- The Wingdale Camp Corporation, also known as the Lake Ellis Camp Corporation, The Loujack Corporation, operates & summer camp on Lake Ellis, N.Y., about three miles from Wingdale, N.Y.
- The camp has been in operation for about ten years, is commonly known as CAMP UNITY, and is referred to locally as "the Communist Camp." The Camp is operated during the summer months, and caters to a most unusual clientels. Reputedly, people of all nationalities, as well as members of the white, yellow and negro races, come there during the vacation months, reside there and mingle and associate freely together. The camp motto is reported to be "In unity there is strength", and Communist mestings and demonstrations are held.
- CAMP UNITY, itself, is a wooded tract of considerable extent, on the shores of Lake Ellis, and the camp plant consists of a casino, recreation hall, bath house, and numerous bungalows and cottages of flimmy frame construction. Except for a construction job and a substantial frame structure which was being erected near the gate, where a number of workmen, evident-ly from a local contracting firm, were working, the camp appeared deserted when visited by the investigator. In the summer months, however, it is reported that as many as 1200-1500 people are at the place at one time. Records in the office of

HERMAN THEODORE EPSTEIN presently resides at 4715 Maripoe Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, is an assistant professor of physics at the University of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and is white.

No information has been developed indicating that DORIS H.

EPSTEIN, the subject's spouse, is employed in any capacity
other than as a housewife, and she is white.

Investigation in this matter was originally initiated in September, 1950, as a result of information received reflecting that EPSTEIN had been receiving Communist literature, including the "Daily Worker," and that he was considered a "Big Left-winger in the Pittsburgh District." Also, during September, 1950, EPSTEIN was interviewed in connection with the investigation "WILLIAM PERL, was., Espionage-R," at which time EPSTEIN related that he had been employed under the direct supervision of PERL at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, Cleveland, Chio, from January, 1944, to the fall of 1946, that he and PERL had maintained personal contact during the interim since they engaged together on a research project in biophysics, and that he considered himself to be one of PERL's closest friends.

The investigation at Pittsburgh to date has failed to disclose any Communist Party or related front activity on the part of the subject or his wife. It is further noted that Security Informants of the Pittsburgh Division familiar with general Communist Party activities, have no knowledge of the subject.

In addition, the investigation to date has not disclosed any specific information reflecting that known associates of the subject are members of the Communist Party or actively engaged in related activities.

It is further noted that numerous interviews have been conducted among individuals who were acquainted with the subject.

In general, these interviews have failed to develop any information indicating subversive activities or associations on the part of EPSTEIN. It is noted, however, that one interviewes, Professor ROBLEY HILLIAMS, University of California, Berkeley, California, advised that EPSTEIN while at the University of Michigan, in 1946, was active in and sympathetic with the American Youth for Democracy or the American Youth Congress at the University. WILLIAMS further stated that he believed EPSTEIN followed the thinking of the Communist theories

After a careful evaluation of the investigation to date, it is the recommendation of the Pittsburgh Office that EPSTEIN not be included on the Security Index of this division.

With reference to an interview of the subject at this time, as is set forth before, EPSTEIN was previously interviewed in connection with the PERL investigation and furnished information concerning his relationship with PERL. It is pointed out that this interview was prior to the indictment of PERL for perjury.

Other than the subject's association with PERL, information developed to date has disclosed no particularly significant association or participation in the Communist movement on the part of EPSTEIN. Under these circumstances, it is questionable that a current interview of the subject would be productive insofar as general Communist Party and related activities are concerned; and, in the absence of a specific request of the New York Office, no further contact with EPSTEIN concerning PERL is contemplated.

Therefore, the Pittsburgh Office is not recommending an interview of EPSTEIN and, unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau, is placing this investigation in a <u>Closed</u> status.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

SECURITY INFORMATION - CORRESPONDE

ROBURT THOMAS JONES and wife, DORIS, in separate interviews advised they were close friends and fellow employees of PERL at NACA Langley Field, Virginia. Mrs. JONES, former girlfriend of PERL, and Mr. JONES unable to recall date of visit with PERL in Cleveland. Both stated they have no knowledge of espionage activity by PERL. Mr. JONES recalled no specific information concerning secret documents missing from Langley Field November, 1944, but remembered incident and that Mr. SOULE was responsible for the document.

