On 12-14-59 he was CENSURED and PLACED ON PROBATION in view of the Inspection of the Kansas City Office. The Bureau was most displeased with the serious substantive errors detected, particularly the three instances of failure to promptly confirm in writing oral discussion with a U. S. Attorney. As Special Agent in Charge he shared in the responsibility for these delinquencies. The various functions of the office were rated as follows: Physical Condition and Maintenance, Very Good; Investigative Operations, Fair; Administrative Operations, Very Good; Personnel Matters, Very Good; and Contacts, Very Good.

In a letter to the Director, dated 12-21-59, he expressed his concern over the fact that the Bureau had to take administrative action against him with regard to substantive errors detected during the inspection. He assured the Director that he would take positive steps and check personally to preclude such weaknesses in the future.

By letter dated 3-3-60 he was COMMENDED and, through him, the personnel in the Kansas City Office who were responsible for the fact that his office exceeded its February, 1960, quota of clerical employees who entered on duty at the Seat of Government.

His daily average overtime for the past three months was approximately 4 hours 4 minutes.

Statistical accomplishments of the Kansas City Office for the first 8 months of fiscal year 1960 as compared with the same period of the previous fiscal year reflect a decrease in Convictions from 246 to 231 or a minus 6%; a decrease in Fines, Savings and Recoveries from \$5,688,666 to \$840,508 or a minus 85%; an increase in Fugitives Apprehended from 150 to 182 or a plus 21% and a decrease in Autos Recovered from 468 to 447 or a minus 4%.

The Kansas City Office is not presently scheduled for an Inspection.

RECOMMENDATION: That SAC Felt be continued on probation for an additional 60-day period. *3681*

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

Today I saw Special Agent in Charge W. Mark Felt of the Kansas City Field Division, who has been in Washington attending the Criminal In-Service School. Mr. Felt makes an excellent personal appearance and seems to be interested in his assignment.

I called to Mr. Felt's attention the fact that he was on probation as a result of the inspection of the Kansas City Office last November and I trusted that by this time the conditions which were observed at that time had been corrected.

I also called attention to the fact he had a number of classes of cases exceeding 10% in delinquency and this should be corrected.

I called Mr. Felt's attention to the fact that I noted the Kansas City Office for the first ten months of the current fiscal year when compared with a similar period of the previous fiscal year was down 10% in convictions, 83% in fines, savings, and recoveries, and 6% in automobiles recovered, and I hoped before the end of the fiscal year this downward trend in these items of accomplishments could be corrected.

I called his attention to the fact that it had been necessary during the last six months to address eleven letters of censure to the personnel of the Kansas City Office and that all of these matters dealt with elemental delinquency for if each person had performed his individual responsibility, it would not have been necessary to write these letters of censure.

I also discussed with Mr. Felt the matter of Agents on limited duty and outlined to him my views. I stated I noted a number of Agents in some of the offices of the service, who were on limited duty, were putting in but a little over the required one hour and twelve minutes in order to obtain fringe benefits, whereas the over-all average for the field for March was two hours and thirty-five minutes. I stated I thought, therefore, it was unfair to the

other Agents in the office to not have an equitable sharing of all overtime if the Agents were all to draw fringe benefits. I told him that if a man was unable to perform the average overtime being performed by the office, such Agent should not be assigned any work that would require overtime so that he could get the fringe benefits by performing the minimum requirement of one hour and twelve minutes.

I also called his attention to the fact that I noted there were twenty unsolved violations of the Federal Bank Robbery Statute in the Kansas City Field Division and prompt attention should be given to these cases.

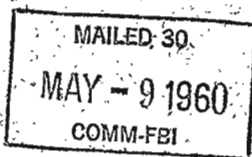

Two tall and slender young men will walk out of St. Joseph's federal building tomorrow on business that may take them into one or more of 20 counties in Northwest Missouri and Northeast Kansas. The casual passerby will not realize that each of these men carries a gun, and each has papers identifying him as a member of one of the most famous organizations in the world.

For these two men are the St. Joseph resident agents of the federal bureau of investigation.

The efficiency and integrity of the FBI depends on each of these men as they do on each of the 6,000 agents who make up the law enforcement team of the United States department of justice.

Work With Officers

Roy L. Humphreys Jr., 38, and Harold A. Butz Jr., 30, are the FBI's special agents in the Midland Empire. They are virtually unknown to most of the residents in their area and all agents prefer it that way. But they are familiar and respected figures in the offices of state and local law enforcement agencies in and around St. Joseph.

Police, sheriffs, prosecutors, and the state highway patrol co-operate very well with Humphreys and Butz, primarily because the FBI co-operates so well with the local officers—and co-operation is an important factor in good law enforcement.

"Free exchange of all possible information between law enforcement agencies at all levels is one of the keys to the solution to the criminal problem," says Mr. Humphreys.

That policy of co-operation is stressed on the national level where the FBI offers the services of its identification division, its laboratory, and its training school. The bureau offers these services free and in its offer of experts to testify in state or district courts also, the cost is borne by the bureau.

Wide Jurisdiction

One of the duties of Agents Humphreys and Butz is to encourage the use of the Bureau's co-operative services. But their work is primarily investigative, and they have 60 to 80 investigations pending here at any one time.

Specifically, their job is collecting evidence in cases in which the United States is or may be "a party of interest," and other duties imposed on them by law. They have jurisdiction over more than 150 types of crimes ranging from administrative investigations to violations of the white slave traffic act. They may even be requested by the department of the interior to take jurisdiction in a matter involving the migratory bird act.

The FBI office here is one of 12 resident agencies in the Kansas City division which covers the west district of Missouri and all of Kansas. Special Agent-in-Charge W. Mark Felt is head of the division office at Kansas City, one of 53 field offices in the 50 states and Puerto Rico.

Theoretically, special agents are on a 40-hour week, but Agent Humphreys says the average overtime is 2½ hours a day.

Always Available

"We must be available any time of the day or night," says Mr. Humphreys, "and the Kansas City office must know where we are. As we are out of the office here so much of the time a caller who cannot reach us at our St. Joseph office, AD 2-1800, should call, in an emergency, the Kansas City office, Baltimore 1-6100, because it is staffed 24 hours every day."

Many outsiders would not accept the bureau discipline; always being "on call," never using the bureau car for personal use, a transfer to any state or United States possession on short notice.

But the FBI agent accepts such discipline because he realizes it helps maintain the bureau's high reputation. FBI Director J. Edgar

Hoover has said that the FBI agent must be a man of high integrity, not only actually but ostensibly.

Advantages Cited

"And there are many advantages," say Agents Humphreys and Butz. "The pay is good, very good really. An agent starts at \$6,505 a year and most agents earn an overtime allowance. There are several fine insurance programs and an excellent retirement plan after reaching the age of 50 with at least 20 years of service."

So the agents are grateful for the advantages and accept the discipline philosophically. When they run to catch a bus for home, leaving the bureau cars at the office, they have the satisfaction of knowing some "indignant taxpayer" cannot complain.

Though there is no "typical" FBI agent, Roy Humphreys and Hal Butz are a good example. They have a total of seven children, are active in civic organizations, and are regular members of their churches.

And they have understanding wives!

That understanding is necessary because all of the work of the federal bureau of investigation is confidential. Some of the bureau's case histories may be revealed after the case is closed, but the FBI doesn't close a case until it is completely solved, sometimes a matter of years.

Share Their Pride

Mildred Humphreys and Nancy Butz may miss sharing in their husbands' work, but they share in their pride in being part of the highly respected organization that is the federal bureau of investigation.

Roy Humphreys is senior resident agent by virtue of having been here first. He was born in Fargo, N. D., 38 years ago. When he got out of college in 1943 he went into the infantry and saw combat as a 2d lieutenant in Italy. Roy became an insurance investigator after World War II but was recalled to active duty during the Korean struggle and was again discharged, after 17 months in Alaska, as a Captain.

In seeking a new career for himself, Roy turned to government service and was thrilled to learn he qualified for the FBI. He entered the bureau in August of 1952 and was assigned to Detroit and Kansas City before coming to St. Joseph in January of 1954. Richard Martin, now an attorney

here, was senior resident agent in St. Joseph until he resigned.

College Courtship

Roy and Mildred Humphreys were married in 1943 after a college courtship. They have five children, Roy, 13; Guy, nine; Ellen, six; Billy, four, and Dan, two. Three of the youngsters are students at Eugene Field School where their mother, a former home economist, is president of the P. T. A.

