SMILG stated that he saw SHUMOVSKY approximately four or five times following this meeting, one of which was on the occasion of SMTIG'S marriage on January 31, 1943 at which time SHUMOVSKY was a guest. SMILG stated that to the best of his knowledge. SHUMOVSKY was assigned to Wright Field for approximately six months, from the full of 1942 to the spring of 1943.

SMILG stated that he did not recall saying good-by to SHUMOVSKY and that as far as he knew "he just disappeared." SMILG stated that during his conversations with SHUMOVSKY the latter never attempted to secure information from SMILG and never requested him to perform any service.

(The following is SMIIG'S testimony concerning his contact with GOLD, admitted Soviet espionage agent, which is set forth since SHUMOVSKY'S name figures in the discussions between GOLD and SMILG.)

SMILG stated that on a day near Thanksgiving, November 30, 1938, en individual who introduced himself as EARRY GOLD appeared at SMILG'S home, 307 Oxford Avenue, Dayton, Ohio, stating he was a student at St. Xavier University, Cincinnati, Ohio, and that he was also a friend of STANISLAUS SHUMOVSKY who had suggested that he, GOLD, visit SMILG. On the occasion of this visit, SMILG recalled that GOLD and he discussed many subjects, one of which was HITLER'S treatment of the Jews, news events, etc. SMILG stated GOLD appeared to him to be obsessed with the idea that the Jews were going to be destroyed. He stated that GOLD said he was studying Chemistry at Xavier University and had previously attended some eastern university. SMILG stated he did not like GOLD, whom he described as very talkative and not very bright.

On the occasion of the first visit by HARRY GOLD, he stated that after two or three hours of social conversation, GOLD indicated it was time to go and departed. SMIIG stated that he politely asked GOID to come again to see him and that GOLD asked him if he would come down to visit him at Xavier University.

SMIIG stated that approximately two months later GOLD again appeared at his home unexpectedly at which time he and GOLD discussed various things such as GOLD'S school work, chemistry, etc. SMIIG stated that GOLD made approximately three visits to his home and that each was unexpected and never was any arrangement made for a future meeting. When asked as to whether GOLD had ever requested any information from him, SMILG stated, release all "He had the impression that I was a very capable, outstanding engineer and that it was a pity that it wasn't being used to fight HITLER. I have the impression that possibly he might have wanted me -- I would not say

suggested but he wanted -- that I ought to go to Russia and help Russia fight HITLER."

During their conversations SMIIG stated that GOLD mentioned several times that he was a friend of SHUMOVSKY and that on one occasion he drove GOLD from his home to the bus station in Dayton, and when they arrived there GOLD said something to SMILG, in effect as follows: I don't think you believe I am a friend of SHUMOVSKY. SMILG stated he said, "Why no. You said you are a friend of SHUMOVSKY and I have no reason to doubt it." SMILG stated that GOLD then "pulled out a receipt, a photostat of a receipt, and said, 'This should prove to you that I really am a friend of SHUMOVSKY.'" SMILG stated that he looked at the receipt and it was a photostatic copy of a receipt he had given SHUMOVSKY years before. SMILG stated that he said, "What difference does it make?" Whereupon GOLD replied, "I want you to believe I am."

SMTIG stated that GOLD never mentioned what his relationship with SHUMOVSKY was nor did he indicate that SHUMOVSKY was doing anything that he should not be doing.

SMILG stated that after the visit when GOLD showed him the receipt, he did not see GOLD for some time and then suddenly GOLD appeared again at his residence at which time they talked for a short period of time, then GOLD departed. SMIIG stated he never saw GOLD following this meeting.

Concerning these visits by GOLD, SMTLG stated that when he met SHUMOVSKY in the fall of 1942 he could not remember GOID'S name, but he said to SHUMOVSKY. "Some guy came around who said he was a friend of yours. Do you know anything about him?" SMTIG stated SHUMOVSKY "gave me the impression that he did not know who it was and just shrugged it off and I forgot about it, and I never thought of GOLD again until his exposure."

SMIIG testified that in this discussion with SHUMOVSKY he does not believe that he mentioned GOLD'S showing him the receipt.