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DETAILS: ROBERT THOMAS JONES, 840 Lincoln, Palo Alto, California, an aeronautical research scientist, National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, Ames Aeronautical Laboratory, Moffett Field, California, was interviewed at Ames Aeronautical Laboratory, Moffett Field on March 11, 1952 by SA NORMAN FRYE and the writer.

Mr. JONES advised that he was employed at Langley Memorial Aeronautical Laboratory, Langley Field, Hampton, Virginia from 1934 COPIES DESTROPHED his transfer to his present place of employment in 1946.

JONES stated he first met PERL, who was known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL, several years after 1934 when PERL commenced his employment at langley Field in theoretical acrodynamics. JONES did not recall the date that PERL came to langley Field, but stated it was two to five years after JONES had started working there. JONES commented that he was very poor in remembering dates or specific periods of time.

According to JONES, PERL was not employed in the same section at langley Field, but that they both had had an interest in theoretical aerodynamics. JONES advised he considered PERL to be a good friend of his during the time PERL was at langley Field, and that they associated together on a social basis as well as sharing mutual interest in theoretical aerodynamics. He stated that PERL was not as advanced in theoretical aerodynamics as he, and would often ask advice from him on problems or formulas.

JONES advised he could not recall the date that PERL left Langley Field or where he went when he left that employment.

JONES stated that his friendship ceased when PERL left langley Field, and that he could only recall seeing PERL once after that time and that was in Cleveland when PERL was employed at NACA Laboratory. He stated he does not recall just when it was he saw PERL in Cleveland, but it was after PERL was married as he remembered going to PERL's apartment to met PERL's wife. JONES advised he did not recall the location of this apartment, but remembers it was a very small one; and there was no one present at the apartment but PERL, PERL's wife, whose name he remembered as "BTTIE" or "HTTTIE," and himself.

JON'S stated that his present wife, DORIS COHEN, prior to her marriage to him was also well acquainted with PERL at Langley Field. He advised that his wife, DORIS, had told him prior to their marriage, which he believed was in May, 1946, after first stating it was in 1945, that she had seen PERL in Pasadena, California, at which time PERL was attending school at California Institute of Technology; and she was employed at Northrup Corpany, Los Angeles. He stated that he does not believe his wife has seen PERL other than this occasion in Pasadena, since PERL left Langley Field.



JONES was unable to recall just how he happened to see PERL in Cleveland, and advised he believed it probably was in connection with a business trip he made to Cleveland on behalf of Army Specail Weapons Unit. when he visited the NACA Laboratory, Cleveland, and the JACK and HEINTZ Company, Cleveland. He stated he believed this is the time he saw PTRL, and that on this trip he stayed in Cleveland several days which would account for why he had time to visit PFRL's apartment, as his trips to Cleveland normally were of one day duration which time was normally spent in conferences at the laboratory.

JON'S stated he did not recall what he may have discussed with PERL, but did not think he would discuss his, JONES', work as PERL was never interested in anything but what he personally was working on. JONES advised he may have possibly mentioned to PERL what he was in Cleveland for, and possibly PERL was at one of the conferences at the NACA Laboratory in Cleveland attended by JONES.

JCNTS advised that he has had no contact with PTRL since that time other than to read some of PERL's writings regarding work he was engaged in in Cleveland and some notes written by PERL on lockupes by Dr. THEODORE VOH KARNAN, a well known expert in aerodynamics. He stated these writings and notes were disseminated throughout the various offices of NACA.

According to JONES, after PERL was indicted in New York, JONES and his wife received a letter from an individual named SHAMUS from New York, who was unknown to them, but described himself as a friend of PERL's. He stated SHANTS was soliciting funds to assist PTRL in raising money to post as bail. JONES said he and his wife were willing to contribute money for PERL's use, but were somewhat dubious of the letter, as there was some mention of a passport in the letter which they could not understand. He was unable to recall what was said · let a regarding the passport; however, he stated he or his wife wrote to SHAM'S for more information, and received a reply thanking whom but stating the money was no longer needed. He did not recollect why the money was not needed, but stated it was his impression that the amount of the bail was either lowered or the money had been raised

Mr. JONES advised he had no other knowledge of activities on the part of PERL except while at Langley Field, PERL was a member of

from other sources.





the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians and of the American Association of Scientific Workers. JONES stated that he personally was very interested and active in these organizations; however, he remembered PERL merely to be a member and does not believe he held any particular offices in the organizations. JONES advised to his knowledge these organizations at Langley Field were made-up of persons loyal to the United States, and any program inimical to the best interest of the United States would not have been sanctioned by the membership.