Roy played semipro baseball and was an avid hunter before he entered the service. Now he makes gardening his special hobby and races with the neighbors to see whose vegetables come up first. He also has been active in the Optimist Club's 'boys' program and in the Boy Scouts. He is managing a Little League Baseball team in his neighborhood. The family attends the Ashland Avenue Methodist Church and Roy serves on the church board.

The Humphreys family is very happy in St. Joseph and Roy has put it at the top of his "list of preference." That means that although agents are subject to transfer at any time, "for the good of the bureau," that St. Joseph is his first choice of assignments.

Former Merchant Mariner

The younger member of the two-man FBI team here is Harold Butz, who is a former merchant marine engineer. Hal is a native of Newark, N. J., though it sounds like "Nerk" in his Eastern accent.

Hal is a graduate of the United States Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, N. Y. He served two years in the navy during the Korean War and was discharged a lieutenant j.g.

Hal had an uncle with the FBI, but it was working on navy court martials that interested the young officer in the bureau. He was attending Georgetown University School of Law when he learned he was eligible for the FBI, and entered the bureau in March, 1955.

As do all prospective agents, Hal went through the 16 weeks of extensive training at Washington, D. C., and the FBI Academy at Quantico, Va. The basic course is the equivalent of one and one-half years of college but takes only one-fourth of the time.

Came Here in 1956

Special Agent Butz was assigned first to Knoxville, Tenn., then to Kansas City, and came to St. Joseph in February of 1956. Although his wife, Nancy, also is an Easterner, from Boston, Hal had to come to Missouri to meet her. Nancy was an airline stewardess and they were married after Hal came to St. Joseph.

Nancy and Hal have two children, Richard, two, and Robert, one. Hal has umpired for Little League baseball and bowled on the championship team of his league. His wife works in a preschool group, the Young Matrons, and other organizations. They attend St. Joseph's Cathedral and belong to the Mr. and Mrs. Club there.

Outside of their work, the special agents live quiet, pleasant lives with their families and friends. They appear to be no different from the fellow next door, but all are aware that excitement or even danger may be as near as the telephone.

SAC Felt was rated Satisfactory on the annual performance rating submitted 3-31-60.

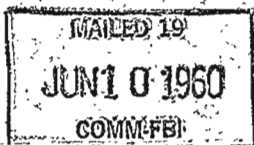

The Kansas City Office is presently scheduled to have an inspection to begin about 10/1/60. It is noted that the accomplishments of the Kansas City Office for the fiscal year 1960 were down 8% in Convictions; down 13% in Fines, Savings and Recoveries; up 6% in Fugitives Apprehended and 3% in Autos Recovered. For the first two months for fiscal year 1961 the Kansas City Office is down 25% in Convictions; down 28% in Fines, Savings and Recoveries; down 22% in Fugitives Apprehended and down 1% in Autos Recovered.

INSPECTOR E. C. WILLIAMS:

SAC Felt makes an excellent personal appearance. He possesses a very good personality and above-average intelligence. He is energetic, has an enthusiastic attitude toward his assignment, and commands the respect of his subordinates. Felt is an excellent contact man and speaker. He is well-received and respected in the Division. He displays a firm grasp of the responsibilities of an SAC and is experienced as an administrator. It is believed that SAC Felt has definite potential for further administrative advancement.

On 12/14/59, Felt was censured and placed on probation for substantive errors detected in his office during the last inspection, failure to promptly confirm in writing oral discussions with U. S. Attorneys. Felt agreed with the Inspector that he should have made more frequent spot checks to insure this rule was being followed in all instances, and assured he would certainly do so henceforth. The various functions of the office were rated as follows: Physical Condition and Maintenance, VERY GOOD; Investigative Operations, FAIR; Administrative Operations, VERY GOOD; Personnel Matters, VERY GOOD; and Contacts, VERY GOOD.

During current inspection two substantive errors were found neither chargeable to SAC Felt. There was no instance found of a delay in confirming discussions with US. Attorney. Survey revealed Felt has fully tightened this operation and has benefited materially by the last inspection.

By memorandum 3/22/60, Felt was continued on probation to be reconsidered in 60 days. By memorandum 9/15/60, consideration of Felt for removal from probation was deferred pending completion of the current inspection, and receipt of the Inspector's recommendations.

The Director saw SAC Felt on 5/6/60, during the latter's attendance at Criminal In-Service School. Director commented he trusted that by this time the conditions observed in the last in-

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pection, which resulted in Felt's being on probation, had been corrected. He called to Felt's attention and expressed the need to correct delinquency in a number of classifications; downward trend in statistical accomplishments; elemental derelictions necessitating eleven censures of Kansas City Office personnel during preceding six months; and necessity for giving prompt attention to unsolved violations of the Federal Bank Robbery Statute in that Office.

SAC Felt and Kansas City Office were commended 12/9/59 for exceptional work done in connection with the Crimdel Program; and he was commended 6/15/60 for excellent work done in arranging a series of feature articles on the FBI appearing in the "St. Joseph News-Press and Gazette."

Administrative action with regard to other personnel handled separately.

Results of inspection and recommendation that SAC Felt be removed from probation handled separately in connection with the inspection summary and separate letter to SAC Felt .

Dear Mr. Felt:

I have reviewed the results of the recent inspection of the Kansas City Office, and, based on the findings of the Inspector, the various phases of the operation of your office are being rated as follows: Physical Condition and Maintenance, Administrative Operations, Personnel Matters and Contacts - Very Good; Investigative Operations - Good.

The space occupied by your office in Kansas City and in the various resident agencies was found to be maintained very satisfactorily. All space was found to be secure; however, you should continue to be alert to the situation of the public corridor adjacent to the main agents' room to preclude eavesdropping, particularly during conferences. Of the automobiles inspected, none were found to have delinquencies affecting safety. I was pleased to find your over-all operating costs of automobiles are below the field averages. Inasmuch as many of these costs are controllable I expect you to afford constant attention to insure minimum expenses. The various house-keeping delinquencies pointed out to you by the Inspector should be resolved at the earliest possible date. In the three resident agencies without space you should be alert for any space which can be obtained on a cost-free basis.

You apparently recognize the importance of prompt investigation as your over-all delinquency has been below the field average for the past six months and delinquency in individual classifications is in line with the over-all office delinquency. However, I am concerned that you were down for the fiscal year of 1960 eight per cent in convictions and thirteen per cent in fines, savings and recoveries. I note with growing concern that for the first three months of the current fiscal year you are down in all categories except automobiles recovered. This is an undesirable trend because Kansas City is an important statistics-producing office. You should continue emphasis on major statistics-producing classifications to improve the accomplishment potential and improve the over-all accomplishment picture of the Kansas City Division.

Efforts with regard to bank robbery violations must be intensified to develop more informant coverage and to identify local suspects. Since the last inspection you have solved only three of the fifteen bank robbery violations reported to you.

Substantive errors found during the inspection involved delayed investigation and setting out the identity of a confidential source in the details of a report. Although the incidence of substantive error was low, I feel there can be a tightening of supervisory procedures looking towards a complete elimination of substantive error. You should give this your personal attention and see that all employees are alerted. Your adherence to deadlines is encouraging and should be continued.

The number of criminal informants has increased since the last inspection and the information being obtained under this program in your office is considered very good. Although you have a substantial number of potential criminal informants, which number has dropped since last inspection, you should take steps to insure there is an adequate reservoir from which a working criminal informant program can be continually supported. Equally important is informant coverage of security matters. As you were instructed by the Inspector, your

Informant coverage of the Nation of Islam is considered weak and must be improved. There is every indication the activities of this militant group are increasing and I cannot stress too strongly the importance of adequate informant coverage in this area.

I was pleased with the downward trend of form errors from last inspection and expect you and your supervisory staff will continue to afford close and effective supervision to keep such errors at a minimum. The incidence of error in Number 3 (Locator) Cards and daily reports was not high, but I cannot impress upon you too strongly the importance of complete accuracy in such work records as our registers. I am concerned that the Inspector found a trend on the part of some agents to delay submission of daily reports and expect you will follow the Inspector's instructions to reverse this trend. The Chief Clerk's Office was found to be operating efficiently and stenographic production was above the field average. These are important facets of our operation and should continually receive your close personal attention. Their importance should be regularly pointed up by you and your supervisory staff to other employees in the office.

