

On July 20, 1967, verified the departure of Helen Sobell on the above freighter. He stated the exact date the freighter will return to Brooklyn, New York, is not known at this time because several stops in the United States might be scheduled prior to its return to New York.

Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and Morton Sobell were convicted in the United States District Court (USDC), Southern District of New York (SDNY), on March 29, 1951, on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR). The Rosenbergs were sentenced to duath on April 5, 1951, and Morton Sobell was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on the same date. Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were legally executed at Sim Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953. Morton Sobell is currently serving his sentance in the custody of the United States Attorney General.

She stated that she and the CFMS have triedlevery avenue of approach in seeking her husband's freedom.



It was learned that HELEN SOBELL felt the CFMS had accomplished more than was hoped for at the 50th Birthday Program, which was held for MORTON SOBELL on April 11, 1967, at the Hunter College Auditorium in New York City.




At the 50th Birthday Meeting to honor MORTON SOBELL, which was sponsored by CFMS on April 11, 1967, in New York City, the subject gave an emotional talk as a faithfull primaring wife and seemed to almost enjoy the role.




A CFMS circular letter, dated November 3, 1967, signed by HELEN SOBELL, stated that MORTON SOBELL's appeal to the Supreme Court was being filed on November 6, 1967. The letter urged the recipient to take whatever action is possible to urge newspaper editors to support MORTON SOBELL's appeal for a hearing.





A CFMS circular letter, dated December, 1967, signed by HELEN SOBELL, stated in part that "Proof of MORTON SOBELL's innocence and the fraud and forgery of the prosecutors in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case are now before the Supreme Court awaiting a decision". This letter made an appeal to help out in the financial obligations of CFMS.

HELEN SOBELL stated that MORTON

SOBELL would be released from prison in July, 1969. She encouraged the sale of the book concerning the ROSENBERGS in which the SOBELL case is discussed.



A CFMS circular letter, dated March 12, 1968, signed by HELEN SOBELL, stated that MORTON SOBELL's freedom date has been changed to not later than July, 1969. The letter stated the CFMS was then engaged in a law suit in Washington, D.C., attempting to have MORTON SOBELL credited with two periods of time which the Bureau of Prisons calls "inoperative".



The April 27, 1968 issue of "The Guardian", formerly known as the "National Guardian", page 19, contained an ad-

vertisement indicating CFMS would sponsor an affair on June 19, 1968, at Carnegie Recital Hall, New York City, in memory of the ROSENBERGs and in anticipation of MORTON SOBELL's release in 1969.

A characterization of the "National Guardian" is contained in the Appendix section of this report.

The June 11, 1968 issue of "The Worker", page 7, contained an advertisement of the above CFMS affair to be held on June 19, 1968, and named the subject as one of the "honored guests".

"The Worker" is an East Coast Communist newspaper.

District Court (USDC), Southern District of New York (SDNY), on March 29, 1951, on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR). The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953. MORTON SOBELL was conditionally released from the United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, on January 14, 1969, and is on probation under the jurisdiction of the United States Probation Officer, SDNY, New York, New York, until May 14, 1981.



D. Education



The Committee to Free Morton Sobell is a defunct communist front organized in 1953 to support MORTON SOBELL, a convicted Soviet espionage agent, and dissolved in 1969 after his release from prison.

It was determined that HELEN SOBELL attended Bucknell University from June 24 to August 2, 1968, during which period she took one course in mathematics and one course in physics, receiving a final grade of "A" in each course. Mrs. SOBELL resided in the new women's residence hall on the Bucknell Campus during her attendance.

On February 25, 1969, it was determined that HELEN SOBELL was among the students whose attendance at Bucknell was financed by the National Science Foundation Grant during the summer of 1968. It was further determined that to be eligible for financial assistance from the federal government to attend the University under this program, all applicants

must have at least a Bachelors Degree and must be employed as a high school science teacher. They must also be recommended by the principal or head of the department at the school where they are employed. Those qualifying under this program are allowed an average of \$450 for tuition and books, \$90 for each dependent, and \$43 for travel expenses.

III. AFFILIATION WITH THE ANTI-WAR MOVEMENT

On January 22, 1970, it was determined that MORTON and HELEN SOBELL mailed form letters during January, 1970, appealing for funds to aid in the defense of the trial of the "Chicago Seven". The letter requested that funds be sent directly to the Chicago Defense Fund, 28 East Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois, and it contained an envelope addressed to this fund. It was further determined that the letter was in the nature of a personal letter signed by MORTON and HELEN SOBELL, and that it was mailed to individuals on the mailing list of the NRSC.



It is common knowledge that the "Chicago Seven" is a group of seven individuals who were tried and convicted in Chicago, Illinois, on charges of conspiracy and interstate travel to promote a riot.