The Joint Fact Finding Committee on the Un-American Activities, California State Legislature in its 1947 report described the FAECT as a Communist front organization, however, no specific mention is made of the Hampton Virginia Chapter.

This committee in its 1948 report described the American Association of Scientific Workers as a Communist front organization.

JONES advised that he knew nothing of PERL's associations or activities after he left Langley Field, and that he had never known any of PERL's family other than his wife. He had never seen PERL other than on the occasions at Langley Field and Cleveland, as previously stated. He advised that the only associates of PERL he knew at Hampton, Virginia were the fellow employees at NACA, Langley Field, and that he could not now recall any particular persons as close associates of PERL other than he and Mrs. JONES.

JONES advised that his former wife, from whom he was divorced in about 19hh, is HAZEL ST. CLAIR JONES, who had a nervous break-down and was hospitalized at Williamsburg, Virginia. He stated that she still is in this hospital.

JONES stated that he recalls an incident, while employed at Langley Field, when a document charged out to Mr. SOULE was lost. He stated that he remembers that everyone was asked to make a thorough search of their desks and papers for the document. He could not recall the date or year when this incident occurred, nor could he recall the contents or appearance of the document.

JONES advised that he does remember that he felt no particular responsibility for the loss of this document, as it had been charged

to Mr. SOULE. He stated that he is sure that he must of seen the document "Guided Missles, Development, Status and Availability," as he was working on that project; however, does not how have any independent recollection of the document or particular circumstances concerning its use prior to the time it was lost.

JONES stated that he does not believe that he unknowningly or mistakenly picked up the document among his papers or carried it to another office or city. He advised that he has no reason to believe that he had taken the document on his trip to another place and left it by mistake. He stated he realized that it was a possibility that he or someone else may have mistakenly taken the document, but that he has no reason to believe that this was done; and would have no idea who may have taken the document or where it may have been left.

JONES advised that he was not acquainted with any of the following individuals:

MICHAEL and ANN SIDOROVICH MAX and HELENE ELITCHER ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT MORTON and HELEN SOBELL ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG JOEL BARR VIVIAN GLASSMAN ANDREI I. SCHEVCHENKO

Photographs of the above individuals were exhibited to JONES, and he advised he was not familiar with any of the photographs other than to say he recognized the photographs of the ROSENBERGS as he had seen them in the newspaper, and thought the one of VIVIAN GLASSMAN looked familiar. He stated he had no idea who VIVIAN GLASSMAN is or why her photograph looked familiar.

JONES advised that PERL as no time requested any unauthorized information from him, and that he had no information which would indicate PERL or any other person was engaged in espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union or any other country.

Mrs. JONES was interviewed at her residence at 340 Lincoln, Palo Alto, California, on March 11, 1952 by SAS WAYNE K. WEICH and PETFR J. HOPKINS.



Mrs. JONES advised that she first met WILLIAM PERL in about 1939 shortly after PERL came to work for NACA at the langley Memorial Aeronautical Laboratory, Langley Field, Hampton, Virginia. She stated she thought that she first met PERL at work, as she recollects that she and PERL each worked on a phase of the same problem shortly after PERL's arrival at Langley. She advised that although they were acquainted at work her primary association with PERL was of a social nature.

Mrs. JONES said they, she and PERL, "ran around" in social groups consisting entirely of persons employed in NACA. She advised she and PERL dated each other for several months, and they dated quite frequently for some time. She said that she was never overly attracted to PERL, but that he was "rushing her." She said that she respected PERL and considered him a brillant man at his work, but socially as a companion she considered him quite inmature and naive and, therefore, somewhat of a bore. She explained this by advising that PERL was completely wrapped up in his work, and when in social affairs was always thinking of his work and wanted to discuss it. She stated this was not done in any breach of security regulations, as all the people with whom PERL associated, worked at the NACA and like PERL were cleared to handle security information.

