





You have previously been furnished with information concerning Edward James Weinstein by Bureau memorandum of July 10, 1951, in the case entitled "Maxwell Finestone, was Espianese = F." Espionage $-R_{\bullet}$

There is being transmitted herewith for your further information a copy of the report of Special Agent Richard F. Bredsby dated August 28, 1951, at New York in the above-ceptioned mateer. You will note that this report sets forth a cummary of information available as to the background, associates and business connections of Keinstein, as well as the extent of his association with Fincetone. As you are every, Frinstein testified before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern listrict of New York on April 17, June 18 and June 27, 1951.

You will note from a review of this report that a confidential informant of known reliability has advised that, occording to Julius Rosenberg, an individual identified as Naxwell Finestone drove him (Rosenberg) to Ithaca, New York, on one occasion to pick up espionage data from Alfred Sarant. Further, that the trip was made in a 1840 or 1950 black Buick convertible with white top, which car is definitely believed to have been ewned by Weinstein. It is also pointed but that Garcth (Gary) Pichard, former roommate of Finestone and Weinstein, has advised that the latter owned a 1949 black Duick convertible with light top and that Finestone on a number. of occesions used this car and that he had it on the day the furniture was removed from the 65 Norton Street apertment. As you are owere, Assistant USA John H. Foley has advised on the besis of the aucilable information that the Covernment could now prove in a circumstantial manner that whis apartment was used by or captonege consultacy. 65-60359

Both Finestone and Weinstein Lave declined to be interviewed by agents of this Eureou. However, both appeared before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York and it is understood that they declined to answer any questions having pertinence to this espionage inquiry on the grounds of self-incrimination. EDWARD JAMET WEINSTEIN, wa. ESPIONAGE - R PERJURY INTERNAL SIGURITY ACT OF 1950

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent Richard T. Hradsky dated August 28, 1951, at New York in the above-captioned matter. It is noted that this report summarizes the background information concerning subject Weinstein, as well as the extent of the association of subject Weinstein and Maxwell Finestone.

A comparison has been made of the facts developed during the course of this investigation and the various statements made by subject Meinstein at the time of his interrogation in the Southern District of New York on June 18 and 27, 1851. Inasmuch as these statements were made under oath, there appears to be a possibility that he may have committed perjury. However, as you are aware, in order to establish such a violation on the part of Weinstein, it will be necessary to adduce proof as to the falsity of the statements by two competent witnesses and to definitely show a material connection with the espionage activities of the kosenberg network.

It was noted from a review of Weinstein's state:
ments that he advised he owned a 1949 Evick convertible during
the period from cround May, 1949, until the Summer of 1950.
Further, that this car was purchased by him from the Glidden
Buick Corporation in New York City and that the car was
fairly light gray in color with a natural convertible top.
It was also indicated by Weinstein that he had the convertible
top on the car replaced at a garage on the west side of 158th
Street, just off Riverside Drive, and believed this garage
was the Riverside Garage.

Julius Rosenberg to Ithaca, New York, where the latter picked up espionage data from Alfred Sarant and information furnished by Gareth (Gary) Pickard as to the use he moved from the 65 Morton Street apartment, it is considered that Weinstein's statement concerning the color of materiality to instant espionage inquiry.

Heinstein's statement concerning the absolute jalsity of Butck convertible has not been established. However, his statement is clearly inconsistent with that information obtained from Rosenberg and Pickerd. It is further noted that the certificate of sale from the Clidden Butck Corporation indicates the color of the car as gray. PURPOSE:

To advise that Leonard Blum, a practicing attorney in Cleveland, Chio, has indicated that in view of his close friendship with the Weinstein Family, he feels he could persuade Weinstein to cooperate with the Bureau and that he has offered to make the trip to New York City at his own expense in order to do so, if the Bureau desires and if such action would be helpful to the Weinstein Family.

To inform that the investigation to date has not indicated that Weinstein is implicated in espionage activities, but that he is in the position to furnish invaluable information in connection with the espionage investigation as to Max Finestone and the perjury investigation as to Weldon Bruce-Dayton, both of whom are allegedly members of the Rosenberg Espionage Network.

To recommend that the Cleveland Division be authorized to advise Blum that the Bureau accepts his offer and would appreciate any assistance he might desire to render in connection with this matter.

DETAILS:

The Bureau's interest in Edward James Weinstein is predicated upon information received from Jerome Eugene Tartakow, an informant who was incarcerated in the Federal House of Detention, New York City with Julius Rosenberg. According to this informant, Rosenberg allegedly advised that an individual who has been identified as Max Finestone was the last member recruited into his Espionage Network, and on one occasion, drove him (Rosenberg) to Ithaca, New York in order to cick up espionage materials from Alfred Sarant, another member of this Network. Further that this individual used the 1949 or 1950 Buick Convertible belonging to an individual who has been identified as Edward James Weinstein for this trip. It was also indicated to this informant by Rosenberg that Finestone was the espionage contact who sent Vivian Glassman to Cleveland, Ohio in order to give William Perl, another member of the group, the \$2,000 to flee the country.

The investigation conducted to date has failed to develop any information indicating reinstein was engaged in espionage activities, however, it was determined that Weinstein had been connected with such organizations as the New York State Young Progressives of America, the Cornell University Chapter of American Youth for Democracy and the Anti-Facist Refugee Committee. In addition it was learned through Attorney O. John Rogge, who is a friend of the Weinstein Family, that subject's father, Joseph Weinstein, has been worried about his son's associates whom he considered as radicals.

Weinstein, who was a fellow classmate of Finestone in Cornell University and lived in the same apartment with Finestone in New York City during 1950, declined to be interviewed by agents of the FBI. He likewise is reported to have refused to answer any pertinent questions concerning his association with Finestone and others when called upon to testify before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York in April and June, 1951. It is noted that Attorney Rogge has made an unsuccessful effort to persuade Weinstein to cooperate.

Leonard Blum, a practicing attorney in Cleveland, Ohio, was recently interviewed by agents of the FBI concerning an automobile which he was known to have purchased from the Weinsteins. Blum advised that he had just returned from New York City where he had visited for a few days with the Weinstein Family, whom he considers to be his closest friends. He indicated that while there he had discussed with Attorney Rogge the activities of subject, Weinstein. He informed that in view of his close friendship with the Weinstein Family, he felt that he would be able to persuade subject, Weinstein, to cooperate with the Bureau. He indicated that he thought he could bring this about either through direct contact with subject or through subject's father, Joseph Weinstein. Blum voluntarily offered to make the trip to New York City for this purpose at his own expense, if the Bureau desired him to do so and if he would thus be helping the Weinstein Family.

It is pointed out that in view of subject Weinstein's close association with Finestone, it is considered that he would be in the position to furnish considerable information as to the espionage activities and associates of Finestone and particularly as to Finestone's association with Rosenberg, Perl and possibly Dayton. This information would, of course, be of considerable value in connection with the present investigation as to Finestone and also with respect to the present contemplated perjury prosecution of Dayton.

In view of the foregoing, it does not appear that the Bureau has anything to lose by accepting Blum's offer, whereas there is a good possibility that much could be gained in the event Blum is successful in persuading subject, Weinstein to cooperate.

A check of Bufiles has failed to reflect any identifiable subversive information relative to Leonard Blum.

PECOMMENDATION:

It is therefore recommended that the Cleveland Division be authorized to re-contact Leonard Blum and advise him that the Bureau accepts his offer and would appreciate it if he found it convenient to go to New York City for the purpose of securing the cooperation of subject, Weinstein in this matter. A letter to the Cleveland Division is attached hereto for your approval.

LEDMARD BLUM was recontacted on Movember 7, 1951 by bis PRODUCTUR L. EDMARDS and JOHN B. O'ROLDGHUE, at which time he was advised of subject's uncooperative attitude with this Bureau. It was stressed to BLUM that a full and detailed interview between WEINSTEIN and Bureau representatives was most desirable and his assistance in procuring MILSTEIL's cooperation was solicited.

filling stated he had no immediate idea as to how he would be able to influence the subject himself, since he has seen JIMAY (MAINSTERN only rarely and for fleeting moments during the past few years. He pointed out, however, that as a child, the subject had always exhibited great respect and admiration for him and he feels that as a non-relative he may well wield greater influence than a member of the family.

BLUM also advised that JIMAY WEINCTEIN may have a high regard for Loctor ADMAFD FAREKY, who has been the family physician, but feels that a great deal of this respect may have worn thin as a result of FAREKY taving served a prison sentence for contempt, although RAUL stated he had no factual basis for either of these opinions. BLUM stated he had met BAREKY through the WEINSTEIN family and feels he, BAREKY, is not a Communist but rather a stubborn idealist who may well bear a resentment as a result of his conviction and jail term.

DLUM said he would give this problem of convincing the subject to cooperate, detailed study and would recontact this office prior to going to New York. He stated that he must visit Chicago and Milwankee, on business matters, within the next week or two but would have to be in New York by December 4 next, as his sister will be honored with an exhibition of her work at the Metropolitan Auseum of Art during that week. If at all possible, however, he will attempt to get to New York before that date.





DETAILS:

EDWARD JAMES WHINSTEIN, more commonly knowns as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was a friend and roommate of MAKWELL FILLESTONE, who was alleged to be the last individual recruited by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a Soviet agent, in his espionage network.

Information indicates that WEINSTEIN loaned his 1949 Buick Convertible automobile to FINESTONE to drive JULIUS ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, where he picked up espionage material from one ALFRED SARANT.

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen-year sentence for transmitting tertain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY COLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage MF JULIUS ROSEMBERG and his wife, ETHED were sentenced to death in April, 1951, in the Scuthern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

pavid and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue R.

Information obtained from MAX ELITCHER, who admits that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet esplorage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October, 1943, to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant T+1, of known reliability, advised on March 23, 1951, that JULIUS ROSENBERG "mentioned

"an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street, where he, JOEE BARR and BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSENFERG did not identify "BILL" at this time but, from other conversations the informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIAM FERL.

On July 10, 1951, T-1 stated that ROSENBERG informed him that this apartment was ostensibly rented for a student to have a place to study, but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bathroom. RCSENEERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARANT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944, and believes that he met JULIUS ROSEMBERG through a mutual friend named JUEL BARR. SARANT has denied that ROSEMBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSEMBERG, JCEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARANT'S apartment, number 6-I, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946, at which time the apartment at 65 Norton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JCEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARANT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARANT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARANT and JOEL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL, in sending the last money order payment in

January, 1950, attached a note requesting SARANT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau Agents in July-August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts is unknown.

WILLIAM PERE has been identified as a Soviet agent by ROSEMBERG to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL MARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBURG to DAVID GRUENGLASS following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. ROSENBURG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in European countries.

ALFRED SARANT has advised that JOEL BARR had a girl friend named VIVIAN GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAN GLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Morton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950, that a money order, number 988487, issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1959, payable to ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAL GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the First National Bank of Ithaca, New York. The money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN has advised upon interview that she was the former fiancee of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALFRED SARANT in payment of the rent on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1946. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950, to contact WILLIAM PERL with \$2,000 in eash and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States

and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist Agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSEBERG stated that on a holiday work-end, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University. PERL took these files to ROSENBERG'S apartment at Knicker-bocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSEBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAEL STDORCVICH, who he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile with a white top, either a 1949 or 1950 model, and that he had leaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit

who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT and make a pickup of espionage material. The date of the Ithaca trip would appear to have been either the weekend of June 3-4 or June 10-11, 1950, according to information furnished by DAVID GREENGLASS.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1, investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick Convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL FINESTONE, with alias MAXIFTMESTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTEIN is the son of JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies! garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTEIN, in an interview with Bureau Agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950, for a 1949 Buick Convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE from February, 1950, to about October-November, 1950.

MAX FINESTONE, who was born on July 28, 1922, at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University, having graduated in September, 1949, and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANT.

On April 5, 1951, VIVIM CLASSMAN was observed leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX FINESTONE.

JAMES WEINSTEIN appeared before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, in June, 1951, and a possible violation of the perjury statute by JAMES WEINSTEIN is being investigated as Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, has advised that the subject Acquaintances of subject have advised that subject's bulck was a dark color.

INVESTIGATION TO DETURMINE TRUE COLOR OF SUBJECT'S 1949 BUICK CONVERTIBLE AUTOMOBILE

On October 15, 1951, at the Monarch Buick Company, 1731 Broadway, New York City, it was ascertained that the Glidden Buick Company had moved to 131st Street and Broadway, New York City, in about September, 1950, and that all sales records had been moved there.

On October 24, 1951, at the Glidden Buick Company, Mr. CURTS advised that the following information is reflected on the sales records of this company concerning the sale of a 1949 Buick Convertible to JAMES WEINSTEIN, 211 Central Park West, New York City:

Mr. CURTS advised that the sales record indicates that this automobile had a standard transmission. He stated that the 1949 Buick automobiles were painted two shades of grey--a dark grey known as "summist" grey and a light grey known as "cumulus" grey. He stated that WEINSTEIN'S convertible was a dark grey color as indicated by the sales record reflecting its color as "summist." Mr. CURTS furnished two paint strip samples of these two colors and it is noted that the "summist" grey appears nearly black. The samples of the two colors are being furnished to the Eureau.

