Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability advised that VAGO had a balance of \$118,32 on November 9,1951, at the Sterling National Bank and Trust Company, 95-38 diseas Boulevard. He stated that cash deposits of \$120.00 and \$150.00 were made on October 30th and November 5th, respectively. All checks appeared to be of a routine nature, for such items as rent and utilities, with the exception of a check for \$100.00 to the Downtown Community School. It is noted that this school, which has been previously described as under Communist domination, was attended by VAGO's son, JOHN, during the previous school year.

The information obtained from Confidential Informant T-1 was obtained on a confidential basis and is not to be made public except on the issuance of a subpoena.

Spot surveillances of VAGO on September 13, 18, and 26, October 3, 5, 6, 10, 19, 26, 31, and November 6 and 12, 1951 reflect that VAGO is apparently abiding by his bond requirements but disclosed no information pertinent to this investigation.





I BACKGROUND

A. Birth Data

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, 70 Columbus Avenue, reflect that OSCAR VAGO was born February 27, 1898, at Budapest, Hungary, to MORRIS and MATHILDE GOLDSTEINZVAGO.

B. Citizenship Status

On May 31, 1938, VAGO filed Petition for Naturalization number 310521, in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, and was admitted to citizenship in the same court September 29, 1938, certificate number 4320335.

According to Immigration and Naturalization Service records VAGO entered the United States at New York on January 12, 1925, on the SS MONGOLIA. He was destined as a student to the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan, however, he actually attended Pratt Institute, Brooklyn, New York, from January to March, 1925, and then began work as an engineer in New York.

C. Education

VAGO on May 15, 1950, when interviewed by SAS LEO H. FRUTKIN and ROBERT M. KANE, advised that he had attended the Hessiche Technische Hochschule at Darmstadt, Germany, from September, 1920 to May, 1921, and was graduated from the Royal Hungarian Technical Institute at Budapest as a Civil Engineer in 1922.

The records of Pratt Institute, Brooklyn, New York, checked by SA RAYMOND A. MULLINS, in the Fall of 1950, reflected that VAGO attended one course, in structural Designing, at the Evening School of Science and Technology from January 22, 1925 to March 19, 1925.



D. Marital Status

According to the records of the Department of Health, Borough of Queens, OSCAR VAGO married CLAIRE NETSMANN at Long Island City, New York, on March 31, 1928. children have been born of this marriage, a son born May 12, 1938, and a younger girl, named SUSAN. MES. OSCAR JOHN VIETO

E. Military Service

The records of Confidential Informant T-1, another government agency which maintains personnel files, advised that VAGO registered under the Selective Service Act on February 15, 1942; that his serial number was 979, order number 11148 and that he had been classified 4A as of May 1, 1943. It was stated that VAGO did not enter into military service because he was over age.

F. Criminal Record

VAGO was arrested September 28, 1950, in the vicinity of 18 East 48th Street, New York City, by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on a bench warrant issued by United . States District Judge JOHN C. KNOX, following the indictment of VAGO on September 28, 1950, by the Grand Jury of the Southern District of New York for Perjury. He was released on \$5,000 bail January 20, 1951. He is presently awaiting trial and is residing at 66-07 99th Street, Rego Park, Queens, New York.

Assistant United States Attorney ROBERT MARTIN. Southern District of New York, on February 18, 1952, advised that he had received tentative clearance to go to trial in the VAGO case sometime in April, 1952.

From early 1950 to the time of his arrest, VAGO was also employed on a part time basis by PAUL WEIDLINGER, partner in the firm of General Engineering Associates, with offices in Washington, D.C. and 101 Park Avenue, New York City. After his release from prison VAGO again worked for this individual out of his own home, on a part time basis, until April, 1951, at which time he began his employment with the Carol Management Corporation, where he is presently employed.

1. Association with A. Brothman Associates

As set out above, VAGO was a partner in A. Brothman Associates from August, 1944 to June, 1948.

On May 15, 1950, in connection with the investigation resulting in the arrest of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and HARRY COLD, VALO was interviewed by SA LEO H. FRUTKIN and SA ROBERT M. KANE. At that time, in addition to the background information

previously set out, VAGO stated that upon coming to New York in 1925, he had taken up residence with an uncle in Brooklyn, New York, WILLIAM GOLDSTEIN, now deceased. He stated that he had returned to Hungary in 1928, and that he and his wife had returned to New York, in 1933. He stated that he had not left the United States since that time.

In connection with his relationship with BROTHMAN, VAGO advised that he had received a telephone call from BROTHMAN in the summer of 1941, at which time BROTHMAN informed him that a mutual friend, whose name VAGO could not recall, had suggested that VAGO might be interested in doing some part-time work. VAGO recalled that BROTHMAN was at that time designing a chemical plant for the Rufert Company at Seymour, Connecticut, and that he had paid VAGO \$25.00 for some structural engineering work which VAGO had done in his spare time. He stated that he had given his work to BROTHMAN and that he did not again see or hear from BROTHMAN until early 1944. At that time, according to VAGO, BROTHMAN informed him that he was hiring men for the Regal Chemical Company, and asked VAGO to accept a position as a structural engineer. VAGO accepted the job, and recalled that BROTHMAN had him doing odds and ends of engineering work in setting up a plant for the purpose of manufacturing DDT. BROTHMAN had been given the job of designing the plant, and VAGO was instructed to set up an office at 55 West 42nd Street, to handle work at the plant. However, the project lasted only some three weeks, at which time BROTHMAN and all of the men whom he had hired were discharged. VAGO recalled that BROTHMAN had quarreled with the president of the company over financial questions, but was unable to supply any details.

Since BROTHMAN and VAGO were unemployed, they looked for new openings until BROTHMAN conceived the idea of setting up a firm of engineers. BROTHMAN promised that through his connections he would be able to obtain some large engineering jobs and painted such a rosy picture of the situation that he was able to induce VAGO to accept a partnership in the firm which became A. Brothman Associates.

