DETAILS: On 3/23/79, Mr. Legal Counsel, State Department, telephonically advised SA FEINO, that a representative of MIRC asked him to obtain from the FbI the code book for People's Temple communications. Mr. was advised that such books were considered evidence collected by this Eureau during the ongoing investigation of a criminal matter and that the HIRC was previously informed of this fact directly by the FbI. Mr. was further advised that due to the nature of the code book, they could not be released at this time. Mr. stated that he fully understood our position and acknowledged that the committee representative had not mentioned to him that the FbI had previously declined to release these documents.



Qc837 through Qc830 are codebooks containing names and phranes used in radio communications by numbers of the Peoples Temple (PT) in Guyana, both Jonestown and Georgetown, and the PT in the United States. Qc1888 (L-3-a-7) is a similar listing but was designed for use by the PT in Caracas, Venezuela and the PT in Guyana. (H)

These codes were updated and revised periodically to protect their security. It appears that Qc227 (E-4-b-1-aaaa) is an update of Qc229 (E-4-b-1-a) and was in use at least from March, 1978 through possibly June, 1978 at which time the codes appear to have been revised. This revision would be Qc228 (E-4-b-2, E-4-c-1 and 2) which was used from possibly July, 1978 up to Movember 11, 1978. At this time, Qc228 appears to have been updated by Qc230 (E-4-b-1-aaa). This was determined by an entry in Qc226 (E-4-a-5-t) dated Movember 11. "OK Mike by the way u will be sending me a picture of ur new dog." This coded phrase, according to Qc230, means "may code list," indicating that the new code list was being used.

There were times during radio breadcasts when the P7 radio operators would get their codes confused. One radio operator would be using an old code list and the other operator would be works from a new list. The overall alphabetimed listing of Qc227 through Qc330 and Qc1388 should facilitate the decipherment of any questioned segments of radio transmissions by the PT.  $\frac{1}{100}$



Mr. Keuch made a commitment that the FBI would furnish this information to the committee which consists of one allegation of kidnaping which had no basis in fact. The identity of the complainant in this matter will be withheld from the committee. (W)

The committee represented to those present at the meeting that the only individuals that they had desired to contact were Stanley Clayton and Odell Rhodes. Mr. Keuch made a commitment to the committee and the FBI that reasonable efforts would be undertaken to contact Clayton and Rhodes and advise them of the committee's interest in them. Permission of Clayton and Rhodes would be sought to furnish the committee with their locations.





- (3) Any data germane to shipments of cyanide and/or other toxic materials to Janestown, especially in the period shortly before November 18, 1978;
- (4) People's Temple ham radio code book found in Jonestown and provided to you by the Department of State;
- (5) Pre-tragedy knowledge and investigation of the People's Temple by the Department of Justice and Federal Bureau of Investigation;
- (6) Copy of the People's Temple Jonestown guest book;
- (7) Copy of all NBC films taken in Guyana; and





# COMMETMIST IN 1959'S

Document, Said to Be the Writing of Cultist, Says Religion Was

Means to Political Ends

STANDARD THE NEW YORK THOMAS

GEORGETOWN, Guyana, Dec. 17— Jim Jones, whose Prople's Temple settlement here espoused more socialism than religion, was a Communist from the early 1950's on, according to a rambling, disjointed personal history found among his effects and published by the Governmentowned newspaper here.

Carl Blackman, editor of The Chronicle, this nation's largest newspaper, said the document appeared to be legitimate, to be Mr. Jones's personal writing and thoughts, prepared in 1974.

The document implied throughout that Mr. Jones was always a Communist and that he used his religious connections only to further Communist ends and to

politicize congregations.

Interviews with members of the Prople's Temple who survived the Nov. 18 death ritual indicated that the group had not been formally religious for several years, even though it registered as a religion with the star of California and took advantage of the providers for religious arountations in Federal income tax laws. And they said they heard a great deal of "socialist rhetone."