INVESTIGATION AT RIVERSIDE GARAGE WHERE SUBJECT HAD BUICK CONVERTIBLE TOP REPLACED

On October 27, 1951, at the Riverside Garage, 654 West 158th Street, New York City, JOSEPH HAMELBURGER advised that he had done the servicing of JAMES WEINSTEIN'S 1949 Buick. He stated that he remembers that this car was a dark grey color and that it originally had a tan canvas top on it. However, during the latter part of 1949, JAMES WEINSTEIN had brought his car into the garage for repair in a partly wrecked condition in that he had a window completely broken, his canvas top cut and torn, and the body of the car dented and scratched. He stated that WEIHSTEIN told him that he had just returned from Peekskill, New York, where he had gone to attend a concert featuring PAUL ROBESON, and that WEINSTEIN had been in the middle of the riot which took place there when the American Legion members of the vicinity led a protest against the holding of the concert. This protest developed into a rock-throwing melee in which a number of persons were injured. WEINSTEIN told him that his car had been stoned and clubbed during the riot, which accounted for its wrecked condition.

(PAUL ROBESON is a member of the Communist Party according to information received from Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, under the name JOHN THOMAS).

Mr. HAMMELDURGEN stated that he replaced the tan canvas top on WEINSTEIN'S 1949 Buick with a very light grey canvas top which looked almost white when it was installed and that he had made other necessary repairs to put the car back into normal operating condition.

Mr. HAMMELBURGER located a service invoice, number 15063, made out to JIMCHETHSTEIN, 211 Central Park West, New York City, dated September 16, 1949, in the amount of \$187.25, a copy of which he furnished to the reporting agent. This invoice reflects the installation of a new top for \$85.00; the installation of one glass window for

\$16.50; the straightening and painting of the left side of the car for \$43.00, and other services. A notation on the invoice indicates that it was paid by check on September 17, 1949.

Mr. HAMMELBURGER stated that he usually sent service invoices to the subject's father, JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, who paid the bills by check. He advised that he had no records for 1947 service and does not remember replacing the top on anyother Euick Convertible owned by the subject. Mr. HAMNELBURGER stated that he did not take over the Riverside Garage until 1948.

SALE OF SUBJECT'S 1949 BUICK CONVERTIBLE ON JULY 19, 1950

On October 15, 1951, at the Broadwest Motor Car Company, 2 West 61st Street, New York City, Mr. HOWARD E. GUEDALIA advised SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer that he purchased from JAMES WEINSTEIN, 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, a 1949 Buick Model 56C Convertible, motor number 53837655, Serial Number 35160786, bearing New York registration number 6269296, during the morning of July 19, number 2568. Mr. GUEDALIA described the seller of this automobile and his description coincides with the description of the subject.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that JAMES WEINSTEIN was alone when he offered this car for sale and that, after GUEDALIA had quoted the price of \$1,800 for the automobile, WEINSTEIN stated that he was going to check several other dealers before accepting the offer. GUEDALIA stated that the subject returned within an hour and the sales transaction was completed.

An examination of check number 2568 revealed that JAMES FINSTEIN had deposited this check at the Industrial Bank of Commerce of New York City on July 19, 1950.

It was noted that the date of the sale of the car and the date of the deposit was two daysafter the arrest of JULIUS ROSENBERG for conspiracy to commit espionage. JULIUS ROSENBERG was arrested on the night of July 17, 1950, and information concerning this arrest first appeared in the newspapers on the morning of July 18, 1950.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that the Buick automobile that he bought from JAMES WEINSTEIN was of a dark grey color and that it had two whitewall tires on it. He stated that he had cleaned and searched the car but that he recalls nothing of any interest having been found in the car.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that on July 21, 1950, he sold this car to one RUBY STROUD, 6124 Ridge Road, St. Louis, Missouri, certificate number A-205435, and that on August 31, 1950, he repurchased the car at New York City sold this car to one Dr. LEONARD J. FOX, 225 West 106th New York City.

Mr. ROBERT FOX, 225 West 106th Street, New York City, telephone number Academy 2-6519, advised on October 23, 1951, that he was the father of LEONARD FOX, the dentist, and that his son was at present either in Tokyo, Japan, or his son sold his Buick, which was a dark grey color, in New York City before he left to either a minister or a student studying for the ministry. Mr. FOX stated that he did not know the name or address of the individual to whom it was sold,

the New York State Bureau of Motor Vehicles for a transfer record of the sale by Dr. LEONARD J. FOX of the above-described Buick with negative results. He advised that the record system used in the New York State Bureau of on the registration record of the seller of a car purchaser's name must be known to determine the seller's name as it is not noted on the seller's registration unless he applies for a registration to another automobile.



FOX, 225 West 106th Street, New York City. The color of the car is listed as gray, seating capacity five, cylinders eight, weight 4,000 lbs., Plate Number of Furchaser 701625. The certificate reflected that the dealer had obtained ownership of the above car from RUBY STROUD, 6124 Ridge Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri, on August 31, 1950. Dealer Certificate Number was reflected as NU 380.



In this connection, it is recalled that on July 21, 1950, according to information received during the interview of VIVIAN GLASSMAN that an unknown man had appeared at her apartment on the night of July 21, 1950, and had given her \$2,000 in each and instructions for her to proceed to Cleveland, Chio, where she was to contact WILLIAM PERL and advise him to use the money to proceed to Mexico.

A check of bank records failed to reflect whether or not this check withdrawal had been immediately converted into eash.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that an effort was made to determine the identity of the banks on which the above deposits had been drawn in order to identify the source of the above deposits, but that it was impossible to trace them inasmuch as the tapes which would indicate this information are destroyed after a period of three months. Therefore, there is no method by which informant can ascertain this information.

T-5 advised that no Recordak records were maintained of these deposits.

It is noted that on July 20, 1950, subject withdrew 7,500.00, which date is one day before VIVIAN GLASSMAN received \$2,000.00 in cash to take to VILLIAM PERL in Cleveland, Ohio.

Information received Jan Confidential Informant T-4 and Confidential Informant T-5, as reflected above, is not to be made public except in a usual proceeding following the issuance of a subpoena.

Confidential Informant F-4 advised that ARRAPAN FARFAN, an attorney, is subject; uncle and is one of several KAUFMAN brothers who operate a real estate firm known as Kaufman Real Estate Company. The informant estimated the firm's holdings as about \$40,000,000 comprising principally real property in the grament district of New York City in the vicinity of lest 35th birdet. T-4 knew of no specific real property buned by subject but surmised that any such holding of subject would be handled by the RAUFMAN firm, possibly by ADR.HAM KAUFMAN. Informant advised that he believed that ADRAHAM KAUFMAN is a reputable, responsible individual and an anti-Communist.

INTERVIEW OF MR. O. JOHN ROGGE

On October 18, 1951 Mr. O. JOHN NOGGE, 401 Broadway, New York City, was interviewed by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer and he advised that he had formerly enjoyed intimately friendly relations with the WEINSTEIN family but that within the last two years he had not seen the WEINSTEINS as frequently as he used to. He stated that he had had lunch with JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, subject's father, several months previously and had called to his attention the fact that their respective families were not visiting each other as frequently as formerly and that JOE had said that it was pure neglect and that nothing had arisen between them to tend to cool the WEINSTEINS' regard for the ROGGE family.

ROGGE stated that a possible reason for the lengthening time between visits between them may be traceable to J.MES TWINSTEIF and Dr. TOWARD TARSHY of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, whom he believes have been telling subject's mother, Mrs. JOIEPH (BOBBLE LAUFMAN) VELUSTRIE, that ROGGE is a Fascist.

ROGGE stated that he was general counsel for the 16 Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee members who were tried for contempt in Mashington, D. C. and that Mrs. BOUBLE NELECTEIN was one of the 16 members cited and convicted. He stated that subject's mother received a suspended sentence and that since them JATES JATESTATE and BARSKY have endeavored to influence BOBBIE WEINSTAIN against him.

Mr. ROGGE advised that subject's sister, LOID'V' New had married an Army Air Force officer in the Summer of 1951 and that he had received an invitation to the wedding. He attited that the groom's last name was SOUTAG (phonetic) but was uncertain of its spelling and that his first name was unknown to ROGGE. He thought that SOUTAG, an Air Force Lieutenant, was now based at Kessler Field, near

Biloxi, Mississippi. Mr. ROGGE stated that he had never heard of LOIS having shown any interest in "left-wing" organizations such as the Joint Anti-Pascist Refuge Committee and that she and her father are much alike in their indifference to this type of activity while subject and his mother seem to manifest considerable interest in it.

Mr. ROGGE stated that EDPELH WEINSTEIN had once mentioned that her son, JANUS, gave a \$400.00 contribution to the Progressive Party and he believes that this was about in 1948. ROGGE assumed from the size of this contribution that JAMES JEHESTEIN must have a considerable investment income. He said that he believes that subject's father had made a division of property between his son and daughter and that one of BOBBIE VEINSTEIN'S brothers, possibly ABRAHA KAUFMAN, handled, the transaction. Mr. ROGGE said that ABRAHAM KAUFMAN, to the best of his knowledge, is anti-Communist and might have some information concerning subject.

Mr. ROGGE stated that he was acquainted with a very good friend of the HEINSTEIN family named LEONAGE ROUM who lives in Cleveland and had met him on several occasions at WEINSTEIN'S home. We advised that fr. BLUI was a very reputable individual and that he has known JAMES WEINST IN for many years.

ROGGE stated that the activities of JAMES VETWSTEIN within the last two years are unknown to him other than that he had rebelled against parental discipline and left home to live by himself. He advised that when subject entered Columbia University Law School in about 1949 or 1950 he offered to take him anto his law firm but that METUSTEIN studied law for only about one term and then discontinued his study and did not avail himself of the opportunity offered him.

Concerning the Progressive Party, mentioned as having received a \$4,00.00 contribution from subject, the September, 1948 issue of "Political Affairs", which identifies itself as "a magazine devoted to the theory and practise of Marxism and Leninism" contained on page 12 the election platform of the Communist Party which is set out in part as follows:

"The new Progressive Party is an inescapable historic necessity for millions who want a real choice between peace and war, democracy and fascism, security and poverty".

"The Worker", Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist newspaper, of February 12, 1950, Section 1, Page 8, Column 4, contained an article referring to the Progressive Party's preparation for a National Convention scheduled to be held in Chicago, February 24 to 26, 1950. The article noted that PAUL ROBESON and RAY LEV would give a concert at this convention.

Confidential Informant T-6 advised on March 14, 1948 that RAY LEV was a self-admitted member of the Communist Party.

INTERVIEW OF MR. JOSEPH VAINSTEIN

On October 13, 1951, Mr. JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, subject's father we interviewed by SA JOHMA. HARRINGTON and the writer at the Versailles Germent Company, Inc., 470 Seventh Avera, New York City, and he advised that he had met MAX PIRESTONE through his son, whom he referred to as "JIMMYKG, in about 1946 wither at Ithaca, New York, or at 211 Central Park Test, New York City, the WEINSTEIN home.

He stated that MAX FINESTONE was a follow student and friend of "JIMMY'S" at Cornell University in Tthaca, New York, and that he had brought WINESTONE to the WEINSTEIN home in New York City on several occasions. Mr. WEINSTEIN said that he has seen FINESTONE only about six times in five years and had folt an intense dislike for FINESTONE since their first meeting and that his dislike was based on a personal feeling toward FINESTONE because of his brusque aggressiveness. He stated that his acquaintance with FINESTONE was only a casual one and that he knows nothing about FINESTONE. Mr. WEINSTEIN advised that he had noted in speaking with FINESTONE that he expressed Communistic opinions in that he was opposed to the American system of capitalism.

He stated that he believes that FINESTOWE has influenced "JIMMY" into similar political thought to such an extent that "JIMMY" had asserted his independence and had left his parents! home and had taken an apartment at 418 East 9th Street, New York City, on the lower East Side of New York City, for the last two years.

Mr. WEINSTEIN has been to "JIMM'S" apartment only once which was shortly after "JIMMY" moved there in January 1950. He stated that he had offered "JIMMY" every educational and professional advantage that money can buy but that "JIMMY" seems to want to show him that he can make his own way and has become estranged from his parents.

He said that he had not seen "JIMAN" for about two months and that "JIMAN'S" mother, who is convalescing from a recent automobile accident, sees him almost as infrequently.

Informed that information had been developed indicating that his son had loaned his 1949 Buick convertible to FINESTOME and that it had been used to furnish transportation for JULIUS ROSENEURG to contact his espionage agents and pick up espionage material from them, possibly with subject's knowledge and agreement that it would be so used which would make him a co-conspirator in the ROSENBERG conspiracy to commit espionage, Mr. VEIUSTHIN expressed his belief that his son would not knowingly consent to the use of his car to further the ROSENBERG conspiracy and that if he did so he was influenced to do so by FIMESTOME.

It was pointed out that JAMES VEINCTLIN had sold his 1949 Buick on July 19, 1950, the day after the arrest of JULIUS ROSENBERG for conspiracy to commit espionage was reflected in the newspapers and Er. Walketell stated this could be a coincidence as his son had been contemplating the sale of this car because he wished to get a smaller car which did not require the expensive maintainance of the Buick.

Mr. WEINSTEIN was advised that Bureau agents had contacted subject for an interview at an earlier date but that he had refused to talk to the agents and that he had subsequently been subpoended to testify before the Federal Grand Jury in connection with hearings pertaining to the Resemberg espionage apparatus in June 1951, in connection with which the possibility existed that a perjury indictment against "JIMMY" might be brought.