Mrs. JONES advised that her own close social association with PERL was discontinued about two years or so before PERL left Langley Field: however, she and PERL still associated in the same social group which consisted entirely of fellow employees at langley Field. Mrs. JONES said that none of the scientists at Langley had anything in common with the people at Hampion, Virginia, therefore, had never had any social contact or friendship among the town people. Regarding other persons in this group, Mrs. JONES recalled that her husband, ROBERT-JONES, SAM KATZOFF and MILITON KLEIN were PERL's friends and companions at Langley Field. The Enlieved KLEIN is now working for NACA at Cleveland, Ordp. on a mabile to recall the names of any other persons in this group. Mrs. JONES said she did not know too much of PERL's activities except he seemed completely absorbed in his work, and had no other interest. She recalled he had an apartment or room fdowntown Hampton, Virginia, but could not recall the street or address. She said the one impressionable thing about the apartment which she could remember was that PERL had built a phonograph in the closet of his room. She said that she had observed nothing indicating





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PERL was interested in anything other than his work, as he never seemed interested in political or International affairs, and was never interested in any discussions in these matters. She advised that after she ceased dating PERL, he dated another girlfriend whose name she could not recall, but whom she remembered as being red haired. PERL also, according to Mrs. JONES, dated Mrs. JONES roommate, LOUISE MOSS. She stated Miss MOSS presently resides at the Roger Williams Hotel, 28 E. 31st Street, New York City. Mrs. JONES could not recall any other friends of PERL. She advised that PERL's time was presently spent in his work, and that his principal means of relexation seemed to be in playing handball.

Mrs. JONES said she cannot now recall just when PERL left Langley Field, and she does not know where he went from Langley Field.

Mrs. JONES said she did not see PERL again until she met him in Los Angeles, California, at the end of 1945, at the time Mrs. JONES was working in Los Angeles and PERL had come to Los Angeles for a continued study at the California Institute of Technology. Mrs. JONES said that for a period of three or four months, possibly until March, 1946, she saw PERL four or five times at the most. She advised, while there, she met PERL's wife, and has no information concerning her, having only seen her on one or two occasions. Mrs. JONES said she visited at the Perl apartment only once. At this time, she advised it was her impression that PERL was devoting all his time to his studies, and was not engaged in other activities. She advised it was her impression that PERL had no fliends or associates in Los Angeles at that time. She advised that prior to her meeting HETTIE PERL, wife of WILLIAM PERL, in Los Angeles, she had never seen her before.

Mrs. JONES said that she and her husband had had no personal contact with Mr. PERL since their marriage in 1946; however, sometime ago they did receive a letter from PERL. She could not recall just when they received this letter, and stated it was perhaps a year or so ago.

In this letter, according to Mrs. JONES, PERL said he was being investigated regarding possible Communist sympathy on his part, and that his wife was being accused of having made statements



sympathetic to the Soviet regime and Russia. She advised, according to the letter, because of this the NACA was investigating PERL and his wife for possible Communist sympathies. PERL, in the letter, requested an affidavit from Mrs. JONES that would advise that Mrs. PERL had not shown or expressed sympathy to the Soviet Union or Communism. Mrs. JONES said she did not write this affidavit, that she had only met Mrs. PFRL in Ios Angeles and did not know enough about her to comment in any way. Another reason, according to Mrs. JONES, for her not writing this affideralt was, at the time, both she and Mr. JON'S were under investigation and had been suspended from working on or having access to any classified material at NACA, Aeronautical Laboratory. She said investigation of them also had to do with unfounded allegations that she and her husband had Communist sentiments. She advised because of the position of the JCNESES themselves, at that time, they were not in any position to write an affidavit to testify to the loyalty of another person. She advised that she had written PERL explaining this to him.