VAGO stated that the firm was in desperate straits financially during almost the entire period of its existence. and that he himself had gone in debt \$2,500.00 for personal living expenses, although he had incurred no debts for the firm. He stated that BROTHMAN repeatedly borrowed money to meet current expenses of the firm and informed the partners that he was borrowing on his own credit from personal friends. was unable to supply the names of the lenders, and was also unable to supply the names of friends of BROTHMAN. He stated that as a result of the financial difficulties of the firm, EMIL BARISH, GERHARDT WOLLAN and JULES KORCHIEN, all partners in the firm, gradually dropped out so that in 1946 only BROTHMAN, MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ and VAGO remained. VAGO stated that he himself had finally left the firm as a result of a violent argument with BROTHMAN, and that he had not seen or contacted BROTHMAN since that time, which was in June of 1948, with the exception of one meeting at the office of an attorney in connection with the dissolution of the firm.

In connection with HARRY GOLD, he advised that he had met GOLD at the time whon the latter was hired in 1947, and that he had known him quite well during the romaining period that VAGO was with the firm. He was unable to supply any information concerning GOLD other than that he appeared to be quite friendly with BROTHMAN.

Subsequent to this interview, HARRY GOLD confessed his participation in Soviet espionage and also furnished information indicating that he had been induced by ABRAHAM BROTHMAN to commit perjury before the Grand Jury which had questioned BROTHMAN concerning his relations with JACOB GOLOS, a known soviet agent.

According to GOID, a great deal of the conversation concerning BROTHMAN'S attempts to instruct GOID as to the testimony which he was to give before the Grand Jury took place in the presence of VAGO. However, on re-interview by Special Agents JOHN M. COLLINS and THOMAS H. ZOELLER, VAGO denied that such a conversation took place in his presence concerning the above testimony before the Grand Jury in 1947.

VAGO said, however, that looking back on his association with GOLD and BROTHMAN, he has a hazy recollection that something was happening in 1947 that he should have known about, but didn't. VAGO stated that he was unable to be more specific about this. In retrospect, VAGO now believes that "this something" was concerned with GOLD and BROTHMAN'S testimony before the Grand Jury.

VAGO also advised that he had never heard of GOLD having received an award from the Soviets for his work, nor had he ever been told by BROTHMAN that the latter had received an award from the Soviet Union for work done by him. VAGO stated that he last saw GOLD about Christmas, 1949, at which time GOLD paid him a visit at his home, and their mutual associations with BROTHMAN were discussed. VAGO denied that he had asked GOLD at this time whether BROTHMAN had ever actually received an award from the Soviet Union, and also that BROTHMAN had once told him that his, BROTHMAN'S work for the Russians, was worth one or two brigades of men. It is noted that GOLD advised that VAGO had made such statements to him, GOLD.

It is noted that in an earlier re-interview with VAGO, subsequent to the arrest of HARRY GOLD, he had advised that GOLD had visited him at his home in late December of 1949, but denied that he had any knowledge of GOLD'S espionage activities.

Following is a signed statement of HARRY GOLD, convicted Soviet espionage agent who operated from about 1935 to 1945, concerning his knowledge of OSCAR VAGO:

"October 2, 1950 Philadelphia, Penna.

ment to Robert G. Jensen and Ralph J. T. Carter, Jr., who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me and I know that any statement I make can be





"used against me in a Court of Law. I have been advised of my right of counsel and I know that I do not have to make any statement at all.

Abraham Brothman, who was at that time furnishing me with technical information for transmittal to the Soviet Union. Brothman at this time wanted me to get financial assistance for him from Semen M. Semenov at that he, Brothman, could hire Oscar John Vago and Jack Miller. Vago and Miller were to work for Henry Colwynne or rather the Chemurgy Design Corporation. Brothman was a partner with Art Weber and Henry Colwynne in this firm.

"Semenov was my Russian espionage superior at this time. I informed him of Brothman's request which he rejected rather violently.

"Vago and Miller had been described, by Brothman, to me as sincere and convinced Communists who could form the nucleus of a later development of a Brothman organization. This organization to produce and design chemical processes for the Soviet Union. This venture of Brothman's was all to be backed by Amtorg or Russian money.

"I first me vago in May of 1946 on the morning I came to work for A. Brothman Associates. He was a partner in this firm and was also a design engineer and the chief draftsman.

"Many times in the ensuing months, Vago would spend a great deal of time in the office on 32nd Street in discussing such matters as what had gone in his own particular 'Communist Party Club' the night before. He would also dwell at some length on news items and editorials in the New York Herald Tribune and would expostulate about the perfidy of the capitalist press in general.

"Later when the design offices had been moved to the Chatham-Phenix Bldg. in Long Island City, on one occasion,

"Brothman became upset for we were delayed in completing a report for the Mattur Chemical Co. of India, because Oscar Vago was at that very moment busy selling a special edition of the Daily Worker in Queens Plaza. On at least one other occasion, Vago told me of having sold the Daily Worker in both his home neighborhood, Rego Park, and nearby Queens Village.

"Sometime in the spring of 1948, a mimeographed series of pamphlets criticizing the policies of the National Leaders of the American Communist Party came out. These pamphlets were issued by an individual whose name may have been 'Franklin'. To the best of my knowledge, this 'Franklin' became a leader of a factionalist group in Harlem.

"Abraham Brothman was much taken with the arguments presented by 'Franklin'. He at one time argued these points before a Communist Party Club in Chelsea, which is a section of Manhattan.

Laboratories of A. Brothman Associates, Vago called and asked me to come to his home some two miles distant. While at the Vago residence, Oscar stated his belief that the Chelsea Communists had been perfectly justified in ejecting Brothman from their meeting. Vago added that in his own Rego Park Club, Brothman would not have succeeded in even getting a few words of criticism out.

"In late May of 1948, Brothman went to Switzerland to sell one of the firm's processes to the Lonza Co. of that country. After he had left, we discovered that Brothman was planning to deprive the rest of his associates from their fair share of any future income of A. Brothman Associates. On one evening in the week following Brothman's departure for Switzerland, Phil'Levine and I were at the Vago home discussing what procedure we should best follow to insure that

were preparing to leave, I mentioned that I was in no position to be too harsh with Brothman. Vago then added that he too did not wish to undergo any scrutiny by the F.B.I., inasmuch as there was an irregularity involved in his leaving the United States for Hungary after his first stay in America. He elaborated on this only to the extent that while the authorities thought or believed he had actually left for Hungary, he was in reality still in the United States.

