
The Informant was unable to comment upon the significance of this information.

RONALD WILFRID GURNEY was investigated in 1949 and in the early part of 1950 under the provisions of Executive Order 9835. By letter dated October 6, 1950, the Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, advised that GURNEY "withdrew from consideration prior to decision on loyalty".

EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS, self-confessed Soviet Espionage agent, who was convicted during 1950 of Soviet espionage in England, was interviewed by Mr. HUGH H. CLEGG, Assistant Director of the FBI, and Special Agent ROBERT J. LANPHERE of the FBI at London, England, on May 26, 1950. FUCHS said that he became acquainted with RONALD GURNEY and his wife, NATALIE, in Bristol, England, about 1933 and was closely acquainted with them until at least 1937. He also met the GURNEYS at Chicago, Illinois, in November, 1947.

FUCHS said that consideration had been given for the employment of Dr. GURNEY at Harwell, England in the Atomic Energy Research Plant there. FUCHS said that he would regard Dr. GURNEY as a security risk. He based this evaluation on the fact that Dr. GURNEY and his wife had both belonged to the Society for Cultural Relations with the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in Bristol during the 1930's. FUCHS himself had attended some meetings of this society while he was in Bristol and although he was not actually a member of it, he regarded this society as a Communist front organization. He advised that Mrs. GURNEY was particularly active in this organization.

FUCHS said that his statement that he would regard Dr. GURNEY as

a security risk may have been somewhat prejudiced because GURNEY was turned down from employment at Harwell. FUCHS believes that the question of loyalty possibly entered into this rejection of Dr. GURNEY but he does not know that this is absolutely a fact. Mr. FUCHS said that the question of Dr. GURNEY's loyalty did not trouble him so much as the loyalty of Mrs. GURNEY. He explained this by saying that he did not know that she did actually engage in espionage activities but he believed that other people might contact Soviet espionage agents through her.

Mr. Barwich. I believe they excluded only some newer ideas, newer developments which they had not yet developed to a degree that they were sure of the results. So they did not disclose these things. But it is not for secrecy, but only for competition.

Mr. Sourwine. Right.

If there had been any weapons research there you wouldn't have shown it to a visiting scientist from the West.

Mr. BARWICH. Never.

Mr. Sourwine. When you were head of the nuclear research center at Rossendorf did you have a deputy?

Mr. Barwich. Yes.

Mr. Sourwine. Who was he?

Mr. Barwich. I had first the one deputy. This was Professor Schwabe, and after some time I had a second deputy. This was Klaus Fuchs.

Mr. Sourwine. He was the convicted British atom spy?


Mr. Barwich. Yes.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you know him well?

Mr. BARWICH. Yes.

Mr. Sourwine. Do you consider him an important scientist?

Mr. Barwich. In the time we live now he cannot be so important. But from—because he lost too much time and health and all these things, and in the first place he is a Communist, and so in this con-



Mr. Sourwing. Would you be able to evaluate the value or importance of the scientific information that Fuchs obtained clandestinely from the British or from the Americans?

Mr. Barwich. When he came from England to East Germany his information could not have any value any more.

Mr. Sourwine. I meant at the time

Mr. Barwich. At this time?

Mr. Sourwine. At the time he obtained the information for the Soviets.

Mr. BARWICH. At the time he gave, I think, yes, because he could give figures, the figures which are very important for research, for

saving time in research, and saving time in construction, too.

Mr. Sourwing. I have heard it said that Klaus Fuchs' information, the information he obtained as a part of his espionage activities, may have saved the Soviets 2 years. Is that a fair appraisal?

Mr. Barwich. Oh, yes. I believe 2 years is not—maybe not very

optimistic. It may be more.

Mr. Sourwine. He might have advanced them by more than 2

Mr. Barwich. Two years I personally think that it is quite possible, even more.

Mr. Sourwine. Even more.

And those were two very crucial years, were they not?
Mr. BARWICH. Yes. These were the crucial years. You must always evaluate it as of that time. Today it has no value.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you ever have any discussions with Fuchs about his activity in securing information from the British and from the Americans?

Mr. Barwich. No. He even didn't like to speak about jail and about this time because in German public opinion he has suffered from political—he was in jail for political reasons which was the official term of introducing him in East Germany. They had not admitted that he had been judged by law, by simple law, he had confessed. It was a very clear story, of course, in this case.

