

Does not now recall JULIUS ROSENBERG saying consultant made {200.00 per day, but is definite in stating JULIUS told him this man had just returned to U. S. from Egypt. DAVID GREENGLASS now recalls that shortly prior to time he farst borrowed money from JULIUS, which presumably came from contact, JULIUS left Fitt Fachine Products, Inc., to meet some man who had and called him on the phone. Control of the Contro At Lewisburg. Pa.

DAVID GREENGLASS was reinterviewed at the U. S. Penitentiary concerning his recollection of the unknown consultant friend of JULIUS ROSENBERG and of the receipt of \$800,00 from JULIUS ROSENBENG, with particular reference to the visit of MIKE SIDGEOVICH. Information received from RUTH and BERNARD GREENGLASS was made known to DAVID GREENGLASS as an aid in refreshing his recollection of pertinent events.

He stated that his original statement to the effect that he hid first heard of the unknown consultant in Karch and 1949, was in error, and that it is his recollection, with information now furnished by RUTH GREENGLASS, that he first heard of this individual in the latter part of 1948 or early 1949. He recalled that it was shortly before his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, had an accident in which she cut her leg, and now recalls that this incident occurred in February 1949, as stated by RUTH GREENGLASS. He also recalled that at that time he had secured \$60.00 from JULIUS, which JULIUS had apparently obtained from the unknown consultant.

Branch Branch Carlotte Control of the State DAVID GREENGLASS also agreed with RUTH GREENGLASS! statements as to the death of his father in March 1949 and JULIUS ROSERBERG's having paid money for their share of the burial plot. He also remembered that JULIUS had indicated that the money he paid for the burial plot was not a loan, since JULIUS had a friend who was staking him and would not demand the repayment of the money.

CONTRACTOR OF THE DAVID GREENGLASS also stated that he does not now specifically recall that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that the unknown consultant made \$200.00 per day, but he does definitely recall that JULIUS told him that the man was a consultant on dam in Egypt, that JULIUS specifically stated that this man had just recently come back to the United States from a trip to Egypt, and that he, DAVID, got the impression that this individual had flown back from Egypt, although he now states that he cannot recall anything specific in this regard, and that he may have been mistaken in the impression that the man had flown back to the United States from Egypt. He reiterated his certainty that JULIUS had specifically commented on this consultant's having recently returned from a trip to Egypt.

pression that the man was a contact of JULIUS, and not a Russian, and DAVID GREENGLASS recalled that JULIUS had specifically stated that this man was a contact. DAVID GREENGLASS also said that it was his impression that the man was not a Russian, and was either a native-born or naturalized citizen of the United States. He also recalled that when JULIUS apoke of his Russian friends he specifically referred to them as "Russian friends" and that he did not so refer to this consultant.

pavid Greenglass stated that his impression or recollection that this consultant had reportedly been paid \$200.00 a day may have been in error, that if JULIUS had told him that the man made \$200.00 per day he is certain he would have advised RUTH GREENGLASS of same, and that RUTH GREENGLASS has a better recollection of past events than he, DAVID GREENGLASS does.

DAVID GREENGLASS stated that he now recalls a cold dry day in New York City when he and JULIUS were at Pitt Machine Products, Inc. He recalled that there was no snow on the ground, but that it was bitter cold, and the windows in the plant were all steamed up. He remembered that JULIUS had received a telephone call at the plant from some man asking JULIUS to meet him, that he mentioned he was going to meet someone and DAVID CheENGLASS followed him to the door, curious to see who he was going to meet and where he was going. He stated, however, that at the door Julius specifically told him to go back into the building and stay inside, DAVID GREENGLASS was curious as to the identity of this person JULIUS was going to meet and recalls seeing Julius walk toward the luncheonette on the corner of Houston Street and Avenue C. He said that he was afraid that JULIUS would turn around and see him watching, and that he accordingly went back into the plant without seeing the person JULIUS was apparently going to meet,

the plant on that occasion he. DAVID, walked from the plant to the luncheonette, hoping to get a glimpse of the person JULIUS apparently planned to meet there, but that neither JULIUS nor the man he was to meet was at the luncheonette or on the corner at that time. He stated that JULIUS had apparently gone off with this man as he did not return to the plant on that day. He recalled asking JULIUS about the man when JULIUS returned to work

on the following day, but said that JULIUS gave him an evasive answer and gave him no indication as to who the man might have been. DAVID said that he does not know whether this man might have been identical with the unknown consultant. He was unable to advise as to the date of this occurrence, but said it is his present recollection that this occurred about two weeks prior to the time he obtained money from JULIUS which had presumably come from the unknown consultant, and probably at about the same time or possibly shortly after RUTH hurt her legality.

SIDOROVICH, he stated that the date of this occurrence was, as stated by RUTH GREENGLASS, July 2, 1948. He recalls that SIDOROVICH drove his car up to the front of Pitt Products, Im, and got out, coming into the place. He stated he was on vacation and DAVID asked him whether his wife was with him. SIDOROVICH replied that she was with him, but was then with her mother. He asked for JULIUS ROSENBERG and DAVID told him that JULIUS was not around. DAVID showed SIDOROVICH around the shop and remembers introducing BERNARD GREENGLASS to SIDOROVICH, and that the three of them went to the luncheonette on the corner for a drink. SIDOROVICH told DAVID that he was working for some steam boiler company in Cleveland, Ohio, and DAVID said that it is his recollection that the name of this place was Wilcox and Gibbs, or something similar.

