PIERCE, Chief of Detectives, Jackson, Miss., PD, on 5/22/67, advised that RICHARD BARRETT, along with approximately 68 other individuals, proceeded to parade on Capitol Street in Jackson, Miss., on 5/21/67, the parade culminating at the War Memorial on North State Street in Jackson, Miss. The parade began at approximately 3:00 PM. During the parade, individuals carried placards and signs reading: "Did 10,000 Americans Die In Vain in Viet Nam?"; "Victory in Viet Nam"; "Win the War Now"; "Deport Stinky Stokely"; "Bury Communism"; 'Better Dead Than Red"; and others of similar nature. Upon arrival at the War Memorial, RICHARD BARRETT, along with several other individuals, made comments and short speeches.

The group then burned what they said was a Viet Cong flag and BARRETT made the statement, "We did something in Mississippi they couldn't do in New York; we burned the Viet Cong flag". PIERCE stated that among the group were

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT RACIAL MATTERS - KLAN

A confidential source advised on October 27, 1966, that Richard Barrett, a white male.age 23. in the past few months, accompanied by father of went to Natchez, Mississippi, and contacted. The purpose of the contact was for Barrett to ascertain if knew the names of a couple of men in each county in Mississippi whom Barrett could contact in an effort to have them ioin some type of hate-group he was trying to form. Barrett he could not assist him in his request.

Assistant Chief of Police J. L. Ray, Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, on November 23, 1966, advised he had received information that Barrett had two large flags hanging in his room which he claimed were given him by Governor George Wallace of Alabama. Barrett has received mail from "Voice of the People", address unknown, condemning Negro servicemen in Viet Nam.

An article appearing in <u>The Clarion-Ledger</u>, a Jackson, Mississippi, daily newspaper, under date of February 12, 1967, indicates that Barrett graduated from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, in 1964. He later returned his degree to the University because he said they had Communist Party leaders teaching there.

He said the institution also sanctioned the sending of blood, money and supplies by certain groups to the Communists in North Viet Nam. Barrett's statement to the Associated Press at that time was "We can't battle Communists abroad and tolerate them here at home".

An article appearing in The Natchez Democrat, Natchez, Mississippi, under date of April 22, 1967, indicates that Richard Barrett is a former Army infantry enlisted man. The article further indicates that Barrett recently returned from Viet Nam where he was wounded twice in action and received the Purple Heart twice.

On May 15, 1967, M. B. Pierce, Chief of Detectives, Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, advised that Barrett had made application for a permit to hold a parade on May 21, 1967, sponsored by the American Victory Committee of which Barrett is Chairman. The theme of the parade was "Win in Viet Nam" and Barrett was urging veterans, mothers, workers and students to participate in this parade.

Barrett was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1967, at which time he advised he is a "racist" and he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and talks concerning Viet Nam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should some day be the law of the land, and it is his objective to organize an organization with this objective in mind. He related he is a Viet Nam veteran and is firmly convinced that the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong war but it should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

Barrett continued that he is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any other organization and would not identify any of his associates nor state whether he was or was not acquainted with any members of the Ku Klux Klan. Barrett refused to discuss in detail any of his activities inasmuch as he felt the FBI was becoming a national police agency similar to the **G**estapo.

Records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, reveal Richard Anthony Barrett, Army Serial Number RA 12701033, served in the U.S. Army from June 4, 1964, to May 27, 1966, receiving an honorable release from active duty as Specialist 4 at Oakland, California, and transferred to U.S. Army Reserve to complete military obligation. Terminal date of military obligation is shown as May 3, 1970. Records indicate that Barrett is currently a member of the Stand-by Reserve, U.S. Army Reserve Control Group. He had foreign service in Viet Nam and received Viet Nam Service Medal, Purple Heart with oak leaf cluster and Combat Infantry Badge. No record of disciplinary action or treatment for mental or nervous disorder is contained in his file. These records indicate Barrett was born on February 18, 1943, at New York, New York.

Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnsboro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December, 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a results a split in the OKKKK occurred.

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a slip—in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, ! Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

APPENDIX

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy, and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on August 10, 1966, that the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klam of Mississippi is an unincorporated secret organization existing in the State of Mississippi and dedicated to the preservation of white supremacy at any cost, including the use of force and violence. The official constitution and other directives of the organization do not show any advocation of force or violence, but it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force and violence will be the only salvation of the white man with regard to his relationships with the Negro race. The White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and other State Officers and the State is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership, as of August 10, 1966, of 800 to 1000 dues-paying members of this organization. . The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964. Sam H. Bowers, Jr., Laurel, Mississippi, continues to be the Imperial Wizard.

