Unity Valkyric Freeman-Mitford now lies like a broken, discarded doll in her father's British mansion, her heart crushed by the mailed fist of the world's No. 1 dictator.

So great was Unity's devotion to

tion that war between Britain and Germany was inevitable. Wearing a Nazi swastika armband, the girl attended a left wing mass meeting in Hyde Park, London's "Union Square." More than 50,000 Britions were in the assemblage and her appearance was the signal for a tremendous anti-Nazi demonstration. "Go back to Germany where you."

"Go back to Germany where you belong," the crowd shouted, "Throw her into the Serpentine."

N A few minutes she was attacked. kicked and beaten. If it were not for, a dozen syring lorden pa-licemen, the beautiful dadghter of Lord Redesdale might have been injured mortally.

It was not long after that event

hatred of Nazism and the fuehrer imbued with every creed of Nazism, was a challenge and not an indication that war between Britain and Germany was inevitable.

Wearing a Nazi swastika armband, the girl attended a left wing mass meeting in Hyde Park, Loning the latter of the German regime.

She became rabidly, openly anti-Semitic. She once wrote in the violently anti-Jewish newspaper "Der Steuermer," edited by Julius Streicher, Her article said:

"The English have no notion of the Jewish danger. Our worst Jews work only behind the scenes. We hope you'll see us soon win against the world's enemy in spite of his cunning. We anticipate the day when we shall be able to say with might and authority England for the English—out with the Jews."

Then she added this postscript: "Please publish my full name, for I want everyone to know I'm a Jew hater."

STRANGELY, under the spell of Hitler, this girl had completely forgotten—or refused to remember—that her grandfather. Algernon Bertram Mitford, was elevated to the peerage through the efforts of Disraeli, a Jew, and one of the most

Unity followed Hitler from place to place, frequently staying as his guest in the fuehrer's mountain estate at Berchtesgaden. She seldom came to England, and when she did there invariably was trouble

When the beautiful daughter of Lord Redesdale saw and met Hitler on the first time, she was but 20 years old, an art student in Munich. Until then there had never been a man in her life who had succeeded in stirring her deeply

A community of interest between Unity and the fueher existed immediately. There was art. Hitler had once striven to become a great artist, and the British girl was just beginning to visit the same mu-seums and ateliers where years be-

And this comment came on an

other occasion: "There can never be any other man in my life,"

A LTHOUGH Unity was a foreign convert, she was in many ways more a Nazi than the majority of

Nazis themselves.

On one occasion she was said to On one occasion she was said to have stood so long under a blazing sun waiting for Hilter's appearance in a parade that she fainted and was ill for some weeks. She accompanied the fuehrer a large part of the way on his visit to Vienna following the Austrian "anschluss."

The height of Hilter's regard for Unity may be seen in the care he took for her safety, and the fact that she was always the guest of the German government, no matter in

took for her safety, and the fact that she was always the guest of the German government, no matter in which hotel in the Reich she saved. Inspired by more than political devotion for Adolf Hitler and the house of Nazidom he built, the fueltren's "ideal Nordic woman" almost succeeded in winning her father, Lord Redesdale, over to her way of thinking. She encountered disastrous failure, however, in the case of one of her five sisters. Instead of coming around to the swastika. Unity's beautiful sister, Jessica, rebounded toward the hammer and sickle!

Little Jessica, not at all like her "perfect Aryan" type sister, threatened for a while to become an even thornier problem in the Redesdale clan than Unity.

She tore loose from her roots in the Redesdale mansions and eloped with her 18-year-old second cousin.

with her 18-year-old second cousin, Esmond Romilly, nephew of Win-ston Churchill, when he left Eng-land to fight in the defense of Ma-

land to fight in the defense of Madrid and Bilbao.

As far as can be learned, Unity and Jessica never tried to "have it out" on their political beliefs. Recently interviewed in Miami, the more radical sister called Hitler's "blond goddess" just "a little bit wild." Jessica and her husband are tending bar in Miami.