I was not at all pleased with the increased costs reported by you in communications, per diem and travel. I must insist that complete economy be practiced and positive results be shown in all categories. You have been behind in your quota to recruit clerical applicants for employment at Seat of Government. This should receive your personal attention looking towards improvement. I also want to reiterate the Inspector's instructions stressing the importance of recommending outstanding applicants.

All personnel passed required examinations and I was further pleased to note the voluntary overtime for the period, June - August, 1960, indicates the work load is being equitably distributed among agent personnel. Time in the office during the same period was noted to be decreasing. I expect this trend to continue. Your production in cases closed per agent is above average and presents a favorable

picture. You should follow the progress of the one agent on limited duty for prompt return to full duty status as soon as medically qualified. I also expect you will personally follow the progress of the one agent in your office who is overweight.



In view of the findings of the Inspector I am pleased to advise you are being removed from probation.

Substantive error incidence below field average. 3 Bank Robbery Statute violations solved of 15 reported since last inspection. SAC instructed to intensify efforts. Criminal Informant Program very good. Missed applicant and fugitive deadlines below field average. Civil Rights matters handled satisfactorily. 8 Communist Party members; all identified. SAC instructed to increase informant coverage of Nation of Islam. 17 Security Index subjects in area. No Klan, hate groups, current "sit-ins" or racial violence noted. Security Informant Program rated good.

Administrative Operations - Very Good. Supervisory distribution of case load equitable. Agent case load and production and stenographic production above field average. SAC instructed to continue decrease in time in office - 23.22% in August, down from 25.37% in July. Chief Clerk's Office work current and efficient. SAC instructed to step up file consolidations project. Index cards misfiled below field average. Incidence of error low in Daily Reports and #3 (Locator) Cards. SAC instructed to reverse trend noted in delayed Daily Report submissions. Communications, per diem and travel costs up due to transfers, specials, subpoenas and cost of recently installed automatic dial system. Economy in all categories stressed with SAC.

Personnel Matters - Very Good. All available personnel passed required examinations. With 3 clerical replacements being requested, personnel considered adequate but not excessive. Need for improvement in clerical

applicant recruiting and importance of outstanding applicants emphasized to SAC. Overtime above field average, essential and equitable. One agent on limited duty from colectomy; 1 agent overweight; making satisfactory progress. SAC and 1 agent on probation. Morale high.

Contacts - Very Good. SAC Felt knows 17 SAC Contacts of which he developed 13. Contacts well-distributed. Press relations generally favorable; public relations very good. Police relations and training effective, very favorable publicity and correspondence. 37 active National Academy graduates in area; SAC participates in activities. Speech program effective. Officials contacted expressed high regard for Director, Bureau, SAC and office.

RECOMMENDATIONS: 1. SAC W. Mark Felt, GS-16 @ \$15,515, nonveteran, on probation. SAC Felt at Kansas City since 3/5/58. He makes an excellent, impressive appearance, is an excellent speaker and a tireless worker, exhibiting loyalty and enthusiasm. He has respect of police and other public officials. Employees indicate full respect for his decisions and guidance. Placed on probation last inspection for errors involving failure to promptly confirm in writing prosecutive discussions with U.S. Attorneys. Felt has installed strong administrative procedures to correct and preclude possibility of recurrence. No instance of such delay found in operations since last inspection. Inspector feels he is capable of assuming additional responsibilities. It is recommended Felt (1) continue as SAC; (2) be removed from probation. If approved, attached letter will so advise him and summarize inspection findings.

2. ASAC Herbert E. Hoxie, GS-14 @ \$12,210, veteran, not on probation. ASAC at Kansas City since 5/23/60. First office as ASAC. Hoxie makes an excellent appearance, is intelligent and personable. He has an excellent knowledge of Bureau rules and regulations. In Kansas City, Hoxie is gaining maturing experience and appears to be taking advantage of opportunity to learn practical application of rules to the varying situations and the important handling of contacts with police and other officials at all levels. He is an intense, hard worker, completely loyal and dedicated to learning all facets of his responsibilities as an ASAC. There were 2 substantive errors in cases under his supervision; he was not personally culpable in either. No administrative action recommended as to Hoxie. SAC, Kansas City believes Hoxie can assume duties of ASAC in larger office or SAC duties in a smaller office, with additional experience. Inspector agrees Hoxie has excellent administrative potential but recommends he be afforded sufficient experience in his present assignment and in another office of smaller or equal size to completely round out his training. Continue as ASAC.

DETAILS

PHYSICAL CONDITION AND MAINTENANCE VERY GOOD

Office conveniently located in downtown Federal Building, adequate, attractive, secure and well-organized. Over-all maintenance of space in headquarters and 9 resident agencies (RAs) very good. Bureau approved construction of new sound-proof communications room which is adjacent to reception room and will eliminate possible security problem. SAC again cautioned on security with regard to public corridor adjacent to main agents room - particularly during conferences instructed to preclude eavesdropping potential. Minor housekeeping delinquencies corrected or ordered corrected. 32 of 59 cars inspected; no delinquencies affecting safety. Over-all cost per mile to operate automobiles below field average. 3 one-man RAs in Kansas do not have space. SAC instructed to be alert for suitable space if available on no-cost basis.

INVESTIGATIVE OPERATIONS GOOD

As of 9-30-60, case load was 1319 (1718 active; 101 inactive). Delinquency 6.3% (field average 6.8%), well below field average for previous 6 months. No delinquency above 12% in any major category. Statistical accomplishments for fiscal year 1960, compared with 1959, down 8% in convictions; down 13% in fines, savings and recoveries; up 6% in fugitives apprehended; and up 3% in automobiles recovered. First 3 months fiscal 1961, compared with like period in 1960, show office is down 13% in convictions, down 31% in fines, savings and recoveries; down 5% in fugitives apprehended; and up 33% in automobiles recovered. SAC instructed to increase accomplishments. Inspector's surveys indicate increased emphasis on major statistics-producing classifications and office potential increasing. 2 substantive errors detected in 1548 pending and closed files reviewed, for 0.13% (field average 0.34%). Errors involved delayed investigation and disclosing identity of confidential source in report. (Administrative action as to all employees handled separately.)

Since last inspection, 11-10-59, 15 violations of Bank Robbery (BR) statutes reported, 1 of 3 robbery cases and 2 of 12 burglary and larceny cases solved. SAC aware of need for particular attention re these violations, was instructed to increase informants and identification of local burglars as suspects in burglary and larceny cases. Suggestions made and SAC instructed to continue to develop statistical potential. Criminal informants (CIs) up from 67 to 68 since last inspection. Potential criminal informants (PCIs) down from 214 to 205. 14 CI or PCI cases closed by Inspector during inspection. Quality of information being obtained is very good. 32% CI turnover indicates emphasis placed on high potential. Agent participation and coverage very good. Over-all CI Program rated very good.

Applicant deadlines missed 4.00% (field average 4.88%); fugitive deadlines missed 2.22% (field average 5.31%). Necessity of meeting all deadlines stressed. 1 Top Hoodlum under investigation, very good informant coverage; airtel summary submitted promptly. Civil Rights matters handled satisfactorily; 30 handled since 11/25/59, 20 as origin; 1 deadline missed.

Communist Party (CP) has 8 members; all identified; covered by 1 excellent and 2 very good informants, [redacted] National of Islam (NOI) ^{b7D} membership in area estimated at 30-35; meeting attendance as high as 50. Coverage only by 2 sources is weak. SAC instructed to immediately increase NOI coverage and is personally following. There are 17 subjects on office Security Index and 1 key figure in area. No known Klan or "hate-type" organizations, nor current bombing suspects; and no demonstrations, at present. Security Informants (3) same as last inspection; 3 current confidential sources developed since then. Security Informant Program rated good.

ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS VERY GOOD

SAC, ASAC and 2 full-time supervisors comprise staff. Supervisory distribution of case load is equitable. Inspector's survey of RAs indicates adequate staff and assignments. Current addition of investigative clerk to Jefferson City RA to handle high volume of record checks cases makes staff adequate. Cases high in Salina Resident Agency. SAC instructed to watch and make any necessary territorial adjustments. Office average case load per agent for June, July and August, 1960, is 23.33 (field average 17.76). Average of cases closed per agent for June, July and August, 1960, is 12.2 (field average 10.03). Office average time in office for June, July and August, 1960, is 23.71, excluding supervisors in June; with decrease from 25.37% in July to 23.22% in August. SAC instructed to continue trend. Form errors 3.68%, showed decrease from 4.35% last inspection (field average 6.69%). Stenographic production average 3.59 (field average 3.39). Percentage of pages retyped 2.79% (field average 2.78%, group III offices 1.57%). No stenographic delinquency.