SMIIG testified further that at the time of his contacts with Mercore HARRY GOLD he did not know SHUMOVSKY was "doing anything he shouldn't be doing" and that, "I still don't think so."

It is apparent from the above testimony of SMILG as well as from the information furnished by HARRY GOLD, that the receipts given by SMILG to SHUMOVSKY were either retained by SHUMOVSKY or the Amtorg Trading Corporation and thereafter used in an effort to induce SMILG to furnish information to the Soviets.

It will be recalled that according to HARRY GOLD, he was directed by his Soviet superior to contact SMILG in an effort to develop him as a source of information and GOLD was furnished the photostatic copies of receipts by his Soviet superior.

Since instant report contains information of general interest in the Intelligence field, information copies are being furnished the New York, San Francisco, Washington Field, and Philadelphia Offices in accordance with Bureau instructions.

No leads are being set forth in this report; however a report will be submitted in the near future.

- Mrs. BOERGER's statements that OTTO_and/or_CARL SCHMIDT was in this country in 1937.

GOLD's statements that he met STEVE SWARTZ in the summer of 1937.

Some degree of similarity between descriptive data furnished by SWITZ, CHAMBERS and COLD.

Upon GOID's return to Philadelphia, he will be reinterviewed for any additional information he may have recalled for STEVE SWARTZ

THOMAS L. BLACK, self-admitted Soviet agent identified AATA as his espionage superior with whom he had infrequent contacts from 1938 to approximately 1948. KATZ had BLACK spying on activities of Trotskyites until 1940. He then told BIACK he had something more important for him to do and tried unsuccessfully to get BIACK to get a job at the Kellex Company. In 1943 and 1944 BIACK prepared and submitted to KATZ reports on Sorbitol and Penicillin. In 1942 KATZ had BLACK contact Dr. EARL W. FLOSDORF to determine if he would be willing to supply some information to the Soviets. In 1944, at KATZ'S direction BLACK contacted the late WM. W. STAPLER, Hercules Powder Co. employee who had been selling information to KATZ. In 1948 or possibly earlier KATZ had BLACK meet him in NYC for the purpose of reactivating him, but BLACK did not become active again. HARRY GCID, convicted Soviet agent, identified KATZ as an alternate espionage superior of his. GOLD said his only contact with KATZ was during one weekend in April or Pay, 1940, at the Hotel New Yorker, NYC. KATZ discussed GOLD'S work with him and gave him about \$150 or \$200. Some known associates of KiTZ in various personal and business ventures listed and identified. KATZ'S passport file reflects he was in France from 3 to 5/47, 7 to 9/47 and 6/48 to present. KATZ presently resides Paris, France, engaged in merchandizing handpainted scarves and ties. KATZ'S wife was employed by AJDC in Paris from 1947 until August, 1949. She then returned to NYC where she and daughter presently reside.

PURPOSE:

To advise that name check request received from State Department on Menke Katz, passport applicant. To report that Menke Katz is brother of Joseph Katz and previously engaged in business with him in 1946; business now dissolved. To recommend that attached blind memorandum summarizing information in Bureau files on Menke Katz, was., be transmitted to the Liaison Section for delivery to State. To point out that/in the blind memorandum State has also been advised first, that Joseph Katz has been identified by Elizabeth Bentley, Harry Gold and two confidential informants (Thomas L. Black and as a Soviet agent; and second, that Joseph Katz is now under investigation by this Bureau.

DETAILS:

The State Department has requested "all information" in Bureau files on Menke Katz, 2662 West Street, Brooklyn 23, New York, for an "ostensible purpose" of "Passport-security." According to the request, Menke Katz was born April 12, 1906, in Lithuania and has derivative citizenship through his father's naturalization on February 19, 1925, naturalization certificate Mo. 2109126. His occupation was given as teacher.

Menke Katz, was., brother of the captioned subject, was registered under the Selective Service Act under the name of Merke Kats. He reported his birth to Selective Service officials as March 12, 1906, in Lithuania. On his father's petition for naturalization he is shown as Max Katz, born June 7, 1906. Menke Kats claims derivative citizenship through his father, H. David Kats, aka., Hirsha-Hiat, who was naturalized February 19, 1925, and who received naturalization certificate No. 2109126.