"Phil Levine, who was present during this entire conversation, was a co-worker of Vago and mine at Abraham Brothman Associates.

"The next time this matter or irregularities in connection with Vago's entry into the United States, came up was in December of 1949. I was in New York City on a visit to the National Exposition of Chemical Industries at the Grand Central Palace. At 5:30 or 6:00 p.m., on the evening of the first Friday in December, 1949, I called Vago just to say hello, but Oscar insisted I come over to his house for dinner and a talk. At the end of several hours of conversation, Vago again mentioned his fear of an investigation concerning the irregularities of his movements in and out of the United States of America in the late twenties or early thirties. This was the last time that I saw or heard from Oscar John Vago.

"This is to certify that I, Harry Gold, have read the above statement consisting of this and four other pages. I have placed my initials at the bottom of the preceding four pages signifying that I have read those pages. I have also placed my initials at the corrections indicated on page 2 and again on page 4. The information that I have furnished above is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that VAGO was a member of the Communist Party on October 28, 1943.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised that on March 29, 1944, VAGO was listed by the Communist Party as a functionary.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that on March 16, 1944, OSCAR VAGO was a member of the Rego Park Club of the Communist Party.

advised that at a County Conference of the Communist Party held on December 18, 1944, VAGO delivered a report on club conditions.

The same informant advised on January 1, 1945, that VAGO was listed as a Communist Party member who had obtained five or more subscriptions to the "Daily Worker" and was invited as a consequence, to attend a dinner for EARL BROWDER on December 27, 1944.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that in January, 1945, VAGO was elected County Council Delegate from the Rego Park Club of the Communist Party.

On March 3, 1945, Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, a dvised that VAGO had submitted a report of approximately two and one-fourth typewritten pages entitled, "Remarks on the Work of the Communist Political Association" dealing with suggestions for improving such phases of Communist Party activities as discussions at meetings, education, "Daily Worker" circulation and literature sales".

On April 23, 1945, Confidential Informant T-5, advised that VAGO was one of the delegates from the Rego Park Club of the Communist Political Association to the County Council.

The same informant advised on October 4, 1946, that VAGO was still carried as a member of the Rego Park Section of the Communist Party.

This informant advised on January 20, 1947, that VAGO was listed as the purchaser of a bond in the amount of \$50 issued by the Queens County Branch of the Communist Party to facilitate the purchase of a building for Jamaica Communist Party Headquarters at 107-04 New York Boulevard, Jamaica.





The following signed statement was obtained by SA VICTOR TURYN from Mrs. BERNICE RIVERIA, 114 West 114th Street, New York City:

"607 U.S. Court House Foley Square New York, N.Y. October 9, 1950

"I, Mrs. Bernice Riveria, make this statement voluntarily of my own free will to Victor Turyn, who identified himself and is known to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats, force, or duress were used against me and no rewards, or promises were made to me to give this statement. This statement concerns my knowledge about one Oscar Vago, for whom I worked in 1948.

"I am twenty-six years old and reside at 114 West 114th Street, N.Y., N.Y. I completed the tenth grade of school and can read and write.

"I first met Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Vago through Mrs. Marilyn Bailey, for whom I was doing housework at the time. I worked for Mrs. Bailey for a period of approximately two and one-half years. After I met Mrs. Vago I was then engaged by her to do housecleaning which I did for her for a period of approximately two months.

During my brief period of employment for Mrs. Vago, she attempted to get me to join the Communist Party on several occasions. She told me that she and Mr. Vago were both members of the Communist Party.

"I know that Mr. and Mrs. Vago were members of the Communist Party because I saw both their names in a loose leaf note book kept by Mrs. Bailey. Mrs. Bailey was Secretary or Treasurer of the Communist Party in Queens and she kept names of members in this note book in alphabetical order. Mrs. Bailey told me herself that this note book contained the

Mnames of Communist Party members in Queens. I saw this book many times and looked up names in the book at the request of Mrs. Bailey. After I started working for Mrs. Vago, it was then that I looked in the book and found the name of Oscar Vago and the name of Mrs. Oscar Vago.

"The Oscar Vagos had numerous bits of literature in their apartment about the Communist Party. Oscar Vago also received the 'Daily Worker' which I observed in the apartment. Mrs. Vago would also play record entitled 'The Red Army Song' to which the children would march.

The note book I referred to earlier which was kept by Mrs. Bailey and contained names of members of the Communist Party in Queens is described as follows: Large loose leaf binder, light blue cover which cover appeared to have been canvas of some sort.

"I have read the above statement consisting of three pages and every word is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, has advised that on August 21, 1950, a check made payable to DOROTHY SMITH and signed by VAGO in the amount of \$6.51 was endorsed by DOROTHY SMITH to the account of the International Worker's Order, Lodge 818. It is noted that the IWO appears on the list of organizations prepared by the Attorney General under Executive Order 9835.

The House Committee on Un-American Activities
Hearings, under the date of October 25, 1939, (Volume X, page
6414), lists as a member of the American League for Peace
and Democracy, under Treasury Department Employees, Procurement Division, Engineer, the name of OSCAR L. VAGO of 6323 Luzon
Avenue, N. W.



Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability stated that in 1941, the name of OSCAR J. VAGO, 4117 4th Street, North, Arlington, Virginia (CH-1946), was contained in a "Members List"--3 by 5 index card system of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.

Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised in the Spring of 1944, that the name, OSCAR JOHN VAGO, followed by the date, July 25, 1940, 4117 4th Street, North Arlington, Virginia, was among the list of expired members of the Washington Bookshop Association.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised that the date, July 25, 1940, referred to the last payment of dues to the Washington Bookshop Association.