Mr. Sourwing. Prof. Manford von Ardenne, he was reported in the press as having termed your defection as deplorable. What are his


duties? He was technically your superior, was he not?

Mr. BARWICH. No.

Mr. Sourwine. Never! The press reported that he was your supe-

rior. What was that situation !

Mr. Barwich. Ardenne has his own small laboratory which he had organized by money which he had saved during the time he was in the Soviet Union. So he had begun with a small house with more or less 35 people and 1 or 2 scientists when he returned from Russia in 1955. This laboratory has grown, and I think now has 70 or 80 persons and more scientists, younger scientists, and he works on a lot of different tasks.



Mr. Barwich. No. They have carefully planned research, everybody who compares the facilities of this plant for nuclear research at Dubna compared with the plants in America would say the chance of success is better in America than at Dubna because of this basic condition. And now good luck means nature has given them a better chance than we had thought about. Nature had given—

Mr. Sourwing. I understand. Mr. Barwich. It is good planning. They achieved a good work in this technique, and so on, but they were even themselves not so con-Kerse!

Mr. Sourwing. Sir, did you know Brung Pontecorvo!

Mr. Barwich. Yes.

Mr. Sourwing. What was your association with him, if any !-Mr. Barwich. As a colleague we met sometimes in the residential

area and sometimes in the laboratory area. So it was not a friendship or relationship but acquaintance.

Mr. Sourwing. He was the scientist who fled from Britain in 1950

to the Soviet Union. Mr. Barwich. Yes.

Mr. Sourwing. Would you be able to evaluate him as a scientist?

Is he in the first rank?

Mr. Barwich. Yes. He seems to be really in the first rank. There is no comparison with Fuchs. He is a real good scientist in my opinion and has good ideas and good knowledge and activities in his field.

Mr. Sourwing. Would you say that Russia's achievement in inducing him to leave Britain and come to Russia was a substantial accomplishment as far as the advancement of science in Russia is concerned ?

Mr. Barwich. It is difficult to say. I think if he had not come there would be no big difference, because his main work is more in ideas and theory than in the practical sense, there is no shortage of theoretical thinking in Russia, and so I think they had not planned to get him for this reason. This was a coincidence of some facts which happened in this time.


Mr. Sourwine. Sir, it has been reported that the Soviet Union has or East Germany has, as the case may be, an announced goal of building at least six nuclear plants in East Germany by 1980. Do you know anything of this goal ?


Mr. Barwich. I heard this in the past. There is no goal. They have canceled all plans and even the second stage of the first plant I mentioned before. Really they have no program now.

Mr. Sourwine. Do you know what Professor Hertz is doing now? Mr. Barwich. Hertz has retired. He is still chairman of the Council of Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy and a member of the Research Council of East Germany, but he does not do many things that are of importance.

Mr. Sourwine. Who succeeded you, do you know, at Rossendorf? Mr. Barwich. According to the charter of our institute, Fuchs must have succeeded now. We have got a new charter and now there is only one deputy director and this one is Fuchs. Formerly there were two. He must take over at once, but they could make new arrangements later. I don't know, but I think he will have taken over as director.







Dubna, about 70 miles north of Moscow, has been accessible to foreign scientists and non-Communist reporters in recent years. It is therefore assumed that the research conducted there is not classified as highly secret.

The nature of the research at Dubna was reflected in reports from Moscow last month asserting that Soviet scientists had synthesized element 104, the 12th manmade radioactive element heavier than uranium created since 1940.

OTHER CARES RECALLED

The feat had eluded the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory of the University of California at Berkeley, a world leader in studies of elements heavier than uranium.

Professor Barwich's defection recalled the flight of two major scientists from Britain—Bruno Pontecorvo to the Soviet Union in 1950 and Klaus Fuchs to East Germany in 1959 after he had served a prison sentence for nuclear espionage.

Pontecorvo and Fuchs, apparently unlike Professor Barwich, had had access to nuclear weapons secrets.

Professor Barwich was presumably a member of a large group of German scientists who went to the Soviet Union at the end of World War II. Other German scientists, who chose to go to the United States or other Western countries, have participated actively in the development of nuclear weapons and <u>de</u>vices.