Meantime, Lord Redesdale, is chagrined, and sick over the whole mess. As a peer he favors England in the war, as a father, he grieves for his daughters defection from the empire's standard?

Jessica Romilly in interviews with reporters, considered her stay in the United States as an adventure and refused to cisclose any information regarding

She did remark that it was quite natural for her family to be pro-Nazi because "most of the upper class in England were pro-Nazi."

When Jessies and Esmond Romilly landed in the United States they had \$400.00, lived in a tiny Greenwich Village apartment while Jessics sold dresses. Esmond Romilly was out of work at the time but expressed a desire to obtain employment in the advertising business or in journalism. Both expressed an opinion that they would return to England if war was declared. They liked America and intended to become citizens.

At the morgue department of the Miami Herald, a search was made for news items concerning Jessica and Esmond Romilly. Accordingly there is being enclosed herewith a copy of article appearing in the edition of the Miami Herald dated January 3; 1940, setting forth information concerning Unity Freeman-Mitford; article in the Miami Herald dated January 4, 1940. FOLKESTONE, England, Jan. 2.—A worried father and an empty ambulance waited beneath the chalk cliffs of this southern England port Tuesday night for Unity Valkyrie Freeman-Mitford, who has been "visiting friends" (including Adolf Hitler) in Germany since before the war, and expected on an imperial Airways. expected on an Imperial Airways plane.





Under date of January 5, 1940, the Miami Herald printed the following story regarding JESSICA and ESMOND ROMILLY:

"SISTER OF ADOLF'S PERFECT NORDIC TYPE MAKING OWN WAY AS MIAMI BARMAID

"Jessica Freeman-Mitford Became Black Sheep of Family when She Married Anit-Fascist.

"Two years ago Jessica Freeman-Mitford was the black sheep of the family of the wealthy British Lord Redesdale because she married a volunteer for loyalist Spain.

"Today, Jessica, sister of the now famous Unity, is working as a barmaid in a Miami Pub, and her husband, Esmond Romilly, nephew of Winston Churchill, works at her side. But it's probable that Lord Redesdale is prouder of Jessica than he is of, say, Daughter Unity who came back to England on a stretcher, her health broken and her past as a favorite of Chancellor Hitler a topic of every back fence gossip, or of Daughter Diana,

who married a Fascist Gentleman, Oswald Moseley, and boasted she would rear her children to greet visitors with "Heil Hitler." Should be Proud "Father Redesdale must be prouder even of drinkserving Jessica than he is of himself, for he was one of the Cliveden Set who, for years, shouted that all should be surrendered to Hitler only to awaken one morning to find the British Empire had sworn to destroy the same Hitler. "Jessica was found at an inexpensive rooming house. at 226 S.W. First Street. Publicity shy, she denied any knowledge of the mysterious malady of her sister Unity which had demanded the attention of the world. 'I'm not in touch with my family,' she said which recalled the fact that this branch of the family's adventures started two years ago when Jessica eloped to France with young Romilly after a friendship of., only three days. Lord Redesdale sent a destroyer to bring her back, but young Jessica was too much in love with anti-Fascist Esmond, of the blue eyes and curly hair. It was the first Communist element to enterthe Fascist lines of the Redesdale family. STRIKING RESEMBLANCE "There is a striking resemblance between Jessica and Unity whom Hitler has called the perfect Nordic type presumably because of her waxen complexion, golden hair, and antipathy for face powder. Jessica has dark hair but the same blue eyes, brows and mouth as her sister. Her manner and sombre clothes are typically British, but she has been won over to one good old American custom- lipstick. "The Romilly's live in a tiny efficiency apartment, and drive a third or fourth-hand car of the 1926 vintage. In the Roma Restaurant at 1327 N. E. Bayshore Court, they are set to start work together at the bar. The two have been on their own since they were married. They are both 21. Apparently they have come to Miami to stay. . "When first the Romilly's came to the United States last March, they settled in Greenwich village

and Jessica sold dresses in a Fifth Avenue shop. At that time she said it was quite natural for her family to be pro-Nazi 'because most of the upper class in England is.' Now, however, she prefers not to discuss her sister, Unity, or her family, because she is not in communication with them.