The desirability of an interview between subject and Bureau agents was emphasized and Mr. WEINSTEIN stated that he did not know what he could do to persuade

subject to cooperate with the Eureau as he had little influence with his son and that his wife's influence was as ineffectual as his own. He stated that in view of the fact that his wife was very seriously injured in a recent automobile mishap and was just recovering that he hesitated to immediately discuss the situation with her but that he would have to bring it to her attention in some manner and that between them they might be able to formulate some plan of developing an inclination of subject to discuss his knowledge of his and FINESTONE'S activities in behalf of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that he would advise agents of his progress in this matter.

Mr. WEINSTEIN said that he believes that his son and FINESTONE are no longer friends and do not see each other any more but he did not know the cause of the alleged rift between them or when their estrangement began.

Mr. WEINSTEIN advised that subject has a supplemental income to whatever he personally earns in his livelihood. He explained that subject has an interest in some real estate and that he also receives the earnings of some investments that his parents have made for him.

He did not know where or if his son was employed at present and did not know the identity of any of his friends and assumed that he was still residing at 418 East 9th Street, New York City.

Mr. WEINSTEIN was shown photographs of individuals known to have been associated with the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus or acquainted with individuals therein for identification with negative results.

INTERVIE' OF MR. ABRAHAM KAUFTAH, ATTORNUY

On October 25, 1951, Mr. ABRAHAM KAUFMAN, attorney, 205 Test 34th Street, New York City, uncle of the subject, was interviewed by SA ROBERT F. BOYAL and the writer and he advised that he was a brother of subject's mother, BARBARA (BOBBIE) WEINSTEIN. Mr. HAUFMAN stated that he has had infrequent social or business contact with the MEINSTEIN family in recent years but that his sister had suffered a broken neck in an automobile accident several ments ago and that he had been instrumental in securing suitable hospitalization for her which has brought him into contact with the WEINSTEIN family again.

Concerning the subject, Mr. KAUFMAN advised that JAMES WITNSTEIN has been a problem child for his parents all his life and that subject appears to be intent upon getting into trouble. He stated that JAMES WEIUSTEIN had become uncontrollable and had left his parents' home and taken an apartment somewhere on the lower East Side of New York City about two years previously and has visited his parents' home infrequently since that time.

Mr. KAUFMAN said that subject has exhbitted considerable preference for Communist activities and seems to regard his lather, who is a wealthy man, as the personification of capitalism and of an economic system that he is opposed to; that MELICTRIM will not discuss the merits of political systems but regard anyone's opinion which differs from his own as valueless; and that although he has a brilliant mind, judged by his class standing when he graduated from high school and college, he has been indifferent to the opportunities offered him.

Mr. KAUFMAN stated that when subject graduated from Cornell University he offered him a position in his law firm and that subject entered Columbia University Law School for a brief time but then refused to continue his studies. He then left home and hes been very difficult.

to reach. Informed of subject's relationship with MAX FINESTOWE and his activities, Mr. KAUFMAN said that his personal relationship with subject had reached the point where subject acknowledges their meeting with a nod or a casual hollo and that WEINSTAIN has no respect for him or his opinion on any matter as he knows that he and KAUFMAN hold opposite viewpoints politically and economically. He said that WEINSTEIN holds most of his relatives in that estimation and that he will have to give the situation some serious thought to ascertain who of the relatives would have sufficient influence with subject to point, out the possible jeopardy in his position and the disgrace he would bring on his family and relatives to induce him to cooperate with the Bureau concerning his acts and knowledge of FINESTONE'S activities in behalf of JULIUS ROSINBURG.

Mr. KAUFMAN stated that he believes securing subject's cooperation will be a task of major proportion from what he knows about the character and will of the subject. He stated that Dr. EDW. RD BARSEY of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee scems to be subject's here and to exert considerable influence with WEINSTEIN and that subject will be very difficult to reason with in view of his apparent respect only for people who hold extreme liberal viewpoints and his indifference to his family. Mr. KAUFMAN said that he would make every effort to locate some relative who has enough influence to persuade WIINSTEIN to talk with Europa agents and would keep agents advised in this matter.

Mr. KAUFMAN advised that he does not handle any financial matters for JAMES VARIETHEN but that he understands that subject's father has settled some property on his son and daughter, its extent or income being unknown to him.

INTERVIEW OF VINCENT CLOPPL, O'GUER OF APARTMENT BUILDING

On October 22, 1951 fr. VINCENT CLOFFI, contacted to obtain a copy of the lease covering. Apartment B-2 at 418 East 9th Street, new York City, which is occupied by JAMES 1217 of the Lease covering search of his records to locate the Lease for this nade a apartment in the building except B-2. INTERVIEW OF JOHN M. CLOFFI

On October 24, 1951 Mr. JOHR M. CIOFFI, 43-25 - 47th Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York, telephone number Stilwell 4-2681, telephonically advised that he has been handling the collection of rents at the 418 East 9th Street apartment house since July 1951 and that JAMES WEINSTEIN, the present holder of Apartment B-2, had failed to pay his rent for the month of Jetober, 1951. He stated that MEINSTEIN has been very slow in paying his rent for the last six months and that he is contemplating eviction proceedings against MEIN MENH. Mr. CIOFFI stated that he is certain that his lease for this apartment has been signed because he recalls having seen the lease within the last year but that he had previously endeavored to locate the lease among the records of his father without success.

Mr. CIOFFI stated that in connection with his father's statement that a domestic employed in his father's apertment may have taken the least, that he does not believe that this is probable. He stated that he has interviewed all employees who have ever worked for his father and has checked their references and that he has no reason to believe that any of them were dishonest or had any interest in the lease or were in any way acquainted with JAMES WEI STEIN. Mr. CHOFFT stated that he would make an additional search to locate this least among other records kept by his father and that, falling this, he would endeavor to contact JAMMO TANK TELL as Apartment B-2 at 418 East 9th Struct ostensibly to obtain the October rent and would at that time ask WEIF TEIN if he has a copy of the lease. He stated that he would tell WEINSTEIN that he wished to check the expiration date of the lease and that he would endeavor in some menner to rotain the copy of the lease long enough to secure a copy for the Buroau.

On October 29, 1951 Mr. JOHN CIOFFI advised that he had contacted the subject at 418 East 9th Street, New York City, to obtain payment of the October rent and had inquired of WEINSTEIN if he planned to renew his lease which had expired. He stated that WEINSTEIN said that he did not believe that his lease had expired and that WEINSTEIN produced his lease to show that the lease would not expire until December 31, 1951. WEINSTEN also stated that he did not plan to renew his lease and would be moving within the near future. CIOFFI offered to make up a new lease for the subject in the event he should change his mind and retained the initial lease to use as a reference in drawing up a new lease.

Mr. CIOFFI provided the lease upon request, which was photostated for a copy thereof. Examination of the lease reflects that it is made out to MAX FINESTONE as tenant and was drawn on December 9, 1949, to run from January 1, 1950 to December 31, 1950 at a rental of \$100.00 per month. It is signed by both MAX FINESTONE and JAMES WEINSTEIN. Mr. CIOFFI stated that he believes that the superintendent, Mr. TOLMUNEN drew the lease. A photostatic copy of the lease is being enclosed to the Bureau.

FINTERVIEW OF MR. AND MRS. EERO TOLMUMIN, SUPERINTENDENTS, 418 EAST OTB STREET, NEW YORK CITY

intendent of the apartment building at 416 East 9th Street, New York City, advised that he recalls that in December, 1949 two men appeared at his apartment to sign a least for Apartment B-2 and that one man told him that he was formerly in the Merchant Marine and that the other had estated that he had formerly been in the United States Havy. Mr. TOLMINEH identified a photograph of MAX FINESTONE as the individual that stated that he had served in the Merchant Marine and JAMES WEINSTELM, the present occupant and the individual who pays the rest for Apartment B-2, as the individual who had informed him that he had been in the United States Navy.

Mr. TOLMHHEN stated that he recalls FINESPONE left the apartment before the lease was signed and that the present occupant, JAMES "ETHSTELH, was the individual who signed the lease for Apartment 8-2. Mr. TOPHUNE stated that WETH TENH is in arrears on his rent for the menth of October and that WETH TENH is, although a little slow, has been paying the rent for the apartment personally ever since it was leased in D. comber, 1949. He stated that he believes that the lease was so run for a period of two years.

Mrs. TOLMFEN identified subject's photograph as that of the two individuals who signed the lease for apartment B 2.

INTERVIEW OF MISS HELISANDE "HONNY" CONGDON

Miss MELISANDE "HONKY" COMGDON, who resides at the Evangeline residence, 123 West 13th Street, New York City, telephone number CH 2-2400, was interviewed by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL on June 25, 1951, and September 20, 1951. Miss COMGDON advised that she is an employee in the Personnel Section at Lever Brothers, Park Avenue and 59th Street, New York City, and that she is a graduate of Smith College, North Hampton, Massachusetts, class of 1949.

Miss CCNGDON stated that she met one GABY PICKARD in October or November, 1949, through his sister, Hiss JOAN PICKARD, who is now known as Mrs. ROBERT T CRAIG, who worked with her at Lever Brothers. She advised that GARY PICKARD was at that time residing with MAXWELL FINESTONE at an address on Morton Street, New York City. She stated that she believes the number was 65 Morton Street, and the apartment was located on the sixth or top floor of that building.

Miss CCNGDON identified a photograph of MAX FELL FINESTONE and stated that she possibly met him the first time in November, 1949, and that she definitely recalls that he and CARY PICKARD were then residing together at the 65 Morton Street apartment.

Miss CONGION recalled that, during the Christmas holiday period in 1949, she saw JOHN DAVID MILE, HARGED LINDSEY GATTY, RONALD CATTY, and a couple whose name she could not recall and a friend of theirs by the name of ART BANKS in the 65 Morton Street apartment.

Miss CONGDON reviewed her engagement calendar and found an entry dated December 30, 1949, which reflected that she met ART BANKS and others at the Morton Street apartment on that date. She noted that on January 7, 1950, she attended a party at the 418 East 9th Street address, which was attended by FAX FINESTONE, JAMES WEIMSTEIN, CARY PICKARD and herself and possibly two or three others.

IIY 65-15773

Miss CONGDON stated that it was possible that on this evening MAX FINESTONE and GARY PICKARD drove her to her residence, which was then the Millband House, 11 Mast 10th Street, Few York City, from the 9th Street address in JAMES WEINSTEIM'S 1949 Buick Convertible. She described this convertible as being a dark grey convertible.

Miss CONGDON noted an entry for January 20, 1950, in her engagement calendar which reflected that she spent the afternoon and evening at the Morton Street apartment with GARY PICKARD. She recalled that they had quite a collection of records and, during the early part of the day which was a Saturday, they listened to operatic selections.

During the January 28, 1950, visit to the Herton Street apartment, Miss CONGRON recalled that the superintendent, a new tenant, and two or three other individuals who were allegedly relatives of the new tenant, viewed the Morton Street apartment. (Mr. THOMAS DOMOVAN and his two sisters, Mrs. FRANK GARLAND and Mrs. THOMAS McGHLL and Mr. THOMAS McGHLL have advised that they visited Apartment 6-1 at 65 Morton Street with the superintendent on that approximate date. The DOMOVANS rented Apartment 6-1.)

Miss CONGDON recalled that approximately two to four days later GARY PICKARD visited her at her residence and advised that MAX FINESTONE had assisted him in moving the remaining furnishings of the Morton Street apariment to the basement of that building for storage. She definitely recalled that GARY PICKARD stated that he had an entremely difficult time in persuading MAX FINESTONE to assist him this moving operation and that PICKARD had stated that, during the course of moving on January 29, 1950, which was a Sunday, the two men who were associates of MAX FINESTONE dropped in on him.

Miss CONGDON stated that CARY PICKARD advised her that FINESTONE did not fully identify there two men, but that it is her definite recollection that one or both of these men were connected with Cornell University. (GINE PICKIND has advised that MAX FINESTONE introduced these two her as

"BILL" and "BRUCT," and he has subsequently identified photographs of WILLIAM PERL and WELDON DRUGE DAYTON as the two men who called on MAX FINESTONE at the time that they were moving the furniture from the apartment into the basement of the building at 65 Morton Street. WELDON BRUCE DAYTON in March, 1941, was a teaching assistant in the Department of Physics in the University of California and was working part-time in the maintenance and operation of the 37-inch cyclotron in the radiation laboratory. June, 1941, to July, 1944, DayTON was employed as a physicist in charge of magnetic ranges, Degaussing Section, Twelfth Naval District, Mare Island Haval Yard. In March, 1945, he was employed with the California Institute of Technology conducting confidential research in projects connected with war rockets. AFRED SARANT has advised that WELDON ERUCE DAYTON was a close friend and neighbor ct Ithacs, New York. DAYTON'S wife, CARCL, accompanied LIFRED SAR MT on his flight from the United States in August, 1950, and secured the necessary parmit for ALFRED SARANT to enter Mexico using her husband's name, BRUCE D.LYTON. WELDOW BRUCE D.LYTON is at present amployed in the . Massachusetts Institute of Technology.)

Miss CONGDON stated that it is her impression street apartment from a friend and that the name of ALTRED SARANT, when suggested to her as the friend, sounded familiar. A photograph of ALTRED SARANT was exhibited to possibly may have met ALTRED SARANT at the \$\pm\$10 Tast 7th viewing her engagement calendar that she was at the 9th Street apartment on February 19, 20, and 28, 1750.

It should be noted that ALFRED SAR NT is known to have been in the New York City area on February 19 and 20, 1950.

that MAX FINESTONE and GARY PICKARD paid no rental for the friend had loaned the apartment to him.