According to reports from Germany, Professor Barwich, a holder of the Stalin Prize, was Klaus Fuch's immediate superior at the institute in Rossendorf.

LAST SEEN IN GENEVA

GENEVA, September 11.—Professor Barwich, many years a top director of the Soviet bloc's nuclear program, was last seen here on Wednesday as a delegate to the Atoms for Peace Conference sponsored by the United Nations.

Soviet sources said today that they were shocked by the flight of the scientist. Western sources described him as the greatest prize the West had won in two

decades of nuclear intrigue.

Professor Barwich left the President Hotel, one of Geneva's finest, on Wednesday when the conference ended. He had with him an East German colleague,

Prof. Max Steenbeck, who has not been heard from since. East Germany's chief nuclear scientist Prof. Baron Manfred von Ardenne,

called Professor Barwich's defection extremely deplorable.

In a telephone interview, he said: "This step shows a surprising lack of sense of duty. I think that Barwich's decision was not a decision against the German Democratic Republic. I believe the reasons are primarily to be found in the personal sphere.'

Professors Barwich and Steenbeck arrived in Geneva August 28. They were

seen in public at a Soviet cocktail party last Saturday.

Although East Germany was not officially invited to the conference, it sent observers, as is usual at such meetings. Many times they come as reporters or as delegates from other Communist countries.

Known as jovial man

Employees of the President Hotel described Professor Barwich as a jovial man who loved to laugh and joke and was always friendly with the staff. His defection came entirely unexpectedly to Soviet coworkers, who spoke of his open-minded frankness and good humor. "He is not at all like the popular image of the dry scientist," one said.

Prof. von Ardenne said he believes that Professor Barwich's wife was still

in East Germany. A previous marriage ended in divorce.

Professor Barwich was a longtime collaborator of the baron. For nearly 10 years they and scores of other East German scientists worked for the Soviet Union at the Suchumi Research Center on the Black Sea.

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NUCLEAR SCIENTIS DEFECTS TO U.S.

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The defector was described as a strapping man with thinning dark hair. His scientific career began when he was an assistant to a Nobel Prize winner, Prof. Gustav Hertz, who worked on nuclear research during World War II in Berlin. Early this year, a Soviet disarmament security liaison officer, Yuriy Nosenko, defected here and was taken to the United States. He was reported to be one of the most valuable escapees to the West since World War II.

SUPRELOR OF KLAUS FUCHS

BERLIN, September 11.—When Professor Barwich returned from the Soviet Union and was named director of the East German Central Institute for Nuclear Physics, he became the immediate superior of Klaus Fuchs, the convicted atom spy who has been deputy director since his release from prison in Britain.

Professors Hertz, Fuchs, Barwich and von Ardenne, head of the nuclear research center at Dresden, make up the elite in East Germany's ambitious atomic-energy program. Its announced goal is to build at least six nuclear plants by 1980 to ease the country's power shortage. Professor Barwich's key role was emphasized by his position as a member of the East German Government's Advisory Council on Research.

The Information Bureau West, a private organization in West Berlin that collects data on East Germans, said Professor Barwich's wife was reported to have been living in West Germany for some years. It was not known whether they had any children.

TOP SOVIET ATOM MAN FLEES TO UNITED STATES

WASHINGTON, September 11 (AP).—A distinguished German atomic scientist who worked in Russia for years fied to West Germany and has been granted political asylum in the United States, the State Department disclosed today.

The Department identified the nuclear physicist as Prof. Heinz Barwich, 53, a holder of the Stalin Prize who was deputy director of the Joint Nuclear Research Institute in Dubna, Russia, until early this year.

Western sources considered him the greatest prize in the two decades of nuclear intrigue, during which Klaus Fuchs and Italy's Dr. Bruno Pontecorvo fled to the Reds.

WORKED WITH FUCHS


Barwich was director of the Central Institute for Nuclear Research in Rossendorf, in Communist East Germany, at the time he defected. Rossendorf, near Dresden, is where East Germany's first nuclear reactor became operational in 1957.


His most prominent collaborator there was Professor Fuchs, the convicted atom spy who returned to East Germany following his release in 1959 after 9 years in a British jail. Fuchs was Barwich's deputy and may now succeed him as head of the Institute.