Mrs. JONES advised that she is well aware that PERL is to be tried for perjury. She said that to her knowledge of the reasons for his being so tried is limited to what she has read in the newspaper, and from information written to her from friends in New York. She said that as she understood it, PERL is being tried because he stated he did not remember MORTON SOBELL, when PERL supposedly had attended school at the same time as SOBELL. Mrs. JONES advised that she had received a couple of letters from friends of PERL asking for financial assistance to raise necessary bail money for PERL. She stated she received such letters from HERBERT RIBNER and HERBERT PASS. She advised they requested this money be sent to HAROID SHAMES, 1568 Macombs Road, the Bronx, New York City. She advised, however, that they, the JONESES, never sent any money because they received a subsequent latter that the funds were not now needed. Mrs. JCNES said that RIBNER is working for NACA at Cleveland, and that PASS resides at 6773 Westward Beach Road, California, Wos. "Will said that in letters requesting funds, there was not much information regarding facts of PURL's case, and SHAMTS was supposed to give any necessary information. Mrs. JONES said she also had heard that PERL was being implicated because of the apartment he sublet in New York. She stated she could not recall just where or when she had learned about the apartmenthouse, but she heard the situation was very unfair to PERL. Regarding this apartment, Mrs. JON'S explained that it was her understanding it had occured when PERL was attending Columbia University.



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She advised that at the time housing was difficult to obtain, and PERL was fortunate to get an apartment that was sublet; and PERL did not . know the person through whom he was to sublet the apartment, but leased the apartment through a third person. She said that she understood that PERL had not met the person from whom the apartment was sublet but rather did all his business through a third person. She said that PERL did not even pay his rent to the original renter but to the third person or some other designated person or agency. According to Mrs. JON:S, this original renter, the one who subleted the apartment but whom PERL does not know, was involved in or accused of some type of activity which caused a question as to this person's national allegiance. She stated PTRL now is being accused of disloyalty when in reality it is the person who allowed the apartment to be sublet who should be accused, and it is her understanding that the original renter is not known to PERL. Mrs. JONES does not know the address of this apartment, but understood it to be in Greenwich Village, New York City. She stated she could not now recall any more information regarding this incident, nor how she came by this information.

Mrs. JONES denied knowing any of the following individuals:

MICHAEL and ANN SIDOROVICH MAX and HELENE ELITCHER ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT MORTON and HELEN SOBELL ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG JOEL BARR VIVIAN GLASSMAN ANDREI I. SCHEVCHENKO

Photographs of the above with the exception of VIVIAN GLASSMAN and ANDREI I. SCHWCHTNKO were exhibited to Mrs. JONES, and she advised that she did not know any of the persons except that she recognized the ROSTNETRGS as having seen their pictures the newspaper.

Regarding her husband's association with PERL, Mrs. JONES advised that her husband was acquainted with PERL at Lengley Field, however, this association was primary social. She advised that Mr. JONES has told her that he saw PERL in Cleveland after PERL went there from Langley Field. She stated that he had seen PERL on one or two occasions. She recalled that Mr. JONES had told her shortly after PERL was married at Cleveland, he went to PERL's apartment where

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he met PERL's wife. She advised to her knowledgo Mr. JONES has had no other contact with PERL, and has not seen PERL since the JONESES were married in 1946.

Mrs. JONES said she has no information regarding PERL or PERL's associates engaging in any activity inimical to the United A States. She said none of PERL's activities were to obtain information its or data in which he would not have in line with work or study. She stated she had no information that PERL may have been disloyal to this country or no reason which might indicate that PERL may have Scomitted perjury.

The San Francisco files contain no information identifiable with LOUISE MOSS, HERBERT S. RIBNER.

HAROID SHAMES and MILTON M. KLEIN have previously been identified as fellow employees of PERL at NACA, Cleveland, Ohio.

SAM KATZOFF has previously been identified as a fellow employee of PERL at NACA at langley Field.

In an application for Federal employment as an aeronatical engineer dated April 23, 1947, HERBERT RALPH-PASS furnished the following background information: born, March 13, 1918, Brooklyn, New York; marital status, single; height, 5'6"; weight 145 lbs.; Social Security number 563-30-475; education, New York University, February 1935 to June 1938, received Degree of Bachelor of Aeronautical Engineering; address, 3959 Michael Avenue, Venice, California.

Included in the employment background HERBERT PASS listed employment from September 1938 to January 1943 at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA), Langley Field, Virginia.

San Francisco T-1, another Government agency which conducts intelligence investigations, advised in 1948 that they were in possession of information from a reliable source indicating that had been heard making pro-Russian statements, was a Communist sympathizer and an associate of known Communists and Communist sympathizers.





This informant also stated that PHYLLIS PILLES had CP Card No. 59412, dated November 25, 1944.