Miss CONGDON advised that her engagement calendar reflects an entry dated March 10, 1950, at which time she attended a housewarming party at the 418 East 9th Street apartment at which possibly 20 to 25 people were present. One of the individuals present, she recalls, was JUDY NCGUL, a former classmate at Smith College. She stated that she does not know Miss MOGUL'S address, but believes that she lives in the New York City area.

Photographs of WELDON BRUCE DIYTON were exhibited to Miss CONGDON and she advised that the photographs were familiar and that she could possibly have not him at the 9th Street apartment. When shown a photograph of MILLIAM PERL, she stated that she believes that she possibly not PERL at the 9th Street apartment with ELEANON GLISSIAN, sister of VIVIAM GLASSMAN, whose photograph she also stated was familiar.

A photograph of VIVIAM GEASSMAN was exhibited to Miss CONGDON and she stated that, although she was not familiar, she recalled that MAX PINESTONE had spoken of a girl as "VIVIE."

Miss CONGDON was unable to identify a photograph of LOUISE SARINT, but she recalled that MAX FINESTONE had spoken of "PUSS" or "PUSSY" and indicated that he had lived with her prior to her marriage to ALFRED SARINT.

Concerning the use of the 1940 Buick Convertible by MAX FINESTONE, Miss CONGDON advised that FINESTONE had told her that he occasionally had use of the cer; that all he had to do was to ask JHES WEIFSTERN for it; and that he would loan the car thereafter to him.

Miss CCMGDON stated that, during the period that she had known MIX FIMESTONE and the ensuing several months in which she had heard about him through others, he had made several trips to Ithaca, New York. She stated that, when he mentioned a trip to Ithaca, New York, he would avoid details; and, therefore, she was unable to furnish any specific dates or excumptances surrounding his Ithaca, New York, trips.

Miss CONCOON advised that she had not been to the apartment at 418 East 9th Street, New York City, since March, 1950, and that the last time she had seen MAX PINESTONE was a chance meeting in the fall of 1950 or the spring of 1951, when she met FINESTONE in one of the New York subways. She stated that, at this meeting, FINESTONE was extremely aloof, and that she was unable to successfully indulge him in any lengthy conversation.

INTERVIEW OF JOH! DAVID LYLE

JOHN DAVID LYLE was interviewed on August 20, 1951 at the Los Angeles Division by SA TOWAS E. BRYANT. LYLE stated that he was residing with his parents at 108 1/2 South Sultana Avenue, Temple City, California, and that he had sublet an apartment at 27 Elliott Road, Lexington, Massachusetts, as he expected to proceed to New York City in the near future to take a position at the Scott Meredith Company, literary agents, at 508 Fifth Avenue, New YorkCity.

LYLE advised that he had met MARVELL PINESTONE at Cornell University in the Fall of 1947 through two students who had asked him to live with them, namely, LEDNARD MARSAK and MARVINDMILLS. He stated that FINESTOWN was a friend of theirs and during the time he resided with them FINESTOWE visited their apartment on several occasions. At that time, according to LYLE, FINESTOWE was attending the International Labor Helations School at Cornell University. He stated that he saw FINESTOWE regularly until about the Fall of 1949 at which time FINESTOWE went to New York having left school in June 1949.

Subsequent to FINESTME'S departure from the University in the Fall of 1749, LYLE stated he occasionally visited New York City at which time he would stay with FINESTME at his apartment on Morton Street. However, he stated he was not certain of this number. He definitely recalled that the apartment was on the 5th or 6th floor and located in the rear of the building. He stated on these occasions when he visited FINESTONE at the Morton Street apartment, GAMY PICKARD, whom he had met at Cornell University in the Fall of 1949, was living with FINESTONE.

IMLE stated that in the latter part of January 1950 he and LITDET GATTY, a fellow student at Cornell University, went to New York City where they moved into

the apartment located at 418 East 9th Street, which was then occupied by FIMESTOLE, PICKARD and JAMES WITHSTELL, whom LYLE had previously met at Cornell University and who was a close friend of TIMESTOWE. LYLE stated that all resided at this apartment for about two weeks after which GATTY, PICKARD and LYLE obtained their own apartment at 780 Greenwich Street and FIMISTOME and VETWITETT remained at 418 East 9th Street.

FINESTONE on weekends at the Morton Street apartment house he did not recall meeting anyone, although he stated it was possible that friends of FIVE TOO may have dropped in. He stated, however, that during the time he resided with FINESTONE, et al. at the 9th Street apartment, and subsequently when he visited FINESTONE after having obtained his own apartment, the met many of their friends and recal's specifically JACK TUKOFT and his wife. He stated MINESTONE was a former student at Cornell University and he did not know whether the latter was a particular Triend of FIVESTONE or WEILSTONE.

IMLE also recalled at one gathering at the 5th Street apartment, subsequent to the time he had moved, that among the guests of FINESTONE and JATASTATE was PAUL 108 MON, JR., son of the Negro singer, and his wife. LYLE advised that FAUL ROBESON, JR. and JACK MINKOPF had been recommates at Cornell University.

Also at this gathering Lill recalled one DAWN MARION, whom he identified as a former student at Cornell University and whom he believed was attending Columbia University at the present time. In addition, a young couple named BARRIE and BARBARA FILDRY, also former students at Cornell University, were present at this time.

Among the guests, the enjerity of whom were former Cornell students, was a close friend of FI (EST) a, one MARTY (MORAL), whom LYLE described as a union organizer

in Pennsylvania, possibly representing the International Ladies Garment Workers Union, although LYLE was not certain of this. LYLE stated MORAN was a frequent visitor at FINESTONE'S as was another guest, one JOHNSWARQUESSE who is believed by LYLE to be presently attending Cornell University. In this connection, LYLE pointed out FINESTONE and his friends regularly frequented an Italian restaurant named JOHN CARDINELLI'S located on Houseon Street near the inter-section of Sullivan, and that MORAN, MARKUESCE, and FINESTONE went to this restaurant on many occasions. At that time LYLE stated this restaurant was identified by a large red awaing.

Also present was RUFI (AM)Rd (phonotic) and wife MARILYM, who were former students at Cornell University and lived in the neighborhood a few blocks north of 9th Street. Both of these individuals were friendly with FINESTONE and WELLSTEIN, according to LYLE. LYLE could not recall any other individuals present at this time.

LYLE advised that while at Cornell Eniversity FINESTONE and WEINSTEIN were members of a campus political organization known as The Young Progressives of America, which LYLE described as the "most left wing organization on the campus". LYLE stated he could not recall the specific occasion but believes that at one time or another FINESTONE asked him to join this organization which he declined. However, FINESTONE was active in the organization and he recalls that on one occasion the Young Progressives of America invited HOMARD FAST, the novelist, to speak before the group and FINESTOME invited LYLE to go with him to Syracuse. New York to drive FAST from there to Ithaca. LYLE stated he accompanied FINESTONE and was introduced by him to FAST.

With regard to his visit to New York Jity during the Christmas vacation of 1940, LYLE stated he recalled being in New England at this time and around

December 26 or 27th he drove from Boston in his jeep and brought with him MORMAN-BOIRTER and his wife, SHINLEY POIRIER. LYLE stated he had been in the Navy with FOIRIER and following his return from the Navy JOIPT R attended Cornell University at which time LYLE introduced POIRIER to FIRESTONE and WEINSTEIN.

LYLE stated that they wint to the Morton Street apartment and when they arrived FIU DETOWI, ILCHAED and GATTY were there. He stated he believes that a girlfriend of PICKIED was also present, although she may have dropped in at some time during the next few days. LYLE could not recall the name of this girl other than the nickname "NORME".

LYLE stated that all of the above were present at this apartment from around Documber 26 or 27th to about January End, and, in addition, on at least one night, ARTHUR BANKS, a former roommate of LYLA at Cornell, who presently resides at 5153 Shorrier Place, N. Wp, Jashington, D. C., also spent the night at this spartment. On this occasion LYLE stated the following individuals would have been present at one time or another in the apartment: PINUSTONE, PICHARU, GATTY, MANNS, SUR WAS FOIRIER, SHIRLEY POIRIER, and LYLE. LYLE stated that two or three people shared the bed and couch and one or two slept on the flior. He stated he bulieves that on one or two occasions to relieve the congestion he stayed at the Hotel Lexington. LYLE stated that during this period he, GATTY and BLEKS attended social affairs sponsored by the few York debutante set and that to the best of his knowledge PICKARD and FINESTONE were working and he saw very little of thom.

at Morton Street was for conomic reasons and was not used as a place for social gatherings but rather as simply a

place to sleep. LYLE stated that during this puriod ho does not recall any individuals other than the above visiting the apartment for any purpose.

With regard to the apartment at Morton Street, he stated that FIMESTOME on one occasion explained to him that it belonged to friends of FIMESTOME named SARANT, who were then living in New Jersey but had formerly lived in the apartment and were retaining it since they might return to New York. Later, at the time FIMESTOME gave up the apartment, he explained to LYLE that the SARAMES had decided to release the apartment. Photographs of ALFRED SARANT were displayed to LYLE who was unable to identify them and stated he never recalls hearing the name other than in the course of the above explanation by FIMESTOME.

btained their apartment, FINESTO A offered them a couch and two chairs which had formerly been in the Morton Street apartment and which were them stored in the basement of the Morton Street apartment building. The stated that he recalls, to the best of his knowledge, in the letter part of January 1950 going to the Morton Street apartment house with PICHARD, contacting the superintendent of this building, and obtaining the above-mentioned furniture from the basement. He stated he recalls seeing one or two of the tenants of the building in the harlway during the tree they were moving this furniture but was unable to identify these individuals by name.

Concorning FINESTONE, LYLL stated that he was practically without funds on most occasions. However, WEINSTEIN appeared to have sufficient funds as his family was wealthy.

LYLE stated that he believes WMINSTEIN 19ft Cornell in June 1949 and thereafter attended Columbic Law School. He stated he understood WEI STEIN also worked for the Progressive Party in New York during his residence with FINESTONE.

During his association with FIMESTONE and MEINSTEIN, EVEL stated neither mentioned or indicated membership in the Communist Party although from FIMESTONE'S conversation in particular LYEE regarded him as "definitely very left wing." When asked to explain this description the time legislation was pending to outlaw the Communist Party that FIMESTONE was bitterly opposed to this and so expressed himself.

FINESTONE and VIINCTEIN no indection was give by either that they were engaged in any suspicious activities and that at no time was he ever requested by them to perform any service.

at the New York Julies by SA ROBERT F. ROZAL and the writer, at which time he stated that he recalled that the number of the apartment building u s 65 forten street and that the number of apertment was located on the sexth and top floor of the building. He stated that the first time he recalls having gone to this apartment was during the Christmas 1949 holiday period and bollows that he arrived approximately a day or NORMAN POIRIOR to New York in his joep.

In reviewing the guests or occupants at the 65 Morton Street apartment during that period, he noted the individuals as set out above in his interview on August 20, 1951. He stated that the only other time that he was at the Morton Street apartment building other than during the Christmas of 1949 holiday period was probably subsequent to February 17, 1950.

LYET stated that he and MARY PICKARD had transported the remaining furniture which had been stored in the Morton Street apartment building becoment to 700 Green-wich Street, which is a nearby Greenwich Village address, via his jeep.

It is noted that LYLE, FARDED LIBERT, GATEM and PICKARD resided together at 780 Greenwich Street subsequent to February, 1951, for a period of several months; the exact detes of which have not been determined, but LYLE believes that it probably began in the letter part of February 1950 or early March 1950.

LYLE stated that a definitedly does not recall over having see EDWART JAMIS MEMOTETE at the Horton Street apartment building.

LYLE was unable to definitely recall how FINESTONE and/or PIC and extended the invitation to himself and the others mentioned above to use the Forton Street apartment during the Christmas 1949 heliday period, but thought that it was possible that the invitation was extended through mutual friends. He stated that he recalled that GARY PICHAPD had returned to Cornell University for a short visit, possible in October or Movember 1949, and that the invitation may have been extended by PICKAMP at that time. He also recalled that JAMES WALESTAIN and MAX FIGESTO E shopped off to visit him for a very short time while caroute to syracuse, New York, during the Pall of 1949 prior to the Christmes heliday period.

LYLE recalled that MEINSTEIN had driven his 1949 Buick convertible which he described as being a dark green color and having a light tan top.

LYLE stated that he resided at 416 East 9th Street for approximately two weeks in February 1950, prior to moving to the 780 Greenwich Street address. He stated that this was the apartment of JAMLS WEIGHTEIN and WAX FINESTONE and that HAROLD LINDSEY GATTY, GARY FICKARD, and himself were residing there.

LYLE was questioned as to the address of RUBY PANORR (phonotic) and his wife, MARILYM, who were former students at Cornell University and living in the neighborhood a few blocks north of the 9th Street address.

It was recalled that DAVID GREEJGHUSS had advised that JULIUS ROSTERAG had once offered him an apartment consisting of three rooms in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B. New York City.

LYLE accompanied SAS RICHARD T. HRADSHY and ROBERT F. ROYAL to the 9th Street vicinity on September 15, 1951, and thereafter convessed several blocks north of 9th Street in an attempt to locate the address of RUEY PANOTR.

LYLE identified 425A East 12th Street as the address at which the PAMORE had resided and stated that they had lived on the second floor of this building. He stated that he thinks that their name is probably spelled PAMORE and that AUBY is a nickname for RUBIN.

