

Rorep SA Charles P. Silverthorn, 12/9/50, entitled "WILLIAM DAWZIGER, ESP-R" (Bufile 101-1632).

Refrep sets forth that WILLIAM DANZIGER admitted to agents of the New York Office that he received a letter in July 1950 from MORTON SCHELL in Mexico City which instructed DANZIGER to advise MORRIS PASTERNAK 41-42 Forty Second Street, Long Island City, of SCHELL'S Mexico City address and alias.

MORTON SOBELL, along with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and others, was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on 1/31/51 in a Compiracy to Commit Espionage.

MORRIS PASTERNAK, uncle of METON SOBELL, admitted to agents of the New York Office that he found a note, with SOBELL'S Mexico City address and alias on it, under his door at his home, but claims he destroyed it immediately since he did not want to become involved in any trouble.

It is noted that IDERIS PASTERNAK is employed as a bonch lathe operator at the Liquidoneter Corp., 4103 Thirty Sixth Street, Long Island City and this corporation has classified contracts from both the Navy and Air Force.

AUSA Myles Lane, SINY, has advised that PASTERNAK may be used as a Government witness in the JULIUS ROSHNBERG-ESP-R trial although this has not been definitely decided.

This information is being called to the attention of the Bureau inasmuch as the Bureau might desire to furnish the Air Force and ONI with information concerning IDRRIS PACTEMNAK'S past Communist Party background. In this connection the report of SA Richard T. Clancy, New York, L/13/19 in captioned matter, contains considerable information regarding PASTEMNAK'S past background.

Mrs. ROSEN stated that she first became acquainted with Communist Party activities on her husband's part about 1940. Her husband and a close associate HARRY TALBOT, at that time attended rallies sponsored by pro-Soviet organizations. She also related that on Saturday afternoons TALBOT and her husband would visit some unknown bookshop in New York City. She stated the purpose of these visits was unknown. She was never invited to the book store nor did she know the name or the location. The subject also subscribed to the "Daily Worker" and "New Masses" and in addition occasionally read a copy of the "Communist Manifesto"

During the early 1940's, Mrs. ROSEN and her husband began visiting the TALBOTS at their residence, 1024 Walton Avenue, Bronx, New York. Mrs. ROSEN recalls that on one occasion other friends of TALBOT were there, whose names she was unable to recall, and that this group is what she termed an "intellectual group", the conversation revolving around the Communist Party and the USSR. She recalls that one of the persons present exhibited a first grade reader which was approved by the Communist Party and which was hoped would soon be adopted by the New York City School System.

During 1940 or 1941, Mrs. ROSEN, her husband and the TALBOTS attended a meeting neld at the DeWitt Clinton High School, Bronz, New York. Mrs. ROSEN is unable to recall the reason for this gathering, but she stated that a huge crowd was present and that MOTHER BLOOR was the principal speaker.

Mrs. ROSEN said that she recently expressed her disapproval of Communism to her husband and told him that she wanted no part of it. She also refused admission of the TALBOTS in her home. She said that many arguments ensued, and that on one occasion her husband told her that he was planning a trip to Russia as he "couldn't live with her unless she was a Communist too."

Prior to 1941, ABRAHAM ROSEN was employed by the City of New York in the Tax Department. Shortly thereafter he obtained a position with the Emerson Radio Corporation, where he is currently employed as the Treasurer.

The following information is being submitted for informational purposes.

On January 4, 1952, Mrs. WILLIAM HAMILTON, 615 Highland Road, Cayuga Heights, Ithaca, New York, dba Brooktondale Stamp Exchange, furnished the following/information to the Resident Agent at Ithaca, New York.

Mrs. HAMILTON has as one of her customers, an individual known to her only as Hrs. JOAN SOBIL. She has been receiving stamps for exchange from this individual since the early part of 1950. The stamps sent in by Mrs. SOBEL for exchange are mounted stamps and are generally canceled specimens. They are generally very recent issues of stamps emanating from Poland, Czechoslovakia, Iran and Palestine. According to Mrs. HAMILTON, many of the stamps received from Mrs. SOBEL are of such recent issue that they are not listed in reference stamp catalogues at the time of their receipt. 

Mrs. ROSEN and her husband soon became incompatible and although they continued to live together, they did not speak. She stated that she was not aware that her husband's reticense was due to the Communist question but rather believed that he was . With this belief in mind.