DAVID said that RUTH is mistaken in her belief that SIDOROVICH was then living at Chappaqua in that he specifically recalls SIDOROVICH mentioning his employment in Ohio. He said that he does not recall having told RUTH about SIDOROVICH'S work or the place he was then residing.

the plant on that day, but that a few days later he mentioned to JULIUS that SIDOROVICH had been in, and JULIUS told him that he had seen SIDOROVICH.

February 21, 1948, her father fell and broke his hip DAVID GREENGLASS stated that this was his DAVID's father, and not RUTH's, but that RUTH refers to him as "Pop". He also agreed with RUTH's statement that on or about June 6, 1948, and shortly before his death, JULIUS LEWIS had given DAVID \$200.00. He recalled that it was at about the same time, i.e. June 1948, not June 1949, and not later in the summer, when he got the

\$500.00 from JULIUS ROSENBERG. He recalled that he had been feeling well stisfied with the world, having approximately \$1000.00 and that he had bought himself some new clothing. He recalled planning on going to a movie and then seeing JULIUS LEWIS, who looked at the time as if he were about to die. He recalled that this depressed him considerably and dampened his elation at having \$1000.00. He is certain that he received the \$200.00 and the \$800.00 at about the same time, and had the entire \$1000.00 shortly prior to JULIUS LEWIS' death. He also recalls that all during the summer of 1948, when HUTH was in Monticello on vacation, he kept taking \$20.00 to \$40.00 from their safe deposit box to give to RUTH to use while on vacation and feels certain that he did not obtain the \$800.00 after JULIUS LEWIS' death.

Concerning BERN RD GREENGLASS' statement that JULIUS ROSENBERG had stated that the money he borrowed from his friend had to be repaid, DAVID said that JULIUS would tell BERN RD this, whether or not it was true, inasmuch as he would never mention any "contact" to BERNARD and would not admit to BERNARD that he had a source for funds which he would not have to repay. He also said that if the consultant or contact were a widely known engineer or prominent person, JULIUS would not make this fact known to BERNARD and because the money had been received from a contact, which fact he would not want known to BERNARD, JULIUS would "play down" the source of the money and treat it in an off-hand manner.

GREENGLASS was questioned at length for other information which might be of assistance in identifying the unknown subject, but could furnish no additional information.





The main purpose of the meeting was to show black and white films of a mural in the Main San Francisco Post Office, which was painted by REFREGIER in about 1947 or 1948. The operator of the motion picture projector (name unknown) did not arrive until about 10:00 or 10:30 PM. He was introduced by MORT EPSTEIN who appeared to be in charge of the meeting. In the introduction MORT EPSTEIN stated that in order to get a man to operate the projector he had to agree to let the man say a few words about the ROSENBERG case. The operator spoke for about ten minutes and urged those present to send letters to the President appealing for clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. He stated there was unsufficient evidence to convict them and some of the best attorneys in the United States agreed with this point of view. He solicited contributions for the defense of the ROSENBERGs and one individual in the rear of the room passed forward a \$10 bill, but informant did not observe the individual who gave the contribution.

The film was then shown and it was noted that the sprocket perforation strip was torn in several places and the film appeared to be badly worn as if it had been used a great deal.





REFREGIER gave a running commentary as the film was shown and explained that the mural he had painted had been criticized by many individuals for not giving an accurate picture of the history of California. REFREGIER, of course, defended his mural. As seen in the film, the mural contained scenes of anti-Labor riots, massacre of the Indians by the Whites, and the murdering of Chinese. Nothing complimentary to the history of California was observed in the mural and the whole impression one received was unpleasant, according to the informant.

REFREGIER asked those attending to write to the President of the United States to save his mural from removal from the Post Office.



He is alleged to have been present at 65 Morton St., New York City, in the apartment of ALFRED SARANT in July of 1949 with WILLIAM PERL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, and another unknown individual when these four persons spent 17 straight hours photographing documents of a highly classified nature.

An informant, of unknown reliability, has stated that he has heard JULIUS ROSENBERG described SIDOROVICH as being involved in an espicinage apparatus equal in importance to his own.

It is to be noted that both MICHAEL and ANNE SIDCROVICH have been interviewed by agents of the Cleveland Office and have repeatedly disclaimed any association with the ROSENBERG apparatus.

MR. LESTER M. ANDERSON, Chief, Accessories Section, Special Projects Branch, Aircraft Laboratory, Wright Air Development Center, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio advised that he recalled PAUL E. VILLIAMS as a fellow employee. He stated that WILLIAMS did not work under his supervision but that he and wILLIAMS worked together. His knowledge of WILLIAMS is limited to WILLIAMS! period of employment at this Base. He never associated with WILLIAMS socially and he could not furnish the name of any of WILLIAMS' associates.

