At that time, a car bearing Virginia license 113-983 was observed to have taken part in these demonstrations. The owner of the car was determined to be Helen Gurewitz, 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Va. (no source given)

On 9/13/41, Bureau Agent observed two young boys who had been present at a meeting of the Haryland and DC Young Communist League, which was held at Hurray's Casino, Washington, D. C., carrying material and placing it in a car parked in that vicinity. This car bore the license No. 87-373, which car was in the name of Clarence Gurewitz, alleged organizer of the CP in D.C. It was noted that Clarence was not in the car; however, an individual believed to be Gurewitz' wife, Helen Guerwitz, was having trouble starting the car at which time, Henry Thomas, a Negro who was an alleged communist in D.C., was attempting to start the car for her.

Bureau Agent also observed a Negro driving a car bearing license No. 76-434 drive up behind the Gurewitz car and get out and engage in a conversation with Henry Thomas and the individual believed to be Helen Gurewitz.

A check of the MPD, Traffic Records, revealed that this car was listed to Ernest Best, Negro, 716 L. Street, S. B. Bureau Agent identified Best as having been present at the aforementioned meeting.

On 11/4/42, ONI advised that their records contained a CP card dated 10/7/41 on Helen Gurewitz. (No further information)

At a special hearing held for Lillian Goldsmith (101-105) by the CSC on 3/5/42, she was asked about Helen Gurewitz. She stated that she did not know her.

It was noted that the name of Helen Gurewitz had not appeared previously in instant file concerning Goldsmith.

This reference is a WFO report dated 3/20/42, captioned "Shirley Nancy Mislove," 101-1190. This reference pertains to the close association of Mislove with Casey and Helen Gurewitz. Information therein revealed that Mislove resided at 4833 Reservoir Rd., N. W., with the Gurewitzes. Mr. and Mrs. Gurewitz bore questionable reputations among residents of that vicinity because of frequent drinking parties held there at which Negroes and whites intermingled. This situation led to frequent complaints from other residents of the neighborhood, who were under the impression that Mislove and the Gurewitzes were communists. Also set out was Helen Gurewitz' affiliations with the CP and CP fronts.



C. At one of thes parties, other guests were Helen and Casev Gurewitz and Elaine Goldstein. It was noted that WFO files revealed that Elaine Goldstein had been an officer in the CP.



Informant was of the opinion that this was a communist meeting inasmuch as Anne and Jack Zucker were also supposed to attend. It was noted that the Zuckers were known members of the CP, as was Helen Gurewitz, and that all had held official positions in the Party in the District of Columbia.

The photograph of Helen Gurewitz was shown to graph, Bureau of Standards, and he stated that he recognized the photograph of Mrs. Gurewitz, also known as Helen Sobell.

Max Elitcher advised that during the end of December 1946, he and his wife, Helene Elitcher, met Julius Rosenberg on the street outside of Alfred Sarant's apartment in Greenwich Village, NYC. They went around the corner to a restaurant where they met Helen and Norton Sobell, William Perl and Joel Barr (65-59453). They all had dinner together at this restaurant, which Elitcher recalled as being "The Blue Hill." They left the restaurant quite late and the entire group went to Julius Rosenberg's apartment at 10 Nonroe St., Knickerbocker Village.

Helene Elitcher advised substantially the same facts that her husband, Hax Elitcher, had given.

It was noted that on March 8-9, 1951, Max Elitcher testified as one of a number of government witnesses in the Federal District Court, Southern District of NY, in the espionage-conspiracy trial of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

He recalled that they, the Jasik family, and the Sobells visited in each others homes in NYC. Jasik also stated that at the end of 1949 or early 1950, Hrs. Sobell contacted him regarding a text book on the "Quantum Theory." During this interview, Jasik identified the photographs of Helen and Horton Sobell.

On 6/13/51, Harry Belock (65-60008), former Vice President and General Manager of the Reeves Instrument Corporation, NYC, advised that he personally requested Morton Sobell to work for him at Reeves. Belock added that Sobell's wife, Helen, was also an employee of Reeves and that he had no idea either were communists, He said that to him both appeared to be loyal citizens. Belock stated that he began employment at Reeves in 1944 and resigned his position in 1950.

Jasik (65-01539) and Esther Jasik testified before the Federal Grand Jury, SDNY.

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When interviewed by Bureau Agents, the Jasiks were questioned at great length concerning all contacts they had ever had with Morton Sobell. In the course of the interview, they outlined their series of contacts with Sobell, indicating that the last time they had any contact whatsoever with Mr. and Mrs. Morton Sobell was at the Sobell home in Flushing, NY, sometime in the early summer of 1950. Their visit on this occasion was purely social. The Jasiks made no further mention of any subsequent contacts with the Sobells.

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It was noted that Max Elitcher, who refused to cooperate with Julius Rosenberg, the executed agent, but who was in daily contact with the Sobells, had received no advance notice from Sobell that he intended taking a vacation or going any place. Elitcher and Sobell were in a daily car pool traveling to Reeves Instrument Co. It was only by accident that Elitcher learned that the Sobells were going to leave the country.

It was further noted that Blitcher, shortly before Sobell fled the US, had observed the Jasiks visiting at Sobell's residence.

William Danziger testified that on the night the Sobells were departing for Nexico he called on the Sobells. Danziger also testified that after the Sobells arrived in Nexico he received several letters from Norton Sobell. These letters were to be delivered or mailed by him to people designated by Sobell.

Under the heading "Mrs. Sobell Arrives At Nother's Home", it was stated that Helen Levitov Guerwitz Sobell, Washington - born wife of the FBI's latest atom spy suspect, arrived at Washington, D. C., on 8/19/50, from Texas and reportedly went to her mother's home in Arlington. According to Mrs. Sobell's brother David Levitov, she once was membership secretary of the CP in D. C.
