheidt makes the following statement:

"In truly National-Socialist spirit of assistance and racial unity my work was made considerably essier through the unselfish obligingness which was proven to us by the "Institute for Germans Abroad" in Stuttgart by it, gratis manufacturing of the majority of the series of picture cuts which found use in the Yearbook and which contribute materially to the embellishment and to the enlightenment of German radial comrades and of American citizens.

"Nowhere in the wide world is there a greater splitting up of Germandom than exists here in our new home land, the United States of America. To fuse this Germandom into one great and unified working community means a task which only such a movement could dare to undertake which is internally strong and young and which tries and will continue to try to utilize the rich experiences already proven during the pest difficult years that they were able to do positive Germandom work." (1)

"Thus the German-American Peoples League made it its task to spread with all means and ways at its disposal enlightenment about the new Germany, its Feltanschauung and especially about the carrying out of all endeavors and ideas within the Third Reigh. . . . " (2)

George Probosse, addressing the September, 1933, convention of the German-American Bund in New York City, stateds

"We will continue to cherish these our sympathies for everything which is German and tell the investigators in Washington that we have not the slightest intention of changing our attitude whether they like it or not. We will continue to visit Germany, and if given a chance stand like son before Hitler and thank him for saving Germany from that bloody and Godless Asistic conster called Jewish Communica." (7)

The following is the clogen of the German-American Bund as of February 20, 1939:

"Our sis a united Germandos." (3)

"We have to speak of the Reich.

The repeated insignations that the Bund's primary interests are German, are justified only in so far as the Bund forms a much-meeded medium for presenting the American public with truthful statements of facts concerning a highly contreversial subject, the true character of which is wilfully suppressed or distorted in daily installments of fabricated news. It faces the alternative in this task of either remaining silent in the face of the misrepresentation and defamation of the ancestral home of millions of citizens, or to employ what resistance it can offer to unscrupulous propagands; in which case it cannot avoid frequent reference to the Reich and its government.

Self-defense is the first law of nature. Since the poissonous attacks on Germany directly recoil upon us of Germany's policies - no recourse is left us but to try to disentangle the truth about Germany

#### \*HERALDS OF THE TRIRD REICH

Present day Germany considers that every person of German encestry and German blood who adheres to German language and culture is a German racial comrade. Germany does not ask you to neglect your duties as an American, but Germany says, only he who is also a good German can become a good American.

Germany considers it as a service to the nation if you great the rebirth of the German folk, the glorious folk movement of Mational Socialism, with understanding; when you openly accept the German language, German custom and manner.

We stand here as the heralds of the Third Reich, as preachers of the German world-viewpoint of Mational Socialism which has displayed before the gyes of the world the in-comparable German miracle, the miracle of Mational Socialism.\*(1)

There appears on pages 56 to 61 of the 1937 Year-book of the German-American Bund an article entitled "The Olympic Trip of the Bund." It is disclosed that on July 23, 1936, more than two hundred members of the German-American Bund departed for Germany on the "MEF YORK"; that among these was an Ordnung Dienst (Orderly Service) contingent of approximately fifty men; that the U. D. members visited the Chancery where an announcement was made:

"The Fuehrer desires to see the Bund leaders in the reception rooms. We are standing before the Chancellor of the Empire, the Fuehrer of Germany. He extends his hand to everyone of us, looks us direct in the eye, lays his rand upon the shoulder of our Bund leader and speaks to us about the Germany which again has become beautiful. He questions us about our German fellow countrymen overseas. He thanks us for our energetic obviations and the infamous false provocations of a custom corrupted press and he inquires

about the course of the rest of the trip in Germany of the Bund.\*

There are likewise contained in pages 56 to 66 of the 1937 Year-book of the German-American Bund several photographs referring to the trip of the German-American Bund members and the reception given them by Adolf Eitler and Hermann Geering.

#### DECLARATIONS INDICATIVE OF PRINCIPAL RELATIONSHIP

A feature article by Bernhard Borgardt of Bremervoerde, Germany, entitled "What They Talk About in Germany," appeared in the Doutscher Weckruf und Beobachter and is quoted in part herewith as follows

"We here in Germany have heard the special joy of the strong flowrishing of the German American Fund. In the United States too one begins to feel the approach of the final decision. That is good for all of those who still carry in themselves the seeds of cleaning house, to get prepared for this decision. In Germany one knows well that there where real German fellows and upright German women are ready to work for Germany abread, this will can be translated into action and the country (the United States) can be snatched from chaos. Germany stands irrevocably committed to its new times and its gigantic idea: Mational Socialism! The homeland greats you, fellow countrymen! Stand firm and hold but in the strom. Close the ranks and tie the strap of your helmets tighter.....for yourself and your beautiful country.\* (1)

Ernst Wilhelm Boble, Chief, Foreign Organization, has declared:

\*A German abroad is today a Mational Socialist, and no newspaper in the world can deny it." (2)

Baron von Weurath, in addressing the Tifth Congress of G. ruene Abroad in August 1937, declared:

"But, while we have not the slightest intention of denying foreign rights we will certainly not permit Germans living abroad to be subjected to any sort of special rulings by foreign governments because of their National Socialist faith. (3)

General Hermann Couring, in addressing the Fifth Congress at Stuttgart, Germany, declared:

"Germans abread can and must help in promoting the sale of German goods. German bus ness firms must under no circumstances employ Jewish representatives, for the Jews have no interest in pushing German goods. You Germans who live abroad must tell everyone in foreign countriess Germany has reached its highest aims in times of peace and will comtinue its work in peace. You, my compatriots abroad, must be proud of this mation, of this movement, and of its fushrer. And when you are defened ad abused abroad then show that you are Mational Socialists and resent the insult. You Germans who live abroad no matter where, have the right to declare yourselves Germans and Mational Socialists. You have this right, for the Third Reich is built on the fundamental idea of National Socialist Weltenschauung. The greatest thing the Third Reich has accomplished is this solidarity of all Germans. Go back them into the world and demonstrate this solidarity. Show yourselves as always a true granitelike block of Germaniam. Thus will you do the greatest service to the homeland. Be the servants of this homeland. Put away thoughts of personal advantage for greater things -- the Eatien, Germany," (1)

