sympathy with Communism and Russia during the Hitler-Stalin > Pact. Also, he has always been unsympathetic toward Russians concerning their control of the arts and sciences.

He recalled that during the 1930's on rare occasions he attended some meetings of the American League Against War and Fascism which he recalled later changed its name to the American League for Peace and Democracy. He advised that during the period he was in medical school from 1932 to 1936 there was a local chapter at the med school which anyone could attend. He recalled that on one occasion the Dean of the med school attended although only probably for the purpose of checking up on the activities of the meeting. Dr. FISHER was not a part of the leadership which controlled this group from behind the scenes but he assumed that there was such a group.

He was asked if he was ever invited to join a Communist Party cell and he stated that if he was asked it goes back a long way into the middle 1930's so that he could not recall it. He advised he has no knowledge of the past or present existence of any Communist Party cells or groups. He advised that he knew of none in connection with the American Soviet Medical Society but stated it is possible there was such a group.

He advised that he was a convalescent from 1939 to 1943 and was not connected in any way with any subversive organization during that period. He stated that at the present time he has no connections with any organization other than legitimate medical societies. He advised that he has no connection with any ALP group, nor does he have any friends whom he knows to be members of a subversive organization. He advised that during the war he used to subscribe to the publication "New Masses" but has not since. He can think of no other publications with a Communist line that he has subscribed to.

During the JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG case he received flyers asking for funds and received one recently concerning the SOBEL case. He advised that he never contributed a cent to either of those causes. Concerning the National Council of American Soviet Friendship, he stated he was never an active member therein although during the early 1940's he had attended

some of their meetings.

He advised that in 1945 or 1946 he was a speaker at the Jefferson School of Social Science on one occasion at a symposium on Soviet medicine and science. He could not recall the source of the invitation but stated it may have come to him through his work on the American Review of Soviet Medicine.

## Dr. ROBERT LINCOLN LESLIE N. V. (100-48830)

Dr. FISHER has known LESLIE about twenty years. During the 1930's and probably at the present time LESLIE was a non-practicing doctor in NYC in the printing business. He nevertheless knew a lot of doctors and held social functions at his home which FISHER occasionally in the 1930's attended. LESLIE had a good feeling toward medical students and would assist them in any way possible. The only mutual organization that LESLIE and FISHER were members of was the American Soviet Medical Society during the middle 1940's.

FISHER still sees LESLIE on rare occasions. His last contact with LESLIE was a year or two ago when to the best of FISHER's recollection LESLIE called FISHER at Bellevue Hospital. That has been the only type of contact that FISHER has had with LESLIE for several years past.

As to LESLIE's well publicized trip to Russia in 1946 before he went over he had a group of doctors at a gathering at his home. Inasmuch as he was to meet many Russian doctors abroad he wanted to be able to ask the proper questions of those doctors. FISHER attended this gathering. Various doctors at that time advised LESLIE all questions they would desire to ask in various specialized fields.

LESLIE was apparently proud of his contacts with the Russians inasmuch as he would occasionally state that he was having lunch or some other get-to-gether with various officials not recalled by FISHER. However, FISHER knew of no unusual

who had a minor stomach condition. This individual was connected with the UN. The last name BOGDANOV may be in error. FISHER recalled nothing unusual concerning this person.

#### Miscellaneous

did may of the Russians indicate a desire to defect or to extend their stay in the US. To the contrary, after the war ended the US appeared to them as unfriendly and many of them wanted to return to Russia as soon as possible. The most notable thing about their attitude that impressed FISHER was the fact that during the war, because of their easy living compared to the bitter hardships in Russia, the Russians in the US had a very guilty feeling.

and ANATOLI A ERMOLAEV were unfamiliar to him. He stated that the names of PAVILLYFEDOSIMOV and YAKOV HOMAKIN were familiar to him but that was all, that he didn't believe he had known them, and in any case would know nothing unusual concerning them.