SEMEN MARKOVICH SEMENOV, with alias ROBERT

SIACK identified a photograph of SEMENOV as the individual he knew as ROBERT and stated that he first met ROBERT through what appeared to be a prearranged meeting of MARTIN, ROBERT and himself at New York City. He believes that this was soon after his first trip to Charleston, West Virginia, to contact HOWARD GOCHENOUR. He further believes ROBERT took this occasion to tell him that he should offer to match GOCHENOUR's salary at the DuPont Company if he would continue to furnish information at that company. SLACK stated his recollection was that this meeting was quite brief and that he and ROBERT were not alone together for any length of time. He stated he never furnished any information directly to ROBERT and does not recall any other details concerning his meeting with ROBERT.

DETAILS:

The Department of Justice was requested to furnish opinion as to whether or not AIFRED DEAN SLACK violated the Fraud Against the Government Statute by stating under oath on an Employee's Declaration at the Holstein Ordnance Horks that he had never been employed by a foreign government.

The Department, by memorandum of August 15, 1950, advised the source of the funds paid to SLACK by and HARRY COLD could not be traced sufficiently to prove that they were derived from a foreign government and that no prosecution of SLACK under this statute would be possible unless continuing investigation resulted in additional evidence.

With regard to the activities of the Department advised on September 11. 1950 that from the information available it is not believed that there appeared to be considerable doubt that there has giving information to a Russian agent when he turned information on the manufacture of nylon over to SLACK. Department stated that there was apparently no government classification on the processes of manufacturing nylon.

The F. B. I. Laboratory, under date of October 30, 1950, advised that it was concluded that the L. C. Smith typewriter, serial 933113612, was used to prepare the typing on material previously submitted reading "The accompanying material and data" and was also used to prepare the typewriting beginning "The report and data text...". The typewriter referred to was obtained from ALFRED DEAN SLACK and the typewriting referred to above was found on two cover sheets which were attached to the front of two reports on chemical processes which were found in the home of HARRY GOLD, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The Laboratory further advised that no conclusion could be reached as to whether or not this typewriter was used to prepare the three page article entitled "Purification of Synthetic Urea", which was found in the home of HARRY COLD and to which the second of the cover sheets referred to above was attached.

While there is a difference in the height and weight of Swarts and Karl, as respectively described by Gold and Black, it is to be noted that Black has not been particularly accurate in the furnishing of descriptions. Black stated that Karl appeared to be well read since he could discuss philosophy, art, etc. Gold's document entitled "Circumstances Surrounding My Work as a Soviet Agent - A Report," mentioned earlier, refers in part to Swartz's ability Swarts who introduced Gold to Cezanne, Van Gogh and the world one Ilia Agapov resembled Karl though he felt certain that it was not. ccerding to Confidential Informant T-1, previously mentioned in this report, IVANOV, who is variously listed under the name of ALEXANDRE IVANOV and ALEXANDRE PETROVICE IVANOV, was listed as being bern December 28, 1909 in Orel, Russia, and arrived at the United States at New York City on April 15, 1939 aboard the SS PARIS. According to this informant, IVANOV was employed as a technician in New York City at 210 Madison Avenue (address of the Amterg Trading Corporation) and was listed as residing at 769 St. Marks Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. He listed his wife's name as ELISAVETA IVANOVA, born August 19, 1910, and stated also that he had an eight year old daughter, ANGELINA. According to this informant, IVANOV was employed in the inspection of purchases at the Amterg Trading Corporation. IVANOV departed from the United States on May 15, 1941 aboard the SS ANNIE JOHNSON, appearding to the informant.

Confidential Informant T-1 has not furnished any information indicating that IVANOV returned to the United States or more specifically that he was in the United States during September and October, 1949, when GOID claims that he was contacted by the subject.

In connection with SARYCHEV, it is to be noted that the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Rouses Point, advised that FILIPP ASARTICHEV, bearing Soviet Passport #25136, entered the United States at Rouses Point, New York, on March 19, 1946. This individual is described as 5'7"; by eccupation a secretary, and destined for the "Russian Consulate" in New York City.