Dr. Joseph Coebbels, Propaganda Minister, in a closing address to the Fifth Congress, declared:

"Certain foreign newspapers reported—much to my autonishment—that certain cultural attaches would be appointed to German Embassies and Legations abroad. What utter nonsensel Our cultural attaches are the thousands upon thousands of Germans living outside the Fatherland. Fe have no need to send special cultural attaches to London, Paris, or Mashington." (2)

Ernst Wilhelm Bohle, in addressing the Fifth Congress, declared:

"We recognize only one idea: A German always and everywhere remains a German and nothing but a German—and thereby a National Socialist." (3)

In Berlin on August 15, 1937, the National Socialist Kurier announced a "program" for the young German-American cor, a as follows:

\*We desire to bring back Germans in the United States to racial unity. To this end the intellectual and apiritual reform of \*mericans of German extraction is necessary in accord with the model furnished by the homeland.

When we have attained this goal, the organized German-American influence thus politically reactivated shall be thrown in the balance under our leadership for the coming struggle with Commiss and Jevs for the Americans' regeneration.

In their summer camps young German-Americans, who owe their duty to America and who are bound to Germany, learn to harmonize their duties as American citizens and their national and radial missions as Germans." (1)

"The Bill of Rights is a wall in which a breach must be made before America's problems can be solved." (2)

"Anti-Semitiam in America is a vital necessity for Wasi plans." (3)

Hugo Grothe in his "Handbook of Foreign Germans" writes to the effect that one-fourth of America's blood will not long be denied its rightful place; that the Reich must do everything in its power to make these Americans return to their German race. (4)

Minister of the Interior Frick, in addressing the Fifth Congress of Gormans Abroad at Stuttgart, declared:

"No German abroad may forget that he is always and everywhere a piece of Germany." (1)

It is reported that Pamphlet No. 7 of the official "Nazi Instructions for our Friends Overseas" contains the following:

"The fundamental aim must always be to discredit conditions in the United States." (2)

Richard Witschke, in his "Der Auslandsdeutschtum," declared:

"In our position, we cannot afford to give up one-third of our people. We make no distinction between Germans at home and Germans abroad." (3)

S. K. Pedover, writing in headers Digest for January, 1939 refers to the book of Colid Ross, Winser Amerika, which was published in Leipsig, Germany, in 1936. Padover points out that the book must be taken as semi-official since Ross is an officer of the Propaganda Institute at Stuttgart and since the organ of the Masi Party, National—socialistische Monatchefte (June 1938), urges that his book be given the "most wide-spread distribution."

Padover refers to that portion of Ross' book which urges that the 30,000,000 Germans in the United States should assert the rights of their blood by every and any means. Padover quotes Ross as follows:

"I believe in the German Hour of America. The great historic events usually are prepared underground until they suddenly emerged in the open. The German rebirth in the United States is more powerful than most people think. We Germans in the old country can only watch the great revolution that is preparing over there, not altogether impartially, to be sure; for our hearts will always best for a people whose blood is one-fourth ours.

From emongst them (Germans in America) will arise a German Thomas Paine.... He will unite all of German blood. All will come as soon as they have realised the simple truth that they are not "Americans," but "Amerikaner," men of German blood and American soil."

Adolf Hitler has declareds

"The German Reich as a State must embrace all Germans not only for the purpose of uniting and maintaining the most valuable racial elements of this nation but also for the purpose of raising the German nation gradually and safely to a dominating position." (1)

\*.....Youth, considering itself as a responsible part of greater Germany, still knows how to differentiate in its definitions, within the hundred million-mation, between German citizens within Germany and German citizens abroad (\*Ausland-reichsdeutsche, \* also \*Die Auslandreichsdeutschen kommen sur Wahlt\*) and other Germans abroad. But at the same time they will admit that blood is stronger than a passport!.....

.....We will never call German people who are citizens of foreign countries aliens but racial comradest German people will always remain our racial comrades even if foreign citizenship is forced upon them..... We will always remember that we, Germans, are not only citizens of the largest German state, of the German Reich, but that we are also racial consides of more than 30 million Germans outside our borders. To must not..... tire to say to ourselves, to our 25 neighboring countries and to the world that state boundaries of today are not national boundaries and must never become cultural boundaries. (2)

The following is a speech by Rudolk Hess at the Conference of German Chambers of Connerge Abroad, Berlin, June 28, 1934:

"You know as well as I do that the one great mistake of the former regime was in not keeping up the ties of blood which connect the Germans in their home country with the Germans abroad; in not having kept these ties alive and in not having used Germandom abroad politically, for the mutual benefit of both of the sections of Germandom. I consider it to be the special duty of the National Socialist state to rectify this mistake and to work out a common basis for cooperation between Germans in the Reich and Germans abroad.

The new Germany needs and expects the cooperation, the apiritual and mental willingness to sacrifice on the part of all her racial coarades abroad. Their positive cooperation shall be included in our great German racial community.\* (1)

Hans Steinacher, National Leader of the League for Germans Abroad, in his Foreward to 1938 Calendar Issued by League for Germans Abroad, declared:

"Every German racial comrade is responsible to the German nation for his work and his whole existence. German national community reaches far across our boundary lines. We must not think of the borders of the state when we speak of the German nation...." (2)

Ernst Wilhelm Bohle made the following "Proclamation to Members of the Foreign Division of the M.S.D.A.P.:"

The following is a portion of a speech by Ernst Wilhelm Rohle at a mesting of the Foreign Organization of the N.S.D.A.F., in Yuremberg on September 11, 1936:

"We believe in the sternal values of race and blood and we feel that we are the chosen guardians of these values among Germans abroad. A State, which like our Mational Socialist Reich has been built upon the strong principles of blood and race, must gather unteitself the people of its own blood.

