[REDACTED] stated that the employee and her husband, SIDNEY, are well thought of in the neighborhood and that she knows nothing of a derogatory nature concerning the employee or her husband whatsoever.

[REDACTED] stated that the employee was a busy woman who always had some kind of part-time office jobs and she did not know where she worked. [REDACTED] stated that she never heard any remarks made by the employee that would be inimical to the best interests of the United States. She stated further that the employee was a woman of good moral character and that she never had any reason to question her loyalty to the United States and that she recommended her for a position of trust and confidence with the United States Government.

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Miscellaneous

On June 24, 1966, [REDACTED], Clerk, Credit Bureau of Greater New York, advised IC [REDACTED] that she could locate no record for the (b)(7)(c) employee.

On July 5, 1966, representatives of the Bureau of Special Services (BSS) and the Bureau of Criminal Identification (BCI), New York City Police Department (NYCPD) advised SA [REDACTED] that they (b)(7)(c) could locate no record for the employee of SIDNEY POWELL.

On June 24, 1966, IC [REDACTED] (b)(7)(c) reviewed the records of the Brooklyn Board of Elections for the address 1002 Foster Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, for the years 1946 through 1948. These records disclosed that SIDNEY and SARAH POWELL when indicating a party preference during those years indicated a preference for one of the major political parties.

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On June 28, 1966, IC [REDACTED] reviewed the records of the Queens Board of Elections for the address 56-27 194th Street, Flushing, New York, for the years 1949 through 1954. These records disclosed that SARAH and SIDNEY POWELL when indicating a party preference during those years indicated a preference for one of the major political parties.

During July, 1966, several confidential informants familiar with some phases of CP activities in the New York City area, advised that they had no knowledge of the employee or her husband, SIDNEY POWELL.

On July 6, 1966, a review of the employee's official personnel file disclosed that she had executed application for Federal employment (Standard Form (SF) 57) on July 23, 1946, in which she answered "No" to question number 26 which read as follows:

"Do you advocate or have you ever advocated, or are you now or have you ever been a member of any organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States by force or violence?"

A copy of this application is attached as Exhibit A.

On March 14, 1966, the employee executed appointment affidavits (SF 61).

Paragraph B of this form entitled, "Affidavit as to Subversive Activity and Affiliation", reads as follows:

"I am not a Communist or Fascist. I do not advocate nor am I knowingly a member of any organization that advocates the overthrow of the constitutional form of the Government of the United States, or which seeks by force or violence to deny other persons their rights under the Constitution of the United States. I do further swear (or affirm) that I will not so advocate, nor will I knowingly become a member of such organization during the period that I am an employee of the Federal Government or any agency thereof."

In 1948, the employee was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in the case entitled, "SARAH SHIRLEY POWELL, aka, Position Classifier, Veterans Administration, Brooklyn, New York, Loyalty of Government Employee". The results of that investigation have been set forth in this report.

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BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

On September 27, 1950, during the course of another investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, NY T-1 advised that from the spring of 1939 until the spring of 1940, ~~he and~~ MORTON-SOBELL *and Max Elitch* resided at 4925 Seventh Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C. NY T-1 stated that upon the persuasion of SOBELL he joined the Communist Party about the fall of 1939 and added that SOBELL was at that time already a member.

NY T-1 stated that ~~while residing at the address on Seventh Street~~ there were approximately five Communist Party meetings held ~~in his and~~ SOBELL's apartment. He stated that ~~both he and SOBELL~~ <sup>was</sup> were present during each meeting. NY T-1 stated that the only person whom he could recall by name who was a member of their cell at that time was one SARAH SILVERMAN.

NY T-1 stated that he could not recall whether ~~he and~~ SOBELL attended any meetings at the home of SARAH SILVERMAN but stated that SOBELL had been dating SILVERMAN at the time the Communist Party meetings were being held in ~~NY T-1 and~~ SOBELL's apartment.

MORTON SOBELL was convicted on March 29, 1951, in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union and was sentenced on April 5, 1951, to 30 years imprisonment. He is currently serving his sentence in the custody of the Attorney General.

NY T-1 stated that SARAH SILVERMAN in 1939, was about 25 years old and was employed by the Civil Service Commission in Washington, D. C. He stated that she either left Washington or dropped out of the Party a short time later and he has not seen nor heard of her since that time. NY T-1 advised that SILVERMAN and SOBELL were in the Communist Party at the same time.