Confidential Informant T-1 subsequently made information available on October 11, 1916 to the effect that among the Soviet Nationals connected with the Soviet Delegation to the United Nations was one FILIPP TIKHONOVICH SARICHEV, and, according to this informant, SARYCHEV was listed as being an employee of the Soviet Delegation, possessing a Foreign Service Passport, and was listed as being born in 1909, Ryesan District (presumably Russia).

Confidential Informant T-1 subsequently made information available periodically indicating that among the Soviet United Mations employees in the United States on July 1, 1947, January 1, 1948, December 1, 1948, July 1, 1949, and January 1, 1950 was FILIPP TIKHONOVION CARRICHEV of JURYTCHEV. This informant in all cases merely reported SARICHEV as being an employee of the Soviet United Mations Delegation, 680 Park Avenue, New York City, residing with his wife, TRAIDA TVANOVNA CARRICHEVA (or SARITCHEVA) at 153 Manhattan Avenue, New York, New York, in Apartment 51.

INTRODUCTION

HARRY COLD, of 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on May 22, 1950, advised Special Agents T. SCOTT MILLER and RICHARD E. BRENNAN that he was the individual to whom Mr. BMIL JULIUS KLAUS-FUCHS passed information concerning the Atomic Bomb for transmission to Russia.

On June 2 and 3, 1950, the residence of HARRY GOLD was searched and numerous items which will be discussed hereinafter were obtained pertaining to one DANIEL KLINE.

On June 15, 1950 GOLD was questioned concerning the items pertaining to KLINE and he explained that he submitted this name when he was being pressed by his Soviet contact for possible recruits to be used in Soviet espicance. These items were rough draft notes which were subsequently made into final reports which were turned over to GOLD's Soviet contact. GOLD stated he had no idea at the time he submitted these reports of recruiting DANIEL KLINE but merely handed these reports in as a delaying action on GOLD's part until GOLD could get away to school in the fall of 1938.

GOID remembered that during the time the reports concerning KLINE were submitted, KLINE was employed at the Philadelphia Navy Yard. GOID also recalled that KLINE was a high school acquaintance of GOID's brother, JOSEPH GOID, having attended South Philadelphia High School during the same years.


BACKGROUND

On June 21, 1950 Special Agent JAMES E. HEIMER contacted Mr. PETER ANTHONY, Personnel Clerk, Building 396, Industrial Relations Department, U. S. lavy Tard, Philadelphia, who permitted is employment records to be reviewed which reflected the following information of pertinence.

TABLEL LOUIS KLINE, born December 25, 1917, was amployed at the Navy Yard on September 16, 1937. He was originally given a probationary appointment as a Junior Messenger, Supply Department, CV-1, \$600 per annum. On June 1, 1938 KLINE was promoted to Undercletk-Typist, CAF-1, \$1260 per annum and to Junior Clerk - Typist, on November 16, 1939 at which time he held a rating of CAF-2 at \$1140 per annum. On October 6, 1940, KLINE resigned without prejudice.

The above-captioned individual was the Subject of an A.E.A.-A investigation, Bureau File 116-35698, as a result of Bureau letter dated September 24, 1947 to New York, with copy to Boston and Newark. By teletype dated October 2, 1947, the Bureau advised that the investigation should be discontinued. Prior to discontinuance, the Boston Office had checked

and had conducted neighborhood investigation in Dorchester and Boston, Massachusetts. All of this investigation was entirely favorable.

On May 19, 1950, LOUIS GOLD was contacted by the Boston Office concerning OLEG CONSTANTINE ENTRETEFF. aka. Al. Oleg Konstantinovick Entreteff

he had formerly been a professor at Brown University, Providence, Rhode Island, and had been acquainted with ENIKETETF for two years while the latter was a student at Brown. He recommended ENIKETETF favorably for a position with the Government.

On July 7, 1950, Headquarters of the U.S.A.F., First District Office of Special Investigation, 55 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts, reported that Dr. GOLD, believed to be formerly connected with the University of Colorado, had been visiting Geophysics Laboratory.

Watertown Arsenal, Watertown, Massachusetts, and, according to evinced undue interest in classified material. Upon receipt of this information a new "Security Matter - C" case was opened in the Boston Office concerning GOLD.

