Page 18 of the first referenced report, Paragraph 2, indicates that background information regarding ANDERSON is set out on Pages 18 and 19 of the report of SA JAMES H. The first report of reference indicates that ANDERSON is friendly with the subject SARANT, but does not otherwise indicate why it is thought he may be implicated in this investigation as a subject. 



SARANT resided in an apartment at 65 Morton Street (Greenwich Village), New York City, from 1943 to September, 1946. A close associate during this time was one JOEL EARM, who has also been identified as a Russian agent and who is now believed to be in Russia. SARANT moved to Ithaca, New York in September, 1946, but paid the rent on the above apartment until January, 1950. It is believed that this apartment was used by ROSENNERG for his espionage activities.

SARANT in several interviews in July, 1950 denied any espionage activities, supplying only vague and indefinite information to the interviewing agents. He left Ithaca for a week's vacation in the New York City area on July 26, 1950. He was met in New York City by CARGL DAYTON, the wife of his next door neighbor in Ithaca. On August 4, 1950, he and DAROL DAYTON left New York and arrived in Tucson, Arizona on August 7. There SARANT sold his automobile, and on August 9 entered Mexico with DAYTON. His present whereabouts are unknown.

SARANT was employed as an electrical engineer by the estern Electric Company both at their 11th Avenue and 42nd Street Plants, in New York City, from 1943 to 1945. LOUIS LAWRENCE ANDERSON was reportedly a supervisor and associate during part of this period. There is no

indication that ANDFRSON was ever engaged in any activities of an espionage nature. It is always possible that any associate of a subject in any type of case may himself be implicated with the subject, this being the reason for the statement appearing in report of Epecial Agent JAMES H. HIGDON, JR. dated September 12, 1950 at Newark.

It is requested that ANDERSON be interviewed concerning his knowledge of subject's activities during the period of his acquaintance with him.