It is noted that on Security Investigation Data for Nonsensitive Position Form, Standard Form 85, certified by the employee on March 14, 1966, she indicated that she was born on December 29, 1943 and was employed by the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C. from December, 1939 to April, 1942.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

On September 22, 1950, NY T-1 advised that he *Max Elitcher* and MORTON SOBELL resided at 4925 Seventh Street, Northwest Washington, D. C. from the spring of 1939 until the spring of 1940. During that year, NY T-1 stated no more than five Communist Party meetings were held in ~~their~~ *the* apartment at this address. NY T-1 recalled that he joined the Party during the fall of 1939 and ~~prior to the time of his joining~~ SOBELL did not hold any Communist Party meetings in their apartment. He stated that ~~the~~ *and the* five Communist Party meetings referred to above were held *at the* in their apartment after he joined the Party.

NY T-1 advised that at these meetings, ~~he and SOBELL were present together~~ with an individual named SARAH SILVERMAN. He added that another individual whose name he could not recall also attended these meetings and that this person resided in an apartment in the Northwest section of Washington.

In July, 1966, NY T-1 advised that he was introduced to SARAH SILVERMAN sometime in 1939 by MORTON SOBELL. He advised that he knew SARAH SILVERMAN for about a year and a half during 1939 and 1940. He stated that during that period, he knew her to be a member of the Communist Party and believes that she attended meetings in the apartment ~~shared by himself and MORTON SOBELL~~ *Max Elitcher*. He could not recall the specific number of meetings that SARAH SILVERMAN attended nor could he recall her at any specific meetings.

NY T-1 advised that ~~when he and MORTON SOBELL moved from their apartment on Seventh Street in Washington, D. C.~~ he lost contact with SARAH SILVERMAN *in 1940* and has had no dealings with her since that time.

NY T-1 advised that SARAH SILVERMAN could be described as a very passive member of the Communist Party in that she took no active part in the discussions and seemed to know very little of the theory of Communism. He recalled

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On January 17, 1951, Mrs. SIDNEY POWELL, 56-27 194th Street, Queens, New York, advised that her maiden name was SARAH SILVERMAN and that she had been employed by the Civil Service Commission in Washington, D. C., in about 1939. She advised that about that time she had known ~~him~~ <sup>him</sup> as a casual acquaintance with whom she had played tennis at a public park. She stated that she knew nothing of ~~his~~ <sup>his</sup> background or his work and did not know where he lived except that it was somewhere in the northwest section of Washington, D. C. Mrs. POWELL stated that she never met any of ~~his~~ <sup>his</sup> friends and that at no time did she ever date them.

Mrs. POWELL stated that she never heard of the name of MORTON SOBELL, nor was she able to recognize a photograph of MORTON SOBELL. She stated that she had never been a member of the Communist Party (CP) nor a member of the American Peace Mobilization. She also stated that she had never heard of JULIUS ROSENBERG and was not aware of the fact that ROSENBERG and SOBELL were in jail awaiting trial on charges of espionage.

JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. They were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and were legally executed in Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953.

He advised that he knew SARAH SILVERMAN for about a year and a half during 1939 and 1940. He stated that during that period, he knew her to be a member of the Communist Party and believes that she attended meetings in the apartment shared by himself and MORTON SOBELL. He could not recall the specific number of meetings that SARAH SILVERMAN attended nor could he recall her at any specific meetings.

NY T-1 advised that when he and MORTON SOBELL moved from their apartment on Seventh Street in Washington, D.C., he lost contact with SARAH SILVERMAN and has had no dealings with her since that time.

NY T-1 advised that SARAH SILVERMAN could be described as a very passive member of the Communist Party in that she took no active part in the discussions and seemed to know very little of the theory of Communism. He recalled.

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NY T-1 stated that he could not recall whether SOBELL attended any meetings at the home of SARAH SILVERMAN but stated that SOBELL had been dating SILVERMAN at the time the Communist Party meetings were being held in SOBELL's apartment.

In July, 1966, NY T-1 advised that he was introduced to SARAH SILVERMAN sometime in 1939 by MORTON SOBELL. He advised that he knew SARAH SILVERMAN for about a year and a half during 1939 and 1940. He stated that during that period, he knew her to be a member of the Communist Party and believes that she attended meetings in the apartment of MAX ELITCHER and MORTON SOBELL. He could not recall the specific number of meetings that SARAH SILVERMAN attended nor could he recall her at any specific meetings.

NY T-1 advised that he lost contact with SARAH SILVERMAN in 1940 and has had no dealings with her since that time.

NY T-1 advised that SARAH SILVERMAN could be described as a very passive member of the Communist Party in that she took no active part in the discussions and seemed to know very little of the theory of Communism. He recalled

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that she was originally from Baltimore and she seemed to be a person of good character and reputation and not to be wild and flighty. He described her as a sincere individual but stated that he saw in her no basic conviction regarding Communism. She seemed to have very little knowledge of the subject.