Chief Clerk's Office (CCO) work current and efficient; instructed to step up project work estimated at 30 days for file consolidation. 11 index cards misfiled of 3100 checked, for 0.32% (field average 0.43%). Survey of 1233 Daily Reports and 2218 #3 (Locator) Cards shows incidence of Agent error at 1.7% and 3.2% respectively, involving minor arithmetical errors in overtime and time in office computations and arrival or departure times. Agents' performance and fringe benefits law requirements not affected. Trend noted in delayed Daily Report submissions. Necessity for reversal of trend and complete accuracy in registers emphasized strongly to SAC.

Automatic dial phone and switchboard system, installed in May, 1960, increases efficiency. Expenditures for communications, travel and per diem were over total base figures for first 8 months of 1960, due to transfers, inspection assignments, specials, subpoenas, and increased monthly cost of automatic switchboard. Economy in all categories stressed with SAC.

PERSONNEL MATTERS VERY GOOD

Required examinations passed by all available personnel. Clerk-agent ratio of 52.5% as of 9/23/60 compares favorably with 60% field average. All available on unannounced availability checks. Of 3 agents overweight 7/28/60, 2 now in desirable limits, 1 agent overweight 9 pounds and making satisfactory progress under medical guidance. Bureau cognizant and SAC following closely. 1 agent on limited duty from colectomy; full duty and general assignment expected in near future. All other personnel available for general or special assignment. SAC requesting 2 clerical and 1 stenographer replacements. With clerical replacements, Inspector rates personnel adequate but not excessive. Office exceeded clerical applicant quota once, equaled once and failed to meet it 10 times last 12 months. Agent recruitments are above average. Importance of recruiting and need for outstanding Special Agent applicants stressed to SAC. Eligibility list satisfactory.

Office average daily overtime for 3-month rating period 3' 02", above field average each month, essential, irregular and equitable. 2 agents recommended for promotion. SAC and 1 agent on probation. Morale high.

CONTACTS VERY GOOD

SAC Contacts increased from 16 to 17 since last inspection, all acquainted with SAC. 13 of 17 developed by SAC Felt; well distributed geographically and as to available services. SAC developing others in banking and finance fields. Press relations favorable and public relations very good, with effective results, including excellent relations with important Kansas City news media. Speech Program effective. 144 made during 1959. Through August, 1960, 41 by SAC; 21 by ASAC Dissly; and 4 by current ASAC Hoxie. SAC instructed to give ASAC Hoxie additional assignments to fully develop him in this regard. Police training program effective; receives considerable favorable publicity and correspondence. Liaison program effective. Police relations very good. 37 active National Academy graduates in area. SAC active in law enforcement activities. Officials contacted during inspection expressed high regard for Director, Bureau, SAC and office.

COMMENDATION MATTER

On October 7, 1960, Kansas City received information from the Los Angeles Office indicating that subject was receiving mail at [redacted] Kansas City, Kansas, under the name of [redacted]. Los Angeles advised that subject was probably accompanied by [redacted]

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[redacted] and [redacted]. Subject and [redacted] were described as armed and dangerous. Subject was believed to be armed with a shotgun, magnum revolver, and a .33 caliber Detective Special which he conceals in his belt by his spine. Investigation determined subject had served [redacted] years of a [redacted]-year sentence in the U. S. Penitentiary for [redacted] and stated he would resist arrest.

Investigation at Kansas City determined subject and [redacted] were [redacted] [redacted] Kansas City, Kansas, and that subject resided with [redacted] [redacted], when not working, was believed to sleep on a cot in the rear of [redacted].

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Surveillance of [redacted] reflected customers coming and going continuously, many of whom were of teenage. As the Los Angeles investigation reflected subject was fanatical, it was necessary to take extreme caution in planning this apprehension to prevent innocent persons, as well as apprehending Agents and officers, from being harmed. It was planned so that it could be executed with split-second timing at such time as the fewest number of persons were in [redacted]. In addition to the apprehension of the fugitive, it was necessary to have personnel ready to proceed

Precautions were taken by surveillance to insure that [] and [] were not in the area and could not proceed to the scene of the apprehension. All entrances and exits to [] and the apartment space above it were guarded to prevent persons from going in or coming out.

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The actual apprehension was effected in the early morning hours of [], 1960 by FBI Agents and local officers. Agents were seated in a booth in [] prior to the apprehension, and another Agent and a local officer were seated at [] counter. When the signal was given, subject was called to the booth by an Agent and was thereby apprehended from the rear by the Agent and local officer who had been seated at the counter. Immediately other personnel took the necessary action according to plan. All participants acted swiftly and expertly, each performing his prescribed assignments smoothly and effectively. Once the apprehension plan was put into effect, subject was apprehended. [] was located and taken into local custody, and [] were cared for within a matter of seconds.

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Thorough search of the premises by Agents disclosed the subject had two fully-loaded pistols in various hiding places around [], which, it may be assumed, subject would have used had he had the opportunity.

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This apprehension was made without incident under the on-the-scene supervision of SAC W. MARK FELT. ASAC HERBERT E. HORN and SA's RICHARD E. AGE, LEO V. EWING, [], ROBERT E. KENT, and [] participated in making this apprehension.

Expert Tells How Reds Work.

IF the Communists force the collapse of the economy of this country, then all the free nations of the world will collapse like a deck of cards," William C. Sullivan, chief inspector for the Federal Bureau of Investigation, told about 300 persons attending a Project Survival forum at the Olathe Naval Air station yesterday.

The 2-day moral-leadership forum started yesterday morning and will end tonight following a dinner at the air station.

An Expert on Communism.

Sullivan, who heads the FBI's special section on communism and espionage, was introduced by W. Mark Felt, special agent in charge of the FBI in Kansas City.

The Communist mode of operation is to lie, infiltrate, then seize power at the proper time, Sullivan told the group.

Sullivan said the Communist party has been operating in the United States since 1919. "There are four phases with which the Communists operate in this country: the open party, the underground, intelligence and espionage," he said.

"You can get a good look at communism at work by observing what is taking place

today off the coast of Florida," Sullivan said.

The Communists hope to organize this country along the lines of the Soviet government, eliminating political parties, social and fraternal groups and establishing a complete dictatorship, the group was told.

Into Minority Groups.

Sullivan said minority groups of students, organized labor and social groups have been infiltrated in the United States.

Dr. W. J. McKeefery, jr., vice-president of Washburn University in Topeka spoke on "Our American Heritage."

Dr. McKeefery said the War between the States tested the cement between the people of this young nation, but the nation held together.

"We must glory in our past, but we must also look at our faults," McKeefery said. "We must separate our heritage which is merely good from that which is merely old," he said.

"Part of the world is free, part of it is slave and part of

it is undecided," McKeefery said. "Will we band together to fight the dangers of the nuclear age, or will we merely look behind, do nothing, and be swallowed up as the empires of old?"

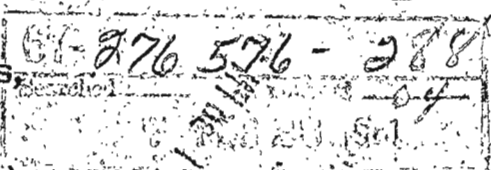

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

On April 10, 1961, I saw Special Agent in Charge W. Mark Felt of the Kansas City Field Division.

I called Mr. Felt's attention to the fact I noted he had a substantial number of classes of cases in excess of 8% in delinquency and this was undesirable and should be immediately corrected.

I commented upon the fact I noted for the first nine months of the current fiscal year when compared with a similar period of the previous fiscal year, his office was down 5% in fines, savings, and recoveries and he should immediately look into this situation to bring about an improvement.

I discussed with Mr. Felt the fact that I noted the Agents in the Kansas City Office were spending 27.92% of their time in the office, which is grossly excessive and this figure should be reduced.

I stressed to Mr. Felt the necessity for developing quality informants, both in the security and criminal fields and in connection with the latter, the necessity for intensifying intelligence coverage of the activities of racketeers and hoodlums.

I outlined to Mr. Felt my views concerning overtime and Agents on limited duty and advised him I did not feel that fringe benefits should be paid to Agents who were not able to share the average overtime of the entire office unless such Agent had just recently returned from an illness which necessitated a few months for him to regain his complete strength or if he was one of the older Agents in his seventies who had given faithful service to the Bureau for many years.