It was ascertained that 425A East 12th Street, New York City, is located in the middle of the block on 12th Street between First Avenue and Avenue A.

Mr. HINRY BRILL, with offices at 570 Seventh Avenue, New York City, telephone number PA 6-8176, advised

SAS RICHARD T. MMADSKY and ROBINT F. ROWAL of September 15, 1951, that he is an agent for the 425A Mast 12th Struct address, and recalls that Mr. and Mrs. R. FAR ON formerly resided in apartment 2% at this address and that at is his understanding that they now reside somewhere on the West Coast.

DAVID GREENGLASS has advised that it is his definite recollection that the apartment with that it is his definite recollection that the apartment that JULIUE ROSSIEURG offered him consisted of three rooms, it would appear that the PANTOR apartment is not identical with the open offered by ROSENEERG.

DYLE stated that he recalled that MAX PI ESTORE on occasions would borrow JAMMA (PIU) Et its 1949 Buied convertible while he resided to the 9th street address. He stated that in this connection he also recalls that in the Fall of 1947 up until the time that FIPESTOLE and WEIMSTELF graduated in 1949 from Cornell University, that FIFESTO E would accompany (MIA) Told to Vew York City, a great many or (EIMST IN) visits to New York City.

LYTE stated that FIMESTO W had mentioned once that JAMES TELL CHILL'S fearly did now approve of him and that it was his understanding that FIMESTONE had at one time been interested in JAMES MINORITY Sister, LOIS.

LCLE further advised that FINESTOLL had had the almost exclusive use of his juep for transportation from his home to Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, while attending Cornell University during the Fall of 1948. He believed that FIVESTON a may have on one or two occasions used this juep to travel to New York City. He was unable to furnish any additional details pertaining to these alleged trips by LYESTO jeep. He believed that

FINESTONE might possibly have used his joep during the Spring Term of 1949 but stated that he was at his Massachusetts address during the Summer of 1949, and, therefore, FICTIONN'S use of his jeep must have concluded with the end of the Spring Term of 1949. He stated that FINESTOFT had volunteered to keep the jeep in good repair and pay for the gas and oil and that he had decided to allow FINESTOOD the use of his jeep during the abovementioned periods.

LYLE advised that in addition he recalls that sometime prior to September, 1950 MAK FINESFORE told him in what he believed was a joking meaner that LYME should not contact him by telephone execut at paybooths. LYLE stated that he thought this was a rather strange thing and MAX FINESFORE indicated in a rather vague way that he desired this so that no one would be ever able to trace LYLE'S calls to him if he would employ telephone booths for telephonic communication.

Photographs of individuals known to have been connected with the ROSENERG espionage appearatus and other associated individuals were exhibited to LYLE with negative results.

DARIEM MARIUM resided at MINSTEIM'S apartment at 418 East 9th Street, New York City, sometime in 1950 and that MARIEN was either a zoology and a biology major at Cornell University and possible graduated in the June, 1949 class. He stated that he was a close friend of both JAMES WEIMSTEIN and MAX FINESTON and that he moved into the East 9th Street apartment possibly around the time that MAX FINESTONE left or maybe a short time prior to his leaving. He said that he had heard that MARIEM was studying natural history as Columbia University as a graduate student and that the last time that he had heard anything pertaining to MERIEM was that he was residing with JAMES MARIEM.

LYLE also advised that he recalled JAMES MEINSTEIN had a girlfriend whom he dated both in Ithaca, New York, and in New York City whose name was MARILYN MILLS and whose nickname was "MALLY" MILLS. She was the sister of MARVIN MILLS, a roommate of LYLE at Cornell University. LYLE stated that she was acquainted with MAX FINESTONE and that in early 1949 she, FINESTONE and JAMES WEINSTEIN drove from Ithaca, New York to New York City in subject's car, which was to the best of LYLE'S knowledge, an old Buick of about a 1944 model. LYLE said he believes that MARILYN lives with her mother, ADA, who is a widow, in New York City, and on consulting an address book furnished her address as 33-11 - 74th Street, Jackson Heights, New York, telephone number NA 4-7733.

LYLE said that he thought that MARILYN HILLS may be attending Queens College in Flushing, New York.

INTERVIET OF HAROLD LINDSEY GATTY

On August 14, 1951 FAROLD LINDSEY GATTY, Company B Glass 36, A. O. C. Division, was interviewed by SA WILLIA! J. BLACK at Fort Biley, Kanses, concerning his association with MAXWELL FIGURE ONE, JAMES WIINSTEIN and GARY PICKALD.

He stated that he met GARY FICKARD at Cornell University at Ithaca, New York around July or August of 1949 through a mutual acquaintance newed MARIAN PORTER now Mrs. JAME SHIRW DD, who presently resided in Philadelphia, Fennsylvania. He stated that he saw PICKARD quite often until PICKARD left Ithaca, New York in September 1949 when he went to Pleasantville, New York to his home and then on to New York where he resided at 65 Morton Street. He stated that he saw PICAARD again during the Christmas holidays of 1949 when David, LYLE, POIRIER, and his wife, SHILLEY, and himself, who were all students at Cornell, were invited by MAX FIMIN TOME and GARY PICKARD to stay at their apartment at 65 Forton Street. He stated they stayed there for approximately four to ton days. He stated tout they only stayed there as night and did not associate With FILLS TO E or PICKARD or FIGESTONE'S crowd. He stated that LYLL, POIRIER, FOIRIER'S wife, and himself returned to Cornell on January 2, 1950. He said a few weeks later during final examinations at Cornell, FICKARD dans back to Ithace for a few days. GATTY advised that he and LMLT, and their roommate, ARTE R SAEHE, put PICKARD up in their aparument at 140 College avenue, Ithaca, New York while he was there.

After graduation the 1st of February, 1950, GATTY stated, he went to New York City, and, being out of a job and short on money, he stayed at 418 Ninth Street, at WILL TEIL'S and FIRESTONE'S apartment. He stated that 's stayed there with PICKARD, WEINTELL, FIRESTONE and EYLE until LYDE, FICKARD, and himself rented an apartment at 780 Gracowich Street approximately two weeks after moving in with GAMESTONE and Coll STRIN. He stated that about August, 1957 PICKARD less New York

to go to Las Vegas, Nevede to obtain a divorce and he and LYLE moved to 353 West 57th Street, Apartment 4-D. He advised that he stayed there a couple of weeks and enlisted in the Army on September 12, 1950.

He stated that he met MAKUELL FINESTOUL during the Christmas of 1948 in New York City. He said that he was closely associated with FIUESTOUE at Cornell until fIUESTOUL graduated about June 1949. He stated that FINESTOUL'S home is in Ithaca, New York and he saw him frequently until he moved to New York City. He advised that after LYL., FICHARD and himself moved to 780 Greenwich Street, he did not see much of LUESTOUE or MAINTERIM.

GATTY stated that he not JAMES MENISTELL through MAX FINELIO & at Cornell decine early 1949. stated what he may have known has carlier but he could not recall ever having mot him before. He stated Williams and FINESIO'N were always together while they were ut school and he drank beer and partied with them some. he stated that they were living at 418 East 9th Street when he onlisted in the Army in September 1950. He stated that several times at drinking parties that FICALRD, Life and himself would get in "bull sessions" and argue political issues with MIN ST IL and FRIEST) M. He crated upon several occasions FIMESTONE and EI/STEIN tried to persuade them to join various organizations such as the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, the American Youth for Democracy, and about six other clubs at Cornell University that Communict sympathizers belonged to. He stated that LYLE and himself never had anything to do with them and he believed that FICH. AL did not either.

The photographs of FIVESETTI, F RL, DATTON, ROSERBERG, GLASSWAY (METALTOR), and TARAST were shown to SATTY and he stated that he never and MILLER HELDE before but he did recognize FIVESTOWN and thoughthe had met SARAMT at Itimea, New York during the Sammer of 1949. GATTY stated that FINESTONE told him that SARANT gave him the apartment at 65 Torton Street for a place to stay while SARANT and his wife were away. He stated that he never saw SARANT or PERL while he was staying there during the Christmas holiday of 1949 and had no reason to question FINESTOW: any further about the apartment. He said that he did not notice anything unusual happening in the apartment at 65 Morton Street during the Christmas holiday of 1949 but that he would not have anyway because he was only there at night time. He said that the apartment has very little furniture and no telephone at that time. He stated that IMLE, FIRMER, and his wife, SHIRLMY, and himself slept on the Floor while they were at 65 Morton Street.

GARTY stated that he could not recall seeing Mr. EDIYM, the superintendent of the apartments at 65 Morton Street, during the holidays. He said that while they were staying at 65 Morton Street during the Christmas holidays of 1949, there were no other persons present in this apartment during the time that they stayed there. He further advised that he never saw fullow BAUGE DAYTON during the holidays at 65 Morton Street.

LEONARD PLUM was recontacted on January 7, 1952, at which time he advised he had been able to make only one trip to New York since the date of the last contact and that . due to weather conditions at the time of the trip he was able to spend only nalf a day in New York City. He stated that although he did have dinner with the WEINSTEIN family he had no occasion to speak to JOSEPH-WEINSTEIN without the presence of JOSEPH's wife, BOBBIE: BLUM has advised that due to the serious physical condition of Mrs. WEI'STEIN he does not feel that she should be burdened with any of the problems concerning her son.

BLUM advised that business interests will necessitate his remaining in Cleveland for sometime and he further pointed out that it is his understanding the LEINSTEIN Camily is now in Florida and will probably remain there for another three weeks.

FLUM said that at his first opportunity he will again contact the WEINSTEIN family in an attempt to feel-out the subject and influence him to cooperate with this Bureau.

It is the opinion of the Interviewing agent that ELUI may well be trying to ease out of his implication in this matter in order to avoid embarrassment and animosity between himself and the WEINSTEIN family and, therefore, unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau no further contact will be had with him unless he should call this office.

DETAILS:

EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, more commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN was a friend and roommete of MAXWELL WINESTONE, who was alleged to be the last individual recruited by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a Soviet agent, in his espicange network.

Information indicates that WELLSTEIN located his 1949 Buick Convertible automobile to FileSTORE to drive DULIUS ROSERBERG to Ithaca, New York, where he picked up capionage material from one ALFRED/SARAMT.

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTHYGREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet appearatus by JULIUS ROSENDERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen-year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bamb project at Los Alamos, New Moxico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionege. JULIUS ROSEMBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951, in the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1945 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espicaage, in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilding documents and making espicaage contacts, an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAX ELITCHER, who admits that ROSE DERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of MERRED SER. HT from October, 1943, to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on March 23, 1951, that JULIUS ROSEMBERG "mentioned

"an apartment rented by a student estins_bay used for studying on Morton Street, where he, JOHL'B.RT. and 'BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSHNBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time but from other conversations the Informent had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIM PERL.

informed him that this apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study, but that the real purpose was to have a place for mactings. ROTHNBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bethroom. ROSEMBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

MIFRED SARIAT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944, and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENEERS through a mutual friend nemed JOEL BIRR. SIRIAT has denied that ROSENEERS was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX ELITORER has advised that JULIUS ROSENEERS, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL (claeghnown to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITORER and his wife, HELENE, were tigether in S.R.ART'S apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945, ALFRED SARAHT morried LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946, at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would sond him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARAHT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARAWT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARAWT and JOEL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL, in sending the last money order payment in

Jamery, 1950, attached a note requesting Simul to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau Agents in July-August, 1950, flod the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts is unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Seviet Agent by Resemberg to Confidential Informent T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Pederal Grand Jury in the Southern District of Yow York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSHBERG to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL DAVID sailing from the United States for Europe in J many, 1942.
ROSHMEERG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his aspionage work in European countries.

ALFRED SARINT has advised that JOHL BIRR had a girl friend numed VIVIAN GLIDSKIN and that he believes that VIVIAN GLIDSKIN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent et 45 mortan Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1050, that a money order, number 988487, issued at the Church Street. Station Post Office, New York City, on Lugust 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARAMT from VIVIAM GLASMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as remitter, who located in the account of ALFRED SARAMT in the First Matienal Bank of Ithaca, New York. The money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bord a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAE has advised upon interview that she was the former finance of JOEL BARR and that she had sont money orders to ALFRED SARANT in payment of the rent on 65 Horton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Claveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950, to contact WILLIAM FERL with \$2,000

in cost and to give instructions, the FRRI to leave the United States and go to Mexico.

She stated that she received the \$2,000 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown man who contacted there at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSIAN elaimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist Agents to identify him.

Confidential Informent T-L edvised that in conversation JULIUS AOSEBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the Informent believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLEM PERL removed sent secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University. PERL took these files to ROSEBERG'S opertment at Anickerbecker Village, New York City, where ROSEBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out at town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two concres photographing the material that PERL had obtained, in order that PERL could return the material at this carliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSE BERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was RICH and SILOROVICH, whom he described as a number of his caplebage argenization.

Confidential Informant T-1 statud that the rearth men was a definite member of the RUSL BREG apionage expending; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVLE GLISSMIN on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to exatest WISLIM PERD and give him \$2,000 in order to facilitate his flight from the United Status to Mexico.

The Informent advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his lost recruit to cortact VIVIAN GLAS AMA on July 21, 1950, and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSEEBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The Informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile with a white top, either a 1949 or 1950 model, and that he had located his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSEEBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARAMT and make a pickup of appionage material. On April 5, 1951, VIVELE GLASSEAR was abserved leaving her apertment at 151 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man one was subsequently identified as AX PILESTOPE.

