

A meeting organized by "Frontier" Magazine, sponsored by PHIL KIRBY, its editor, was held at the Wilshire-Ebell Theater in Los Angeles on 5/25/54, commencing at 8:30 p.m., admission \$1.50. It was fairly crowded.

The talk given by Dr. Harold C. UREY of Chicago was to have dealt with the question of the H-Bomb, mass retaliation, and the Oppenheimer Case. UREY, however, only touched on these subjects. In connection with the H-Bomb, he said he has no authority on it, since he had nothing to do with its development. On the Oppenheimer question, he indicated he had had some differences with him - that OPPENRETMER believed it was a mistake to make the A-Bomb without his consent, whereas he, UREY, was against that opinion and was in favor of making the A-Bomb. On the subject of mass retaliation, UREY spent most of his time.

He pointed out that in his opinion, it was impossible to make peace with the Communists, but if the United States would become a Soviet America, we could have peace tomorrow; however, on the other hand, if the Soviet Union became a democratic country like the United States, we could also have peace tomorrow. Since neither of these two things is possible, we have to face reality - a third war is inevitable. The United States must prepare, organize, produce a



preponderence of weapons that would overwhelm the enemy. UREY said the only hope for survival is in being bigger and stronger than the U.S.S.R. UREY stated he proposes the formation of a western federation of states, which would include the United States, Great Britain, France, Mexico, Spain, Denmark, Sweden, Italy, and a number of the other smaller countries, as well as Canada. Such a federation, united under one government with the United States at the head, would make a combination that would one day defeat the U.S.S.R.

There was a juestion and answer period after, and in all cases UREY answered that as a scientist he was giving an obvious opinion, and whether the people agreed or like what he said, this was his program, this was his analysis, and this was what he was fighting for.

There were about 75 people in the audience who were antagonistic to what UREY said. The rest appeared to be favorable.