"They said America and Americans are so wonderful, that they may become citizens."

At the Congressional Library, Agent examined newspaper records of the New York Times, relating to JESSICA LUCY RCMILLY; MNITY VALKYRIE FREEMAN-MITFORD; and Mr. and Mrs. OSWALD ERNALD MOSLEY, for the period from 1937 to date. These reflected that in February, 1937, JESSICA FREEMAN-MITFORD ran away to Spain in an attempt to marry her 18 year old cousin, ESMOND ROMILLY, who is a nephew of WINSTON CHURCHILL. She is one of six daughters of Lord REDESDALE of England. Three years previously, ESMOND ROMILLY had run away from Wellington College in England and was reported to have come under the influence of a group of London Communists and had recently been fighting on the Madrid barricades in the International Column. Upon the flight of his daughter, Lord REDESDALE enlisted the aid of the British and Spanish Governments to locate his daughter, expressing his fears of a Communist marriage.

The newspaper articles further reflect that ESMOND ROMILLY took JESSICA to Bilbao, Spain, as his secretary and upon being advised by Lord REDESDALE's solicitors that JESSICA had been made a ward in chancery and that he would be liable to imprisonment if he married her without the other's permission, ROMILLY is reported to have sent the following cable:

"Threats of imprisonment make no difference. We both regard marriage mainly as a convenience and that it does not mean the end of the world if we are unable to marry."

On March 10, 1937, ESMOND ROMILLY and JESSICA FREMAN-MITFORD are reported to have been brought from Bilbao with some 200 other refugees on a British destroyer to Bayonne, France, where they were met by JESSICA's brother and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. RODD. They were married in May, 1937, in the British Consulate in Bayonee, France, at which time they reported that they had not joined the Loyalists cause in Spain but had been correspondent for British newspapers. They expressed their intention to come to the United States to start a beet root plantation at Palm Beach, Florida.

The papers further reflect that in 1939, Mr. and Mrs. ESMOND ROMILLY entered the United States at New York City, where they settled in Greenwich Village. JESSICA is reported to have gone to work in a Fifth Avenue dress shop.

It is further indicated that in July, 1940, ESMOND ROMILLY joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and after a period of training, returned to England while JESSICA ROMILLY made her home in Alexandria, Virginia. An article dated December 5, 1941, states that Flying Officer ESMOND MARCUS DAVID ROMILLY, Royal Canadian Air Force Navigator and Bomb-Aimer, had been posed as missing in action and was probably dead or a prisoner of war. This report reached Mrs. ROMILLY at Alexandria, Virginia, where she was preparing to leave for England to re-join her husband with her nine month old baby.

With respect to the family of JESSICA ROMILLY, the New York Times articles indicated that her sisters, UNITY VALKYRIE FREEMAN-MITFORD and DIANA PREEMAN-MITFORD, while art students in Germany in 1934, met ADOLPH HITLER in the Osteria Restaurant in Munich. HITLER was attracted to the two girls and arranged an introduction and thereafter, they received many attentions from him. UNITY was given a swastika badge autographed by HITLER, and she was subsequently reported to have been described by HITLER as the "perfect Nordic dream girl".

She is reported to have adopted the Nazi ideology and to have on one occasion, written a letter which was published in the Steurmer, a Nazi party newspaper, in which she stated, "England for the English; out with the Jews. Heil HITLER!", with the postscript, "I want everybody to know I am a Jew Hater".

Lord REDESDALE, JESSICA ROMILLY's father, is reported to have entertained pro-German sympathies prior to Munich, although there is no indication from the articles examined that his sympathies were strong as those of UNITY or DIANA, nor that he entertains such views at the present time.