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised in 1941, that contained on the membership list of the Washington Committee for Aid to China was the name OSCAR VAGO, 4117 4th Street, North Arlington, Virginia.

The Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians edition of the CIO News, dated November 28, 1940, (Volume III, No. 48), revealed that OSCAR VAGO was secretary of the National regislative Bureau of the FAECT at Washington, D.C.; further, that communications to this legislative bureau were to be addressed to VAGO at 4117 4th Street, North Arlington, Virginia.

The American League for Peace and Democracy, the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the Washington Bookshop Association have all been declared within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

In its guide to subversive organizations and publications, the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., comments as follows concerning the Washington (D.C.) Committee for Aid China:

1. Cited as Communist controlled organization (Special Committee on Un-American Activities report, March 29, 1944, page 143).

2. Cited as a Communist front which followed the line laid down by the Communist front, American Friends of the Chinese People (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, pages 143 and 336).

The following is noted concerning the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians:

On page 151 of the book "A Story of the CIO", by BENJAMIN STOLBERG, appears the following: "Only four CIO unions are under complete control of Stalinist officials. They are the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians..." The following information appears on pages 264 and 265 of the above mentioned book by STOLBERG: "The Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians was organized in 1934 mainly from the technical staffs in the Works Progress Administration, From the very beginning the Federation has been under Stalinist leadership and its rank and file are chiefly Communist followers."

Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, advised on January 10, 1942, that the FAECT was one of the CIO unions which was completely dominated by the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, reported that OSCAR J. VAGO was listed as a petition canvasser for the Election Campaign Committee of the Communist Party in the 1949 campaign for the reelection of BENJAMIN J. DAVIS, JR., Communist candidate for Councilman, City of New York.

Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability, on July 20, 1950, advised that OSCAR VAGO was a stockholder of the 107-04 New York Boulevard Real Estate Corporation, Jamaica, Long Island, New York. VAGO was issued stock certificate number 57 in the amount of \$50.00.

Confidential Informant T-16, of known reliability, has reported that the property located at 107-04 New York

Boulevard, Jamaica, Long Island, was given to the Communist Party, Queens County, New York, as headquarters for the Jamaica Section, by OTTO ABBRIGHT, SR., who according to the informant, is a member of the Jamaica Section of the Communist Party.

III CLAIRE VAGO

Records of Immigration and Naturalization Service reflect that the subject's wife was born in Eudapest, Hungary, January 31, 1907, and entered the United States as CLARA OLGA WEISZMAN at New York on March 26, 1926. She was naturalized November 19, 1931, in the Supreme Court at Jamaica, Long Island, New York.

Confidential Informant T-17, of known reliability, advised that on May 23, 1944, CLAIRE VAGO, 66-07 99th Street, Queens, New York, was listed as a Rego Park Communist Club Assistant.


Confidential Informant T-18, of known reliability, advised that CLAIRE VAGO had signed a "Daily Worker" Victory Brigade Pledge card in 1944.

Confidential Informant T-5 advised that CLAIRE VAGO was a member of the Queens County Communist Party on May 20, 1949.

Confidential Informant T-19, of known reliability, advised that Mrs. CLAIRE VAGO, 66-07 99th Street, Rego Park, had sent a communication to Judge HAROID R. MEDINA protesting the trial of the Communist Party leaders.

It is noted that in the signed statement set out above from Mrs. RIVERIA, considerable information is contain concerning Mrs. VAGO'S Communist Party connections.

The records of the Board of Elections, Queens County, reflect that OSCAR and CLATRE VAGO registered





as members of the American Labor Party from 1941 through 1949, inclusive.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", dated March 3, 1951, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U.S. House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the American Labor Party:

"American Labor Party

"1. For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control. (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, page 78.)

"2.! Among organizations that are victims of Communist domination.! (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, pages 40 and 41.)"

Confidential Informant T-14 advised that CIAIRE VAGO was listed as a petition canvasser for the Election Campaign Committee of the Communist Party in the 1949 campaign for the reelection of BENJAMIN J. DAVIS, JR., Communist candidate for Councilman, City of New York.

IV MISCELLANEOUS

Confidential Informant T-20, of known reliability, advised that VAGO, as of March 6, 1952, had a balance of \$190.28 in his account at the Sterling National Bank and Trust Company, 95-38 Queens Boulevard, Rego Park, New York. The informant advised that VAGO, on February 28, 1952, made a payment of \$157.50 to the Downtown Community School.





It is noted that this school, which has been previously described as a Communist dominated school, has been attended by VAGO'S son, JOHN.

The informant further advised VAGO made out two checks on February 23, 1952, and March 3, 1952, to CHARLES WEISMAN in the amounts of \$40.00 and \$50.00, respectively. Both of these checks were endorsed CHARLES WEISMAN and JOSEPHINE WINKLER.

The informant advised that other checks issued by VAGO appeared to be of a routine nature for such things as the payment of rent and utilities.

The above information was obtained on a confidential basis and should not be made public without the issuance of a subpoena.

CHARLES WEISMAN and JOSEPHINE WINKLER both reside at 2844 50th Street, Woodside, Long Island, New York. JOSEPHINE WINKLER is the sister of CLAIRE VAGO, wife of OSCAR VAGO and provided the \$5,000.00 bond for VAGO.

The above information was obtained on a confidential basis and should not be made public without the issuance of a subpoena.

Mr. HENRY BOLIA, Assistant Superintendent at 66-07 99th Street, Rego Park, advised that he has noticed nothing of an unusual nature in VAGO'S activities. He said the subject continues to follow his normal routine of going to work at the usual time of day.

Spot surveillances of VAGO on January 21th, February 5th, 13th, 29th, and March 6th and 7, 1952, reflect that he continues his employment at the Carol Management Corporation, 12 East 48th Street, and continues to reside at 66-07 99th Street, Rego Park. The surveillances also indicated that the subject is apparently abiding by his bond requirements but disclosed no information pertinent to the investigation.





advised that Magyar Jovo, Hungarian daily journal, is a Hungarian language newspaper, which consistently reflects the prevailing Communist Party line and at all times expresses itself in favor of Communist principles and the Soviet Union.