Interview of Subjection Fablor, J. STOT E. D. STELL on December 16, 1951

Mr. JOSEPH MEINSTEIN, Versailles Gamment Company, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, father of the subject, was interviewed on December 14, 1951 by SA's ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer.



EDWARD JAMES WEIRLYSIA, more commonly known as JAMES MEINSTEIN was a friend and roommoth of HAXWELL FINESTONE, who was alleged to be the last individual recruited by JULIUS ROSEWBERG, a Soviet gent, in his explanage network.


Information indicates that WHINSTEL loaned his 1989 Euck Convertible sutemobile to PH ESTOLD to drive JULIUS ROSELBERG to Ithaea, New York, where he sacked up espionage material from one LLPRED STELLER.

DAVID GRIENGLASS and his wife, RUVE GRANTILLSS, have advised that they were recruibed into the Beviat depionage apparatus by JULIAS ROSH BRAG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is now a riving a fifteen-year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Las Alemas, Few Mexico, to HARAY GOLD, a confessed Saviet upy new serving a thirty-year sentence for assigned. A LAUS ROSH EERG and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951, in the Southern District of New York for amspiredy to commit aspishage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREEKGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSEMBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Seviet espicaage, in connection with which he was using to a capacitatorial headcuarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espicaage contacts, an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from M.M. ELITCHER, who admits that ROSE BERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espienage, indicates that the Greenwich Villugo epertment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This sportment was rented in the name of ALFRED SIR.NT from October, 1943, to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant Tal, of hown rollability, advised on Harch 23, 1951, that JULIUS Needs 8440 "montioned




"an apartment rented by a student estensibly and for studying on Mort a Street, where he, JOHL BLRA and 'BILL' used to meet in steret to discuse their plans." ROSEMBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time but from other conversations the Informant had with ROSELBARG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIM PERL.

On July 10, 1951, T-1 stated that ROSEMBERG informed him that this apertment was astemably rented for a student to have a place to study, but that the real purpose was to have a place for mackings. ROLEMBERG said that he had typed for many hours or various occasions in the Morton Street apertment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table logs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSEMBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apertment.

ALFRED SARLET, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Perty in 1943-1944, and believes that he mot JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend named JOEL B.RR. SARLET has demied that ROSENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MIX EDITOTER has advised that JULIUS ROSEBERG, JOEL BLRR, WILLIAM PARE (clse demown to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITOTER and his wife, HELEME, were together in S.R.M.T.S apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945, ALFRED SLRAMT married LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL-ROSS and mived to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946, at which time the apartment at 65 Horton Street, New York City, was token by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SLRAMT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

SIRRET has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SIRLET and JOEL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JOEL BIRR under the same rental paying arrangement and that FERL, in sanding the last memby order payment in



Jenusry, 1950, attoched a nose requesting dannal to relinquish the opertment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARAMT, following his interview by Bururu Agents in July-August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. Fie present whereabouts is unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Seviet Agent by Rosenberg to Confidential Informent T-L. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BLAR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSHMBERG to DIVID GREENGLASS following JOEL LATE'S willing from the United States for Europe in January, 1940.
ROSHMBERG advised DAVID GREEFGLASS that BLAR was going to Europe to continu his aspishage work in Aurope to contribus.

ALFRED SARLUT has advised that JOHL Blatched a girl friend named VIVIA CLASSIE, and that he believes that VIVIA GLASMIN sunt him the first for restal nayments in the form of money orders for the apartment rank of 55 merton Street, New York City.

The Albery Office advised on July 22, 1950, that a mancy order, number 988487, issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, an august 8, 1949, payable to AFRED ARREST from VIVI. 1 GEAS and, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as rematter, was located in the recount of AMERID SIRLET in the Farat Articul Bank of Itheca, New York. The money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit data of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAE has advised upon interview that she was the former finance of JOEL BARR and that she had sent wordy orders to ALFRED SARINT in object of the rest on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an eighbour trip to Claveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950, to contact WISLIAM FRRE with #2,000

She stated that she received the \$2,000 and the instructions for real from an unknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 Bast Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSOAN element that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist Agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised bhat in conversation JULIUS hOSHEBAR stated that an a holiday weekend, which the Informant boli var may have been the Fourth of July wookend, 154), WILGHEL EAR removed and accest files from a laboratory located at Columbia University. FRRE took those files to ROSHEDEVAL apartment at at smickerbacker Villege, New York City, where HOSEEBAR, FERE, a third unite atified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two compars photographing the material that PARE and obtained, in order that FIRE could return the material at his carliest convenience to Columbia University. JAMES WINSTEIN, in an interview with Bureau Ag ato on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile socistation dated January 19, 1950, for a 1949 Duick Severtible.

JAMES AND STEIN resided at 41% Agest Hinth Street, New York City, with MAX FINDSTONN from Februar, 1950, to about October-Flovember, 1950.

h.X FILESTOLE, who was born on July 28, 1982, at Boston, Macsachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell Haiver-sity, having graduated in September, 1969, and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) S.R.M.T.

On April 5, 1951, VIVIA: GLASSALD and abstruct loaving her operboost at 131 East Seventh Street, How Werk City, with a man who was subsequently identified at LAX FIRESTORE.



Mr. CURTS advised that the seles record indicases that this automobile had a scandard transaction. He stated that the 1949 Buick automobiles were painted two shades of grey--a dark grey known as "surmist" grey and a light grey known as "cumulus" grey. He stated that WETHSTETK'S convertible was a dark grey color as indicated by the sales record reflecting its color as "surmist". Mr. CURTS furnished two paint strip samples of these two colors and it is noted that the "surmist" grey appears hearly black.


Sale of Subject's 1949 Buick Convertible On July 19, 1950

Company, 2 West 61st Street, New York City, Mr. HOWIRD E. GUEDALIA advised S. ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer that he purchased from J.MES WEINSTEIN, 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, a 1949 Duick Model 560 Convertible, Mater Number 53837655, Scriel Number 35160786, bearing New York Registration Number 6209296, during the morning of July 19, 1950, for the price of \$1,800, for which he gave his check No. 2568. Mr. GUEDALIA described the soller of this automobile and his description coincides with the description of the subject.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that JAMES WATESTEIN was slone when he offered this car for sole and that, after GUEDALIA had quoted the price of w1,800 for the automobile, WEINSTEIN stated that he was going to check several other dealers before accepting the offer. GUEDALIA stated that the subject returned within an hour and the soles transaction was completed.

An examination of check No. 2568 revealed that JIMES JEINSTEIN had deposited this check at the Industrial Bank of Commerce of New York City on July 19, 1950.

It was noted that the date of the sale of the car and the date of the deposit was two days after the arrest of JULIUS ROSENBURG for conspiracy to commit espionage. JULIUS ROSENBURG was arrested on the night of July 17,



1950 and information concerning this are at first appeared in the newspapers on the morning of July 18, 1950.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that the Buick automobile that he bought from JAMES WEIMSTEM was of a dark grey color and that it had two whitewall tires on it. He stated that he had eleaned and searched the ear but that he recalls nothing of any interest having been found in the ear.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that on July 21, 1950, he sold this car to one RUBY STROUD, 6124 Ridge Read, St. Louis, Missouri, Certificate No. A-205435, and that on August 31, 1950, he repurchased the car at New York City from Miss RUBY STROUD. On October 19, 1950, he again sold this car to one Dr. Leonard J. Fox, 225 Most 106th Street, a dentist who had offices at 134 West Soth Street, New York City.

Mr. ROBERT FOX, 225 Most 106th Street, New York City, telephone number ACademy 2-6519, advised on October 23, 1951, that he was the father of LEON.RD FOX, the dentist, and that his sen sold his Buick, which was a dark grey color in New York City before he left, to either a Minister or a student studying for the ministry. Mr. FOX stated that he did not know the name or address of the individual to whom it was sold.

SE CLISTON E. POLLOCK checked the records of the New York State Bureau of Meter Vehicles for a trensfer record of the sale by Dr. LECKARD J. POX of the above-described Buick with negative results. He advised that the record system used in the New York State Europa of Meter Vehicles reflects the name of the soller of a cor on the registration record of the purchaser, but that the purchaser's name must be known to determine the soller's name as it is not noted on the soller's registration unless he applies for a registration to another automobile.



On October 31, 1951, SE CLINTON ... POLLOCK rechecked the records of the Motor Vehicle Bureau, New York City, and escertained that Dr. LEGNARD J. FOX had purchased a four-door Buick sedan, color black, Sorial Number 35097381, Engine No. 52474375, from one HARRY CLAMCY, 1 Ridgeview Avenue, White Plains, New York, on Ney 1, 1950, and that this car was last registered in the name of one Reverend CHARLES A. CLAMCY, 193 Tunth Avenue, New York City, in 1950.

A Statement of Transfer reflected that Reverend CHARLES A. CLIMCY had transferred the vehicle to FARRY CLAMCY on April 25, 1950. An affidavit of sale reflected that HARRY CLAMCY had sold this vehicle to Dr. LEOSAND J. FOX, 225 West 106th Street, New York City, on May 1, 1950. Dr. LEOWARD J. FOX transferred this vehicle to the Broadwest Motor Car Company, 2 West 61st Street, New York City, on October 19, 1950.

On Movember 21, 1951, Father CMARLES A. GLAMCY, Catholic Maritime Center, 193 Tenth Avenue, How York City, advised that he did not buy a grey Bulck Convertible from Dr. LEONARD J. FOX, 225 West 106th Struct, New Mork City, but that he had sold a black Buick sedan to Dr. FOX in the spring of 1950. Father Chimcy stated that he did not know Dr. FOX, Dr. FOX'S present whereabouts, nor did he know to whom Dr. FOX had disposed of the Buick sedan. He stated that he was not every that Dr. FOX had ever owned a grey Buick Convertible. He stated that his Buick had been sold to Dr. FOX through his brother, HARRY CLAMCY.



Investigation Resulting is Legation of Subject's 1949 Grey Buick Convertible

On November 2, 1951, Mr. ROBERT FOX, 225 West 105th Street, New York City, father of DR. LEONARD J. FOX, was telephonically requested to ascertain by correspondence with his son, who is presently serving in the U.S. Army in Kores, the identity of the individual to whom he sold his grey 1949 Buick Convertible, Serial No. 35160786, Engine No. 53837655.

On December 14, 1951, Mr. POX tokephonically advised that he had received the following information from his sen, Dr. LEONARD J. POX, regarding the identity of the purchaser of the 1949 grey Buick Convertible: The name of the purchaser was not recalled by Dr. LEONARD J. POX, but the purchaser was a Rabbi who lived on Riverside Drive between 110th Street and 115th Street, New York City.

The Street Address Tolophono Directory, Borough of Manhattan, 1951, reflects listing for six Rabbis between 110th Street and 115th Street, on Riverside Drive, New York City.

On December 14, 1951, Rabbi ARTHUR J. LELYVELD, 410 Riverside Drive, New York City, telephonically advised that he had purchased a grey 19h9 Buick Convertible from Dr. LEONARD J. POK, a Dentist, in the spring of 1951 and that the car was new in deed storage at the Herbst Garage, 227 East 162nd Street, Bronx, New York.

Rabbi LELYVELD advised that F.B.I. Agents had his consent to photograph and search the car at the Herbat Garage and that he would so advise the garage management.

On Docember 19, 1951 at the Herbst Garage, 227 East 162nd Street, New York City, MICHOLAS GACHUK, day manager, made available the 1949 grey Buick Convertible, which was stored there by Rebbi IRTHUR J. LELYVELD.


The scrial number of the Moto feat med to the left-front door hinge pillar post reflected the number 35160786 and the Motor Number on this car was 53837655.

The convertible was taken from its deed storage position in the Herbst Garage by NICHOLAS GACHOK and was perked on East 162nd Street, in the front of the Hurbst Garage, where color photographs were taken by SE REMINISTED DELIMON.

A scarch was made of the interior and of the trunk of the convertible for any material possibly pertaining to JIMES WEINSTEIN, with negative results.

It was noted that in the trunk of the car there was a ten cover for use when the top of the convertible was retracted. Also noted were two 1951 license plates for the State of New York, No. 2095-10.

Identification of subject's convertible was made by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer.

Mr. JOSEPH METHSTEIN, Versailles Garment Company, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, father of the subject, was interviewed on December 14, 1951 by SA's ROPERT F. ROYAL and the writer.

Mr. WETASTEIN advised that he had spoken to his sen, LDw.RD JAMES ENLASTEIN, when he referred to as "JIMEN", in regard to being interviewed by F.B.I. Agents concerning JULIUS ROSENBERG, M.X FLUESTONE and the alleged loan of his 1949 gray Buick Convertible to MAXUTED FILESTONE, who used it to transport JULIUS ROSENBERG between N. w Mork City and Ithaca, New York for the purpose of making pick-ups of espionege meterial, and that JULIUS had stated he could not tell the F.B.I. anything because he did not know anything about ROSENBERG or any trips made by ROSENBERG in his, WEINSTEIN'S, Buick of evertible.

Mr. WELLSTEIN stated that he recolled that JIMMA was planning to sell his Boick Convertible before July, 1950, and that he had spoken to him about doing so a few weeks before; that he had bed lunch with JIMMA on July 17, 1950, which dote was JIMMA'S birthday, and that JIMMA had again mentioned disposing of the ear during lunchesa.

Mr. WEINSTELL said that he therefore placed an ad in the New York Times" newspaper advertising JHMY'S Buick Convertible for sale and that according to information he received from JHMY, a teleph we call was received from the used car dealer that he eventually sold the car to inquiring about the Buick and requesting JHMY to bring the car around to be appraised.