The files of the Boston Office reflect information concerning one IR. LOUIS COLD in the FOCASE indicating that an individual by that name had made several attempts to enter the Atomic Energy Premises at Los Alamos, New Mexico. This individual is possibly identical with Ir. LOUIS COLD the subject of this letter.

Reference is made to the report of SA ALBERT RUNDBAKEN, dated September 5, 1950, in the above captioned matter.

In this connection it will be noted that during a search of the residence of HARRY FOLD, 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pa., by Bureau Agents a number of sheets of paper in GOLD's handwriting, apparently referring to JOSEPH SCHULTZ, were found.

These notes contained background data on SCHULTZ and further indicated that he and GOLD had met in high school where they became friendly. SCHULTZ was further described as having worked himself up to the position of foremen in the construction and maintenance of neval aircraft at the Philadelphia Navy Yard. He was also described as having married a girl who dominated him and in whom he confided. According to GOLD, he stopped seeing SCHULTZ because of his wife.

GOLD, when questioned about JOSEPH SCHULTZ, explained that SCHULTZ was a fictitious individual. He added that he submitted the name of SCHULTZ to his Soviet superiors in 1938 as they were pressing him for additional recruits at that time. The information submitted concerning SCHULTZ was also fictitious, GOLD explained.

SHIRLEY TIMAN, nee OKEN, who appeared to be one of the factual individuals mentioned in GOLD's notes, was interviewed concerning GOLD and his friends. She denied knowing a SCHULTZ although she associated with GOLD during the period he allegedly knew SCHULTZ.

Records of the United States Havy indicate that a JOSEPH SCHULTZ was employed in the shippard section of the Philadelphia Havy Yard as an electrician, third class, from July 24, 1942 until March 27, 1946 when he was terminated due to a reduction in force. Information developed at the Navy Yard indicated that no one named SCHULTZ was ever a foreman in the aircraft section of the Yard. It was also determined to be highly unlikely that a third class electrician

from the shippard would have been assigned to work on airplanes. In addition SCHULTZ was listed as having attended the Central High School in Philadelphia which is situated in the northern section of the city, whereas GOLD, in explaining how he selected the name of the city, whereas GOLD, in explaining how he selected the name of SCHULTZ, declared it may have come from a South Philadelphis of SCHULTZ, declared it may have come from a South Philadelphis High School year book or some other directory such as a telephone directory.

Navy Yard records failed to list a JOSEPH SCHULTZ as having been employed prior to 1912.

However, while it is unlikely the JOSEPH SCHULTZ who was employed at the Havy Tard is identical with the JOSEPH SCHULTZ mentioned in GOLD's notes, it is believed that his interview would materially assist in positively eliminating him or further identifying him as a possible espionage recruit of GOLD.

Bureau authority is therefore requested for the interview of SCHULTZ.

To obtain authority to close this investigation of Joseph Schultz, said by Harry-fold to be a fictitious individual be suggested in 1938 as a possible recruit, without interviewing one Joseph Schultz, 1110 North 41st Street, Philadelphia, and without reviewing Bureau indices.

DETAILS

The search of Harry Gold's residence developed certain notes concerning a Joseph Schultz employed as a Foreman in the construction and maintenance of Maval Aircraft at the Philadelphia Navy Yard. According to these notes, Gold met Schultz in High School and later continued the acquaintanceship, often meeting at his (Schultz') or other people's homes for a social evening, at one of which parties he, Gold, met Herbert Epstein.

Harry Gold has advised that Joseph Schultz and Herbert Epstein are fictitious individuals on whom he submitted biographical data in 1938 when he was pressed by his Soviet superiors for possible recruits. Other notes found in the search of Gold's residence concorning Herbert Epstein stated that Epstein was known to a girl named Shirley Oken, who appeared to be a real person.

Investigation has developed that Joseph Schultz of 1110 North 41st Street, Philadelphia, was employed at the Philadelphia Havy Yard. This employment, however, was during the period from July 24, 1942, to March 27, 1946, and not during 1938. Furthermore, this Joseph Schultz was employed as an Electrician 3/C and not as a Percuan. Finally, this Schults attended Central Righ School in the me Northern section of Philadelphia, and all of his residences have been in the Northern section, whereas Gold attended South Philadelphia High School and resided in the Sourthern section of the city.