Though the State Department labeled Barwich "a senior East German nuclear physicist," few American atomic scientists queried yesterday had heard of him. Indeed, two American nuclear physicists who last year made an official visit to Dubna, the Soviet research center Where Barwich was a deputy director for 4 years, said they did not recall meeting him.

Barwich began his career as an assistant to Nobel and Stalin Prize Winner Gustave Herts, a German physicist who led a German-Soviet group during 1946-52 in the development of ways to separate isotopes. Presumably, Barwich was a member of the Hertz team, for he is known to have engaged in nuclear research in Russia from 1945 to 1955.

In 1955 Barwich returned to East Germany to teach at Dresden's technical university. He went back to Russia as deputy director of Dubna, a Communist bloc research center whose primary purpose is to conduct basic scientific research. American officials who visited Dubna agree that there is no weapons research or secret work being conducted there.

Early this year Barwich returned to East Germany to become head of East Germany's nuclear research center. His deputy at the center was convicted British atom spy, Klaus Fuchs.

Yesterday, Associated Press reported that Barwich's boss, Prof. Baron Manfred von Ardenne, called the defection extremely deplorable and suggested it was undertaken for personal reasons.


Mr. Barwich. As a scientist I cannot evaluate him; as a man, he is an example of a typical Soviet "boss," which is not so frequently occurring among Soviet scientists, even party members. He is able rigorously to follow the party line according to the slogan: "The party is always right." Firstly, his information about Western conditions is restricted. Secondly, he seems to have been really convinced that the goal can justify the means his country is usually applying; including demagoguery. His permanent attempt to convince Western scientists of the sincerity of their Russian colleagues by claiming that they do not lie in their scientific work and will consequently do the same in Pugwash, looked to me not like naivete, but like blunt demagoguery. Though I personally liked some convinced Communists, whom I believed to be understanding human beings, and who normally were honest persons, I never found Topchiev to be one of this kind.






Mr. Barwich. As the son of a priest, he is adhering to communism as to a religion. Instead of God he idolizes "dialectic materialism." His scientific gift is mostly abstract, difficult to understand and far from experimental reality. He cannot be worried by facts which seem not to fit into his political picture. He will not acknowledge them. Evidently, while in prison he decided to put an end to the split in his own personality, which he had formerly suffered from, and to deliver himself fully to the community of Communists in Germany. In 1959, when he rejoined the party, he confessed that he had had serious doubts about the truth of party line during his imprisonment. In the future, it is probable that there will be no more doubts. Blokhintsev, a leading Soviet scientist, said "He has sacrificed his significance as a scientist to political fanaticism." This seems to be true. He is not able to do good teamwork. Though he has no technical understanding, no organization or economic talent, he tries to take over responsibility in this field, because he feels responsibility as a party comrade. In fact he is still a pathological case.

Mr. Sourwine. Bruno Pontecorvo. Mr. Barwich. He is the most outstanding scientist in high-energy physics (neutrino) now in Dubna. He is a theoretic thinker as well as an experimenter. No technician. In technical developments in Russia he did not take part. There is no evidence that he formerly helped the Chinese to process uranium, as Western newspapers reported. Though suffering a lot of setbacks in personal life in Russiaunder a bodyguard for some years in Dubna, no permission to go abroad, mental sickness of his wife for many years until now, lack of equipment for experiments compared with Western labs—he really seems to have preserved his basic Communist conviction. He scarcely would defect, even if he had the opportunity. Nevertheless, he would like to see Italy, Europe, et cetera, if he could. His brother is a Communist film director in Italy. He has a broad knowledge of Western literature, but his picture of the West is from the 1950's. He likes sports, what he can afford to do in the Soviet Union. His true belief in the Communist order is probably based, on one side, on his need to preserve his self-respect. On the other hand, it is impossible to convince a believer in the future of a Communist world, by scientific proof of the failure of his system—even when he knows the Western way of life. It is a matter of trust—not of scientific knowledge. All that is possible to do in a scientific way is to show that Marxist and Leninist "theories" have turned out not to be true. But this does not mean that an experiment, begun on behalf of a false







On a wider view, the right-wing extremist group to which Senator McCarthy belongs is a more serious threat to British and American security than any group under definite Communist control. Their campaign to eliminate from public life all people having any understanding or direct knowledge of Communism is, in effect, a campaign for the disarmament of America in the fields of psychological wurfare and political intelligence. The Communists among the French dock workers are trying to deprive their country of the means to resist military aggression. Sepator McCarthy and his supporters are trying to deprive their country of the means to prevent the outbreak of war, to leave their country powerless to counteract the deliberately produced ignorance and hysterical fear which may lead the masses under Communist rule to support the extremists of the Russian Communist Party in a policy of military aggression.