Highway Sarety Patrol (MHSP), Jackson, Mississippi, on July 30, 1967 advised that Richard Anthony Barrett, along with five other individuals, arrived at the State Capitol grounds at approximately 2:15 p.m. and requested permission to place a wreath at the foot of the statue of Theodore Bilbo. Barrett was advised that the Capitol was closed on Sunday at which time the group placed the wreath on the steps leading to the Capitol. Barrett then requested permission to read a proclamation at which time this permission was denied. Barrett advised that he was forming a group which is to be called the "Americans' Victory Force" which will consist of a group of young militant segregationists.

stated Barrett and his group wanted to parade on the Capitol grounds carrying flags; however, he, Barrett, was advised that if he paraded, he and his group would be arrested. stated that at this time, Barrett and his group left the Capitol grounds and remained on the sidewalk for approximately thirty-five minutes at which time they departed. There were no incidents and no one was arrested.



Bufiles also indicate that he or others have formed the "American Victory Committee." This group has as its objective segregation and the winning of the war in Vietnam by the U. S.

There is no indication that Barrett is a member or has associated with members of the American Nazi Party.

Jackson should conduct an inquiry concerning the American Victory Committee and Richard Anthony Barrett. The extent of his organization as well as a resume of their activities should be incorporated in form suitable for dissemination.

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT RACIAL MATTERS (KLAN)

Richard Barrett was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1967, in connection with another official investigation, at which time he advised that he is a "Racist", and he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and Viet Nam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should be the law of the land some day, and it is his objective to organize an organization with this objective in mind. He related that he is a Vietnam veteran and is firmly convinced that the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong War but should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

Barrett continued that he is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any other organization, and he would not identify any of his associates nor state whether he was or was not acquainted with any members of the Ku Klux Klan. Barrett refused to discuss in detail any of his activities, inasmuch as he felt the FBI was becoming a national police agency.

On May 15, 1967, M. B. Pierce, Chief of Detectives, Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department, advised that Barrett had made application for a permit to hold a parade on May 21, 1967, sponsored by the American Victory Committee of which Barrett is National Chairman. The theme of the parade was "Win in Vietnam", and Barrett was encouraging veterans, mothers, workers, and students to participate in this parade.

Chief Pierce stated on May 22, 1967, that Barrett, along with approximately sixty-eight other individuals, held a parade in Jackson, Mississippi. Individuals participating in the parade carried signs reading "Did 10,000 Americans die in Vain in Vietnam"; Victory in Vietnam"; "Win the War Now"; "Deport Stinky Stokely"; and others. Chief Pierce stated that there

were no spectators along the parade route, and no incidents occurred during the parade. He attributed the lack of spectators and no more participants in the parade to very inclement weather.

A fourth confidential source advised on August 14, 1967, that Richard Barrett held a "Victory In Vietnam" Parade in Natchez on the night of August 12, 1967. There were approximately twenty-five automobiles in the parade with two people in each car, making a total of fifty people in the parade.

Source stated that

in the Natchez Campaign Headquarters of
Gubernatorial Candidate, helped organize the parade. United
States Representative John R. Rarick of St. Francisville,
Louisiana, was the main speaker, and the theme of his
talk was Americanism. Barrett made a short talk about
winning the War in Vietnam. Barrett stated in his talk
that while he served in Vietnam, he could not get an American
flag.

Source stated the parade was not organized and was a complete flop.

Source further advised that he had observed several individuals participating in this parade who were members of the Ku Klux Klan.

An article appeared in the "Meridian Star"
Newspaper, Meridian, Mississippi, under date of July 31,
1967, entitled "White Militant Group Planned By Jacksonian."
The article stated that "A Jackson man who has sponsored conservative rallies and at least one parade says he plans to organize a new militantly segregationist group called 'America's Victory Force.'" The article pointed out that Richard Barrett, age 24, the moving force behind another group called "The American Victory Committee", and two youths laid a wreath on the steps of the State Capitol in memory of Senator Theodore G. Bilbo, the segregationist Mississippi Governor and Senator. The

article also pointed out that Highway Patrolmen told the group they could be arrested if they tried to carry flags or read a "proclamation," which Barrett had prepared.

Barrett said in this article that the group's purpose would be "to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans." He said the "main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all laws."

The third confidential source advised on August 8, 1967, that he is acquainted with Richard Barrett and has learned that Barrett is attempting to organize an organization entitled "American Victory Committee" and "The American Victory Force" and set himself up as the head of both of these organizations. Source stated that he does not believe Barrett will get a foothold in his attempts to organize this organization, inasmuch as the general consensus of the people he comes in contact with is that he is a "nut."