Mr. WEIDSTEIN stated that JIMAY informed him that he had located his car to MIX FILESTOLE on recasions, but that he had no knowledge of MIX FILESTORE having driven JULIUS MOSEMBERG in the car.

Mr. WEITSTEIN advised that he is inclined to believe that JIMMX has no knowledge if may of the achievities

of MOSEMBERG and HAN FINESTONE, or that fill the indicated that he hesitates to talk to F.B.I. he has because he might become involved in a matter in which he is actually not involved.

He stated that due to the tenuous relationship between JRMY and binself, he is unable to incist on JRMY talking to Burcau Agents, as much to be desired JRMY to do so, but that he had suggested to JUMY that he agree to consulting an attorney, a friend of Mr. MELLSCPIL'S, and that he then talk to agents in the processes of the attorney who could guard his right against incriminating himself.

JIMM'S answer to this suggestion was a reliteration that he did not believe that he had any information that he could give to the F.B.I.

It was indicated to Mr. WEI STEEL that JIMAN chould not conclude that what he may have to say is not informative, as he might possibly fix some dates and chromateness unach might be of assistance in this investigation.

Mr. WEINSTEIN stated that he would continue his efforts to effect the cooperation of subject and abolicy s he may be successful because he does not believe that JIMMY is influenced by hax FILESTORE any longer.

He stated that he knows that JIMM is in paer financial condition; that JIMM has had his telephone taken out of his sportment and would embedde hiv to give up his present aperatest at 418 East 7th Street, how York City, due to the high rent. He advised that JIMM is now dependent on his own wages and that he occasionally gives him some money to tide him over.

Mr. WEINSTHIN stated that he hopes to regain the confidence and esteem of JIMMY and possibly influence him to return to the family home at 211 Gentral Park West, as he would like to interest him in the family business. He said he is therefore treating JIMME with every consideration and hopes to have him attainable out his possible muto the F.B.I. regarding his association with MAX FILMSTERS and any other individual associated with the ROSEGERGIS.

On October 31, 1951, Mr. ABRAWAM KAUMAM, Attorney, 350 Seventh Avenue New York City, telephonically advised that he had made no progress in securing the comperation of his nephow, JAMES WEINSTEIN; that in fact he had not been able to centact him.


Ho advised that he had telephoned JOSIPH WEINSTEIF, subject's father, and had esked him to have JIRMY call him, but that he had received no call from JIRMY. He stated that he had discussed the situation of subject with JOSE W WEINSTEI who hold him that he and talked to JIMMY and was of the opinion that JIMMY was innecent of any espionage activity or association with the ROSIMBERG emspirators.

Mr. KLUFALL stated that he and asked JOSEFH WEILSFEIN, why, if this were so, JIMAY did not emperate and discuss the circumstances with the F.E.F. He said that subject's father indicated that JIMAY was being advised by a lawyer whose mass JOSEFH WEILSTEIN professed not to know.

Mr. LIGHTH stated whet he does not believe thet he will be given the opportunity to take to JIMM and that he had received the impression from talking with JOSEPH WEILSTEIN that even if he did it would not do any good due to the attitude of JIMES WEILSTEIN as well as that of JOSEPH WEILSTEIN.


Mr. KLUFMIN advised that JUSEPH WEINSTEIN told him that there was no connection between the arrest of JULIUS ROSMIEERG on July 17, 1950 and the selection of JUMMY'S Enick



Convertible on July 19, 1950, because the Point and been advertised for sale in the New York newspapers and that JOSEPH VEILSTEIN had put the ad in the newspapers himself.

Mr. K.UFM.M stated that he asked if he, JOSETH METHSTEIN, had told this to the F.B.I. Agents who interviewed him as that would appear to be an important fact in JIMMY'S defense, and that JOSEPH WITCHESSEN, and stated that he did not. KLUFFEN did not know if JOSEPH WELL STRUK had purposely withheld this information or if be had not ricollected it at the time.

Mr. K.WITEF did not know which him Fork newspaper JOSEFF WEINSTAIN had placed the ad of the duick Convertible in, nor did he know the period of time during which it was run.



Interview of Mr. LIMERD DLUM, 607

Engineers Building, Cleveland, Ohi.

On Movember 14, 1951 the Cleveland Division advised that Mr. LEONIRD BLUM, 807 Ingineers Building, Cleveland, Ohio, was interviewed by SA'S FRADERICK L. IDWARD and JOHN B. O'DONOGHUE, at which time he was advised of subject's uncooperative attitude with the Bureau; that it was stressed to Mr. BLUM that a full and detailed interview with JAMES WELLSTETT and Bureau representatives was most desirable, and his assistance in procuring WELUSTETH'S cooperation was solicited.

Mr. MINSTELL stated that he had no ismediate iden as to how he would be able to influence the subject himself since he has seen JIMMY ATTISTER only rarely and for fleeting moments during the past few years. He pointed out, however, that as a child the subject always exhibited great respect and admiration for him and that he feels that as a non-relative he may well wield greater influence than a member of the family.

Mr. ALUM also advised that JIDAY WELLSTEIN may have a high regard for Dr. EDWARD barsky, who has been the family physician, but feels that a great deal of this respect may have wern thin as a result of BARSKY'S having served a prison sentence for contempt, although BLUM stated that he has no factual basis for either of those epinions.

Mr. BLUM stated that he had not ELMSMI through the WELLSTEIN family and fools that BLUSTM is not a Communist but rather a stubborn idealist who may well bear a resentment as a result of his conviction and jail term.

Mr. BLUM indicated that he would be in New York City in December and that he would endeaver to contact and convince subject to cooperate.

BRINES that he attended a social affair in early Soptember, 1951 at which JOSEPH WELLETERS, subject's father, who was also in attendance, stated that his son-in-law, RICHARD 307510, was being transferred to an atomic energy project in Dos Alamos, New Mexica.

RICHARD SONTAG is morried to LOIS WELHSTEIN, daughter of JOSERY WEIHSTUDY and sister of the subject. (JCSET N. KAUTELE is not related to the WLL UTELE fordly).

DETAILS:

EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, more commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was a friend and roommate of MAXWELL WFINESTONE, who was alleged to be the last individual recruited by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a Soviet agent, in his espionage network.

Information indicates that WEINSTEIN loaned his 1949 Buick Convertible automobile to FINESTONE to drive JULIUS ROSENBERG to Ithera, New York, where he picked up espionage material from one ALFRED SARANT.

have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen-year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage. JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951, in the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage, in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts, an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAX/ELITCHER, who admits that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwhich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October 1943, tq January 1950.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on March 23, 1951, that JULIUS ROSENBERG "mentioned"

an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street, where he, JOEL BARR and 'BILL' FEKL used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSENBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time but from other conversations the Informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

On July 10, 1951, T-1 stated that ROSENBERG informed him that this apartment was ostensibly rented for a student to have a place to study, but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table logs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARANT, upon interviow, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944, and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend named JOEL BARR. SARANT has denied that ROSENBERG was over in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL! (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARANT'S apartment, number 6-I, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

MAS MAX ALICATIC

In 1945 ALFRED SARANT married LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September 1946, at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARANT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARANT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARANT and JOEL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JOHA BARR under the same rental paying arrange ment and that PERL, in sending the last money order payment in

January 1950, attached a note requesting SARANT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau Agents in July-August 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts is unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Soviet Agent by ROSENBERG to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January 1948.
ROSENBERG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in European countries.

ALFRED SARANT has advised that JOEL BARR had a girl friend named VIVIAN GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAN GLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment ront at 65 Morton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950, that a money order, number 988487, issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the Pirst National Bank of Ithaca, New York. The money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN has advised upon interview that she was the former fiancee of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALFRED SARANT in payment of the ront on 65 Morton Street in July and August 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplano trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950, to contact WILLIAM PERL with \$2,000

in cash and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico.

She stated that she received the \$2,000 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist Agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSENBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the Informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University. PERL took these files to ROSENBERG'S apartment at Knickerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained, in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSENBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAED SIDOROVICH, whom he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The Informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The Informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile with a white top, either a 1949 or 1950 model, and that he had loaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT and make a pickup of espionage material. The date

of the Ithaca trip would appear to have been either the weekend of June 3-4 or June 10-11, 1950, according to information furnished by DAVID GREENGLASS.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1, investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick Convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL FINESTONE, with alias: MAX FINESTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTEIN is the son of JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTEIN, in an interview with Bureau Agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950, for a 1949 Buick Convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Winth Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE from Pebruary 1950, to about October-November 1950.

MAX FINESTONE, who was born on July 28, 1922, at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University, having graduated in September 1949, and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANT.

On April 5, 1951, VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX FINESTONE.

JAMES WEINSTEIN appeared before the Federal Grand
Jury, Southern District of New York, in June 1951, and a
possible violation of the perjury statute by JAMES
WEINSTEIN is being investigated as Confidential Informant
T-2, of known reliability, has advised that the subject

Present Employment of Subject

On February 25, 1952, Miss A. DEL VESCOVO, Personnel Department, David Bogen Company, Incorporated, 663 Broadway, New York City, advised that JAMES WEINSTEIN was still employed by this firm as a Audio-Tester but that he had been transferred from this location to a new location of the firm located at 401 West 13th Street, New York City. She advised that his working hours are from 8:30 s.m. to 5:15 p.m. daily, except Saturdays, but that on some occasions the employees work overtime and occasionally work on Saturdays.

Subject's Advertisement for Sale of 1949 Buick Convertible

SE GERARD M. LENAHAN ascertained on January 15, 1952, that an ad advertising subject's 1949 Buick Convertible for sale appeared in the "New York Times" newspaper Tuesday, July 18, 1950. The ad reflected as follows:

"Buick Convertible 1949 - R and H - Shift - Good Condition - \$1900 - 25,000 miles - GR 5-2146 - 9-10 a.m."

The 1950 Manhattan Telephone Directory reflects that telephone number GR 5-2146 is listed to JAMES WEINSTEIN, 418 East Ninth Street, New York City.

On February 26, 1952, Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised that GR 5-2146, had been changed to Canal 8-0488.

It will be recalled that when subject's father, Mr. JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, Versaillos Garment Company, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, was interviewed on December 14, 1951, he advised that he had placed an ad in the "New York Times" newspaper advertising JIMMY'S Buick Convertible for sale and that according to information he received from subject, a telephone call was received from the used car dealer who eventually bought the car inquiring about the Buick and requesting JIMMY to bring the car around to be appraised.

Information from Broadwest Motor Car Corporation, 2 West 61st Street, New York City

On January 25, 1952, Mr. HOWARD E. GUEDALIA, Broadwest Motor Car Corporation, 2 West 61st Street, New York City, advised that he does not recall whether or not he had telephoned to subject requesting him to bring his 1949 Buick Convertible to the Broadwest Motor Car Corporation to be appraised but that he may have done so inasmuch as he frequently answers ads which are listed in the "New York Times" Classified Automobile Section and in that manner obtains used cars for sale in his agency.

Mr. GUEDALIA stated that he does not recall any additional information concerning this transaction with JAMES WEINSTEIN other than that he believes that WEINSTEIN appeared with the car in the latter part of the morning of July 19, 1950, and that he had offered WEINSTEIN \$100 less than he had requested after he had examined the Buick Convertible. He stated that he recalled that subject informed him that he was going to check several other dealers before accepting his offer and that about one hour later WEINSTEIN had returned and the sales transaction was completed.

Color Transparencies of Subject's 1949 Buick Convertible Obtained

SE KENNETH N. DELANOY who photographed JAMES WEINSTEIN'S 1949 Buick Convertible at the Herbst Garage, Bronx, New York, obtained color-transparencies of the car and three color transparencies are being forwarded herewith to the Albany Division to exhibit to the neighbors of ALFRED SARANT and WELDON BRUCE DAYTON to determine if they recollect when this automobile was noted at either residence and to ascertain if the dates, time and the identity of the individuals who were using it can be obtained.

Photographs of JULIUS ROSENBERG, EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN and MAX FINESTONE are being forwarded to assist in the possible identification of these individuals having been seen together at ALFRED SARANT'S or WELDON BRUCE DAYTON'S residences.

Two transparencies are being enclosed for the Bureau.

The transparencies illustrate that subject's 1949

Buick Convertible was a very dark gray, appearing almost black,
and was not a property of the subject according to

Confidential Informant T-2 has described the color of his car
to the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, in (b)(3)

June 1951.

SE DONALD A. BUCHER, Supervisor of the Photographic Laboratory of the New York Division, advised that prints of color film negatives do not always reflect the true color of the objects photographed but that color transparencies do. Color transparencies instead of photographic prints were therefore obtained to retain the exact shade of color of subject's 1949 Buick Convertible.

Identity of Registrant of New York License 1951 8N-95-10

SE CLINTON E. POLLOCK ascertained at the New York State Bureau of Motor Vehicles, New York City, that 1951 New York License Plates 8N-95-10 were registered to Dr. LEONARD J.

FOX, 225 West 106th Street, New York City. This registration was for a 1949 Buick Convertible, Engine Number 53837655. The above plates, it will be recalled, were noted in the trunk compartment of subject's Buick Convertible which was located in the Herbst Garage, Bronx, New York, during a search of the car on December 19, 1951.