"Magyar Jovo" is published by the Hungarian Daily Journal Association, Inc., New York City.

The interim report submitted on December 17, 1948 by the Sub-Committee on Education and Labor, United States House of Representatives, 80th Congress, Session Committee Report No. 16, reflects the following concerning the "Union Voice".

The "Union Voice" which gives much publicity to wages, hours, working conditions, job security, etc., is essentially a front for Communism. Because it poses as a legitimate union paper it is able to lard into text and cartoon either absolute Communist Party doctrine or an equally persuasive party line and thus penetrate minds which would indignantly reject such propaganda if they saw it in an out and out identifiable Communist newspaper such as the "Daily Worker".

The American Committee For Protection Of Foreign Born is an organization designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Surveillances on OSCAR VAGO on March 14, 21, April 2, 15, 22 and May 1 and 8, 1952 reflect that he continues his employment at the Carol Management Corporation, 12 East 48th Street, New York, and continues to reside at 66-07 99th Street, Rego Park, New York.

The surveillances also indicated that the subject is apparently abiding by his bond requirements but disclosed no information pertinent to the investigation.

Confidential Informant T-4, a business concern familiar with other businesses in the New York area in a report dated April 4, 1951 with supplemental reports dated October 11, 1951 and March 14, 1952 supplied the following information concerning the Carol Management Corporation, 12 East 48th Street, New York City, where VAGO is employed:

The Carol Management Corporation is in the Real Estate Owning and Management business. The President is ALFRED KASKEL and DAVID BARRIE is the Secretary and Treasurer.

"The Corporation was chartered under New York State laws on October 23, 1935 with an authorized capital of \$5,000. in common stock.

This concern has a wholly owned subsidiary, namely Belplaza Corp. and owns 100% of the outstanding capital stock in that concern. The subsidiary owns and operates the Belmont Plaza Hotel, with headquarters located at the caption address and the hotel located at 539-541 Lexington Avenue, New York City. The subsidiary concern was chartered under New York State laws on October 6, 1945 with an authorized capital of 100 shares of no par value common stock. A balance sheet has not been made available on the subsidiary and the extent of intercompany relations between the parent and its subsidiary has not been fully ascertained, but it is stated that the parent concern pays all the bills and other debts incurred by the subsidiary.

"ALFRED KASKEL, born 1901, Austria, started business in 1925 in Brooklyn, N.Y. as a principal in an electrical contracting company. He later appeared as principal in the Wellworth Electric Corp. and Dayerite Electric Corporation, both of which have since been discontinued. He also appeared as a member of the firm of Isias & Kaskel, 16 Court Street, Brooklyn, N.Y. which has been engaged in the building line, but discontinued in 1935. Since that time KASKEL has been the President and principal at interest in over 25 corporations engaged in building, holding title to or managing apartment houses in the Greater New York area. Among the companies with which he was connected, but which are no longer active were: C.& J. Holding Corp., Goetz Werstein & Goetz Inc., Wellington Apartments Inc., Greenwich Residences Inc., Bronxville Gardens Inc., Triangle Engineer Co. Inc., Washington Improvements Inc., Cambridge Development Corp., Kaston Realty Co.

"ALFRED KASKEL is said to be the principal and sole

"stockholder of the following corporations, all of which are active at this time: Belplaza Corporation, which owns and operates the Hotel Belmont Plaza, New York City; Berkeley Gardens Inc.; 320 Park Place Inc.; Orange Properties Inc.; Princeton Operating Corp.; Lincoln Arcade Inc.; 160th Street Management Corp.; Clinton Operating Corp. and Forest Hills Apartments Inc., all of which hold title to real estate in and around New York City; Ritalde Realty Corp. which reportedly holds title to land in Queens County; and Blossom Operating Co. Inc. holding title to the Hotel Bradford in Boston, Mass.

"Three corporations are currently being used for construction work on apartments to be held by other newly formed real estate companies. Selgate Realty Corp. is building Central Graden Apartments at 110th Street and 63rd Drive, Forest Hills, which will be held by Central Gardens Unit #1 Inc. and Central Gardens Unit #2 Inc. Percy Construction Co. Inc. is building the Hunter Garden Apartments at Flushing, N.Y.C. which will be held by Hunter Gardens Inc. Doral Construction Corp. is currently engaged in building the Fleetwood Garden Apartments at Bronxville, N.Y. which will be held by Fleetwood Section #1 Inc. and Fleetwood Section #2 Inc.

"In addition to the above corporations, of which ALFRED KASKEL is reported to own all of the outstanding stock, he also appears as Secretary of Monarch Construction Corp. which was chartered under New York laws May 2, 1949 to construct a series of apartment house buildings to be known as Netherland Gardens in the Bronx. KASKEL is said to own 59% of the stock in that corporation, but the net worth of the company was not learned.

"ALFRED KASKEL appears as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Industrial Bank of Brooklyn, N.Y. He is said to own 80% of the outstanding capital stock. As of December 31, 1949 the bank statement showed a paid in capital of \$500,000, surplus of \$500,000 and undivided profits of \$69,517 for a Tangible Net Worth of \$1,069,572.

"ALFRED KASKEL is also a principal at interest in the Somerset-Wilshire Apartments Inc., Park City Inc. and the Empire

Land Corp., which concerns maintain their headquarters at the caption address. Complete details regarding the officers, purposes of those concerns, financial data and other pertinent details are not available at this date. The extent of inter-company relations, if any, between the aforementioned corporations and the subject has not been ascertained at this date.

**KASKEL was the President of Carol Development Corporation which had held title to the Hotel Empire at 1889 Broadway, New York City, until it was sold on January 18, 1949 to a Chicago syndicate. KASKEL also appeared as principal of 231 West 82nd Street Corp. which operated the Half Moon Hotel in Brooklyn, N.Y. until January 21, 1949 when it was sold to the Harbor Hospital of Brooklyn.