Records on file at MPRC, St. Louis, Missouri, reveal that Richard Anthony Barrett, Army Serial Number RA 12701033, served in the United States Army from June 4, 1964, to May 27, 1966, receiving honorable release from active duty as Specialist 4, at Oakland, California, and transferred to United States Army Reserve to complete military obligation. Terminal date of military obligation shown as May 3, 1970.

Barrett currently is a member of Standby Reserve, United States Army Reserve Control Group, MPRC, St. Louis, Missouri. He had foreign service in Vietnam and received Vietnam Service Medal, purple heart with oak leaf cluster and combat infantry badge. No record of disciplinary action or treatment for mental or nervous disorder contained in his file.

An article appearing in the "Clarion-Ledger", a Jackson daily newspaper, under date of February 12, 1967, indicates that Barrett graduated from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, in 1964. He later returned his degree to the university because he said they had Communist Party leaders there. He said the institution also sanctioned the sending of blood, money, and supplies by certain groups to the Communists in North Vietnam. Barrett's statement to the Associated Press at that time was 'We can't battle Communism abroad and tolerate it here at home."

Investigation at Rutgers University, Newark,
New Jersey, indicates that Barrett attended this university
from September 15, 1960, to June 3, 1964. He received
an AB Degree in Social Sciences. The record indicates that
in 1965 or 1966 Barrett returned his diploma to Rutgers
University in protest of statements made by Rutgers Professor
made statements protesting

United States intervention in Vietnam. Barrett claimed that he was wounded two or three times in Vietnam.

All sources (except any listed below) whose identities are concealed in referenced communication have furnished reliable information in the past.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with Units in several Southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

A review of Bufiles pertaining to Barrett fails to indicate that Barrett is of national prominence or of national interest at this time. While his potential for violence is realized through the very fact of his participation in and leading of demonstrations against segregation, nevertheless, there is insufficient information available at this time indicating that violence has occurred through his actions.

You should conduct an investigation of Barrett as well as the "Americans Victory Force." Be guided by Section 122 of the Manual of Instructions concerning these investigations.

If Barrett and his group are not part of the Klan, the reports submitted should be captioned "Racial Matters (Organization)."



Chief of Detectives M. B. Pierce (NA), Jackson Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, on October 24, 1967, advised that Richard Barrett had contacted him advising that he, Barrett, would hold a demonstration at the State Capitol in Jackson, Mississippi, beginning at 3:45 p.m., on October 24, 1967. Barrett stated that he was going to drag the United Nations flag around the Capitol and then burn it.

Chief Pierce stated that the City of Jackson has no authority to arrest Richard Barrett based on the burning of the United Nations flag inasmuch as it is not a recognized sovereign nation.

Richard Barrett, with arrived at the State Capitol grounds at 4:00 p.m. on October 24, 1967, Both individuals, dragging a United Nations flag, walked on the sidewalk around the State Capitol. Barrett and then stepped on the United Nations flag and a Viet Cong flag, thereafter squirting lighter fluid on the two flags and setting them afire. As they walked around the State Capitol, they carried two signs entitled, "Victory in Vietnam" and "U. S. Over U. N."

At the conclusion of the flag burning, Barrett made the statement that "We have a future in the United States; the United Nations does not". He also stated, "Get the United Nations out of the United States and we will have victory in Vietnam".

He is attempting to organize the "American Victory Force", which will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of Barrett stated, "The main flavor of our white Americans. militancy will be in national segregation -- we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all laws".

Barrett has been known to associate with known members of the Ku Klux Klan in Mississippi; however, no information has been developed indicating that he is, in fact, a member of any Klan group.

Barrett is a white male, age 24, and served in the United States Army from June 4, 1964 through May 25, 1966, receiving an honorable release from active duty. He had foreign service in Vietnam and received the Vietnam service medal, purple heart with oak leafecluster, and the combat infantry badge.

The Bureau is in possession of much material forwarded by various offices concerning captioned individual who is a "racist." He has made many attempts to form organizations, the main purpose of which is to fight integration and communism, such as the "American Victory Committee," "American Victory Force," and parades with the general theme of "Back the Boys in Vietnam." His organizations have the militantly segregated flavor with the theme of Christianity and patriotism to further coordinate white Americans. recommended for the Rabble Rouser Index.

