Ref: sets forth that WILLIAM DANZIGER admitted to agents of the New York Office that he received a letter in July 1950 from MORTON SOBELL in Mexico City which instructed DANZIGER to advise MORRIS PASTERNAK 41-42 Forty Second Street, Long Island City, of SOBELL'S Mexico City address and alias.

MORTON SOBELL, along with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and others, was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on 1/31/51 in a Conspiracy to Commit Espionage.

MORRIS PASTERNAK, uncle of MORTON SOBELL, admitted to agents of the New York Office that he found a note, with SOBELL'S Mexico City address and alias on it, under his door at his home, but claims he destroyed it immediately since he did not want to become involved in any trouble.

It is noted that MORRIS PASTERNAK is employed as a bench lathe operator at the Liquidometer Corp., 4103 Thirty Sixth Street, Long Island City and this corporation has classified contracts from both the Navy and Air Force.

AUSA Myles Lane, SDNY, has advised that PASTERNAK may be used as a Government witness in the JULIUS ROSENBERG-ESP-R trial although this has not been definitely decided.

This information is being called to the attention of the Bureau inasmuch as the Bureau might desire to furnish the Air Force and ONI with information concerning MORRIS PASTERNAK'S past Communist Party background. In this connection the report of SA Richard T. Clancy, New York, 4/13/49 in captioned matter, contains considerable information regarding PASTERNAK'S past background.

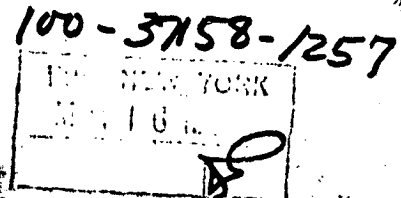

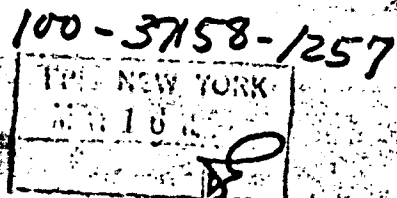

On December 7, 1951, SA THOMAS W. SMITH interviewed Mrs. KATHARINE BALL RICH at 371 82nd Street, Brooklyn, New York.

Mrs. RICH advised that she is fifty-four years old, a graduate of Hunter College and the widow of WILLIS SCOTT RICH. According to Mrs. RICH last summer she was employed as a maid in the home of GEORGE BIDDLE, who is the brother of FRANCIS BIDDLE, Attorney General during the Franklin D. Roosevelt administration. Mr. and Mrs. BIDDLE left the United States to tour Italy and Mrs. RICH was employed as a maid by Mr. and Mrs. HOWARD MEYER of 76 Tarrence Street, Rockville Center, Long Island, New York. According to the informant, Mrs. HOWARD MEYER is the daughter by a previous marriage of Mrs. GEORGE BIDDLE.

Mrs. RICH advised that after working for the MEYERS for two months she quit because she discovered that they were "Jewish atheists," called the ten commandments "nonsense" and "made fun of religion."

Mrs. RICH recalled that at one time she overheard one of the MEYERS state, "it is time to take over now and get that gang out of Washington" but she did not know the subject of the conversation which prompted the remark.

HOWARD MEYER is an attorney and Mrs. RICH advised that last October she read a brief he was preparing. The brief was in defense of a person named "SOBELL," who was arrested by the FBI in Mexico in connection with the ROSENBERG Spy Trial. Mrs. RICH was not able to recall whether this was an appeal brief or not but stated that the theme of the brief emphasized the seriousness of treason, alleged that SOBELL was vacationing in Mexico at the time of his arrest, and that the arrest and deportation proceedings were illegal.

The Bureau will recall that the name HOWARD N. MEYER appears on the appeal brief of MORTON SOBELL. In view of the pending appeal of SOBELL it is felt that it would not be proper to conduct an active investigation of the above-captioned subject at this time. A report will be prepared in the near future based upon information in the New York files.

Mrs. ROSEN stated that she first became acquainted with Communist Party activities on her husband's part about 1940. Her husband and a close associate HARRY TALBOT, at that time attended rallies sponsored by pro-Soviet organizations. She also related that on Saturday afternoons TALBOT and her husband would visit some unknown bookshop in New York City. She stated the purpose of these visits was unknown. She was never invited to the book store nor did she know the name or the location. The subject also subscribed to the "Daily Worker" and "New Masses" and in addition occasionally read a copy of the "Communist Manifesto".

During the early 1940's, Mrs. ROSEN and her husband began visiting the TALBOTS at their residence, 1024 Walton Avenue, Bronx, New York. Mrs. ROSEN recalls that on one occasion other friends of TALBOT were there, whose names she was unable to recall, and that this group is what she termed an "intellectual group", the conversation revolving around the Communist Party and the USSR. She recalls that one of the persons present exhibited a first grade reader which was approved by the Communist Party and which was hoped would soon be adopted by the New York City School System.

During 1940 or 1941, Mrs. ROSEN, her husband and the TALBOTS attended a meeting held at the DeWitt Clinton High School, Bronx, New York. Mrs. ROSEN is unable to recall the reason for this gathering, but she stated that a huge crowd was present and that MOTHER BLOOR was the principal speaker.

Mrs. ROSEN said that she recently expressed her disapproval of Communism to her husband and told him that she wanted no part of it. She also refused admission of the TALBOTS in her home. She said that many arguments ensued, and that on one occasion her husband told her that he was planning a trip to Russia as he "couldn't live with her unless she was a Communist too."

Prior to 1941, ABRAHAM ROSEN was employed by the City of New York in the Tax Department. Shortly thereafter he obtained a position with the Emerson Radio Corporation, where he is currently employed as the Treasurer.

Mrs. ROSEN stated that she never heard of MORTON SOBELL or JULIUS ROSENBERG, and that she does not know how Mr. SCHREYER obtained this information. A photograph of SOBELL was exhibited to her whereupon she stated that she did not know this person and was positive that he had never visited their home. Mrs. ROSEN advised that her husband has the following relatives:

SAMUEL ROSEN - Brother

1266 Olmstead Avenue, Bronx, New York.

His wife is named BETTY ROSEN and he is employed in the clothing business, although she does not know the name or location of the firm. She stated that both are Communists or very pro-Russian.

BENJAMIN ROSEN - Brother

Mrs. ROSEN stated that she does not know the present whereabouts of this brother, but does recall he was recently divorced.

ROBERT JOSEPH ROSEN - son

Born July 26, 1928. He is a senior student at Long Island University and soon expects to be drafted into the United States Army. Mrs. ROSEN advised that her husband's father and mother are presently dead.

HAHN, a Private Investigator employed by SCHREYER, states that he surveilled ABRAHAM ROSEN for four days during February, 1951; that each morning ROSEN met three individuals in Long Island Station, Penn Station, New York City. HAHN stated that during these meetings the three frequently referred to notes in their possession.

Mrs. MARGARET ROSEN appeared at the New York Office and was interviewed by the writer and Special Agent ROBERT L. STEVENSON.

She said that she was certain her husband was a Communist, although she had no concrete proof of this statement. 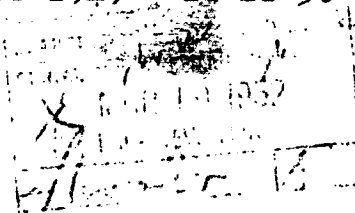

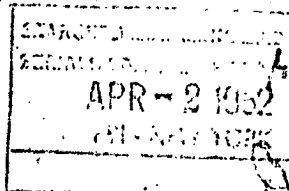