"DAVID BARNIE is middle aged, married. He has had diversified experience in the real estate field and has been associated with KASKEL in a number of the latter's corporations for several years. Although he holds official titles in a number of aforementioned corporations, he has no stock interest. BARRIE had been Secretary of the subject corporation until about July 1949 at which time he was also elected to the position of Treasurer. DAVID BARRIE is also stated to be a principal in the Triboro Coin Corp. Details regarding that concern are not available, with regard to the corporate strudure and a complete list of officers and its function. However, it is reported that there are no inter-company relations in the form of loans, guarantees or endorsements between that corporation and the subject.

"DAVIDAKASKEL, brother of ALFRED KASKEL, was Secretary of this corporation from inception until around July 1949.

This concern maintained headquarters at 68-38 Yellowstone Blvd., Forest Hills, N.Y., Boro of Queens, up until January 1, 1946 at which time headquarters were moved to 12 East 48th Street, New York City. A branch continues to be maintained at 68-38 Yellowstone Blvd., Forest Hills, N.Y.

*FIRE RECORD: Extensive damage was suffered from fire which occurred at the caption address on February 16, 1948. The extent of damage was not disclosed by the management but

"almost an entirely new building was erected in its place of the old structure.

Belplaza Corp, and owns 100% of the outstanding capital stock in that concern. The subsidiary owns and operates the Belmont Plaza Hotel, with headquarters located at the caption address and the hotel located at 539-541 Lexington Avenue, New York City. Carol Management Corp. is also reported to hold title to several apartment houses in Queens County and New Jersey. A rather sizable staff is employed to handle all of the management details. Staff includes an architect, accountant and an attorney in addition to other office employees.

"Headquarters are maintained in a new brick building which is maintained in excellent repair and owned by the subject corporation. A branch is reported maintained at 68-38 Yellowstone Blvd., Forest Hills, N.Y.

"Interviewed on March 30, 1951 ALFRED KASKEL, President, deferred all financial information at this date. In the past it has been stated that all of the stock in this corporation is owned by ALFRED KASKEL individually. In outside quarters consulted in the past it was learned that this corporation had a tangible net worth somewhat over \$1,000,000 and was represented chiefly by real estate. ALFRED KASKEL individually is said to be worth over \$5,000,000.

Records disclose that seventeen suits were entered against the subject corporation from December 19, 1944 until November 16, 1950 and in amounts ranging from \$50 up to \$1,000 in regard to various natures of actions. In addition there is also a foreclosure on a lien and a mechanics lien in the amount of \$3,897, latter which was satisfied on October 3, 1950. Records also show three judgments in amounts ranging up to \$10,317. Two of the judgments were satisfied as of record and a judgment obtained on February 16, 1950 by J. PETTIT, New York City, in the amount of \$3,514, is still outstanding as of the latest search. A current search is underway regarding this judgment.

"A local depository reports the account as having been closed. In the past relations at the bank were regarded as satisfactory.

"Real estate records show that the property located at the caption address consisting of a seven-story brick office and store building is in the name of the subject corporation, having been purchased on March 9, 1946. The total mortgages amount to a building loan of \$160,000 effective November 9, 1948 payable to installments due May 1, 1949 with interest at 45% to the Home Title Guarantee Co. The property is assessed at \$450,000 for the 1950-1951 year."

The informant also advised that the Carol Management, Corporation maintains an additional subsidiary, namely, Half Moon Alleys Inc. which was formed in New York last March 27, 1948, with an authorized capital of \$5,000. ALFRED KASKEL, President of the corporation, declined to comment on the Half Moon Alleys when requested to do so by the informant.



According to the information, Weimen was desirous of arranging for Vago to enter a plea of solo contendere, but Mr. Martin informed him that the United States Attorney does not accept this type of plea. It was indicated that Mr. Martin felt there is a possibility, although not too definite as yet, that Vago will plead guilty and that his attorney Weiman desires more time to think the matter over.

To answer your inquiry on the attached memorandum as to why Oscar John Vago was not given a Vago, while known to be a partner of jail sentence. Abraham Brothman, was not known to be involved in espionage activities. He was called before a Federal Grand Jury on September 20, 1950 and made certainfalse statements regarding his whereabouts in the period 1929 to 1933. We informed Special Assistant to the Attorney General Donegan of the falsity of these statements. Vago was then recalled before the Grand Jury on September 27, 1950 at which time he stated he wanted to amend part of his testimony. Donegan refused to allow him to do so before answering specific questions through which Vago was then forced to admit the falsity of his previous testimony. He was then indicted.

The prosecution in this case has been viewed from its inception as a technical violation with considerable doubt existing as to whether Vago's false testimony could be shown to be material to the purpose of the Grand Jury inquiry and thus in violation of the perjury statute. It was on this basis that the Government agreed to going before Judge Ryan with the defense and making a statement of facts after which the Judge found Vago guilty, but gave him only the three years' suspended sentence and three years' probation.

PURPOSE:

To advise that the subject was found guilty of perjury and sentenced today by U. S. District Judge Sylvester J. Ryan, New York to 3 years suspended and 3 years probation.

BACKGROUND:

Vago was a partner in the firm of A. Brothman and Associates, New York City, from August, 1944, to June, 1948. During this period he became closely associated with Abraham Brothman and Harry Gold. On September 20, 1950, Vago testified before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York, at which time he stated that he left the United States in 1929 to visit his relatives in Hungary and that he did not return until January, 1933. Inasmuch as an FBI investigation conclusively showed that Vago was continuously employed in New York City during the years 1929 through 1932, he was again summoned to appear before the Grand Jury on September 27, 1950. Upon questioning before this body, he admitted he had previously testified falsely as to his trip to Hungary and that he actually returned to Hungary for a visit of about one month during the months of December, 1942, and January, 1943. He was indicted on September 28, 1950, for perjury, based on this false testimony.

On the morning of June 20, 1952, Supervisor

Tom McAndrews of the New York Office telephonically advised
that Vago had been found guilty of perjury and was sentenced
today (June 20) by U. S. District Judge Sylvester J. Ryan,
Southern District of New York, to a 3-year suspended sentence
and was given 3 years probation.