NY T-1 stated that he believes that Communist Party meetings were held in the apartment of SARAH SILVERMAN sometime during 1939 or 1940. He cannot specifically recall any such meeting being held in her apartment but stated these meetings were held in almost every member's of the Party's house at some time or other. NY T-1 also believes that SARAH SILVERMAN was undoubtedly active in the American Peace Mobilization since this was one of the activities in which the Communist Party was interested in at that time. He cannot specifically recall SARAH SILVERMAN's participation in this organization.

The American Peace Mobilization has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

NY T-1 stated that he would recommend SARAH SILVERMAN for a position with the United States Government providing she had discontinued her affiliation with the Communist Party and had not been active in it since he last knew her. NY T-1 stated that he, himself, continued his activities in the Communist Party until about 1947 and during the period from 1940 to 1947, he cannot recall observing SARAH SILVERMAN as being an active participant in any Communist Party activity. For this reason, he feels that she dropped out of the Communist Party in about 1940.

NY T-1 advised that he knew of no other person who would have any knowledge of the Communist Party activities of SARAH SILVERMAN.

NY T-1 also advised that he is not willing to appear before a hearing board or to furnish assigned statement.

New York and Washington Field are referred to their case file captioned "Morton Sobell, with aliases, Espionage - R," New York file 100-37158 and Washington Field file 101-2316. This discloses that David Levitov, when contacted by Bureau Agents, was cooperative (see WFO teletype 7-24 and 27-50). It is also noted he testified before a Federal Grand Jury on 10-27-50. (101-2483)

In this investigation New York and Washington Field should refer to their case files captioned "Helen Sobell, with aliases, SM-C," New York file 100-109849 and Washington Field file 100-3074. (100-404849)

It is noted that the applicant's sister, Helen Sobell, was at one time married to Clarence Darrow Gurewitz, the subject of WFO file 65-1131. The file indicates they were married between 1938 and 1945. Gurewitz has been identified as a Communist Party member. (100-4724)

New York and Washington Field are also referred to their case files 65-15396 and 65-5553, respectively, which relate to William Danziger. The report of SA Silverthorn dated 12-9-50 at New York mentions the applicant and his sister, Edith Levitov, in connection with mail from the Sobell's in Mexico directed to Danziger in New York and in turn forwarded to the Levitov's in Virginia. (101-1632-70)

Washington Field report the basis. The report should clearly disclose the relationship between the applicant and the Sobell's and should be directed toward determining the extent of influence which may have been exerted of him by the Sobell's and Gurewitz. New York will characterize the Sobell's and Danziger and Washington Field will characterize Gurewitz. Washington Field should bear in mind that any cooperation on the part of the applicant with the Bureau should be reported factually by that office. Baltimore and St. Louis conduct the necessary agency checks.

1. in article appearing in the Washington (D.C.) Post, 8-18-50, captioned "SOBELL Background Here a Murky One", reflects the following, in part:

"Backtracking the Washington life of MORTON SOBELL, jailed as a Russian spy, yesterday led reporters to many small curtains.

"He lived and worked here, and wed a former Arlington, Va., girl. Yet those who knew him at all could scarcely recall him; those who may have known him well were flight-flipped.

"SOBELL married Mrs. HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ, who last year was named by the FBI as membership secretary of the District of Columbia COMMUNIST PARTY.

"She was so identified in District Court at the JUDITH COPLON espionage trial, in June, 1949. And her first husband, CLARENCE D. (CASEY) GUREWITZ, was named in the same Government document as a very active member of the COMMUNIST PARTY, District of Columbia, and has been so for 12 years.

"Mrs. SOBELL'S relatives in Arlington were reluctant to talk. A brother said she was estranged from the family, by her part in COMMUNIST things.

"We don't talk about HELEN," said her brother, DAVID LEVITOV, of 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington. "She probably knew what he (SOBELL) was doing."

"At the GUREWITZ home, at 1619 R St. NW., a woman told questioners: "I'm sorry, we have no information. Sorry. Sorry. Sorry."

"SOBELL, the FBI disclosed, was born in New York City on April 11, 1917. His parents, now naturalized United States Citizens, were born in Russia. His father now works as a pharmacist in a New York drug store.

"In 1938, the son was graduated from the City College of New York with a bachelor of electrical engineering degree. He came here to the Navy Bureau of Ordnance the following January.

When SOBELL left the bureau, in 1941, for the University of Michigan, he apparently took with him the memory of HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ. For he returned to marry her on March 10, 1945. He took leave for the wedding while employed in the General Electric Co., at Schenectady, N. Y.

The files reflect the following information on: DAVID LEVITOV

(All names, words and capitalization supplied, unless otherwise indicated.)

"SOBELL joined GE after receiving his master's degree in electrical engineering at the University of Michigan. He worked there from June 15, 1942, until June 13, 1947, the period in which he is charged with conspiring with others to send national defense information to Soviet Russia.

"He left GE to accept employment in Mid-1947 with the Reeves Instrument Co. of New York and was employed by that firm until he failed to appear for work, on last June 16, the day another spy ring was arrested.

