A photograph of GAFFRON has been obtained from Immigration and Naturalization Service files, Chicago, Illinois, by Special Employee ROBERT W. NICKLESS. Two copies of this photograph are being enclosed ≥for the Bureau, New York and Boston. Special Agent RICHARD J. BAKER has interviewed the following approved sources of information at the University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois: Miss ANNA B. WALKER, Secretary to the Vice-President, University of Chicago, who has the custody of faculty records, advises that GAFFRON has been employed by the University of Chicago since October 1, 1939. He is presently an Associate Professor of Biochemistry and Research Associate in Chemistry in the Department of Chemistry and in the Institute of Radio Biology and Biophysics. Wiss WALKER advises that he has one quarter off each year but that her records do not contain information indicating which quarter he had off in any particular year. She has no information which would show whether GAFFRON had any time off during the period between August, 1944 and January 1, 1945. Miss WALKER has in her possession a photograph of GAFFRON which was obtained in 1939. This photograph was identical with the photograph obtained from Immigration and Naturalization Service, which would indicate that the photograph being transmitted was taken not later than 1939. TS. Miss WALKER would be in a position to obtain information of this type but it is not certain that the necessary discreetness could be maintained in obtaining information as to absences of GAFFRON from the University during the pertinent period. For this reason, Miss WALKER has not been requested to obtain information pertinent to GAFFRON's absences.

Doctor WARREN CHARLES CHINSON, Chairman, Department of Chemistry, University of Chicago, would have information of this type in his possession or would be in a position to discreetly obtain the information pertaining to CAFFRON's absences. JCHNSON has in the past been extremely cooperative with this office in connection with Atomic Energy Act - Applicant and Employee investigations. He has been investigated under the Atomic Energy Act personnel investigation program and has received a "Q" clearance from the Atomic Energy Commission. He is presently attached on a part-time basis to the Argonne National Laboratory in the Chicago area.

of the furnished Special Agent GEORGE E. DAVIS 12 with information in 1948 to the effect that WARREN C. JOHNSON, 1301 East 100 60th Street, Chicago 37, Illinois, was a member of the Atomic Scientists of Chicago.

The Personnel Security Questionnaire prepared by JOHNSON in 1949 in connection with his clearance under the Atomic Energy Act, set out that he was a member of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions from 1945 to 1946 at which time he resigned. He also stated that at one time he was a member of the Executive Committee of the ICCASP in Chicago.

The *Chicago Daily News*, April 23, 1946, contains an article to the effect that nine Chicagoans, representing the ICCASP, had sent a telegram to President TRUMAN, urging that President TRUMAN send UNO Representatives and a Congressional Committee to the Atom Bomb tests against Naval vessels. One of the signers of the telegram was WARREN C. JOHNSON.

The "Chicago Daily Tribune" for November 8, 1946 carries an article which states that various scientists in the Chicago area have resigned from the ICCASP. One of these is Doctor WARREN C. JOHNSON, University of Chicago, Department of Chemistry, Chairman.

The Bureau is requested to authorize an interview with JCHNSCN pertaining to GAFFRON so that any absences of GAFFRON from the University during the pertinent period can be ascertained. It is suggested that this interview also include the obtaining of information pertaining to GAFFRON's present activities and associates which is being handled in connection with a separate investigation.

Boston is requested to exhibit the photograph of GAFFRON to
BOBERT and KRISTELLHEINEMAN in order to determine whether GAFFRON might
be identical with unknown subject to the results of this examination by the HEINEMANS should be furnished the Bureau, New York and







Many members of the Joint Committee feel strongly that the Fuchs confession and interview - copies of which you have transmitted to us - should be declassified and made public.

It is felt that the Soviet Union in all probability possesses the information contained in these documents, which are couched in fairly general terms in any event. Accordingly, publication would have the advantage of informing our people as to the extent of the increased danger which they confront as a result of the fuchs affair — and in a democracy they would seem to be entitled to this information. Moreover, the Commission is experiencing difficulty in recruiting scientific and technical personnel needed in our own hydrogen project, and the Fuchs documents, if made public might influence the heeded people to make available their services. By the same token, publication might help create greater security consciousness among project employees.

Members of the Reactor Development Subcommittee, who visited the Argonne and Knolls Laboratories last week-end, have advised the full committee that publication of the Canadian report arising out of the case involving Dr. Allan Num May had a helpful effect upon our own people in stimulating them to take greater care in guarding classified information, and also in impressing them with the need for the utmost efforts on our part in order to retain a tomic leadership!

For all such reasons as these, I request that careful consideration be given to the idea of declassifying and publishing the Fuchs documents, and that the Joint Committee be advised as soon as possible regarding such action as may be taken along

Mr. DAVID JUEL, Personnel Director, M. W. Kellogg Company, Foot of Denforth Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey, assisted SA CARLOGE C. LENZ in obtaining the past employment records of EMIL ZOLA BARISH. The records consisted of a personnel service record which reflected that EMIL Z. BARISH, Social Security No. 558-10-7924, was employed by the company from January 12, 1942 to June 16, 1942, when he resigned to accept a new position. The record also indicated that he was employed in the Mechanical Engineering Department as a draftsman, had been born on May 8, 1916, in the United States, and was married. There was no other information contained in this record.