PURPOSE:

To recommend that the attached report of Special Agent Blaze J. Tomasoni, dated June 30, 1952, at New York, placing this case in a closed status, be accepted. OSEAR STANACE SUN WINY

DETAILS:

OSCAR VAGO came to the Bureau's attention in connection with the Harry Gold investigation when it was determined that Vago was a business partner of Abraham Brothman during the period Brothman was associating with Gold.

Investigation reflected that Vago was born February 27, 1898, in Budapest, Hungary. He came to the United States in 1924, and was naturalized as an American citizen in the Southern District of New York on September 29, 1938. He resided in Washington, D.C., from 1938 to 1941, during which period he was employed by the Federal Building Administration, Procurement Division of the Treasury Department, and the War Department at Fort Myer, Virginia. (101-1988).

While in Washington, D.C., Vago was reported as being a member of the Washington Book Shop, the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and the American League for Peace and Democracy. (61-7582-1298).

In 1941, Vago moved back to New York City. In May, 1944, it was reported that he was a member of the Executive Committee at Large of the Rego Park Club of the Communist Party of America. In July, 1944, he was elected to the Queens City Council of the Communist Party of America. As of June, 1949, he was listed as president of the Trylon Club, Ridgewood Section, Queens County Communist Party. On September 20, 1950, Vago was called before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York and made certain false statements concerning his whereabouts in the period 1929 to 1933. We advised Special Assistant Attorney General Donegan of this, and Vago was recalled before the Grand Jury on September 27, 1950, and thereafter was indicted for perjury.

On June 20, 1952, Vago was found guilty and sentenced by U. S. District Court Judge Sylvester J. Ryan, Southern District of New York, to three years' suspended sentence and placed on three years' probation.

Subject is being retained in the regular section of the Security Index in view of his Communist background.

Stops placed against Vago with U. S. Customs, Immigration and Naturalization Service, and the Alien Tax Division of Internal Revenue are being continued for another year when they will be revaluated by the New York Office to determine the desirability of continuing them.

Dissemination of all pertinent information concerning subject has been made to the Department, G-2, ONI and INS.

Bureau references on subject have been reviewed and all pertinent information reflected in these references are in subject's main case file.

RECOMMENDATION:

Inasmuch as all logical investigation has been conducted and this case has been successfully prosecuted, it is recommended that the attached report of SA Tomasoni be accepted, and this case be placed in a closed status.

LSUMMERY Oscar John Vago was a partner in the firm of A. Brothman and Associates, New York City, from August, 1944 to June, 1948. During this period he became closely associated with Abraham Brothman and Harry Gold, a confessed Soviet agent.

According to Gold, Vago was present in the office of A. Brothman and Associates on the evening when Brothman had received his Grand Jury subpoens and announced his intention of telling the whole story as to his furnishing information to the Russians. Gold also stated that Vago in December, 1949, made inquiry of him as to whether Brothman's statement, that he (Brothman), had received a Red Star from the USSR for his activities in behalf of the Soviets was true. Vago upon interview, however, denied the above.

On September 20, 1950, he testified before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York, at which time he stated that he left the United States in 1929 to visit his relatives in Hungary and that he did not return until January, 1933. Inasmuch as an FBI investigation conclusively showed that Vago was continuously employed in New York City during the years 1929 through 1932, he was again summoned to appear before the Grand Jury on September 27, 1950. Upon questioning before this body he admitted that he had testified falsely as to this trip to Hungary and that he actually returned to Hungary for a visit of about one month during the months of December, 1942, and January,

Vago entered a plea of not guilty on arraignment. On June 20, 1952 Vago was found guilty and sentenced by U.S. District Judge Sylvester J. Ryan, of the Southern District of New York, to three years' suspended sentence and placed on three years' probation.

On 5/22/44, it was determined OSCAR VAGO, 66-07 99th St Rego Park, Queens was a member-at-large of the Rego Park Club, Queens County CP. 4. On 10/4/46, it was developed OSCAR VAGO, 66-07 99th St. Resofack, uns mamber ar Rego Section, Queens County CP. 25. On 4/28/47, information was received reflecting subject was a member and possibly president of the Trylon Club, Rego Section, Queens CP. ARRY COLD, self-conferred and convicted espionage agent on 9/14/50, advised that subject was a CP member. He stated during the period he was acquainted with subject he had been told by subject that he attended meetings and was a CP member in Forrest Hills, Queena, On 10/2/50, HARRY GOLD furnished a signed statement in which he advised he first heard of subject through ABRAHAM EROTHMAN in 1943. At that time GOLD was receiving technical information from EROTHMAN for transmittal to the Soviet Union. 
financial assistance from his Russian superior so that VAGO could be worked into a position with an organization partly controlled by BROTHMAN. At this time EROTHMAN described VAGO as a sincere and convinced Communist. VAGO was to become a part of an organization whose purpose was to produce and design chemical processes for the Soviet Union. The venture sponsored by BROTHMAN was to be backed by AMTORG or Russian money, GOLD further stated he first met VAGO in 1946 when subject was at that time a partner in the FIRM, MARK A BROTHMAN Associates. GCLD stated he gathered from VAGO's conversation, actions, and other factors that he was, during 1946, active in the CP and completely in sympathy with the Communist cause. As late as 1948 GOLD stated that VAGO indicated to him he was active in the CP. He last saw subject in December, 1949. GOLD stated he did not believe VAGO was involved in any espionage because he was too talkative.

7. On 9/20/50, subject appeared before the FGJ, SDNY, and refused to answer any questions as to CP membership on grounds of self-incrimination. He denied having ever participated in any espionage activity and stated he knew of no espionage conducted by HARRY GOLD or ABRAHAM BROTHMAN.

8. In a signed statement executed 10/9/50, Mrs. BERNICE RIVERIA, domestic for the VAGO family in 1948, advised that subject's wife had attempted to recruit her into the CP on several occasions. Further, Mrs. VAGO told her that both she and the subject were CP members.