EDUCATION

At the Strayer College, 13th and F Streets, N. W., made available the records which indicated JESSICA ROMILLY had taken a course of shorthand and typing in day school for the period from September 15, 1941 to February 26, 1942. Her grades were quite high and when she left she had accuired a fair ability to take dictation and a fair speed in typing.

informed that considering the period she had attended, she had learned rapidly and seemed to be proficient.

EMPLOYMENT

Agent learned at the Weinberger's Dress Shop, formerly located at 1132 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., where Mrs. ROMILLY is reported to have been employed for the period from September, 1940 to March, 1941, is now out of business and the proprietor's present whereabouts are not known.

At the Royal Air Force Delegation personnel department, 1424 - 16th Street, N. W., examined the personnel file of JESSICA ROMILLY and infomed that she had been employed by the Delegation from March 24, 1942 to September 25, 1942. The records reveal that she was born in Glos, England, on November 9, 1917; that her father is Lord REDESDALE; and that her husband is a nephew of WINSTON CHURCHILL. Mr. and Mrs. ROMILLY entered the United States at New York, on March 2, 1939, as quota immigrants on Immigrant Card #1040112, issued by the United States Vice Consul, in London, England on January 6, 1939.

In England, she had worked for the J. Walter Thompson Advertising Agency, from 1937 to 1938. In New York, she was employed as a sales girl at the World's Fair from April, 1939 to July, 1939. From September, 1939 to March, 1940, she was employed at Miami in the Roma Bar and Restaurant, where she became part-owner. From September, 1940 to March, 1941, she was employed by Weinberger's Dress Shop, at 1132 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C.

The efficiency record indicated that Mrs. ROMILLY was above average in intelligence and during the period of her employment, had become increasingly efficient. She had received one promotion and her salary at the time she resigned to take a position with the Office of Price Administration, was \$120 per month. She was studying Radio Engineering while employed at the Royal Air Force Delegation, although her duties were of a stenographic nature in the signal section.

She has some peculiar characteristics which he was unable to describe but he attributed these to the loss of her husband who was posted as missing in action in a bombing raid over Germany a few months before she went to work at the Royal Air Force Delegation. He stated she is average in neatness and appearance and that she dresses conservatively, not being inclined to be flashy or greatly concerned about her clothes, "like all English women".

advised that Mrs. ROMILLY seldom spoke of her family and when she did mention them, she displayed no affection.

He knew of the history of her family and was impressed that Mrs. ROMILLY did not in any way share the sympathies of her sisters, UNITY and DIANA, and to the extent that she had expressed herself he considered her philosophy quite to the contrary.

Delegation, advised that he considered Mrs. ROMILLY a zealous worker and an efficient employee. He knew her brother slightly and stated that he was last known to be with the British Tank Corps in North Africa. He knows of nothing derogatory to Mrs. ROMILLY and considers her "a loyal British subject".

REFERENCES

Department of the Interior, informed that he had known Mr. and Mrs. ROMILLY since shortly after they came to Washington, in 1940. He was stimulated by their personalities and considered them to be intelligent and likeable people. He was confident that they had no sympathies with the Axis and stated that their views were quite liberal, that he would not call them Communistic, and did not believe that either of them were members of the Communist Party.

He commented further that ESMOND ROMILLY enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in July, 1940, a time when the Communist Party in this country, was advocating isolationism. He had told that he did not like conditions in England but that he did respect the civil liberties which the Democratic forms of Government guaranteed and was willing to fight to protect them.

A short time thereafter, the ROMILLYS moved to Florida where they worked in a restaurant and bar in Miami, and it was when they returned to Washington in the summer of 1940, that ESMOND ROMILLY had requested permission for JESSICA ROMILLY to live at their home.

considered Mrs. ROMILLY very outspoken and bitter against her father and conditions in England. She had often said that she liked this country very much and that she and her husband planned to become citizens. She was strongly opposed to the Axis and had expressed sympathies with the Russian experiment and some of its philosophy. From the ROMILLYS, he had learned that ESMOND had fought with the Loyalists in Spain prior to the time that he took JESSICA to Spain with him in 1937. From it was learned that Mrs. ROMILLY's childhood had been very unhappy; that her parents had not permitted her to attend public schools or to associate with other children, considering them inferior. It was due to this early environment that many of Mrs. ROMILLY's present liberal views were attributed.