There has been considerable comment in America on the laxity of the British authorities in the case of Dr. Fuchs. This would seem to give the British public some right to comment on the extraordinary laxity of the American authorities toward the equally dangerous activities of Senator McCarthy and his associates.

LETTER TO MARGNESTER GUARDIAN

84 SUNNY BANK, HULL, 21st April 1951.

Size: Your American correspondents who defend General MacArthur, and indeed the General himself, appear to accept the basic assumptions of Communist propagands. They assume that there is a clear-cut struggle between the forces of good and the forces of evil in which all right-thinking persons must subordinate every other standard to securing a victory for the right side, and that this simple partisan motivation enables self-appointed leaders to provide infallibing guidance on every question of policy. The case both against Russian Staliniam and this inverted American Staliniam can be stated in terms of the moore realistic assumptions implicit in the practice of democracy and in scientific mathod; that any human cause is seldom wholely right or wholely wrong, that justice is not simply that which serves some particular interest but is something which makes cooperation between free men possible, and that our judgments can seldom be based on anything but the weight of more or less circumstantial evidence.

There is strong evidence to indicate that the continued loss of American, and allied, lives in Korea is a direct consequence of General MacArthur's refusal to take account of the well-founded warnings that an advance to the Manchurian border was almost certain to produce Chinese intervention. It is not unreasonable to suppose that General MacArthur is equally mistaken in believing that further hostile measures against China could be taken without producing Russian intervention and a general world war.

Going further back, there is evidence that the extremist and blindly proRossian forces in China owe their dominance very largely to the continued and
active assistance they have received from the forces in America who now support
General MacArthur. By their blind support of the corrupt and incompetent
Enomintang police state, these groups in America discredited democracy in
Chinese opinion and appeared to substantiate extremist Communist propaganda.
Even conservative Chinese opinion was rendered anti-American through the
bombing of Chinese cities by an air force based on Formose with American
planes and, as most people believed, with American or Japanese pilots. Furthermore, it was these same groups in America who provided the Chinese armies
now fighting the U. N. forces with a considerable part of their equipment. The
shipment of American arms to China was continued in the face of expert wirnings that a high proportion of these supplies was likely to end in Communist
hands. It is likely that the same would happen to any fresh supplies given to
the Knomintang army.

The term "appeasement" was originally applied to policies which abandoned principles in the hope of appeasing aggressors. But in this case, British policy is upholding the principles of civilized justice against the totalitarian concept of justice. If the U. N. is maintaining any principle in condemning China on an issue where China is in the wrong it must also be ready to support China on issues

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That letter is a rather remarkable document. It will bear some discussion. At the outset, let me say frankly it had not been expected the Department would refuse to make the Hiss notes available to the Internal Security Subcommittee; though consideration had been given to the possibility that the Department might report that no such notes were in its possession. I am therefore grateful for the confirmation, contained in the first paragraph of the Department's letter, of the fact that these papers are in the possession of the State Department.

The State Department's answer that "it has been the consistent policy of the Department not to permit the release of papers of this type" is not an honest statement of fact. Informal notes, and in fact full transcripts of conferences, have been released in the past. The Wake Island Conference is only one example in a long series. Furthermore, Sherwood's book, the Forrestal diaries, Byrnes' book Speaking Frankly, and Stettinius' book, all gave what purported to be intimate conversations and descriptions of informal statements made at the Falta Conference. There should be nothing about Alger Hiss' notes which would make them sacrosanct; nor should there be anything about the conversations of the persons mentioned in his notes, even "persons now active in public life in friendly governments," which would entitle those conversations to protection in a situation where no protection was given to the conversations of such persons as General MacArthur at Wake Island, and all those at Yalta who are mentioned in the Byrnes, Sherwood, and Stettinius books and the Forrestal diaries.