The Foreign Organisation of the Mational Socialist Party ... aims to retain the German individual whether poor or rich, young or old, in whatever part of the world he may be..." (1)

The following is a portion of a speech of Ernst Wilhelm Boble delivered at the Congress of Germans Living Abroad, at Stuttgart, on August 30, 1937:

"We National Socialists living abroad reject the concept of such a cosmopolitan German whose chief ambition is to assimilate with the people of the country in which he lives, because this cosmopolitan German not only makes himself ridiculous in the eyes of foreigners, but because he consciously or unconsciously denies his Germandon. We only know the concept of the complete German who as a citizen of his country is always and everywhere a German and nothing but a German, this makes him a National Socialist." (2)

The following is a declaration of Ernst Wilhelm Bohle on the subject of "Foreign Germans-Consolidated Under Adolf Hitler!":

"The leader of the Foreign Organisation of the National Socialist Party placed at our disposal the speech which he delivered on the occasion of the Reich Party Congress in Euremberg in 1935, as his contribution to the book, 'Wir Deutsche in der Welt.'

longer belong to the Reich. But they still think and feel in German, they mostly still speak their eld German tongue, they still observe the customs and habits of their inherited folkdos, they have German blood in their veins; therefore, they are, nationally speaking, our brothers, our racial comrades, even if they possess the Polish, Csecho-Slovakian or the American citizenship. Mation and state are not identical. Folkdom is much greater than citizenship in a country. Even if one gives up or is compelled to give up one's citizenship, one does not have to give up one's folkdom!

"Some of the most leasing appearances of the awakening of german customs in America are the efforts for educating the youth. Since immigration of the german people has come to a stand-still, the American german-patriots are becoming more clearly cognizant of the fact that their preservation can be assured only thereby, that the children born over there hol? themselves up to their nationality. Consequently, in the course of the past year a large number of kindergartens, youth movements, children-choirs and, above all, language schools were established which today, though they at first are drawing only a conservative number of youths, are continually in the process of building and expansion. In many vicinities of Worth America during school vacations sugger camps are arranged, in which thousands of children of german descent are spending their free time at sport and play. One of the climaxes of the youtheducational projects of this year was the song festival in Chicago where 3000 children sang. This choir is to be attributed to a great number of language schools." (2)

The following statement was made by Adolf Hitler:

"In its capacity as a State, the German beich must gather all Germans to itself..... (3)

#### MEMORANDUM FOR MR. E. A. TAMM.

At 3;45 p.m. today I got a call from Mr. Yost of the State Department. He said that they had received Mr. Hoover's letter and the memorandum of facts attached, re the German American Bund and the possibility of its having violated the law requiring the registration of Agents of Foreign Principals. He said that after perusing the memo he thought it would be necessary to show something further than an ideological or spiritual tie-up, that it would probably be necessary to go into the records of the Bund to establish the connection with Germany.

I told him the memo had been submitted to Mr. McMahon before any further investigation was undertaken, so that we could have the advice of the criminal division as to just what in particular is wanted, before we undertook what would otherwise result in a general survey. I advised him that if the criminal division desires any further investigation, it will specify the type desired, and that this Bureau will then go forward. He asked to be advised of the desires of the criminal division if and when we receive them. I told him I would call him at such time.

# MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

I was contacted by Mr. Fisher of the Department relative to a telephone call received by him from Mr. Green of the State Department regarding Fritz Kuhn and another unidentified official, who apparently were applying for passports. According to Mr. Fisher, the State Department referred to a letter from the Bureau dated April 5th indicating we would like to have these applications stopped. Mr. Fisher advised that the State Department told him they could not hold up the applications unless there were indictments against these individuals, but they could probably stall them off until about Tuesday.

I advised Mr. Fisher that this was not a case in which we were interested, but that we did write the State Department a letter under date of April 5th telling them that according to information we had, Herlands, the Commissioner of Investigation of the State of New York, in New York City, had all the books and records belonging to these individuals, and that it was our understanding Kuhn and some other person had applied for a passport. Mr. Fisher was advised that this is a case on which the New York State authorities are making an investigation. In response to Mr. Fisher's inquiry as to whether I knew if the New York authorities contemplated indicting Kuhn or the other individual, I told him I did not know and, of course, we would not be advised by them if indictments were contemplated. He was further advised that the New York Authorities evidently knew about the passport applications.

I advised Mr. Visher that we are not interested in stopping these paysports and that the matter should be taken up with Mr. Herlands, the Commissioner of Investigation of the State of New York, whose name was set forth in the letter to the State Department

#### MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY CENERAL

Reference is made to the letter of Honorable Sunner Felles, Acting Secretary of State, dated March 13, 1939, directed to the Attorney General, concerning the investigation of certain organisations with the thought of ascertaining the existence of a possible violation of the Act of June 8, 1938, requiring the registration with the Secretary of State of Agents of Foreign Principals.

In pursuance thereof conversations were held between representatives of this Bureau and representatives of the Department of State attached to the office of Mr. Joseph C. Green, Chief, Office of Arms and Munitions Control. Conversations were also held with Mr. James C. Dunn, Adviser on Political Relations, as the result of which it was considered advisable to undertake an investigation of three representative organisations, namely -

The Communist Party, U.S.A.

The American League for Peace
and Democracy.

With a view to the appropriate consummation of this inquiry the Bureau has prepared memoranda of facts consisting of available data concerning these three organizations. One of each of these memoranda is being transmitted herewith to you for your information.

On March 30, 1939, the Bureau transmitted to Mr. Brien WcMahon, Assistant Attorney General, one copy of the memorandum of facts pertaining to the German-American Bund, dated March 20, 1939, with the request that if further investigation were desired concerning the German-American Fund as a possible violator of the Act of June 8, 1938, the Bureau be advised of the particular type of investigation desired.

You are further informed that a copy of the Bureau's memorand of the German-American Fund, dated March 29, 1939, was transely text to Fr. Joseph C. Green of the Department of State by letter dated March 30, 1939. At that time Mr. Green was advised that no further investigation

would be undertaken with regard to the German-American Bund until this Bureau had been specifically advised by the Criminal Division of the Department as to the particular type of inquiry desired.

By memorandum dated April 4, 1939, the Bureau transmitted to Mr. Brien McMahon one copy of the memorandum of facts conserning the American League for Peace and Democracy, dated April 4, 1939. On that occasion Mr. McMahon was advised that further investigation is being undertaken by the appropriate field offices and that copies of reports developing further data as to a possible violation on the part of the American League for Peace and Democracy of the Act of June 8, 1938, would be forwarded to him.