CREDIT AND CRIMINAL





OCCUPATION AND EMPLOYMENT RECORD

The subject at the present time is on the staff of the California Labor School in Oakland, California. She occupies the position of financial director, and she is employed full time in this position and has been so employed since June of 1944.

The subject's past employment record, which was obtained from the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, San Francisco, and Retailers Credit Association of San Francisco, is as follows:

From January, 1944 to June of 1944, the subject was employed in the Office of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, which is a Communist dominated and controlled organization in San Francisco.


Subject was employed by the Office of Price Administration in Washington, D. C. from September 14, 1942, until February 15, 1943, as a clerk-typist, CAF2, salary \$1440, legal department, Enforcement Division, In February, 1943, she was transferred in this same department to San Francisco, California, where she was employed as a junior-investigator until January of 1944.

She was employed by in Washington, D. C., from July, 1940 until December of 1940, The nature of this employment is not known.

During the latter part of 1940, the subject was also employed by the Royal Air Force Delegation, 1139 Connecticut Avenue, N Washington, D. C.

From September, 1939 to June of 1940, subject was a part owner of a restaurant on Bay Shore Drive, Miami, Florida. She was

employed in New York City from May, 1939 to September of 1939 by as a salesgirl at the World's Fair. She was employed in London, England June 1937 to January of 1939 by J. WALTER THOMPSON STRAND, London, England, an advertising agency.
The subject was reported to have written articles for the Washington Post, which were published weekly during the winter of 1940 and 1941 in Washington, D. C. These articles were syndicated by the Hearst Syndicate.
The above information concerning subject's past employment record prior to her employment by the OPA was obtained from the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service by Special Agent The above record was obtained by the Immigration and Naturalization Service from subject's application for Federal employment in Washington, D. C.
The results of an investigation conducted by the Immigration and Naturalization Service reflect that during the time subject was employed by the Office of Price Administration, the question arose as to her citizenship in whether or not she should continue to be employed by the OPA if she was an alien. The above investigation further revealed that the subject was paid from the so called "Alien Budget" and it was proper for her to be employed by the OPA.
EDUCATION
The application for Federal employment, made by the subject in Washington, D. C. and set out and reported in the investigation of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, reflects that the subject attended the Sorbonne, Paris, France, from 1933 to 1934 and received a diploma in December of 1934. The subject is reported to speak, read and understand French excellently, German fair and Spanish fair.
CRIMINAL RECORD
The records of the San Francisco Police Department were checked by Special Agent on September 12, 1944, with negative results.
CREDIT RECORD
The records of the Retailers Credit Association were checked by Special Agent and except for some background information concerning the subject which will be set out later in this report, no other information was available.

CITIZENSHIP STATUS

The information contained on the application for Federal employment which was reflected in the report of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at San Francisco reveals that the subject was born at Glos, England, on September 11, 1917. The petition for naturalization, No. 75206, of the subject, maintained by the Clerk of the United States District Court, reflects that the subject was born on September 11, 1917 at Morton, March, England. A certificate of arrival, dated March 1, 1943, and bearing No. 4-34289, reflects that JESSICA LUCY ROMILLY entered the port of New York, New York on March 2, 1939 aboard the SS Aurania.

The above mentioned patition for naturalization reflects that the subject was admitted to United States citizenship on January 3, 1944 in the United States District Court at San Francisco, California.

GENERAL

The subject resides with her husband, ROBERT E. TREUHAFT, whom she married on June 21, 1943, at Gueneville, California. Her husband was born in New York City on August 8, 1912. The subject has two children who also reside with her: AMN CONSTANCIA ROMILLY, born and NICKOLAS TITO TREUHAFT, Subject's husband is

employed as an attorney by the National War Labor Board.