Incidentally, speaking of "persons now active in public life in friendly governments", Mr. Churchill has written extensively on his meetings with many Americans, and on many occasions has been quite candid. To mention a case more in point, the "inside" story of Klaus Fuchs is now being syndicated. Would your Department object to disclosure of any notes Fuchs may have made?

Alger Hiss was not just another State Department functionary. He is a man who has been found by a jury to have been guilty of acts which brand him as a traitor of his country. What he did in the State Department were not the acts of an ordinary man. The notes he took and the influence he bore on the shaping of our policy at the Yalta Conference should be known and exposed at this time. Certainly, the contents of the Hiss notes are a proper subject of inquiry by the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee.

would give notice to all persons in the State Department that any notes they might take would be subject to release in the future. Perhaps there may have been such an implication in the release of other notes and recollections of various smeetings; but in the particular case of the Hiss notes there is only implied notice that if the taker of notes subsequently is proven to be a traitor to his country his notes may be subject to examination by a Senate committee.

Alger Hiss was in a position where he could have placed many persons in key positions in our Government. We should know what his notes show about those with whom he dealt, those upon whom he relied, and those who assisted him; and we should check up on what they are doing now. By nature, training, and doctrine, Communists attract other Communists and put them in positions of influence.

The position of the United States in future diplomatic discussions, about which the Department's letter expresses concern, would be much more hampered by the continued presence of persons Alger Hiss may have put into important positions than it would be by any revelation of what Hiss wrote in his notes. It is an ironical standard that every single secret that the United States Government possessed, according to testimony before our subcommittee, was available to Alger Hiss in his position as Director of Postwar Planning; yet the notes which Hiss wrote at Yalta are being withheld not only from the people of the United States but even from the United States Senate.

I noted particularly that the Department's letter made no mention whatever of security in connection with the Hiss notes. I assume this was not because the Department thought the matter of security unworthy of consideration, or failed to consider it, but rather because no valid question of security, under the circumstances, could exist.

Though this letter has been written, as I have indicated, in the light of the assumption that the Department's answer under date of Mny 14 and over the signature of Mr. David Bruce, the Under Secretary of State, represented a considered decision in which you had participated and with which you concur,

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On July 2, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS, a confessed Educate Espionage Agent, who is now serving a 15 year sentence for compiracy to commit espionage against the United States, advised SAS JOHN A. HARRINGTON and ROLLIF ROYAL that he furnished the names of Dr. HANSE THE among others to HARRY GOLD on June 4, 1945 as a possible espionage recruit. He stated that WILLIAM SPINDED had advised him that BETHE was a Communist. GREENGLASS stated that he had never met BETHE. GREENGLASS advised that he had been instructed in this matter by his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS (a confessed Soviet Rapionage Agent), who had received her instructions in this matter from JULIUS ROSENTERG (convicted Russian Espionage Agent). GREENGLASS said that GOLD cave this list of possible recruits to ANATOLE A. YAKOVLEV, then Vice-Consul of the USSR Consulate in Washington, D.C. GREENGLASS advised that these instructions were carried out. It is to be noted that GOLD is a self confessed former Russian espionage agent currently serving a 30 year prison sentence.



As far as she could recall, she thought this referred to Dr. KLAUS FUCHS, British scientist who has been jailed for espionage activities.

For the information of the Bureau, JOSEPH EDWARD MAYER is presently affiliated with the Argonne National Laboratory as an assigned employee at the University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, and is presently assigned to the Institute of Muclear Studies, University of Chicago. MAYER is an occasional consultant to the Argonne National Laboratory on experimental problems. He was granted Class Q olearance on January 25, 1948 while affiliated with the Santa Fe Operations Office of the Atomio Energy Commission. This Class Q clearance was reaffirmed by the Chicago Operations Office of the AEC, February 1, 1949, and is still in full force and effect.

WAYER is also a member of the Advisory Committee on Chemistry for the Division of Research, AEC. He has been a consultant to Los Alamos since 1948.

Por the information of the Bureau, MARIE GOEPPERT MAYER, wife of JOSEPH EUWARD MAYER, is employed at the Argome National Laboratory as a senior physicist on a half-time basis. WARIE MAYER is also employed at the University of Chicago, Institute for Nuclear Studies. She was granted Class Q clearance on October 27, 1947.