A copy of the memorandum on the American League for Peace and Democracy, dated April 4, 1939, was likewise transmitted to Mr. Joseph C. Green of the Department of State by letter dated April 4, 1939. Mr. Green was advised that further investigation is being undertaken by the Bureams field offices interested in this matter.

I have today transmitted by memorandum to Mr. Brien McMahon a memorandum of facts concerning the Communist Party, U.S.A., dated April 10, 1939. I am requesting Mr. McMahon to advise se whether, in view of the nature of the information contained in that memorandum any further investigation should be undertaken by this Bureau. A copy of the memorandum concerning the Communist Party, U.S.A. is likewise being transmitted to Mr. Joseph C. Green of the Department of State today with the advice that no further investigation will be undertaken concerning the Communist Party until this Bureau has been specifically advised by Mr. Erien McMahon as to the exact nature of such further investigation as he might deep advisable.

NEMORANDO FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

I am submitting for your information the following data with reference to several cases investigated by the Bureau, showing the status of each case.

By memorandum dated January 3, 1939, Mr. Brien McMahon, Issistant Attorney General, made reference to the testimony of Edwin P. Banta before the Dies Committee Investigating Un-American Activities and requested an investigation into the existence of a consciracy on the part of the Communist Party or the Morkers Alliance or the personnel of the Federal Priters' Project of New York City, and any or all individuals connected with any of these organizations to unlawfully divert public funds to non-Governmental purposes, whether Communistic or otherwise.

On Jenuary 5, 1939, an investigation in this matter was undertaken. Durin, the course of the inquiry several reports were submitted, college of all of which were forwarded to Ur. McMahon on April 17, 1939. The investigation it elf was completed on March 10, 1939. On April 25, 1939, the Bureau directed a memorandum to Mr. McMahon advising him that he had received all reports submitted in this investigation and that no further inquiries would be conducted in the absence of a rejuest from him specifying the exact nature of the investigation desired. On May 1, 1 33, a closing report in this investigation was rived to the livising facoords of the Department.

Workers Alliance as "job protection" and there were instances in which these suggestions bordered upon coercion, but no proof was shown that persons were forced to join the Workers Alliance. Inquiries showed that wherever there had been specific allegations of misconduct on the part of employees or the abuse of their positions, the proper Project officials had taken steps to rectify such abuses. The influence of the more radical elements in the FIVE ARTS PROJECT was generally admitted but it was shown that the officials in charge of these Projects are compelled to employ persons regardless of their political faith. Instances of job discrimination against persons refusing to join the Workers Alliance or the Communist Party were not provable. These assertions were often based upon supposition and without concrete proof.

An allegation was made by Benta to the effect that one Irving Bicholson, employed on the Federal Writers' Project, had gone from New York City to New Jersey on Government time to do organizational work on behalf of the Communist Party. Investigation showed that Micholson did, in fact, go to New Jersey but there was nothing to show that he was agitating or organizing on behalf of the Communist Party on these occasions.

By memorandum dated January 6, 1939, Mr. Brien McMahon referred the Bureau's attention to Page 1115, Volume 2 of the Hearings before the Dies Committee, in which the following allegation is made by a former Dies investigator, John C. Metcalfes

"Storm-troops members revealed to this investigator that several of them are eviation mechanics and hinted that they were employed by the Bouglas Aircraft Corporation, also Boeing Aircraft. One storm-troop official at this post—that is in os Angeles—Hans Diebel, stated that he was formerly employed the Zeppelin Co. in Germany, and also had worked for Zeiss.

In connection with this testimony Mr. McMahon requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of the ellegations hade by Mctcalfe to the effect that Nasi groups are engaging in espionage activities.

This investigation was importaken impediately but because of the speaking engagements of John C. Metcalfe it was impossible to incate him until Pebruary 9, 1939, at Miami, Florida, where he was interviewed. He was unable to furnish the identity of Storm Troopers allegedly employed in aviation plants. He was unable to furnish any specific information with reference to the alleged espionage activities of Hands Diebal. No information of a tangible nature could be obtained from Metcelfe. He advised, however, that he possesses certain note: maintained at his home in Chicago, Illinois, and that by refreshing his memory from such notes he will be able to furnish information in the future. Metcalfs has not returned to Chicago to date, for which resson it has been impossible to complete this portion of the investigation. By memorandum dated April 25, 1939, the Bureau transmitted a cony of a letter of the Mismi office of the Bureau, dated February 9, 1939, reporting on the interview with Metcalfe. It was explained to Mr. McMahon that due to Metcalfe's continued absence from Chicago, it had been inpossible to interview him at that point where he would have access to his notes.

Mr. McMehon's memorandum of January 6, 1939, also refers to the alleged espionage activities of Karl Neumaister contained on larges 1178 and 1179 of Volume 2 of the Dies Hearings.

This information was furnished to the Bles Committee by John C. Metcalfe in substance as follows:

"Nemesister admitted under questioning that he is engaged in aprending Maxi propagands. He explained he was doing this kind of work because he believed in the principles of Mitherism. He admitted blandly that he goes around checking up on neople to whom material of this type is mailed from Germany and that he does everything in his power to get these people to take more Maxi propagands and essist in its distribution throughout the United States."

"Nouncister, while admitting that he is disseminating propagands for German agencies and is connected with one of the political subdivisions subsidised by a foreign nation, has not yet registered with the Secretary of State here in Washington, as required under the Act of Congress governing the registration of Agents of Foreign Principals."

Upon interview Karl Neumeister denied that he had ever been interviewed by John C. Metcalfe. He alleged that Metcalfe's testimony before the Dies Committee is a fabrication. He explained that as an American citizen he feels it his duty to assist those interested in establishing the truth concerning Germany. He denied being an Agent of any Foreign Government and claimed as an American citizen his right to distribute literature.

The investigation as to Neumeister was completed on April 4, 1939, and a copy of the report completing the investigation was submitted to the Division of Records on April 11, 1939.