I called Mr. Felt's attention to the fact that I noted there were 18 violations of the Federal Bank Robbery Statute which were unsolved and this is most undesirable and he should bear down on these to bring about an improvement.

Physical Condition and Maintenance - Very Good. Office centrally located. Space well kept, but inadequate. Office aware and to secure more space when new Federal Building constructed. Minor housekeeping delinquencies ordered corrected. No auto delinquencies affecting safety. Cost of auto repair and operation per mile below field average.

Investigative Operations - Good. Convictions up 7%; fugitives up 5%; autos up 3%; fines, savings and recoveries down 7%. Missed applicant deadlines below field average. Missed investigative deadlines in fugitive cases above field average and missed reporting deadlines below field average. White Slave Traffic Act convictions improved over last inspection. 8 of 16 bank robberies and 3 of 24 bank burglaries solved. Investigations ordered intensified. 2 substantive errors; 1 incomplete reporting, other failure to notify U.S. Attorney re complaint filed. Security informant and criminal informant coverage very good, better than previous inspection. Top Hoodlum Program receiving intensified coverage with exhaustive summary submitted on Top Ten Hoodlum residing in area.

Administrative Operations - Good. Supervision equitably distributed. Cases assigned and closed per Agent above field average. Time in office during February - April, 1961, 14.9%; ordered reduced. Errors of form, misfiled index cards and percentage of retype pages are substantially below field average. Steno production slightly below field average. Travel costs and communications costs exceed office base due to 2 special investigations during rating period. SAC instructed to keep to minimum. Resident Agency territory, Salina, Kansas, redistributed to equitably balance work load.

Personnel Matters - Very Good. Personnel adequate, not excessive. Voluntary overtime high (3' 31"), necessary, productive and equitable. No limited duty Agents. 1 Agent on probation for overweight; reduced from 262 pounds to desirable weight of 191 pounds. Morale very high.

Contacts - Very Good. 17 SAC contacts in diversified fields. Press and TV contacts excellent and police training effectively handled. Office not aware of alleged incomplete crime reporting by Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department, which is currently being investigated by Grand Jury. Office closely following and has excellent relations with Governor, who appointed Acting Police Commissioner. Recent National Academy graduate from Kansas City, Missouri.

Police Department not involved in current Grand Jury hearings. Officials contacted expressed extremely high regard for Director, Bureau, and office.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. SAC W. Mark Felt, GS-16 @ \$15,515, nonveteran, not on probation. He makes an excellent, impressive appearance, is an excellent speaker and a tireless worker. He is aggressive, capable administrator and takes an energetic and enthusiastic approach toward his duties. He is a firm but fair administrator who enjoys the respect of his Agents. Inspector feels SAC Felt is capable of assuming additional responsibilities. It is recommended that he be continued as SAC.

2. ASAC Herbert E. Hoxie, GS-14 @ \$12,210, veteran, not on probation, ASAC at Kansas City since 5/23/60. First office as ASAC. Hoxie makes a good appearance, is intelligent and personable. He is eager and enthusiastic and has a good knowledge of Bureau rules and regulations. With further experience as an ASAC it is believed that he might adequately handle the duties of SAC in a small office.

DETAILS

PHYSICAL CONDITION AND MAINTENANCE VERY GOOD

Office centrally located. Space well kept but inadequate. Office aware of same and is to secure more space when new Federal Building is constructed. Minor housekeeping delinquencies corrected on spot or arrangements made to have corrections made. For added security, suggested office install buzzer system on doors leading to public corridors. 30 autos (47%) inspected and no delinquencies affecting safety. Average repair costs per mile and cost of operation per mile below field average. Repair cost per vehicle slightly above field average.

INVESTIGATIVE OPERATIONS GOOD

Statistical accomplishments for fiscal year, 1961, as of 4/30/61, show increase in convictions (up 7%), fugitives (up 5%), autos (up 3%) and decrease in fines, savings and recoveries (down 7%). Missed applicant deadlines 1.14%, below field average of 6.70%. Investigative deadlines missed in 6 of 169 fugitive cases reviewed (3.5%) above field average of 2.19%. Reporting deadlines missed was 2.4%, below field average of 3.7%. As of 4/30/61, Kansas City had recorded 10 White Slave Traffic Act convictions as compared with 8 as of 4/30/60, which is an improvement. As of 5/15/61, there were 26 Bank Robbery Act violations in which Kansas City was origin. Of these, there are 3 bank robberies and 7 bank burglaries solved and 1 bank robbery and 15 bank burglaries unsolved. Since last inspection (10/1/60) Kansas City solved 8 of 16 bank robberies (50%) and 3 of 24 bank burglaries (12.5%) for a total of 11 cases solved of 40 (27.5%). Security informant coverage very good, especially coverage of Nation of Islam. Increase of 1 security informant and 1 potential security informant since last inspection. Criminal informant coverage very good (increased since last inspection) with 13 criminal informants and 40 potential criminal informants furnishing information concerning Top Hoodlums and Criminal Intelligence Program. Top Hoodlum Program receiving intensified coverage and Kansas City office submitted an exhaustive summary 5/6/61, of the activities of Nicholas Civella, Top Ten Hoodlum residing in area. 2 substantive errors; 1 for incomplete reporting and the other for failure to promptly notify the United States Attorney when a complaint was filed.

ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS GOOD

Supervision of work is equitably distributed and on-the-spot supervision being afforded important matters by supervisory personnel. Cases assigned per Agent (22.1) exceeds field average (20.3). Cases closed per Agent (11.4) exceeds field average (10.8). Time in office during February - April, 1961, was 14.9%. SAC ordered to reduce.

Errors of form (2.6%) substantially below field average (5.31%). Percentage of index cards misfiled (0.26%), below field average (0.39%). Stenos and typists average 3.39 pages transcribed per hour, which is slightly below field average (3.45). Per cent of pages retyped (2.0%), below field average (2.89%). Review of 1257 No. 3 cards indicated 1.9% errors (none of these affecting fringe benefits requirements).

Cost of travel, and communications costs exceed office base; increase due to 2 special investigations during rating period. SAC ordered to reduce. Resident Agency Territory of Salina, Kansas, redistributed by Inspector to transfer 2 counties to Hays, Kansas, resident agency to more equitably balance work load.

PERSONNEL MATTERS VERY GOOD

Personnel adequate, but not excessive. The clerk-Agent ratio is 59.5%. Voluntary overtime is high, (3-month average of 3' 31"). Overtime necessary, productive and equitably distributed. There are no limited duty Agents. 1 Agent on probation for overweight; has reduced from 262 pounds to desirable weight of 191 pounds. Morale is very high.

CONTACTS VERY GOOD

17 SAC contacts in various fields of endeavor are all known to the SAC. Speech program is very good (42 in January - March, 1961), all before quality groups. Press and television contacts excellent. Police training effectively handled. Office not aware of alleged incomplete crime reporting by Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department, which is currently being investigated by the Grand Jury. Office following closely and has direct liaison with Governor, who appointed Acting Chief of Police, Recent National Academy graduate from Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department not involved in current Grand Jury hearings concerning police department. All persons contacted were high in their praise of the Director, Bureau, SAC and the office.

Dear Mr. Felt:

I have reviewed the results of the recent inspection of the Kansas City Office, and, based on the findings of the Inspector, the various phases of the operation of your office are rated as follows: Physical Condition and Maintenance, Personnel Matters and Contacts - Very Good; and Investigative Operations and Administrative Operations - Good.

It was noted that your headquarters space is inadequate and you should follow closely the negotiations for additional space to insure that it is obtained as promptly as possible. I am pleased to note that of the automobiles inspected, none were found to have delinquencies affecting safety. The various housekeeping delinquencies pointed out to you by the Inspector should be resolved at the earliest possible date.

At the time of the inspection, your statistical accomplishments revealed an increase in convictions, fugitives and automobiles recovered; however, you are below last year's accomplishments in fines, savings and recoveries. You should give this matter your concerted attention to bring about a prompt increase in accomplishments. I am concerned that your accomplishments in the solution of bank robberies and bank burglaries are low. You must follow this matter closely to insure that intensified investigation is afforded to remedy this unfavorable trend. Time in office, travel costs and communications costs were excessive. These matters should receive your immediate attention to effect a substantial reduction. The progress and accomplishments achieved -

by your office in the Top Hoodlum Program further accentuates the fact that you should intensify your efforts and coverage of Top Hoodlums in your Division.