CERTRUDE CONTER, aka Certrude Counter Soltker

On Bebruary 6, 1946, T-12, of known reliability, advised that CERTROIE GUNYER SOLTKER, wife of DAVID IEE SOLTKER, first joined the CP in 1934 in Chicago, Illinois. As of November, 1937, her membership in the CP had been uninterrupted, and she held the position of Unit Organizer of Unit 129, Section 1, District No. 8 of the CP in Chicago. She was then an actress with the Chicago Repertory Group, Inc. On Harch 15, 1938 she was expelled from the CP for having distributed Party discipline, being in disagreement with Unit decisions, having sent in a letter of resignation from the CP, and having an individualistic attitude. The Party The decision on her expulsion carried provisions for her respelication for membership after three months.

T-12 continued that GERTRUE GUNTER, upon re-applying for Party membership, had claimed that she always had a deep respect for the CP. GERTRUE GUNTER further claimed that she had done much work on Party campaigns and programs for Spain, May Day and Memorial Day events. The informant related that GERTRUE GUNTER further claimed that after having been dropped from the Party, she attempted to continue her political development by reading such publications as "New Masses," "The Record," ERCHOER'S "Peoples Front," and the "Communist." The informant stated that Miss GUNTER felt that the only place for her was in the CP, and she was re-admitted to CP membership in August, 1938.



It may be noted that the Congressional Becord of September 24, 1942, on Page 7688, quotes the Attorney General as stating that "New Masses" is a Communist periodical.

It may be further noted that LOUIS F. BUDENZ, Assistant Professor, Fordham University, New York, New York, a former Party functionary during his ten years as a CP member from 1935 - 1945, testified during the trial of the eleven Communist leaders in New York that the "Midwest Daily Record" was published from February, 1938 through September, 1939 as a daily, and from September, 1939 through January, 1940 as a weekly. It was set up and completely financed by the CP. All staff members were CP members, and Mr. BUDENZ was Editor of the paper during its entire life.




On June 18, 1954, T-M, another agency which conducts security investigations in the Chicago area, advised that a memorial meeting homoring JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENEERG was held on June 17, 1954 at Curtiss Hall, 410 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, under the auspices of the Chicago Rosenberg-Sobell Committee, at which some three hundred persons were in attendance.

According to this informant, FRARL HART, an attorney who has defended Communists, called this meeting to order, advising them that this meeting was held to commemorate the First Amiversary of the deaths of RTHEL and JULIUS MOSENHERG, who were executed by the Federal Government on June 19, 1953 as atomic spies. In her opening remarks, Miss MART asked the audience to bear with her while she addressed the spirits of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENHERG, "who are in this room tonight." According to T-ll, Miss MART stated that, "The guests here all realize that your deaths were untimely, and that the sacrifice you both made will long be remembered and will have a decided effect on the future, for all of us, so your sacrifice was not in vain."

T-lh further advised that Rabbi S. BURR TAMPOL addressed those assembled, and told them that, "The Rosembergs should still be here with



ws. They did not deserve the punishment they received. YAMPOL further told the group that no one was killed as a result of the secrets given away by the ROSENEERGS, and in the future, "we" must endeavor to execute justice with kindness and mercy in cases like that of the ROSENEERGS.



According to this informant, MALCOIM SHARP, Professor at the University of Chicago, told the audience that he not being too familiar with the whole case, felt that justice would be done although he did not agree with the ROSENBERGS in most of their beliefs. According to SHARP, he felt that after the death of the ROSENBERGS a mark was placed on their two innocent children, and it was up to him and people like him to do something for them. According to T-14, supra, PEARL HART prepared a resolution which was passed, asking the transfer of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz to "any other federal prison", stating that Alcatraz was built to house only criminals, such as murderers and other such major offenders, and not a man such as MORTON SOBELL, who was guilty of nothing. According to Miss HART, this resolution was to be sent to the head of the New York Prison System.

T-14 also advised that Professor STEPHEN LOVE,
an attorney and reportedly a professor at Northwestern
University, confined his talk to MORTON SOBELL and his unjust sentence
of thirty years for treason. According to LOVE, the only crime that SOBELL
was guilty of and apparently convicted on was that he held four or five
conversations with JULIUS ROSENBERG. According to this informant, LOVE
concluded by telling the sudience that he would keep on working and
hoping that someday SOBELL would be released of this unjust charge.

T-14, supra, advised that approximately \$418 was collected at this meeting.