Mr. McMahon's memorandum of January 6, 1939, called the Bureau's attention to Earnest Von Buelow, who was referred to in the Bureau's investigation of Masi military training camps, upon which a report was submitted on December 31, 1937. The allegation had been made that Von Buelow might possibly be engaged in espionage activities on behalf of the Masi Government.

The investigation showed that Von Buelow's correct name is Dr. Earnest Ulrich Von Buelow; that Von Buelow is a former member of the Imperial German Army Staff and is known to have entertained high ranking German officials and United States Maval officers at his home in San Diego, California. His stepdaughter is presently married to Vice Admiral Robert Whitthoeft-Enden, a Maval Attache of the German Embassy, Washington, D. C. Von Buelow has lived in the United States for several years but has made trips back to Germany. He at the time considered becoming an American citizen but since a recent trip to Germany his attitude has apparently changed.

He is considered by those known to him to be a potential danger while in this country, but no evidence of espionage activities on his part was disclosed by the investigation. The inquiry with reference to Von Buelow has now been completed and a copy of the report containing the investigation was submitted to the Division of Records of the Department on April 11, 1939.

Mr. McMahon's memorandum of January 6, 1939, next made reference to the testimmy of Arnold Gingrich before the Dies Committee, particularly to Pages 1221 to 1229. Mr. Arnold Gingrich is the editor of KFM magasine.

In the first instance Mr. Gingrich made reference to letters exchanged between Spencer J. Marwick, reportedly the Chie Commander of the Silver Shirt Legion of America, and Miss Susan Sterling whose correct name is believed to be Elsie Thewer. Miss Sterling is of Cleveland, Chie. The apparent purpose in showing this exchange of correspondence was to disclose the relationship between Miss Sterling and the Silvershirts. The Burean's investigation of the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Inserperated, which will be referred to in more detail later in this memorandum, disclosed an inquiry with reference to Susan Sterling and showed that she is likewise a leader of the Silvershirt organization in Cleveland, Chie.

Mr. Gingrich next refers to possible espionage activities in behalf of Nasi interests undertaken by one Henry D. Allen and charged;

"The real inside job for the bunds is not merely propaganda and conversion to Masi ideology but a military organisation for sabotage and espionage in the United States in the event of European war, whether we are neutral or not. For this ticklish work the leaders are too smart to use suspected aliens but rely on native Americans."

Investigation conducted in several parts of the country concerning Henry D. Allen discloses that Allen is strongly anti-Semitic in his attitude and has not only associated himself with anti-Semitic organisations but has actively carried on a campaign of anti-Semitism. He was found to have connections with so-called Fascist or vigilante organisations, such as:

The Militant Christian Patriots
The American League of Christian Women
The American Mationalist Confederation
The Silver Shirt Legion of America

The German-American Bund

The Gold Shirts of Mexico
The American White Guards
James True Associates
Canadian Mationalists and Mational
Christian Party of Canada
Mational Liberty Party

and others of a similar character.

The investigation failed to disclose, however, that Allen is interested in any espionage activities but that his interests lie largely in anti-Semitism and anti-Communism.

The investigation as to Henry D. Allen has now been completed and copies of reports covering the investigation of Allen have been sub-aitted to the Division of Records on the following dates:

Mr. Gingrich in his testimony mext made reference to possible espionage activities on the part of Edward James Smythe of New York and Ernst Goerner of Chicago, Illinois. Smythe was reported to be the Chairman of the Mational Committee Against Communism, while Goerner was reported to be a known Masi propagandist. Gingrich introduced an excerpt from a letter, presumably written by Smythe to Goerner, in which Smythe claimed to receive confidential letters from Germany, in one portion of which he declared:

"I look upon Hitler as the second Jesus Christ of the modern world."

Investigation has thus far failed to locate Edward James Smythe. Inquiries have shown, however, that Smythe is an erratic individual of questioned mental stability and of the prometer type. He is engaged essentially in anti-Semitism and anti-Communism.

Ernest Goerner was arrested by Department of Justice Agents in August, 1918, for pro-German activities. He is presently carrying on anti-Semitic and anti-Communistic activities. On Movember 13, 1918, a petition was filed to cancel Goerner's Certificate of Vaturalization but this petition was dismissed. Goerner was born on Movember 28, 1878, in Alsace, Germany, and was naturalized in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in 1914. Investigation failed to disclose that Goerner is receiving any printed matter from abroad with the exception of a few publications obtained through subscription from Germany. Goerner was found to be an erratic and an excitable individual who becomes almost inarticulate when denouncing the Jews and Communists. He is connected with both the German-American Bund and the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Incorporated.

Goerner upon interview explained that he first became acquainted with Smythe through their mutual friend, Karl Neumeister, who has been mentioned hereinbefore. The investigation failed to disclose that Goerner is engaged in any espionage activities. The inquiries with reference to both Goerner and Smythe have been conducted by several of the Bureau's field offices and in so far as Goerner is concerned the investigation is completed. Further investigation is being undertaken looking toward the location of Smythe. Copies of reports concerning Smythe and Goerner have been submitted to the Division of Records on the following dates:

Arnold Gingrich, editor of KEN magasine, has been interviewed on several occasions in an effort to obtain amplification of the statements which he made before the Dies Committee. He disclosed that the information to which he testified before the Committee was published in article form in KEN magasine and that the authors are John L. Spivak and William Miller of Cheveland, Ohie. Spivak was the author of one article entitled "Exposing Native V. S. Pletters," which appeared in KEN magasine on September S, 1938. It was this article that dealt with the reported espionage activities of Henry D. Allem. Miller is the author of an article entitled "Prelude to American Fascism," which appeared in KEN magasine for August 25, 1938. Both Spivak and Miller have been interviewed. No additional information of value was obtained from either of

these individuals. Copies of reports recording these interviews were submitted to the Division of Records on -

April 11, 1939 April 21, 1939.

The information furnished by Miller refers almost entirely to the activities of the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Incorporated, and is referred to in greater detail later in this memorandum.

Copies of two reports reflecting the interviews with Arnold Gingrich were submitted to the Division of Records on April 11, 1939.