MOURNAKOFF but did not know him. He also stated that he never had any indication that any of the Russians were engaged in espionage. He never heard anything indicating such activity on anyone's part, and never noticed that any Russian might be more important than the actual position he occupied.

SOBLE denied that he knew of any connection between his former Soviet superior, VASSILI ZUBILIN, and ANATOLI YAKOVLEV. SOBLE stated that he had never heard of YAKOVLEV prior to a recent publication of "Look" magazine which mentioned YAKOVLEV's name in connection with the Rosenberg Case.






### GERHART EISLER

LOUIS F. BUDENZ, former editor of the "Daily Worker," former East Coast Communist newspaper, testified before the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) that he had been informed by high Communist Party officials that HANS BERGER was a strictly underground operative and a responsible comrade whose real name was GERHART EISLER. BUDENZ further testified that he had been told EISLER was equivalent to a representative of the Communist International.

On February 6, 1947, GERHART EISLER appeared before the HCUA and refused to be sworn as a witness. In 1948 GERHART EISLER was indicted and convicted for contempt of Congress. On May 19, 1949, EISLER, while on bond, flad the United States on the Polish liner BATORY after being smuggled aboard this ship.

### HARRY GOLD

GOLD was arrested on May 23, 1950, and subsequently pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. On December 9, 1950, in the United States District Court. Eastern District of Pennsylvania, GOLD was sentenced to zerve thirty years imprisonment.


#### ROSENBERG CASE

Of the photographs exhibited to her, irs. NEUNSON selected the photograph of ANATOLI ANTONOVICE YAKOVIEV as that most closely resembling the Russian who felled at their home in 1943.

With regard to the Russian visitor discussed above, the subject was reluctant to disclose the name of this visitor when first interviewed by Bureau agents. He described him as a "friend of YAKOVLEY" and finally said his name was BALANOV.

Since it is known that the subject knew YAKOVLEV and that YAKOVLEV was an MGB agent operating in the United States from 1941 to 1946, it is possible that he was the Russian visitor in the subject's residence in August 1943. This theory is further strengthened by the subject's admission that the visitor asked him whether he had friends in Tennessee. YAKOVLEV's accomplishments in the field of atomic espionage are now well known.

When the subject was interviewed on June 2, 1950, he informed that he had met YAKOVLEV at the Hotel Savoy in Moscow in 1930; that YAKOVLEV addressed at least two, or possibly more, semi-annual conferences of technicians who attended the Engineering and Technical Institute in Moscow and that he had met YAKOVLEV in the corridors of the GPU Building at Moscow.

On February 8, 1952, when asked (1) if he had ever seen YAKOVLEV in the Hotel Savoy, (2) if YAKOVLEV had ever taught any technical courses, (3) if he had ever heard YAKOVLEV lecture or make speeches, (4) if he had ever seen YAKOVLEV in the GPU or NKVD Building in Moscow, NEUNSON replied "no" to each question.

His New York residence was given as 109 West 103rd Street, New York City. He possessed Passport Number 14229/261798, issued at Moscow, Russia, on July 16, 1938, which expired on January 9, 1940. He stated he arrived in the United States at New York City on August 22, 1938, on the SS Queen Mary for a length of stay of nine months. KRUTCHKOV came to the United States for the purpose of placing Russian furs on the American market. He is employed at the Amtorg Trading Corporation, New York City, at \$252.00 per month.

On September 16, 1941, KRUTCHKOV was advised of his change of status to that of a foreign Government official.





Philadelphia teletype, June 13, 1950 indicates SAM (SEMENOV) may have known Kingsport, Tennessee, as whereabouts of SLACK in 1943, and furnished this information to GOLD. This suggests possibility of SLACK'S father having furnished the information to SAM.