"Wire services last night reported locating Mrs. SOBELL and her two children in Laredo, Texas. One child was identified as Sydney GUREWITZ, about 9, a son of her first marriage; the other, Mark SOBELL, 15-month-old son of her present marriage.

"Mrs. SOBELL, the wires indicated, was as noncommittal as her Washington relatives and her husband's friends."

MORTON SOBELL was convicted in U. S. District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of Conspiracy to Commit Espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. He was sentenced on April 5, 1951, to 30 years imprisonment and is presently serving his sentence in the Federal Penitentiary at Atlanta, Georgia.

The DAILY WORKER, THE WORKER, PEOPLE'S WORLD, NATIONAL GUARDIAN and other publications have, between 1951 and 1961, printed numerous articles (many of which were contributed by HELEN SOBELL) concerning MORTON SOBELL and JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG (co-defendants in the trial of MORTON SOBELL), including HELEN SOBELL'S participation in various speaking engagements, debates, ceremonies and organizational sponsoring activities regarding MORTON SOBELL and the ROSENBERGS, and also her participation in other activities which were prominently mentioned in these publications.

The DAILY WORKER, formerly the official organ of the Communist Party on the East Coast, ceased publication on January 13, 1958, at which time it was succeeded by an enlarged edition of THE WORKER, a weekly publication.

THE WORKER is the Official Communist Weekly Newspaper on East Coast.

In an effort to refresh POND'S memory and to obtain more information as to the length of time this group was in existence, its leadership, operation, and its successor, if any, it is asked that New York question POND along the above lines.

It is also requested that POND be questioned thoroughly concerning his discussions with LOUISE from which he concluded there was in existence at least one other Communist group within OPA. It is noted that POND identified WILLIAM W. STAFFORD as an OPA employee who was probably a member of the other OPA group. The enclosed group photograph shows one W. STAFFORD who is probably identical with WILLIAM W. STAFFORD.

Re HELENE ELITCHER, New York files 100-79449 and 65-14873, pages 39 and 40 of the report of SA VINCENT J. GAYLOR dated 2/11/52 at New York entitled 00000, IS - C, reflect she stated she was employed by the War Department from February, 1943 until December, 1944 and by OPA from December, 1944 until approximately 1946 and for a short while starting about March, 1947. She also stated from about the Fall of 1943 until approximately April 1946 she was a member of the Navy Department Cell. She advised she normally would have been picked up as a member of the War Department Cell but that Cell made no overtures to her.

It is requested that New York interview her for any information she might have concerning OPA groups and the War Department Cell.

It would appear that HELENE ELITCHER might have some information concerning LOUISE B. GERRARD, was, and her associates inasmuch as it is known LOUISE for a while, although prior to HELENE'S OPA employment, was local representative of local 203, the United Federal Workers of America, the local of which HELENE was probably a member. It is also asked that she be questioned concerning HATHAN GERRARD.

As HELENE indicated a number of OPA group activities in the Communist movement on the part of OPA employees, it is requested that she be presented for identification the names listed in WFO letter 2/8/52 to New York captioned DONALD W. LYON POND, et al, the names enclosed with this letter, and the photographs.

It is noted that NY files show both HELENE and MAX ELITCHER have already furnished information to New York on each of the above.

Enclosed is a group picture of probable OPA employees. This picture was obtained from the "Federal Reporter", UPF - CIO, July 11, 1946 and shows the OPA Adjustment Committee, UPF-CIO. It is requested that they be shown to FOND for identification purposes. (U)

It is noted that the Civil Service Commission shows FOND was employed by OPA from 9/24/42 to 10/3/43, and that LOUISE GERRARD was employed by OPA from 7/12/42 to 7/7/43. In January, 1945 when CSC was conducting an investigation of [redacted] was interviewed as a neighbor at 51 Hick Street, Brooklyn and stated he knew [redacted] through wife, [redacted] that he met her about six months after he started working with OPA. Apparently the existence of the OPA Group under LOUISE'S leadership to [redacted] knowledge would, therefore, start about March, 1943 and end no later than 7/7/43 when she resigned from OPA. This also appears to tie in with [redacted] belief that [redacted] had attended a meeting of the group inasmuch as CSC shows both [redacted] and [redacted] were employed by OPA about that time. b7c b7D (U)

It is further noted that FOND stated he attended four or five meetings and was told by LOUISE to cease attendance because he had been denounced as a Communist. FOND stated he continued making donations and contributing to the group. It is requested that he be asked the nature of the donations and contributions and to whom were they given. (U)

In regard to FOND'S statement that meetings of the group which he attended were in the homes and apartments of members of the group and that he is unable to recall the addresses, the following addresses known in WFO files are listed with the thought FOND may be able to identify one or more of them. 