In his testimony before the Dies Committee Gingrich alleged that in less than a year German espionage in the United States had set up one Section known as Section No. 2 under the direction of Colonel Nicolai and that in addition thereto three new departments known as Nos. 23, 24 and 25, devoted to espionage in the United States, had been set up. He stated that Department 23 specialises in economic espionage; that Department 24 specialises in military intelligence and that Department 25 specialises in Nasi propagands. Gingrich in his testimony also referred to "Pamphlet No. 7," also known as "Instructions for Our Friends Overseas," from which he quoted, in part, as follows:

"German propaganda in the United States must be handled more tactfully than it has been done before. It will not be possible to subsidise American newspapers except in very rare cases — and only newspapers of minor importance.

The fundamental aim must always be to discredit conditions in the United States and thus make life in Germany seem enviable by contrast. It will, therefore, be to the best interests of the Reich to cooperate secretly with all persons or groups who criticise the American system, regardless on what ground. The line to be taken in all such cases is to exaggerate the strength of Germany and to contrast it with the weakness of democracies.\*

Gingrich upon interview explained that he obtained this information from Rene Eraus of New York. Eraus is a former Austrian. He admitted having furnished Gingrich with information concerning Section No. 2 under the direction of Golonel Nicelai and stated he had obtained the information through confidential sources in France. He informed that three new departments had been established, known as Departments Nos. 23, 24 and 25, all devoted to espionage activities in the United States. He declared that the documentary evidence which he originally obtained in France had subsequently been burned. He was of the opinion that "Pamphlet No. ?" could be obtained from sources in France. He stated that subsequent to furnishing the information to KEN magasine he had also destroyed a copy of "Pamphlet No. ?." In brief, Eraus was unable to furnish any data in substantiation of the purported information which he furnished to Arnold Gingrich and to which Gingrich testified before the Dies Committee.

In his memorandum of January 6, 1939, Mr. McMahon referred again to the testimony of Investigator John C. Metcalfe, with particular reference to the activities of Charles Bruce Swift of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, who, according to Metcalfe, had some connection with the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Incorporated. It was found that the correct mase for this individual is Charles Burdell Swift, who is a 3rd. Junior Grade Lieutemant, United States Naval Reserve. It was learned that Swift, while acting as an investigator for the Haval Intelligence, arranged for a meeting to be addressed on October 4, 1938, by Roy Zachary, Field Marshal of the Silver Shirt Legion. This address was at the Pittsburgh Athletic Association and the attendance was composed largely of businessmen. Swift claimed that his purpose in arranging this meeting was to obtain information for the benefit of the Nevel Intelligence. His explanation was apparently unacceptable to his superiors for he received a letter dated November 21, 1938, signed by J. C. Townsend, Commandant, 4th Neval District, Philadelphia, which is quoted as follows:

"You are instructed, pending any further instructions from the Commandant, to cease all I. V. (5) activities."

A copy of a report covering this was submitted to the Division of Records on April 20, 1939.

In his memorandum of January 6, 1939, Mr. McMahon also requested a thorough investigation of the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Incorporated, its membership, activity and connections with German Bunds. In keeping with that request an investigation was immediately undertaken throughout the entire United States. The investigation has now been completed and copies of reports have been submitted to the Division of Records of the Department generally as they have been received.

In brief, it may be stated that the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Incorporated, has its headquarters in Asheville, North Carolina; that its leader and adving force is William Dudley Pellay. The Legion centers itself entirely about the person of Pellay. The organization is interested largely in anti-Semitism and anti-Communism. Its principal publication is a weekly magazine called "LTEERATION," which centers its attention on attacking the New Deal and Jewish domination of the United States Government. The magazine "LIBERATION" is said to have a regular subscription list of 5,700 but with a weekly circulation of 10,000 copies. Pelley has published a book entitled "No More Hunger," in which he discusses the ills of the nation. He proposes as a solution thereof the plan of "Christian Economics."

Membership in the Silvershirts is restricted to persons of eighteen years of age who must be native or naturalised Americans of Christian faith without Jewish blood.

Investigation failed to disclose that there is any connection between the Silvershirts and the German-American Bund. Likewise there was no indication that the Silvershirts are engaged in any form of sabotage or espionage detrimental to the interests of the United States Government. No information was obtained tending to disclose that the Silvershirts are agents of any foreign organization.

The total membership in the organisation is sost mebulous. Pelley has made exaggerated claims of the membership and the following. He has estimated that there are 150,000 persons in the United States actively interested in the Silvershirts. He was unable, however, to distinguish between the number of persons interested and the number of persons who are actually members of the organisation. He further claimed that there are at least one million persons willing to support the principles of his organisation at the present time. Investigation showed that there are approximately 12,358 members of the Silvershirt organisation

in the United States. It is pointed out, however, that these figures are based merely upon claims of local leaders of the organization in the various States. No proof of this membership could be ascertained through an examination of records. There were allegations to the effect that no record of the membership is maintained by any part of the organization.

Among the purposes and aims of the Silvershirts are the discarding of the New Deal, the repeal of the Wagner Act, the Mational Labor Relations Board and Social Security Act, the prosecution of officials responsible for the disbursement of funds to extend the progress of Jewish Communium, the institution of a Nine-Year-Program for the resuscitation of American business on a Pederal-credit financing basis, restrictions of the right to strike when it jeopardises the public, restriction of Jewish ownership of property to only one city in each State and other aims of a related nature.

The Bureau has prepared a memorandum, dated April 29, 1939, summarising the entire investigation of the Silvershirt movement throughout the United States. For your information one copy of this memorandum is attached hereto and is considered as Exhibit No. 1.

Reference is made to the letter of Honorable Summer Welles, Acting Secretary of State, dated March 13, 1939, directed to the Attorney General, concerning the investigation of certain organizations, with the thought of ascertaining the existence of a possible violation of the Act of June 8, 1938, requiring the registration with the Secretary of State of Agents of Foreign Principals.