It is encouraging to find your Speech Program, press relations and Police Training Program have been effective; however, I am deeply concerned over the allegations concerning incomplete crime reporting by the Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department. You should intensify your liaison with the Governor's Office and insure that you are fully apprised of all developments concerning police matters within your Division. You must be on top of the current inquiry and be certain that you furnish to me all information proving or disproving the current allegations being investigated by the Grand Jury.

You and the Assistant Special Agent in Charge should carefully study the inspection report and summary memorandum concerning the work papers which were left with you and inform the Bureau promptly, in detail, of action taken by you to correct the delinquencies detected during the inspection.

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I interviewed SA [REDACTED] on September 6, 1961. He is [REDACTED] years of age, [REDACTED], weighs [REDACTED] pounds. My initial impression of [REDACTED] was that he did not meet the high standards of personal appearance desired by the Director. Most noticeable in his facial characteristics were his large, prominent lips. I feel that these detract from his general appearance. I would rate [REDACTED] appearance otherwise as average. He has a quiet but pleasant personality. He appears to be sufficiently aggressive. His marks in class have been average. In general, he handled himself satisfactorily during the interview.

[REDACTED] comes from [REDACTED], Missouri. He has a law degree from the University of Kansas Law School. He was interviewed by SAC W. Mark Felt, who stated that applicant presented a very good initial impression and made a good personal appearance. He had a friendly personality and appeared to meet the public well. He commented that [REDACTED] was conservatively dressed, had ordinary features, well-groomed, friendly, steady poise, self-confident, enthusiastic, sufficient force, amenable, alert, tactful, mature, answered questions definitely, and had above-average resourcefulness and average intelligence.

Special Agent [REDACTED], Counsellor, commented that [REDACTED] has a satisfactory appearance and a quiet and self-assured personality and approach. He converses well and should be able to handle contacts with the public very well.

[REDACTED] is applying himself and is developing in a satisfactory manner.

CONCLUSION:

I feel that SAC Felt failed to properly evaluate [REDACTED] features in that he failed to point out whether or not in his opinion his prominent lips detracted from [REDACTED] over-all appearance to the degree where it would constitute a hindrance in making a good first impression.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

On March 6, 1962, I saw Special Agent in Charge W. Mark Felt of the Kansas City Field Division. Mr. Felt makes a substantial personal appearance, seems to be intensely interested in his work, and I would rate him above average.

I called Mr. Felt's attention to the fact I noted he had over a dozen cases in excess of 7% delinquent and he should give this immediate attention.

I commented upon the fact I noted for the first seven months of the current fiscal year when compared with a similar period of the previous fiscal year, his office had dropped 19% in automobiles recovered and he should look into this situation to bring about an improvement.

I discussed with Mr. Felt the fact that I noted the Agents in the Kansas City Office were spending 13.1% of their time in the office, which is excessive and this figure should be reduced.

I commented upon the fact I noted for the first seven months of the current fiscal year when compared with a similar period of the previous fiscal year, the cost of operation for his office was up 8%, which is an undesirable trend.

I called to Mr. Felt's attention the fact I noted that the Kansas City Office had recruited six Agents during the past year for the New Agents Class, which was not up to the expected production of applications for new Agents. I pointed out at the same time that he had asked for additional Agents to be assigned to his office and obviously the Bureau had to intensify its program of recruitment if field offices were to be enlarged in personnel.

I called Mr. Felt's attention to the fact that I noted there were eleven violations of the Federal Bank Robbery Statute which were unsolved and this is an undesirable situation. FBI 100-35

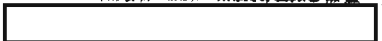

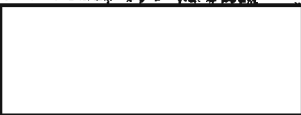

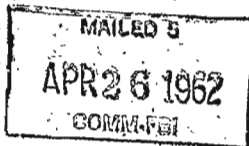

Continental Airlines, Boeing 707, Jet Airliner, Flight #11, en route from Chicago, Illinois, to Los Angeles, California, with a stop-over at Kansas City, Missouri, crashed near Unionville, Missouri, 9:15 p.m., CST, 5-22-62. The aircraft carried a crew of eight and 37 passengers. All aboard perished although one passenger lived through the night and died in the hospital the following morning. Continental Airlines requested assistance of the FBI Disaster Squad. All victims identified - 39 by fingerprints (five by latents) and the remaining identified by personal effects, dental charts or visual means. Identifications by fingerprints - 87%. Confirmation being sent interested agencies. Cause of crash under investigation.

RECOMMENDATION:

Seven Bureau personnel named at end of details be commended by letter for their fine work in assisting in the identifying process.

DETAILS

Captioned aircraft carrying 37 passengers and a crew of eight disappeared from the tracking radar scope of the Federal Aviation Agency (FAA) Control Center, Kansas City, Missouri, at 9:15 p.m., CST. The aircraft had been approaching an intense storm and disappeared from radar within 60 seconds. It was subsequently determined that it had crashed near the Iowa-Missouri border. The closest town was Unionville, Missouri, and wreckage of the aircraft spread over the two states for a distance of over 100 miles. However, the fuselage of the aircraft remained relatively intact and crashed on a hilly farm. Thirty-six bodies and one fatally injured man remained with the fuselage. Eight persons were thrown from the air-

craft as it fell to earth. All bodies revealed severe impact damage; however, the Disaster Squad was able to obtain fingerprints from all but one of the victims.

REQUEST FOR SERVICE

The services of the FBI Disaster Squad were requested by [redacted] [redacted], Continental Airlines. The writer and Latent Fingerprint Examiners [redacted], [redacted] and [redacted] proceeded to the scene via Chicago, Illinois, and Des Moines, Iowa, arriving Unionville, Missouri, approximately 6:30 p.m., 5-23-62. b6 b7C

MORGUE FACILITIES

At Des Moines, Iowa, it was determined that a temporary morgue had been set up in a garage at Unionville, Missouri. Upon arrival at Unionville, it was determined that very limited facilities were available. There was no refrigeration and only sufficient ice to temporarily preserve the bodies of two crew members. The bodies were stacked along side of each other on the floor of the garage. At the outset, it became obvious that immediate steps had to be taken to preserve the bodies as decomposition set in rapidly. As soon as a body was examined and fingerprinted by the Disaster Squad, morticians, who had been called from surrounding areas, immediately began preserving the bodies with formaldehyde and other chemicals. The odors and working conditions became intolerable as the formaldehyde has a blinding effect and it was necessary to set up four huge circular fans in order to create tolerable working conditions. Drs. [redacted] State University of Iowa, and [redacted] United States Marine Corps, Air Force Institute of Pathology, Washington, D. C., conducted medical examinations and autopsies. SAC Mark Felt of the Kansas City Division and Agents from both the Omaha and Kansas City Divisions assisted in the identification process. Dr. Charles L. Judd, County Coroner, Putnam County, Unionville, Missouri, was the ranking medical man and responsible for issuing death certificates. He was overwhelmed by the extent of the tragedy and repeatedly expressed appreciation to the FBI for the assistance being afforded. Officials of the Continental Airlines headed by [redacted] and assisted by [redacted] also remained at the morgue and expressed continuing admiration for the manner in which the identification of the dead was being handled. b6 b7C

RESULTS

All 45 victims identified. Thirty-nine persons were identified by their fingerprints, five of these through latent impressions obtained from articles the victims had handled while alive. Four victims were identified through dental examinations, personal effects and scars. Two victims (Philip I. Hoare, an Englishman and Takehiko Nakano, a Japanese) were visually identified. [redacted] flew to the United States from England and [redacted] made visual identifications at the temporary morgue. Confirmation of the identifications which were effected is being prepared and will be furnished to all interested agencies. b6 b7C

PERSONNEL PARTICIPATING

SAC Felt of the Kansas City Division was at the temporary morgue upon our arrival. He had done a great deal of preliminary work so that the identification process started immediately. SAs [redacted], Robert E. Kent and [redacted] did exceptionally fine work under unpleasant circumstances over an extended period in assisting the Disaster Squad. SA [redacted] handled one of the most distasteful assignments in assisting with the processing of the bodies. SA Robert E. Kent provided liaison with airline officials, relatives of the victims, local law enforcement officials and was successful in establishing excellent working relations. SA [redacted] photographed bodies and assisted in a general manner throughout the proceedings. b6 b7C

Latent Fingerprint Examiner [redacted], who is an experienced Disaster Squad veteran, performed in an admirable manner. His technical skill is exceptional and his energy and vigor under unpleasant circumstances are also amazing. Latent Fingerprint Examiner [redacted] although he had one previous disaster assignment had not been involved in directly processing a large number of bodies and he showed very good potential and displayed fine technical skill. Latent Fingerprint Examiner [redacted] on his first disaster assignment did an excellent job. Despite the unpleasant nature of the work, he participated fully and shows excellent potential. b6 b7C

Payment will be made for death by self-destruction after the Agent has been a member of the fund for a continuous period of two years. It is understood and agreed that the sum tendered herewith is a voluntary, gratuitous contribution to said fund which I understand is to be administered in the following manner.