9. On 9/28/50, the FGJ, SDNY, returned an indictment against subject charging he committed perjury in testimony given under oath before the FGJ on 9/20/50. He was charged with giving false testimony concerning his country of residence from 1929, to 1932. He testified that during this period he was in Hungary, when in fact he was in the U.S. continuously from 1925, to 1932. Subject was arrested by the FBI on 9/28/50, and bail was subsequently set at \$40,000. Subject could not meet the bail and he was placed in the custody of the USM, SDNY. The FGJ before which subject appeared was conducting investigation and inquiring into possible violation of espionage laws of the U.S.

10. After subject was arrested and was unable to raise bail, he was placed in the Federal House of Detention, NYC. Also in this institution at the time was JULIUS ROSENBERG. In connection with information



fornished by JEROVE EUGENE TARTAKOW. concerning JULIUS ROSENBERG, the following data relative to subject was also obtained: 1. During VAGO's period of incarceration ROSENBERG was very friendly with subject and on one occasion subject furnished ROSENBERG with several sheets of paper which both studied together for the most part of one day. Both subject and ROSENBERG on several instances discussed mutual acquaintances of theirs who resided in different sections of the US. Once ROSENBERG told VAGO to tell BROTHMAN (ABE) to stop acting "like a scared Kid and everything would be taken care of. 2. In January, 1951, TARTAKOW advised VAGO indicated to him in conversation he intended to flee the US upon release from detention whether he was acquitted, released on bails or on completion of sentence. VAGO made the statement, according to TARTAKOW. that he would go by a "tried and proven route" if a US passport was denied Further, he is reported to have said his arrest ended his "usefulness in the US". Immediately upon his release, VACO is alleged to have stated, he intended on going to Budapest and that he had been preparing to leave the US at the time of his arrest. He informed TARTAKOW that friends in France were to write him a letter offering him a job which would then enable him to obtain an American passport. 3. On 1/18/51 TARTAKOW advised that subject related to him that all the material furnished the Russians by Dr. KLAUS FUCHS was first turned over to ABRAHAM BROTHMAN to check for accuracy and verification. 4. In describing ROSENBERG and VAGO, TARTAKOW stated: "Never have I been associated with two men whose hatred for our government is so profound. Every statement contains a threat of destruction, of violence, to America. There men are not mere Communists. What is more important is that they are revolutionists and that even in the Communist organization itself that is a horse of a different color". . -

JEROME TARTAKOW's reliability is not known.

11. On 6/20/52, subject was found guilty by Federal Judge SYLVESTER J. RYAN (he waived trial by jury) and was sentenced to a three year suspended sentence and placed on three years probation.

12. Subject was a partner in the A. BROTHMAN Associates from August, 1944, to June, 1940. In connection with the investigation which led to the arrest of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and HARRY GOLD, subject was interviewed by Bureau agents on 5/15/50. At this time he furnished considerable information regarding his relationship and business association with BROTHMAN. He admitted knowing GOLD through that individual's employment at BROTHMAN Associates. However, he denied any knowledge of any espionage activity engaged

in by either GOLD or EROTHMAN or any connection these two might have had with the Soviet Union. He stated he had severed relationship with ERCTHMAN in June, 1948, after having engaged in a violent argument with him. As of the time interviewed he had not had any further association with EROTHMAN.

As a result of information revealed by HARRY GOLD and through investigation relative to Soviet espionage activity in the US, extensive investigation was conducted to ascertain if VAGO himself was involved in espionage. As far as the investigation disclosed no direct evidence of subject's involvement in espionage was developed. Based on information furnished by JEROME TARTAKOW to the effect subject planned to flee the country when released from prison, stops were placed throughout the US at points of embarkation and the USA authorized an arrest if subject was determined to be attempting to leave the country. However, no evidence or indication of such intention on his part was received during the period of time the stops were in effect.

As a condition of his probation subject was required to inform the US Probation Office of his employment and residence at all times. He has been employed by various engineering firms since being placed on probation and is currently working with the firm of JAMES RUDERWAN, Consulting Engineer, NYC, and resides in Flushing, Long Island, where he purchased a home in October, 1953.

No evidence has been received during his period of probation which would indicate he has been engaged in any subversive activity.

RECOMMENDATION.

Remove from the SI.

Even though subject has been identified as a CP member and was from 1944, to 1948, affiliated with ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, who figured prominently in the HARRY GOLD espionage apparatus, no direct evidence of actual involvement on the part of the subject has been developed. Information as furnished by JEROME TARTAKOW would tend to indicate the possibility that subject might have been engaged in some type of activity which was not in the best interest of the US. However, investigation failed to determine, if any, the extent or degree of such activity. HARRY GOLD stated while subject was a CP member



he did not believe him to be engaged in espionage. No direct connection was determined between subject's act of perjury and any espionage activity. There has been no evidence of CP membership on his part within the past five years nor does his known activity otherwise bring him within the criteria for retention on the \$I.

CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS, formerly known as the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act.



A source advised on April 15, 1958, that the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act (CJDC) was formed by the Communist Party (CP) in March, 1956.

A second source advised on July 17, 1958, that at a working conference of the CJDC held on June 8, 1958, at Chicago, the name of the CJDC was changed to the Chicago Committee to Defend Democratic Rights (CCDDR). The purpose of the CCDDR, according to its "Statement of Principles and Organization," is to "...defend and extend the human rights embodied in the Bills of Rights...and to put an end to the political and racial persecutions which threaten American democracy today." Officers of the CCDDR elected at this conference were Chairman, LEON KATZEN, and "paid Executive Secretary," RICHARD CRILEY, both of whom were officers of the CJDC. As of May, 1959, this organization continued to function within the framework of its stated principles. Working committees affiliated with the CCDDR in 1958 and 1959, in accordance with the CCDDR's Statement of Principles and Organization, included a welfare committee for the families of Smith Act victims and a committee to work for Taft-Hartley defendants.

LEON KATZEN was identified by a third source as a member of the CP in March, 1959.

RICHARD CRILEY, according to a fourth source, as of March, 1959, was a member of the Illinois CP State Committee.

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On May 9, 1960, the second source revealed information which indicated that the Chicago Smith Act Emilies Committee is an affiliate of the CCDDR.