FRED ROSE, principal subject in Corby Case, is known to have spent several days with JACOB GOLOS in New York City in 1943 immediately prior to GOLOS' death. ROSE was known as "FRED" and "DEBOUZ" in Coby Case. Photograph of ROSE should be exhibited to SLACK at Syracuse and GOLD at Philadelphia possibly identical with unknown subject FRED.

There is also enclosed photographs of ANATOLI ANTONOVICH VAKOVLEV. YAKOVLEV has been identified by GOLD as unknown subject JOHN. Buffalo and Syracuse respectively should display photograph to SLACK'S father and SLACK.





### COMMUNIST ACTIVITIES AMONG ALIENS AND NATIONAL GROUPS

#### THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 1949

The subcommittee met, pursuant to recess, at 10:30 a.m., in room

424, Senate Office Building, Senator Forrest C. Donnell presiding.

Present: Senator Donnell (presiding).

Also present: Messrs. Richard Arens, staff director of the special

subcommittee; Frank W. Schroeder and Otto J. Dekom, professional staff.

Senstor Donnell. The hearing will now come to order.

Mr. Arens, will you proceed?

Mr. Arens. This is a continuation of the hearings on S. 1832 to provide for the exclusion and deportation of subversives.

Our next witness, Mr. Chairman, is Mr. John J. Huber.

Senator Donnell. Mr. Huber, do you solemnly swear that the testimony you are about to give will be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, so help you God?

Mr. HUBER. I do.

#### TESTIMONY OF JOHN J. HUBER

Mr. Arens. Mr. Huber, is it agreeable with you for all or any part of your testimony today and your identity to be released publicly!

Mr. Huber. Yes, sir. Senator Donnell. Pardon me, Mr. Huber, it is now about 7 minutes before the time the Senate convenes, and I am wondering whether you would be willing to go right ahead with your statement, and then respond to questions of Mr. Arens, or his assistants. I will ask that I be excused from attendance. Are you willing to go right ahead, Mr. Huber?

Mr. Huber. Yes, sir.

Senator Donnell. Very well. I am glad to have met you.

Mr. Arens. Will you please state your name and give us an outline

of your background and experience?

Mr. HUBER. My name is John J. Huber. I was born in New York City and have lived in that city and its environs all of my life. In 1987, I was employed in a supervisory capacity in the WPA in New

Jackson read telegrams from Congressman Hugh Delacy, Upton Sinclair, Harbert Lehman, Edward G. Robinson, Carey McWilliams, and Bartley C. Crum, praising the members of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in their fight against fascism. He continued stating, "We have another legal representative to our convention, Vice Consul-Anatole Yakovley, of the Soviet Union."

Milton Wolff, national commander of the brigade, delivered the keynote address as follows:

Guests, friends, and delegates, the Abraham Lincoln Brigade was born first fighting against fascism. The members have been characterized as fighting anti-Fascists and we have been called other less complimentary names. Certain very blunt commentators have dubbed us premature anti-Fascists. I cannot remember a convention where we have not worked out plans to intensify our fight against fascism. We have always been guided by the motive which sent us to Spain, by the remembrance of the people who gave their lives—the people of Spain. Down the years we have dedicated ourselves to the struggles of peace, and of the conception of a government of the people, by the people, and for the people. Men of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade have fought and distinguished themselves in every battlefront.

themselves in every battlefront.

When we went to Spain in 1936, proclaiming to the world that we would fight fascism, we rejected with our lives all the evils of appeasement and compromise. We have stuck to our guns in the face of the enemy. We feel that it is important for the American people today to review the message of the last 10 years in the light of our own experience. Ten years ago the Spanish people were holding the curtains of democracy against fascism. The Soviet Union was the only country which defended these principles, and did so with matériel and supplied armies. We, the American volunteers of the International Brigade, rejected a policy of appeasement with guns in our hands and with our lives on the battle-fronts of Argonne. We maintain that the hope of the world rests with us, the American people. We must reestablish on a firmer basis than ever before, the friendship between the Soviet Union, the United States, and Great Britain, which defeated the Axis and which can maintain the peace and build a better world for us. We must stay in the forefront in the fight for the destruction of facism, and particularly in Spain. Spain is one of the most important keys to all international development. Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade cannot and will not stop short of a world of peace—a democratic world.