In pursuance thereof, conversations were held between representatives of this Bureau and representatives of this Department of State attached to the office of Mr. Joseph C. Green, Chief, Office of Arms and Munitions Control. Conversations were also held with Mr. James C. Dunn, Advisor on Political Relations, as the result of which it was considered advisable to undertake an investigation of three representative organizations, namely:

The German-American Bund
The Communist Party, U.S.A.
The American League for Peace
and Democracy

With a view to the appropriate consummation of this inquiry, the Bureau has prepared memoranda of facts consisting of available data concerning these three organisations. The memorandum of fact pertaining to the German-American Bund was completed on March 29, 1939, and by memorandum of March 30, 1939, one copy thereof was transmitted to Mr. Brien McMahon, Assistant Attorney General, with the request that if further investigation were desired concerning the German-American Bund as a possible violator of the Act of June 8, 1938, the Bureau be advised of the particular type of investigation desired.

You are further informed that a copy of the Bureau's memor indum on the German-American Bund dated March 29, 1939, was transmitted to 'ir. Joseph C. Green of the Department of State by letter dated March 30, 1939. At that time Mr. Green was advised that no further investigation would be undertaken with regard to the German-American Bund until this 'Bureau had been specifically advised by the Criminal Division of the Department as to the particular type of inquiry desired.

The memorandum of fact as to the Corean-American hund discloses briefly that the Bund que established on June \*, 1500, its predecessors having been the Mational Socialist Associ tions, "Toutpala", and "The Mangue of the Friends of the hew Germany". Frith Kuhn, the present Bund leader, was elected to that position on Dedomber 1, 1377. The study prepared by the Bureau fails to disclose any direct agency relationship between the bund and the Jerman Covernment or may organisation operating within the confines of the Third Reich. There is, however, a striking similarity between the purposes and aims of the Bund and the Foreign Organisation of the German Government. Briefly, the Bund is interested in Anti-Semitiem, Anti-Communica; the defence of the good name and bonor of Germany in this country, and opposing the boycott of German goods in the United States. It is likewise interested in the perpetuation of the Terman culture and language and has taken stope to insure the perpetuation of that language and that culture.

For your information, there is attached hereto a copy of the Bureau's memorandum of fact on the German-American Bund dated March 49, 1939, which is considered Exhibit No. 4.

The Sureau also prepared a memorandum of fact concerning the American League for Peace and Democracy. This memorandum was completed on April 4, 1979, and by memorandum deted April 4, 1999, the Bureau transmitted to Mr. Brien Achahon one copy of this memorandum of fact concerning the American League for Beack and Democracy. On that occasion, Mr. McMahon was advised that further investigation is being undertaken by the appropriate field offices, and that copies of reports developing further data as to a possible violation on the part of the American League for "eace and Democracy of the Act of June 8, 1938, would be forwarded to him. A copy of the memorandum on the American Leagum for Peace and Democracy was likewise transmitted to Mr. Joseph C. Green of the Department of State by letter dated April 4, 13%. Mr. Green was advised that further investigation is being undertaken by the Bureau's field offices interested in this matter. Reports are surrently being received from various field offices and are being transmitted to the Division of Records of the Department. The investigation as to the American

League for Peace and Democracy has not been completed, but the impairy thus far discloses the following facts in brief:

The American League is an outgrowth of the World Congress Against War held in Amsterdam, Holland, in August, 19°2. In 19°3 a United States Congress Against Mar was hald, out of which grew the present American League for Peace and Democracy. The implication for the international organization was Menri barbase, a leading French Communist, who came to the United States to assist in the organizational work here. The American League is today one of 33 national organizations constituting the Forld Committee Against War and Fundiane At its insoption, the American League was dominated to a large extent by Communist interests, Earl Browder being a leading figure in its development. Dozald Henderson, a known Communist, was also a leader in the organisational drive for the League in America. Another of its organisers was John B. Matthews, an admitted "Fellow-Traveler" of the Communist Party. Earl Broader, addressing the 13th Plemm of the Executive Committee of the Communist International, soon after the establishment of the League in the United States, declared in part "We led a highly successful U.S. Congress Against War... The Congress from the beginning was led by our party quite openly ...

Dr. Harry F. Ward, Chairman of the American League, has vigorously disclaimed any connection between the League and the Communist Party or the Communist International. He has challenged the Dies Committee to subposes appropriate officers of the League for the purpose of establishing this fact. Vaile there is a general disclaimer of any direct connection between the League and the Communist Party, U.S.A., or the Communist International, the facts have been shown that the League itself is a United Front movement, in keeping with the United Front gragram of the Communist International that it was founded internationally by the leading Frunch Communist at that time, and that it was established in America by Virtue of the services of that landing French Communist namely Henri Barbusse, and the efforte of other leading American Communists or Pellow-Travelurs, such as Earl Browder, Donald Benderson, J. B. Matthews and many others. The most striking connection between the League and the Communist Party is the similarity of their programs. At its inception, the League was

interested in defending the Soviet Union, giving fulsees praise to the accomplishments of the Soviet Union and a general attack upon the capitalist form of government. Continued investigation is being made in this matter to determine whether the American League is an Agent of a Foreign Principal.

For your information, there is attached hereto and considered Exhibit No. 3, one copy of the Bureau's memorandum on the American League for Peace and Demogracy dated April 4, 1939.

On April 10, 1939, the Bureau completed a memorandum of fact concerning the Communist Party, U.S.A., a copy of that memorandum being transmitted to Mr. Brien McMahon by memorandum of the same date. At that time, Mr. McMahon was requested to advise me whether, in view of the nature of the information contained in the memorandum of fact as to the Communist Party, any further investigation should be undertaken by this Bureau. A copy of the memorandum concerning the Communist Party, U.S.A., was likewise transmitted to Mr. Joseph G. Green of the Department of State by letter dated April 10, 1929, with the advice that no further investigation would be undertaken concerning the Communist Party until this Bureau received advice from Mr. Brien McMahon as to the exact nature of such further investigation as he might deem advisable.

In brief, the memorandum of fact with reference to the Gommunist Party, U.S.A., shows that it is a section of the Third (Communist) International, the latter having been established in Moscow, in March, 1919; that as a section of the Communist International, it is bound to obey and fulfill the program adopted by the Communist International and the decisions, not only of the Forld Congresses of the Communist International which are held periodically, but of the directives of the Executive Committee of the Communist International which are issued at more frequent intervals. It is shown that the Communist Party makes a general disclaimer of being controlled by the international organisation at Moscow, but in spite of the disclaimer, it is shown that without exception, the Communist Party, U.S.A., fulfills those obligations imposed upon it by the decisions of the Communist International.