The Director of the FBI will appoint a committee which shall consider all matters pertaining to the acquisition, safe keeping and expending of said fund, which committee will recommend appropriate action to the Director in pertinent matters. The Assistant Director of the Administrative Division of the FBI shall receive all contributions and account for same to the Director. Upon the death of any Special Agent who is a member of said fund the appointed committee will consider the case and submit a recommendation to the Director as to its conclusions. Appropriate instructions will then be issued to the Assistant Director of the Administrative Division, directing him to pay to the designated beneficiary the sum of \$10,000. Dear Mr. Felt:

I have reviewed the results of the recent inspection of the Kansas City Office, and, based on the findings of the Inspector, the various phases of the operations of your office are rated as follows: Physical Condition and Maintenance and Investigative Operations - Good; Administrative Operations - Very Good; Contacts and Personnel Matters - Excellent.

Your headquarters and resident agency space was found to be neat and properly maintained; however, your headquarters space is inadequate. You must diligently pursue the pending negotiations for additional space. I am disturbed to note that even though your automobile repair and operating costs exceeded the averages for all Bureau cars during fiscal year 1962, a delinquency affecting safety was detected in one of your automobiles. Economy in operations is a necessity; however, you must be most attentive to those factors which concern safety.

The accomplishments of your office for the first two months of the current fiscal year are substantial in three categories but the drop in convictions demands the concerted attention of yourself, your supervisory staff and investigative personnel to improve this phase of your accomplishments.

I am disturbed about the fact that 22 of 51 bank robbery violations which occurred since the last inspection remain unsolved. Immediate corrective measures must be devised looking toward the solution of these pending matters.

The gradual reduction in time in office noted during the inspection must continue to receive your close attention.

The first-office agents in the Kansas City Division should continue to receive your guidance, training, and close supervision. The assignments of your five Investigative Clerks must also be afforded special supervision to insure that their work is productive, satisfactory and current. The large number of letters of commendation and Incentive Awards received by personnel of your office during fiscal year 1962 has obviously contributed to the morale of your personnel and the over-all efficiency of the Bureau.

I am pleased with your record in securing qualified Special Agent applicants. It is basic that if we are to continue to measure up to our many responsibilities, above-average applicants must be recruited in every office.

You are to be commended for your excellent public relations program. You should remain alert to this vital aspect of the Bureau's work.

You and the Assistant Special Agent in Charge should review carefully the findings in the inspection report and work papers left with you by the Inspector. The Bureau should be advised of the corrective action taken within thirty days of receipt of this letter.

Physical Condition and Maintenance - Good. (Last inspection - very good.) Space well kept but not adequate. Expansion plans being negotiated with General Services Administration. Minor housekeeping delinquencies ordered corrected. One automobile delinquency affecting safety detected; ordered corrected. Cost of automobile repair and operation per mile above average.

Administrative Operations - Very Good. (Last inspection - good.) Five-desk office, work equitably distributed. Case load and closings per agent above field average. June-August, 1962, time in office 19.7% - instructed to reduce. Chief Clerk's Office operating efficiently. Stenographic production over offices of comparable size. Travel and per diem costs down. Communications costs up - instructed to reduce.

Personnel Matters - Excellent. (Last inspection - very good.) All available personnel passed examinations. Morale excellent. No agents overweight or unavailable. One agent on limited duty - justified. Two agents on probation from other offices. Incentive awards and letters of commendation for fiscal 1962 considerably above average. Agent and clerical recruitment quotas met since last inspection. Clerical personnel adequate but not excessive. Request for five additional agents considered justified (handled separately).

Contacts - Excellent. (Last inspection - very good.) 21 of 24 SAC Contacts developed by SAC Felt; all known ^{to him}. Quality high, coverage diversified with emphasis on news media. 103 speeches given to varied and high quality groups during first 8 months of 1962. FBI National Academy and police training schools effective and well publicized. Need for more command-level schools. Officials contacted spoke well of Director, Bureau and Kansas City Office. "Top Ten" Fugitive Program on 10 television and 4 radio stations; each new "Top Ten" fugitive recorded by SAC and broadcast by radio station; one television station interviews SAC or ASAC each month; one radio station features a series of recorded interviews with SAC concerning interesting FBI cases.

RECOMMENDATIONS: (1) SAC W. Mark Felt, GS-16 @ \$15,775, nonveteran (under transfer to Seat of Government.). He makes an excellent impressive appearance, is a colorful speaker and a tremendous worker. He provides effective leadership, is a firm but fair administrator and is highly respected by his associates. One substantive error detected on his desk, involving delay in covering fugitive leads. Not personally attributed to SAC. If approved, attached letter summarizing Inspector's findings will be sent.

(2) ASAC Harold J. Edgerton, GS-14 @ \$12,210, veteran, not on probation, ASAC at Kansas City since 2/20/62. Second office as ASAC. Edgerton makes a very good appearance, is highly intelligent, rather reserved, and has a pleasing personality. He is an enthusiastic, most conscientious employee with a very good knowledge of Bureau rules and regulations. No substantive errors detected on ASAC's desk. With further experience as an ASAC, it is believed he could handle adequately the duties of an SAC in a small office.

DETAILS

PHYSICAL CONDITION AND MAINTENANCE GOOD

Space well kept but not adequate. Office aware of this and has plans to utilize additional contiguous space pending completion of negotiations with General Services Administration. Automobile inspection detected one delinquency affecting safety. During fiscal 1962, average automobile repair cost per mile in Kansas City was \$.016 as compared with average for all Bureau cars of \$.013. Cost per mile to operate Bureau cars in Kansas City was \$.066 as compared with all Bureau cars of \$.064.

INVESTIGATIVE OPERATIONS GOOD

Statistical accomplishments for fiscal 1962 showed convictions up 33%; fines, savings and recoveries up 22%; fugitive apprehensions up 10%; and automobile recoveries down 10%. As of 8/31/62, Kansas City fines, savings and recoveries up 146%; fugitives up 27%; automobiles up 34%; but convictions down 13%. Improvement ordered. 2,285 pending cases (2,126 active) - up. Delinquency 4.9% - low. Two substantive errors in 1,113 files reviewed for 0.18% (field average - 0.34%). 6 of 12 robberies; 13 of 31 burglaries and 3 of 8 larcenies for total of 22 of 51 bank robbery violations reported since last inspection solved. Improvement ordered. Applicant deadlines missed 5% (field average - 4.58%). Fugitive deadlines missed 5.51% (field average - 3.13%). 273 potential criminal informants (63 more than last inspection) and 61 criminal informants (1 less than last inspection); quality of coverage afforded - good; program rated good; improvement ordered. Security work limited due to little subversive activity in territory. Criminal Intelligence Program and major cases involving Teamsters Union officials receiving intensified coverage and suggestions for improvement offered.

ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS VERY GOOD

Case supervision equitably distributed among SAC, ASAC and three supervisors. Close working relationship exists. On-the-spot supervision - excellent. Average number of cases assigned for 3 months period - 23.2 (field average August, 1962 - 20.8). Case closings per agent same period - 12.6 (field average August, 1962 - 11.8). Assignments equitably distributed. Average time in office, 3 months checked 19.7%. SAC instructed to reduce.

Chief Clerk's Office operating very effectively. Physical re-organization previously ordered should further improve efficiency. 13 of 4,000 index cards misfiled - 0.33% (field average - 0.42%). 33 files of 1,113 checked contained form errors - 2.96% (field average 4.78%).

Stenographic production 3.52 pages per hour compared to 3.41 pages for offices of comparable size. Travel and per diem expenses below base for 1962 fiscal year. Communications costs up 36.5% for same period, due to several specials. SAC instructed to reduce. Office submission of articles for Law Enforcement Bulletin considered excellent.