The Matter Stage Investigation at the Philadelphia Navy Yard failed to develop any other employees named Joseph Schultz, and Mr. William B. CEYO

In addition to the material discrepancies between the background of Joseph Schultz, 1110 Morth Wist Street, Philadelphia, and subject. It will be noted that the results of the interview of processing and the investigation at the Mavy Yard are corroborative of Gold's statement that the subject of this case is a fictitious person.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this case be closed without interviewing Joseph Schultz, 1110 North 41st Street, Philadelphia, and without reviewing the Bureau's indices in view of the apparent fictitious nature of the subject. For your approval there is attached an appropriate letter to the Philadelphia Office.



It will be noted that Mrs. SHENITZ was assigned to the 1466nd ALFBU from C tober 15, 1944, until June 5, 1945. Army records further reflect that Mrs. SHENITZ was hospitalized from November 16, 1944, to December 5, 1944, with the diagnosis of cause undetermined.

In interviews conducted with HARRY COLD, self-confessed Soviet espicage agent, on August 2-3, 1950, by Agents of the New York Office, GOLD stated he had sard the name, SHURA SLAN, when ABRAHAM BROTHMAN mentioned that name to him in the March 1942 at New York City, on which occasion GOLD and BROTHMAN were both registered at the New Yorker Hotel. At this time, according to GOLD, BROTHMAN mentioned that his friend, SHURA STAN, who had worked for the Soviet men, had been laid off. Further, BROTHMAN gave GOLD the idea that SWAN worked for Amtorg and was the individual who first introduced BROTHMAN to another Amtorg man, not identified, to engage in industrial espionage. BROTHMAN requested GOLD to see hat he could do to resecure STAN's job at Amtorg. GOLD replied he would see what he could do in this respect.

GOLD recalled that JUN's name was morely mentioned in 1943. However, in about June 1946 EROTHMAN was berating various Soviet officials in this country for makericans working for them. He referred to SMAN's case.

It was this informant's belief that STEFANSSEN had acquired a favorable impression of the Soviet peoples due to his contact with them on his numerous arctic expeditions.

The following confidential informants, of known reliability, were unable to furnish information regarding Communist activity on the part of STEFANSSEN:

Association with Communists and Communist Sympathizers

The Morning Freiheit" published November 10, 1945 reflected that VILHJALMUR STEFANSSEN was a guest at the Soviet Consulate, 7 East 61st Street, New York City on November 8, 1945 on the occasion of the 28th anniversary of the Russian Revolution.

Concerning the "Morning Freiheit", "The Worker", an East Coast Communist newspaper published January 9, 1944 set forth on page 3 an article by WILLIAM Z. FOSTER, Chairman of the Communist Party, USA. The article stated that the "Morning Freiheit" was one of the many newspaper either owned or supported by the Communist Party.

D.", a trade magazine for art directors. SEITLIN also is a psychologist and writer, according to the informant, and had contributed to the aforesaid magazine, "Direction", in 1945.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that PERCY SEITLIN had been in contact with JULES KORCHIEN in april, 1947.

According to Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, KORCHIEN was the leader of a Communist dominated group of tenants in the Knickerbocker Village Tenant's Association during KORCHIEN'S residence at Knickerbocker Village, which is located at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.


It will be noted also that KORCHIEN was formerly associated with ABREMAM-BROTHMAN and Associates, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. 

In a report prepared by T-1, another Government agency that maintains personnel records and conducts intelligence investigations, at a time when BRUIN was in the Army, it is indicated that he told another soldier he fought for the Loyalist Army in Spain, or possibly was an office clerk for the Loyalist Army. Also, in his biographical sketch, BRUIN states he left the United States in 1916 with his mother, and remained in Russia five years before returning to this country. The files of the State Department, at Washington, D. C., contain no record that a passport had been applied for, or issued to the subject under his true name or known aliases.