For your information, there is attached hereto one copy of the Bureau's memorandum of fact concerning the Communist Party, dated April 13, 1939, and considered Exhibit No. 4.

Brien Hemahon addressed a memorandum to me in which he related that the State Department has had occasion to consider the cases of several organisations and persons whose activities, according to the information received by it, rould appear to be of such a nature as to require them to register pursuant to the Public Act No. 583 - 75th Congress, approved on June 8, 1936, requiring the registration of agents of foreign principals. Mr. McMahon enclosed a copy of the Secretary of State's letter on the subject, and it was requested that an investigation be made of the following organisations and persons:

Amkino Corporation Beckmign Corporation Count Anastasi Vonsistaky The James True Associates Il Orido della Stirpe Edgar Y. Hunt

The investigations requested in connection with this memorandum have been completed with the exception of the Il Grido della Stirpe and the Kiyoshi K. Kawakami cases. In the Il Grido della Stirpe investigation a comprehensive report has been submitted, but certain individuals who were to be interviewed were found to be temporarily out of this country. They will be interviewed upon their return and the appropriate reports submitted.

The investigation as to Kiyoshi K. Kewakami has been completed with the exception of interviewing Kawakami, who is in Japan. Upon the return of Kawakami, he will be interviewed and an appropriate report submitted.

The following is a brief summarisation of the results of our investigative efforts as to each of the organisations and corporations mentioned above:

#### MIKING CORPORATION

The Amkino Corporation was incorporated in New York state on November 29, 1926, to manufacture, purchase, and deal in motion pictures and perform allied activities. Its principal activities have been the

U

purchase of films produced in Russia and sold by Seyusintorkino, a Soviet State organisation having exclusive export rights. The policy of the Amkino Corporation is to have its President, a Russian citizen, hold the entire stock of the Corporation in trust for the Soviet interests. Officials and attorneys of the Amkino Corporation elais it is not an agent of a foreign principal according to their interpretation of the Registration Act. Many of the films distributed by them are apparently of a political nature.

On March 29, 1939, a comprehensive report reflecting our investigative efforts was forwarded to the State Department and the Department. Under date of April 20, 1939, the State Department advised that the Amkino Corporation had registered pursuant to the requirements of the Registration Act, further indicating that it appeared, therefore, that no further investigation need be made in respect to this organisation.

### BOOKNIGA CORPORATION

The Bookmiga Corporation was incorporated in New York state on October 4, 1935, for the purpose of purchasing and distributing books and literature of all kinds and for other incidental activities. It acts as exclusive distributor in Borth and South America for the Soutet State book agency Meshdumerodnaja Kniga of Moscow, MSSR, also acting as purchaser of books published in the United States, for that agency. Much of the material sold by the Bookmige Corporation is purely of a political nature.

Mr. Raphael Rush, Vice President, claims that the Poskniga Corporation is not an agent of a foreign principal, according to their interpretation of the Registration Act.

Copies of a report reflecting our investigative efforts in regard to this case were forwarded to the State Department under date of March 25, 1939, and to the Department under date of April 19, 1939. The State Department has indicated that the Booknigs Corporation should register pursuant to the requirements of the Begistration Act. Facts in connection with this case have been referred to Mr. Frien McMahon, Assistant Attorney General, for an opinion as to whether the activities of the Booknigs Corporation are in violation of the Registration Act.

### COUNT AMASTASI VONSLATSKY

An extensive investigation failed to disclose that the activities of Count Anastasi Vonsiatsky are in violation of the provisions of the Registration Act. Copies of a closing report in connection with this investigation were forwarded to the State Department and to the Department under data of April 12, 1939.

## THE JAMES TRUE ASSOCIATES

A complete investigation was conducted concerning James True, trading as the James True Associates, without disclosing that the activities of that organization were in violation of the provisions of the Registration Act. Copies of a closing report in regard to this investigation were forwarded to the State Department and to the Department under date of Narch 29, 1939.

## IL ONIDO DELLA STIRPE

Il Grido della Stirpe was incorporated in New York state in 1924, for the varpose of publishing, printing, and selling books, papers, and the like, and of conducting other activities necessary to this business. Domenico Trombetta, editor, was indicated for the murder of Salvatora Aruna, following a riot between Passists and enti-Pascists at Garibaldi's Shrine, Staten Island, on July 4, 1932. He was acquitted on October 28, 1932. Trombetta claims he alone is responsible for the policy and finances of his paper, and denies any connection with or subsidisation by any foreign person or group.

This investigation, as related above, is pending the interviewing of certain individuals who were found to be temporarily out of the country. On March 29, 1939, a report reflecting the investigative efforts in connection with this case was forwarded to the State Department and to the Department.

### RIGAR T. RINT

Edgar W. Hunt, Lombertville, New Jersey, General Counsel for the North German Lloyd Steenship Line, does not believe bis duties as general counsel of this company brings him within the provisions of the Registration Act. Start is currently being paid an annual retainer, together with additional yearly payments representing fees for past services rendered the North German Lloyd Line for prosecuting the latter's claims for compensation following the World War.

A closing report in connection with this matter was forwarded to the State Department and to the Department under date of May 2, 1939.

### KIYOSHI K. KAWAKANI

Kiyoshi K. Kawakami, a native of Japan, is self-admitted correspondent and representative since 1923 of the Osaka Mainichi Publishing Company, publishers of the Tokyo Daily News and the Osaka Daily News. Mr. Kawakami is the author of several books published in New York and numerous articles published in domestic magazines and daily papers. The investigation disclosed that he departed from San Francisco, California, on January 19, 1939, for Japan and is not expected to return from the Orient until May or June, 1939.

Under date of April 28, 1939, by memorandum addressed to Assistant Attorney General Brian Mollahon, I transmitted each of the reports submitted in connection with this case and asked that an epinion be rendered as to whether there is an indication that the Registration Act has been violated by Kiyoshi K. Kawakami. Each of the reports submitted in this case has previously been submitted to the State Department. As indicated above, upon the return of Mr. Kawakami, he will be interviewed relative to this matter.