PERSONNEL MATTERS EXCELLENT

All available personnel passed required examinations. 91 agents and 52 clerks assigned as of 9/14/62 or clerk-agent ratio of 57%; compares very favorably with field-wide average of 66%. Present clerical personnel adequate but not excessive; request for five additional agents considered justified; being considered separately. Nine accidents involving Bureau cars since last inspection; no Bureau personnel held responsible. Two agents on probation from other offices. No overweight agents; one limited-duty agent - justified; all are available. Since last inspection Kansas City Office has met quota on agent applicants and above quota on clerical applicants. Thirteen suggestions submitted last fiscal year are substantial increase over seven for prior fiscal year. Letters of commendation for clerical and agent personnel in fiscal 1962 are more than double those for offices of similar size. Incentive awards during same period considerably above average. Morale is excellent.

CONTACTS EXCELLENT

Kansas City has 24 SAC Contacts, 21 developed by SAC Felt; up since last inspection and all known to SAC. Quality high, coverage diversified with emphasis on news media. 179 speeches given during 1961 and 103 given during first 8 months of 1962 to varied and high-quality groups. FBI National Academy and police training programs are effective and well publicized. SAC instructed to concentrate on holding additional command-level schools as one held since last inspection. Officials contacted throughout territory expressed high regard for the Director, Bureau and Kansas City Office. Bureau's "Top Ten" fugitive publicity is furnished 10 television and 4 radio stations. SAC personally records a 3-minute tape for a radio station concerning each new addition to "Top Ten" list; one television station presents a monthly FBI program which consists of an interview with the SAC or ASAC; a radio station features a series of recorded interviews with the SAC concerning interesting FBI cases; and 2 television stations have expressed interest in having an FBI program.

This is to advise that Mr. Felt reported to the Training Division at 9 a.m., 10/23/62, for assignment as No. 1 Man. He was afforded a tour of the Training Division and introduced to all of the employees. He was informed of the Director's instructions that he is desirous of bringing more know-how into the Training Division with experienced SACs affording forceful and appropriate supervision to all training matters. Mr. Felt was advised the Director insists that all of our new employees, clerical and Agent, receive full and complete indoctrination to avoid such incidents as the [] matter and clerical employees engaging in improper activities involving morals. The liaison responsibilities of the Training Division as they relate to the IACP were carefully outlined. Tamm's steamroller type activities in the training field were called to Mr. Felt's attention and the absolute necessity that the Bureau maintain its position of leadership in the police training field and being alert to all activities of the IACP. The fact that the Bureau's best interests are protected at all times was also emphasized.

I also pointed out to Mr. Felt the need for continuous indoctrination of employees in the Training Division and all new employees so that they may realize that they must be FBI symbols at all times. Our responsibilities at Quantico were carefully outlined to see that he was reminded he must make certain at all times Quantico is an integral part of the Training Division with on-the-spot supervision. This can best be done by frequent visits to Quantico to see that the men are fulfilling their jobs and providing a very rugged training program. The necessity for us having comfortable and clean training facilities at Quantico was outlined. The importance of the Training Division making certain that memoranda are kept to an absolute minimum, that the persons preparing memoranda keep in mind those individuals who are going to receive them so that they can be intelligently read and completely to the point was brought to Mr. Felt's attention. He was informed that it is absolutely necessary that in the handling of forms and manuals, we hold changes to a minimum. We should remain alert to necessary streamlining, cut down on the use of paper, and see that SAC letters are cut down in length. In other words, SAC letters should be simplified and short.

Relative to the Suggestion Program which is also our responsibility, I pointed out to Mr. Felt the need to emphasize to all new Agents and clerks as well as employees in our Division that we must all remain alert to look for waste and unnecessary procedures; that we must indoctrinate our people with the idea that they are taxpayers, that we are a service organization and as a result all employees should participate in the Suggestion Program so that the Bureau operates at peak efficiency.

Relative to our training program, I emphasized that we must make sure that Agents understand that Manuals are not Bibles, only a guide or road map and that we are providing them with the best possible training and thereafter they must rely on their own good judgment. I pointed out that our training program should be so designed so that when emergencies come up the Agents will utilize proper judgment in carrying out their assignments in the true traditions of the Bureau.

I told Mr. Felt that it would be necessary for us to conduct a complete review and analysis of all training procedures and to come up with necessary recommendations and suggestions which will be evaluated and considered by the Training Committee so that the Bureau has a revitalized training program designed to prevent the problems which have occurred in the recent past and to project Bureau's training program so that it will be unequal in the Bureau's history as an effective and outstanding new program with greater emphasis on know-how and practical experience.

Mr. Felt indicated that he was very pleased with his assignment and will do everything possible to implement these ideas and instructions.

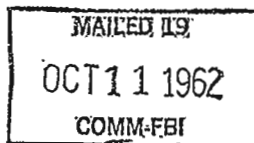

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

On October 26, 1962, I saw Mr. W. Mark Felt, formerly Special Agent in Charge at Kansas City and designated Number One Man to Inspector Casper in the Training Division. Mr. Felt makes an excellent personal appearance, seems to be very enthusiastic about his new assignment, and I would rate him above average.

I pointed out the importance of the Training Division's work and the fact I had not been completely satisfied with the manner in which it had been handled up to the present time. I stated there should be a complete and continuing re-evaluation of the procedures and policies and curriculum of that Division.

I stressed the importance of the indoctrination of Bureau personnel by the Training Division - of the new Agents; the new clerks; the In-Service Agents; and the National Academy. I indicated that the first contact that clerks and Agents have with the FBI is in the Training Division and much depended upon the manner in which the Bureau's policies, rules, and regulations and over-all procedures were presented.

I cautioned Mr. Felt about the making of any statements upon the part of anyone appearing before the classes of the Training Division that could be misinterpreted. I referred to the experience we had with former Special Agents [redacted], [redacted], and [redacted] and how they had distorted and misinterpreted statements made by lecturers.

I stressed the necessity for the Training Division to promptly screen out any undesirable new employees, clerks or Agents. I commented upon the difficulty we have had in connection with the proper appearance of some of our personnel and this should be spotted very promptly by the Training Division and steps taken either to have the appearances corrected or we should take steps to remove the employees from the service.

I told Mr. Felt the Training Division had the responsibility for the final clearance of all SAC Letters and I had been particularly concerned with the length of these documents, and there should be an effort made to be brief in statements contained in SAC Letters. I stated the mere fact I approved an SAC Letter does not mean I approved the form of it, but merely the basic contents and, therefore, the Training Division should revise any SAC Letters it felt necessary as I felt they could be made briefer and more clearly understood.



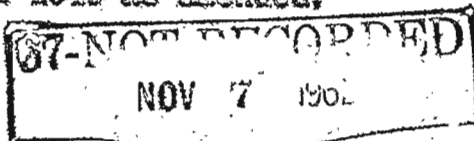

CONSULTATION REPORT

This 38 year old investigator of the F.B.I. was referred here for cardiac examination and evaluation. Complete physical examination as well as clinical history revealed no evidence of past or present heart disease. Because of his history of recurrent periodic attacks of left upper chest pain and associated distress in his left arm, a more complete laboratory study was done. The nature of the precordial and arm distress this man experiences is not typical of angina pectoris or coronary pain. There is no relation to physical exertion, however, a very definite relationship has been noted with motion or movement of his arm in specific positions. He has noted an increased frequency and severity of his pain during

or right after periods of nervous tension. There has never occurred an episode of exertiating pain requiring a hypo for relief, nor has this pain ever awakened him from his sleep or caused him to perspire profusely or become nauseated or vomit because of severity. He has not taken any medication for relief of this distress. This man is able to ascend with impunity the hills and streets in downtown Seattle and experiences no pain or aggravation of existing distress during such efforts. He doesn't become unduly short of breath following such exertion nor has he ever had other objective evidences of cardiac decompensation.

A complete electrocardiogram including standard, augmented extremity, and unipolar precordial leads was completely normal. A Ballistocardiogram was normal. An exercise tolerance test (MASTER 2-STEP TEST) was performed DOUBLE the required number of ascents for a man of this age and weight. (THE SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF A NORMAL DOUBLE MASTER TEST IS BELIEVED TO EXCLUDE CORONARY ARTERY DISEASE) without subjective symptoms and without significant changes in the electrocardiogram. A Blood Cholesterol was 209 mgm % (NORMAL).

IMPRESSION: I do not believe this man has significant coronary artery disease nor Angina Pectoris and I can see no indication of necessity for restriction of his physical activity.