The chairman read greetings from Frank Kingdon, Serge Koussevitsky, and Pablo Picasso. Betty Simms sang several Spanish songs, followed by Faul Bates, who also sang Spanish songs. The chairman then stated:

At this time we bring before the convention a person who needs no introduction to members of the Fifteenth Brigade—our own commander of the Thirty-fifth Division whom we know so well as General Walter (General Walter is the name under which Gen. Karol Swierczewski, Polish Vice Minister of Defense, led the Dombrowski brigade in Spain).


His address was delivered in Polish and translated at intervals, but indistinguishable. The essence of it was high praise for the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and to the effect that Polish fighters had fought in Spain in 1936 to prevent the dropping of bombs on Poland in 1939. Jackson continued:

General Walter, who was in Paris only hours ago, has brought with him some awards to be made to some members of our brigade, who have consistently carried on the fight against fascism and have kept alive the fight against Franco. The first name that comes to mind is the name of our own Herman Boettcher; obviously the award will have to be received by someone else—and who better than Comrade Irving Goff.

Irving Goff was a captain in the United States Army, serving with OSS.

He resides at 489 First Avenue with his wife, EDITH STRICK SHEPPARD. SHEPPARD was born in Camden, New Jersey on October 25, 1918. The is 25 years of age and holds an amateur radio operator's license. He is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, receiving a Master's Degree. He was formerly employed in the summer time by RCA and Philco Radio and by the University of Pennsylvania. He is registered at Local Selective Service Draft Board #10, Camden, New Jersey.

A preliminary investigation as to SHEPPARD's loyalty and nationalistic tendencies reveals that he is a very brilliant and capable radio engineer and highly thought of at the Hazeltine Electronics Company. His immediate superiors, Mr. WHEELER and Mr. HAFNETT, reliable engineers, have stated that SHEPPAPD is a very loyal American and not in the least bit Communistically-inclined and could be trusted to keep information confidential. He could also be approached regarding a confidential matter. His personnel file reveals that he was highly recommended by the University of Pennsylvania and by previous employers. At his residence, 489 First Avenue, New York City, it was ascertained that SHEPPARD and his wife are considered very reliable and not interested in Communism. Mrs. SHEPPARD is taking a pre-Medical course pre pratory to becoming a doctor. SHEPPARD is continuing his studies by going to school nights at a Brooklyn Technical School.

The Hazeltine Electronics Company is engaged 100% in war work for the Navy Department manufacturing naval communications and otherwise engage in electronic research for the Navy Department. The executives of this company are engineers of considerable experience and the company is one of the foremost in its field.

The files of this office reveal that SHEPPARD's wife, under her maiden name of EDITH STRICK, 489 First Avenue, was a signer of a Communist Party nominating petition in the 1942 State elections. SHEPPARD in the June-July 1940 issue of the Fraternal Outlook, the official organ of the International Workers' Order. A copy of this is not available in this office at the present time to determine if the CHARLES SHEPPARD of this letter is identical with the CHARLES B. SHEPPARD whose photograph appears therein.

Regarding ANATOLI A. YAKCVLEW, INS records, New York City, revealed that he entered the United States in 1941 to work as a clerk at the USSR Consulate, New York City. On August 17, 1950, the Wederal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York returned an indictment charging YAKOVLEW and others with conspiracy to commit espionage.

Subject claimed she has never met or ever heard of the names SEAMEN M. SETENOV or ANATOLI YAKOVLEW.







His official duties involved attempts to locate persons who were missing in the USSR and these duties brought him into contact with many in the USSR and these duties who had relatives in the USSR.

The subject on his personnel security questionnaire listed his father and mother as having been born in Russia, but were as of this time deceased.