Interview of Mr. LEONARD BLUM

On January 10, 1952, the Cleveland Division advised that Mr. LEONARD BLUM, 807 Engineers Building, Cleveland, Ohio, had been recontacted on January 7, 1952, at which time he advised that he had been able to make only one trip to New York since the date of the last contact by agents and that due to weather conditions at the time of the trip he was able to spend only a half a day in New York City. He stated that although he did have dinner with the WEINSTEIN family he had had no occasion to speak to JOSEPH WEINSTEIN without the presence of JOSEPH'S wife BCBBIE. BLUM advised that due to the serious physical condition of Mrs. WEINSTEIN he does not feel that she should be burdened with any of the problems concerning her son. BLUM advised that business interests will necessitate his remaining in Cleveland for sometime and he further pointed out that it is his understanding that the WEINSTEIN family is now in Florida and would probably remain there for another three weeks. BLUM said that at his first opportunity he would again contact the WEINSTEIN family in an attempt to feel out the subject and influence him to cooperate with the Bureau.

Interview of MARILYN MILLS

Miss MARILYN MILLS, 33-11 74th Street, Jackson Heights, New York, who according to JOHN DAVID LYLE, 321 Elizabeth Avenue, Lafayette, Louisiana, was a girl friend of EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, was interviewed by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer on January 11, 1952.

LYLE advised that MARILIN MILLS, whose nickname was "MALLY", was a sister of MARVIN MILLS, a roommate of LYLE at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York in 1949. LYLE stated that MARILYN MILLS was also acquainted with MAX FINESTONE and that in early 1949, she, FINESTONE and JAMES WEINSTEIN drove from Ithaca, New York, to New York City in subject's car which was to the best of LYLE'S knowledge an old Buick of about a 1941 model.

Upon interview, MARILYN MILLS advised that she was a graduate of Queens College, Long Island, New York, class of June 1951, and that she is at present employed at the Bulova Watch Company, Long Island City, New York.

Miss MILLS stated that she believes that she met EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN sometime in the latter part of 1948 or early 1949 at a Cornell University social affair staged somewhere on Park Avenue, New York City, but does not remember who introduced them.

She stated that her brother, MARVIN MILLS, was a student at Cornell University for one term from about February to June 1949, and that during that poriod she visited Ithaca, New York, twice to attend Cornell University dances. She travelled by train to Ithaca on both occasions. She used a taxicab from the railroad station the first time and was met at the railroad station by WEINSTEIN the second time. Miss MILLS stated that the dances were held on Friday or Saturday nights and that she arrived in Ithaca on Friday night and returned to New York City on Sunday; that she undoubtedly met a number of friends of WEINSTEIN while at the dance and probably met her brother's roommates and some of his friends. However, she stated that she does not remember their names nor does she recollect thom by description. She stated that she actually had very little time to spend in Ithaca other than


the period during which the dances were held and that WEINSTEIN did not take her to visit any Ithaca residents.

She advised that she recalls meeting MAX FINESTONE in Ithaca but that she does not know anything about him other than that her recollection of him associates him with the telling of obscene jokes and stories.

Miss MILLS stated that she had several dates with WEINSTEIN in New York City during 1949-1950 and that they went to the movies on these dates. She stated that she has no recollection of WEINSTEIN ever taking her to visit anyone's apartment in Greenwhich Village, but on one occasion after the theater he took her to his apartment on the lower East Side of New York City where a large party was in progress. She claimed she could recall no details of the affair; whether it was a housewarming or other occasion; whether or not MAX FINESTONE was there or whether any of the individuals that she had mot at the Cornell University dances were there. She claimed that she did not recall if there was music or dancing; if it was staged as a benefit for, or was sponsored by any organization; if anyone made a talk or if the gathering was conducted as a meeting with a presiding officer. She claimed, she did not recognize the photographs of VIVIAN and ELEANOR GLASSMAN, WILLIAM PERL OF WELDON BRUCE DAYTON, which were exhibited to her, as any of the individuals in attendance. She stated that the lights were very low making . it difficult to observe the individuals.

Miss MILLS was shown photographs of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT to ascertain if she had met them in the company of WEINSTEIN or FINESTONE or if they had taken her to visit SARANT'S home in Ithaca. She stated that she did not recognize the SARANTS as anyone she had met or visited in Ithaca.

She was also asked what mode of transportation she had used to return from Ithaca to New York City and she replied that she had to the best of her recollection used a train. To the question of whether or not she had ever driven back in WEINSTEIN'S Buick Convertible she answered that she may have, but she did not recall doing so.



Miss MILLS stated that she knew very little about WEINSTEIN and that she had not seen him for about two years; that WEINSTEIN had not told her that he was studying the Russian language nor had he discussed Communism pro or con; that he had indicated that he was interested in an organization known as the Young Progressives of America, but that WEINSTEIN was not a talkative individual and disclosed very little information concerning himself or his activities.

She stated that she had not met any members of his family nor had she ever been to his parents' home at 211 Central Park West, New York City. She claimed no knowledge of mutual acquaintance between WEINSTEIN, FINESTONE, WILLIAM PERL and the GLASSMAN sisters, VIVIAN and ELEANOR.

It was observed that Miss MILLS' recollection of events, persons, times and places became more vague as the interview progressed and the interview was discontinued with a request that Miss MILLS review her recollection of the individuals whose photographs had been shown to her and that recontact would be made with her.

Upon recontact the following week Miss MILLS refused to be interviewed and stated that she had given all the information that she wished to give.

Interview of DANIEC HARIEN, 209 Clinton Avenue, New York City

On February 14, 1952, DANIEL MARIEN, 209 Clinton Avenue, New York City, Apartment 6C, was interviewed by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer at Schermenhorn Hall, Columbia University, where he is currently working toward a doctor's degree. MARIEN was telephonically contacted at his residence during the late afternoon of February 13, 1952, and he suggested Schermerhorn Hall, Columbia University, as the place where he desired to be interviewed.

MARIEN was cordial in receiving the agents and inquired as to the agents' interest in him. He was advised that the Bureau's inquiry was of the upmost interest to the security of the United States and that possibly he could be of assistance in connection with an investigation being conducted by the Bureau.

MARIEN, upon the mention of the name of MAX FINESTONE stated, "I don't wish to answer any question or questions which would tend to incriminate me." He refused to explain how his answers might tend to incriminate him. MARIEN, in answer to questions, advised that he did not have any knowledge of nor had he ever participated in any crimes against the United States. He was specifically asked as to whether or not he had any knowledge of or if he had ever participated in any acts of espionage and he stated that he had not participated nor did he have any knowledge of acts of espionage against the United States.

He stated, in answer to questions, that he was a citizen of the United States; that he had sorved honorably in the United States military service during World War II; that he believed in our constitutional form of government and democratic way of life; that he considered himself a loyal American citizen and then repeated his statement that he did not wish to enswer any questions on the grounds that it may tend to incriminate him.

He stated that he did not have an attorney nor had he consulted with one. MARIEN stated that the only person with whom he had discussed the matter of an interview with the FBI

was with his wife and he stated, "This is my decision."
MARIEN stated that on Fobruary 13, 1952, he had consented to
be interviewed only in a desire to learn of the Bureau's
interest in him.

The records indicate that he was born August 19, 1925, in New York City and that he has a New York State Veterans Scholarship.

The records of the Board of Election for New York City reflect that the signature of one DANIEL MARIEN, 1916 Grand Concourso, Bronx, New York, appeared on a Communist Party Independent Nominating Petition, State of New York, dated August 1946.

The "Cornell Daily Sun", student newspaper at Cornell University, in its issue of May 17, 1947, reflects an article captioned "AYD...Elects Officers." The article states that at a meeting held May 16, 1947, DANIEL MARIEN of the class of 1950 was elected Representative at Large.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that DANIEL MARIEN was elected to the Executive Committee of the Cornell Chapter of the American Youth for Democracy for the 1947-48 school year.

The American Youth for Democracy has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.





Information from Columbia University, Admissions Office on JAMES WEINSTEIN


On December 4, 1950, SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN examined the records of the Registrar's Office, Columbia University, New York City, for information pertaining to JAMES WEINSTEIN. The records reflected that JAMES WEINSTEIN of 211 Central Park West, New York City, had entered Columbia Law School in September 1949, as a candidate for an LL.B. degree. The Registrar's Office records indicated that WEINSTEIN attended his first year classes but did not take final examinations in May 1950.

He re-registered for the second year, but being absent from examinations had given him a mark of failure which with other grades under the average rule disqualified him and made it necessary for him to petition in order to enter second year classes, which he had not done.

The Registrar's Office records further indicated that WEINSTEIN'S father was named JOSEPH WEINSTEIN of 211 Central Park West, New York City; that the student was born June 17, 1926, in New York City; and that he had received an A.B. degree at Cornell University in June 1949. The records contain a photograph of JAMES WEINSTEIN taken at the time he registered.

SA LITTLEJOHN reviewed the records of the Admissions Office, Columbia University, relative to JAMES WEINSTEIN, which reflected the following information:

JAMES WEINSTEIN (no middle name) applied for admission to Columbia School of Law on February 21, 1949. At this time he gave his home address as 211 Central Park West, New York City, and his mailing address as 303 College Avenue, Ithaca, New York, (until June 4, 1949). WEINSTEIN stated in his application that he was born July 17, 1926, at New York City, and had never attended Columbia University. He listed his education as follows: Waldon School, One West 88th Street, New York City, 1930-1944; Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, 1944-1949, A.B. degree, majoring in government.



WEINSTEIN stated that he was first in class graduating from secondary school and stated that in connection with his application for Columbia he had also applied for the Yale School of Law and that he might apply to Harvard. WEINSTEIN listed among "extra-curricular" activities at Cornell the American Veterans Committee.


He stated that he was inducted into the United States Navy on January 10, 1945, and he had Navy Serial Number 910-969-31. He served as a Radio Technicians Mate Second Class and was a Radio Technician and Instructor of Mathematics at Primary Radio School. He stated that he received a Victory and an American Theater of War Medal. He said that he was discharged honorably on July 23, 1946, and had no disabilities and received no court martials.

WEINSTEIN listed his father as JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, born in New York City, and described his father as a clothing manufacturer who had a high achool education. He named his mother as HILDA KAUFMANT born in New York City, and described her as a housewife who had two years of college.

WEINSTEIN said that there was no other child in the family younger than himself. He listed the following relatives: uncle, ABRAHAM R. KAUFMAN, lawyer, who attended Columbia School of Law; uncle GUSTAF WEINSTEIN, lawyer, who attended Yale School of Law. He listed the Kaufman Realty Company, 450 Seventh Avenue, New York City, as being operated by a relative who would assist him in finding employment. WEINSTEIN claimed that he had never been arrosted and said that he was in excellent health and wore glasses only for reading.

In his application for Columbia, he stated that he needed no financial assistance, that he did not earn any of his college expenses, and that he would not need to earn any part of his law school expenses. He said that he expected to reside at home or in an apartment of his own. He listed his draft board as Local Board Number 62, Ithaca, New York. Under training he listed pre-radio school, primary radio school, radio material school and teacher training in the Navy from May 1945, to February 1946. He said that he had applied through the Veterans Administration for an educational subsidy under Public Law 346.

A "blind" statement by WEINSTEIN (typowritten) indicated that he entored Walden School "progressive" at four years of age and attended for 14 years. He listed his main interests as painting, mathematics, sciences, music and printing (lotterpress). WEINSTEIN said that he spends nine or ten hours a week painting and had entered his work in several exhibitions. He said that he played the piane and that during the summer months while in high school he had worked on a cattle ranch in Telelotenos, New Mexico.

WEINSTEIN said that he taught mathematics in the Navy at Great Lakes, Illinois, for the remainder of his stay in the Navy (after graduation from Navy School). In this memorandum WEINSTEIN said that he considered his teaching as the most interesting period of his life and made the statement. *It was almost enjoyable enough to make life in the Navy boarable.*

In this memorandum WEINSTEIN said that he intended to practice law or go into government. The Admission Office records indicated that WEINSTEIN received his A.B. degree at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, in June 1949. It was noted that he majored in chemistry at Cornell in 1944 and took a course in the German language. When he returned from Naval service in 1946, he majored in government and from 1946 to 1948 he took four courses in Russian.

The records of Columbia University reflected that in his application WEINSTEIN had listed as a reference the Dean of Cornell University, LEONARD SLATER COTTRELL, and had given recommendation forms to Professors ROBERT EUGENE CUSHMAN, Professor of Government, and PAUL WALLACE GATES, Professor of American History.

The Columbia records contained a letter dated December 6, 1948, at Cornell University signed by Associate Dean M. L. HULSE, which was addressed "To Whom It May Concern." This letter stated that JAMES WEINSTEIN was 112th in a class of 426 when that class was last ranked.

columbia records also reflected that Professor CUSHMAN returned a reference form for WEINSTEIN stating that WEINSTEIN was of excellent character, was worthy of admission to the bar and to Columbia School of Law.

Professor GATES returned WEINSTEIN'S recommendation form stating that WEINSTEIN was of excellent character so far as GATES had seen. GATES described WEINSTEIN as a pleasant, well mannered, really cultured individual of promise whom he had liked from the outset.

On the same date the Washington Field Office was requested to place stops with the United States Customs Service and the Passport Division of the State Department against the names EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, with alias JAMES WEINSTEIN.

It was indicated that there was no process outstanding for subject.

On December 28, 1951, SA VINCENT J. CAHILL was advised by MAX ELITCHER that he did not know JAMES WEINSTEIN and that he did not recognize a photograph of WEINSTEIN exhibited to him by SA CAHILL.