MR. ANDERJON further advised that WILLIAMS has been a good worker and qualified for the type of work he was doing at this Base. He described WILLIAMS as an "individualist" and he explained this by saying that MILLI/MS worked alone and he, WILLIAMS, did not seek the advice of his fellow workers. He stated that WILLIAMS did not discuss his background to any extent and that he knew very little about SIGLES! background. He did recall that WILLIAMS had told him that he had flown in the Spanish Revolution and as a result of this he had been wounded. ANDERSON was of the opinion that WILLIAMS had been born in New York City and that his father had been a policeman in that City. also stated that he had the idea that WILLIAMS had spent some of his life in Youngstown, Ohio with his folks.

MR. ANDERSON stated that he never observed wILLIAMS act in any manner which caused him to become suspicious of WILLIAIS. He said that WILLIAMS was a regular worker and was seldom away from the job.

When WILLIAMS left the Base, ANDERSON understood that he was going to work for a private contractor as a draftsman but he did not recall the name of the contractor. He heard that WILLIAMS resigned from his employment at the Base because he had mis-represented himself when he completed his Application for Federal Employment. This mis-representation consisted of stating that he had attended certain schools when in fact he had not attended them. Hen questioned about this matter WILLIAMS just left work one day and never returned. ANDERSON stated that he heard at a later date that WILLIAMS had cleared up this matter with the Umited States Government.

He further advised that approximately two years ago he had seen WILLIMS at the Dayton Municipal Airport at which time WILLIMS advised him that he is an instructor at some University in Washington, D. C. but he could not recall the name of this University. He is of the opinion that it was a Catholic University in Washin ton, D. C. The could not furnish any exact address for WILLIMS at the present time nor could he furnish the names of anyone who might know WILLIAM present where bouts.

MR. ANDERSON stated that during WILLIAM! employment at this Base he performed the following duties:

He worked on a continuous project to develop, test, and standar-dize aircraft nuts, bolts, screws, pins, and washers. He would represent the Air materiel Command in their contacts with industry, the purpose of which is to guide industry in the improvement of aircraft utility parts for military purposes. For example, contact bolt and self-locking nut manufacturers to give them engineering advice and to explain to them the Air Force requirements and to guide them in their development work. He would write specifications and standards which cover types of nuts, bolts, screws, washers, cotter pins, and similar utility parts used in United States Air Force planes and their associated equipment.

MR. ANDERSON pointed out that the above information was furnished from memory and that there was a possiblitty that an exact job description could be found in the employee's personnel file which is forwarded to St. Louis; No. when an employee terminates his government service. He stated that the majority of the work done in the section where MILLIAMS was employed was unclassified. He could not furnish any other information concerning WILLIAMS or his activities.

MR. JOSEPH W. EVANS, Assistant Chief, Accessories Section, Special Projects Branch, Aircraft Laboratory, Wright Air Development Center, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio advised that he recalled PAUL E. WILLIAMS as a fellow employee. He stated that he knew very little about his background and that he had associated with WILLIAMS on a very limited basis and that this was confined to duty hours at this Base. He furnished substantially the same information as to the information

available to WILLIAMS as had MR. LESTER M. ANDERSON. He did not know the present whereabouts of WILLIAMS.

MR. FAUL CARON, Pleasant Hill, Onio advised an agent of the Cincinnati office in 1951 that a colored man, later identified as PAUL WILLIAMS, had moved into a building on Main Street which used to be a hardware store. He stated that ALLIAMS appeared to be very secretive about what he was doing and that he had covered the windows with newspapers in an attempt to discourage anyone who might be interested in what was going on inside. MR. CARON exercising his perogative as mayor, went to this place of business and found an airplane inside this building which had been moved in at night. WILLIAMS advised CARON that he was doing some experimental work for the United States Air Force and inquired of CARON as to the possibility of the Federal Government obtaining some land in the vicinity of Pleasant Hill, Ohio.

Subsequent investigation conducted at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio revealed that WILLIAMS was not doing any experimental work for that Base and that he was not doing any research work for the air Force. At this time CL.RENCE E. LEWIS, an engineer and draftsman at the Aircraft Laboratory, advised that he has known PAUL ELISHA WILLIAMS for several years. LEWIS had worked for WILLIMS in the housing construction business in Dayton, Ohio, at which time WILLIAMS and CARL HORST were working on a small cirplane and were constructing this plane in a garage basement. It was his understanding that the plane was an experimental plane and was supposed to be built for personal use, embodying principles which would enable the plane to fly at the rate of 200 miles per hour and they hoped to sell the plane on the commercial market for less than \$1000. He advised that in general conversation with WILLLAMS in the post, WILLIAMS definitely gave the impression that he was very much in favor of the Russia and he thinks that WILLI/MS had in the past, attended several meetings of the Progressive Party.

MR. PAUL CARON, Pleasant Hill, Ohio was recontacted at which time he advised that he did not have any additional information to furnish. He stated that WILLIAMS had moved away from Pleasant Hill, Ohio about two years ago and that he did not leave a forwarding address. Caron is of the opinion that WILLIAMS moved to New York, New York at that time.