#### Attachment to the Technique

Several survivors, like the former latter manager. Jim Bore suggested that Mr. Jones's attachment to religion was not to me substance bit to the technique. Mr. Jones, he said, had found evangelical speaking, music, faith healing and other tent meeting techniques useful in attracting and controlling the many working class members, particularly the aced whose Secial Security and Government support checks were an important re-

According to the document, Mr. Jones, while studying at the University of Indiana, "somewhere along in 1949-1950," became convinced there was a conspiracy in the United States to ostracize Communists.

"And if you had any Communist connections, your grandma or your cousin, or your trade union, you wouldn't get into this country (the United States). Immigration barriers were horrible. But Nazis kept coming in by the uniteen thousands. That is why I became very pro Jewish. The strongest on the Communist side

were Jews."

He recalled "I was in a coma when the Rosenbergs [Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, convicted of Invason in the sale of atomic secrets to the Soviet Union] were being executed. I was ready to die, infectious hepatitis." Mr. Jones said that he would have "marched till there were holes in my shees trying to petition" to save them and that he kept asking his wife, Marceline, "Are they dead yet?"

could have and them. Hell, you can have only so many revolutionary deaths," he wrote the me time after the Rosenburgs were executed, Mr. Jones said, "I quit crying. Don't cry any more. Rough being a Communist. Lot of persecutions would inake good stories but I don't know how to get them out, too painful.

The document continued: "I'd get picked up hitch-hiking, talking Communism — car would come to a screeching stop, and I'd be ordered out of the car, middle of nowhere. Happened not once

but dozens of times."

It said that talking about Communism was what put Mr. Jones in touch with a man he called "Martin," a Methodist superintendent, who put him into his first church.

"He said I want you to take a church. I said, you giving me a church. I don't believe anything. I'm a revolutionary... and he appointed me, a Communist, to a church, and I didn't even meet him through the party, I met him in a used car lot. This was in 1863," the document said.

#### Religious Trappings Abcent

At Jonestown, newsmen noticed that there were no religious placards or outwardly religious trappings in the community. There was a map of the Soviet Union; a sign over Mr. Jones's mother's grave read: "Lynette P. Jones, in commemoration of a true fighter for the just, who gave the ultimate, a son, so he could serve the people in the struggle for justice, for freedom from oppression and for the foundations of socialisms."

Two survivors both of whom asked during interviews that their names not be used fecause they leared retailation, strongly believe that, even if Mr. Jones did not have a clear ideological position, a right choose of militant Marxists surtounced him.

went to great lengths during the settlement's last hours to bequeath some 37 million to the Soviet Union. The money, in Panamanian and Venezuelan bank accounts, was placed in the names of several of the Temple's leaders.

The rambling memoir has little detail on Mr. Jones's understanding of Marxist socialist ideology, but it contains a rather superficial view of 29th Century Communist political history:

#### "I West With the Maos"

"But when [Mao Tse-tung, the late Chinese leader] turned against the Soviets, I had troubles with that period even though I idolized him for what he did in the long march, I thought that was tremendous; but I had real trouble. Because Mao was the lover of the Soviets, he loved Stalin [Joseph Stalin, former Premier of the Soviet Union]. I never would accept that Stalin was all that bad as he was portrayed."

The document added that when revisionists condemned Stalin "that's when I broke with the C.P. The American C.P. [Communist Party]. I broke all my connections and went with the Mans. Because of loyalty again, deep-seated loyal-

#### AN OPEN LETTER:

I was extremely shocked to read, in the <u>San Francisco Examiner</u> (March 8, 1979), an article by Tom Eastham, concerning your recent remarks before the George Washington Law Association. Someone — either you or Mr. Eastham, does not have the facts straight.

I quote, "The F.B.I. looked into only one complaint against the Peoples Temple before the Jonestown murder-suicides, director William Webster has revealed." My name is mentioned as being the person you "probably meant". The article goes on to say, "Agents interviewing the woman found she had no actual evidence -- only 'very good woman's intuition' -- which was not enough to open an investigation."

First of all, I would like to clarify the fact that NO F.B.I. agents interviewed me when I asked for help. Also, your alleged statements appear to be slapted to make the listener believe that no one, other than myself, registered complaints against the Peoples Temple prior to the Jonestown massacre. The fact is that I personally know of at least two other people, members of the Concerned Relatives, who did complain directly to the F.B.I., sometime ago. If their pleas were not given any attention -- why?