In addition to the above, Mr. JOHL made available BARISH's application that he filled out when he applied for the position. A photostatic copy of this application is enclosed herewith for the Bureau and New York. A photographic negative was also made of this application in the event that a handwriting analysis is desired at a later date. The photographic negative will be maintained in the Newark file.

Mr. JOEL said that from a review of BARISH's application for employment it was apparent that he had never worked at the Jersey City plant, but had been employed entirely in their New York Office. All the records at the Jersey City Office were searched in an attempt to locate a photograph for BARISH without success. Mr. JOEL also made a routine inquiry at the New York Office of the M. W. Kellogg Company in an attempt to locate a photograph there, but without success.

In September 1949, it was determined that EMIL BARISH was employed by the Industrial Process Engineers Company, 8 Lister Avenue, Newark, New Jersey. No further attempt has been made by Newark to determine whether or not he is still employed with this company.

Kellogg Company, the former place of employment for BARISH. The Newark files contain no other information concerning TONKONOGY.

In the visa application, FRANCK stated that he had resided in Berlin, Germany until 1936 and in Bahal, Switzerland, from October, 1936 until July, 1938. He listed his mother as IOTTE STEINITZ and his father as HEINRICH FRANCK, Berlin, Germany.

FRANCK stated in the application that he intended to join MR. and MRS. GEORGE BARSKY in New York, New York; that he was immigrating for perhanent residence. The visa reflected FRANCK's entry at the Port of New York on August 28, 1938, on the Statendam. He was given Alien Registration #3570152. Further reflected in the INS files was a Declaration of Intention #17432 filed June 17, 1943, which contained the names of identifying witnesses as JOSEPH D. COPPOCK, 3901 Davis Place, N. W., Washington, D. C., executive, OPA, and one who had known FRANCK since February, 1939, and GERTI LANDAUER, Arlington Village, Assistant Economist, who had known FRANCK since February, 1940.

The 1949 New York directory did not give a residence address for FRANK A. STRAUSS, however, it is to be noted that in the report of Special Agent JOHN R. Further, that it was to provide an orderly channel through which American and Soviet scientists might exchange publications, conferences and correspondence. The membership list of October, 1946, contains the name of Doctor BARSKY, chemical

New York should endeavor to locate a photograph of Doctor GEORGE BARSKY in view of the probability that PETER FRANCK knew KIAUS FUCHS in Germany in 1933.

Bureau instructions are requested concerning an interview with FRANCK. It is suggested the Bureau give instructions to institute a physical surveillance of FRANCK to determine his current activities prior to an interview.

Washington Phone Directory, reside at 173h P Street, N. W.

A pretext phone call to the American University revealed that FRANCK is presently a part-time instructor there.

The Washington Field Office is endeavoring to obtain a photograph of Doctor GEORGE BARSKY and is giving instant investigation continuous attention. It is expected that a report will be submitted on this matter in the near future.

he. Edward Corson had contacted Dr. J. Robert Oppenhaiser who said that Corson obviously was distraught and mentally deranged. Oppenhaiser seported to the Hewark Office that Corson talked about a position as a follow research student at the Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton, and went on to say that he was going to Russia with some other scientists on a mission. Br. Oppenhaiser reported that Corson next stated there were other accentists in England as dangerous as Puchs. Corson reportedly told Oppenhaiser that he had made public some letters and telegrams in which he, Corson, maintained that Puchs was innocent. Corson is reported to have then said that at present his wife was missing and that there was a 15-state alarm for his wife. He told Oppenhaiser he could be reached in care of David Kratcher, Editor of "Physics Today." Oppenhaiser repeated his previous statement regarding the mental oppdition of Corson.

Corson then attempts to analyse the cause for Fuchs' fans tical Communism which would lead him to betray atomic energy information to a foreign power, He observed that Fuchs is elearly a brilliant psychopathis personality, perhaps made so by the torture and marder of members of his family by the Masis. He comments that it is a small wonder that Pushs sould be derunged. He poses the question whether society is not on trial along with Fushs. He concluded that the direct issue of the case is not that of the "Paychotic Fuchs vs. The State," but rather one of spenkind vs. God in the form of truth, beauty, ethics and logic." Corson finally makes a fervent plea that all ecientists stop nee theoretical work on perfecting more terrible weapons of destructions

In the source of this "Letter to the Editor" Corson made th ent that "I had sorked closely with Pache in America during the twoyear, car-time period of inglo-incrican ecoperation on the garbatian Project and I believe that the essential workings of this man's (Puohs) aind were reasonably elear to me. His political allegiances were unknown to me, but I was fully convinced that he was not capable of betraying any trust personal or mational.

Bureau files reflect Corson was the subject of an Atomic Emergy Act-Employee investigation conducted in September and October, 1947, as a result of his application for employment as a consultant with the Brookhawan Mational Laboratory, Long Yeland, New York, According to his application, he was born June 27, 1921, long Island, New York, and both of his parents are naturalised estisens of Russian birth. He holds a Ph.D.Degree from Johns Hopkins University and formerly was saployed from 1943 to 1947 as a research physicist by the Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation, New York City, and Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The investigation reflects that Charles We Shaw, Professor of Physics, Ohio State University, who was well acquainted with Corson, said that he had heard Corson make statements which led Shaw

to believe Vorson to be in sympathy with Russia during the part. Then know of no subversive elements with which Corson was connected, and did not think him disloyal, although he said Corson had a tendency to be man reliable and he dealined to recommend him for employments.