COLLUNIST PARTY CONNECTIONS

A. Proof of Membership.

HARRY GOLD advised he first met ERUIN at Drexel Institute in Philadelphia around 1934. He informed that ERUIN was at that time an open Communist, and was going about attempting to recruit other students.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that a meeting of the 6th Congressional District of the COMMUNIST PARTY was held on January 10, 19hh in a club room on the third floor above the Bliss Drug Store, 60th Street and Haverford Avenue. This informant advised that several times during the meeting, the name of JACK ERUIN was mentioned, and after the meeting, the informant found a note, on the outside of which was written "JACK ERUIN". The note stated, "JACK, May I have some material? One of the comrades agreed to take BOERY for an hour tomorrow afternoon." The informant stated that ERUIN took an active part in the evening's proceedings.



This informant advised that he was convinced from SVENCHANSKY'S attitude towards the Russians at Ladd Field, from his background, his outspoken criticism of the United States Army and his general remarks over a period of weeks that SVENCHANSKY was a Communist, and considered himself more a Russian soldier than an American soldier.

The files of Confidential Informant T-7 also contained a memorandum dated July 5, 1943, covering an interview with Confidential Informant T-9, of unknown reliability, but an officer of the United States Air Force who was familiar with SVENCHANSKY'S activities at that time at Ladd Field. This informant mentioned in the course of the interview that it was generally accepted at Ladd Field that SVENCHANSKY was a strong Communist because of his attitude and his close association with the Russian personnel both during on and off duty hours.



During interviews had with HARRY GOLD, a self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, on August 2nd and 3rd, 1950, GOLD advised that he had first heard the name SHURA SWAN when ABRAHAM BROTHMAN mentioned that name to him in March, 1942. According to GOLD, BROTHMAN mentioned that his friend, SHURA, who worked for the Soviet Union had recently been laid off by them. BROTHMAN gave GOLD the impression that SHURA worked for the Amtorg Trading Corporation and that he was the man who had introduced BROTHMAN to another Amtorg man who induced BROTHMAN to engage in industrial espionage.

The indictment contained a second count, charging BROTHMAN with wilfully influencing GOLD to give false testimony before a Grand Jury on July 31, 1947. Their trial began on November 8, 1950 in the Southern District of New York, and on November 22, 1950, the jury returned a verdict of guilty for BROTHMAN on both counts and for MOSKOWITZ on the one count.

ACTIVITIES AND ASSOCIATES

There is contained in the files of the Passport Division, United States Department of State, a letter dated August 20, 1937 from ANGEL FLORES, Editor of "Critics Group Series," 96 Fifth Avenue, New York, and written on stationery of that organization. This letter was addressed to the Honorable CORDELL HULL, Secretary of State, Washington, D. C., and reads as follows:

"My dear Mr. HULL:

"Our friend, Mr. ALEXANDER SVENCHANSKY, has been assigned by our staff to write a series of articles on the present Spanish situation. Mr. SVENCHANSKY is preparing, as a matter of fact, a work on this subject. Could you possibly help us out in seeing that Mr. SVENCHANSKY obtains permission to go to Spain for this purpose?

Also appearing in the file is a letter written August 21, 1937 from the subject, to the Passport Division, advising that he had been assigned by the Staff of the "Critics Group" to write a series of articles for them on the situation in Spain. He stated that for this purpose it would be necessary for him to go to Spain as soon as possible. He noted that he desired to go to Spain solely with that purpose in mind, and the "Critics Group" was the only organization he was associated with at that time.

It was noted that the Passport file also contained a letter dated June 5, 1937 from the subject, then residing at 609 West 158th Street, New York City, in which he noted that he was compiling data for a novel dealing with the Spanish Civil

ACTIVITIES AND AFFILIATIONS

According to Bureau letter to Chicago dated December 11, 1950, a monthly intelligence summary of the Manhattan District dated October, 1945, reflects JEROME H. MANHEIM had advised T/5 THOMAS ALPHENBERG and DON C. MILLER, SED, Los Alamos, not to correspond with him as he was being investigated by the F.B.I. for alleged Communist activities. He informed FILIBERG and MILLER that he was never active but was reconsidering his political philosophy and had given up his pro-Aussian bias.

Py letter to the Director dated March 19, 1951, the Albuquerque Office advised that a search of its files failed to disclose any information bearing on the above mentioned correspondence.