I have in my possession copies of two sworn affidavits, both from exmembers of the Peoples Temple, which spell out the abuses at Jonestown, including the mass suicide threats. Not only was all this information given wide newspaper coverage, last June, but also these affidavits, I believe, were sent to the State Department, in Washington D.C. With the lives of so many Americans threatened, was there no communication between the State Department and the F.B.I.? What assistance was offered, by any government agency, to Leo Ryan when he courageously attempted to free the people at Jonestown?

There are a multitude of unanswered questions arising from the tragedy of Jonestown. Those of us who lost our loved ones deserve and demand to know the entire truth about all that went before November 19, 1978. The public at large is also entitled to honest answers about the involvement, or lack of it, of local and federal government agencies and officials.

Jim Jones spoke to these persons enquiring from them why they wanted to leave, during such time about fifteen more person on the farm came up saying that they also wanted to leave. At that moment J m Jones sent someone for several thousand of dollars to send away those desirous of leaving; this was about 3.30p.m. and several persons boarded the truck to leave the farm; the Congressman was yet speaking to Jim Jones in the pavillia and attorney when suddenly a member of the People's Temple came up and probably attempted to stab the Tongressman as both were lying on the ground jostling as they were being separated the same time, The attack was pulled away and lead off, shortly after, the entire party that came with the Congressman left, and few of the farm remained at the pavillion with the attorneys whilst the majority want to their homes. At that moment Maria Hatsairs came to me whilst I was near the paillian and told me that there would be trouble as some of People's Temple members have gone after the Congressman and party. Hatsairs was one of the Secretaries to Jim Jones and she told me to go to her house and wait for her and I did so and while there Tim Carter a member of the People's Temple came with an empty suit case and handed it to someone who was also in the house and someone asked him to give a message to someone and after he left Haria Hatsairs came and filled the bag with money and and told me that there were letters also inside and she said to take the letters and mail them and the money to the Embassy. The did not mention which Embassy. I presumed it was the Soviet Union Embassy because there was taking at Jonestown about moving to the "cviet Union. At that moment she told to wait for Nike and Tin Carter who will be accompanying me with the money. She then gave a .30 revolver and five rounds of amountaions and another to Mike Carter with five rounds also. Mike, T'm and I then left, this was about 4.30p.m. - 5.00p.m. and we intent heading for Fort Krituma but found the money bag too congested for us to fetch and nove quickly so we hid some of the money by the chicken pen and in the plantain fields and we took small amounts which we could have walked with and these consisted of Guyana and American dollars. As it was nightfall we were passing the vicinity of Kaituma Police Station when the Police stopped us and we told them what had happened and they took the money. arms and ammunitions from us and we stayed at a cassava mill, which was near the Police Station. The Crime Chief Mr. Roberts came Sunday might to Maituma and I told him of all the incidents in general and I subsequently returned to Jonestown incompany with the Felice where I idenfified dead bodies at the farm and took the Police where the money was burild. I donot know how much money was buried but it was made up of American and Guyanese orrencies. Refore Tim and Mike Corter and I left with the money there was no killing of humanbeings taking place; the only thing I heard whilst we were leaving was the sound of a round being fired off. Sgd. California driver's license which was obtained from California authorities to assist in the identification process. Both identifications were then verified by comparing these prints with a fingerprint card obtained from the Guyanese Government of Ann Moore which was taken at the time she entered Guyana. (u)

The identification of Carolyn Layton (Moore) was made by comparing fingerprints taken from her body at Dover Air Force Base with an applicant fingerprint card located for her through a search of the files of the California Bureau of Identification and Investigation. She was fingerprinted as required by state law when she applied for a position with the State Board of Education. This was verified through a comparison of both sets of prints with the thumb print located on her California driver's license and a Guyanese fingerprint card of fingerprints of Carolyn Layton taken at the time she entered the country of Guyana [6]

For information of San Francisco, the Bureau is in receipt of autopsy reports on other victims, however, no copies are being provided to the next of kin of those victims as none was requested except for Mr. Steven Katsaris, who requested a copy of such a report on his daughter, Maria Katsaris.

Mr. Katsaris' request was handled by direct correspondence with him. (U)