Last evening (1/3/68) BARRETT called the office and inquired of SAC if he would issue a public statement of apology for having conducted an investigation concerning BARRETT's background indicating he had information and signed affidavits in his possession from individuals from South Carolina who had been contacted and that the head of the South Carolina Office of the FBI had issued such a statement. BARRETT was definitely set straight as to our policy in conducting such investigations that I was certain the SAC of our Columbia, S.C., Office had made no such statement; that if he had such affidavits in his possession they were probably falsified and that we would conduct an investigation concerning anyone when they fell within our jurisdiction to do so.

Upon the conclusion of the foregoing conversation, BARRETT said, "Well, I will have to write that letter to JOHN EDGAR HOOVER complaining about the harassment of the Jackson Office of the FBI." BARRETT was informed that he should feel free to write any letter that he cared to but that he should be very careful that he put in only true facts and not make false accusations concerning anyone.

This office has been making inquiries concerning BARRETT and as to whether he falls within the criteria for the Rabble Rouser Index (see Jackson airtel 8/17/67 captioned "Rabble Rouser Index (Subversive Control)"). He is an unethical racist who will attach himself to any group for publicity purposes.

The purpose of this letter is to alert the Bureau that a complaint concerning the Jackson Office may be forthcoming from BARRETT and to advise that no investigation has been conducted except that necessary and within our rules and regulations.

Special Agent in Charge, Jackson Dīvision, advised that Richard Anthony Barrett, a notorious racist, called the Jackson Office and inquired of the Special Agent in Charge if he would issue a public statement of apology for having conducted an investigation concerning Barrett's background indicating he had information and signed affidavits in his possession from individuals in South Carolina who had been contacted and that the head of the South Carolina Office of the FBI has issued such a statement.

Barrett was set straight by Special Agent in Charge Roy K. Moore and was told that he was certain the Agent in Charge of our South Carolina Office had made no such statement and that the FBI would conduct investigations concerning anyone when it was within the Bureau's jurisdiction to do so

Barrett then told Special Agent in Charge Moore that he would have to write a letter to Director Hoover complaining of the harassment of the Jackson Office of the FBI. Barrett was told that he should be careful in relating only true facts and not to make false accusations concerning anyone.

The Jackson Office has informed us that a complaint concerning the Jackson Division may be forthcoming from Barrett.

Richard Anthony Barrett is a white male, born JAN 12 1968 February 18, 1943, in New York City and is National Chairman for the "American Victory Committee" which is militartly segregationist group whose alleged purpose is to promote Christianity and patriotism. He was arrested in August of 1967 by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department for disturbing the peace in connection with a demonstration during a Poor People's March to the State Capitol in Jackson, Mississippi.

A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed Richard Anthony Barrett place a wreath and small placard beside the entrance to the Washington Monument, Washington, D. C. at 2:30 PM on March 9, 1968. He was also observed to pin a Purple Heart medal on the placard, which read as follows:

"Tribute to our brave soldiers-May Washington's will to win be reborn for victory in Vietnam."

The wreath and placard were removed by Barrett within ten minutes. No speech or announcement was made by Barrett, who departed the area shortly thereafter.

Barrett, interviewed under suitable pretext, identified himself as the speaker for America's Victory Force, from Jackson, Mississippi. He advised that he is twenty five years of age, and is a twice-wounded veteran of Vietnam. He stated that his purpose for laying a wreath, placard and Purple Heart medal at the Washington Monument, was to "call on Americans to appreciate the sufferings of our soldiers in Vietnam and to support our boys by calling for prompt victory in Vietnam. So that our sons have not sacrificed in vain."

Barrett related that his future plans for a speaking tour are not formulated or definite at this time; however, he stated that he planned to apply by letter to the local police authorities in Washington, D. C. for a permit to allow him to demonstrate at the Washington Monument on April 22, 1968.

During this investigation, information was developed that RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT would be leaving Jackson, Miss., on an eleven-state speaking tour under the sponsorship of the American Victory Force, which he, BARRETT, has set himself up as national chairman.

The Bureau, by referenced communication, requested Jackson to attempt to obtain BARRETT's itinerary and identify any group sponsoring this tour.

Investigation has disclosed that BARRETT is a "loner" and individuals interviewed stated that BARRETT has not actually planned his tour; in fact, he will go to a place and if he finds a group which is receptive to him, he will "bilk" this group for everything he can and then move on to another location.

Jackson, Miss., who is on the Board of Directors of the American Victory Force, has advised that even BARRETT did not tell him where he would be going on this speaking tour and has no idea as to how to get in touch with or communicate with BARRETT.

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT is on the rabble rouser index of the Jackson Office.