It is to be noted that DAVID GREENGLASS advised Special Agent JOHN A. HARRINGTON that he believes he furnished the name of THOWAS AN FINEBERG to HARRINGTON as a possible espionage recruit at Los Alamos. This information is reported in the report of Special Agent JOHN W. LEWIS dated October 30, 1950 at New York entitled "DAVID GREENGLASS, was, Espionage - R."

It is noted that D.VID GREENGLASS pleaded guilty on October 18, 1950 to an indictment charging conspiracy to commit espionage before Honorable WILLIAM RONIN, U. S. District Judge, Southern District of New York, and that HARRY GOLD was named as a co-conspirator in this indictment though not named as a defendant.

The December 10, 1950 issue of the Chicago Daily Tribune, Page 12, Column 3, contains a news item under a Philadelphia December 9, 1950 dateline, reflecting HARRY GOLD, a research chemist, to have been sentenced to thirty years in prison for having been a courier of a Russian atomic spy ring.

5. The trial judge committed reversible error in his refusal to charge that the defendant MOSKOWITZ must be acquitted if the Jury could infer a hypothesis of innocence from the substantive case against her, as well as a hypothesis of guilt.

6. The trial judge committed reversible error in his refusal to charge that the defendant BROTHWAN must be acquitted of the 2nd Count of the indictment, unless the Jury found that the defendant BROTHWAN influenced HARRY GOLD on July 31, 1947 and at no other time.

7. The trial judge committed a reversible error in his refusal to charge that if GOID'S testimony on July 31, 1947, was pursuant to an agreement with the defendant BROTHMAN made prior to July 31, 1947, they must acquit the defendant BROTHMAN of the 2nd Count of the indictment.

8. The evidence as against the defendant MDSKOWITZ was insufficient as a matter of law to establish her guilt beyond a reasonable doubte

On April 25, 1951, Deputy United States Marshal Southern District of New York, advised that he had intended to transport MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ to the Federal Reformatory for Women at Alderson, West Virginia on the same day. However, on that date, she served the warden of the Women's House of Detention, New York City, with a "notice of election not to serve".

April 25, 1951 and that any time served after this date by her in the Women's House of Detention, New York City, will not count toward her original sentence, but that time served prior to April 25, 1951, would count.

On May 22, 1951, a writ of Habeas Corpus was granted to MOSKOWITZ and ABRAHAM BROIHMAN, her co-defendant, by Judge EDWARD CONGER of the Southern District of New York. According to JOHN N. FOLEY, Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, their purpose in bringing on this writ was to enable them to meet and confer in the United States Court House relative to certain unfinished business of ABRAHAM BROIHMAN and Associates. According to FOLEY, they also desired to prepare certain tax returns for this firms.

This writ was returnable May 25, 1951 before Judge HENRY W. GODDARD,

but was adjourned to May 31, 1951 since the United States Attorney's Office was unable to obtain the signature of the United States Marshal on the return.

On this latter date, WILLIAM L. MESSING, Attorney for BROTHMAN and MOSKOWITZ, could not be present. It was, therefore, adjourned to June 4, 1951 by Judge GODDARD and by agreement between counsel for both sides, this date was subsequently changed to June 5, 1951.

On this date, argument on the writ was heard by Judge SAMUEL J. KAUFMAN, Southern District of New York, who denied the write

On June 11, 1951, MOSKOWITZ's appeal from her conviction for conspiracy to obstruct justice was argued by her attorney, WILLIAM L. MESSING, before the United States Court of Appeals, Second Circuit. The court on this date was composed of Chief Judge THOMAS SMAN and Judges LEARNED and AUGUSTUS HAND

A check of the records maintained by the United States Marshal, Southern District of New York, reflects that MOSKOWITZ was removed to the Federal Reformatory for Women at Alderson, West Virginia on June 22, 1951

On July 26, 1951, the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, in an opinion written by Chief Judge SWAN and concurred in by Judges LEARNED and AUGUSTUS HAND affirmed MOSKOWITZ's conviction for conspiracy to obstruct justice. Her appeal to this court challenged the sufficiency of the evidence to prove her participation in the conspiracy and claimed prejudicial error in the prosecutor's summation. The court, however, rejected both of these contentions.



GOLD recalled that TOM JACKSON was a drafts—man or an engineer; that he was of English ancestry and possibly a member of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians.