The San Francisco Examiner, dated December 4, 1943, contains an article concerning the subject. This article states that "The Honorable JESSICA FREEMAN-MITFORD, whose sister was the one-time 'Nordic Goddess' of ADOLF HITLER, was discovered yesterday working as an investigator in the OPA Office in San Francisco. She is now Mrs. ROBERT TREUHAFT, wife of an employee in the Legal department of the OPA unit here. Formerly she was married to the late ESMOND ROMILLY, author-nephew of WINSTON CHURCHILL. She is the sister of Lady DIANA MOSLEY, wife of Sir OSWALD MOSLEY, British Fascist leader, and of UNITYAFREEMAN-MITFORD, who several years ago reportedly attempted suicide when RITLER's friendship for her cooled. She married TREUHAFT several months ago in Washington, shortly after ROMILLY had been killed in action while a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force. She married ROMILLY when he was eighteen and she was a year older. ROMILLY fought with the loyalists in Spain. For several months she was employed in the OPA Office in Washington, where it was reported she first became actively interested in the United Federal Workers Alliance, leftist labor group. She is said

to have continued that interest since joining the local OPA organization, an interest notable because of its contrast to the Fascist affiliation of her two sisters." The San Francisco Call Bulletin for December 4, 1943 reflects that the subject was asked about her feelings toward her sisters and her own political philosophy. According to this newspaper article, the subject "bit her lips and caustically announced, 'I don't think it's any business of the people of America or San Francisco what I think.'" This article stated that the OPA in San Francisco appeared surprised at the identity of the worker with the English accent in their midst." However, the office said that Mrs. TREUHAFT "had been cleared by the FBI."

UNION ACTIVITIES

advised Special Agent April 2, 1943 that the subject was quite active in a union which had been formed among the OPA employees in San Francisco, which union is named the Federal Workers of America and is affiliated with the CIO. This source stated that the subject, while not possibly termed an organizer for the Union, constantly urged non-members to join and took active part in the meetings. This source further stated that he had heard that the subject's transfer from Washington, D. C. to San Francisco was arranged by the CIO and he ventured the opinion that this might have been done so that she could assist in the organizational work. said that this union had been formed in the OPA only a short time prior to April, 1943 and had been causing the OPA officials considerable difficulty in that the members, if not Communists, are Communistically inclined and they make certain demands, loaf on the job and create dissension. According tol the Legal and Investigative Divisions of the OPA are most strongly affected by the union and by persons of Communist tendencies advised Special Agent on January 28, 1943, that he was of the opinion that the above mentioned union, Federal Workers of America, in the OPA offices had gone beyond the purposes of an ordinary union and was endeavoring to promote Communism. He had no substantiation of this, but explained that he had reached this conclusion from bits of conversation he had heard, the methods used by the union in recruiting new members and the attitude and office conduct of the leaders of the union.

advised Special Agent on March 7, 1944 that the subject was employed in the OPA Office in Sch Francisco up to December 15, 1943. She was extremely active in the United Federal Workers Alliance and recruited members for that union, as well as actively participating in its meetings. This source furnished a copy of a union bulletin issued by the War Agency Local 223, containing

information with reference to the subject. This bulletin is entitled, "Union Scores Double Victory." Under this heading are the lines, "We Keep Our Membership Chairman! OPA Keeps a Trained Investigator!" This bulletin then states:

"On July 29, 1943, Regional OPA had notice from National OPA to terminate all aliens not covered by OPA appropriation rules. Mrs. TREUHAFT is English, a citizen of one of the United Nations; she has applied for American citizenship; she is married to an American citizen; she is a trained investigator; SHE IS MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN FOR THE WAR AGENCIES LOCAL 223, UFWA, CIO. Mrs. TREUHAFT, an alien, was told she must be terminated.