The Bureau also requested, in referenced communication, that if information was developed regarding BARRETT's itinerary, offices covering that particular location should be advised in order that local, as well as pertinent Federal agencies, could be advised of BARRETT's activities.

Inasmuch as information was developed that BARRETT is allegedly going to speak in Alabama, Georgia, North and South Garolina, Virginia, New Jersey, as well as New York, copies of this communication are being sent to those offices who are requested to contact sources and in the event information is received that BARRETT will be







He stated that in conversations with BARRETT, he has the opinion that he is a "kook", meaning that BARRETT does not actually know what he is working for or what he actually stands for. stated BARRETT's main concern is getting publicity for himself. stated he knewthat BARRETT was allegedly going on an eleven-state speaking tour; however, he does not know the states involved or the groups which will sponsor BARRETT's speeches. stated that in his opinion, even BARRETT does not know from one day to the other where he will be speaking next. Richard Barrett was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1967, at which time he advised he is a "racist" and he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and talks concerning Vietnam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should some day be the law of the land. It is his objective to organize an organization with this objective in mind. He related he is a Vietnam veteran and is firmly convinced that

the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong war, but it should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

Barrett continued that he is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan (KKK) or any other organization and would not identify any of his associates nor state whether he was or was not acquainted with any members of the KKK. Barrett refused to discuss in detail any of his activities inasmuch as he felt the FBI was becoming a national police agency similar to the gestapo.

Records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, reveal Richard Anthony Barrett, Army Serial Number, RA12701033, served in the U. S. Army from June 4, 1964, to May 27, 1966, receiving an honorable release from active duty as Specialist 4, at Oakland California, and transferred to U. S. Army Reserve to complete military obligation. Terminal date of military obligation is shown as May 3, 1970. Records indicate that Barrett is currently a member of the Standby Reserve, U. S. Army Reserve control group. He had foreign service in Vietnam and received Vietnam service medal, purple heart with oak leaf cluster and combat infantry badge. No record of disciplinary action, treatment for mental or nervous disorder is contained in his file. These records indicated that Barrett was born February 18, 1943, at New York, New York.

An article appearing in the <u>Clarion-Ledger</u>, a Jackson, Mississippi, daily newspaper, under date of February 12, 1967, indicates that Barrett graduated from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, in 1964. He later returned his degree to the university because he said they had Communist party leaders teaching there. He said the institution also sanctioned the sending of blood, money, and supplies by certain groups to the Communists in North Vietnam. Barrett's statement to the Associated Press was, "We can't battle Communists abroad and tolerate them here at home."

Richard Barrett has organized, and held, several parades and memorial services sponsored by the American Victory Force, of which Barrett has set himself up as chairman. The main theme of the American Victory Force is "Back the Boys in Vietnam", and Win the War in Vietnam."

Barrett has stated that the "American Victory Force" will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans. He stated, "The main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the groups' militant acts would be within all laws."

No information has been developed that Richard Barrett is a member of the KKK; however, he associates with individuals who have been identified by informants of the Jackson Division as being members of the KKK.

Purpose is to inform you of allegations of harassment by FBI Agents made by the subject in testimony before an Executive Session of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee (SISS) on March 26, 1968, and to recommend that a representative of Crime Records Division contact that Committee and furnish them with the true 171 HORSE SHOE facts regarding our interest in the subject.

discharged Vietnam war veteran. Upon his return to the United States, he formed and now leads a small group known as the American Victory Force which he describes as a militant segregationist group, whose purpose is to promote Christianity and patriotism; to back America's Vietnam effort; and to further the "unity and coordination of white America." In view of his activities and extremist statements, he was placed on the Agitator Index and an investigation initiated to determine whether he or his group are a danger

to the internal security of this country. He is extremely anti-Bureau and has refused to be interviewed by Bureau Agents in the past. In view of statements made by him, he was considered a suspect in the bombing of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C. in February, 1968. Investigation eliminated him as a suspect.

On March 26, 1968, he requested and was granted permission to testify before the SISS. He testified about the "communist threat to the United States;" the need to strengthen the internal security of the United States; communist participation in riot activities; and the need for riot control legislation. He also alleged that he and his neighbors have been questioned and harassed by FBI Agents due to his activities. He then called for legislation "guarding against a national police force." It is noted that in January, 1968, he wrote a letter to the Director alleging the same type harassment and the Director noted "ignore" on this communication.

RECOMMENDATION:

That a representative of Crime Records Division be authorized to contact the SISS and advise them of the subject's background, activities, and our investigative interest in the subject and the fact that our Agents have never engaged in harassing tactics in this or any other investigation.
